## MEDIA INTORMATION

The Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office welcomes your interest in the Vanderbilt women's basketball program. We will make every effort to meet your needs throughout the season. Following is information and guidelines to help you during the season and allow our coaches and players to adhere to their schedules.

## Credentials

The Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office issues season media credentials to authorized full-time or specified representatives of media outlets who cover Vanderbilt basketball on a regular basis. Single-game credentials also will be available for media who cover the team less frequently, should space allow. Please e-mail credential requests to the attention of women's basketball contact, David Dawson. Vanderbilt Communications reserves the right to confirm employment by a media outlet. Season credentials are issued jointly for men's and women's basketball.

## Credential Pick-Up

Credentials are available for pick-up at Media Will Call located near the playing floor at Memorial Gymnasium. Those media wishing to access Media Will Call should enter the service tunnel located at the end of Lot 71 behind the outfield wall of Vanderbilt's Hawkins Field baseball stadium. Proceed through the tunnel until you arrive at the Media Will Call table. If enough advance notice is given, credentials can be mailed or sent via next-day carrier at the expense of the media organization making the request.

## Media Parking

Media parking is located inside the 25th Avenue Garage located at the southeast corner of 25th Avenue and Jess Neely Drive. After parking, please enter Memorial Gymnasium through the service tunnel entrance located at the end of Lot 71 behind the outfield wall of Vanderbilt's Hawkins Field baseball stadium. Vehicles parked in Lot 71 without the proper parking pass will be towed.

## Media Seating

Media covering Vanderbilt basketball games are seated at various locations inside Memorial Gymnasium. A select number of seats are available on the floor, usually reserved for Nashville beatwriters and radio crews from both schools. An additional 20 seats are available inside Suite 5 located on the northside concourse (above Section C), reserved for media following the visiting team and Nashville radio and television media.

## Media Workroom

Memorial Gymnasium's media workroom is located in the northeast corner of the facility, nearest the opponents' bench. This room will serve as a place for pregame meals as well as an area for the media to work after the game. The room is equipped with telephone and data lines, as well as wireless internet. For access to wireless internet, please see a member of the communications staff.

## General Communications Possibilities

Wireless internet is available in all seating areas at Memorial Gym, in addition to a very limited number of data ports. For access to the wireless network, see a member of the communications staff. For data lines, it is recommended you request access in advance from David Dawson. Visiting radio stations are provided with the option of a phone line or ISDN line, in accordance with Southeastern Conference policy. Visiting radios in need of a data line should contact David Dawson at least 24 hours in advance of the game.

## Postgame Interview Format

For non-conference games, Head Coach Melanie Balcomb and two-to-three requested Vanderbilt players will be made available in the media interview room, located down the hall from the work room. Media wishing to speak with coaches or players from the visiting team may coordinate with that institution's sports information representative. For SEC games, in accordance with league policy, the visiting coach will be made available first in the media interview room, followed by the Vanderbilt coach and players. Visiting player requests can be made with that team's sports information representative. Specific player requests for Vanderbilt can be made with David Dawson no later than the final media time out in regulation.

## Road Interview Policy

In accordance with SEC policy, visiting coaches will be made to available to the media within a designated window following the game. The location is at the discretion of the host's sports information staff. Vanderbilt players can be made available through David Dawson, with a location also at the discretion of the home sports information staff.

## Visiting Radio

In accordance with Southeastern Conference policy, a traditional phone line and ISDN line are available to the visiting school's official radio network. Any additional radio broadcasts (including student radio) or any needs beyond phone line or ISDN line (such as data line) should contact David Dawson at least 24 hours in advance of the contest.

## Interviewing the Commodores

It is the policy of Vanderbilt Athletics to coordinate all interviews with coaches and student-athletes through the communications department. Please contact David Dawson at least 24 hours in advance of any needs.

## Practice Coverage

Vanderbilt players and coaches are available for interviews prior to practices on designated days. Practice schedules are sent via e-mail to media multiple times each week during the season to help facilitate coverage. Contact David Dawson if you wish to receive these updates. Player interviews typically begin 45 minutes before practice at Memorial Gymnasium. Interviews with Coach Balcomb follow. Media are typically allowed to attend practices, but must receive permission in advance. Gameday walk-throughs are closed to the media at both Memorial Gymnasium and all road venues.

The official web site of Vanderbilt Student Athletics has all of your information needs. Pregame notes, including updated statistics, can be easily downloaded in PDF format. Following each contest is a game summary, boxscore, and postgame notes and quotes.

## Vanderbilt Games on the Radio and Internet

Vanderbilt basketball can be heard live on WNSR-AM 560 AND WNSR-FM 95.9. Selected games will also be carried on networks of affiliate stations across the mid-state area. Charlie Mattos returns for his 19th year as the voice of the Commodores. All games will be streamed and archived on the internet at the Commodores' official web site, vucommodores.com. You can also keep up with the Commodores on the internet through Gametracker live stats. Just check the women's basketball schedule page for the "live stats" link for a running box score throughout the game.

## Photography

All photographers are restricted to the designated areas along the baseline opposite the home and visitor benches and must sign an affidavit agreeing to the SEC's new policy concerning photography. Strobe lights may not be installed in Memorial Gymnasium without permission from the Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office. When using photo images provided by the Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office, please credit: Vanderbilt Photography.

## Guidelines for Granting Media Credentials to Online Media Representatives

The following is a set of guidelines that the Vanderbilt University Athletic Communications Office will use as a basis for issuing media credentials to independent online media representatives (bloggers). Overall, Vanderbilt University strives to work with individuals who adhere to professional standards, demonstrate transparency in their operations, and regularly produce quality content. While what follows shall serve as a guideline, they may be altered for certain events when necessary and are subject to regulations set forth by the Southeastern Conference and/or the NCAA.

- Individuals associated with a web-only media outlet may apply for credentials on a game-by-game basis unless otherwise specified. Requests for credentials must be sent via e-mail, fax or in writing to the requested Athletic Communications Director and be received at least three (3) business days prior to the event. Request should include applicant's legal name, company or blog they are representing, a mailing address and website address.
- The Athletic Communications Office requires that a requesting outlet possess its own domain name (.com, net, etc.) and will not accept requests from sites based on free services (blogspot, wordpress, etc.).
- First time applicants must submit traffic/subscriber data from an independent source in order to be considered. Sites with fewer than 25,000 legitimate unique visitors per month are not eligible for football or men's basketball credentialing. Sites with fewer than 7,500 legitimate unique visitors per month are not eligible for women's basketball credentialing.
- In the interest of protecting the Vanderbilt University fan base, we require that all applicants that give users ability to submit comments and/or place cookies on user's computers supply a privacy policy that describes in full how the data collected through such activities is used or disseminated.
- Athletic Communications seeks to perpetuate the program and sport being credentialed and therefore prefers to work with online media outlets with an established track record covering our school, our conference or the requested sport. In the request, please provide a short summary of previous relevant experience, if any.
- As a general guideline, we would like to work with outlets that have been in continuous operation for at least 3-6 months. Additionally, an average of $3-5$ substantive postings per week is expected in season from applicant web sites.
- Obtaining media credentials is an opportunity to interview players and team officials for legitimate media purposes only. Bloggers who are granted access to the press box and other areas inside the venue are expected to act professionally and adhere to all SEC and NCAA-mandated media guidelines at all times.
- The standard of professionalism also extends to content posted on the requesting website, whether posted by the requester, user or other agent. Profanity, racial or sexual comments will not be tolerated from credentialed outlets.
- No credentials will be issued to individuals under the age of 18.
- Vanderbilt University reserves the right of its personnel to deny or revoke credentials without notice and an individual shall surrender their credential upon request for violating the policies and/or safety procedures of security personnel, Vanderbilt University, the Southeastern Conference, or the NCAA.

## SHASON OUTHOOK

## SEASASON PREVIEW

Equipped with two of the SEC's most explosive and experienced players - along with the winningest coach in the program's history and a highly-touted crop of recruits - the Vanderbilt women's basketball team appears primed to extend a tradition of success that has included 14 consecutive trips to the NCAA tournament.

Seniors Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister, who each notched career milestones last season by reaching the 1,000-point plateau, will be among the headliners for this year's talented Commodore cast. Together, the Lister/Foggie duo has compiled 2,346 points, 626 assists and 191 steals.

