MIEDIA INPORMATION

The Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office welcomes your interest in the Vanderbilt women's basketball program. We will make every effort to meet your needs throughout the season. Following is information and guidelines to help you during the season and allow our coaches and players to adhere to their schedules.

## Credentials

The Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office issues season media credentials to authorized full-time or specified representatives of media outlets who cover Vanderbilt basketball on a regular basis. Single-game credentials also will be available for media who cover the team less frequently, should space allow. Please e-mail credential requests to the attention of women's basketball contact, Michael Scholl. Vanderbilt Communications reserves the right to confirm employment by a media outlet. Season credentials are issued jointly for men's and women's basketball.

## Credential Pick-Up

Credentials are available for pick-up at Media Will Call located near the playing floor at Memorial Gymnasium. Those media wishing to access Media Will Call should enter the service tunnel located at the end of Lot 71 behind the outfield wall of Vanderbilt's Hawkins Field baseball stadium. Proceed through the tunnel until you arrive at the Media Will Call table. If enough advance notice is given, credentials can be mailed or sent via next-day carrier at the expense of the media organization making the request.

## Media Parking

Media parking is located inside the 25th Avenue Garage located at the southeast corner of 25th Avenue and Jess Neely Drive. After parking, please enter Memorial Gymnasium through the service tunnel entrance located at the end of Lot 71 behind the outfield wall of Vanderbilt's Hawkins Field baseball stadium. Vehicles parked in Lot 71 without the proper parking pass will be towed.

## Media Seating

Media covering Vanderbilt basketball games are seated at various locations inside Memorial Gymnasium. A select number of seats are available on the floor, usually reserved for Nashville beatwriters and radio crews from both schools. An additional 20 seats are available inside Suite 5 located on the northside concourse (above Section C), reserved for media following the visiting team and Nashville radio and television media.

## Media Workroom

Memorial Gymnasium's media workroom is located in the northeast corner of the facility, nearest the opponents' bench. This room will serve as a place for pregame meals as well as an area for the media to work after the game. The room is equipped with telephone and data lines, as well as wireless internet. For access to wireless internet, please see a member of the communications staff.

## General Communications Possibilities

Wireless internet is available in all seating areas at Memorial Gym, in addition to a very limited number of data ports. For access to the wireless network, see a member of the communications staff. For data lines, it is recommended you request access in advance from Michael Scholl. Visiting radio stations are provided with the option of a phone line or ISDN line, in accordance with Southeastern Conference policy. Visiting radios in need of a data line should contact Michael Scholl at least 24 hours in advance of the game.

## Postgame Interview Format

For non-conference games, Head Coach Melanie Balcomb and two-to-three requested Vanderbilt players will be made available in the media interview room, located down the hall from the work room. Media wishing to speak with coaches or players from the visiting team may coordinate with that institution's sports information representative. For SEC games, in accordance with league policy, the visiting coach will be made available first in the media interview room, followed by the Vanderbilt coach and players. Visiting player requests can be made with that team's sports information representative. Specific player requests for Vanderbilt can be made with Michael Scholl no later than the final media time out in regulation.

## Road Interview Policy

In accordance with SEC policy, visiting coaches will be made to available to the media within a designated window following the game. The location is at the discretion of the host's sports information staff. Vanderbilt players can be made available through Michael Scholl, with a location also at the discretion of the home sports information staff.

## Visiting Radio

In accordance with Southeastern Conference policy, a traditional phone line and ISDN line are available to the visiting school's official radio network. Any additional radio broadcasts (including student radio) or any needs beyond phone line or ISDN line (such as data line) should contact Michael Scholl at least 24 hours in advance of the contest.

## General Media Policies

## Interviewing the Commodores

It is the policy of Vanderbilt Athletics to coordinate all interviews with coaches and student-athletes through the communications department. Please contact Michael Scholl at least 24 hours in advance of any needs.

## Practice Coverage

Vanderbilt players and coaches are available for interviews prior to practices on designated days. Practice schedules are sent via e-mail to media multiple times each week during the season to help facilitate coverage. Contact Michael Scholl if you wish to receive these updates. Player interviews typically begin 45 minutes before practice at Memorial Gymnasium. Interviews with Coach Balcomb follow. Media are typically allowed to attend practices, but must receive permission in advance. Gameday walk-throughs are closed to the media at both Memorial Gymnasium and all road venues.

The official web site of Vanderbilt Student Athletics has all of your information needs. Pregame notes, including updated statistics, can be easily downloaded in PDF format. Following each contest is a game summary, boxscore, and postgame notes and quotes.

## Vanderbilt Games on the Radio and Internet

Vanderbilt basketball can be heard live on WNSR-AM 560. Selected games will also be carried on networks of affiliate stations across the mid-state area. Charlie Mattos returns for his 18th year as the voice of the Commodores. All games will be streamed and archived on the internet at the Commodores' official web site, vucommodores.com. You can also keep up with the Commodores on the internet through Gametracker live stats. Just check the women's basketball schedule page for the "live stats" link for a running box score throughout the game.

## Photography

All photographers are restricted to the designated areas along the baseline opposite the home and visitor benches and must sign an affidavit agreeing to the SEC's new policy concerning photography. Strobe lights may not be installed in Memorial Gymnasium without permission from the Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office. When using photo images provided by the Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office, please credit: Vanderbilt Photography.

## Guidelines for Granting Media Credentials to Online Media Representatives

The following is a set of guidelines that the Vanderbilt University Athletic Communications Office will use as a basis for issuing media credentials to independent online media representatives (bloggers). Overall, Vanderbilt University strives to work with individuals who adhere to professional standards, demonstrate transparency in their operations, and regularly produce quality content. While what follows shall serve as a guideline, they may be altered for certain events when necessary and are subject to regulations set forth by the Southeastern Conference and/or the NCAA.

- Individuals associated with a web-only media outlet may apply for credentials on a game-by-game basis unless otherwise specified. Requests for credentials must be sent via e-mail, fax or in writing to the requested Athletic Communications Director and be received at least three (3) business days prior to the event. Request should include applicant's legal name, company or blog they are representing, a mailing address and website address.
- The Athletic Communications Office requires that a requesting outlet possess its own domain name (.com, .net, etc.) and will not accept requests from sites based on free services (blogspot, wordpress, etc.).
- First time applicants must submit traffic/subscriber data from an independent source in order to be considered. Sites with fewer than 25,000 legitimate unique visitors per month are not eligible for football or men's basketball credentialing. Sites with fewer than 7,500 legitimate unique visitors per month are not eligible for women's basketball credentialing.
- In the interest of protecting the Vanderbilt University fan base, we require that all applicants that give users ability to submit comments and/or place cookies on user's computers supply a privacy policy that describes in full how the data collected through such activities is used or disseminated.
- Athletic Communications seeks to perpetuate the program and sport being credentialed and therefore prefers to work with online media outlets with an established track record covering our school, our conference or the requested sport. In the request, please provide a short summary of previous relevant experience, if any.
- As a general guideline, we would like to work with outlets that have been in continuous operation for at least 3-6 months. Additionally, an average of $3-5$ substantive postings per week is expected in season from applicant web sites.
- Obtaining media credentials is an opportunity to interview players and team officials for legitimate media purposes only. Bloggers who are granted access to the press box and other areas inside the venue are expected to act professionally and adhere to all SEC and NCAA-mandated media guidelines at all times.
- The standard of professionalism also extends to content posted on the requesting website, whether posted by the requester, user or other agent. Profanity, racial or sexual comments will not be tolerated from credentialed outlets.
- No credentials will be issued to individuals under the age of 18.
- Vanderbilt University reserves the right of its personnel to deny or revoke credentials without notice and an individual shall surrender their credential upon request for violating the policies and/or safety procedures of security personnel, Vanderbilt University, the Southeastern Conference, or the NCAA.

# SEASON OUTHOOK <br> 2012-13 <br> SEASDN PREVIEW 

When a program returns 10 of 11 players and all five starters, including the Southeastern Conference's leading scorer, while adding to the mix a top- 25 recruiting class, expectations will be high.

Throw in the fact that Head Coach Melanie Balcomb has led the Vanderbilt women's basketball team to at least 20 wins and an NCAA Tournament bid in each of her 10 seasons in Nashville, and the expectations grow a little more.
> "When I came to Vanderbilt, I didn't want peaks and valleys," Balcomb said. "I knew there would be some transition years because of recruiting. That's why I'm excited about the future. Bringing this freshman class in that's a top- 25 class and hopefully continuing to get better and raise the talent level."

In trying to raise the level of the team, Balcomb has put together an aggressive schedule that includes five non-conference opponents who reached postseason play in 2012 and a total of 16 games against teams that received postseason bids.

The Commodores will hit the road early and often, including a neutral-site tournament in Puerto Rico where they will face Virginia and Florida State. Other trips will include Dayton, Western Kentucky, Oklahoma and Southern Cal.

In addition, Vanderbilt will take on a 16-game SEC slate that includes two games each against Tennessee, Texas A\&M and Ole Miss. The Commodores will visit NCAA teams South Carolina, Florida and Georgia while
playing host to tournament teams Kentucky and Arkansas.
"I feel like it's a year we can get out there and play some good programs early on to test ourselves to make a run at the SEC," Balcomb explained. "We have the confidence and experience to be able to handle bigger games earlier and on the road."

