## Recap \& Notes

NASHVILLE - Willie Cauley-Stein scored 15 points, and No. 14 Kentucky beat Vanderbilt 71-62 for the Wildcats' fourth straight victory.

Aaron Harrison added 14 points and Andrew Harrison 10 and Kentucky (12-3, 2-0) started off a two-game road swing through the Southeastern Conference with a win. Julius Randle had 10 of his 11 rebounds in the first half.

That left senior Rod Odom as Vandy's leading scorer averaging 13.8 points a game, and he spent 10 minutes of the first half on the bench because of foul trouble. He finished with five points.
"Rod's now our leading scorer," Stallings said. "Every team needs their leading scorer."

Freshman Damian Jones had a game-high 18 points and 11 rebounds for Vanderbilt (8-6, 0-2). Kyle Fuller had 17 points and 10 assists, and Dai-Jon Parker added 17.

Vanderbilt outshot Kentucky 50 percent (25 of 50) to 42.6 percent (26 of 61).

But the Wildcats used their size for a 41-28 rebounding edge, and their much deeper bench outscored the two scholarship players on Vanderbilt's bench 19-3.
"They attack offensive rebounds," Stallings said of Kentucky. "Randle is a great offensive rebounder. I thought Cauley-Stein played well for them. Sometimes you watch film, and there's a guy who stands out who you like. He's that player. You don't have to make plays for him, and he'll still get you good production. They're a great offensive rebounding team."

The Wildcats took advantage of Vanderbilt's woes by painting the inside of Memorial Gym blue with fans making themselves right at home chanting "Go Big Blue" early and often.

Kentucky took the lead for good at 8-6 on a jumper by Aaron Harrison, the first of nine straight points as the Wildcats took advantage of a nearly 6-minute scoring drought by Vanderbilt to go up 15-6. Calipari anticipated Vanderbilt trying to grind his Wildcats down, so he had them open the game trying to match that pace.

## Notes:

^ Freshman Damian Jones led Vanderbilt with his first career double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds, while senior guard Kyle Fuller also added his first career double-double with 17 points and 10 assists.
$\star$ Junior guard Dai-Jon Parker added a season-high 17 points. The Commodores shot 50 percent from the floor for the game (25-0f-50). It was the fifth time this season the 'Dores shot at least 50 percent from the floor.
$\star$ Vanderbilt hit six three-pointers against Kentucky, marking the sixth time this season the 'Dores hit more than five threes in a game.
$\star$ The Commodores had two players finish with doubledoubles (Jones 18 pt, 11 reb. and Fuller 17 pt, 10 ast.) for the first time since March 8, 2009 against Arkansas (A.J. Ogilvy 12 pts, 10 reb. and Jeffery Taylor 16 pt, 10 reb.).

## Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952

Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 62nd Season
Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 62nd season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

Prior to working for Vanderbilt, Fisher served as a television sports anchor in the Nashville market (19871996), with stints at WSMV-4 and WKRN-2. He also worked in the public relations field for two years.

Thompson, who is in his 13th year providing color commentary, played for Vanderbilt from 1975-79, receiving the Outstanding Leader and Civitan Sportsmanship Awards. He currently works with Nike College Sports Marketing.

Broadcast Engineer Bob Horner is in his 31st year courtside producing broadcasts of Commodore basketball. During his tenure, Horner has worked more than 750 games for Vanderbilt.

The broadcasts are produced by IMG College, the exclusive multi-media rightsholder for Vanderbilt. Jeff Miller is the general manager.

