## SCOUTING THE COMMODORES

The Vanderbilt women's basketball team (16-9, 6-6), heads to Florida following an 83-64 setback at No. 12/10 Tennessee. The Commodores have been playing without their leading scorer, Christina Foggie. The junior is averaging 15.7 points per game and has missed the last two contests with a knee injury. Tiffany Clarke is second on the team in scoring at 15.5 points per game, while leading the team in rebounding at 8.2 per contest. Clarke is shooting 54.0% from the field, which is second in the SEC and 18th nationally. Clarke did not see action in the second half of the game at UT after falling ill at halftime. Junior point guard Jasmine Lister is coming off a 24-point performance against the Lady Vols and is third on the team at 11.9 points per game. She is also averaging 5.6 assists per game, third in the SEC. Senior guard Elan Brown is also expected to start on Thursday. Brown is averaging 6.5 points and 5.8 rebounds per game, second on the team. Freshman forward Heather Bowe is likely to join Clarke in the post to start the game. Bowe is posting 6.6 points and 4.8 rebounds per contest. Senior guard Gabby Smith rounded out the starting five in Foggie's absence and is averaging 1.9 points and 1.2 rebounds per game. Off the bench, look for freshman guard Morgan Batey (1.9 ppg/2.1 rpg), freshman guard Jasmine Jenkins (1.9 ppg/2.4 rpg) and freshman forward Kendall Shaw (3.5 ppg/2.1 rpg).

## SCOUTING THE GATORS

Florida (15-11, 4-8 SEC) enters the contest having lost its last two games to Texas A&M, 78-71, and Georgia, 62-57. The Gators are led by the duo of Jennifer George and Jaterra Bonds, who are each posting 12.2 points per game. George also leads the team in rebounding at 7.9 per game. The Florida starting five against the Lady Bulldogs was rounded out by Sydney Moss (9.8 ppg/6.2 rpg), Christin Mercer (6.7 ppg/4.2 rpg) and Lily Svete (5.4 ppg/2.0 rpg). Head Coach Amanda Butler's squad has seen 10 of its 12 league games decided by eight points or less, while over all they have played 14 games decided by 10 points or less. Florida has dealt with injuries all season, dressing nine players for most games on the season.

## THE SERIES - VANDERBILT VS. FLORIDA

The Commodores and Gators have met 50 times, with Vanderbilt holding a 31-19 edge in the series. Vanderbilt has won eight of the last nine contests, however two of the last three needed extra time to decide a winner. The first meeting came in 1978 and the teams have met at least once a year since. Last year, Vanderbilt won a 75-69 decision in overtime. Christina Foggie hit a three-pointer at the buzzer to tie the game, which saw Stephanie Holzer and Tiffany Clarke each record double-doubles. The last time the teams met at the O'Connell Center, it took double overtime for Vanderbilt to secure the win, 103-97. Clarke and Holzer also led the way in that game with 23 points apiece.

The game will tip at 6:00 p.m. CT and can be seen on CSS with Bernie Guenther and Maria Taylor on the call. The contest can also be seen on ESPN3.com (no blackouts apply). ## ON DECK - TEXAS A&M

Vanderbilt returns to Music City to open a two-game homestand with No. 10/13 Texas A&M. It will be the second meeting of the season, following a 60-52 Aggie win in College Station on January 31. The game will tipoff at 4:00 p.m. CT. The pregame kids zone will be open in the practice gym at 2:30 p.m. and the team will sign autographs on the floor following the game.

## LAST TIME OUT

The Vanderbilt women's basketball team, playing without starters Christina Foggie and Kady Schran, dropped an 83-64 decision at No. 12/10 Tennessee on Sunday, February 17. The Commodores dropped to 16-9, 6-6 in SEC play, while the Lady Vols improved to 20-5, 11-1 in league action. Junior guard Jasmine Lister led a valiant Vanderbilt effort,

scoring 24 points while dishing out four assists. Freshmen Heather Bowe and Morgan Batey each added 10 points, while Batey contributed a team-best six rebounds. Already missing Schranne and Foggie, Vanderbilt also played the second half without Tiffany Clarke, who became ill in the locker room at halftime. The Commodores played four freshmen, Bowe, Batey, Rayte'a Long and Jasmine Jenkins, along with Lister for most of the second half. Tennessee had five players in double-figures, led by 17 from Meighan Simmons. Ariel Massengale added 14, while Bashaara Graves contributed 13 and Taber Spani and Jasmine Jones each added a dozen. "The freshmen are playing hard and they're starting to figure it out," Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "I think a lot of good things happened as the game went on. They got aggressive and we kept making runs back." After Lister opened the scoring with a three, Tennessee went on a 14-2 run over 3:41 to build a 14-5 lead. Massengale and Spani each had five in the stretch. The Commodores settled in and answered with a 7-0 run to cut it to 14-12 at the under-12 minute timeout. After the game stayed close, UT used an 8-1 run over 1:51 to build a 33-24 lead with just under four minutes to go. Vanderbilt again responded, this time with Lister hitting back-to-back threes to cut it to 33-29. The Lady Vols ended the half on a 6-0 run to take a 39-29 lead into the break, their largest of the game. Lister led all scorers at the break with 11, while Clarke had contributed seven points and five rebounds. Tennessee was led by 10 from Jones in the period, while Spani had nine. Tennessee shot 53.8% in the opening period, while Vanderbilt, after shooting better than 50% for much of the period, missed its last five field goals and shot 38.7% in the period. The Lady Vols opened the the half with a 14-4 run, leading 51-35 at the 17:16 mark. Simmons was key during the run, scoring eight of the Tennessee points. The Lady Vols then built a 20-point lead, 60-40, before Lister again drilled back-to-back threes to make it 60-46 with 11:36 to play. Vanderbilt continued the run, cutting it to 60-50 with 8:33 to play. The Commodore defense forced UT to miss nine consecutive field goals during the stretch. Tennessee responded and did not allow Vanderbilt to get closer than 10. The Lady Vols would close the game on a 10-4 run and win by a final margin of 83-64.

