## Recap \& Notes

To the Kentucky Wildcats, there's no doubt that Nerlens Noel's jumper left his hand before the shot clock buzzer sounded, and they couldn't be happier.

Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings disagrees.
That bucket allowed Kentucky to escape with a 60-58 win over Vanderbilt in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams after blowing a 16-point lead.
"We're lucky to win the game," Kentucky coach John Calipari said.

Kyle Wiltjer's jumper with 1:57 left put Kentucky ahead to stay, but the Wildcats (10-4) also seemed to get a bit of help from officials by counting Noel's jumper with 17.3 seconds left that went in after the shot clock buzzer went off. Stallings took a timeout to plead his case, even patting his head as he talked to officials to signal shot clock violation.

But officials didn't review the play.
"They said it was not reviewable," Stallings said. "That's what they told me. It's not reviewable. The officials got together and said it's not reviewable. I don't really want to spend this press conference talking about a call that wasn't made. Obviously by my reaction, you could tell what I thought."

Kedren Johnson said he was right there and felt the ball still was in Noel's hands when the buzzer went off. Johnson made a 3 with 7.6 seconds left to pull Vandy within 60-58, and Kyle Fuller stole the inbound pass with 6.7 seconds to go giving the Commodores a last chance. Johnson's 3 hit the back rim just before the buzzer as the rally fell short for Vanderbilt (6-7).
"I knew it was a little bit too much to the right after I let it go," Johnson said. "Sometimes those still have a chance. Unfortunately, that one didn't go in for me."

Ryan Harrow led Kentucky with 16 points, Noel had 13 and Archie Goodwin 12.

Johnson finished with a game-high 18 points, and Rod Odom added 12 as Vanderbilt outrebounded Kentucky 42-37

* The Commodores shot only $32.9 \%$ from the floor for the game, its second-worst shooting performance of the season. However, Vanderbilt outrebounded the Wildcats, 42-37 and 20-9 on the offensive glass The 20 offensive rebounds was a season-high. The previous best was 16 against Marist (11/23).
ฝ It was the most offensive rebounds by a Vanderbilt team since February 16, 2011, when the Commodores had 23 at Georgia in a 64-56 win.
$\star$ It was the first loss of the season this year for Vanderbilt when outrebounding their opponent (4-1).
* The Commodores, who trailed by 16 with 16:27 to go in regulation, scored 18 unanswered points in the second half and took the lead, 49-47, with 6:11 to play. The game featured three ties and two lead changes.
$\star$ Vanderbilt's bench outscored the Wildcats' bench, 21-5.
* Shelby Moats set a new career-high in points (9) and rebounds (10) on a career-high four made field goals.
$\star$ Dai-Jon Parker scored a season-high eight points on 3-of-7 shooting. He had a season-high four rebounds.
$\star$ - Kedren Johnson tied a career-high with six assists and four steals. Johnson led the way with 18 points. He has scored in double-figures in 11 of the team's 13 games.

Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 61st Season
Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 61st season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

Junior guard John Jenkins was drafted 23rd by the Atlanta Hawks, senior Festus Ezeli was drafted 30th by the Golden State Warriors, and senior forward Jeffery Taylor was drafted 31st by the Charlotte Bobcats. Vanderbilt tied for the second-most players drafted in first 31 picks - Kentucky had four, while North Carolina also had three.

Sophomore point guard Kedren Johnson is in the top 10 in the SEC in several categories, including: Scoring -6th (16.7) FG\% - 8th (.465) 3FG\% - 4th (.372) 3FG Made - T-5th (2.2) Min. Played - 2nd (33.8) He also ranks tied for third in assists (6.0) and second in steals (4.0) in SEC play only.

Vanderbilt is competing in their 79th SEC season. The Commodores are 660646 all-time against current members of the SEC.

The Commodores had one signee in the fall, 6'9 big man Damian Jones of Baton Rouge, La. Jones, who attends Scotlandville Magnet in Baton Rouge, is regarded as one of the best big men in the class of 2013.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt rolled to an 80-65 win over Nicholls State at Memorial Gym in the Commodores 2012-13 season-opener.

Vanderbilt has now won six-straight seasonopeners, dating back to the 2006-07 season. The Commodores (1-0 overall) are now 3-0 all-time versus Nicholls State ( $0-1$ overall).