## VANDERBILT BASKETBALL QUICK HITTERS

- This is the 112 th year of Vanderbilt basketball, with the first season taking place in 1900-01. There were no teams in 1904-05 and 1905-06.
- The Commodores have been to 13 NCAA Tournaments and 11 NIT's. Vanderbilt advanced to the Elite 8 in 1965 (field of 23), and the Sweet 16 in 1988, 1993, 2004, and 2007. The Commodores captured the NIT Championship in 1990 and finished runner-up in 1994.
- The Commodores are a charter member of the SEC, with the 2013-14 season being the 80th year in the conference.
- Vanderbilt is the only private institution in the SEC with the lowest enrollment of any of the 14 schools $(6,738)$.
- Vanderbilt's Perry Wallace became the first AfricanAmerican scholarship basketball player in the SEC when he took the court in 1967.
- The Commodores have 43 career 1,000-point scorers, with Shan Foster (2004-08) the all-time leading scorer with 2,011 career points.
- Vanderbilt has had 12 All-Americans since 1950. They are: Billy Joe Adcock (1950), Clyde Lee (1965), Tom Hagan (1969), Jan van Breda Kolff (1974), Will Perdue (1988), Billy McCaffrey (1993), Dan Langhi (2000), Matt Freije (2004), Derrick Byars (2007), Shan Foster (2008), and John Jenkins (2011).
- The Commodores had three players drafted in the first 31 picks of the 2012 NBA Draft - John Jenkins, Atlanta, 23rd pick, Festus Ezeli, Golden State, 30th pick, Jeffery Taylor, Charlotte, 31st pick - the most by the Commodores in one draft. In all, 35 Vanderbilt players have been selected in the NBA Draft since 1950.
- The Commodores ended a 61-year SEC Tournament drought in 2012 by claiming the tournament championship in New Orleans, the team's first SEC championship since 1951.
- Coach Stallings is the winningest coach in Vanderbilt history after surpassing legendary mentor Roy Skinner on November 15, 2013, against Lipscomb.
- Stallings has led his Commodore teams to 10 postseason tournaments since his arrival in 1999 and has had seven 20+-win seasons. His 2004 and 2007 teams advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since the tournament expanded to 64+ teams.
- Stallings has appeared in the NCAA Tournament six times, including a stretch of three consecutive appearances from 2010-2012. It was the first time in school history that Vanderbilt has advanced to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments.
- All three of the university's top all-time scorers played for Coach Stallings (Foster, Jeffery Taylor, Matt Freije). John Jenkins, who is 10th on the list, also played for him.
- Vanderbilt's intercollegiate athletics teams are nicknamed the Commodores, in honor of the nickname given to founder Cornelius Vanderbilt, who made his fortune in shipping. Vanderbilt donated $\$ 1$ million to begin "Central University" in 1875 - the campus was later renamed for Cornelius because of his generosity. Cornelius never stepped foot on the campus that bears his namesake.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt got an impressive debut performances from some new faces Tuesday night to help head coach Kevin Stallings tie the school's all-time wins record.

Freshman Damian Jones had 19 points and seven rebounds, while transfer Eric McClellan scored 18 to help the Commodores pull away from Georgia State for an 86-80 season-opening victory. Rod Odom, one of two VU seniors, also scored 19 points including five 3-pointers.
"I'm pretty sure of what we have. Now it's a matter of us getting to be as good as we can be," said Stallings, who tied Roy Skinner (1961-76) with most victories as Vanderbilt head coach (278).

Odom, the team's top returning scorer, hit two 3s early to close it to 12-10 after four different GSU shooters hit 3-pointers the first 4:07 for a 12-7 lead

Jones, a 6-foot-10 center from Baton Rouge, La., gave the Commodores a boost off the bench early with five straight points including a dunk to launch a 10-2 run for a 20-16 lead.

In a game that saw 16 lead changes and 10 ties, Jones hit a big jumper and Dai-Jon Parker sank his third 3-pointer to push Vanderbilt ahead 78-73 with 1:06 left.

Jones' jumper that gave Vanderbilt the lead for good was about a 17-footer after most of his baskets came inside, including alley-oops and other dunks.

Stallings, who liked his team's resolve to pull out the victory, said the freshman has a lot to learn but could go up and catch almost anything thrown his way.

VU senior Kyle Fuller hit a pair of free throws with 45.1 seconds left for the largest lead in the game (80-74) since 8:09 remaining

Odom had back-to-back 3s for Vanderbilt down the stretch and sank a pair of free throws with 9.8 seconds for an 84-80 lead. McClellan, a transfer from Tulsa, added two fouls shots for the final points.