That experience can be seen most in the six juniors and seniors on the roster.

The senior class includes guards Gabby Smith and Elan Brown, along with forward Tiffany Clarke.
"Gabby has been a great leader, on and off the court," Balcomb said of the Cincinnati native. "Last year, she took a step backwards with the injuries, but I'm really hoping she can have a nice year."

Brown and Clarke are the two of the players Balcomb will look to most as a steady, consistent hand on the floor.
"Tiffany and Elan have just progressed each year, getting tougher mentally and physically each year," Balcomb said. "They have the experience to really have consistent and productive senior seasons."

The junior class contains Christina Foggie, who led the SEC in scoring at 17.7 points per game last season, point guard Jasmine Lister and center Stephanie Holzer.
"My philosophy in recruiting is you need a point, a post and a shooter," Balcomb said.

"This class gives us that. The more we can develop the three of them into more than just those roles and into complete players, they more they can help us."

The sophomore class shows that philosophy as well. Kady Schrann was the next in a long line of freshman to crack Balcomb's starting lineup. Fellow guard Maggie Morrison was seeing heavy minutes as the backup point guard before a kneed injury ended her season in December. Clair Watkins began to develop as a reliable alternative to Holzer and Clarke in the post.

Balcomb is very excited about the impact a healthy Morrison could have this year.
"She allows us to put her at point and move Jasmine to the two-guard," Balcomb said. "That lets us play Christina at the three and now you have Jaz at the two and Christina at the three, that's really difficult to defend."

In addition to 10 returning players, Balcomb brings in a six-player freshman class that was ranked among the top- 25 nationally. It will be the first time in Balcomb's tenure that her team will use the full compliment of scholarships allotted by the NCAA.
"This is the first time l've had the full roster," Balcomb said. "You have to be prepared for kids to miss practice and I just felt if we had the scholarships, we need to use them."

Like Balcomb's other classes, the group covers a wide range of positions. There are two guards in Jasmine Jenkins and Morgan Batey, two wing players in Heather Bowe and Kristen Gaffney and a pair of posts in Rayte'a Long and Kendall Shaw.
"We went for all different pieces in that class that we felt we needed, but one big piece was the four," Balcomb said. "We want to extend the defense and get some players that are undersized, but can extend a defense and face-up. Kristen, Heather and Rayte'a are different, but they are all that."

Balcomb feels Bowe and Shaw, especially, will make an immediate impact.
"Heather will help us right away," Balcomb says. "She's already playing like a junior. She has an incredible work ethic, so I think you'll see her working as a compliment with Steph and Tiff right away. Same with Kendall. I like the size she gives us, especially in the defensive end, but at 6-4, she can also face-up."

Jenkins and Batey will also contribute to the team's depth at guard.
"Morgan gives us that bigger, longer, rebounding guard that we needed," Balcomb said. "While J.J. gives us that point guard experience and strength that we needed last year."

Gaffney will begin her collegiate career recovering from a knee injury sustained during her senior season.

Balcomb will be looking to make history this year. Averaging better than 23 wins per season over her first decade at Vanderbilt, if the coach gets to 19 victories this season she will pass Jim Foster to become the program's all-time winningest coach.

The season begins on November 10 when McNeese State visits Memorial Gym and ideally culminates with the NCAA Final Four in New Orleans, April 7-9.

# Melanie BALCDMB

11 TH SEASロN
The numbers say it all -10 seasons， 10 NCAA Tournaments， 10 seasons of at least 20 wins． Vanderbilt women＇s basketball has been a model of consistency under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb． That＇s not to mention three SEC Tournament Championships，four Sweet 16 trips and eight top－25 finishes over a decade in Nashville．

Since arriving in 2002，Balcomb has posted a 238－94（．717）record at Vanderbilt，averaging 23.8 wins per season．Should she match that pace in season 11，Balcomb will become the winningest coach in program history（Jim Foster，256－99 in 11 season）．Balcomb was the fastest in program his－ tory to reach 200 wins，reaching that mark in five fewer games than Foster．

Balcomb is one of just eight coaches in the nation to have led a program to each of the last 10 NCAA Tournaments．In 2012，she becomes the second longest－tenured coach in the Southeastern Conference，trailing only Georgia＇s Andy Landers（ 33 seasons）．Over her 10 seasons at Vanderbilt，Bal－ comb has coached eight WNBA draft picks，a WBCA National Defensive Player of the Year（Jennifer Risper），a WBCA National Scholar－Athlete of the Year（Christina Wirth）and an SEC scoring champion （Christina Foggie），while graduating 100\％of her players．

With nearly 20 years of collegiate head coaching experience，Balcomb is a renowned offensive strategist．Her 10 seasons at Vanderbilt have only enhanced that reputation．Every Commodore squad has finished in the top－20 nationally in field goal percentage，averaging a finish of 7.8 nationally （including four teams that have finished top－four nationally）．Balcomb＇s inaugural Commodore team in 2002－03 led the nation in field goal percentage，shooting 51．3\％．

The Commodores have shot just as well from three－point range，averaging a top－15 finish in three－ point percentage among Division I teams with top－40 finishes every season．Balcomb＇s 2006－07 squad led the nation in three－point shooting at 43．7\％，while her most recent edition finished sixth nationally at $37.2 \%$ ．

The Commodores have finished in the top－10 nationally in field－goal percentage seven times and in the top－ 10 in three－point field－goal percentage six times under Balcomb．Her teams have also finished in the top five in assists per game，free－throw percentage and scoring offense．

Balcomb＇s teams have been especially successful at home，where Vanderbilt has posted a 131－25 （．840）record at Memorial Gym．The Commodores have been almost as successful during the stretch－ run，as over the last 10 years，Vanderbilt＇s record over the final nine regular season games is 62－23， good for a .730 winning percentage．

Balcomb＇s success as a head coach is not limited to Vanderbilt．Before arriving at Vanderbilt，Bal－ comb had successful coaching tenures at Ashland（Ohio）and Xavier．She picked－up her 400th career win in the opening round of the 2011 SEC Tournament and has a career mark of 401－198（．669）．The 2012－13 season－opener will be Balcomb＇s 600th game as a head coach．

The 2011－12 season saw one of Balcomb＇s youngest teams，as the squad of 11 featured just one senior，yet she still successfully steered the Commodores to a 23－10 mark and a 13 th－straight NCAA Tournament．Leading the way was break－out star Christina Foggie，who became the first Balcomb player to lead the SEC in scoring（ 17.7 ppg ）．

Foggie was a First Team All－SEC selection and was joined by four other Commodores earning All－ SEC honors－Jasmine Lister（second team），Tiffany Clarke（second team），Stephanie Holzer（honor－ able mention）and Kady Schrann（All－Freshman）．

Vanderbilt defeated three ranked opponents on the season（No． 12 Oklahoma，No． 17 Georgia and No． 11 Tennessee），earning a seven seed in the NCAA Tournament．The Commodores hosted at Memorial Gym，defeating 10th－seeded Middle Tennessee in the first round before falling to second－ seeded Duke．

Balcomb started at Vanderbilt in 2002 and wasted no time in implementing her own style of winning．Working to transition veteran players into a new system while building new team chemistry，Balcomb＇s first year saw the Commodores win six of their last seven regular season games，earn an NCAA Tournament berth，and lead the nation in field goal percentage（51．3）against the fourth toughest schedule in the country．She was named a finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year award．

In 2003－04，Balcomb led the Commodores to their fourth Southeastern Conference Tournament title．She masterfully balanced strong upper－class leadership with exciting freshmen talent，winning 10 consecutive games and advancing to the program＇s 11th Sweet 16 appearance．One year later， her team made its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet 16．The Commodores posted the most wins（10）in the program＇s history in Southeast－ ern Conference play finishing with a 10－4 record．

The Commodores were ranked seventh in the final AP poll of the 2006-07 season, and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament after winning another SEC Tournament title. That Vanderbilt squad was the nation's best three-point shooting team, and ranked among the top 10 in points scored. The team's 28-6 mark was the best record for a VU squad in 14 years.

The 2008 season was also one of Balcomb's most impressive coaching jobs. Despite graduating three All-SEC seniors, she led the Commodores to a 25-9 record and the school's 13th appearance in the NCAA sweet 16, all with two freshmen and no seniors in the starting lineup.

In 2009, Vanderbilt won its sixth SEC Tournament title, the third for Balcomb in the last six years. The team also advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 14th time in school history -- Balcomb's fourth trip with the Commodores. Vanderbilt finished
the year ranked No. 8 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll after narrowly missing an upset of No. 1 seed Maryland in the Raleigh Regional Semifinal.

National accolades came flooding in for Vanderbilt, including senior Jennifer Risper being named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Defensive Player of the Year. Risper and classmate Christina Wirth, who herself was named an All-American and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, were both selected in the 2009 WNBA Draft.

In 2010 Balcomb was faced with one of her most challenging tasks. Faced with replacing National Defensive Player of the Year Jennifer Risper and All-American Christina Wirth, Balcomb guided an undersized team back to the NCAA Tournament, where they narrowly missed advancing to their third consecutive sweet 16.

