## SCOUTING THE COMMODORES

The Vanderbilt women's basketball team (13-6, 3-3 SEC) will look to snap a two-game losing streak on Sunday when they visit Alabama. Tiffany Clarke leads the Commodores on the season in both scoring and rebounding. The senior forward is averaging 16.0 points and 8.2 rebounds per game, while shooting 56.1% from the field. Right behind her in the scoring efforts is junior guard Christina Foggie. The preseason first-team all-league selection is averaging 15.6 points per game after scoring 22 on Thursday night against No. 9/9 Tennessee. Foggie, who led the SEC in scoring a season ago, has also emerged as one of the team's top defenders this year, grabbing 1.9 steals per game. Junior Jasmine Lister runs the point and scores 11.6 points per game in addition to her 6.1 assists per game which rank second in the SEC and 20th in the nation. Sophomore guard Kady Schran, who is averaging 7.7 points per game after recording 14 against the Lady Vols, and senior guard Elan Brown, posting a very solid 6.4 points and 6.4 rebounds per game, will likely round out the starting five for Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. The first options off the bench will be freshman forward Heather Bowe (5.6 ppg/4.4 rpg), freshman guard Morgan Batey (1.8 ppg/1.6 rpg) and senior guard Gabby Smith (2.2 ppg/1.3 rpg).

## SCOUTING THE CRIMSON TIDE

Alabama (12-7, 2-4 SEC) hosts Vanderbilt coming off a 61-51 win over rival Auburn on Thursday night in Tuscaloosa. The Tide are led in scoring by sophomore guard Daisha Simmons, who is posting 12.4 points per game while also grabbing 4.7 rebounds per outing and averaging a team-best 4.3 assists per game. Junior guard Shafontaye Myers is right behind her, posting 12.2 points per game, while junior guard Jasmine Robinson is also in double figures at 10.7 points per game. The Tide are just 2-4 in league play, but all four of those losses came to ranked teams in Texas A&M, Kentucky, Georgia and Tennessee. Head Coach Wendell Hudson's squad has conference wins over Ole Miss and Auburn. The Tide allows 68.7 points per game, the second-highest total in the SEC. They do lead the league in three-point field goal defense, allowing opponents to shoot just 23.7% from beyond the arc (Vanderbilt is the second-best three-point shooting team in the league at 35.3%).

## THE SERIES - VANDERBILT VS. ALABAMA

Thursday night will be the 40th meeting between the Commodores and Crimson Tide in women's basketball, with Vanderbilt holding a 28-11 edge in the series. Alabama won six of the first eight contests between 1977-84. Since then, Vanderbilt has won 26 of the last 31 meetings between the schools. The Commodores also hold a 10-7 edge in Tuscaloosa, however the series returns to Foster Auditorium for the first time since 1981, where the Tide hold a 2-0 advantage. Melanie Balcomb is 12-1 against Alabama, with the lone loss coming in 2004 in Tuscaloosa. Last year, Vanderbilt won its 11th straight in the series, 67-54, behind 18 points and seven rebounds from Christina Foggie as she wrapped up the SEC scoring title and 18 points, seven rebounds and seven assists from Jasmine Lister.

Vanderbilt will face one of the two newest Southeastern Conference members for the first time, traveling to College Station, Texas, to face Texas A&M on Thursday, January 31. Tipoff is set for 7:00 p.m. CT and the game can be seen on SportSouth, FOX Sports Southwest and Sun Sports, as well as online at ESPN3.com outside of the Southeast.

at all. The Commodores outscored No. 9 Tennessee 38-32 in the paint and even grabbed 21 offensive rebounds, but they couldn't keep up with the Lady Vols' top scorers Thursday night in losing 83-75. "Believe it or not, the game plan in the first half was the same as it was in the second half," Balcomb said. "We just didn't execute the game plan. Get the ball inside, get the ball to the rim. It all worked in the second half. The first half, we took too many outside shots, weren't aggressive and didn't attack enough." That left Vanderbilt trailing 41-29 at halftime. The Commodores scored the first 12 points of the second half to tie up Tennessee at 41. But that was as close as they would get as the Lady Vols responded by scoring 11 of the next 13 points before hitting 14 of their final 15 free throws in the final 3:49 to seal the win. "Just can't celebrate when we make a run," Vanderbilt junior guard Christina Foggie said. Foggie led Vandy with 22 points before fouling out in the final minute, Tiffany Clarke had 19 and Kady Schranz 14. Spani scored a career-high 24 points and Simmons added 23 as Tennessee (16-3, 7-0) won its ninth straight. The Lady Vols got a measure of payback for losing in Memorial Gym a year ago, their last SEC loss. "Well, I mean honestly you just want to come in and play your best against a great SEC team," Spani said. "Obviously, this is a great rivalry game. But we also have a lot of respect for Vanderbilt and what they're capable of doing and it's always a great environment." With No. 5 Kentucky losing to No. 18 South Carolina earlier in the night, Tennessee is the Southeastern Conference's last undefeated team in league play. Simmons said that's exactly where the Lady Vols expected to be. Coach Holly Warlick cautioned it's still very early this season. "But yeah, it's great to be undefeated and be on top of the SEC," Warlick said. "But ... we're not satisfied absolutely." The Lady Vols have won 11 straight SEC games dating back to the loss here last season. Bashaara Graves also had 16 points for Tennessee. Vanderbilt (13-6, 3-3) lost for the first time at home this season and has lost three of four overall. The Commodores played without 6-foot-4 sophomore Clair Watkins, who suffered a knee injury in practice Wednesday. They still pulled down 21 offensive rebounds despite being outrebounded 46-43. The Commodores managed to tie the score twice, the second time at 41 after scoring the first 12 points of the second half. The Lady Vols answered with an 11-2 spurt capped by a drive by Simmons with 12:45 to go, and Vanderbilt couldn't get closer than five the rest of the way. Tennessee hit 14 of 15 at the line in the final 3:49 to seal the victory. The Commodores came in as the SEC's second-best team beyond the arc, shooting 36.4 percent from 3-point range. They shot 21.7 percent (5-of-23) and missed three 3s in the final minutes with a chance to make it a one-score game.