#### BALCOMB BALL

Head Coach Melanie Balcomb has averaged 23 wins per season during her decade on West End. If she can maintain that pace this season, she'll become the all-time winningest coach in Vanderbilt history. With a record of 254-103, Balcomb is just two wins from tying and three wins from passing 2013 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Jim Foster.

#### HOME COOKING

The Commodores have been tough to beat at Memorial Gym, posting a 10-2 record this season with losses coming to No. 9/9 Tennessee and No. 10/8 Kentucky. Vanderbilt has won 27 of the last 30 regular season home games at Memorial, as well as 28 of the last 32 contests counting the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The five losses since the start of the 2011-12 season have come to South Carolina, Duke (second round of the NCAA Tournament), Tennessee and Kentucky.

#### COMMODORES VS. TOP 25

Vanderbilt fell to 1-5 on the season against ranked teams on Sunday at No. 12/10 Tennessee. The Commodores have a win over then-No. 12/13 Oklahoma before losses to No. 18/19 South Carolina, No. 9/9 Tennessee, No. 16/16 Texas A&M, No. 10/8 Kentucky and No. 12/10 Tennessee. Vanderbilt will face two ranked teams over its last five games, as the Commodores have games left versus No. 11/13 Texas A&M and at No. 13/12 Georgia.

#### BIT BY THE BUG

Vanderbilt continues to cope with injuries that have been plaguing the team all season, with the most recent being a knee injury to Christina Foggie suffered against Kentucky. The team's leading scorer missed games against Missouri and Tennessee. In addition, sophomore guard Kady Schranne continues to be day-to-day with an ankle injury. The Commodores lost reserve center Clair Watkins to a knee injury prior to the Tennessee game on January 24 and have played all season without

Stephanie Holzer (knee) and Kristen Gaffney (knee). Entering the season, Vanderbilt returned 97.6% of it's scoring, but Foggie, Schran and Holzer contributed nearly half that number (49.4%).

### MIXING IT UP

Through 24 games this season, Head Coach Melanie Balcomb has used six different starting lineups, one more than she did all of last season. In fact, Balcomb did not change the starting lineup at all until the 16th game of the season. The most common lineup this season is Jasmine Lister, Christina Foggie, Kady Schran, Elan Brown and Tiffany Clarke. The quintet is 11-4 as starters this season. At No. 16/16 Texas A&M, Balcomb changed her lineup for the first time in nine games, sliding Heather Bowe in for Kady Schran. Injury to Christina Foggie in the Kentucky game necessitated another change, creating a starting five of Bowe, Lister, Brown, Gabby Smith and Clarke that was used against Mizzou and Tennessee.

### 1,000 X 3

With Jasmine Lister hitting 1,000 points at LSU, she became the third player this season to reach the 1,000-point plateau, joining Tiffany Clarke and Christina Foggie. It marks just the second time in the 36-year history of Vanderbilt women's basketball that more than two players joined the club in the same season. The only other time was 20 years ago in the 1992-93 Final Four season when Heidi Gillingham, Julie Powell, Misty Lamb and Shelley Jarrard all hit the mark.

### LISTER HITS 1,000

In the first half of the game at LSU, Jasmine Lister became the 36th player in Vanderbilt history, and third this season, to hit 1,000 career points when she connected from three with 9:53 to play in the first half. She now has 1,088 career points and is 30th all-time, four points behind Dee Davis.

### FOGGIE HITS 1,000

With nine points at No. 18/16 South Carolina, Christina Foggie became the 35th player in Vanderbilt history to reach 1,000 points. Foggie now stands at 1,121 points, 26th all-time. Next in Foggie's radar is Jence Rhoads at 1,132 points.

### CLARKE HITS 1,000

With 22 points against Hartford on December 6, senior forward Tiffany Clarke became the 34 player in Vanderbilt history with 1,000 career points. The Duluth, Ga., native now has 1,254 points, 20th in program history. Next on her radar is Na'Sheema Hillmon at 1,295 points. Clarke is guaranteed at least five games left in the black and gold (four regular season plus the SEC Tournament) and at her current average would finish with 1,332 points, tied for 19th all-time.

### WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

Senior Elan Brown is one of the players whose true impact does not show up on the stat sheet. She is one of just three Vanderbilt players to have started all 25 games this season and averages 6.5 points and 5.8 rebounds per game, in addition to 2.0 assists and 1.4 steals per game. Perhaps the best measure of Brown's impact is her plus/minus rating, which measures Vanderbilt's scoring differential when she is on the floor. Brown's rating is +7.96, third on the team behind Tiffany Clarke (+8.36) and Kady Schran (+9.14).