GSU transfer Ryan Harrow, who started 24 games last season for Kentucky, had a game-high 27 points for the Panthers (1-1). He lost to the Commodores in the Southeastern Conference tournament in his last game with the Wildcats.

Sophomore R.J. Hunter scored 21 points including three 3-pointers for Georgia State.

Devonta White's two free throws cut it to 82-80 with 10 seconds remaining for the Panthers, picked as a preseason Sun Belt favorite by several outlets.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings entered the 2013-14 season needing only two wins to become the Commodores' all-time wins leader.

He got there in only two games, but he had to sweat a little.

Vanderbilt defeated Lipscomb 80-69 in front of a crowd of 8,416 as Stallings picked up his 279th win at Vanderbilt (2-0). The victory moved him past Roy Skinner, who coached Vanderbilt from 1958-76. Stallings is 279175 in 14 seasons with the Commodores. In tying the late Skinner's record, Vanderbilt also had to pull away late in Tuesday's opener against Georgia State
"I wish somehow I could win a lot of games and not break his record because you don't want to break his records," Stallings said. "He's too nice a guy."

Vanderbilt forward James Siakam picked up his first career double-double, and forward Rod Odom matched a career-high with 20 points against the Bisons (1-2).

Lipscomb, a crosstown foe from the Atlantic Sun that hadn't won in Memorial Gym since 1939, gave Vanderbilt trouble for more than 30 minutes before the Commodores pulled away late. J.C. Hampton led Lipscomb with 21 points. Khion Sankey added 15 for the Bisons.

The difference though was Siakam and Odom.
Siakam provided energy on several occasions for Vanderbilt, especially in the second half. He had a dunk and three-point play as the Commodores pulled away after the break. The junior added three assists and a block.
"Every time the game got tight and things got close, James came up with a big play," said Odom, who was 8-of-13 from the field. "In a lot of ways, he kept us going, kept us ahead and kept us ahead. He provided energy through is play."

Siakam had never had more than eight points and eight rebounds in a game before Friday, when he topped his career high in the first half alone.

Stallings might not expect 18 points and 13 rebounds out of Siakam every night, but with his energy and length, Stallings said he knew this kind of game was a possibility.
"I want to be that energy guy," said Siakam, who arrived at Vanderbilt from Douala, Cameroon. "I want to be active on defense and block shots."

INDIANAPOLIS - Khyle Marshall scored 16 of his careerhigh 26 points in the final seven minutes Tuesday night, leading Butler past Vanderbilt 85-77 in overtime.

Kellen Dunham added 16 points for the Bulldogs, who won for the 22nd time in 25 games at Hinkle Fieldhouse -- though few have been this challenging.

Butler led 61-47 with 7:43 left in regulation and appeared bound for an easy win.

But the Commodores (2-1) went on a 15-2 run to trim the deficit to one and took the lead when Eric McClellan completed a three-point play with 53.8 seconds to go. Marshall gave Butler the lead with a layup, and then after McClellan tied it with a free throw, he missed the second free throw and was called for a travel. Dunham missed a running 3 -pointer at the buzzer.

But Marshall dominated overtime as the Bulldogs pulled away.

McClellan finished with a career-high 29 points
The Commodores fell to 0-5 all-time against Butler on one of the strangest nights in recent memory at Hinkle Fieldhouse.

The teams combined for 54 fouls and traded scoring flurries all night.

Dunham was held scoreless for nearly $91 / 2$ minutes before going on a 3-point binge and then fading from view over the closing stretch. The oddest play of the night might have been when Butler's Kameron Woods came up with a loose ball on the defensive end and the 6-foot-9 forward dribbled coast to coast and went in for a one-handed dunk that appeared to get batted out of the basket as it was going through the net -- ruled a miss.

But nothing was stranger than the Commodores comeback.