Guiding the team will be head coach Melanie Balcomb, who enters her 12th season at the helm and has recorded 259 career victories with the Commodores. With a win last season in late February against Auburn, she notched her 257th victory at Vanderbilt and surpassed former head coach Jim Foster as the all-time leader in the program's history.
"It wasn't anything I was looking forward to or shooting at, but at the same time, it was nice to be recognized," said Balcomb. "The reason I came here was because of the tradition of success that the coaches before me had (put in place). So it was an honor to be able to surpass the things that had been done here, and that obviously was something that I felt good about."

This season, Balcomb will be directing a Commodore team that has plenty of young talent, but will be anchored by veterans Lister and Foggie.
"They are the bread and butter of our program right now," said Balcomb. "They've matured on a consistent level each year and I am excited to see what they are going to do. Each year they've improved, each year they've matured and each year they've (gained) a better understanding of what it takes to be successful at the highest level - in the SEC and nationally."

Lister, the team's floor leader, averaged 12 points and five assists per game last season. She started all 33 games and played an instrumental role in helping Vanderbilt post a 21-12 record, representing the team's 11th straight 20-win season under Balcomb.

Lister has led the team in assists in each of the past two seasons, and has also ranked among the SEC leaders in minutes played. Last season, she logged 14 games in which she played all 40 minutes. She had 12 such games in her sophomore season.

Joining Lister in the backcourt will be Foggie, the smooth-shooting guard with super-quick hands. Foggie,

who led the SEC in scoring during her sophomore season, averaged 13.4 points per game last year.

Although she was sidelined for six games late in the season with a knee injury, Foggie ranked among the SEC's top-10 in scoring, three-point percentage and three-pointers per game. She also led the team in steals.

While Foggie and Lister will provide experience and leadership, three incoming freshmen - Rebekah Dahlman, Marqu'es Webb and Kylee Smith - will bring youthful energy, and immense skill, to the team. Balcomb raved about the trio of freshmen, praising their work ethic and ability level.

Webb, a 6-1 post player, was Miss Basketball in Alabama last season after averaging 15 points and 11 rebounds per game.
"She is someone who is going to make an impact right away," said Balcomb. "She has a great attitude, she is very skilled and there is just a lot she can do."

Balcomb also spoke glowingly of Dahlman and Smith, saying both are hard-nosed players who will energize the other players - and likely, the Vanderbilt fan base.

Dahlman was a McDonald's All-American during her prep career, and was named Miss Basketball in Minnesota last season following her senior year at Braham Area. She compiled a staggering 5,060 points in her prep career, becoming the first female player in Minnesota to ever surpass the 5,000 -point mark.

"(Dahlman is) relentless and tenacious," said Balcomb. "She is one of our hardest workers already - and that's impressive as a freshman."

Smith, from Alpharetta (Ga.) High, was a McDonald's All-America nominee and ranks No. 10 on the state's alltime scoring list with 2,175 career points.
"Kylee is tough, and she goes hard," Balcomb said. "She will be versatile ... She is a real competitor."

The lone junior on the team is Kady Schrann, who will get a late start this season while recovering from ankle surgery she underwent in August. Schrann missed the back half of last season with the injury, but she saw action in 22 games and averaged 6.4 points and 2.2 rebounds per game. She shot 48 percent from 3-point range (making 16-of-33 attempts).

The Commodore roster will feature strong collection of sophomores, including Heather Bowe, Jasmine Jenkins, Morgan Batey, Kendall Shaw and Rayte'a Long.

Bowe was named to the SEC's All-Freshman team last year after shooting 49 percent from the floor while averaging 6.2 points and 4.3 rebounds per game. The 6-0 forward played in 32 games and logged an average of 19 minutes per contest.
"(Bowe) had really advanced herself before she came (to Vanderbilt), and I think that's why she was counted on early by this team," said Balcomb. "As a sophomore, we are looking for her to be more consistent."

Jenkins, a guard, played in 25 games last season, averaging 2.3 points and 2.4 rebounds per game. Her highlights included a 10-point, four-rebound performance in Vanderbilt's win over Missouri.


Balcomb said she believes Jenkins is primed for a breakout season: "She put in all the time you could ask of her this summer and to be blunt about it, I look for JJ to be the most improved player on our team - and possibly in the SEC - this year. She has all the tools."

Batey, like Jenkins, will be looking to build off the momentum she gained last season, when she played in 32 games as a freshman. She came into her own late in the year, averaging 4.2 points and 6.2 rebounds over the final 10 games. She had nine points and nine rebounds in the regular-season finale against Georgia, and was in the starting lineup for all four of the Commodores' postseason games.
"(She showed) constant improvement throughout the season," said Balcomb.

Completing the cast of sophomores are Long and Shaw, both of whom are battling injuries. Long had offseason surgery on her wrist but is expected to be in the mix this year. Shaw will miss this season while recovering from an ACL surgery.
"(This situation) gives (Kendall) a year to work on everything and this could be a good opportunity for her if she makes the most of it," said Balcomb.

Gaffney, a redshirt freshman, suffered the second ACL injury of her career in recent months, and will miss the first half of the season. The Commodores are hoping to have her back in January in time for conference play.

And make no mistake, the Commodores will need to be as close to full strength as possible this season while navigating through a demanding schedule.

Vanderbilt's 29-game regular season slate includes 10 matchups against teams who made the NCAA tournament last season, and a total of 19 games against opponents who advanced to the postseason (either the NCAA Tournament, WNIT or WBI).

The challenging schedule features games against four teams who advanced to the Elite Eight.

When looking at the slate, Balcomb pointed to two games - a road trip to Duke on Nov. 21 and a home game against Dayton on Nov. 24 - as key dates for her team.
"We lost at Dayton last year on the road, and they ended up going up the second round at NCAAs ... So right away (this year), you have a measuring stick from where you were last year to this year. That's a big game for us."

## Melanie <br> BALCOMB

Head Coach<br>12th Season

The numbers say it all - 11 seasons, 11 NCAA Tournaments, 11 campaigns of at least 20 wins. Vanderbilt women's basketball has been a model of consistency under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. That's not to mention three SEC Tournament Championships, four Sweet 16 trips and eight top-25 finishes in over a decade on West End. That record has enabled Balcomb to become the all-time winningest coach in Vanderbilt women's basketball history.

Since arriving in 2002, Balcomb has posted a 259-106 (.710) record at Vanderbilt, averaging 23.5 wins per season. On February 28, 2013, against Auburn, Balcomb secured her 257th victory, passing Jim Foster for the program's wins record in exactly as many seasons as the former Commodore coach.

Balcomb's name is also showing up on some of the most exclusive lists in women's basketball. She is one of just five coaches, joining Connecticut's Geno Auriemma, Stanford's Tara VanDerveer, Notre Dame's Muffet McGraw and Georgia's Andy Landers, to lead the same program to each of the last 11 NCAA Tournaments. Balcomb is also the second longest-tenured coach in the Southeastern Conference (behind Landers) and currently serves on the USA Basketball Girls National Junior Team committee alongside Foster, California coach Lindsay Gottlieb, Central Florida coach Joi Williams and 2008 Olympic gold medalist Kara Lawson.

Over her 11 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has coached eight WNBA draft picks, a WBCA National Defensive Player of the Year (Jennifer Risper), a WBCA National Scholar-Athlete of the Year (Christina Wirth) and an SEC scoring champion (Christina Foggie), while graduating $100 \%$ of her four-year players.

With 20 years of collegiate head coaching experience, Balcomb is a renowned offensive strategist. Her 11 seasons at Vanderbilt have only enhanced that reputation. Every Commodore squad has finished in the top-50 nationally in field goal percentage, averaging a finish of 11.1 in the country (including four teams that have finished nation's top four). Balcomb's inaugural Commodore team in 2002-03 led the nation in field goal percentage, shooting $51.3 \%$.

The Commodores have shot just as well from three-point range, averaging a top-20 finish in three-point percentage among Division I teams with top-50 finishes every season. Balcomb's 2006-07 squad led the nation in three-point shooting at $43.7 \%$. The Commodores have finished in the top- 10 nationally in field-goal percentage seven times and in the top-10 in three-point field-goal percentage six times under Balcomb. Her teams have also finished in the top five in assists per game, free-throw percentage and scoring offense.