Despite having to overcome numerous injuries throughout out the season and a size disadvantage in almost every game, Vanderbilt finished the season 23-11 overall. Individually, Balcomb helped junior point guard Jence Rhoads earn first team All-SEC honors, while senior shooting guard Merideth Marsh earned second team All-SEC accolades. Elan Brown and Tiffany Clarke were also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

The 2010-11 season featured many obstacles that Balcomb successfully maneuvered through to reach another NCAA Tournament and finish third in the SEC. Injuries took an unfortunate toll on the team throughout the year with at least one of Vanderbilt's five leading scorers unavailable for 14 out of the team's 32 games. Injuries coupled with matching Georgia for the fewest upperclassmen in the SEC challenged Balcomb to use different personnel groupings regularly.

Despite the challenges, Balcomb again reached 20 wins, finishing 20-12 and 10-6 in the SEC. Individually, Balcomb helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention AllAmerica honors from the Associated Press in addition to first team All-SEC recognition. Rhoads was also a WBCA Region 3 All-American. Freshman center Stephanie Holzer was named honorable mention All-SEC, SEC Sixth Woman of the Year and to the SEC All-Freshmen team. Freshman point guard Jasmine Lister was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

In 10 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has won 13 games in the NCAA Tournament, including a 9-1 mark in the opening round. She holds a winning percentage of 65.7 against SEC opponents. In all, Balcomb owns series advantages over 10 of the 11 other schools in the SEC before 2012.

Before arriving at Vanderbilt, the Cranbury, N.J., native spent seven seasons at Xavier University. Beginning in 1995, her up-tempo style wreaked havoc on the Atlantic 10 while building the Musketeers into a national contender. In 1998, Xavier recorded its second postseason appearance in school history with a selection to the Women's National Invitational Tournament. Each of the next three seasons, Xavier competed in the NCAA Tournament, capped in 2001 by a victory over perennial power Tennessee and a run to the Elite Eight.

En route to earning three invitations to the NCAA Tournament and compiling a 136-78 record during her tenure, Balcomb's offensive schemes helped push Xavier onto the national stage. Musketeer field-goal percentages ranked among the top three in the nation during three different seasons while the 1999 squad led the country in 3 -point accuracy at 40.1 percent. Her 2000-01 squad averaged 79.4 points per game, the highest total in program history. Individual records were rewritten as well. Of the 15 Musketeers who have scored at least 1,000 points in a career, six of them played on Balcomb-coached teams.



Before her accomplishments at Xavier, Balcomb took her first head coaching position at Ashland University. Prosperity was immediate as Balcomb's first unit matched the best record in school history at 18-9 while registering its first winning season in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with an 11-7 mark.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Balcomb served three years as an assistant at Providence College (1990-93), during which the Friars went 62-30, made two NCAA Tournament appearances and once (1990-91) led the nation in scoring while they amassed a 26-6 record. In 1989-90, Balcomb was an assistant at Ohio University and she began her coaching career with a four-year stint (1985-89) on the staff at Niagara University.

In all, Balcomb has coached 19 players who have received All-SEC accolades. Nine of her players have been drafted by the WNBA, including VU's Chantelle Anderson, Ashley McElhiney, Jenni Benningfield, Ashley Earley, Carla Thomas, Dee Davis and Christina Wirth. Her Xavier teams won two league tournament titles (2000 and 2001) and one regular-season championship in the Atlantic 10 Conference (2001).

Xavier's successes during the Balcomb era helped push for construction of the Cintas Center, a state of the art facility which became home to Xavier basketball at the start of the 2000-01 season and - ironically - was dedicated with a victory over Vanderbilt. That season the program posted a school record for attendance with a total of 40,098 fans, who thrilled in the Musketeers' style of play and their results. Commodore followers have enjoyed the entertainment as well.

Her basketball education began at an early age among some of the most well respected coaches in the game. Balcomb's father, Alan, was a varsity boy's coach for 30 years at South Brunswick (N.J.) High School, and then served as an assistant for four years at Princeton University under Pete Carril, the master of the half-court game.

For Balcomb, however, a complete education goes far beyond the hardwood. Every eligible, four-year player during Balcomb's coaching tenure has earned her degree. In May of 2011, Balcomb's team earned a Public Recognition Award for finishing among the nation's top 10 percent in multi-year Academic Progress Rates (APR). Six of seven squads at Xavier earned team grade point averages that ranked in the Top 25. In 2004-05, 40 percent of the Commodore basketball team was named to the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll. Vanderbilt led the SEC with eight players being named to the honor roll in 2003-04.

Two Commodores have been named SEC Scholar Athletes of the Year under Balcomb. Hillary Hager received the honor in 2004 and Christina Wirth won it in 2009. With was also named a 2009 Lowe's Senior CLASS All-American, while receiving WBCA and NCAA post- graduate scholarships. Hager recently returned to Vanderbilt and received her doctorate in 2010.

Balcomb also stresses the importance of community service to her teams. VU logged more than 95 hours of community service last season, including numerous opportunities to visit with young patients at the Vanderbilt Children's Hospital. After the devastating Nashville flood in 2010, Balcomb and her coaching staff volunteered in helping to clean up flood-damaged areas. Balcomb herself has been active in outreach to the surrounding area, participating in numerous fundraising events for local and national organizations, including Coaches vs. Cancer, the Race for the Cure, Mercy Ministries, Vanderbilt Children's Hospital and the Girl Scouts of America. She joined colleagues to represent the SEC in the 2008 4Kay Golf Classic to benefit the Kay Yow Cancer Fund.

An avid golfer, Balcomb finds time to make it to beach on her rare weeks off, and also enjoys reading.

Vicky Picott has served as an assistant coach under Melanie Balcomb for over a decade，including the last 10 years as the post coach for the Commodores．

Under Picott the Commodores＇inside presence has played a large role in the team having an average national rank of 8th in field－goal percentage under Balcomb．

The last several seasons have produced some of Picott＇s finest coaching efforts．In 2009，the Commodores lost their starting center due to injury shortly before postseason play and Picott employed the 5－foot－8 Jennifer Risper to occupy the middle of the court．Despite a size disadvantage，Risper and forward Christina Wirth guided the Commodores to the SEC Tournament title and the Sweet 16.

In 2010，Picott again was faced with having an undersized interior．However， despite being small in stature，the Commodores advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament．Picott also helped forwards Elan Brown and Tiffany Clarke earn SEC All－Freshman honors．

In 2011，Picott helped freshman center Stephanie Holzer earn SEC Sixth Woman of the Year，honorable mention All－SEC and a spot on the SEC All－ Freshman team．

In 2012，Picott mentored Clarke（coaches honorable mention）and Holzer（AP honorable mention）to All－SEC honors．The pair both ranked in the top－10 in the league in field goal percentage and rebounds per game．

Picott has developed a number of inside players at Vanderbilt into profes－ sional prospects，including 2007 first－round WNBA draft pick Carla Thomas．In
seven seasons，six Commodores under Picott＇s tutelage have been selected in the WNBA draft，including Thomas（Chicago），second－overall pick Chantelle Anderson（2003，Sacramento），Wirth（2009，Indiana），Risper（2009，Chicago）， Jenni Benningfield（2004，Indiana）and Earley（2005，Indiana）．
＂The consistency that Vicky Picott has given our team has been invaluable，＂ Balcomb said．＂You can＇t win without that consistency．Vicky is an extremely knowledgeable teacher with a passion for the game that sets her apart．I＇m always telling kids that if they want to go to the pros as a post，they need to come play for Vicky．＂

Picott，who prepped at the same high school that produced Balcomb，came to Nashville with her fellow New Jerseyan in 2002 after two seasons at Xavier．

There，Picott helped direct the Musketeers to a 43－22 mark，including the 2000－01 campaign that featured a trip to the NCAA Tournament Mideast Regional Finals．Before joining Balcomb at Xavier，Picott served as an assistant coach at Temple from 1995－2000．She also worked as an assistant coach at Drexel during the 1994－95 season．

Picott is a 1992 graduate of Rutgers University．She still ranks fourth in school history in career points $(1,792)$ ，third in rebounds $(1,029)$ and fifth in steals （225）．A four－year starter at Rutgers，Picott was named the Atlantic－10 Freshman of the Year following the 1998 season．

She earned all－conference honors three times and was a two－time Most Valu－ able Player of her team．Picott also earned the New Jersey Sports Writers Player of the Year and District II Regional All－America honors her senior season．For her efforts，Picott was inducted into the Rutgers Hall of Fame on April 26， 1998.