#### COMMODORES VS. TOP 25

In falling to No. 9/9 Tennessee on Thursday night, Vanderbilt is now 1-2 against ranked teams, having scored a win over then-No. 12/13 Oklahoma before losses to No. 18/19 South Carolina and the Lady Vols. As of this week's Associated Press poll, the Commodores have five games remaining in the regular season against ranked foes.

#### HOME COOKING

The Commodores dropped their first home game on the season Thursday night to No. 9/9 Tennessee, putting their home record at 8-1 on the season. Vanderbilt has still won 25 of the last 27 regular season home games at Memorial, as well as 26 of the last 29 contests counting the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The three losses since the start of the 2011-12 season have come to South Carolina, Tennessee and Duke (second round of 2011 NCAA Tournament).

#### 1,000 X 3

With Jasmine Lister hitting 1,000 points in Sunday's game at LSU, she became the third player this season to reach the 1,000-point plateau, joining Tiffany Clarke and Christina Foggie. It would mark the second time in the 36-year history of Vanderbilt women's basketball that more than two players joined the club in the same season. The only other time was 20 years ago in the 1992-93 Final Four season when Heidi Gillingham, Julie Powell, Misty Lamb and Shelley Jarrard all hit the mark.

### LISTER HITS 1,000

In the first half, Lister became the 36th player in Vanderbilt history, and third this season, to hit 1,000 career points when she connected from three with 9:53 to play in the first half. She now has 1,111 career points and is in 34th place all-time, just six behind Rhonda Blades.

### CLARKE HITS 1,000

With 22 points against Hartford on December 6, senior forward Tiffany Clarke became the 34 player in Vanderbilt history with 1,000 career points. The Duluth, Ga., native now has 1,170 points, 23rd in program history. Next in her sights is Hannah Tuomi at 1,192 points.

### FOGGIE HITS 1,000

With nine points at No. 18/16 South Carolina, Christina Foggie became the 35th player in Vanderbilt history to reach 1,000 points. Foggie now stands at 1,057 points, 29th all-time. Next in Foggie's radar is Dee Davis at 1,092 points.

### BALCOMB BALL

Head Coach Melanie Balcomb has averaged 23 wins per season during her decade on West End. If she can maintain that pace this season, she'll become the all-time winningest coach in Vanderbilt history. With a record of 251-100, Balcomb is just six wins from passing 2013 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Inductee Jim Foster.

### SHUTTING THEM DOWN

In Vanderbilt's 67-36 win over Austin Peay, second half defense was the big difference maker. The Commodores held the Lady Govies to nine points in the period, including 3-28 from the field and 1-10 from three-point range. The nine points marked the lowest output in a half for a Vanderbilt opponent since November 22, 2005. On that date, the Commodores held Alabama A&M to eight first half points en route to an 80-29 win. In addition, Vanderbilt held the Lady Govies to just 13-56 from the field, good for 23.2%. That marks the lowest field goal percentage for an opponent since December 21, 2008, when UT Martin was held to 17.6% (9-51) from the field in an 86-29 Commodore victory.

### MIXING IT UP

Through 19 games this season, Head Coach Melanie Balcomb has used five different starting lineups. That matches the number of starting five Vanderbilt used all of last season. In fact, Balcomb did not change the starting lineup at all until the 16th game of the season. The most common lineup this season is Jasmine Lister, Christina Foggie, Kady Schran, Elan Brown and Tiffany Clarke. The quintet is 10-4 as starters this season.

### CLARKE SHOOTING FOR THE STARS

Senior forward Tiffany Clarke has connected for 120 field goals on 214 attempts this season, good for a .561 shooting percentage which is second in the Southeastern Conference. In addition, her mark of .565 at the last NCAA national update on January 25 is 15th in the nation. Off that shooting, Clarke is averaging 16.0 points per outing this season, first on the team and fifth in the league.

### WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

Senior Elan Brown is one of the players who's true impact does not show up on the stat sheet, but against No. 9/9 Tennessee, the guard dished out a career-high six assists. Brown is one of just three Vanderbilt

players to have started all 19 games this season and averages 6.4 points and 6.4 rebounds per game, in addition to 2.2 assists and 1.6 steals per game. Perhaps the best measure of Brown's impact is her plus/minus rating, which measures Vanderbilt's scoring differential when she is on the floor, which is +10.47, second on the team to only Tiffany Clarke's +10.63.

### STARTING TO DEFEND

Two Vanderbilt players who found themselves atop statistical categories in the SEC last year are off to a solid start this year. Christina Foggie, who led the SEC with 17.7 points per game last year, is averaging 15.6 (sixth in the conference). The junior is a First Team Preseason All-SEC honoree and has been named to watch lists for the Wooden Award and Wade Trophy. Jasmine Lister led the conference with 5.5 assists last season and already has four double-digit assist performances this season, including in both of Vanderbilt's SEC contests. Lister's 6.1 assists per game this season rank second in the Southeastern Conference.

### STARTING THEM EARLY

Head Coach Melanie Balcomb has always shown a willingness to play freshmen early if they earn the minutes. Freshman forwards Heather Bowe, Kendall Shaw and Rayte'a Long have seen action in most of Vanderbilt's games this season, with Bowe starting two contests in Puerto Rico. Bowe is posting 5.6 points and 4.4 rebounds per game. Shaw has contributed 3.3 points and 2.2 boards, while Long is adding 2.1 points and 1.2 rebounds per outing. The rookie trio became even more important with the loss of center Stephanie Holzer for the season, as they will be trying to replace Holzer's 11.0 points and 7.5 rebounds per game. Bowe, Shaw and Long are doing their best, averaging 11.0 points and 7.6 rebounds per game, combined.