### CLARKE SHOOTING FOR THE STARS

Senior forward Tiffany Clarke has connected for 150 field goals on 278 attempts this season, good for a .540 shooting percentage which is second in the Southeastern Conference. In addition, her mark of .540 at the last NCAA national update on February 18 is 18th in the nation. Off that shooting, Clarke is averaging 15.5 points per outing this season, second on the team and seventh in the league.

### STARTING THEM EARLY

Head Coach Melanie Balcomb has always shown a willingness to play freshmen early if they earn the minutes. Freshman forwards Heather Bowe, Kendall Shaw and Rayte'a Long have seen action in most of

Vanderbilt's games this season, with Bowe starting seven games. Bowe is posting 6.6 points and 4.8 rebounds per game. Shaw has contributed 3.5 points and 2.1 boards, while Long is adding 1.6 points and 1.3 rebounds per outing. The rookie trio became even more important with the loss of center Stephanie Holzer for the season, as they are trying to replace Holzer's 11.0 points and 7.5 rebounds per game. Bowe, Shaw and Long are doing their best, averaging 11.7 points and 8.2 rebounds per game, combined.

### LET'S GO STREAKING

As tends to be the case during a winning streak, almost every Vanderbilt statistic improved during the team's nine-game streak earlier this year, which has followed a 3-3 start. A glance at some of the statistics Vanderbilt improved in:

### SHUTTING THEM DOWN

In Vanderbilt's 67-36 win over Austin Peay, second half defense was the big difference maker. The Commodores held the Lady Govs to nine points in the period, including 3-28 from the field and 1-10 from three-point range. The nine points marked the lowest output in a half for a Vanderbilt opponent since November 22, 2005. On that date, the Commodores held Alabama A&M to eight first half points en route to an 80-29 win. In addition, Vanderbilt held the Lady Govs to just 13-56 from the field, good for 23.2%. That marks the lowest field goal percentage for an opponent since December 21, 2008, when UT Martin was held to 17.6% (9-51) from the field in an 86-29 Commodore victory.

### FEW AND FAR BETWEEN

After the Commodores snapped a three-game losing streak against Austin Peay, it is important to note such streaks under Melanie Balcomb have been few and far between. On just four occasions in her 10-plus seasons in Nashville have the Commodores lost three or more consecutive outings. The most recent instance came last year, when they lost at Tennessee, at Arkansas and to South Carolina in overtime. That team went on to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Prior to that, Vanderbilt had not lost three-in-a-row since 2005-06. They also dropped three straight in 2004-05, with that team going on to the Sweet 16. The longest losing streak came in 2003-04, when the Commodores dropped four-straight games before advancing to the Sweet 16.

### A NEW WAY TO GIVE THANKS

For the first time since 1998-99, Vanderbilt did not host a Thanksgiving Tournament at Memorial Gym. Instead, the Commodores will head to the San Juan Shootout in San Juan, Puerto Rico, to take on Virginia and Florida State. It marks the first time since 1989-90 there will not be an in-season tournament at Memorial Gym.

### CLARKE'S GOT CLASS

Senior forward Tiffany Clarke was one of 30 players nationwide nominated for the Senior CLASS Award. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Clarke was not among the list of 10 finalists that was announced on February 6. For more information, visit seniorCLASSaward.com.

### HOLZER OUT FOR SEASON

While the Commodores did win their exhibition game against Alabama-Huntsville, 81-53, they did suffer a pretty big loss. Redshirt junior center Stephanie Holzer will miss the entire 2012-13 campaign after suffering a dislocated knee just 11 minutes into the contest. Holzer has led the Commodores in rebounds each of the last two seasons, was SEC Sixth Woman of the Year in 2010-11 and was Honorable Mention All-SEC last season. Holzer redshirted as a freshman in 2009-10 after breaking her ankle in a preseason work out.

## THE STANDARD MAINTAINED

Vanderbilt women's basketball, one of the top-20 winningest programs of all time, maintained that winning standard during the 2011-12 season. Under 10th-year Head Coach Melanie Balcomb, the Commodores won 20-plus games for the 26th time and received their 25th NCAA Tournament bid, going 23-10 and earning an at-large bid and a seven seed in the Fresno Region. During Balcomb's 10 seasons at the helm on West End, Vanderbilt has won 20 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament each year. With their first round NCAA win over 10th-seeded Middle Tennessee, the Commodores have also won at least one NCAA Tournament game in nine of the 10 seasons under Balcomb.

## THE TOURNAMENT STANDARD

The 2011-12 season saw Vanderbilt make the NCAA Tournament for the 25th time and 13th-in-a-row. The Commodores have posted a 38-25 (.603) mark in the tournament and won at least one game in each tournament during 12 of the last 13 appearances. Vanderbilt has made 14 appearances in the Sweet 16, including six in the last 12 seasons. The Commodores have one Final Four appearance (1993).

## THAT WOULD MAKE A BAKER'S DOZEN

Vanderbilt is one of eight programs to have made the last 13 NCAA Tournaments. The Commodores are joined by Connecticut, Duke, Georgia, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Stanford and Tennessee as the only programs to have earned bids each of the last 13 seasons.