They trailed by 14 three different times in the second half and spent most of the night in foul trouble, yet somehow dug deep to shut down Butler's outside scorers over the final seven minutes of regulation.

Meanwhile, the Commodores continually drove to the basket, scoring, drawing fouls -- or both -- leading to the 15-2 run.

Vandy finally took its first lead, 69-68, in nearly 23 minutes when McClellan converted the late three-point play.

Marshall answered with a layup to give Butler a 70-69 lead, and after Woods was called for a foul with 11.1 seconds left, McClellan grabbed the rebound off the missed free throw and was called for traveling. That gave Dunham a chance to win it with a running 3-pointer, which fell short.

In overtime, it was all Marshall, who gave Butler the lead for good on a short jumper in the lane with 4:26 left. Marshall scored nine of Butler's 16 points.

Providence trailed $56-40$ with 10:42 left, but caught fire and Vanderbilt crashed and burned. The Friars held Vanderbilt scoreless for nearly 9 minutes, ending on Rod Odom's 3-pointer to give Vanderbilt a $59-57$ lead with 2:55 left.

Providence scored the next eight points to build its biggest lead of the game at $65-59$. The Friars hadn't led since 9-7 early in the game.

Bryce Cotton added 14 for Providence (5-0) and LaDontae Henton had 12.

Odom led Vanderbilt (2-2) with 17 points, Eric McClellan added 13 and Josh Henderson tied a career-high with 13 points. Henderson scored a combined 11 points in Vanderbilt's first three games, 6,1 , and 4 respectively.

The Friars will play the winner of the Morgan StateLa Salle matchup.

Throughout most of the second half, Providence couldn't get the stops when it needed to. The Friars didn't score more than five consecutive points in the second half until the 6:34 mark.

But Providence rallied back, going on an 18-0 run, with 3-pointers by Harris, Kris Dunn and a three-point play by Carson Desrosiers.

Damian Jones missed two crucial free throws with 3:53 left that would have given Vanderbilt its first points in nearly 7 minutes.

Providence trailed for a majority of the first half too.
The Friars were held to without a field goal for over 4 minutes, but LaDontae Henton's 3-pointer pulled the Friars to $19-18$ with $7: 43$ left.

Vanderbilt led $31-22$ with 1:41 remaining but did not make a field goal in the final 2 minutes and Providence scored the next four to trail 31-26 at halftime.

Providence was held to 34.5 percent shooting, including 2 of 153 -pointers, in the first half.

Kevin Stallings commented at halftime about Vanderbilt's defense in the first half, saying "...defensively, that's the best 20 minutes of basketball we've played this season."

Vanderbilt out-rebounded the Friars 23-15 in the opening half and made 42 percent of its shots, mostly coming in the paint.

But Fuller sealed the game for Vanderbilt, making all four of his free throw attempts with just seconds left.

Vanderbilt will face Loyola Marymount in the fourthplace game on Monday. The Commodores led by as many as 17 in the second half. But Morgan State kept clawing away at its deficit.

The Bears shot just 32.1 percent in the first half, but turned it around in the second, making 14 of 29.

Kornet, a freshman, scored all 11 of his points in the second half for Vanderbilt. Ahead 57-50 with 7:49 left, Kornet threw down a dunk and his 3 -pointer less than 2 minutes later extended Vanderbilt's lead to 62-53.

Morgan State did not score in the final minute after missing both 3 -point attempts.

The first half was much of the same.
The Commodores built an early $14-11$ lead, behind seven points by Fuller. He finished with 10 points in the half as Vanderbilt led 37-23 at the break. They outscored Morgan State 26-12 in the paint.

Fuller's basket with 1:44 left pushed Vanderbilt's lead to 66-62. He made all four of his free throws on Vanderbilt's next two possessions to make it 70-62 with 48 seconds remaining.
"Kyle played well in this tournament," Vanderbilt's coach Kevin Stallings said. "That bodes well for us going forward."

Eric McClellan made three of his four free throws in the final 30 seconds and Rod Odom made two more with 3 seconds remaining to end it.