Picott boasts extensive international experience，as well．She was selected to two Olympic Festival Teams $(1987,1989)$ and was a member of the Junior World Championship team that won gold after competing in Sao Paulo，Brazil． Picott played in the Women＇s Professional Basketball Association in Luxembourg （1992－93），helping to lead the Etzella Team to the Luxembourg Cup Championship． While in Luxembourg，she continued her development in coaching by working with high school teams．

Kim Rosamond is in her sixth season at Vanderbilt as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for Melanie Balcomb＇s Commodores．

Hired before the 2007－08 season Rosamond brought 10 years of SEC experi－ ence as a player and coach with her to Vanderbilt，in addition to two season spent locally at Middle Tennessee State．Rosamond coordinates Vanderbilt＇s recruiting efforts while also contributing to every facet of scouting，player devel－ opment and on－court strategy．

Rosamond＇s impact in recruiting was felt almost immediately．In 2009， 2010 and 2011，Rosamond was instrumental in the Commodores bringing in recruit－ ing classes that were ranked among the nation＇s best by numerous reporting services．

The six－member 2012－13 freshman class earned a top－25 ranking from ESPN HoopGurlz，while including two top－100 ESPN players in Morgan Batey and Jasmine Jenkins，while Kristen Gaffney and Heather Bowe were each named Associated Press Players of the Year in North Carolina and Wisconsin，respec－ tively．Gaffney and Bowe also picked up Parade All－America honors．

In each of the last three seasons，two players Rosamond helped bring to Vanderbilt earned SEC All－Freshman honors．In 2010 it was Elan Brown and Tiffany Clarke and in 2011 it was Stephanie Holzer（redshirt）and Jasmine Lister， while Kady Schrann made the list in 2012.
＂Kim has come in and made recruiting a full－time job，＂Balcomb said．＂She
is really helping us get ahead on the recruiting front， and get after that next－level talent．Kim is high energy and takes a great deal of pride in her job．On top of doing a tremendous amount of relationship－building for us，Kim has an outstanding knowledge of the game of basketball．＂

At MTSU，Rosamond was hired by Stephany Smith in 2003 as an assistant coach．She would serve as the interim head coach when Smith left in 2005．During her tenure in Murfreesboro，the Lady Raiders boasted consecutive 24 －win seasons while capturing a pair of Sun Belt Conference championships and scoring two first－round NCAA Tournament upsets（over North Carolina and North Carolina State，respectively）．

Prior to her time at MTSU，Rosamond spent five years as an assistant at her alma mater，Ole Miss．She was hired onto Coach Ron Aldy＇s staff in 1998 just months after graduating and would be promoted to recruiting coordinator in 2001.

Rosamond was responsible for bringing a pair top－50 classes to Oxford．Two Tennessee Miss Basketball selections were included in her Lady Rebel classes， with her final group of signees — highlighted by All－American Armintie Price－ having reached the NCAA Elite Eight in 2007.

Rosamond attended high school at Winston Academy in Louisville，Miss．， where she was recruited to Ole Miss by Van Chancellor．She was a four－year letterwinner for the Lady Rebels（1995－98）．Following her senior year，Rosamond was the recipient of the team＇s Lady Rebel Award，which is given to the player who excels on and off the court．

As a student－athlete at Ole Miss，Rosamond was the first Lady Rebel to earn All－SEC Academic honors in all four years of her collegiate career．

After serving as the Interim Head Coach at MTSU following the 2005 season， Rosamond worked in the private sector prior to coming to Vanderbilt．

Now in his fourth season，Tom Garrick is the newest member of Melanie Balcomb＇s coaching staff．A former Head Coach at the University of Rhode Island， Garrick joined Vanderbilt＇s staff as an assistant coach in the summer of 2009.

Garrick focuses on working with the team＇s guards，and his impact has been felt immediately．In 2011，Garrick helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention All－America honors and first team All－SEC．He was also vital in the development of freshmen Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie．Lister earned SEC All－Freshman honors at point guard．

The progress was even more noticeable in 2012，as Foggie averaged 17.7 points per game to lead the SEC in scoring and earn First Team All－SEC Honors． Lister led the conference in assists（ 5.3 per game）and was a second team honoree，while Kady Schrann averaged 6.7 points per game and earned SEC All－Freshman honors．

In his first year with the Commodores，Garrick helped Vanderbilt advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament，and also played a role in Vanderbilt ranking second in the SEC in field－goal percentage and three－point field－goal percentage．

Before arriving at Vanderbilt，Garrick spent the past 11 years coaching at his
alma mater，including 2005－09 as the head coach of the Rams＇women＇s basketball team．
＂Tom brings an exceptional wealth of knowledge with him to our program，＂Balcomb said．＂I know Tom＇s vast experience－as both a player and a coach－will be an invaluable asset to our program．＂

Garrick began his coaching career as an assistant for the Rhode Island men＇s team in 1998－99，helping the Rams win the Atlantic－10 Championship in his first year． In 2001，he moved over to the women＇s side to work under Head Coach Boe Pearman．
When Pearman took a leave of absence in 2004，Garrick was named the act－ ing head coach．He would take an assistant coaching position at the University of Virginia that spring before returning to Rhode Island in August to become the school＇s sixth head coach．

An outstanding player at Rhode Island，Garrick was drafted by the Los Ange－ les Clippers in 1988 and would play in the NBA for four seasons，including stints in San Antonio，Minnesota and Dallas．Garrick＇s professional career also took the＂Ocean State＂native overseas to play in Germany，Turkey and Spain during a five－year span．

Garrick earned a bachelor＇s degree in communications from Rhode Island， where he was a four－year letterwinner for the men＇s basketball team．Nicknamed ＂the Chief，＂he led the 1988 squad to the Sweet 16，while compiling a program－ best $28-7$ record．Garrick still ranks among the school＇s all－time Top 10 in scoring （1，573 points）steals（189）and assists（407），and was inducted into the URI Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998.

During his prep career，Garrick was a two－time all－state basketball player for West Warwick（R．I．）High School，while also excelling in football．

## Nichalas Zeppas • ChANCELLロR



Chancellor Nicholas S. Zeppos was raised in Milwaukee, where he spent many an afternoon watching the great Hank Aaron of the Braves slug home runs in the old County Stadium.

Named Vanderbilt's eighth chancellor in 2008, Zeppos has taken a keen interest in athletics at Vanderbilt during his more than two decades at the university.
"I don't do the operations," Zeppos said. "I don't call the plays, I don't throw the passes. I see my job as simply trying to do whatever I can to support all of the talented people who do these things."

This support has included the endorsement of an athletics capital improvement plan expected to surpass $\$ 50$ million, which orchestrates efforts to improve the student experience for athletes and assists with recruiting.
"One thing I consider the ultimate compliment is when a coach calls me and says, 'I've got a couple of recruits here. Could you meet them?'"

A distinguished legal scholar, teacher and executive, Zeppos served from 2002 to February 2008 as Vanderbilt's chief academic officer, overseeing the university's undergraduate, graduate and professional education programs and research in liberal arts and sciences, engineering, music, education, business, law and divinity. As provost and vice chancellor, he chaired Vanderbilt's budgeting and capital planning council, as well as oversaw the dean of students and dean of admissions.

Zeppos has led a number of important initiatives at Vanderbilt, including the planning process for The Ingram Commons, a landmark transformation of the first-year experience; the Strategic Academic Planning Group; innovative efforts in undergraduate admissions and financial aid; and the development of new programs in Jewish studies, law and economics and genetics, among others.

In a bold move to strength Vanderbilt's commitment to admitting undergraduates on the basis of accomplish-
ment and achievement, rather than their ability to pay, Zeppos significantly expanded the financial aid program in 2009. By replacing undergraduate, need-based loans with grant and scholarship assistance, the university opened its doors wider to highly talented and qualified students of all economic, cultural and geographical backgrounds. The expanded aid program is funded by a combination of strategic budget allocations, the university's Shape the Future fundraising campaign, which under Zeppos' leadership raised over $\$ 1.9$ billion, and the current Opportunity Vanderbilt campaign.

Zeppos was recognized with five teaching awards at the law school before serving as an associate dean, associate provost, and provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs. He also served as interim chancellor for eight months prior to being formally appointed as Vanderbilt's eighth chancellor on March 1, 2008.

Zeppos is the Vice President of the 2012-13 executive committee of the Southeastern Conference.

In the Nashville community, Zeppos serves on the boards of the Nashville Area Chamber of Commerce and the Nashville Public Education Foundation. He also serves on the National Security Higher Education Advisory Board and the Freedom Forum Diversity Institute Board.

From 1982 to 1987, Zeppos practiced law in Washington, D.C., at the United States Department of Justice and at Wilmer, Cutler \& Pickering, where he specialized in appellate litigation involving complex regulatory, statutory and constitutional matters.

Zeppos is a 1979 magna cum laude graduate of the University of Wisconsin Law School, where he served as editor in chief of the Wisconsin Law Review and was selected as the outstanding graduate of his class. He studied history during his undergraduate years at the university, where he was a 1976 Phi Beta Kappa graduate.

He is married to Lydia A. Howarth, a graduate of the University of Chicago and Lawrence University, who is an editor. They have two sons, Benjamin and Nicholas.

In December 2011, Williams demonstrated his leadership by orchestrating the thorough search that led to Maryland associate head coach James Franklin becoming Vanderbilt's 27th head coach.
Whether supporting coaches and
student-athletes, presiding over
important activities, or debating strategic policy changes in Commodore athletics, Williams plays a key leadership role in the administration of Vanderbilt Athletics.

Since 2003, Williams has guided Vanderbilt Athletics into a bold new direction. Under Williams, the Vanderbilt program has had many successes on and off the field of competition. Williams has directed an initiative to more fully integrate Commodore athletics into the total Vanderbilt student life experience.

Today, Williams has firmly placed his stamp on the program, and has positioned Vanderbilt Athletics among the most innovative in the nation. The cumulative grade point for Vanderbilt student-athletes has continued to improve through Williams' tenure, reaching its highest level in more than two decades. Competitive success, such as the first-ever Southeastern Conference championship won by the women's cross country team in 2011-12, is becoming an expectation on campus. Individual accomplishment has been increasing, with 11 Vanderbilt athletes being selected in the first round of their respective professional sports in the last eight years.