### CLARKE'S GOT CLASS

Senior forward Tiffany Clarke is one of 30 players nationwide nominated for the Senior CLASS Award. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate classes will be narrowed to 10 men's and 10 women's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one men's finalist and one women's finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition. ### FEW AND FAR BETWEEN

After the Commodores snapped a three-game losing streak against Austin Peay, it is important to note such streaks under Melanie Balcomb have been few and far between. On just four occasions in her 10-plus seasons in Nashville have the Commodores lost three or more consecutive outings. The most recent instance came last year, when they lost at Tennessee, at Arkansas and to South Carolina in overtime. That team went on to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Prior to that, Vanderbilt had not lost three-in-a-row since 2005-06. They also dropped three straight in 2004-05, with that team going on to the Sweet 16. The longest losing streak came in 2003-04, when the Commodores dropped four-straight games before advancing to the Sweet 16.

### A NEW WAY TO GIVE THANKS

For the first time since 1998-99, Vanderbilt did not host a Thanksgiving Tournament at Memorial Gym. Instead, the Commodores will head to the San Juan Shootout in San Juan, Puerto Rico, to take on Virginia and Florida State. It marks the first time since 1989-90 there will not be an in-season tournament at Memorial Gym.

### HOLZER OUT FOR SEASON

While the Commodores did win their exhibition game against Alabama-Huntsville, 81-53, they did suffer a pretty big loss. Redshirt junior center

Stephanie Holzer will miss the entire 2012-13 campaign after suffering a dislocated knee just 11 minutes into the contest. Holzer has led the Commodores in rebounds each of the last two seasons, was SEC Sixth Woman of the Year in 2010-11 and was Honorable Mention All-SEC last season. Holzer redshirted as a freshman in 2009-10 after breaking her ankle in a preseason workout.

## BRING 'EM BACK

With 10 of 11 players returning from last year's 23-win squad, Vanderbilt brings back 97.6% of its scoring. The percent of returning scoring is tops in the Southeastern Conference, with only Alabama returning over 90%:

## THE STANDARD MAINTAINED

Vanderbilt women's basketball, one of the top-20 winningest programs of all time, maintained that winning standard during the 2011-12 season. Under 10th-year Head Coach Melanie Balcomb, the Commodores won 20-plus games for the 26th time and received their 25th NCAA Tournament bid, going 23-10 and earning an at-large bid and a seven seed in the Fresno Region. During Balcomb's 10 seasons at the helm on West End, Vanderbilt has won 20 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament each year. With their first round NCAA win over 10th-seeded Middle Tennessee, the Commodores have also won at least one NCAA Tournament game in nine of the 10 seasons under Balcomb.

## THE TOURNAMENT STANDARD

The 2011-12 season saw Vanderbilt make the NCAA Tournament for the 25th time and 13th-in-a-row. The Commodores have posted a 38-25 (.603) mark in the tournament and won at least one game in each tournament during 12 of the last 13 appearances. Vanderbilt has made 14 appearances in the Sweet 16, including six in the last 12 seasons. The Commodores have one Final Four appearance (1993).

## THAT WOULD MAKE A BAKER'S DOZEN

Vanderbilt is one of eight programs to have made the last 13 NCAA Tournaments. The Commodores are joined by Connecticut, Duke, Georgia, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Stanford and Tennessee as the only programs to have earned bids each of the last 13 seasons.

## FOGGIE WINS SEC SCORING TITLE

For the first time since 1991, Vanderbilt boasted the top scorer in the Southeastern Conference. Sophomore guard Christina Foggie led the league with 17.9 points per game at the conclusion of the regular season, as well as a conference-best 18.0 points per contest during SEC games. Foggie received WBCA All-Region honors and was a First Team All-SEC selection by the league's coaches and the Associated Press. She had 12 20-point performances on the season and led Vanderbilt in scoring during 16 contests on the season. The highlights included a career-high 34 points in a 68-48 upset of No. 17/15 Georgia and 22 points in a 93-79 win over No. 11/11 Tennessee. Foggie became just the second Vanderbilt player to win the SEC scoring title, joining Wendy Scholtens, who won three league scoring titles (1989, '90 and '91).

## VANDERBILT IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Vanderbilt made its 25th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 13th-consecutive. All-time, Vanderbilt is 38-25 in NCAA play, following a first round win over Middle Tennessee and a second round loss to Duke. It marked the 11th time in 12 seasons the Commodores won at least one game in the Tournament. Vanderbilt has made 14 Sweet 16 appearances, including six over the last 11 seasons (last in 2009). The last Elite Eight trip came in 2002, while Vanderbilt's lone Final Four appearance was in 1993. In first and second round contests, Vanderbilt is 32-11, while it is

### VANDERBILT ATHLETICS UNMATCHED PAST TWO YEARS

With Vanderbilt's invitation to the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, the school concluded its second straight calendar year in which its baseball and men's and women's basketball teams played in the NCAA Tournament and its football team was invited to a bowl. In 2011, there were eight schools that accomplished this feat, and in 2012 there were just six. Vanderbilt is the only school to do it two years in a row. During the 2011-12 academic year, Vanderbilt was also one of just six schools nationally to finish with NCAA Tournament appearances in baseball and men's and women's basketball and in a bowl game.

### VANDERBILT BASKETBALL IS EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

The Vanderbilt women's and men's basketball teams made their respective NCAA Tournament fields each of the last three seasons, something only accomplished by 10 NCAA Division I institutions. 2012 was the 10th time both teams made the NCAA Tournament, with both teams previously making the tournament in 1989, 1991, 1993, 1997, 2004, 2007, 2008, 2010 and 2011. The other nine schools to have both programs reach the NCAA Tournament over the last three seasons are Duke, Georgetown, Gonzaga, Kentucky, Michigan State, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Texas and West Virginia. In addition, with Christina Foggie capturing the women's SEC scoring title and Vanderbilt's John Jenkins doing the same on the men's side, it marked just the fourth time in SEC history the same school won both titles and first since 2006.

