## QUICK HITTERS

$\star$ The Commodores dropped a 69-67 decision at Baylor on Sunday night in their first true road game of the season. Wade Baldwin IV led the Commodores with 19 points on 7-of-9 shooting, his fourth consecutive game in double figures and his sixth of the season. He also added four rebounds, four assists, and two steals. Matthew Fisher-Davis also scored in double figures with 11 points. Fisher-Davis is 7-13 from three in his last two games.

* The Commodores outshot Baylor, $46.8 \%$ to $40.0 \%$ from the floor, $47.6 \%$ to $45.5 \%$ from three, and $76.5 \%$ to $60 \%$ at the free throw line. Sunday marked the first game this season VU has lost after out shooting an opponent.
$\star$ Baylor had 20 offensive rebounds to only nine for Vanderbilt, and outscored VU, 19-7, on second-chance points. The Bears had 18 more shot attempts than VU (65-47).
$\star$ Vanderbilt committed a season-high 17 turnovers. The previous high was 12 against Detroit. Baylor outscored the Commodores, 24-10, in points off of turnovers.
$\star$ Vanderbilt went 2-1 in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational and finished second in the Thanksgiving-week tournament, with the Commodores posting a 92-55 win over St. John's and an 86-64 win over Wake Forest before dropping a 70-63 decision to Kansas in the tournament final.
$\star$ Two Commodores are averaging double figures on the season, with Baldwin leading the way with 15.0 ppg. Damian Jones is also averaging 11.6 points per game.
$\star$ Ten players have scored in double figures in a game this season - Baldwin, Luke Kornet, Jones, Jeff Roberson, Riley LaChance, Fisher-Davis, Nolan Cressler, Camron Justice, Josh Henderson, and Joe Toye.
* For the season, Vanderbilt is shooting $49.3 \%$ from the floor and $40.3 \%$ from three, outrebounding opponents by a +5.1 margin, and have a +2.3 turnover margin.
$\star$ Vanderbilt has 125 assists against only 84 turnovers for the season. Opponents have 102 turnovers and only 61 assists on the year.
$\star$ On the season, the Commodores are averaging 83.4 points per game and limiting opponents to 60.6 points per game
$\star$ The Commodores have 53 blocks on the year, an average of 6.6 per game. Opponents have only blocked a combined 16.
« From the field, Vanderbilt has six players that are shooting $50 \%$ or better on the season - Baldwin (.554), Jones (.530), Roberson (.581), Justice (.500), Henderson (.581), and Toye (.619).
* Head Coach Kevin Stallings, the school's all-time winningest coach, is in his 17th season with the Commodores and 22nd overall as a head coach, and is now the dean of SEC coaches. Stallings has 319 career wins at Vanderbilt and 442 overall as a head coach. He has eight 20 -win seasons in the last 12 seasons, with 11 total postseason appearances, six NCAA tournaments, and two Sweet 16's (2004 and 2007). He is also one of five SEC coaches to win 300 or more games at one institution, joining Kentucky's Adolph Rupp, Florida's Billy Donovan, and LSU's Dale Brown and Harry Rabenhorst, and is now in 6th place all-time on the SEC wins list.
$\star$ This is the fifth consecutive week Vanderbilt has been ranked in the top 25 of the Associated Press and Coaches Polls. The Commodores check in at number 21 in the AP poll and number 16 in the USA Today/Coaches Poll. It marks the longest consecutive streak for Vanderbilt since being ranked for six weeks in a row from January 3-February 28, 2011. $\star$ The Commodores have three players at seven feet or higher in their front court - Josh Henderson (7'0), Damian Jones (7'0), and Luke Kornet (7'1). LSU has two seven footers, and the rest of the league has one or fewer.

Riley LaChance leads the conference in assist to turnover ratio at 4.1, and Luke Kornet leads the league in blocks (2.8). Wade Baldwin is fourth in free throw percentage (.857) and tied for seventh in field goal percentage (.554), and Damian Jones is seventh in blocks (1.9). |

| JONES <br> ON <br> WATCH <br> LISTS | Damian Jones has been named to numerous preseason watch lists, including the Wooden Award, given to the nation's top player, the Lute Olson Award, presented to the nation's top Division I player who has played at least two seasons, and the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award, given to the nation's top center. Damian Jones was the team's leading scorer and rebounder in 2014-15, averaging 14.5 points and 6.5 rebounds per contest. He scored $20+$ points in eight games as a sophomore and finished first in the SEC in field goal percentage, 3rd in blocks (2.0), and 10th in scoring. Jones was named an All-SEC First-Team selection in 2015 and a preseason first-team member by the league's coaches and media prior to this season. |