Behind a career day from Kedren Johnson, the Commodores took complete control of the game at the start of the second half. Johnson set new careerhighs in points (25), rebounds (6) and assists (6). The Lewisburg, Tenn., native was an efficient 8 -of-14 from the field, including 3 -of-7 from three-point range.

The Commodores came out of the locker room after half with a quick 6-0 run to extend their lead to 11 (34-23). From there, Vanderbilt continued its hot shooting as the Commodores would score 21 points in the first four and a half minutes of the second half.

Kevin Bright and Kyle Fuller each scored 15 points for the Commodores, while Bright led the team with eight rebounds in his collegiate debut. Fuller's 15 points were a new career-high, while he tied for the team-lead in assists with six, which also set a new career-high.

The Commodores shot 49 percent from the field for the game, including 66 percent from the field in the second half. Vanderbilt shot 72 percent ( 8 -of-11) from beyond the arc in the second half and 46 percent (12-of-26) for the game.

Fred Hunter led Nicholls State with 20 points and 10 rebounds, while Sam McBeath and T.J. Carpenter added 15 and 11 points, respectively.

Vanderbilt led by six points at the half, 28-22, behind 10 points from Johnson. Johnson (4-of-10 from the field) was the lone Commodore in double-figures in the first half.

Bright led all rebounders with seven boards in the first half. Johnson and Rod Odom each had four boards, apiece.

Both teams struggled from the field in the first half, as Vanderbilt shot 33 percent and Nicholls State shot just 31 percent. Vanderbilt held a slight rebounding advantage after one half, 21-19.

Fred Hunter led all scorers with 11 points for Nicholls State, while also adding a team-high five rebounds.

Freshman guard Damyean Dotson had his third double-digit scoring game for the Ducks (3-0) with 10 points, and Tony Woods had 10 as well.

Kyle Fuller scored 17 points to pace the Commodores (1-1), who lost coach Kevin Stallings to an ejection with $15: 57$ to play after he was whistled for a pair of technical fouls. Kedren Johnson added 14 points for Vanderbilt.

Oregon led 41-20 at halftime, and the Commodores never got closer than 14 points in the second half.

The Ducks held a 17-14 lead midway through the first half before exploding for 24 points in the final $9: 25$, starting with an 11-0 run that included two 3 -pointers by Dotson and a 3-pointer and jumper from Singler to make it 28-14 with $7: 38$ before halftime.

Fuller ended Vanderbilt's scoreless stretch with a layup with $6: 41$ to play in the half, but the Commodores didn't make another field goal the rest of the half, missing on their next six attempts.

Oregon shot 50 percent from the field in the first half and scored 16 points off 11 turnovers by the Commodores, who shot just 27 percent. was finally cleared to play Thursday.

Overall, the Ducks outshot the Commodores 46 percent to 34 percent. Vanderbilt, which made 12 3 -pointers in its season opener against Nicholls State, was just 4 of 21 from long range against Oregon.

Vanderbilt (1-3) got eight points from James Siakam. The Commodores shot just 23.0 percent (14 of 61) and finished with their lowest point total since a 33-31 loss to Mississippi State on Jan. 30, 1982.

Both teams lost in Thursday's opening round. Marist lost 87-44 to West Virginia, while Davidson beat Vanderbilt 75-62.

Price hit a 3 and Chavaughn Lewis scored on a fast-break slam during an 11-0 run to start the second half that gave Marist a $38-14$ lead with 15 minutes left.

Vanderbilt didn't get its first point in the second half until Siakam's free throw with $13: 54$ remaining. After missing their initial eight shots, Kedren Johnson's layup 1 minute, 34 seconds later was the Commodores' first second-half basket.

Johnson, who had career-high 28 points Thursday, scored four Friday.

Rod Odom's basket got Vanderbilt within 47-30 with two minutes remaining.

Price made a 3-pointer to put Marist ahead 27-9 three minutes before intermission.

Morton hit a 3 and Lewis had a three-point play as Marist went up 8-0 with 15:21 left in the first half. T.J. Curry's long-range jumper extended the Red Foxes' advantage to $13-3$ three minutes later.

Vanderbilt missed its first 10 shots. Sheldon Jeter got the Commodores' first basket, a 3-pointer six minutes into the game.