### TOPS FROM FIELD & THREE

As is usually the case under Melanie Balcomb, Vanderbilt was one of the top teams in the nation from the field and from three-point range last season. The Commodores finished sixth in the nation after shooting 46.4% from the field (national champion Baylor led the nation at 48.8%). They matched the sixth-place ranking from three, posting a 37.2% mark from beyond the arc (Richmond led the country at 38.8%). All 10 teams Balcomb has coached at Vanderbilt have finished in the top-20 of the NCAA in field goal percentage. As a program, only Vanderbilt and Connecticut have finished that high every season since 2000.

### NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb and her coaching staff have put together one of the best recruiting classes in program history, with the three-player class earning top-15 national rankings from multiple recruiting services. All Star Girls Report ranks the class at No. 12 in the country, while Collegiate Girls Basketball Report ranks the class 13th nationally and third in the Southeastern Conference. BlueStar Report has the new crop of Commodores as the No. 15 class in the country. In addition, all three have been named nominees for the McDonald's High School All-America Game. A quick look at the newest Commodores:

# MELANIE BALCOMB

The numbers say it all – 10 seasons, 10 NCAA Tournaments, 10 seasons of at least 20 wins. Vanderbilt women’s basketball has been a model of consistency under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. That’s not to mention three SEC Tournament Championships, four Sweet 16 trips and eight top-25 finishes over a decade in Nashville.

Since arriving in 2002, Balcomb has posted a 238-94 (.717) record at Vanderbilt, averaging 23.8 wins per season. Should she match that pace in season 11, Balcomb will become the winningest coach in program history (Jim Foster, 256-99 in 11 season). Balcomb was the fastest in program history to reach 200 wins, reaching that mark in five fewer games than Foster.

Balcomb is one of just eight coaches in the nation to have led a program to each of the last 10 NCAA Tournaments. In 2012, she becomes the second longest-tenured coach in the Southeastern Conference, trailing only Georgia’s Andy Landers (33 seasons). Over her 10 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has coached eight WNBA draft picks, a WBCA National Defensive Player of the Year (Jennifer Risper), a WBCA National Scholar-Athlete of the Year (Christina Wirth) and an SEC scoring champion (Christina Foggie), while graduating 100% of her players.

With nearly 20 years of collegiate head coaching experience, Balcomb is a renowned offensive strategist. Her 10 seasons at Vanderbilt have only enhanced that reputation. Every Commodore squad has finished in the top-20 nationally in field goal percentage, averaging a finish of 7.8 nationally (including four teams that have finished top-four nationally). Balcomb’s inaugural Commodore team in 2002-03 led the nation in field goal percentage, shooting 51.3%.

The Commodores have shot just as well from three-point range, averaging a top-15 finish in three-point percentage among Division I teams with top-40 finishes every season. Balcomb’s 2006-07 squad led the nation in three-point shooting at 43.7%, while her most recent edition finished sixth nationally at 37.2%.

The Commodores have finished in the top-10 nationally in field-goal percentage seven times and in the top-10 in three-point field-goal percentage six times under Balcomb. Her teams have also finished in the top five in assists per game, free-throw percentage and scoring offense.

Balcomb’s teams have been especially successful at home, where Vanderbilt has posted a 131-25 (.840) record at Memorial Gym. The Commodores have been almost as successful during the stretch-run, as over the last 10 years, Vanderbilt’s record over the final nine regular season games is 62-23, good for a .730 winning percentage.

Balcomb’s success as a head coach is not limited to Vanderbilt. Before arriving at Vanderbilt, Balcomb had successful coaching tenures at Ashland (Ohio) and Xavier. She picked-up her 400th career win in the opening round of the 2011 SEC Tournament and has a career mark of 401-198 (.669). The 2012-13 season-opener will be Balcomb’s 600th game as a head coach.

The 2011-12 season saw one of Balcomb’s youngest teams, as the squad of 11 featured just one senior, yet she still successfully steered the Commodores to a 23-10 mark and a 13th-straight NCAA Tournament. Leading the way was break-out star Christina Foggie, who became the first Balcomb player to lead the SEC in scoring (17.7 ppg).

Foggie was a First Team All-SEC selection and was joined by four other Commodores earning All-SEC honors – Jasmine Lister (second team), Tiffany Clarke (second team), Stephanie Holzer (honorable mention) and Kady Schran (All-Freshman).

Vanderbilt defeated three ranked opponents on the season (No. 12 Oklahoma, No. 17 Georgia and No. 11 Tennessee), earning a seven seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores hosted at Memorial Gym, defeating 10th-seeded Middle Tennessee in the first round before falling to second-seeded Duke.

Balcomb started at Vanderbilt in 2002 and wasted no time in implementing her own style of winning. Working to transition veteran players into a new system while building new team chemistry, Balcomb’s first year saw the Commodores win six of their last seven regular season games, earn an NCAA Tournament berth, and lead the nation in field goal percentage (51.3) against the fourth toughest schedule in the country. She was named a finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year award.

In 2003-04, Balcomb led the Commodores to their fourth Southeastern Conference Tournament title. She masterfully balanced strong upper-class leadership with exciting freshmen talent, winning 10 consecutive games and advancing to the program's 11th Sweet 16 appearance. One year later, her team made its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Commodores posted the most wins (10) in the program's history in Southeastern Conference play finishing with a 10-4 record.

The Commodores were ranked seventh in the final AP poll of the 2006-07 season, and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament after winning another SEC Tournament title. That Vanderbilt squad was the nation's best three-point shooting team, and ranked among the top 10 in points scored. The team's 28-6 mark was the best record for a VU squad in 14 years.

The 2008 season was also one of Balcomb's most impressive coaching jobs. Despite graduating three All-SEC seniors, she led the Commodores to a 25-9 record and the school's 13th appearance in the NCAA sweet 16, all with two freshmen and no seniors in the starting lineup.