McClellan added 17 points for the Commodores (4-2) and James Siakam scored all 11 of his points in the second half. Vanderbilt made 25 of its 52 shots and nailed 75 percent of its 32 free throws.

"We showed out most resolve when they took the lead," Stallings said. "Our defense got better. Our offense got better. We were 17 of 21 from the foul line in the second half."

Ireland finished with 20 points, his third-straight 20 -plus point game for Loyola Marymount (5-2), while Ben Dickinson and Gabe Levin chipped in with 10 each.

It was the first ever meeting between the two programs.


AUSTIN - Isaiah Taylor had 14 points and eight assists and Texas won its first game against a power conference team this season in a 70-64 victory over Vanderbilt on Monday.

Demarcus Holland and Javan Felix each scored 12 points for Texas (7-1). Felix went 2 of 3 from beyond the arc and Kendal Yancy contributed 11 points and six rebounds.

The Longhorns led by as many as 13 points in the second half and were able to hold off Vanderbilt (4-3), which trimmed the Longhorns lead to one point in the final minute after an Eric McClellan steal and dunk.

Felix sunk a pair of key free throws to make it 65-62 before Holland's three-point play with 12.6 seconds left sealed the win.

Austin native McClellan scored a team-high 22 points for Vanderbilt while Josh Henderson scored 12 points on 5 of 8 shooting and Rod Odom had 11 points.

Texas needed second-half comebacks in four of its previous six wins this year but started the game on an 8-2 run and never looked back. The Longhorns led for the final 39 minutes of the game, using a $16-3$ run to take a $31-25$ halftime lead.

Vanderbilt trimmed Texas' lead to three points when Henderson knocked down a jumper to make it $57-54$ with 2:30 left to play.

Then, Taylor helped the Longhorns take control of the game down the stretch. He completed a three-point play and hit a floater following a steal by Holland all in less than 30 seconds to give Texas a $62-54$ lead with $1: 47$ to go.

The Longhorns initially struggled from the free throw line, making just 10 of 16 attempts before knocking down five straight in the final 24 seconds.

Texas, whose victory Monday came in the first-ever Big 12-SEC challenge, has now won 46 consecutive home games against unranked non-conference opponents. The Longhorns have also won seven of their first eight games for the first time in three years.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt held on to win the game with a money shot and a big stop, but also lost a seasoned player to injury in a 69-67 victory over Marshall.

Dai-Jon Parker sank a 3-pointer just inside the final minute to give the Commodores (5-3) a 69-65 lead over the hard-charging Thundering Herd (4-4). Shawn Smith sank his final two free throws and Marshall had a chance to tie it on a drive into the paint before James Siakam stole the ball.
"We changed and had a small lineup, not knowing they also changed and had a small lineup," VU Coach Kevin Stallings said. "James (Siakam) came off and defended on a ball screen. He tends to give guards trouble because he has a seven-foot wingspan. Obviously their coach thought he got fouled.
"James made a very good defensive play. l'm proud of him for that nine seconds - at that point anything can happen."

Siakam and freshman center Damian Jones scored 15 points apiece, and Rod Odom added 11 points including two 3 -pointers.

Vanderbilt junior center Josh Henderson, however, suffered a knee injury at 11:15 of the first half right after back-to-back blocks by his teammates on a Herd fast break. Initial indications are a torn ACL and MCL, with an MRI scheduled to confirm the damage.
"It's tough because he was playing well," Stallings said. "He really improved in the offseason and had three really good games in a row. I'm disappointed for him."

Jones, starting his fifth straight game, played a career-high 28 minutes and was a force inside. Marshall Coach Tom Herrion said the freshman from Baton Rouge, La., had the chance to be "something special" and played like he had even more points and rebounds than Jones actually did.

Jones' 3-point play a half-second before intermission handed Vanderbilt the largest lead of the first half at 3526. He powered in a basket after halftime, then slammed in a dunk on a loose ball for a 41-30 advantage.