The Commodores' 186 blocks ranked 15th nationally for the season. So far in 2015-16, Vanderbilt is ahead of last year's pace, blocking an average of 6.6 shots per contest and are tied for sixth nationally in the category. |
| ASSIST NUMBERS | Vanderbilt had 541 assists on the season in 2014-15, which tied the seventh-best season in Commodore history for assists. Wade Baldwin had 155 assists to lead all Commodore players for the year. This season, Vanderbilt has 125 assists against only 84 turnovers and LaChance leads the team with 29 assists individually. |

## -Consensus Top 20 preseason team

-Wade Baldwin named a breakout candidate by CBSSports.com
Q: Wade Baldwin has a 6-10 wingspan and shot 40+\% from 3 as a freshman. Do you see him skyrocketing up your big board?
A: Baldwin is definitely one of my biggest breakout candidates this season nationally. Vanderbilt has a shot to be really good, and Baldwin will be the maestro of their team after Shelton Mitchell transferred. Few teams are better coached offensively than the Commodores, as Kevin Stallings can really get the most out of a group with the way he can create space with sets on offense. Baldwin will be a rather large beneficiary of that this season, just like he was last year.

Baldwin's a pretty awesome drive and kick player, and it showed last year with his 31.2 assist rate. He's also a strong defensive player due to that quickness and, as you mention, the long arms. He was the only freshman in the country to have a 30 -plus assist rate and a 3 -plus steal rate last year. Plus, he's a great rebounder for a point guard. That's the basis of his game, before you even get to the jump shot that was so effective last year. I'm still not 100 percent sold on his jumper given that it was the major question about his game coming into his maiden collegiate voyage, but if it keeps up around 40 percent on more attempts that would be the icing on the cake.

Basically, with just marginal growth this year, Baldwin could be looking at an excellent 12 points, five assists, four rebounds, two steals per game line on solid efficiency while leading Vandy to the NCAA Tournament. He's capable of making "the leap" this season. It's just incumbent upon him to do the work necessary to get there. He's already on the NBA's radar, but that kind of improvement would put him in the first round mix over the next two years.

## Recap

WACO (AP) -- No. 16 Vanderbilt is 0-2 against the Big 12 this season.

The Commodores couldn't hold on after scoring 17 points in a row midway through the second half, as No. 25 Baylor erased a 13-point deficit on way to a 69-67 victory Sunday night when Lester Medford made a 3 -pointer while being fouled in the final minute.
"They got aggressive. We turned the ball over like crazy and just didn't play like we needed to play, the way we had played to that point," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "But you've got to give them credit. They became the aggressors."

The Bears (6-1) missed nine shots in a row before Prince hit a 3-pointer to finally end their scoring drought and start a stretch when Vanderbilt (6-2) had four of its 17 turnovers. Prince had seven points in the 13-0 run to get the Bears even, including a one-hander off the glass while falling down and his steal that led to a fadeaway jumper.
"He's a good player, very versatile," Vandy guard Matthew Fisher-Davis said. "I guess I could have done a better job on him."

Vandy also lost to No. 4 Kansas, the perennial Big 12 champion and again preseason favorite. The Jayhawks beat the Commodores 70-63 in Maui last month.

Wade Baldwin IV had 19 points for the Commodores, but fouled out when he knocked down Medford on the game-winning shot with 42 seconds left -- the last points scored in the game. Fisher-Davis had 11 points.

Fisher-Davis had a pair of 3-pointers and two assists in the 17-0 run over a 5-minute span. His later assist came on Baldwin's run-capping 3-pointer that put Vandy up 52-39.

But it was 52-all when Ismail Wainright drove the baseline for a two-handed slam with 8:40 left.

Medford finished with 15 points. Rico Gathers had 10 points and 13 rebounds, becoming Baylor's career rebounding leader.

Medford stayed sitting on the floor, gritting his teeth and shaking both fists as teammates gathered around the point guard after his big 3 from the left corner.
"Ah, man, it was electric," Prince said. "Props to AI Freeman. ... I wanted the ball, but Al got in the lane and drew two, then fed Les in the corner."

Gathers fouled out while going for the rebound when Medford missed his free throw. But Nolan Cressler missed two free throws at the other end for Vanderbilt.