In 2009, Vanderbilt won its sixth SEC Tournament title, the third for Balcomb in the last six years. The team also advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 14th time in school history -- Balcomb's fourth trip with the Commodores. Vanderbilt finished

the year ranked No. 8 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll after narrowly missing an upset of No. 1 seed Maryland in the Raleigh Regional Semifinal.

National accolades came flooding in for Vanderbilt, including senior Jennifer Risper being named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Defensive Player of the Year. Risper and classmate Christina Wirth, who herself was named an All-American and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, were both selected in the 2009 WNBA Draft.

In 2010 Balcomb was faced with one of her most challenging tasks. Faced with replacing National Defensive Player of the Year Jennifer Risper and All-American Christina Wirth, Balcomb guided an undersized team back to the NCAA Tournament, where they narrowly missed advancing to their third consecutive sweet 16.

Despite having to overcome numerous injuries throughout out the season and a size disadvantage in almost every game, Vanderbilt finished the season 23-11 overall. Individually, Balcomb helped junior point guard Jence Rhoads earn first team All-SEC honors, while senior shooting guard Merideth Marsh earned second team All-SEC accolades. Elan Brown and Tiffany Clarke were also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

The 2010-11 season featured many obstacles that Balcomb successfully maneuvered through to reach another NCAA Tournament and finish third in the SEC. Injuries took an unfortunate toll on the team throughout the year with at least one of Vanderbilt's five leading scorers unavailable for 14 out of the team's 32 games. Injuries coupled with matching Georgia for the fewest upperclassmen in the SEC challenged Balcomb to use different personnel groupings regularly.

Despite the challenges, Balcomb again reached 20 wins, finishing 20-12 and 10-6 in the SEC. Individually, Balcomb helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention All-America honors from the Associated Press in addition to first team All-SEC recognition. Rhoads was also a WBCA Region 3 All-American. Freshman center Stephanie Holzer was named honorable mention All-SEC, SEC Sixth Woman of the Year and to the SEC All-Freshmen team. Freshman point guard Jasmine Lister was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

In 10 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has won 13 games in the NCAA Tournament, including a 9-1 mark in the opening round. She holds a winning percentage of 65.7 against SEC opponents. In all, Balcomb owns series advantages over 10 of the 11 other schools in the SEC before 2012.

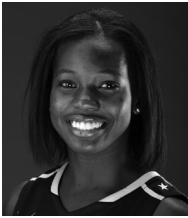

Foggie made it a one-possession game with 20 seconds left by connecting for a three, but two free throws from Kelley Austria put the game away for Dayton, providing the final margin of 71-66.

The junior guard added five assists. Classmate and fellow guard Jasmine Lister contributed 14 points and seven assists in the effort. Kady Schran, coming off the bench for the first time this season, scored 10 points while dishing out three assists. The Cavaliers were led by Jazmin Pitts, who scored 20 points off the bench. Sarah Imovbioh added 15 points and six rebounds, while China Crosby scored 13, dished out seven assists and grabbed five rebounds. Virginia opened the game with a 12-2 run before the Commodores slowly fought back to pull within one, 23-22, with 7:33 left in the opening half. Virginia responded with a 10-0 run over the next four minutes to take a 33-22 lead. They maintained the 11-point advantage into the break, 37-26. The Commodores continued to fight in the second half, closing the gap to three points, 47-44, with 12:45 left in the game. Virginia responded again, pushing the lead right back to eight and Vanderbilt would get no closer than five over the rest of the contest. "We have to start games better," Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "We can't only play hard when we're down." Balcomb was pleased with Foggie's effort, but wants the Preseason All-SEC selection to take charge earlier. "(Foggie) has to come out aggressive and ready to shoot the ball," Balcomb explained.

**NASHVILLE** -- The Vanderbilt women's basketball team snapped its three game losing skid behind 19 points from senior Tiffany Clarke, defeating Austin Peay on Wednesday, 67-36. Vanderbilt dominated the second half, as the Commodores (4-3 overall) out-scored Austin Peay (1-5 overall), 38-9. The Commodores also owned the battle of the boards, outrebounding the Lady Gobs, 56-24. Clarke led all scorers with 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting from the field, while also pulling down a game-high seven rebounds. Jasmine Lister (12) and Morgan Batey (11) were the only other Commodores to finish in double figures. The 11 points for Batey were a new career-high. Lister and Jasmine Jenkins tied for the team-lead with four assists apiece. As a team, Vanderbilt shot 39 percent from the field, while holding Austin Peay to just 23 percent overall and 21 percent from behind the three-point line. The Commodores also shot an efficient 85 percent (23-of-27) from the free throw line. Austin Peay's Tiasha Gray led the way with 12 points on 4-of-6 shooting from behind the three-point line. Gray was the lone Lady Gov to score in double-figures. Both teams went back-and-forth for much of the first half, as neither team could really find a rhythm. The two teams combined to commit 11 fouls within the first five minutes of the game, while also turning the ball over a combined 24 times in the half. The Commodores held a 29-27 lead at the half, behind 10 first half points from Clarke. She was the only player in double figures. Vanderbilt shot 42 percent from the field, but committed 15 turnovers, while Austin Peay shot 35 percent and committed nine turnovers. Gray scored nine of her 12 points in the first half for Austin Peay.

**NASHVILLE** -- Head Coach Melanie Balcomb wanted her team to focus on defense right from the tip on Saturday against Tennessee Tech. The Commodores did just that, utilizing a 15-0 run to open the game, before cruising to a 77-50 victory at Memorial Gym. The Commodores (5-3) were led by 17 points from Tiffany Clarke. The senior also grabbed seven rebounds. Classmate Elan Brown contributed 10 points and nine rebounds. Vanderbilt also got nine from Morgan Batey, eight from Jasmine Lister and seven each from Kady Schran and Gabby Smith. Tennessee Tech was led by 18 points from Diamond Henderson. T'Keyah Williams contributed 10 points and five rebounds. The 15-0 Vanderbilt run to open the contest was the best for a Commodore team to start a game since a 17-0 run against Lipscomb in last season's Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament. During the stretch, Tennessee Tech missed six field goals and turned the ball over twice. In addition to stout defense, Vanderbilt shot 50% from the field (27-54). It marked the first time since the season opener against McNeese State that the Commodores shot at least 50% from the floor. "I'm really proud of how we're executing," Balcomb said. "I think that's what's important. It's being able to slow down. As we start to trust our defense, you can play relaxed on offense." Vanderbilt led the entire contest and the biggest lead of 27 points was the final margin. Balcomb felt her team played two complete halves for the first time this season. "We just wanted to put two halves together to continue to build confidence," Balcomb said. "I think the most important part of that is the start of both halves." Brown, who has emerged as the team's steady force, seconded that notion. "That was one of our goals, especially this past week," Brown explained.