Williams has overseen the recruitment and hiring of nine outstanding head coaches. Williams also has addressed numerous facility upgrades, including an extensive refurbishing of Vanderbilt Stadium and football locker rooms, expansion of Hawkins Field, addition of new tennis courts and amenities at Brownlee O. Currey Center and renovations in Memorial Gym, the Hendrix Room and the McGugin Center. In addition to the facility upgrades, he is also leading the charge to build a new indoor multipurpose facility that will be used by several Vanderbilt teams and will house an indoor track and 100-yard
football field. Under his guidance, a program was started to allow more overseas travel and study for Commodore teams and student-athletes.
Williams' campus activities also include being a tenured full professor at the School of Law, where he teaches Tax Law, Sports Law and Education Law. He has also taught a class on Law and Higher Education at Peabody College, and occasion, courses in the undergraduate curriculum.
Williams has reached outside of the Vanderbilt community in the area of intercolle-
giate sports. Williams served as a member of the SEC team that negotiated the recent SEC/ESPN/CBS contract, and is beginning his third year of a four-year term on the NCAA Division I Academic Cabinet.
He also serves as Chairman of the NCAA Infraction Appeals Committee and is a member of the Enforcement Working Group appointed by NCAA President Mark A. Emmert.
Williams was named Vice Chancellor, General Counsel and Secretary of Vanderbilt in 2000. His role moved toward administration of Vanderbilt student affairs and athletics in 2002.
Williams came to Vanderbilt after serving in numerous administrative roles at Ohio State over a 14 -year period. When he accepted the Vanderbilt role, Williams was Vice President of Student and Urban/Community Affairs and Professor of Law at Ohio State.
A native of Detroit, Michigan., Williams received a Bachelor of Science in Social Science and Master of Arts in Education from Northern Michigan University where he was a member of the track team. He also earned a Master of Business Administration and a Doctor of Jurisprudence from the University of Detroit, and an L.L.M. in taxation from New York University.
Before entering law school, Williams spent 10 years as a teacher and coach in the Detroit public school system.
Williams is active in the Nashville area community, serving as a board member with several organizations. He is treasurer and finance committee chair of the Nashville Public Television Board of Directors, and former treasurer of the Board of Directors of the Nashville Symphony where he continues to serve on the Board. Some of Williams' other board memberships include the Nashville Sports Council, Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame, Adventure Science Center, 100 Black Men of Middle Tennessee, the Community Foundation, Special Olympics of Tennessee, and the Center for Nonprofit Management.
Williams also supports youth athletic programs in the Nashville community.
Professionally, Williams is an active member of the American Corporate Counsel Association, the National Association of College and University Attorneys and the American Bar Association. He is a past member of the Continuing Legal Education committee of both the Nashville Bar Association and the NACUA. As a member of ABA's Section of Business Law, Williams has served as a member of the Corporate Counsel Committee. He held terms on two prestigious legal committees - the ABA Standing Committee on Public Education and the ABA Section on Legal Education and Admissions Standards Review Committee.
He recently completed consecutive three-year terms as a member of the Nashville branch of the Atlanta Federal Reserve Board.
Williams also is a member of the American Law Institute, and a past member of the Harry Phillips Inn of Court. He has served on a number of ABA Accreditation site visits of law schools and has completed a term on the Membership Review Committee of the American Association of Law Schools. Williams has written, lectured and participated in many seminars on topics of tax law, sports law, law and education, and legal history. Williams recently completed a three-year term on the board of directors for the National Association for Colleges and University Attorneys. He is serving a second term on Nashville Mayor Karl Dean's Procurement Standards Board.
Williams has taught at the law schools of the University of Detroit, Capital University, Ohio State University and Vanderbilt, and directed the Ohio State University Law Program in Oxford, England in 1992 and 1995. He was elected outstanding law professor at both the University of Detroit and Ohio State University.
Williams and his wife, Gail, have four children: Erika, who is a grade school teacher in Detroit, and is a graduate of Eastern Michigan University; David Williams III, who is a two-time graduate of Bowling Green State University, and is an academic counselor at Michigan State University; Samantha, who recently graduated from Brown University, where she was a member of the swim team, and is now working in Washington, DC; and Nicholas, who is a senior at University School of Nashville and competes in cross country, basketball,
track and soccer; Gail is a graduate of the University of Michigan and the University of Detroit College of Law and serves as the Associate Director of Community Relations of Vanderbilt. She is serving her third year as President of the University School of Nashville Board of Trustees and is the past Chair of the Metro Transit Authority where she continues to serve as a Board member. In addition, Gail serves on the Boards of many non-profit organizations, including The Frist Center, The Women's Fund Advisory Board, and the YWCA.

## The Standard Maintained

Vanderbilt women＇s basketball，one of the top－20 winningest programs of all time，maintained that winning standard during the 2011－12 sea－ son．Under 10th－year Head Coach Melanie Balcomb，the Commodores won 20－plus games for the 26th time and received their 25th NCAA Tournament bid，going 23－10 and earning an at－large bid and a seven seed in the Fresno Region．During Balcomb＇s 10 seasons at the helm on West End，Vanderbilt has won 20 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament each year．With their first round NCAA win over 10th－ seeded Middle Tennessee，the Commodores have also won at least one NCAA Tournament game in nine of the 10 seasons under Balcomb．

## Foggie Wins SEC Scoring Title

For the first time since 1991，Vanderbilt boasted the top scorer in the Southeastern Conference．Sophomore guard Christina Foggie led the league with 17.9 points per game at the conclusion of the regular season，as well as a conference－best 18.0 points per contest during SEC games．Foggie received WBCA All－Region honors and was a First Team All－SEC selection by the league＇s coaches and the Associated Press．She had 12 20－point performances on the season and led Vanderbilt in scor－ ing during 16 contests on the season．The highlights included a career－ high 34 points in a $68-48$ upset of No．17／15 Georgia and 22 points in a 93－79 win over No．11／11 Tennessee．Foggie became just the second Vanderbilt player to win the SEC scoring title，joining Wendy Scholtens， who won three league scoring titles（1989，＇90 and＇91）．

## Vanderbilt In The NCAA Tournament

Vanderbilt made its 25th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 13th－ consecutive．All－time，Vanderbilt is 38－25 in NCAA play，following a first round win over Middle Tennessee and a second round loss to Duke．It marked the 11th time in 12 seasons the Commodores won at least one game in the Tournament．Vanderbilt has made 14 Sweet 16 appear－ ances，including six over the last 11 seasons（last in 2009）．The last Elite Eight trip came in 2002，while Vanderbilt＇s lone Final Four appearance was in 1993．In first and second round contests，Vanderbilt is 32－11， while it is 16－2 in opening round games since the NCAA expanded the field to 64 teams in 1994.

## March Madness With A Dose Of Memorial Magic

2012 marked 10th season in which Vanderbilt played host to NCAA action at Memorial Gym．All－time，Vandy is 15－2 in NCAA play at Memo－ rial．During the 10 times they have hosted，the Commodores advanced to regional play on eight occasions．It was just the second time Melanie Balcomb got to coach her squad at Memorial during the Tournament． Her 2005－06 team lost to top－seeded North Carolina，89－70，in the second round that year．Along with this season＇s second round loss to Duke，those are the only time Vanderbilt has lost an NCAA Tournament game at Memorial Gym．Since the field expanded to 64 teams in 1994， Vanderbilt has hosted seven times．It was just the second time during that stretch that the Commodores will not be the highest－seeded team at the site（2006－Vandy was eight seed with North Carolina as the one seed）．

## Lucky Number Seven

This marked the first time in Vanderbilt＇s 25 NCAA Tournament appear－ ances it was a seven seed．In 2011，Vanderbilt was a 10 seed in the Spokane Region，while the season before they were the six seed in the Sacramento Region．As the seven seed in the Fresno Region，Vanderbilt is now $8-6$ in the West／western－most Region．The Commodores have been in the region six times（including 2008 \＆ 2011 in the Spokane Region， 2010 in the Sacramento Region and 2012 in the Fresno Region）． The first three times in the region（1995， 1997 \＆2008），Vanderbilt advanced to the Sweet 16．In 2010，it fell in the second round， 2011 it was defeated in the first round and lost in the second round in 2012.

## Vanderbilt Basketball Is Equal Opportunity

The Vanderbilt women＇s and men＇s basketball teams made their respective NCAA Tournament fields each of the last three seasons， something only accomplished by 10 NCAA Division I institutions． 2012 is the 10th time both teams made the NCAA Tournament，with both teams previously making the tournament in 1989，1991，1993，1997， 2004，2007，2008， 2010 and 2011．The other nine schools to have both programs reach the NCAA Tournament over the last three seasons are Duke，Georgetown，Gonzaga，Kentucky，Michigan State，Notre Dame， Ohio State，Texas and West Virginia．In addition，with Christina Foggie capturing the women＇s SEC scoring title and Vanderbilt＇s John Jenkins doing the same on the men＇s side，it marked just the fourth time in SEC history the same school won both titles and first since 2006.