Balcomb's teams have been especially successful at home, where Vanderbilt has posted a 143-27 (.841) record at Memorial Gym. The Commodores have been almost as successful during the stretch-run, as over the last 10 years, Vanderbilt's record over the final nine regular season games is $67-28$, good for a .705 winning percentage.

Balcomb's success as a head coach is not limited to Vanderbilt. Before arriving at Vanderbilt, Balcomb had successful coaching tenures at Ashland (Ohio) and Xavier. She picked-up her 400th career win in the opening round of the 2011 SEC Tournament and has a career mark of 422-210 (.668).

Her 2012-13 squad dealt with serious injury problems, but still won over 20 games and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The team returned over $97 \%$ of its scoring, but played stretches without half of that firepower. Three starters - Stephanie Holzer, Christina Foggie and Kady Schrann - combined to miss 60 games, but a combination of seniors Tiffany Clarke and Elan Brown, junior Jasmine Lister and five freshmen helped fill the void. The Commodores scored a pair of huge wins at Florida and over No. 10 Texas A\&M late in the year to solidify their 14th straight NCAA Tournament bid.

Clarke led the team in scoring (16.6) and rebounding (8.4) to earn First Team All-SEC honors from the league's coaches, the 11th time a Balcomb coached player has done so. Clarke also earned first team all-conference honors from the Associated Press and All-Region recognition from the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Vanderbilt won its first round game over ninth-seeded Saint Joseph's, giving Balcomb a 10-1 record in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores fell in the second round to top-seeded Connecticut, capping the season at 21-12.

Balcomb started at Vanderbilt in 2002 and wasted no time in implementing her own style of winning. Working to transition veteran players into a new system while building new team chemistry, Balcomb's first year saw the Commodores win six of their last seven regular season games, earn an NCAA Tournament berth, and lead the nation in field goal percentage (51.3) against the fourth toughest schedule in the country. She was named a finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year award.

In 2003-04, Balcomb led the Commodores to their fourth Southeastern Conference Tournament title. She masterfully balanced strong upper-class leadership with exciting freshmen talent, winning 10 consecutive games and advancing to the program's 11 th Sweet 16 appearance. One year later, her team made its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Commodores posted the most wins (10) in the program's history in Southeastern Conference play finishing with a 10-4 record.

The Commodores were ranked seventh in the final AP poll of the 2006-07 season, and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament after winning another SEC Tournament title. That Vanderbilt squad was the nation's best three-point shooting team, and ranked among the top 10 in points scored. The team's 28-6 mark was the best record for a VU squad in 14 years.

The 2008 season was also one of Balcomb's most impressive coaching jobs. Despite graduating three All-SEC seniors, she led the Commodores to a 25-9 record and the school's 13th appearance in the NCAA sweet 16, all with two freshmen and no seniors in the starting lineup.

In 2009, Vanderbilt won its sixth SEC Tournament title, the third for Balcomb in the last six years. The team also advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 14th time in school history -Balcomb's fourth trip with the Commodores. Vanderbilt finished the year ranked No. 8 in the ESPN/ USA Today Coaches Poll after narrowly missing an upset of No. 1 seed Maryland in the Raleigh Regional Semifinal.

National accolades came flooding in for Vanderbilt, including senior Jennifer Risper being named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Defensive Player of the Year. Risper and classmate Christina Wirth, who herself was named an All- American and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, were both selected in the 2009 WNBA Draft.
In 2010 Balcomb was faced with one of her most challenging tasks. Faced with replacing National Defensive Player of the Year Jennifer Risper and All-American Christina Wirth, Balcomb guided an undersized team back to the NCAA Tournament, where they narrowly missed advancing to their third consecutive sweet 16.

Despite having to overcome numerous injuries throughout out the season and a size disadvantage in almost every game, Vanderbilt finished the season 23-11 overall. Individually, Balcomb helped junior point guard Jence Rhoads earn first team All-SEC honors, while senior shooting guard Merideth Marsh earned second team All-SEC accolades. Elan Brown and Tiffany Clarke were also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

The 2010-11 season featured many obstacles that Balcomb successfully maneuvered through to reach another NCAA Tournament and finish third in the SEC. Injuries took an unfortunate toll on the team throughout the year with at least one of Vanderbilt's five leading scorers unavailable for 14 out of the team's 32 games. Injuries coupled with matching Georgia for the fewest upperclassmen in the SEC challenged Balcomb to use different personnel groupings regularly.

Despite the challenges, Balcomb again reached 20 wins, finishing 20-12 and 10-6 in the SEC. Individually, Balcomb helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention All-America honors from the Associated Press in addition to first team All-SEC recognition. Rhoads was also a WBCA Region 3 All-American. Freshman center Stephanie Holzer was named honorable mention AII-SEC, SEC Sixth Woman of the Year and to the SEC All-Freshmen team. Freshman point guard Jasmine Lister was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. In 10 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has won 13 games in the NCAA Tournament, including a 10-1 mark in the opening round. She holds a winning percentage of 65.7 against SEC opponents. In all, Balcomb owns series advantages over 11 of the 13 other schools in the SEC before 2013.

The 2011-12 season saw one of Balcomb's youngest teams, as the squad of 11 featured just one senior, yet she still successfully steered the Commodores to a 23-10 mark and a 13th-straight NCAA Tournament. Leading the way was break-out star Christina Foggie, who became the first Balcomb player to lead the SEC in scoring (17.7 ppg).

Foggie was a First Team All-SEC selection and was joined by four other Commodores earning All-SEC honors - Jasmine Lister (second team), Tiffany Clarke (second team), Stephanie Holzer (honorable mention) and Kady Schrann (All-Freshman).

Vanderbilt defeated three ranked opponents on the season (No. 12 Oklahoma, No. 17 Georgia and No. 11 Tennessee), earning a seven seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores hosted at Memorial Gym, defeating 10th-seeded Middle Tennessee in the first round before falling to second-seeded Duke.

Before arriving at Vanderbilt, the Cranbury, N.J., native spent seven seasons at Xavier University. Beginning in 1995, her up-tempo style wreaked havoc on the Atlantic 10 while building the Musketeers into a national contender. In 1998, Xavier recorded its second postseason appearance in school history with a selection to the Women's National Invitational Tournament. Each of the next three seasons, Xavier competed in the NCAA Tournament, capped in 2001 by a victory over perennial power Tennessee and a run to the Elite Eight. En route to earning three invitations to the NCAA Tournament and compiling a 136-78 record during her tenure, Balcomb's offensive schemes helped push Xavier onto the national stage. Musketeer field-goal percentages ranked among the top three in the nation during three different seasons while the 1999 squad led the country in 3-point accuracy at 40.1 percent. Her 2000-01 squad averaged 79.4 points per game, the highest total in program history. Individual records were rewritten as well. Of the 15

Musketeers who have scored at least 1,000 points in a career, six of them played on Balcomb-coached teams.

Before her accomplishments at Xavier, Balcomb took her first head coaching position at Ashland University. Prosperity was immediate as Balcomb's first unit matched the best record in school history at 18-9 while registering its first winning season in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with an 11-7 mark.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Balcomb served three years as an assistant at Providence College (1990-93), during which the Friars went 62-30, made two NCAA Tournament appearances and once (1990-91) led the nation in scoring while they amassed a $26-6$ record. In 1989-90, Balcomb was an assistant at Ohio University and she began her coaching career with a four-year stint (1985-89) on the staff at Niagara University. In all, Balcomb has coached 19 players who have received All-SEC accolades. Nine of her players have been drafted by the WNBA, including VU's Chantelle Anderson, Ashley McElhiney, Jenni Benningfield, Ashley Earley, Carla Thomas, Dee Davis and Christina Wirth. Her Xavier teams won two league tournament titles (2000 and 2001) and one regular-season championship in the Atlantic 10 Conference (2001).

Xavier's successes during the Balcomb era helped push for construction of the Cintas Center, a state of the art facility which became home to Xavier basketball at the start of the 2000-01 season and - ironically - was dedicated with a victory over Vanderbilt. That season the program posted a school record for attendance with a total of 40,098 fans, who thrilled in the Musketeers' style of play and their results. Commodore followers have enjoyed the entertainment as well.

Her basketball education began at an early age among some of the most well respected coaches in the game. Balcomb's father, Alan, was a varsity boy's coach for 30 years at South Brunswick (N.J.) High School, and then served as an assistant for four years at Princeton University under Pete Carril, the master of the half-court game.