## FOGGIE WINS SEC SCORING TITLE

For the first time since 1991, Vanderbilt boasted the top scorer in the Southeastern Conference. Sophomore guard Christina Foggie led the league with 17.9 points per game at the conclusion of the regular season, as well as a conference-best 18.0 points per contest during SEC games. Foggie received WBCA All-Region honors and was a First Team All-SEC selection by the league's coaches and the Associated Press. She had 12 20-point performances on the season and led Vanderbilt in scoring during 16 contests on the season. The highlights included a career-high 34 points in a 68-48 upset of No. 17/15 Georgia and 22 points in a 93-79 win over No. 11/11 Tennessee. Foggie became just the second Vanderbilt player to win the SEC scoring title, joining Wendy Scholtens, who won three league scoring titles (1989, '90 and '91).

## VANDERBILT IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Vanderbilt made its 25th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 13th-consecutive. All-time, Vanderbilt is 38-25 in NCAA play, following a first round win over Middle Tennessee and a second round loss to Duke. It marked the 11th time in 12 seasons the Commodores won at least one game in the Tournament. Vanderbilt has made 14 Sweet 16 appearances, including six over the last 11 seasons (last in 2009). The last Elite Eight trip came in 2002, while Vanderbilt's lone Final Four appearance was in 1993. In first and second round contests, Vanderbilt is 32-11, while it is 16-2 in opening round games since the NCAA expanded the field to 64 teams in 1994.

## VANDERBILT ATHLETICS UNMATCHED PAST TWO YEARS

With Vanderbilt's invitation to the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, the school concluded its second straight calendar year in which its baseball and men's and women's basketball teams played in the NCAA Tournament and its football team was invited to a bowl. In 2011, there were eight schools that accomplished this feat, and in 2012

there were just six. Vanderbilt is the only school to do it two years in a row. During the 2011-12 academic year, Vanderbilt was also one of just six schools nationally to finish with NCAA Tournament appearances in baseball and men's and women's basketball and in a bowl game.

### VANDERBILT BASKETBALL IS EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

The Vanderbilt women's and men's basketball teams made their respective NCAA Tournament fields each of the last three seasons, something only accomplished by 10 NCAA Division I institutions. 2012 was the 10th time both teams made the NCAA Tournament, with both teams previously making the tournament in 1989, 1991, 1993, 1997, 2004, 2007, 2008, 2010 and 2011. The other nine schools to have both programs reach the NCAA Tournament over the last three seasons are Duke, Georgetown, Gonzaga, Kentucky, Michigan State, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Texas and West Virginia. In addition, with Christina Foggie capturing the women's SEC scoring title and Vanderbilt's John Jenkins doing the same on the men's side, it marked just the fourth time in SEC history the same school won both titles and first since 2006.

### TOPS FROM FIELD & THREE

As is usually the case under Melanie Balcomb, Vanderbilt was one of the top teams in the nation from the field and from three-point range last season. The Commodores finished sixth in the nation after shooting 46.4% from the field (national champion Baylor led the nation at 48.8%). They matched the sixth-place ranking from three, posting a 37.2% mark from beyond the arc (Richmond led the country at 38.8%). All 10 teams Balcomb has coached at Vanderbilt have finished in the top-20 of the NCAA in field goal percentage. As a program, only Vanderbilt and Connecticut have finished that high every season since 2000.

### NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb and her coaching staff have put together one of the best recruiting classes in program history, with the three-player class earning top-15 national rankings from multiple recruiting services. All Star Girls Report ranks the class at No. 12 in the country, while Collegiate Girls Basketball Report ranks the class 13th nationally and third in the Southeastern Conference. BlueStar Report has the new crop of Commodores as the No. 15 class in the country. In addition, all three have been named nominees for the McDonald's High School All-America Game. # MELANIE BALCOMB

The numbers say it all – 10 seasons, 10 NCAA Tournaments, 10 seasons of at least 20 wins. Vanderbilt women’s basketball has been a model of consistency under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. That’s not to mention three SEC Tournament Championships, four Sweet 16 trips and eight top-25 finishes over a decade in Nashville.

Since arriving in 2002, Balcomb has posted a 238-94 (.717) record at Vanderbilt, averaging 23.8 wins per season. Should she match that pace in season 11, Balcomb will become the winningest coach in program history (Jim Foster, 256-99 in 11 season). Balcomb was the fastest in program history to reach 200 wins, reaching that mark in five fewer games than Foster.

Balcomb is one of just eight coaches in the nation to have led a program to each of the last 10 NCAA Tournaments. In 2012, she becomes the second longest-tenured coach in the Southeastern Conference, trailing only Georgia’s Andy Landers (33 seasons). Over her 10 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has coached eight WNBA draft picks, a WBCA National Defensive Player of the Year (Jennifer Risper), a WBCA National Scholar-Athlete of the Year (Christina Wirth) and an SEC scoring champion (Christina Foggie), while graduating 100% of her players.

With nearly 20 years of collegiate head coaching experience, Balcomb is a renowned offensive strategist. Her 10 seasons at Vanderbilt have only enhanced that reputation. Every Commodore squad has finished in the top-20 nationally in field goal percentage, averaging a finish of 7.8 nationally (including four teams that have finished top-four nationally). Balcomb’s inaugural Commodore team in 2002-03 led the nation in field goal percentage, shooting 51.3%.