**NASHVILLE** -- Tiffany Clarke recorded her first double-double of the season to lead Vanderbilt past Hartford, 67-45 on Thursday night at Memorial Gym. Clarke scored 12 of her 22 points in the second half to help Vanderbilt (7-3) put away Hartford (6-2) for good. Clarke led all players with 22 points and 12 rebounds, which was her first double-double of the season and 13th of her career. Late in the first half, Clarke also became the 34th player to reach 1,000 career points for the Commodores. She is now tied for 31st (Rhonda Blades) all-time with 1,017 career points. The Duluth, Ga., native shot an efficient 7-of-10 from the field and 8-of-10 from the free throw line. She also tied a career-high with four blocked shots. Kady Schranz was the only other Commodore in double-figures as she finished with 10 points. Jasmine Lister added nine points and a game-high five assists. Elan Brown and Gabby Smith each scored eight points. Christina Foggie tied a career-high with four steals. As a team, the Commodores shot 48 percent from the field, while holding the Hawks to just 32 percent from the field and only 23 percent from behind the three-point line. Vandy outrebounded Hartford, 43-32 for the game. Vanderbilt led by as many as 24 points in the second half to run away from the Hawks. Hartford's Alex Hall scored 10 points to lead the Hawks, while Amber Bepko added eight points and a team-high six rebounds. Vanderbilt used a 13-0 run midway through the first half to take a 17-8 lead. The Commodores held Hartford scoreless for nearly six minutes during the run and would extend their lead to as many as 13 in the first half. Behind 10 points and eight rebounds from Clarke, the Commodores led 30-19 at the half. Clarke was the lone player in double-figures after one half of play. Brown had six points, while Lister chipped in five points and two assists. Both teams struggled shooting the ball in the first half, as Vanderbilt shot 40 percent (13-of-32) from the field, 16 percent (1-of-6) from behind the three-point line and only 37 percent (3-of-8) from the free throw line. Hartford shot 26 percent (6-of-23) from the field and 30 percent (3-of-10) from three-point range. Vanderbilt outrebounded the Hawks 24-16, while also forcing eight Hartford first half turnovers.

**NORMAN, Okla.** -- The Vanderbilt women's basketball team used a complete, team performance to take a 76-63 victory at No. 12/13 Oklahoma on Sunday, December 16. The Commodores improve to 8-3 and have won five-straight games. The Sooners fall to 8-2. Four Commodores were in double-figures, led by 17 from Christina Foggie. Jasmine Lister and Tiffany Clarke contributed 16 each, while Kady Schranz added 11 points. Clarke grabbed a team-best eight rebounds, while Lister grabbed six of her own and dished out nine assists. Oklahoma was led by 21 points from Aaryn Ellenberg. Nicole Griffin scored 11 points and grabbed five rebounds, while Morgan Hook scored 10 and had four rebounds. Joanna McFarland just missed a double-double with nine points and a game-high 11 rebounds. "I'm really proud of our effort defensively," said Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. "I thought Elan Brown played really hard, diving on balls and getting loose balls and we started to follow that. It was a really good team effort." Brown scored just four points, but grabbed five rebounds and four steals. As a team, Vanderbilt forced 20 Oklahoma turnovers and scored 23 points off those miscues, while the Commodores picked up a season-best 12 steals. The opening minutes were filled with back-and-forth action. Oklahoma jumped out to an 8-4 lead before a pair of steals by Brown and Foggie helped the Commodores tie it back up at eight. With the game still tied at 13, Schranz went on an 8-0 run by herself to put Vanderbilt up, 21-13. Hook responded with a 3-pointer before the media timeout to make it 21-16. The run would end up being 18-15, with Vanderbilt opening a 31-18 lead with just over six minutes left in the half. The Commodore lead would be maintained into the break, with the score at the half being 37-27. In the first half alone, Vanderbilt matched its season best with 10 steals. The Sooners turned it over 15 times in the opening period, leading to 16 Commodore points. Oklahoma came out strong in the second half, cutting the Vanderbilt lead to 41-35 before the Commodores responded with an 11-2 run. The stretch was capped by a three from Lister that made it 52-37. The Sooners continued to respond. After Vanderbilt built an 18-point lead, Oklahoma quickly cut it to 12, 60-48, with just over seven minutes to play. Twice Sooner runs were halted by three-pointers from Gabby Smith. Oklahoma again closed it to nine, 65-56, with 3:50 to play as Ellenberg was starting to heat up. Then Clarke grabbed a big offensive rebound and got the put-back to make it 67-56. After Ellenberg hit another jumper, Foggie hit a pull-up jumper, followed by a 3-pointer to push the lead back to 14, 72-58.