For Balcomb, however, a complete education goes far beyond the hardwood. Every eligible, four-year player during Balcomb's coaching tenure has earned her degree. In May of 2011, Balcomb's team earned a Public Recognition Award for finishing among the nation's top 10 percent in multi-year Academic Progress Rates (APR). Six of seven squads at Xavier earned team grade point averages that ranked in the Top 25. In 2004-05, 40 percent of the Commodore basketball team was named to the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll. Vanderbilt led the SEC with eight players being named to the honor roll in 2003-04.

Two Commodores have been named SEC Scholar Athletes of the Year under Balcomb. Hillary Hager received the honor in 2004 and Christina Wirth won it in 2009. Wirth was also named a 2009 Lowe's Senior CLASS All-American, while receiving WBCA and NCAA post- graduate scholarships. Hager recently returned to Vanderbilt and received her doctorate in 2010.

Balcomb also stresses the importance of community service to her teams. VU logged more than 95 hours of community service last season, including numerous opportunities to visit with young patients at the Vanderbilt Children's Hospital. After the devastating Nashville flood in 2010, Balcomb and her coaching staff volunteered in helping to clean up flood-damaged areas. Balcomb herself has been active in outreach to the surrounding area, participating in numerous fundraising events for local and national organizations, including Coaches vs. Cancer, the Race for the Cure, Mercy Ministries, Vanderbilt Children's Hospital and the Girl Scouts of America. She joined colleagues to represent the SEC in the 2008 4Kay Golf Classic to benefit the Kay Yow Cancer Fund. An avid golfer, Balcomb finds time to make it to beach on her rare weeks off, and also enjoys reading.

## Tor <br> GARRICK

Associate Head Coach<br>Fifth Season

Tom Garrick, a former Head Coach at the University of Rhode Island, joined Vanderbilt's staff as an assistant coach in the summer of 2009 and was promoted to associate head coach in 2013.

Garrick focuses on working with the team's guards, and his impact has been impressive, to say the least. This year, his development will be in the forefront as the team's lone seniors, Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie, are both guards who have already surpassed 1,000 career points at Vanderbilt and combined for 7.5 assists per game in 2012-13.

In his first year with the Commodores, Garrick helped Vanderbilt advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, and also played a role in Vanderbilt ranking second in the SEC in field-goal percentage and three-point field-goal percentage.

In 2010-11, Garrick helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention AllAmerica honors and first team All-SEC. He was also vital in the development of freshmen Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie. Lister earned SEC All-Freshman honors at point guard.

The progress was even more noticeable in 2011-12, as Foggie averaged 17.7 points per game to lead the SEC in scoring and earn First Team All-SEC Honors. Lister led the conference in assists ( 5.3 per game) and was a second team honoree, while Kady Schrann averaged 6.7 points per game and earned SEC All-Freshman honors.

## Assistant Coach <br> Seventh Season

Kim Rosamond is entering her seventh season at Vanderbilt as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for Melanie Balcomb's Commodores.

Hired before the 2007-08 season Rosamond brought 10 years of SEC experience as a player and coach with her to Vanderbilt, in addition to two season spent locally at Middle Tennessee State. Rosamond coordinates Vanderbilt's recruiting efforts while also contributing to every facet of scouting, player development and on-court strategy.

Rosamond's impact in recruiting was felt almost immediately. Since 2009, she has been instrumental in the Commodores bringing in recruiting classes that were ranked among the nation's best by numerous reporting services.

Her most recent effort may have been one of the best yet, as the three-player freshman class is ranked as high as eighth nationally. The top-ranked recruit is Minnesota native Rebekah Dahlman, who became the first player in state history to score over 5,000 career points while earning player of the year honors from both Gatorade and the Associated Press. She is not the only player of the year in the class, as Marqu'es Webb picked-up Gatorade Player of the Year and Miss Basketball honors in Alabama. The Hoover, Ala., native helped Hoover High to its second-straight state title as a senior. The class is rounded out by Kylee Smith, who led Alpharetta (Ga.) High School to the state quarterfinals for the first time in school history and became the first female in school history to surpass 2,000 career points.

The six-member 2012-13 freshman class earned a top-25 ranking from ESPN HoopGurlz, while including two top-100 ESPN players in Morgan Batey and Jasmine Jenkins, while Kristen Gaffney and Heather Bowe were each named Associated Press Players of the Year in North Carolina and Wisconsin, respectively.

Before arriving at Vanderbilt, Garrick spent the previous 11 years coaching at his alma mater, including 2005-09 as the head coach of the Rams' women's basketball team.
"Tom brings an exceptional wealth of knowledge with him to our program," Balcomb said. "I know Tom's vast experience - as both a player and a coach will be an invaluable asset to our program."

Garrick began his coaching career as an assistant for the Rhode Island men's team in 1998-99, helping the Rams win the Atlantic-10 Championship in his first year. In 2001, he moved over to the women's side to work under Head Coach Boe Pearman.

When Pearman took a leave of absence in 2004, Garrick was named the acting head coach. He would take an assistant coaching position at the University of Virginia that spring before returning to Rhode Island in August to become the school's sixth head coach

An outstanding player at Rhode Island, Garrick was drafted by the Los Angeles Clippers in 1988 and played in the NBA for four seasons, including stints in San Antonio, Minnesota and Dallas. Garrick's professional career also took the "Ocean State" native overseas to play in Germany, Turkey and Spain during a five-year span.

Garrick earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Rhode Island, where he was a four-year letterwinner for the men's basketball team. Nicknamed "the Chief," he led the 1988 squad to the Sweet 16, while compiling a program-best 28-7 record. Garrick still ranks among the school's all-time Top 10 in scoring (1,573 points) steals (189) and assists (407), and was inducted into the URI Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998.

During his prep career, Garrick was a two-time all-state basketball player for West Warwick (R.I.) High School, while also excelling in football.

Gaffney and Bowe also picked up Parade All-America honors.
In each of the last three seasons, two players Rosamond helped bring to Vanderbilt earned SEC All-Freshman honors. In 2010 it was Elan Brown and Tiffany Clarke and in 2011 it was Stephanie Holzer (redshirt) and Jasmine Lister, while Kady Schrann made the list in 2012.
"Kim has come in and made recruiting a full-time job," Balcomb said. "She is really helping us get ahead on the recruiting front, and get after that next-level talent. Kim is high energy and takes a great deal of pride in her job. On top of doing a tremendous amount of relationship-building for us, Kim has an outstanding knowledge of the game of basketball."

At MTSU, Rosamond was hired by Stephany Smith in 2003 as an assistant coach. She would serve as the interim head coach when Smith left in 2005. During her tenure in Murfreesboro, the Lady Raiders boasted consecutive 24-win seasons while capturing a pair of Sun Belt Conference championships and scoring two first-round NCAA Tournament upsets (over North Carolina and North Carolina State, respectively).

Prior to her time at MTSU, Rosamond spent five years as an assistant at her alma mater, Ole Miss. She was hired onto Coach Ron Aldy's staff in 1998 just months after graduating and would be promoted to recruiting coordinator in 2001.

Rosamond was responsible for bringing a pair top-50 classes to Oxford. Two Tennessee Miss Basketball selections were included in her Lady Rebel classes, with her final group of signees -- highlighted by All-American Armintie Price -having reached the NCAA Elite Eight in 2007.

Rosamond attended high school at Winston Academy in Louisville, Miss., where she was recruited to Ole Miss by Van Chancellor. She was a four-year letterwinner for the Lady Rebels (1995-98). Following her senior year, Rosamond was the recipient of the team's Lady Rebel Award, which is given to the player who excels on and off the court.

As a student-athlete at Ole Miss, Rosamond was the first Lady Rebel to earn All-SEC Academic honors in all four years of her collegiate career.

After serving as the Interim Head Coach at MTSU following the 2005 season, Rosamond worked in the private sector prior to coming to Vanderbilt.

## Ashley EARLEY

Assistant Coach First Season

Ashley Earley, a 2005 Vanderbilt graduate, joined Melanie Balcomb's staff in the summer of 2013 and will lead the effort with post players, while also contributing significantly to recruiting.

Earley comes back to Nashville having spent last season as an assistant coach at the University of Virginia.