The Commodores have shot just as well from three-point range, averaging a top-15 finish in three-point percentage among Division I teams with top-40 finishes every season. Balcomb’s 2006-07 squad led the nation in three-point shooting at 43.7%, while her most recent edition finished sixth nationally at 37.2%.

The Commodores have finished in the top-10 nationally in field-goal percentage seven times and in the top-10 in three-point field-goal percentage six times under Balcomb. Her teams have also finished in the top five in assists per game, free-throw percentage and scoring offense.

Balcomb’s teams have been especially successful at home, where Vanderbilt has posted a 131-25 (.840) record at Memorial Gym. The Commodores have been almost as successful during the stretch-run, as over the last 10 years, Vanderbilt’s record over the final nine regular season games is 62-23, good for a .730 winning percentage.

Balcomb’s success as a head coach is not limited to Vanderbilt. Before arriving at Vanderbilt, Balcomb had successful coaching tenures at Ashland (Ohio) and Xavier. She picked-up her 400th career win in the opening round of the 2011 SEC Tournament and has a career mark of 401-198 (.669). The 2012-13 season-opener will be Balcomb’s 600th game as a head coach.

The 2011-12 season saw one of Balcomb’s youngest teams, as the squad of 11 featured just one senior, yet she still successfully steered the Commodores to a 23-10 mark and a 13th-straight NCAA Tournament. Leading the way was break-out star Christina Foggie, who became the first Balcomb player to lead the SEC in scoring (17.7 ppg).

Foggie was a First Team All-SEC selection and was joined by four other Commodores earning All-SEC honors – Jasmine Lister (second team), Tiffany Clarke (second team), Stephanie Holzer (honorable mention) and Kady Schran (All-Freshman).

Vanderbilt defeated three ranked opponents on the season (No. 12 Oklahoma, No. 17 Georgia and No. 11 Tennessee), earning a seven seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores hosted at Memorial Gym, defeating 10th-seeded Middle Tennessee in the first round before falling to second-seeded Duke.

Balcomb started at Vanderbilt in 2002 and wasted no time in implementing her own style of winning. Working to transition veteran players into a new system while building new team chemistry, Balcomb’s first year saw the Commodores win six of their last seven regular season games, earn an NCAA Tournament berth, and lead the nation in field goal percentage (51.3) against the fourth toughest schedule in the country. She was named a finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year award.

In 2003-04, Balcomb led the Commodores to their fourth Southeastern Conference Tournament title. She masterfully balanced strong upper-class leadership with exciting freshmen talent, winning 10 consecutive games and advancing to the program's 11th Sweet 16 appearance. One year later, her team made its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Commodores posted the most wins (10) in the program's history in Southeastern Conference play finishing with a 10-4 record.

The Commodores were ranked seventh in the final AP poll of the 2006-07 season, and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament after winning another SEC Tournament title. That Vanderbilt squad was the nation's best three-point shooting team, and ranked among the top 10 in points scored. The team's 28-6 mark was the best record for a VU squad in 14 years.

The 2008 season was also one of Balcomb's most impressive coaching jobs. Despite graduating three All-SEC seniors, she led the Commodores to a 25-9 record and the school's 13th appearance in the NCAA sweet 16, all with two freshmen and no seniors in the starting lineup.

In 2009, Vanderbilt won its sixth SEC Tournament title, the third for Balcomb in the last six years. The team also advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 14th time in school history -- Balcomb's fourth trip with the Commodores. Vanderbilt finished

the year ranked No. 8 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll after narrowly missing an upset of No. 1 seed Maryland in the Raleigh Regional Semifinal.

National accolades came flooding in for Vanderbilt, including senior Jennifer Risper being named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Defensive Player of the Year. Risper and classmate Christina Wirth, who herself was named an All-American and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, were both selected in the 2009 WNBA Draft.

In 2010 Balcomb was faced with one of her most challenging tasks. Faced with replacing National Defensive Player of the Year Jennifer Risper and All-American Christina Wirth, Balcomb guided an undersized team back to the NCAA Tournament, where they narrowly missed advancing to their third consecutive sweet 16.

Despite having to overcome numerous injuries throughout out the season and a size disadvantage in almost every game, Vanderbilt finished the season 23-11 overall. Individually, Balcomb helped junior point guard Jence Rhoads earn first team All-SEC honors, while senior shooting guard Merideth Marsh earned second team All-SEC accolades. Elan Brown and Tiffany Clarke were also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

The 2010-11 season featured many obstacles that Balcomb successfully maneuvered through to reach another NCAA Tournament and finish third in the SEC. Injuries took an unfortunate toll on the team throughout the year with at least one of Vanderbilt's five leading scorers unavailable for 14 out of the team's 32 games. Injuries coupled with matching Georgia for the fewest upperclassmen in the SEC challenged Balcomb to use different personnel groupings regularly.

Despite the challenges, Balcomb again reached 20 wins, finishing 20-12 and 10-6 in the SEC. Individually, Balcomb helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention All-America honors from the Associated Press in addition to first team All-SEC recognition. Rhoads was also a WBCA Region 3 All-American. Freshman center Stephanie Holzer was named honorable mention All-SEC, SEC Sixth Woman of the Year and to the SEC All-Freshmen team. Freshman point guard Jasmine Lister was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

In 10 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has won 13 games in the NCAA Tournament, including a 9-1 mark in the opening round. She holds a winning percentage of 65.7 against SEC opponents. In all, Balcomb owns series advantages over 10 of the 11 other schools in the SEC before 2012.