Vanderbilt, looking to replace its top six scorers from last season, made just 6 of 30 shots ( 20 percent) during the opening half.

ORLANDO - Kedren Johnson scored 17 points and Rod Odom added 16 as Vanderbilt beat Texas El-Paso $73-49$ in the consolation round at the Old Spice Classic.

Kyle Fuller added 14 points for Vanderbilt (2-3). The Commodores, looking to replace their top six scorers from last season's 25 -win team, entered averaging 55.8 points a game.

John Bohannon had 11 points for the Miners (1-4), who have lost four in a row. The streak matches their longest skid under coach Tim Floyd.

Both teams lost their previous two games at the classic.

Vanderbilt was coming off a $50-33$ loss Friday to Marist. The Commodores were also defeated 75-62 by Davidson. UTEP's losses came against Clemson (69-48) and Oklahoma (68-61).

Johnson's 3 -pointer made it 57-36 with 7:30 to play. The guard, who had a career-high 28 points in Thursday's loss to Davidson, was held to four points one day later by Marist.

Vanderbilt opened the second half with a 9-2 run to grab a 42-19 lead. Shelby Moats had a 3 during the stretch.

UTEP narrowed the gap to 49-34 midway through the second on C.J. Cooper's basket.

Odom had eight points in helping Vanderbilt go ahead 33-17 at halftime.

The Wildcats led by eight early in the second half, but the Commodores pulled to within $46-44$ with 7:18 left. Vanderbilt (2-4) made just two baskets the rest of the way and shot just 36.4 percent ( 8 of 22) after halftime. The Commodores are off to their worst start since 1988.

Villanova also blitzed the Commodores on the boards, outrebounding them 34-28. Vanderbilt finished with just four offensive rebounds - all coming in the first half.

Rod Odom led the Commodores with 14 points. Kedren Johnson added 12. Freshman Kevin Bright notched his first career double-double with 12 points and a career-high 12 rebounds.

The teams had met just once before. Villanova defeated Vanderbilt 80-73 for the 1994 NIT championship.

The Commodores stayed in front for much of the first half, grabbing a five-point lead twice. Their last came with $12: 52$ left on a Shelby Moats layup for a 14-9 lead. The Commodores went nearly five minutes without a basket, allowing Villanova to jump in front. Daniel Ochefu's two free throws with 3:21 left pushed the Wildcats in front for good and sparked an 8-3 run.

After missing his first four 3-pointers, Ryan Arcidiacono sunk a 25 -footer for a 31-26 lead at halftime. Villanova pushed the lead to eight early in the second half as Vanderbilt went nearly five minutes without a basket.

The Commodores missed six of their first seven shots before Sheldon Jeter's 3-pointer with 11:49 to go cut the deficit to 39-34.

Vanderbilt chucked up 26 3-pointers, making just nine, but the perimeter shooting allowed the Commodores to stick around. A 3-pointer by Johnson, followed by two free throws from Shelby Moats cut the deficit to $46-44$ with more than seven minutes remaining.

CINCINNATI - Xavier had no answer for Kyle Fuller at crunch time.

The Vanderbilt junior guard scored all of the Commodores' 12 overtime points on his way to a career-high 25 points as they outlasted Xavier for a $66-64$ win on.
"It was a huge win for us," said Fuller, who scored 20 points in the second half to lead Vanderbilt back from a 13 -point deficit. "We've been struggling. We're a young team and we have to learn how to win. It is a growing point for us."

Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings had mixed feelings about Fuller's overtime effort.
"I didn't realize that," Stallings said about Fuller's solo act. "That's awesome for him and almost embarrassing for the rest of us. Good for Kyle. He made some huge plays."

Fuller gave Vanderbilt (3-4) the lead for good at $61-60$ on a leaner with 1:26 left in the game. He was fouled and missed the free throw, but he followed up by being fouled while scoring on a driving layup and making the free throw for a $64-60$ lead with 1:10 left. His two free throws with 14.9 seconds left were the difference.

Sophomore guard Kedren Johnson scored 19 points and freshman guard Kevin Bright added 11 with 10 rebounds for Vanderbilt. The Musketeers knew the Commodores' strength was in their backcourt, coach Chris Mack said.

The Commodores won despite making just 13 of 25 free throws.