The Commodores got off two shots in the final 4 seconds, including Cressler's baseline jumper after a rebound.
"It felt like pulling teeth the whole night. I felt like I was asking for things the entire night that I wasn't getting," Stallings said. "We kind of got what we deserved. We should have won the game, but we didn't deserve to."

## Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952

Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 63rd Season
Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 63rd season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 950 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

## VANDERBILT BASKETBALL QUICK HITTERS

- This is the 113 th year of Vanderbilt basketball, with the first season taking place in 1900-01. There were no teams in 1904-05 and 1905-06.
- The Commodores have been to 13 NCAA Tournaments and 12 NIT's. Vanderbilt advanced to the Elite 8 in 1965 (field of 23), and the Sweet 16 in 1988, 1993, 2004, and 2007. The Commodores captured the NIT Championship in 1990 and finished runner-up in 1994.
- The Commodores are a charter member of the SEC, with the 2015-16 season being the $82 n d$ year in the conference.
- Vanderbilt is the only private institution in the SEC with the lowest enrollment of any of the 14 schools ( 6,738 ).
- Vanderbilt's Perry Wallace became the first AfricanAmerican scholarship basketball player in the SEC when he took the court in 1967.
- The Commodores have 43 career 1,000 -point scorers, with Shan Foster (2004-08) the all-time leading scorer with 2,011 career points.
- Vanderbilt has had 12 All-Americans since 1950. They are: Billy Joe Adcock (1950), Clyde Lee (1965), Tom Hagan (1969), Jan van Breda Kolff (1974), Will Perdue (1988), Billy McCaffrey (1993), Dan Langhi (2000), Matt Freije (2004), Derrick Byars (2007), Shan Foster (2008), and John Jenkins (2011).
- The Commodores had three players drafted in the first 31 picks of the 2012 NBA Draft - John Jenkins, Atlanta, 23rd pick, Festus Ezeli, Golden State, 30th pick, Jeffery Taylor, Charlotte, 31st pick - the most by the Commodores in one draft. In all, 35 Vanderbilt players have been selected in the NBA Draft since 1950.
- The Commodores ended a 61 -year SEC Tournament drought in 2012 by claiming the tournament championship in New Orleans, the team's first SEC championship since 1951.
- Coach Stallings is the winningest coach in Vanderbilt history after surpassing legendary mentor Roy Skinner on November 15, 2013, against Lipscomb.
- Stallings has led his Commodore teams to 12 postseason tournaments since his arrival in 1999 and has had eight $20+$-win seasons. His 2004 and 2007 teams advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since the tournament expanded to $64+$ teams.
- Stallings has appeared in the NCAA Tournament six times, including a stretch of three consecutive appearances from 2010-2012. It was the first time in school history that Vanderbilt has advanced to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments.
- All three of the university's top all-time scorers played for Coach Stallings (Foster, Jeffery Taylor, Matt Freije). John Jenkins, who is 10 th on the list, also played for him.
- Vanderbilt's intercollegiate athletics teams are nicknamed the Commodores, in honor of the nickname given to founder Cornelius Vanderbilt, who made his fortune in shipping. Vanderbilt donated $\$ 1$ million to begin "Central University" in 1875 - the campus was later renamed for Cornelius because of his generosity. Cornelius never stepped foot on the campus that bears his namesake.

NASHVILLE - The 18th-ranked Vanderbilt Commodores know how to start off a season strong, and tuning up with scrimmages against North Carolina and Virginia certainly helped.

Luke Kornet had 13 points and 13 rebounds and №. 18 Vanderbilt routed Austin Peay 80-41 on Friday night in the opening round of the Maui Invitational and the season opener for both teams. The Commodores opened the game scoring the first 21 points and hit their first nine shots inside the arc.
"We've had a couple scrimmages against two of the best teams in the country, and l'm not surprised we were on our game because we've been on our game most of the fall," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "So confidence comes from knowing what to expect, and । have confidence in our team because they give me reason to expect that they're going play hard."

Vanderbilt came into the season ranked for the first time since the 2011-12 season and only the seventh time ever. Stallings has four starters back from the team that went 21-14 and won 10 of its final 14 games before losing in the NIT quarterfinals.

Wade Baldwin IV led Vandy with 14 points, and Damian Jones added 12. The Commodores will play St. John's in Maui on Nov. 23.

Khalil Davis scored 10 Points for Austin Peay. This was one of two guarantee games for Austin Peay, from the Ohio Valley Conference, this season, and coach Dave Loos said the Commodores putting a pair of 7 -footers on the court early affected his Governors.
"We obviously got off to a terrible start, and Vanderbilt got off to a great start," Loos said. "They're a good basketball team. I think they're as advertised, certainly in my book. They're big, they make shots, they overwhelmed us obviously early."