Earley will help the Commodores continue a sustained level of success that has seen the program reach each of the last 14 NCAA Tournaments. She was a part of that success as a player from 2001-05, helping her teams to the Elite Eight in 2002, the Sweet 16 in 2004 and 2005 and SEC Tournament Championships in 2002 and 2004.

As a senior, she was a unanimous first-team All-SEC selection, Kodak AllRegion, Associated Press honorable mention All-American and Full Court Press second-team All-American. She paced the Southeastern Conference in field goal percentage and offensive rebounds and was a candidate for both the Naismith Trophy and Wooden Award. She capped her career with 1,382 points, a total which ranks 18th in program history.

After being drafted by the WNBA's Indiana Fever, Earley played professionally for the Maccabi Tel Kabir in the Safsal Israeli League.

She embarked upon a career in coaching following her playing career, first as a graduate assistant at the University of Alabama. From Tuscaloosa, she went on to spend two seasons as an assistant coach at Tennessee Tech before spending one season on the staff at the University of Rhode Island.

Earley then moved to Marquette in 2010, helping the Golden Eagles to the second round NCAA Tournament and a 24-9 mark. She was in Milwaukee for one more season before moving to Virginia in April 2012.

A native of Memphis, Tenn., Earley was an outstanding prep player who was the 2001 Gatorade Tennessee Player of the Year.She was also named High School All-America by Parade, the Women's Basketball Coaches Association and USA Today for her senior season at Briarcrest High School.

She earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from the College of Arts and Science at Vanderbilt, while also earning a master's in marketing from the University of Alabama in 2007

Chancellor Nicholas S. Zeppos was raised in Milwaukee, where he spent many an afternoon watching the great Hank Aaron of the Braves slug home runs in the old County Stadium.

Named Vanderbilt's eighth chancellor in 2008, Zeppos has taken a keen interest in athletics at Vanderbilt during his more than two decades at the university.
"I don't do the operations," Zeppos said. "I don't call the plays, I don"t throw the passes. I see my job as simply trying to do whatever I can to support all of the talented people who do these things."

This support has included the endorsement of an athletics capital improvement plan expected to surpass $\$ 50$ million, which orchestrates efforts to improve the student experience for athletes and assists with recruiting.
"One thing I consider the ultimate compliment is when a coach calls me and says, 'I've got a couple of recruits here. Could you meet them?'"

A distinguished legal scholar, teacher and executive, Zeppos served from 2002 to February 2008 as Vanderbilt's chief academic officer, overseeing the university's undergraduate, graduate and professional education programs and research in liberal arts and sciences, engineering, music, education, business, law and divinity. As provost and vice chancellor, he chaired Vanderbilt's budgeting and capital planning council, as well as oversaw the dean of students and dean of admissions.

Zeppos has led a number of important initiatives at Vanderbilt, including the planning process for The Ingram Commons, a landmark transformation of the first-year experience; the Strategic Academic Planning Group; innovative efforts in undergraduate admissions and financial aid; and the development of new programs in Jewish studies, law and economics and genetics, among others.

In a bold move to strengthen Vanderbilt's commitment to admitting undergraduates on the basis of accomplishment and achievement, rather
than their ability to pay, Zeppos significantly expanded the financial aid program in 2009. By replacing undergraduate, need-based loans with grant and scholarship assistance, the university opened its doors wider to highly talented and qualified students of all economic, cultural and geographical backgrounds. The expanded aid program is top university priority and is funded by a combination of strategic budget allocations and gifts from thousands of generous donors to Opportunity Vanderbilt, a campaign to increase undergraduate scholarship endowment.

Zeppos was recognized with five teaching awards at the law school before serving as an associate dean, associate provost, and provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs. He also served as interim chancellor for eight months prior to being formally appointed as Vanderbilt's eighth chancellor on March 1, 2008.

Zeppos is the Vice President of the 2013-14 executive committee of the Southeastern Conference and has been named President-elect for the 2014-16 term.

In the Nashville community, Zeppos serves on the boards of the Nashville Area Chamber of Commerce and the Nashville Public Education Foundation. He also serves on the National Security Higher Education Advisory Board and the Freedom Forum Diversity Institute Board.

From 1982 to 1987, Zeppos practiced law in Washington, D.C., at the United States Department of Justice and at Wilmer, Cutler \& Pickering, where he specialized in appellate litigation involving complex regulatory, statutory and constitutional matters.

Zeppos is a 1979 magna cum laude graduate of the University of Wisconsin Law School, where he served as editor in chief of the Wisconsin Law Review and was selected as the outstanding graduate of his class. He studied history during his undergraduate years at the university, where he was a 1976 Phi Beta Kappa graduate.

He is married to Lydia A. Howarth, a graduate of the University of Chicago and Lawrence University, who is an editor. They have two sons, Benjamin and Nicholas.




## David Williams • Vice Chancellor/ Athletic Director



An integral part of the Commodore athletics community for the last decade, David Williams II serves in a full-time role as Athletics Director at Vanderbilt University.

Williams ranks among the university's most prominent leaders, serving in numerous capacities since arriving in Nashville in 2000. Aside from his role in McGugin Center, Williams holds the titles of Vice Chancellor for University Affairs and Athletics and law professor at Vanderbilt.

He also is active with the SEC and NCAA in matters of negotiations, reforms, regulations and planning.

Williams has guided Vanderbilt Athletics since 2003 when the Board of Trustees and its administration accepted an initiative to more fully integrate Commodore athletics into the total Vanderbilt student life experience.

Today, Williams has firmly placed his stamp on the program, and has positioned Vanderbilt Athletics among the most innovative in the nation. The cumulative grade point for Vanderbilt student-athletes has continued to improve through Williams' tenure, reaching its highest level in more than two decades. Competitive successes, such as back-to-back bowl appearances in football, recent SEC titles in baseball and women's cross country, is becoming an expectation on campus. Individual accomplishment has been increasing, with 11 Vanderbilt athletes being selected in the first round of their respective professional drafts in the last nine years.

Williams also demonstrated his leadership within the Vanderbilt program by orchestrating successful searches for exceptional coaches to guide Commodore sports. In December 2010, he enticed University of Maryland Assistant Head Coach and Offensive Coordinator James Franklin to become the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt football history - and the first AfricanAmerican head coach to guide a revenue sport on campus. Since the hiring, Franklin has been a smashing success and had their best single-season record since the university joined the SEC as a charter member in 1933.

Williams also directed the search for new men's golf coach Scott Limbaugh, who guided his first Vanderbilt squad to the NCAA Regional Championships.

Williams has kept top coaches and staffs on campus. In recent months, he orchestrated extensions for baseball coach Tim Corbin and men's tennis coach Ian Duvenhage. He also worked to retain Franklin's assistant coaches
after the team's 9-4 success in 2012. When the 2013 season opened, Vanderbilt was the only SEC squad with its entire football coaching staff intact.

Williams has addressed numerous facility upgrades, including an extensive refurbishing of Vanderbilt Stadium and football locker rooms, expansion of Hawkins Field, addition of new tennis courts and amenities at Brownlee 0. Currey Tennis Center and renovations in Memorial Gym, the Hendrix Room and the McGugin Center. This fall, several Vanderbilt teams will start using a new on-campus indoor multipurpose facility that will house an eight-lane track complex and regulation football field.

An initiative to allow more overseas travel and study for Vanderbilt teams and student-athletes also has become reality during Williams' tenure.

In association with Vanderbilt Athletics, Williams has served as a member of the SEC team that negotiated recent ESPN and CBS television partner contracts, and is beginning the final year of a four-year term on the NCAA Division I Academic Cabinet. He also serves as Chair of the NCAA Infraction Appeals Committee and is a member of the Enforcement Working Group.

Williams joined Vanderbilt from The Ohio State University in 2000 as Vice Chancellor, General Counsel and University Secretary. His role expanded to Vanderbilt Athletics in 2002.

Williams served numerous administrative roles at Ohio State over 14 years. When he accepted the Vanderbilt role, Williams was Vice President of Student and Urban/Community Affairs and Professor of Law at Ohio State.

A native of Detroit, Williams received a Bachelor of Science in Social Science and Master of Arts in Education from Northern Michigan University where he ran track. He also earned a Master of Business Administration and a Doctor of Jurisprudence from the University of Detroit, and an L.L.M. in taxation from New York University. Before entering law school, Williams spent 10 years as a teacher and coach in the Detroit public school system.