## The Tournament Standard

The 2011－12 season saw Vanderbilt make the NCAA Tournament for the 25th time and 13th－in－a－row．The Commodores have posted a 38－25 （．603）mark in the tournament and won at least one game in each tour－ nament during 12 of the last 13 appearances．Vanderbilt has made 14 appearances in the Sweet 16 ，including six in the last 12 seasons．The Commodores have one Final Four appearance（1993）．

## That Would Make A Baker＇s Dozen

Vanderbilt is one of eight programs to have made the last 13 NCAA Tournaments．The Commodores are joined by Connecticut，Duke， Georgia，Notre Dame，Oklahoma，Stanford and Tennessee as the only programs to have earned bids each of the last 13 seasons．

## Five Dores Earn All－SEC Honors

Vanderbilt was well represented when the Southeastern Confer－ ence announced all－league honorees as selected by the coaches on Wednesday，February 29．Christina Foggie，Vanderbilt＇s first league scoring champion since 1991，earned a spot on the first team．A pair of Commodores were on the second team，Jasmine Lister and Tiffany Clarke，while Kady Schrann was named to the All－Freshman team．The following week，it was announced the Associated Press had also named Foggie to its All－SEC First Team，while Clarke，Lister and redshirt center Stephanie Holzer had been named Honorable Mention All－SEC by the writers．

## Milestones Passed

Despite a young team in 2011－12，the Commodores still managed to make an impact in the program record book during the year．Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister have placed themselves in career top－10 lists．Foggie now finds herself as one of the programs top－10 three－point shooters，as her ． 393 career mark（132－336）ties her for tenth all－time with Michelle Palmisano，while Lister now ranks sixth with 13 career 40－minute games．From a season top－10 standpoint，the pair also made a dent．Foggie＇s 91 threes made and 219 three attempted both rank as the second highest in a single season．Lister＇s 176 assists were the ninth most ever by a Commodore，while her 1，214 minutes played are the fifth－most in a season．Head Coach Melanie Balcomb also reached an important milestone on the year，collecting her 400th career win （401－198）．

## Milestones Approaching

With its top－seven scorers returning next season，some personal milestones are in the very near future when the 2012－13 season begins． Four players will have a shot at joining the 1,000 point club if they can replicate their scoring totals from the 2011－12 season．Tiffany Clarke is the closest，at 866 points．Right behind her are Christina Foggie（792 points）and Jasmine Lister（ 790 points），while Stephanie Holzer sits at 674 points．The player to reach 1,000 first will be come the 34th player in Vanderbilt history to reach the mark．In addition，if Melanie Balcomb can lead her squad to 19 wins（the Commodores have won at least 20 during all 10 seasons under Balcomb），she will be come the program＇s all－time winningest coach．Balcomb＇s current mark is 238－94，trailing Jim Foster（256－99）by just 18 wins．

NASHVILLE - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team used an impressive shooting night to score an 86 - 55 victory over Alabama A\&M in its season opener. The Commodores improved to 1-0 on the season, while the Bulldogs fell to 0-1. Guards Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie led the way for Vanderbilt with 22 and 18 points, respectively. Lister added seven assists, while committing no turnovers. She was also 4-of-6 from 3-point land. Three other Commodores were in double-figures. Tiffany Clarke picked up 11 points, while grabbing seven rebounds. Freshman Maggie Morrison had an impressive collegiate debut with 10 points, five assists and four rebounds. Junior Elan Brown narrowly missed a double-double with 10 points and nine rebounds. Alabama A\&M was led by 25 points and eight rebounds from Whiquitta Tobar. Shundray Davis added 13 points and nine rebounds. Outside of their two guards, the Bulldogs did not get much scoring output, as no one else on the squad recorded more than five points. Morrison's play was especially important to Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb, as her team was without junior guard Gabby Smith (concussion, day-to-day) and saw freshman guard Kady Schrann roll an ankle late in the first half. The Commodores shot 48.5\% from the field, including $45.0 \%$ from three. Size and depth both proved to be a factor, as Vanderbilt outscored Alabama A\&M in the paint, 38-28, as well as off the bench, 23-9. Vanderbilt nearly doubled-up on the Bulldogs in the first half, taking a 45-23 lead into the break. Three-point shooting helped open up the lead, as the Commodores were 7-10 from beyond the arc. Lister was an impressive 6-7 from the field, as well as 3-3 from 3-point range in the frame.

The Commodores improved to 2-0, while the Leathernecks fell to 1-1. Vanderbilt's guards did what they do best, share the basketball. As a team, the Commodores dished out 28 assists, which is the most since distributing 32 helpers against Alabama in March 2006 Jasmine Lister alone had seven assists, matching her career-high set in the season-opener against Alabama A\&M. Lister led the way in scoring, as well, with 15 points. Tiffany Clarke had 13 points and seven rebounds, while Stephanie Holzer added 14 points and six rebounds. Clair Watkins joined the trio in double-figures with 10 points, while grabbing four rebounds. Elan Brown led the Commodores in rebounding for the second-straight time, grabbing nine boards. Vanderbilt almost had six players in double-figures for the first time since January 2009, as Christina Foggie, Maggie Morrison and Gabby Smith all had nine points apiece. Gabby Smith added five assists in her first action this season (concussion). As a team, the Commodores finished at $62.7 \%$ (37-59) from the field and $47.1 \%$ from three-point range. It marks the highest total field goal percentage for a Commodore team since February 8, 2009, when Vandy shot $64.1 \%$ (25-39). Western Illinois was led by 12 points from Sadie Webb, while Lindsay Carroll added 10 off the bench. Michele Salvatori was impressive underneath, grabbing 10 rebounds, seven on the offensive glass. The Commodores used an incredibly balanced approach in the first half to open a 55-17 lead. Clarke had 12 points while hitting all six attempts from the field. Lister and Holzer each added eight points, Morrison and Smith had seven while Foggie added six.

NASHVILLE -The Vanderbilt women's basketball team improved to a perfect 3-0 with an 88-42 win over USC Upstate on Wednesday, November 16, at Memorial Gym. For the second-straight game, the Commodores dished out 28 assists, led by nine from freshman Maggie Morrison, who added eight points. Junior guard Jasmine Lister added 10 points and seven helpers. On the receiving end were freshman Kady Schrann, who scored a game-high 15 points, and Stephanie Holzer, who scored 14 points while grabbing 13 rebounds. Holzer is the first Commodore this season to register a double-double. USC Upstate (0-3) was led by 13 points from Hannah Ohl. She added three assists and three rebounds. Tee'Ara Copney joined her in double-figures with 10 points. The Sooners, who dropped to 3-1, were led by All-Tournament selection Aaryn Ellenberg, who scored 22 points. She sat for 1:49 and Vanderbilt went on a 7-0 run to open up a 43-33 lead. Byrd re-entered the game at the 11:07 mark and never fouled-out, but the Rebels were never able to get back within 10 points. Vanderbilt has now won 17 of the last 21 meetings with Ole Miss, including eight of 12 under Melanie Balcomb.

Lister's backcourt mate Christina Foggie scored 27 points for the third time this season, equaling a career high. In addition to going 7-11 from the field, she was 6-8 from behind the three-point line and 7-7 from the free throw line.Lister added 11 points of her own, along with five assists, four rebounds and three steals, to help the Commodores improve to 14-2 on the season and 2-1 in SEC play. Junior forward Tiffany Clarke added 12 points and eight rebounds. She's now averaging 14.7 points and 8.3 rebounds in SEC play. Auburn was led by 14 points from Tyrese Tanner. Chantel Hilliard added 11 points, while Camille Glymph scored nine. Najat Ourdad had six assists and a career high seven steals. The Tigers fell to 9-8, 1-3 in league action. Foggie scored 22 points in the second half to help Vanderbilt pull away, then hold on. Commodore Head Coach Melanie Balcomb was glad to see Foggie put her team on her shoulders, despite an adjustment in roll due to injuries."She's sharing responsibilities with Kady (Schrann at the point)," explained Balcomb. "She had to do a lot and play a lot of minutes, but to knock down those big threes, I thought it was really impressive." Balcomb also echoed Lister's sentiments about the ugliness of the game, but was not the least bit surprised. KNOXVILLE, Tenn. -- The No. 25/24 Vanderbilt women's basketball team played No. 6/7 Tennessee close for the first half, trailing 39-36 at the break, before the Lady Volunteers pulled away for 87-64 win. The Commodores fell to 14-3, 2-2 in SEC play. The Lady Vols improved to 13-4, 4-1 in league action. Sophomore guard Christina Foggie led the Vanderbilt effort, scoring 27 points on 8-16 shooting and 5-12 from three. Vanderbilt also got 14 points from Tiffany Clarke, as well as nine points and five assists from Jasmine Lister. Tennessee was led by 20 points from Shekinna Stricklen. Vicki Baugh and Glory Johnson each added 16 points and Meighan Simmons contributed 10. Johnson recorded a double-double, grabbing a game-high 13 rebounds. The teams traded leads through the first half, with Vandy leading by as much as four and Tennessee leading by as much as nine. FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. (AP) -- Sarah Watkins scored a season-high 21 points to lead the Razorbacks to a 69-47 win over Vanderbilt (No. 22 ESPN/USA Today, No. 25 AP) on Thursday night. The junior also tied her career high with six blocks as Arkansas (13-5, 2-4 Southeastern Conference) won its second straight after opening SEC play with four straight losses. The win is the Razorbacks' first since 2006 over the Commodores, who had won 13 of the previous 14 meetings. "I don't think there are words to describe how good it feels to get a win in the SEC," Watkins said. "I think some people might even say, 'It's a win, they should have won that game,' but any win in the SEC is going to be a battle." Ashley Daniels added 17 points for Arkansas, which led by as many as 23 points in the second half. The Razorbacks forced 22 turnovers and held Vanderbilt (14-4, 2-3) to a season-low point total. The loss is the second straight for the Commodores, who lost to Tennessee on Sunday. Christina Foggie had 14 points to lead Vanderbilt, which shot a season-low 32 percent in the loss. "I think our problem is on defense," Vanderbilt coach Melanie Balcomb said. "Our defense was creating a lot of our offense, and we're not creating anything. We're not getting stops and we let a team that's been struggling shooting get open shots to start the game. We're not ready to defense and get stops." The Commodores entered the game leading the SEC in shooting at 48 percent, but they hit just two of their first 13 shots and fell behind 24-11 after a 3-pointer by Arkansas' C'eira Ricketts. Vanderbilt finished the first half 10 of 28 from the field and was 17 of 54 for the game, its worst shooting performance of the season. The scoring struggles have been a theme for the Commodores since the start of SEC play. They entered the game third in the conference in scoring, averaging 76.1 points per game, but only 63.3 points in SEC play.