The last time these teams met in December 2013, Austin Peay just missed a tip-in with a second left in a $58-56$ loss. This time, Fisher-Davis hit a 3 -pointer within the opening minute, and the Commodores never let it get closer than that.

Stallings was able to go to his bench early, playing three of his four freshmen. Baldwin stole an inbound pass by Austin Peay that appeared thrown to him and scored Vandy's final bucket of the first half. Vandy led 47-15 at halftime. Stallings pulled all but one starter with $9: 08$ left and a $69-28$ lead.

NASHVILLE - There was nothing tentative about Jeff Roberson's play Monday night.

After missing Vanderbilt's season opener with a concussion, Roberson returned to the court against GardnerWebb and had a productive performance off the bench. He scored a career-high 18 points and tied a personal best with eight rebounds as the 17th-ranked Commodores cruised to a 98-62 win.
"Jeff played a man's game tonight," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "He got in there and was physical, and played great defensively. He was great on the boards, both offensive and defensive. Scored inside, he made it from the perimeter, he drove it and did a great job at the foul line."

Vanderbilt (2-0) really needed Roberson, too, after starting forward Luke Kornet was sidelined with a sprained ankle with 2:17 left in the first half.

Roberson shot 6 of 8 from the floor and 5 for 6 at the foul line. The 6 -foot- 6 sophomore from Houston had four offensive rebounds.
"I guess I do whatever I've got to do," said Roberson, known more for his defensive abilities. "Obviously, I wish Luke didn't get hurt, but we have a lot of depth on this team. Throughout the season anybody should be ready because you never know when your time is coming."

Kornet, a 7 -foot-1 junior, was off to a strong start with a team-high 10 points at halftime. His status for Thursday's game against Stony Brook was uncertain.

Riley LaChance added 13 points, including three 3-pointers, for Vanderbilt.

Tyrell Nelson led Gardner-Webb (0-2) with 16 points, and Harold McBride added 10.

The Commodores, who return six of their top seven scorers from last season's NIT quarterfinal team, forced 19 turnovers with their defensive pressure. They outscored the Runnin' Bulldogs 35-9 in points off turnovers.

Gardner-Webb, which beat Purdue and Clemson en route to a 20 -win season in 2014-15, had an off night on offense and shot 42 percent from the floor.

Vanderbilt looked crisp on the other end, hitting 58.2 percent. The Commodores went 11 of 23 from beyond the 3-point stripe.

Vanderbilt's Damian Jones, a 7-foot center, had a solid night with 10 points and seven rebounds.

NASHVILLE - Back in August, Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings warned his team about the third game of the season. He was right.
The 17th-ranked Commodores needed a late rally to beat unheralded Stony Brook 79-72 in overtime on Thursday night.

A bruised back kept Wade Baldwin IV out of the starting lineup for the first time in 22 games, but he still led the Commodores (3-0) with 21 points off the bench.

Baldwin also gave teammate Damian Jones a pep talk during a timeout late in the game. He told Jones he was the best player on the floor and he needed to start acting like it.

Jones bounced back from a slow start with 13 points and six rebounds.

Vanderbilt (3-0) outscored Stony Brook 13-6 in overtime, as the Commodores hit 9 of 10 from the foul line.

Stony Brook's Carson Puriefoy made a layup with one second left in regulation to send the game into overtime tied at 66 . He finished with 16 points for the Seawolves (1-1).

Vanderbilt's Riley LaChance had 13 points and Matthew Fisher-Davis scored 11.

Commodores forward Luke Kornet, who missed the last 22 minutes of Monday's win over Gardner-Webb with a sprained ankle, scored nine.

Stony Brook went 4 of 17 from beyond the arc and Vanderbilt wasn't much better at 5 of 18.

Jameel Warney, a two-time America East player of the year, led the Seawolves with 22 points and 11 rebounds. He led the nation in double-doubles (24) and total rebounds (409) last season.

Warney, a 6-foot-8 forward, and Jones, a 7-foot center, are both NBA prospects.

Stony Brook's Ahmad Walker added 13 points and Lucas Woodhouse grabbed 11 rebounds.

After trailing by as many as 10 in the second half, LaChance's 3-pointer tied the score at 62 for Vanderbilt with 2:16 left in regulation.