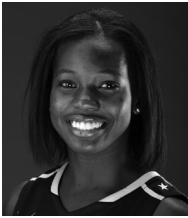

Vanderbilt dominated the second half, as the Commodores (4-3 overall) outscored Austin Peay (1-5 overall), 38-9. The Commodores also owned the battle of the boards, outrebounding the Lady Gows, 56-24. Clarke led all scorers with 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting from the field, while also pulling down a game-high seven rebounds. Gray was the lone Lady Gov to score in double-figures. Both teams went back-and-forth for much of the first half, as neither team could really find a rhythm. The two teams combined to commit 11 fouls within the first five minutes of the game, while also turning the ball over a combined 24 times in the half. The Commodores held a 29-27 lead at the half, behind 10 first half points from Clarke. She was the only player in double figures. Vanderbilt shot 42 percent from the field, but committed 15 turnovers, while Austin Peay shot 35 percent and committed nine turnovers. Gray scored nine of her 12 points in the first half for Austin Peay.

**NASHVILLE** -- Head Coach Melanie Balcomb wanted her team to focus on defense right from the tip on Saturday against Tennessee Tech. The Commodores did just that, utilizing a 15-0 run to open the game, before cruising to a 77-50 victory at Memorial Gym. The Commodores (5-3) were led by 17 points from Tiffany Clarke. The senior also grabbed seven rebounds. Classmate Elan Brown contributed 10 points and nine rebounds. Vanderbilt also got nine from Morgan Batey, eight from Jasmine Lister and seven each from Kady Schrans and Gabby Smith. Tennessee Tech was led by 18 points from Diamond Henderson. T'Keyah Williams contributed 10 points and five rebounds. The 15-0 Vanderbilt run to open the contest was the best for a Commodore team to start a game since a 17-0 run against Lipscomb in last season's Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament. During the stretch, Tennessee Tech missed six field goals and turned the ball over twice. In addition to stout defense, Vanderbilt shot 50% from the field (27-54). It marked the first time since the season opener against McNeese State that the Commodores shot at least 50% from the floor. "I'm really proud of how we're executing," Balcomb said. "I think that's what's important. It's being able to slow down. As we start to trust our defense, you can play relaxed on offense." Vanderbilt led the entire contest and the biggest lead of 27 points was the final margin. Balcomb felt her team played two complete halves for the first time this season. "We just wanted to put two halves together to continue to build confidence," Balcomb said. "I think the most important part of that is the start of both halves." Brown, who has emerged as the team's steady force, seconded that notion. "That was one of our goals, especially this past week," Brown explained.

**NASHVILLE** -- Tiffany Clarke recorded her first double-double of the season to lead Vanderbilt past Hartford, 67-45 on Thursday night at Memorial Gym. Clarke scored 12 of her 22 points in the second half to help Vanderbilt (7-3) put away Hartford (6-2) for good. Clarke led all players with 22 points and 12 rebounds, which was her first double-double of the season and 13th of her career. Late in the first half, Clarke also became the 34th player to reach 1,000 career points for the Commodores. She is now tied for 31st (Rhonda Blades) all-time with 1,017 career points. The Duluth, Ga., native shot an efficient 7-of-10 from the field and 8-of-10 from the free throw line. She also tied a career-high with four blocked shots. Kady Schranz was the only other Commodore in double-figures as she finished with 10 points. Jasmine Lister added nine points and a game-high five assists. Elan Brown and Gabby Smith each scored eight points. Christina Foggie tied a career-high with four steals. As a team, the Commodores shot 48 percent from the field, while holding the Hawks to just 32 percent from the field and only 23 percent from behind the three-point line. Vandy outrebounded Hartford, 43-32 for the game. Vanderbilt led by as many as 24 points in the second half to run away from the Hawks. Hartford's Alex Hall scored 10 points to lead the Hawks, while Amber Bepko added eight points and a team-high six rebounds. Vanderbilt used a 13-0 run midway through the first half to take a 17-8 lead. The Commodores held Hartford scoreless for nearly six minutes during the run and would extend their lead to as many as 13 in the first half. Behind 10 points and eight rebounds from Clarke, the Commodores led 30-19 at the half. Clarke was the lone player in double-figures after one half of play. Brown had six points, while Lister chipped in five points and two assists. Both teams struggled shooting the ball in the first half, as Vanderbilt shot 40 percent (13-of-32) from the field, 16 percent (1-of-6) from behind the three-point line and only 37 percent (3-of-8) from the free throw line. Hartford shot 26 percent (6-of-23) from the field and 30 percent (3-of-10) from three-point range. Vanderbilt outrebounded the Hawks 24-16, while also forcing eight Hartford first half turnovers.