A win over Tennessee is something to celebrate no matter how much the Lady Vols might be struggling. Tiffany Clarke scored 23 points, and the Vanderbilt Commodores upset No. 11 Tennessee 93-79 on Thursday night for their fifth straight win overall and a very rare victory over their in-state rival. For the Commodores (19-5, 7-4 Southeastern Conference), this was their first win against Tennessee since Jan. 11, 2009, and they did it by scoring their most points ever against their rival. It was just Balcomb's second win in 23 games against Tennessee since coming to Vanderbilt. Tennessee (17-7, 8-3) had won 23 of the last 24 in this rivalry and seven straight. The Lady Vols, who fell out of the top 10 on Monday, now have lost two of three. Christina Foggie scored 22 points for Vanderbilt, and Stephanie Holzer added 19. Jasmine Lister had her first double-double with 19 points and a career-high 13 assists. Glory Johnson led Tennessee with 19 points before fouling out with $5: 59$ left. Meighan Simmons had a team-high 20 points, and Shekinna Stricklen 17. The Commodores outworked, outshot and simply outplayed Tennessee from start to finish. They shot 55.7 percent ( 39 of 70 ) compared to 45.9 percent ( 28 of 61) for Tennessee as they drove past the Lady Vols time and again for easy layups with plenty of room to hit jumpers. Keyla Snowden (14 points) and Bria Goss (12 points) were also in double-figures for the Wildcats. The Commodores struggled with Kentucky's up-tempo press and perimeter defense in the first half. Despite out-shooting UK, $47.6 \%$ to $50.5 \%, 12$ Vanderbilt turnovers helped the Wildcats lead by as many as 20 points and by 16 at the break, $39-23$. Vanderbilt committed another 12 turnovers in the second half, but turned-up the defensive pressure and forced UK into 11 miscues of their own while holding them to $32 \%$ shooting from the field. Vanderbilt would cut it to a two-possession game, 61-55 with 1:21 remaining, but could not get any closer.


NASHVILLE -- The No. 24 Vanderbilt women's basketball team concluded its regular season with a 67-54 victory over Alabama on Sunday, February 26, at Memorial Gym. The Commodores conclude the season with a 21-8 record, 9-7 in SEC play. The Crimson Tide finish their season with a record of 12-18, 2-14 in league action. The Commodores were led in scoring by sophomore guard Christina Foggie, who's 18 points wrapped up the SEC scoring title with a season average of 17.9 points per game. Foggie also grabbed seven rebounds. She becomes the first Vanderbilt player to lead the SEC in scoring since Wendy Scholtens did it for the third time in 1991. She was joined in double-figures by backcourt mate Jasmine Lister, who posted 16 points along with seven assists and a career-high seven rebounds, and center Stephanie Holzer, who scored 12 points and grabbed eight rebounds. Elan Brown matched Holzer with eight boards. The Tide was led by 16 points from Jasmine Robinson, while Kyra Crosby contributed 12 points. Meghan Perkins grabbed a team-high six rebounds. The Commodores never trailed and used an 11-1 run to open the game. They led by as many as 21 points (with 5:49 remaining). Vanderbilt outscored Alabama in the paint, $36-14$, and out-rebounded the Tide, 40-29. As a team, Vanderbilt was $25-59$ from the field, good for $42.4 \%$, while the Tide shot just $33.3 \%$ (16-48). Vanderbilt's lone senior, Jordan Coleman, got her first start of the season and scored two points while grabbing four rebounds.

# Game No. 30 - SEC Tournament rv/rv Vandy 67, Mississippi State 51 March 1, 2012 Bridgestone Arena • Nashville 



NASHVILLE -- The Vanderbilt women's basketball team advanced to the second round of the SEC Tournament, defeating Mississippi State, 67-51, at Bridgestone Arena. The Commodores improved to 22-8 and move to the second round where they will face second seeded Tennessee. The Lady Bulldogs season comes to a close at 14-16. Four Commodores scored in double-figures, led by SEC scoring champion Christina Foggie's 18 points. Center Stephanie Holzer added 12 points and 10 rebounds for her 10th career double-double. Tiffany Clarke scored 10 points and grabbed nine rebounds, while Jasmine Lister scored 13 points. Mississippi State was led by 14 points from Diamber Johnson, while Porsha Porter added 12 points. Martha Alwal contributed seven points and seven rebounds. Vanderbilt led the enter contest, but Commodore turnovers kept Mississippi State in the game. The Lady Bulldogs scored 30 points off 22 Vanderbilt turnovers. Free throws also helped Vanderbilt overcome the miscues, as they went 21-25 from the line. Holzer and Foggie were both 6-6 from the charity stripe. The first half saw Vanderbilt come out swinging, as they led by as many as 14 and got 11 points from Foggie on 3-6 shooting and 4-4 from the free throw line. After the Lady Bulldogs cut it to 42-39 with 10:01 remaining, the Commodores held Mississippi State to 11 points over the final 10 minutes, including a Diamber Johnson three with just two seconds remaining. Vanderbilt scored 25 points during the final 10 minutes.

NASHVILLE -- After rallying within a point from 19 down, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team fell to No. 13/10 Tennessee in the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals, 68-57, on Friday, March 2, at Bridgestone Arena. The Commodores fell to 22-9, while the Lady Vols improved to 22-8 and move on to Saturday's semifinals. Just like its opening round win over Mississippi State, Vanderbilt was led by Christina Foggie and Stephanie Holzer. Foggie scored a team-high 16 points, while Holzer recorded another double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds. Jasmine Lister was also in double-figures with 12 points. The Lady Vols were led by 18 points from Shekinna Stricklen, with all of them coming in the second half. Glory Johnson added 15 points and nine rebounds, while Meighan Simmons contributes 12 points. Vanderbilt struggled early on, shooting just $26.9 \%$ in the opening half. The Lady Vols led by as many as 19 points with $3: 44$ to play in the opening frame before the Commodores rallied to be down just eight, $35-27$, at the break. After the teams sat through an extended halftime because of a severe weather threat in the Nashville Metro area, the Vanderbilt rally continued. The Commodores cut the lead to 41-40 with 14:11 to play and again to 43-42 at the 11:31 mark and 45-44 at the 10:42 mark. Vanderbilt could never quite tie or take the lead and after Lister missed a layup, Stricklen responded with a three to push the lead to 48-44. After a Foggie layup, Stricklen scored a lay-up and was fouled by Holzer, converting the three-point play to push the lead back to five, 51-46. That was immediately followed by a Foggie miss from three and another three-point play by Johnson. A Lister jumper to cut it to six, then Stricklen drilled another three to make it 57-48. Vanderbilt would get no closer than six points the rest of the way.

# Game No. 32 - NCAA Tournament \#7 Vandy 60, \#10 Middle Tenn. 46 <br> March 18, 2012 <br> Memorial Gym • Nashville 



NASHVILLE -- The Vanderbilt women's basketball team overcame the heat and foul trouble to advance to the second round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament. The seventh-seeded Commodores defeated 10th-seeded Middle Tennessee, 60-46, on Sunday, March 18 at Memorial Gym. Vanderbilt improves to $23-9$ while the Blue Raiders' season comes to an end at $26-7$. Vanderbilt will move on to play second-seeded Duke in the second round on Tuesday, March 20. Duke defeated Samford, 82-47, in the first round on Sunday at Memorial. Tipoff at Memorial Gym is set for 8:30 p.m. The winner will move on to the Fresno Regional Semifinals. Vanderbilt overcame significant foul trouble by its posts thanks to strong defense and strong point play. The Commodores were led by 19 points from Jasmine Lister. The sophomore point guard was 4-10 from the field, but hit 11 of 14 free throw attempts. She also had five assists and five rebounds. Junior guard Elan Brown added 12 points and nine rebounds. Redshirt sophomore center Stephanie Holzer also just missed a double-double, scoring nine points and grabbing 10 rebounds. Middle Tennessee was led by 12 points from Kortni Jones. Ebony Rowe recorded a double-double with 10 points and 16 rebounds. Icelyn Elie also grabbed 16 rebounds while adding seven points. The story of the first half was foul trouble. With about four minutes remaining, Vanderbilt had been whistled for nine fouls while MTSU had been called for just one. This included three on Holzer and three on junior forward Tiffany Clarke, Vanderbilt's starting forwards. Despite the foul trouble, Vanderbilt was able to take a 25-18 lead into the break thanks to holding the Blue Raiders to $22.6 \%$ ( $7-31$ ) from the field. That was especially thanks to the play of Brown, junior guard Gabby Smith and senior guard Jordan Coleman. The second half saw Holzer play 14 minutes, score seven points an grab five rebounds while committing just one more foul. Vanderbilt was able to pull away thanks largely to her and Lister, who scored 14 of her 19 points in the second half. Vanderbilt's patience on the defensive end was demonstrated by the fact that the Blue Raiders pulled down 25 offensive rebounds but managed just four second-chance points. The Commodores scored 14 second-chance points on 16 offensive boards.