Point guard Kareem Canty, last week's Conference USA freshman of the week, led the Thundering Herd with 18 points. His third 3-pointer of the game cut what had been a 13 -point lead to \(66-65\), and Marshall put the ball in Canty's hands for the chance to tie.

Chris Horton's 16 points and 10 rebounds led the Governors (5-6), while Will Triggs chipped in 11 points.

Fuller sank a pair of free throws with 15.8 seconds remaining for a \(57-53\) advantage. But Travis Betran hit a Iong 3-pointer to trim it to \(58-56\) before Fuller hit his final foul shot with 8.2 seconds left. Peay missed a chance at the buzzer.

Demarius Smith's 3-pointer pulled Austin Peay even at 50-50, but Fuller made a steal and drove the lane for the go-ahead score. After a James Siakam block, Fuller's first free throws gave the Commodores a \(54-50\) lead with 1:23 to play.

The Governors' Zavion Williams had three straight baskets including two transition scores to push Peay ahead 43-41. Fuller's 3 -pointer ended the drought for a 44-43 cushion and Siakam scored Vanderbilt's next six points for a 50-47 margin.

Siakam didn't play the first 10 minutes for Vanderbilt, which was already down to eight scholarship players after losing redshirt junior Josh Henderson for the season. Henderson suffered a severe knee injury in the Commodores' last outing, 12 days ago in a win over Marshall.

Austin Peay extended its 22-20 halftime lead to 24-20 on Triggs' basket to open the second half. But Vanderbilt went on a 6-0 spurt to retake the lead on two straight baskets by Jones.

Peay's Smith picked up back-to-back fouls for his third and fourth fouls with 13:37 to play, and Jones hit both free throws for a 33-30 lead.

Daniel Miller had 11 of his 16 points in the first half for the Yellow Jackets (8-4). He then went 27 minutes without a field goal, scoring his final five points in the last 3 minutes of the game. Miller, who has started all 105 games in his Tech career, finished with 10 rebounds.

Saint Louis stretched it to 49-44 on Dwayne Evans' steal and subsequent dunk on the fast break with 2 minutes left.

Damian Jones scored 12 points to lead the Commodores (7-4), who saw a three-game win streak end with its first home court loss this season. It was Vanderbilt's lowest offensive output at Memorial Gym since scoring 43 in back-to-back losses in February 2002.

Glaze finished with 10 rebounds and Evans added nine.

Saint Louis shot ahead 6-0 on three straight drives with Jett scoring the first two buckets after neither team scored the first \(31 / 2\) minutes.

Odom, with four 3-pointers, and McClellan, with a pair of treys, were perfect from beyond the arc as \(\mathrm{VU}(8-4)\) warmed up for its Southeastern Conference opener next week.

McClellan only missed one shot on his way to 12 first-half points. The Commodores shot 76.0 percent from the field the first half and 83.3 from 3-point range ( 5 of 6 ) to lead 46-18 at intermission.

Kyle Fuller didn't miss at all to finish with 11 points, and Jones also had six blocks for Vanderbilt.

Reggie Spencer led the Huskies (3-11) with 15 points.

Odom's 3-pointer that extended the lead to 44-17 pushed the percentage to 78.3, one game after the Commodores had their poorest shooting performance in Monday's loss to Saint Louis.

Referees even waived off Jones' turn-around desperation shot that banked in at the buzzer, after he initially bobbled the pass.

The Commodores made 17 of their first 22 shots for a 77.3 field-goal percentage. At one point, VU hit nine straight field goals -- going \(81 / 2\) minutes without a miss.

McClellan scored eight straight points for Vanderbilt -- including two 3-pointers, the first after his steal -for an early 10-4 lead. He had 12 points in the first 8 minutes, plus his second steal led to Kyle Fuller's fast-break layup and an 18-8 advantage.

Marco Banegas-Flores cut it to 18-11 on his trey, but the Commodores doubled up the score 28-14 on Dai-Jon Parker's 3.