**NORMAN, Okla. --** The Vanderbilt women's basketball team used a complete, team performance to take a 76-63 victory at No. 12/13 Oklahoma on Sunday, December 16. The Commodores improve to 8-3 and have won five-straight games. The Sooners fall to 8-2. Four Commodores were in double-figures, led by 17 from Christina Foggie. Jasmine Lister and Tiffany Clarke contributed 16 each, while Kady Schranz added 11 points. Clarke grabbed a team-best eight rebounds, while Lister grabbed six of her own and dished out nine assists. Oklahoma was led by 21 points from Aaryn Ellenberg. Nicole Griffin scored 11 points and grabbed five rebounds, while Morgan Hook scored 10 and had four rebounds. Joanna McFarland just missed a double-double with nine points and a game-high 11 rebounds. "I'm really proud of our effort defensively," said Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. "I thought Elan Brown played really hard, diving on balls and getting loose balls and we started to follow that. It was a really good team effort." Brown scored just four points, but grabbed five rebounds and four steals. As a team, Vanderbilt forced 20 Oklahoma turnovers and scored 23 points off those miscues, while the Commodores picked up a season-best 12 steals. The opening minutes were filled with back-and-forth action. Oklahoma jumped out to an 8-4 lead before a pair of steals by Brown and Foggie helped the Commodores tie it back up at eight. With the game still tied at 13, Schranz went on an 8-0 run by herself to put Vanderbilt up, 21-13. Hook responded with a 3-pointer before the media timeout to make it 21-16. The run would end up being 18-15, with Vanderbilt opening a 31-18 lead with just over six minutes left in the half. The Commodore lead would be maintained into the break, with the score at the half being 37-27. In the first half alone, Vanderbilt matched its season best with 10 steals. The Sooners turned it over 15 times in the opening period, leading to 16 Commodore points. Oklahoma came out strong in the second half, cutting the Vanderbilt lead to 41-35 before the Commodores responded with an 11-2 run. The stretch was capped by a three from Lister that made it 52-37. The Sooners continued to respond. After Vanderbilt built an 18-point lead, Oklahoma quickly cut it to 12, 60-48, with just over seven minutes to play. Twice Sooner runs were halted by three-pointers from Gabby Smith. Oklahoma again closed it to nine, 65-56, with 3:50 to play as Ellenberg was starting to heat up. Then Clarke grabbed a big offensive rebound and got the put-back to make it 67-56. After Ellenberg hit another jumper, Foggie hit a pull-up jumper, followed by a 3-pointer to push the lead back to 14, 72-58.

**NASHVILLE (AP) --** Melanie Balcomb wanted her Vanderbilt Commodores to push the ball inside offensively and focus on defending Taber Spani and Meighan Simmons of Tennessee. They didn't follow the game plan well at all. The Commodores outscored No. 9 Tennessee 38-32 in the paint and even grabbed 21 offensive rebounds, but they couldn't keep up with the Lady Vols' top scorers Thursday night in losing 83-75. "Believe it or not, the game plan in the first half was the same as it was in the second half," Balcomb said. "We just didn't execute the game plan. Get the ball inside, get the ball to the rim. It all worked in the second half. The first half, we took too many outside shots, weren't aggressive and didn't attack enough." That left Vanderbilt trailing 41-29 at halftime. The Commodores scored the first 12 points of the second half to tie up Tennessee at 41. But that was as close as they would get as the Lady Vols responded by scoring 11 of the next 13 points before hitting 14 of their final 15 free throws in the final 3:49 to seal the win. "Just can't celebrate when we make a run," Vanderbilt junior guard Christina Foggie said. Foggie led Vandy with 22 points before fouling out in the final minute, Tiffany Clarke had 19 and Kady Schranz 14. Spani scored a career-high 24 points and Simmons added 23 as Tennessee (16-3, 7-0) won its ninth straight. The Lady Vols got a measure of payback for losing in Memorial Gym a year ago, their last SEC loss. "Well, I mean honestly you just want to come in and play your best against a great SEC team," Spani said. "Obviously, this is a great rivalry game. But we also have a lot of respect for Vanderbilt and what they're capable of doing and it's always a great environment. "With No. 5 Kentucky losing to No. 18 South Carolina earlier in the night, Tennessee is the Southeastern Conference's last undefeated team in league play. Simmons said that's exactly where the Lady Vols expected to be. Coach Holly Warlick cautioned it's still very early this season. "But yeah, it's great to be undefeated and be on top of the SEC," Warlick said. "But ... we're not satisfied absolutely." The Lady Vols have won 11 straight SEC games dating back to the loss here last season. Bashaara Graves also had 16 points for Tennessee. Vanderbilt (13-6, 3-3) lost for the first time at home this season and has lost three of four overall. The Commodores played without 6-foot-4 sophomore Clair Watkins, who suffered a knee injury in practice Wednesday. They still pulled down 21 offensive rebounds despite being outrebounded 46-43. The Commodores managed to tie the score twice, the second time at 41 after scoring the first 12 points of the second half. The Lady Vols answered with an 11-2 spurt capped by a drive by Simmons with 12:45 to go, and Vanderbilt couldn't get closer than five the rest of the way. Tennessee hit 14 of 15 at the line in the final 3:49 to seal the victory. The Commodores came in as the SEC's second-best team beyond the arc, shooting 36.4 percent from 3-point range. They shot 21.7 percent (5-of-23) and missed three 3s in the final minutes with a chance to make it a one-score game.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala. --** The Vanderbilt women's basketball team snapped a two-game losing streak on Sunday, January 27, at Alabama, defeating the Crimson Tide, 67-58. The Commodores improved to 14-6, 4-3 in SEC play, while the Tide fell to 12-8, 2-5 in league play. Tiffany Clarke matched her career high with 27 points, while also grabbing 15 rebounds for her seventh double-double of the season and third in a row. Heather Bowe also contributed a double-double with 13 points and 13 rebounds. For Alabama, Daisha Simmons led the way with 15 points. Shafontay Myers added 13, while Jasmine Robinson contributed nine and Meghan Perkins added six, and pulled down a team-best nine rebounds. "I really liked how our kids responded," Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "(Alabama) is a team that comes at you for 40 minutes and you have to be tough. When Tiffany Clarke plays two halves, we're going to be a good team." Clarke knew Vanderbilt was in for a challenge facing the Tide. "We needed this," Clarke said. "They play really good defense and it was a hard-fought game." It took over two minutes for someone to get on the scoreboard. Alabama missed its first five field goals before Perkins hit a layup two minutes and 13 seconds in. The Commodores missed their first four shots before Foggie connected from three at the 17:23 mark of the first half. Things picked up for the Commodores, as they hit their next four field goals to take an 11-7 lead with 13:44 to play. Alabama then answered with a pair of back-to-back threes to take a 13-11 lead. Two free throws by Clarke tied it at 13 midway through the first half. Trailing 21-20 with 6:31 until the break, Vanderbilt used an 8-0 run from Tiffany Clarke to open up a 28-21 lead with just over four minutes remaining the period. The senior hit two free throws, got back-to-back layups and hit another pair from the line. The Tide responded and took advantage of five straight Vanderbilt turnovers to take a 29-28 lead. Foggie halted the run with a jumper for the eighth lead change of the half, putting the Commodores on top, 30-29. Clarke followed with a basket and a free throw to provide the 33-29 halftime margin. Alabama would not go away, and retook the lead with just over 13 minutes left, making it 42-40 on a jumper by Perkins. Clarke responded to tie it back up at 42, the 10th tie of the ballgame. Bowe started to give the Commodores a little breathing room, scoring five straight points to give Vanderbilt a 54-48 lead. Alabama would get no closer than four. Clarke scored the next three to make it 58-50, giving Vanderbilt its largest lead of the game. Clarke and Bowe combined for the Commodores' only 11 points during a four-minute stretch that saw Vanderbilt put the game away. Alabama could get no closer than seven points down the stretch and Vanderbilt held on for a 67-58 victory. Vanderbilt was able to overcome 27 turnovers in the game, which the Tide converted for 33 points. It was the first time Vanderbilt had at least 25 turnovers since committing 25 at South Carolina on January 25, 2012. The Commodores were very solid from the field, shooting 43.6% Clarke led that charge, shooting 9-15, while Bowe added a 6-9 mark.