**LOS ANGELES --** The Vanderbilt women's basketball team closed out non-conference play with a seven-game winning streak, defeating USC, 74-56, on Saturday, December 29, at the Galen Center. The Commodores improved to 10-3, while the Trojans fell to 3-8. As usual, Christina Foggie and Tiffany Clarke led the way. Foggie scored 28 points on 8-of-18 shooting and 7-of-11 from three. The seven three-pointers matched a career-high for the junior and were just one shy of the Vanderbilt record for threes in a game. Clarke recorded her third double-double in the last four games, scoring 24 points and grabbing 11 rebounds. The senior forward shot 10-21 from the field. Jasmine Lister joined the pair in double-figures. A native of nearby Corona, Calif., the junior guard scored 11 and dished out six assists, while grabbing three steals playing in front of several family members and friends. USC was led by 22 from Cassie Harberts. The forward scored 22 points and grabbed seven rebounds. Ariya Crook contributed 12 points for the Trojans, who have lost six-straight. After Vanderbilt worked to an eight-point lead midway through the first half, USC worked it to one before taking tying the game, 20-20, with 6:27 left in the period on a free throw by Harberts. Clarke responded with a basket to push the lead back to two. The teams traded baskets before the Trojans took their first lead, 25-22, on a three by Vaiioletama with 5:24 to play. Harberts followed with a jumper to push the lead to 27-22. Schrann hit a pair of free throws to cut the lead to three before Foggie drilled a three to even the score up at 27. The junior had a jumper to put the Commodores up 31-30, but Crook connected from three with three seconds left to put the Trojans up 33-31 at the break. The teams were close from the field, with USC shooting 46.2% and Vanderbilt shooting 45.5%. The squads were an identical 3-5 from three in the first period. Points off turnovers were a big advantage for the Trojans, as USC had 12 points off six turnovers, while Vanderbilt had just four points off nine USC miscues. The second period was a different story, as it was all Vanderbilt. VU opened the second half with a 19-6 run, taking a 50-39 lead. The Commodores built the lead mostly by securing the basketball, as Vanderbilt did not commit a turnover in the second period until there was just 7:25 left in the game. In the second half, Vanderbilt outscored the Trojans 43-23, to pick-up its first win of the season when trailing at the half (at Western Kentucky). Foggie and Clarke combined for 29 of Vanderbilt's points, while Lister added seven in the period. In addition to sound offense, the Commodores played solid defense in the frame, as well. They held the Trojans to 33.3% (10-30) shooting, while forcing eight turnovers and scoring seven points off those miscues.

**LOS ANGELES --** A balanced scoring attack led Vanderbilt to a 92-41 rout of the Mississippi State Bulldogs Thursday night at Memorial Gym in the SEC opener. Vanderbilt (11-3, 1-0) scorched Mississippi State (8-6, 0-1) for season-highs in points (92), assists (24), steals (12) and a season-low eight turnovers on a night when everything went right for the Commodores in their first conference game of the 2013 calendar year. Every player that suited up for the Commodores, saw game action. The 51-point margin of victory for Vandy was the largest since the Commodores defeated Quinnipiac, 111-53 (+58) on Nov. 26, 2010. Five different Commodores reached double-figures on the night, led by Christina Foggie's 17 points on 5-of-10 shooting from the field and 3-of-7 from downtown. Foggie also chipped in four rebounds, four steals and three assists. Jasmine Lister recorded her third career double-double and second of the season with 14 points and 10 assists. Tiffany Clarke scored 14 points and grabbed six rebounds. Kady Schrann added 13 points, three rebounds, two assists and two steals. Heather Bowe added 10 points off the bench on 3-of-4 shooting from the field and a perfect 4-of-4 from the charity stripe. For the game, VU shot 57 percent (31-of-54) from the field, 53 percent (7-of-13) from three-point range and 92 percent (23-of-25) from the free throw line. Vanderbilt's suffocating defense held Mississippi State to just 32 percent from the field and 7 percent (1-of-13) from three-point range, while also forcing 22 MSU turnovers. Vandy then converted those turnovers into 36 points. Martha Alwal led Mississippi State with 14 points and seven rebounds, while Carnecia Williams added 11 points. The Commodores started the game on a 23-9 run behind seven points from Foggie and five points and four assists from Lister. Foggie then hit back-to-back three-pointers at the 10-minute mark in the half, giving VU a 29-11 lead. Foggie led the Commodores with 13 first half points, en route to a 53-18 lead at halftime. Vandy shot a blistering 58 percent from the field and 55 percent from three-point range. Lister was also in double-figures with 10 points and a game-high seven assists. **COLUMBIA, S.C.** -- The Vanderbilt women's basketball team saw its nine-game win streak snapped on the road at No. 18/16 South Carolina, 64-48. The Commodores fell to 12-4, 2-1 in SEC play, while the Gamecocks improved to 14-2, 2-1 in league action. The highlight of the night for the Black and Gold came with 10:10 to play when junior Christina Foggie became the 35th player in program history to reach 1,000 career points. Foggie finished the night with nine points and seven rebounds. Heather Bowe and Jasmine Lister each scored 11 to lead the Commodores. Lister added eight assists. Tiffany Clarke scored eight points and grabbed five rebounds, while Elan Brown contributed seven points. South Carolina was led by 13 points from Aleighsa Welch. The Gamecocks also got 12 points and five assists from leasia Walker. Ashley Bruner and Elem Ibiem each added nine. Sancheon White led the Gamecocks with eight rebounds. USC outscored Vanderbilt in the paint, 36-20. "Even when we did have a good look or good shot, you have to make it," Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "And then when you don't make it, you have to offensive rebound. Our lack of offensive rebounding was exposed again tonight." Balcomb was also not pleased with her team's frustrating showing on the floor. "We went back to our frustrating showing," the coach explained. "It was something uncharacteristic, more like where we were in the beginning of the season. We had to bring them back together as a team and we made a few runs." She was also quick to credit South Carolina. "We haven't seen that defense all year," Balcomb said. "You want to put your team in situations (to prepare) and nobody plays defense like that." South Carolina's defense stifled the Commodores in the first half, holding Vanderbilt to 4-of-20 shooting and forcing 10 turnovers. Vanderbilt did not hit a field goal in the final 7:07 of the period and trailed, 36-20, at the break. Foul trouble was also a first-half issue, as Clarke and Bowe both had two fouls with seven minutes left in the half. That showed in the post, as the Gamecocks outscored Vanderbilt, 24-6, in the paint in the opening frame. Vanderbilt slowly chipped away at the lead in the second half, cutting it to 47-37 on a pair of Bowe free throws. They would cut it to 10 again, 55-45, with 2:23 to play before a Mitchell layup pushed the lead back to 12. That would be as close as the Commodores would get before falling. Commodore defense kept the second period closer, as they held South Carolina to 38.5% shooting in the period. Vanderbilt also forced 11 USC turnovers in the period.