Williams has taught at the law schools of the University of Detroit, Capital University, Ohio State and Vanderbilt, and twice directed the Ohio State Law Program in Oxford, England. He was elected outstanding law professor at both the University of Detroit and The Ohio State University.

Williams is active in the Nashville area community, serving as a board member with several organizations.

Currently, Williams is serving a second term on Nashville Mayor Karl Dean's Procurement Standards Board. He is also a former two-term member of the Nashville branch of the Atlanta Federal Reserve Board.

Williams and his wife, Gail, have four children: Erika, who is a grade school teacher in Detroit and graduate of Eastern Michigan University; David Williams III, who is a two-time graduate of Bowling Green State University, and is an academic counselor at Michigan State where he is working toward a doctorate; Samantha, who is a graduate of Brown University where she competed in swimming, and is now working in the U.S. Senate; and Nick, who will enroll this fall at High Point (N.C.) University after graduating from University School of Nashville. Nick was selected as USN's 2012-13 co-Athlete of the Year after competing in cross country, basketball, track and soccer.

Williams' wife, Gail, is a graduate of the University of Michigan and the University of Detroit College of Law and serves as the Associate Director of Community Relations of Vanderbilt. She is a past president and current board member of the University School of Nashville Board of Trustees and is the past Chair of the Metro Transit Authority where she continues to serve as a board member. In addition, Gail serves on the Boards of many non-profit organizations, including The Frist Center, The Women's Fund Advisory Board, and the YWCA.

## Another Year, Another NCAA Tournament

Vanderbilt women's basketball continued its success, advancing to the NCAA Tournament for the 14th straight season, including all 11 under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. The Commodores finished with an overall record of 21-12 and finished seventh in the SEC with a 9-7 mark in league play.

## NCAA Tournament Win

Vanderbilt was tabbed as the No. 8 seed in the Bridgeport Regional and played first and second round games in Storrs, Conn. The Commodores defeated Saint Joseph's 60-54 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before losing on UConn's home court, 77-44, in the second round. UConn would go on to win the national championship. By defeating Saint Joseph's, the Commodores won a game in the NCAA Tournament for the 12th time in 13 seasons. Vanderbilt has advanced to 26 NCAA Tournaments and holds an overall recod of 39-26.

## Vanderbilt's All-Time Winningest Coach

With a win over Auburn in the home finale, Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb secured her 257th win with the Commodores and became the program's all-time winningest coach. Balcomb, who is now 259-106 (.710) in 11 seasons, passed 2013 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Jim Foster. Foster won 256 games in 11 years at Vanderbilt. Balcomb has won 20 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament each year while at Vanderbilt. She has also won at least one NCAA Tournament game in 10 of her 11 appearances.

## Just One of Eight Programs

Vanderbilt is one of eight programs to have made the last 14 NCAA Tournaments (since 2000). The Commodores are joined by Connecticut, Duke, Georgia, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Stanford and Tennessee as the only programs to have earned bids each of the last 14 seasons.

## Shooting for the Stars

Melanie Balcomb is known as one of the best offensive coaches in women's basketball and the numbers back that up. All 11 of Balcomb's Vanderbilt teams have finished in the top 50 nationally in field goal percentage and three-point field goal percentage, with the 2012-13 team finishing 41st in field goal percentage (42.6\%) and 40th in three-point percentage (34.1\%). Only four other programs have finished in the top 50 of field goal percentage in each of the last 11 years: Connecticut, Green Bay, Ohio State and Stanford.

## Three for All-SEC

Three Vanderbilt players received All-SEC honors as voted on by the league's coaches. Senior forward Tiffany Clarke received First Team All-SEC honors after finishing among the top-three in the league in scoring (16.6), rebounding (8.5) and field goal percentage (.515). Junior guard Jasmine Lister was named to the second team after posting 12.2 points and 5.1 assists per game, 19th and fourth in the league respectively. Freshman forward Heather Bowe was named to the All-Freshman team after playing in all but one contest and starting 13 while averaging 6.2 points and 4.3 rebounds per game.

## Home Cooking

The Commodores were tough to beat at Memorial Gym, posting a 12-2 record last season with losses coming to No. 9/9 Tennessee and No. 10/8 Kentucky. Vanderbilt has won 29 of the last 32 regular season home games at Memorial, as well as 30 of the last 34 contests counting the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The four losses since the start of the 2011-12 season have come to South Carolina, Duke (second round of the NCAA Tournament), Tennessee and Kentucky.

## A New Way to Give Thanks

For the first time since 1998-99, Vanderbilt did not host a Thanksgiving Tournament at Memorial Gym. Instead, the Commodores went to the San Juan Shootout in Guaynabo, Puerto Rico, to take on Virginia and Florida State. It marked the first time since 198990 there was not any type of in-season tournament at Memorial Gym. The Thanksgiving Tournament returns in 2013.

## Bit By the Injury Bug

Vanderbilt coped with injuries throughout the season, with the most notable being a knee injury to Christina Foggie suffered against Kentucky. The team's leading scorer missed four games before seeing limited action in the final six regular season games. In addition, sophomore guard Kady Schrann missed 11 games and only played once after January 24. The Commodores lost reserve center Clair Watkins to a knee injury prior to the Tennessee game on January 24 and have played all season without Stephanie Holzer (knee) and Kristen Gaffney (knee). Entering the season, Vanderbilt returned $97.6 \%$ of its scoring, but Foggie, Schrann and Holzer contributed nearly half that number (49.4\%). In total, Vanderbilt players missed 99 games on the year:

## 1,000 X 3

With Jasmine Lister hitting 1,000 points at LSU, she became the third player last season to reach the 1,000-point plateau, joining Tiffany Clarke and Christina Foggie. It marked just the second time in the 36 -year history of Vanderbilt women's basketball that more than two players joined the club in the same season. The only other time was 20 years ago in the 1992-93 Final Four season when Heidi Gillingham, Julie Powell, Misty Lamb and Shelley Jarrard all hit the mark.

## Mixing it Up

VU used eight different starting lineups last season, three more than in 2011-12. The most common lineup was Lister, Foggie, Schrann, Brown and Clarke. The quintet was 11-4. At Texas A\&M, Balcomb changed her lineup for the first time in nine games, sliding Bowe in for Schrann. Injury to Foggie in the Kentucky game necessitated another change, creating a starting five of Bowe, Lister, Brown, Smith and Clarke that was used over the final six regular season games and went 4-2. At the SEC Tournament, VU used freshman Batey in for Smith in both games. Foggie then reentered the starting group for Bowe at the NCAA Tournament.

Senior Tiffany Clarke led all scorers with 24 points on 9 -of- 12 shooting to lead Vanderbilt (1-0) past a feisty McNeese State ( $0-1$ ) squad. The 24 points for Clarke were just three points shy of her ca-reer-high, while she also added a game-high eight rebounds. Vanderbilt's stingy defense also held McNeese State without a single fast break point. For the Cowgirls, Ashlyn and Caitlyn Baggett each scored 20 points in the game. Arianna James chipped in 12 points and four rebounds. At the half, Vanderbilt held a five-point lead, 41-36. The Commodores were lead by Clarke's 10 points. She was the lone Commodore in double-figures at the half. Foggie, Lister, Brown and Bowe each had six points, apiece. As a team, Vanderbilt shot 53.6 percent from the field and was a perfect 8 -of- 8 from the charity stripe. McNeese State shot 50 percent from the field, including 5 -of-12 from behind the three-point line. The Commodores lead the rebounding battle at half, $16-11$, while also forcing 12 Cowgirl turnovers. On Monday night in Nashville, the No. 13/17 Commodores got some first hand experience as they overcame a poor shooting night to defeat Lipscomb, 62-45, and improve to 2-0. GUAYNABO, P.R. -- The Vanderbilt women's basketball team couldn't overcome the loss of Christina Foggie late in the first half and dropped a 73-59 decision to Florida State in the final game at the San Juan Shootout. The Commodores fell to 3-3 on the season, while the Seminoles improved to 5-0. Vanderbilt was led by 16 points from Jasmine Lister, while Elan Brown contributed 13 points and six rebounds. Freshman Kendall Shaw had her first career double-figure game, scoring 10 points. Florida State saw five players score double-figures. Leonor Rodriguez led the way with 16 points. Alexa Deluzio added 14 off the bench, followed by Chasity Clayton with 13 points and Chelsea Davis with 10 points. Guard Yashira Delgado contributed nine assists. The contest was back and forth early, with six lead changes over the first nine minutes. The Commodores led 17-16 with 11:26 to play in the opening period. Florida State answered with a 6-0 run to take a 23-17 lead. The FSU lead was 27-20 when Foggie went down under the basket with a foot injury and did not return. The Commodores fought, but the lead was 10 at the half, 36-26, and Vanderbilt would get no closer than five in the second half. Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb was pleased with the effort her team showed, especially after Foggie's injury. "We fought, we competed harder each game," Balcomb said. "We've made some great adjustments since the Dayton game. We played a lot freer these last two games." Balcomb felt a major issue was post defense, where the Commodores had to play most the contest with a pair of freshman - Shaw and Heather Bowe - because Tiffany Clarke was in foul trouble."They got easy points in the paint," Balcomb explained. "We're going to have to improve our post defense. That's something that plagued us last year and it's plaguing us this year." The biggest positive for the head coach was the play of Brown, one of the team's three seniors. "Elan was fabulous today," Balcomb said. "She made more plays, defensively (than anyone). She's our smartest defender and she plays defensively, but she also got shots on offense. She played two, three, four and five for us, everything but point, and she's the glue. She kept this team together tonight."