Game No. 33 - NCAA Tournament \#2 Duke 96, \#7 Vandy 80 March 20, 2012 Memorial Gym • Nashville



NASHVILLE -- The Vanderbilt women's basketball season came to a close at the hands of second-seeded Duke, 96-80, during the second round of the NCAA Tournament at Memorial Gym on Tuesday, March 20. The Commodores conclude the season at 23-10 while the Blue Devils improve to $26-5$ and move to the Fresno Regional semifinals to face third-seeded St. John's. The Blue Devils came out firing and ended up shooting season-highs from the field ( $65.6 \%$ ) and from three-point range ( $63.6 \%$ ). The Blue Devils were even hotter to open the contest, shooting $67.6 \%$ in the first half. Vanderbilt did manage to score 80 points, which was the most given up by Duke all season. Christina Foggie led the Commodore effort with 26 points. Jasmine Lister added 16 points and seven assists. Stephanie Holzer recorded a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds and Elan Brown added 13 points. Leading the Duke effort were Haley Peters, who shot 12-16 from the field for 25 points, and Tricia Liston, who shot 10-15 from the field, $3-5$ from three, and scored 23 points. Elizabeth Williams ( 13 points), Shay Selby ( 12 points) and Chelsea Gray ( 12 points) were also in double-figures. The first five minutes saw the teams trade baskets, with all four ties and both lead changes occurring in the first six minutes and five seconds. After a Holzer lay-up tied the game at 16 at the 13:55 mark of the first half, Duke kept scoring and Vanderbilt did not. The Blue Devils went on a 20-4 run to take a 40-20 lead with 6:35 left until the break and took a 56-32 lead into the locker room. They out-scored Vanderbilt in the paint, 30-16, as well as 19-2 off turnovers. Vanderbilt would win the second half, 48-40, but the Commodores never truly threatened a comeback. The primary reason for the better second half showing was improved defense, as Vanderbilt forced 11 turnovers in the second frame after forcing just two in the opening half.

## Notable Accomplishments

## Wendy Scholtens•1990

Wendy Scholtens, a 6-4 center from Ft. Smith Arkansas, holds the Vanderbilt record for most rebounds in a career. She holds a total of 15 Commodore records, including all of the free throw categories. She was the SEC Freshman of the Year and earned All-SEC honors three times, while earning All-SEC Academic Honors twice. She was also selected SEC Player of the Week eight times. She is the only woman at Vanderbilt to have her jersey retired. She was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame in 1999 and Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in 2009.

## Heidi Gillingham • 1993

Heidi Gillingham, a 6-8 center from Floresville, Texas, holds six Vanderbilt records, including an SEC record 131 blocks in a season. Gillingham is the tallest player in Vanderbilt history. She was a three-time All-SEC first team selection and was chosen SEC Player of the Week once. She was selected to the 1993 NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team and was named Sports Illustrated National Player of the Week. She was also named Homecoming Queen at Vanderbilt. She was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame in 2000 and Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in 2010.

## Sheri Sam • 1996

Sheri Sam, a 6-1 forward from Duson, La., is the third Kodak All-American from Vanderbilt. Sam ranks in five statistical categories and totaled double digits in scoring in 77 games and in rebounding in 22 games. She was selected SEC Player of the Week once and was a two-time All-SEC team selection. She was also named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll. Sam was a Naismith Finalist in 1996 and was named to the 1996 NCAA Tournament AllRegional Team.

## Chantelle Anderson • 2002, 2003

Chantelle Anderson is Vanderbilt's first two-time Kodak All-American earning the honor her junior and senior seasons. She was the first Commodore to earn SEC Player of the Year honors (2002) and was also named ESPN The Magazine Center of the Year. She was named MVP of the NCAA Midwest Regional and was a Naismith Finalist in 2001, 2002 and 2003. As a sophomore, the 6-6 center from Vancouver, Wash., set the NCAA record for field goal percentage connecting on 292-404 from the field for a 72.3 percentage. She is also the VU career leader in points with 2,604 points. She was inducted into the Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in 2008.

## MEMORIAL GYM

The Southeastern Conference's most historic home for college basketball, Memorial Gymnasium serves as the home court for the Vanderbilt Commodores. Dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II, the arena was built as a combination gymnasium and concert hall by the late master architect Edwin Keeble.

Six decades later, the unique style of Memorial Gymnasium - with its benches situated on the baseline, a playing court that sits above portions of the crowd and deafening acoustics - continues to make the Commodores' home a dreaded stop for opponents. "Memorial Magic," with its capacity crowds, overflowing student section and lively pep band have assisted in numerous Commodore victories. In the stands, fans across Middle Tennessee have helped Memorial Gymnasium (capacity 14,326 ) rank among the NCAA's Top 30 attendance leaders on numerous occassions.

On the floor, Vanderbilt has a 414-94 record at home, winning 81.5 percent of its games. Vanderbilt has never had a losing season at home and under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb, Vanderbilt has won 84.0 percent (131-25) of its home games. The Commodores finished 18-2 at home last season and have not lost more than four games at home since finishing 9-5 during the 1998-99 season.

This season will feature a brand new video board, installed during the summer of 2012. The display, manufactured by Utah's Young Electric Sign Company, features four screens that measure 16 feet by 9 feet and includes a 2 foot tall LED display that will wrap around the bottom of the board.

Before the 2008-09 season, Vanderbilt's locker rooms, the video room, the training room and media room were renovated and are now state-of-the-art. The floor was also replaced before the 08-09 season. During the 2009-10 season, the building received new championship banners.

In 2002, a $\$ 25$ million renovation of Memorial Gymnasium was completed, highlighted by yet another one-of-a-kind feature. Connected to the facility sits a new practice gym that includes a three cross-court playing floor, coaching offices, a donor room and a Hall of Champions. Other aspects of the renovation included upgrades of the seating areas, private suites, a new lighting and sound system and a new court design.

In all, Memorial Gym has been expanded three times. Constructed with a seating capacity of 6,583 , the University saw its first need to increase seating in 1965 with the addition of two north-side balconies. Two years later, a pair of balancing balconies were erected on the south side of the gym and dubbed "The Balconies That Clyde Lee Built."

Capacity has fluctuated throughout the history of the building. It reached its highest number of 15,646 in 1969 when 4,000 seats were added in the east and west ends. When chairback seats in the end zones and suites on the north side were installed in the late 1990s capacity lowered to 14,168 . Prior to last season, university officials removed portions of media press row on the south side in an effort to expand the student section by nearly 150 seats. Official capacity for the 2012-13 season will be 16,326 .

Located in the popular Midtown district of Nashville, Vanderbilt is regarded among the nation's finest universities. The private research university enrolled 6,970 undergraduate and 5,835 postgraduate students last year. Those students arrive on campus from all 50 states and nearly 100 countries.

The university was founded 138 years ago when shipping and rail magnate "Commodore" Cornelius Vanderbilt provided an initial \$1 million endowment.

Vanderbilt is one of 10 charter members of the Southeastern Conference. It is the only private school among the SEC's 12-member universities.

Vanderbilt is ranked among the top universities in America. In its popular annual "Best Colleges" edition, U.S. News \& World Report most recently ranked Vanderbilt No. 17 among all national universities. The magazine also placed Vanderbilt No. 2 among schools located in the Southeast.

The campus is located 1.5 miles southwest of downtown Nashville on 330 pristine acres that was designated a national arboretum in 1988. Two focal areas of campus closed to vehicles - the Peabody campus and the collection of academic buildings surrounding Kirkland Hall that form the original campus are frequently listed among the most beautiful college environments in the South.

Though located within walking distance of downtown activities, the quality of Vanderbilt life is reflected in much smaller, less public ways - running into friends while walking on campus, researching papers or grabbing a late-night snack with friends, choosing between a public policy lecture or athletic event, or having dinner at a professor's home.

Most Vanderbilt undergraduates live on campus during their time at the university. Thirty-four residential halls dot the campus, ranging from the four towers off West End Avenue to The Ingram Commons, a state-of-the-art complex for Vanderbilt's first-year students that has attracted national acclaim for its design and unique living experience.

Vanderbilt offers numerous degrees in four undergraduate colleges: the College of Arts and Science, Peabody College, School of Engineering and Blair School of Music.