Stony Brook tied it at 64 on Warney's jumper with 1:21 remaining in regulation and a layup by Jones gave Vanderbilt a 66-64 lead with 1:01 left. But Puriefoy's layup tied it and led to the overtime.

Stony Brook made seven of its first 12 shots to take a 19-9 lead on Puriefoy's jumper with 12:40 left in the first half.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings knew his team was ready to compete. He just didn't expect the 19th-ranked Commodores' $92-55$ victory over St. John's in the opening round of the Maui Invitational.
"I don't think you ever anticipate a game like that," he said after his team shot 53 percent from the field, 48 percent from 3-point range and outrebounded the Red Storm 49-26. "We had a lot of people play well and we shot the ball well."

Jeff Roberson had 11 points and 13 rebounds for Vanderbilt, which opened the game with a 27-4 run. Vanderbilt scored the game's first nine points and it only got worse from there for the Red Storm (3-1), who lost for the first time under first-year coach Chris Mullin and nearly suffered the worst loss in school history.

Luke Kornet, one of Vanderbilt's three 7-footers, had 13 points and seven rebounds, and Camron Justice added 11 points.
"Rebounding is a lot about mentality," Kornet said. "I just tried to be as much of a physical presence as I could around the goal."

Federico Mussini led the Red Storm with 14 points.
When the Commodores went up $30-5$, they had
made 10 of their first 18 shots from the field. St. John's had made two of 18 in the same span.

The lead got as high as $48-15$ with $3: 39$ to play in the first half, and the Commodores led 53-24 at the break.

The biggest lead was 41 points with 2:31 to play. Stallings had a chance to give players more minutes than normal.
"When we got the lead that was something we tried to do with three games in three days," Stallings said.

Damian Jones, the Commodores' second-leading scorer and rebounder, played 14 minutes and had five points and five rebounds.
"He's the leader of our band," Stallings said, "and if we want to do what we think we can in this tournament, he'll be a big part of it."

Depth was certainly an issue, with Vanderbilt's subs outscoring St. John's 26-0 in the first half.

St. John's played without freshman guard Malik Ellison (foot) and junior college transfer forward Darien Williams (shoulder).

LAHAINA, Hawaii - Wade Baldwin IV and Damian Jones both scored 17 points, and the No. 19 Commodores used their size, depth and shooting to beat Wake Forest 86-64 on Tuesday night.
"I thought that our guys played, again, very inspired," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "But I thought fatigue might have played a little bit of a part in that game. I thought maybe our team being a little deeper than theirs had an impact. They made a great run after we ran on them at the beginning. They made a great run to get back in the game.
''Then I thought from that point forward we were able to establish control and never really relinquish it. ...I like how we're playing."

What coach wouldn't?
Jones, who grabbed 10 rebounds, was 6 for 10 from the field and Baldwin was ever better at 6 for 8 . The Commodores were never threatened in the second half and led by as many as 24 points.

Vanderbilt (5-0) will play the winner of the game between No. 5 Kansas and UCLA for the championship on Wednesday.

The game couldn't have started much worse for Wake Forest (3-2). While Vanderbilt was opening 9 of 13 from the field, the Demon Deacons missed 12 of their first 13 shots. That amounted to a $21-5$ lead for the Commodores, who beat St. John's $92-55$ in the first round.

Wake Forest was able to get within $30-24$ with 6 minutes left in the first half, but Vanderbilt went on a 10-0 run that was started and ended by Jones scoring inside. The Commodores stayed comfortably in front this time and led 43-28 at halftime.

Jeff Roberson had 10 points and seven rebounds for Vanderbilt, and Riley LaChance had nine points and six assists.

Jones had five points and five rebounds in 14 foul-plagued minutes against St. John's. He had an easy explanation for his improvement from one game to the next.
"'Stayed out of foul trouble," he said.
Freshman point guard Bryant Crawford, who had the winning basket in the closing seconds of the first-round win over No. 13 Indiana, led the Demon Deacons with 15 points. John Collins scored 14 and Devin Thomas added 13.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - Wayne Selden Jr. scored 25 points on 8-of-11 shooting, and the Jayhawks beat No. 19 Vanderbilt 70-63 on Wednesday for the tournament title.

Selden was 4 of 6 from 3 -point range. He also had seven rebounds.

The Jayhawks (4-1) did what no other team in the field could do, take a lead over the Commodores (5-1). It didn't happen until the second half but when they got it they extended it to as many as 13 points.

Kansas trailed by 10 points midway through the first half and the Jayhawks were able to cut the lead to 30-26 at halftime.