Vanderbilt dominated the second half, as the Commodores (4-3 overall) out-scored Austin Peay (1-5 overall), 38-9. The Commodores also owned the battle of the boards, outrebounding the Lady Govs, 56 -24. Clarke led all scorers with 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting from the field, while also pulling down a game-high seven rebounds. Jasmine Lister (12) and Morgan Batey (11) were the only other Commodores to finish in double figures. The 11 points for Batey were a new career-high. Lister and Jasmine Jenkins tied for the team-lead with four assists apiece. As a team, Vanderbilt shot 39 percent from the field, while holding Austin Peay to just 23 percent overall and 21 percent from behind the three-point line. NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Head Coach Melanie Balcomb wanted her team to focus on defense right from the tip on Saturday against Tennessee Tech. The Commodores did just that, utilizing a 15-0 run to open the game, before cruising to a $77-50$ victory at Memorial Gym. The Commodores $(5-3)$ were led by 17 points from Tiffany Clarke. The senior also grabbed seven rebounds. Classmate Elan Brown contributed 10 points and nine rebounds. Vanderbilt also got nine from Morgan Batey, eight from Jasmine Lister and seven each from Kady Schrann and Gabby Smith. Tennessee Tech was led by 18 points from Diamond Henderson. T'Keyah Williams contributed 10 points and five rebounds. The 15-0 Vanderbilt run to open the contest was the best for a Commodore team to start a game since a 17-0 run against Lipscomb in last season's Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament. Foggie exploded for 16 second half points to help the Commodores ( $6-3$ ) pull away. The junior finished with 18 for the game. Sophomore guard Kady Schrann contributed 14 points, while Jasmine Lister and Tiffany Clarke added 13 each. Senior Elan Brown pulled down a career-best 13 rebounds, while scoring nine points. Lister also dished out 11 assists, recording the first Vanderbilt double-double of the season. Western Kentucky (5-2) was led by 15 points apiece from Chastity Gooch and Alexis Govan. Govan pulled down seven rebounds, while Gooch grabbed six. As a team, Western Kentucky committed just nine turnovers in the game. The Lady Toppers led, $35-34$, at the half. Gooch and Govan were leading the charge with 10 and eight points respectively. Schrann was leading the Commodore effort at the intermission with nine points. The game featured eight ties and 11 lead changes, mostly in the first period. Vanderbilt had an outstanding shooting performance, going 31-49 from the field for $63.3 \%$. The hot shooting helped Vanderbilt overcome 22 turnovers in the contest. The Commodores opened the second half making their first 11 field goals, including four three-pointers, to help build a lead. The Hilltoppers fought back but could not close the gap to closer than six.