**KNOXVILLE, Tenn.** -- The Vanderbilt women's basketball team, playing without starters Christina Foggie and Kady Schrann, dropped an 83-64 decision at No. 12/10 Tennessee on Sunday, February 17. The Commodores dropped to 16-9, 6-6 in SEC play, while the Lady Vols improved to 20-5, 11-1 in league action. Junior guard Jasmine Lister led a valiant Vanderbilt effort, scoring 24 points while dishing out four assists. Freshmen Heather Bowe and Morgan Batey each added 10 points, while Batey contributed a team-best six rebounds. Already missing Schrann and Foggie, Vanderbilt also played the second half without Tiffany Clarke, who became ill in the locker room at halftime. The Commodores played four freshmen, Bowe, Batey, Rayte'a Long and Jasmine Jenkins, along with Lister for most of the second half. Tennessee had five players in double-figures, led by 17 from Meighan Simmons. Ariel Massengale added 14, while Bashaara Graves contributed 13 and Taber Spani and Jasmine Jones each added a dozen. "The freshmen are playing hard and they're starting to figure it out," Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "I think a lot of good things happened as the game went on. They got aggressive and we kept making runs back." After Lister opened the scoring with a three, Tennessee went on a 14-2 run over 3:41 to build a 14-5 lead. Massengale and Spani each had five in the stretch. The Commodores settled in and answered with a 7-0 run to cut it to 14-12 at the under-12 minute media timeout. After the game stayed close, UT used an 8-1 run over 1:51 to build a 33-24 lead with just under four minutes to go. Vanderbilt again responded, this time with Lister hitting back-to-back threes to cut it to 33-29. The Lady Vols ended the half on a 6-0 run to take a 39-29 lead into the break, their largest of the game. Lister led all scorers at the break with 11, while Clarke had contributed seven points and five rebounds. Tennessee was led by 10 from Jones in the period, while Spani had nine. Tennessee shot 53.8% in the opening period, while Vanderbilt, after shooting better than 50% for much of the period, missed its last five field goals and shot 38.7% in the period. The Lady Vols opened the the half with a 14-4 run, leading 51-35 at the 17:16 mark. Simmons was key during the run, scoring eight of the Tennessee points. The Lady Vols then built a 20-point lead, 60-40, before Lister again drilled back-to-back threes to make it 60-46 with 11:36 to play. Vanderbilt continued the run, cutting it to 60-50 with 8:33 to play. The Commodore defense forced UT to miss nine consecutive field goals during the stretch. Tennessee responded and did not allow Vanderbilt to get closer than 10. The Lady Vols would close the game on a 10-4 run and win by a final margin of 83-64.
