SEC	The Commodores are the reigning SEC Tournament champions after defeating number-one ranked Kentucky in the SEC Championship in 2012. It was Vanderbilt's first tournament title since 1951.
3	Vanderbilt has been to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments, the first time that has been accomplished in the history of the program.

NBA	Vanderbilt had three players drafted in the first 31 picks of the 2012 NBA Draft, the first time that has happened in program history. Junior guard John Jenkins was drafted 23rd by the Atlanta Hawks, senior Festus Ezeli was drafted 30th by the Golden State Warriors, and senior forward Jeffery Taylor was drafted 31st by the Charlotte Bobcats.
3.1	Vanderbilt's leading returning scoring total from an individual player. Kedren Johnson averaged 3.1 points per game in 36 contests last season. Johnson scored 25 points, and had six assists and rebounds in his first collegiate start vs. Nicholls State, and leads the team with an 19.5 ppg scoring average.
834	Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 834 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game

played since the 3-point line was implemented.

RECAP AND NOTES

E.J. Singler scored 22 points and Oregon defeated Vanderbilt in a 74-48 victory Friday night.

Freshman guard Damyean Dotson had his third double-digit scoring game for the Ducks (3-0) with 10 points, and Tony Woods had 10 as well.

Kyle Fuller scored 17 points to pace the Commodores (1-1). Kedren Johnson added 14 points for Vanderhilt

Oregon led 41-20 at halftime, and the Commodores never got closer than 14 points in the second half.

The Ducks held a 17-14 lead midway through the first half before exploding for 24 points in the final 9:25, starting with an 11-0 run that included two 3-pointers by Dotson and a 3-pointer and jumper from Singler to make it 28-14 with 7:38 before half-time.

Fuller ended Vanderbilt's scoreless stretch with a layup with 6:41 to play in the half, but the Commodores didn't make another field goal the rest of the half, missing on their next six attempts.

The Ducks, meanwhile, were just heating up. They finished the first half on a 13-2 run, capped by a long 3-pointer from Johnathan Loyd as time expired.

Oregon shot 50 percent from the field in the first half and scored 16 points off 11 turnovers by the Commodores, who shot just 27 percent.

Overall, the Ducks outshot the Commodores 46 percent to 34 percent. Vanderbilt, which made 12 3-pointers in its season opener against Nicholls State, was just 4 of 21 from long range against Oregon.

Starting Lineups

The Commodores started juniors Rod Odom and Kyle Fuller, sophomores Kedren Johnson and Shelby Moats, and freshman Kevin Bright. It was Odom's 12th career start, Fuller's third, and the second for Johnson, Moats, and Bright.

Gamenotes

- ★ Junior guard Kyle Fuller led all Commodore players with a career-high 17 points, while sophomore guard Kedren Johnson tallied 14 points in the loss.

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 61ST SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 61st season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.