**NASHVILLE** -- Four different Commodores recorded double-digit scoring efforts on Sunday afternoon versus the Arkansas Razorbacks en route to a 78-58 win at Memorial Gym. With the win, Vanderbilt is now 13-4 overall and 3-1 in conference action, while the Razorbacks dropped to 13-4 on the season and 1-3 in SEC play. The win also makes Vandy 8-0 at Memorial Gym this season and 11-1 all-time versus Arkansas in the building. Jasmine Lister led the way with a game-high 19 points (7-of-13) and six assists. Christina Foggie finished with 18 points on 6-of-14 shooting from the field to go along with five rebounds, four assists and two steals. With Foggie's three made three-point field goals (175), she moved past Paige Redman (173) for seventh all-time in school history for made three-pointers. Tiffany Clarke scored 10 of her 15 points in the second half on 7-of-9 shooting from the floor. Elan Brown finished one rebound shy of a double-double with 10 points and nine rebounds. Denise Brooks also added four assists. As a team, Vanderbilt dished out 20 assists on the day, while Arkansas only managed 11. The 20 assists marks the fourth time this season in which Vandy has had 20 or more assists in a game and three of those come in SEC contests. For the game, the Commodores scorched the Arkansas defense at the tune of 56 percent (28-of-50) from the field and 42 percent (8-of-19) beyond the arc. After turning the ball over 11 times in the first half, the Commodores only turned it over five times in the second half. Arkansas shot 37 percent from the field, but could not find the range from behind the three-point line, as the Razorbacks converted on 1-of-15 (6.7 percent) tries. Quistelle Williams finished with 16 points, six rebounds, three steals and two blocked shots for the Razorbacks, while Sarah Watkins added 10 points and five boards off the bench. Coming out of the locker room after the break, Vanderbilt picked up right where it left off, as the Commodores used a 9-0 run to take a 52-29 lead. That lead would extend to as many as 24 in the second half. Vanderbilt used a 12-0 run midway through the first half to take a 16-6 lead. Foggie and Lister combined to score 12 of the first 18 points of the game. The Commodores then used an 8-0 run to extend their lead right before the break. Foggie led all scorers with 12 points at the half to lead Vandy to a 43-29 lead. Foggie also contributed three assists, two steals and two rebounds. Lister was the only other player in double-digits with 10 points. For the half, Vandy shot an extremely efficient 60.9 percent (14-of-23) from the field. The Commodores also outscored the Razorbacks 19-17 in the first half. Arkansas shot just 33 percent (12-of-36) from the field and 14 percent (1-of-7) from three-point range, but did force 11 Vanderbilt turnovers. Williams led the Razorbacks with eight points in the first half on 4-of-10 shooting from the floor.

NASHVILLE (AP) -- Melanie Balcomb wanted her Vanderbilt Commodores to push the ball inside offensively and focus on defending Taber Spani and Meighan Simmons of Tennessee. They didn't follow the game plan well at all. The Commodores outscored No. 9 Tennessee 38-32 in the paint and even grabbed 21 offensive rebounds, but they couldn't keep up with the Lady Vols' top scorers Thursday night in losing 83-75. "Believe it or not, the game plan in the first half was the same as it was in the second half," Balcomb said. "We just didn't execute the game plan. Get the ball inside, get the ball to the rim. It all worked in the second half. The first half, we took too many outside shots, weren't aggressive and didn't attack enough." That left Vanderbilt trailing 41-29 at halftime. The Commodores scored the first 12 points of the second half to tie up Tennessee at 41. But that was as close as they would get as the Lady Vols responded by scoring 11 of the next 13 points before hitting 14 of their final 15 free throws in the final 3:49 to seal the win. "Just can't celebrate when we make a run," Vanderbilt junior guard Christina Foggie said. Foggie led Vandy with 22 points before fouling out in the final minute, Tiffany Clarke had 19 and Kady Schranz 14. Spani scored a career-high 24 points and Simmons added 23 as Tennessee (16-3, 7-0) won its ninth straight. The Lady Vols got a measure of payback for losing in Memorial Gym a year ago, their last SEC loss. "Well, I mean honestly you just want to come in and play your best against a great SEC team," Spani said. "Obviously, this is a great rivalry game. But we also have a lot of respect for Vanderbilt and what they're capable of doing and it's always a great environment." With No. 5 Kentucky losing to No. 18 South Carolina earlier in the night, Tennessee is the Southeastern Conference's last undefeated team in league play. Simmons said that's exactly where the Lady Vols expected to be. Coach Holly Warlick cautioned it's still very early this season. "But yeah, it's great to be undefeated and be on top of the SEC," Warlick said. "But ... we're not satisfied absolutely." The Lady Vols have won 11 straight SEC games dating back to the loss here last season. Bashaara Graves also had 16 points for Tennessee. Vanderbilt (13-6, 3-3) lost for the first time at home this season and has lost three of four overall. The Commodores played without 6-foot-4 sophomore Clair Watkins, who suffered a knee injury in practice Wednesday. They still pulled down 21 offensive rebounds despite being outrebounded 46-43. The Commodores managed to tie the score twice, the second time at 41 after scoring the first 12 points of the second half. The Lady Vols answered with an 11-2 spurt capped by a drive by Simmons with 12:45 to go, and Vanderbilt couldn't get closer than five the rest of the way. Tennessee hit 14 of 15 at the line in the final 3:49 to seal the victory. The Commodores came in as the SEC's second-best team beyond the arc, shooting 36.4 percent from 3-point range. They shot 21.7 percent (5-of-23) and missed three 3s in the final minutes with a chance to make it a one-score game.