Fuller stretched it to 31-15 on an over-the-shoulder reverse after dropping the ball as the shot clock expired. Jones scored eight straight points, including a dunk, as Vanderbilt stretched it to 39-15, and Odom's jumper made it 41-15 to cap a 20-2 run.

The Huskies, meanwhile, missed nine straight field goals between Reggie Spencer's jumper at 10:07 to pull within 21-13 and his layup 2:34 before halftime at 41-17.

Northeastern had defeated Georgetown earlier, and seven of its 10 previous losses had been by five points or less.


TUSCALOOSA - Alabama's seven losses this season have been by 10 points or fewer. After a 68-63 win against Vanderbilt, The Crimson Tide have now won two close games in a row.

After beating Robert Morris in its last non-conference game 64-56, Alabama held on to defeat Vanderbilt in the opening SEC game for both teams.

Trevor Releford scored 16 points and had six assists for Alabama (7-7, 1-0). Shannon Hale and Obasohan had 15 points each, and Levi Randolph added 11 points.

Vanderbilt's (8-5, 0-1) Rod Odom had a doubledouble with 20 points and 10 rebounds. Damian Jones had 16 points and Kyle Fuller added 12 points for the Commodores.

With Alabama ahead 52-36 with 12:11 to go, the Commodores went on a 22-9 run to slice the lead to 61-58 with 3:20 left, but Obasohan buried a three-point shot to extend the lead to 66-60 with 1:27 remaining. The Crimson Tide pushed the lead back up to 68-60 with 25 seconds to go in the game.

It was a pretty evenly played first half, with the score tied 20 at the 6:58 mark before the Crimson Tide went on a 12-2 run to take a 32-22 lead on an alley-oop dunk by Rodney Cooper with 1:19 left in the half. Releford scored eight points to spark the rally. Alabama maintained a 3626 advantage, matching its largest lead of the first half, at intermission.


NASHVILLE - John Calipari sees his young Kentucky Wildcats growing up and playing more the way he wants even if youthful mistakes still slip through.

Willie Cauley-Stein scored 15 points, and No. 14 Kentucky beat Vanderbilt 71-62 for the Wildcats' fourth straight victory.

Aaron Harrison added 14 points and Andrew Harrison 10 and Kentucky (12-3, 2-0) started off a two-game road swing through the Southeastern Conference with a win. Julius Randle had 10 of his 11 rebounds in the first half.

That left senior Rod Odom as Vandy's leading scorer averaging 13.8 points a game, and he spent 10 minutes of the first half on the bench because of foul trouble. He finished with five points.

Freshman Damian Jones had a game-high 18 points and 11 rebounds for Vanderbilt (8-6, 0-2). Kyle Fuller had 17 points and 10 assists, and Dai-Jon Parker added 17.

Vanderbilt outshot Kentucky 50 percent (25 of 50) to 42.6 percent ( 26 of 61 ).

But the Wildcats used their size for a 41-28 rebounding edge, and their much deeper bench outscored the two scholarship players on Vanderbilt's bench 19-3.

The Wildcats took advantage of Vanderbilt's woes by painting the inside of Memorial Gym blue with fans making themselves right at home chanting "Go Big Blue" early and often.

Kentucky took the lead for good at 8-6 on a jumper by Aaron Harrison, the first of nine straight points as the Wildcats took advantage of a nearly 6-minute scoring drought by Vanderbilt to go up 15-6. Calipari anticipated Vanderbilt trying to grind his Wildcats down, so he had them open the game trying to match that pace.

The Wildcats led 30-22 at halftime but didn't take control until Andrew Harrison hit back-to-back 3-pointers, the second midway through the second half pushing the Wildcats' lead back to double digits. Alex Poythress added his first bucket on a layup giving Kentucky its biggest lead at 53-39 with 9:26 left.

Cauley-Stein said he thought the Wildcats played a good game.

A technical called on Poythress for delay after a dunk with 5:37 left helped Vanderbilt score five quick points including a 3-pointer by Parker to pull within 60-52 with 5:20 left.