Travis Taylor scored 15 points to lead four Musketeers in double figures. Justin Martin added 13 and Stephon Christon finished with 12 for Xavier (6-2), which suffered its first loss in four home games. Xavier was almost as bad as Vanderbilt on free throws, making just 9 of 17 .

The Commodores (4-4) played for the first time since an overtime victory at Xavier on Dec. 6. Johnson ensured consecutive wins for the first time this season. He accounted for 10 of 13 points early in the second half as a six-point lead quickly ballooned to a 16-point advantage.
"We were just trying to push the lead and not give them any hope," Johnson said. "We just had to extend the lead. After we smelled blood, we just had to go finish them."

Rod Odom added a career-high 17 points and made a career-high four 3-pointers. His second 3 of the night came with 7 seconds before halftime and gave Vanderbilt a 31-22 lead at the break.

The momentum spilled over into the second half, when the Commodores shot 63.6 percent (14 of 22). After an Alabama A\&M 3-pointer cut the lead to six, Vanderbilt used a 16-6 run to pull away. Johnson began to attack the basket. He interspersed a jumper in among five free throws. His 3 -pointer with 13:19 left gave the Commodores a commanding 47-31 lead. Center Josh Henderson also provided a spark, scoring 11 of his career-high 13 points in the second half.

Alabama A\&M (2-6) sputtered offensively, especially after the break. The Bulldogs made just six shots in the second half and shot 32.6 percent ( 15 of 46) for the game. The 46 points were the fewest allowed by Vanderbilt this season.


NASHVILLE - Tweety Knight scored a go-ahead layup with 1:08 left to lift Middle Tennessee State to a 56-52 victory over Vanderbilt.

Bruce Massey scored 17 points to lead the Blue Raiders (9-3), who ended the game on a 16-3 run to get their first win against Vanderbilt since 1995.

After Knight's layup, Kerry Hammonds plucked a steal from Kedren Johnson and finished with a layup for a three-point cushion. Johnson missed a 3-pointer and Raymond Cintron's free throws with 7.5 seconds left sealed the win.

The Commodores (5-5) led 49-40 with 9:58 left but went scoreless for nearly the next six minutes.

Johnson scored 15 of his 25 points in the first half to lead Vanderbilt. He banked in his final basket with 1:56 left to give Vanderbilt a 52-51 lead before Knight responded.

Hammonds scored a season-high 11 points for Middle Tennessee, which had lost five straight against its in-state neighbors from 38 miles away

The game had five ties and 10 lead changes. Vanderbilt, which had won three in a row, appeared in control early in the second half

Johnson scored four straight points to end a 10-2 run as the Commodores feasted on 20 turnovers by Middle Tennessee. Johnson's jumper with less than 10 minutes to go catapulted Vanderbilt to its largest lead.

The Blue Raiders slowly charged back. After consecutive baskets by Massey, Shawn Jones and Knight each scored off offensive rebounds to cut the lead to 49-48 with 4:36 left.

A minute later, Cintron drove the lane to give the Blue Raiders their first lead since late in the first half. Johnson answered with a tough shot inside.

Knight missed his first layup but wrestled for the rebound with Vanderbilt center Josh Henderson to force a jump ball in favor of Middle Tennessee. The Blue Raiders pounced on the second-chance opportunity. Marcos Knight lofted a pass to his younger brother, who came open for an easy layup.

The Commodores had won 29 of 33 in the all-time series. The game was played downtown at Bridgestone Arena, marking the first neutral-site contest between the schools.

NASHVILLE - Butler coach Brad Stevens kept watching Rotnei Clarke as his senior guard missed his first six shots, something he really hadn't seen yet from the transfer playing just his 12th game for the Bulldogs.

Then Clarke found his stroke in hitting six 3-pointers and finished with 22 points, and the 18th-ranked Butler Bulldogs shook off a sluggish start and routed Vanderbilt 68-49 for their seventh straight victory.

The Bulldogs (10-2) missed their first seven 3-pointers and led only 25-22 at halftime before taking control of the game with a 14-3 run to open the second half.

Clarke, who missed his first six shots, had another memorable game in Memorial Gym. He scored 36 points in January 2011 playing for Arkansas, hitting 6 of 8 beyond the arc in that game.

This time around, the senior guard hit 6 of 9 from 3-point range, and he said he was excited about his return to Southeastern Conference country.