They took control with their offense, shooting 62.5 percent (15 of 24) in the second half. They got the lead for the first time with $18: 16$ to play on a jumper by Mason, and Vanderbilt never was in front again.
"I thought that we played a lot better in the first half than we did in the second. I'm guessing that Bill felt like they probably played a lot better in the second half than they did in the first," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "But, you know, shots that we are pretty accustomed to making, we didn't make today."

Vanderbilt closed to 68-63 with 16 seconds to play, and Mason and Jamari Traylor each made one free throw for the final margin.
"In the second half, they just came out and we got a little lazy and had some misses defensively," Vanderbilt's Luke Kornet said. "And they just came out made shots and we never really made the shots to counter it."

Devonte Graham had 12 points for Kansas, and Mason added 10.
Damian Jones led the Commodores with 17 points. Kornet had 14, and Wade Baldwin IV 11.

Jones grabbed 10 rebounds, but the Jayhawks, led by Perry Ellis' eight, outrebounded Vanderbilt 39-32.

Kansas won this tournament in 1996 and title No. 2 came with wins over St. John's, Wake Forest and the Commodores.


NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt held Detroit to just five made field goals inside the arc. Coach Kevin Stallings was a bit more upset that his Commodores gave up 11 3-pointers, even in a rout.

Wade Baldwin IV led seven Commodores in double figures with 20 points, and No. 16 Vanderbilt beat Detroit 102-52 in a quick stop at home.

The Commodores (6-1) played their first game since finishing second to Kansas in the Maui Invitational last week, and they visit No. 25 Baylor on Sunday. This was the first time Vanderbilt has had six players in double figures since Nov. 11, 2008, against Central Arkansas, and the
Commodores hadn't scored 100 since Feb. 12, 2012, in a 102-76 win at Mississippi.

Nolan Cressler scored 14 points, his most since transferring to Vanderbilt. Matthew Fisher-Davis hit four 3-pointers in scoring a season-high 12 points. Josh Henderson finished with 11, and Damian Jones, Riley LaChance and Joe Toye all had 10 each.

Anton Wilson led Detroit (2-3) with 14 points. Jarod Williams had 12, and Chris Jenkins and Josh McFolley each had 11.

The Horizon League team came in tied for second in the nation scoring 96 points a game and scored the first five points. The Titans were tied twice.

Then Vanderbilt shook off its jet lag going on a 31-7 spurt that featured 14 straight points as the Titans missed 11 straight shots. The Commodores also strung together another 10-0 run as they just kept pushing their lead with a 3-pointer by Fisher-Davis putting them up 36-14 with 3:26 left.

Then the Titans hit three straight buckets, including back-to-back 3s. That prompted Stallings to take a timeout, and he slammed his dry erase board down on the floor as his Commodores huddled around.

Vanderbilt finished the half scoring the final nine points in leading 47-20 at halftime.

In the second half, the Commodores led by as much as 50 when Cressler hit a 3 with 7:55 left at 86-36. They matched with the final margin with Stallings playing 13 players.


WACO, Texas - The Commodores couldn't hold on after scoring 17 points in a row midway through the second half, as Baylor erased a 13-point deficit on way to a 69-67 victory when Lester Medford made a 3-pointer while being fouled in the final minute.

The Bears (6-1) missed nine shots in a row before Prince hit a 3-pointer to finally end their scoring drought and start a stretch when Vanderbilt (6-2) had four of its 17 turnovers. Prince had seven points in the 13-0 run to get the Bears even, including a one-hander off the glass while falling down and his steal that led to a fadeaway jumper.

Wade Baldwin IV had 19 points for the Commodores, but fouled out when he knocked down Medford on the game-winning shot with 42 seconds left -- the last points scored in the game. Fisher-Davis had 11 points.

Fisher-Davis had a pair of 3-pointers and two assists in the 17-0 run over a 5 -minute span. His later assist came on Baldwin's run-capping 3-pointer that put Vandy up 52-39.

But it was 52-all when Ismail Wainright drove the baseline for a two-handed slam with 8:40 left.

Medford finished with 15 points. Rico Gathers had 10 points and 13 rebounds, becoming Baylor's career rebounding leader.

Medford stayed sitting on the floor, gritting his teeth and shaking both fists as teammates gathered around the point guard after his big 3 from the left corner.

Gathers fouled out while going for the rebound when Medford missed his free throw. But Nolan Cressler missed two free throws at the other end for Vanderbilt.

The Commodores got off two shots in the final 4 seconds, including Cressler's baseline jumper after a rebound.