The Bulldogs had the game in control well enough that Stevens was able to pull his starters late. Kellen Dunham added 12 points.

Kyle Fuller led Vanderbilt (5-6) with 10 points. Kedren Johnson finished with nine, well below his average of 17.8 points and didn't score until nearly three minutes into the second half. Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said Johnson hurt his right shooting shoulder Wednesday and that he wasn't sure his sophomore guard would play.
"He tried as hard as he could. I can't imagine his shoulder felt very good," Stallings said.

The Bulldogs hadn't played Vanderbilt since the 1929-30 season and picked a good time to visit with the Commodores trying to replace their top six scorers from the team that won the Southeastern Conference tournament last season. Vandy will visit Butler next season

NASHVILLE - Freshman Sheldon Jeter scored a career-high 14 points off the bench to lead Vanderbilt to a 64-50 victory over William \& Mary.

The Commodores (6-6) smothered William \& Mary, which shot just 34 percent (16 of 47) from the field. Still, the Tribe (7-5) trailed by just seven with 7 minutes left. But Vanderbilt rattled off eight straight points, including consecutive 3-pointers from Kedren Johnson and Dai-Jon Parker to pull away.

Jeter was 6 of 7 from field and scored seven straight points twice.

Marcus Thornton paced William \& Mary with 14 points. Tim Rusthoven added 11 and Matt Rum had 10, while Kyle Gaillard grabbed 10 rebounds.

Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings picked up his 182nd win at home to become the all-time wins leader at Memorial Gymnasium. Stallings, in his 14th season, passed Roy Skinner, who won 181 games in 16 years over two stints from 1959-76.

Vanderbilt led 26-21 at halftime but missed its first five shots out of the break.

The Tribe took advantage, tying the game at 31 with a layup by Sean Sheldon. They couldn't jump back in front, as Vanderbilt went on a 13-4 run. Jeter closed out the spurt with seven straight points. The Commodores had missed 13 straight 3-pointers until Jeter snapped the skid with 12:10 left -- though replays showed he was inside the line -- as he sank a shot in the corner as he was fouled.

He missed the free throw but kept attacking the basket. He tipped in a teammate's miss later and drove the baseline for a 44-35 lead with 10:33 left and sparked a timeout from Tribe coach Tony Shaver.

William \& Mary, which entered shooting 48.6 percent, cut the lead to seven twice. Gaillard's jumper with 7:11 left pulled the Tribe within 48-41 but Vanderbilt made four straight 3-pointers to end the game.

NASHVILLE - To the Kentucky Wildcats, there's no doubt that Nerlens Noel's jumper left his hand before the shot clock buzzer sounded, and they couldn't be happier.

Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings disagrees.
That bucket allowed Kentucky to escape with a 60-58 win over Vanderbilt in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams after blowing a 16-point lead.
"We're lucky to win the game," Kentucky coach John Calipari said.

Kyle Wiltjer's jumper with 1:57 left put Kentucky ahead to stay, but the Wildcats (10-4) also seemed to get a bit of help from officials by counting Noel's jumper with 17.3 seconds left that went in after the shot clock buzzer went off. Stallings took a timeout to plead his case, even patting his head as he talked to officials to signal shot clock violation.

But officials didn't review the play.
"They said it was not reviewable," Stallings said. "That's what they told me. It's not reviewable. The officials got together and said it's not reviewable. I don't really want to spend this press conference talking about a call that wasn't made. Obviously by my reaction, you could tell what I thought."

Kedren Johnson said he was right there and felt the ball still was in Noel's hands when the buzzer went off. Johnson made a 3 with 7.6 seconds left to pull Vandy within 60-58, and Kyle Fuller stole the inbound pass with 6.7 seconds to go giving the Commodores a last chance. Johnson's 3 hit the back rim just before the buzzer as the rally fell short for Vanderbilt (6-7).
"I knew it was a little bit too much to the right after I let it go," Johnson said. "Sometimes those still have a chance. Unfortunately, that one didn't go in for me."

Ryan Harrow led Kentucky with 16 points, Noel had 13 and Archie Goodwin 12.
"Even though it was an ugly win, at least we came out with the win," Harrow said.

Johnson finished with a game-high 18 points, and Rod Odom added 12 as Vanderbilt outrebounded Kentucky 42-37.