NASHVILLE, Tenn. -Tiffany Clarke recorded her first double-double of the season to lead Vanderbilt past Hartford, 67-45 on Thursday night at Memorial Gym. Clarke scored 12 of her 22 points in the second half to help Vanderbilt (7-3) put away Hartford (6-2) for good. Clarke led all players with 22 points and 12 rebounds, which was her first double-double of the season and 13th of her career. Late in the first half, Clarke also became the 34th player to reach 1,000 career points for the Commodores. The Duluth, Ga., native shot an efficient 7-of-10 from the field and 8-of-10 from the free throw line. She also tied a career-high with four blocked shots. Kady Schrann was the only other Commodore in double-figures as she finished with 10 points. Jasmine Lister added nine points and a game-high five assists. Elan Brown and Gabby Smith each scored eight points. Christina Foggie tied a career-high with four steals. As a team, the Commodores shot 48 percent from the field, while holding the Hawks to just 32 percent from the field and only 23 percent from behind the three-point line. NORMAN, Okla. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team used a complete team performance to take a $76-63$ victory at No. 12/13 Oklahoma on Sunday, December 16. The Commodores improve to 8-3 and have won five-straight games. The Sooners fall to 8-2. Four Commodores were in double-figures, led by 17 from Christina Foggie. Jasmine Lister and Tiffany Clarke contributed 16 each, while Kady Schrann added 11 points. Clarke grabbed a team-best eight rebounds, while Lister grabbed six of her own and dished out nine assists. Oklahoma was led by 21 points from Aaryn Ellenberg. Nicole Griffin scored 11 points and grabbed five rebounds, while Morgan Hook scored 10 and had four rebounds. Joanna McFarland just missed a double-double with nine points and a game-high 11 rebounds. "I'm really proud of our effort defensively," said Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. "I thought Elan Brown played really hard, diving on balls and getting loose balls and we started to follow that. It was a really good team effort." Brown scored just four points, but grabbed five rebounds and four steals. As a team, Vanderbilt forced 20 Oklahoma turnovers and scored 23 points off those miscues, while the Commodores picked up a season-best 12 steals. The opening minutes were filled with back-and-forth action. Oklahoma jumped out to an 8-4 lead before a pair of steals by Brown and Foggie helped the Commodores tie it back up at eight. With the game still tied at 13, Schrann went on an 8-0 run by herself to put Vanderbilt up, 21-13. Hook responded with a 3-pointer before the media timeout to make it 21-16. The run would end up being 18-5, with Vanderbilt opening a 31-18 lead with just over six minutes left in the half. The Commodore lead would be maintained into the break, with the score at the half being 37-27. In the first half alone, Vanderbilt matched its season best with 10 steals. The Sooners turned it over 15 times in the opening period, leading to 16 Commodore points. Oklahoma came out strong in the second half, cutting the Vanderbilt lead to 41-35 before the Commodores responded with an 11-2 run. The stretch was capped by a three from Lister that made it 52-37. The Sooners continued to respond. After Vanderbilt built an 18 -point lead, Oklahoma quickly cut it to $12,60-48$, with just over seven minutes to play. Then Clarke grabbed a big offensive rebound and got the put-back to make it 67-56. After Ellenberg hit another jumper, Foggie hit a pull-up jumper, followed by a 3-pointer to push the lead back to 14, 72-58.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Heather Bowe recorded a career-high 14 points and 12 rebounds to power the Commodores past the College of Charleston Saturday afternoon at Memorial Gym, 69-44. Vanderbilt (9-3) overcame a sloppy first half to outscore the College of Charleston (4-5) 40-23 in the second half, while also dominating the glass, 29-19 and 5238 for the game. The Cougars outrebounded Vanderbilt 23-19 in the first half. The 14 points and 12 rebounds for Bowe gave the freshman from Eau Claire, Wis., her first career double-double. Tiffany Clarke's 15 points and 10 rebounds mark the second double-double of the season and 14th of her career. Clarke was 6 -of-12 from the field. The two double-doubles from Bowe and Clarke marked the first time since Feb. 16, 2012, that two Commodores recorded double-doubles in the same game. Christina Foggie was the third Commodore in double-figures, as she finished with 12 points, four assists and four rebounds. Overall, 11 different players donning the Black and Gold scored on the afternoon. As a team, Vanderbilt shot 43 percent ( 25 -of-58) from the field and 81 percent ( 17 -of-21) from the free throw line. Vandy's defense stifled the College of Charleston all afternoon, as the Cougars shot just 25 percent (17-of-67) from the field, 15 percent ( 3 -of-20) from three-point range and 43 percent ( 7 -of-16) from the charity stripe. Megan Fischer and Latisha Harris each scored 10 points for the Cougars. Harris also had a team-high eight rebounds. As the second half wore on, Vanderbilt started taking advantage inside, as the Commodores dominated the paint, 42-14 for the game. The Commodores used an 11-0 run late in the first half to head into the locker room with the momentum after a sluggish start, 29-21. The Commodores improved to 10-3, while the Trojans fell to 3-8. As usual, Christina Foggie and Tiffany Clarke led the way. Foggie scored 28 points on 8-of-18 shooting and 7 -of-11 from three. The seven three-pointers matched a career-high for the junior and were just one shy of the Vanderbilt record for threes in a game. Clarke recorded her third double-double in the last four games, scoring 24 points and grabbing 11 rebounds. The senior forward shot 10-21 from the field. Jasmine Lister joined the pair in double-figures. A native of nearby Corona, Calif., the junior guard scored 11 and dished out six assists, while grabbing three steals playing in front of several family members and friends. USC was led by 22 from Cassie Harberts. The forward grabbed seven rebounds. Ariya Crook contributed 12 points for the Trojans, who have lost six straight. NASHVILLE, Tenn. - A balanced scoring attack led Vanderbilt to a 92-41 rout of the Mississippi State Bulldogs Thursday night at Memorial Gym in the SEC opener. Vanderbilt (11-3, 1-0) scorched Mississippi State (8-6, 0-1) for season-highs in points (92), assists (24), steals (12) and a season-low eight turnovers on a night when everything went right for the Commodores in their first conference game of the 2013 calendar year. Every player that suited up for the Commodores saw game action. The 51-point margin of victory for Vandy was the largest since the Commodores defeated Quinnipiac, 111-53 (+58) on Nov. 26, 2010. Five different Commodores reached double-figures on the night, led by Christina Foggie's 17 points on 5 -of-10 shooting from the field and 3-of7 from downtown. Foggie also chipped in four rebounds, four steals and three assists. Jasmine Lister recorded her third career double-double and second of the season with 14 points and 10 assists. Tiffany Clarke scored 14 points and grabbed six rebounds. Kady Schrann added 13 points, three rebounds, two assists and two steals. Heather Bowe added 10 points off the bench on 3-of-4 shooting from the field and 4-of-4 from the charity stripe. For the game, VU shot 57 percent (31-of-54) from the field, 53 percent ( 7 -of-13) from three-point range and 92 percent ( 23 -of-25) from the free throw line. Vanderbilt's suffocating defense held Mississippi State to just 32 percent from the field and 7 percent (1-of-13) from three-point range, while also forcing 22 MSU turnovers. Vandy then converted those turnovers into 36 points. Martha Alwal Ied Mississippi State with 14 points and seven rebounds, while Carnecia Williams added 11 points. The Commodores started the game on a 23-9 run behind seven points from Foggie and five points and four assists from Lister. Foggie then hit back-to-back three-pointers at the 10 -minute mark in the half, giving VU a 29-11 lead. Foggie led the Commodores with 13 first half points, en route to a $53-18$ lead at halftime. OXFORD, Miss. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team ran its winning streak to nine games on Sunday, January 6, defeating Ole Miss, 76-57. The Commodores improved to 12-3, 2-0 in SEC play, while the Rebels fell to $7-8,0-2$ in conference action. Tiffany Clarke led the Vanderbilt effort with 25 points and 13 rebounds. It was her fourth double-double of the season. Jasmine Lister contributed 13 points and 10 assists for her third double-double of the year. It marks the second time this season Commodores posted double-doubles in the same game. Kady Schrann and Christina Foggie joined the duo in double figures, posting 15 and 13 points, respectively. Elan Brown scored four point while grabbing seven rebounds. Ole Miss was led by 15 points from Diara Moore. Tia Faleru contributed 10 points and seven rebounds for the Rebels. Vanderbilt held the home team to $35.4 \%$ shooting and forced 13 turnovers. "I like what we're bringing as a team; we're tougher mentally and physically," Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb said. "They're enjoying themselves, enjoying working hard and we're having good results." Clarke echoed that sentiment. "We definitely have more fun because we trust each other," the senior said. "The feeling of 'We're one,' makes us have more fun. We know we have each other's back so we're able to play more free and it shows on the court." Similar to Thursday's contest against Mississippi State, the Commodores steadily built a first half lead. Vanderbilt used a $55.6 \%$ (15-27) shooting percentage to open up a 40-19 lead at the intermission. Lister was the big reason for the 21-point margin, as she connected for three field goals and hit a pair from the line for 11 points, while dishing out six assists. She had a hand in nine of Vanderbilt's 15 first-half field goals. The second half was the Tiffany Clarke show. After missing her first four field goals and having eight points at the break, the senior scored 17 of her 25 points in the second half. One of the top shooters in the SEC, she finished 11-20 from the field in the contest. The victory marked the fourth consecutive road win for Vanderbilt (preceded by wins at Southern Cal, Oklahoma and Western Kentucky). It's the first time that has happened since early in the 2009-10 campaign when the Commodores won at Southern Illinois, St. Joseph's (Pa.), Wright State and Quinnipiac to open the season.


COLUMBIA, S.C. -The Vanderbilt women's basketball team saw its ninegame win streak snapped on the road at N o. 18/16 South Carolina, $64-$ 48. The Commodores fell to 12-4, 2-1 in SEC play, while the Gamecocks improved to 14-2, 2-1 in league action. The highlight of the night for the Black and Gold came with 10:10 to play when junior Christina Foggie became the 35 th player in program history to reach 1,000 career points. Foggie finished the night with nine points and seven rebounds. Heather Bowe and Jasmine Lister each scored 11 to lead the Commodores. Lister added eight assists. Tiffany Clarke scored eight points and grabbed five rebounds, while Elan Brown contributed seven points. South Carolina was led by 13 points from Aleighsa Welch. The Gamecocks also got 12 points and five assists from leasia Walker. Ashley Bruner and Elem Ibiam each added nine. Sancheon White led the Gamecocks with eight rebounds. USC outscored Vanderbilt in the paint, 36-20. "Even when we did have a good look or good shot, you have to make it,"Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "And then when you don't make it, you have to offensive rebound. Our lack of offensive rebounding was exposed again tonight. We went back to our frustrating showing. It was something uncharacteristic, more like where we were in the beginning of the season. We had to bring them back together as a team and we made a few runs." She was also quick to credit South Carolina. "We haven't seen that defense all year," Balcomb said. "You want to put your team in situations (to prepare) and nobody plays defense like that." South Carolina's defense stifled the Commodores in the first half, holding Vanderbilt to 4 -of-20 shooting and forcing 10 turnovers. Vanderbilt did not hit a field goal in the final 7:07 of the period and trailed, $36-20$, at the break. Foul trouble was also a first-half issue, as Clarke and Bowe both had two fouls with seven minutes left in the half. That showed in the post, as the Gamecocks outscored Vanderbilt, 24-6, in the paint in the opening frame. Vanderbilt slowly chipped away at the lead in the second half, cutting it to 47-37 on a pair of Bowe free throws. They would cut it to 10 again, $55-45$, with $2: 23$ to play before a Mitchell layup pushed the lead back to 12 . That would be as close as the Commodores would get before falling. NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Four different Commodores recorded double-digit scoring efforts on Sunday afternoon versus the Arkansas Razorbacks en route to a $78-58$ win at Memorial Gym. With the win, Vanderbilt is now 13-4 overall and 3-1 in conference action, while the Razorbacks drop to 13-4 on the season and 1-3 in SEC play. The win also makes Vandy 8-0 at Memorial Gym this season and 11-1 all-time versus Arkansas in the building. Jasmine Lister led the way with a game-high 19 points (7-of13) and six assists. Christina Foggie finished with 18 points on 6-of-14 shooting from the field to go along with five rebounds, four assists and two steals. With Foggie's three made three-point field goals (175), she moved past Paige Redman (173) for seventh all-time in school history for made three-pointers. Tiffany Clarke scored 10 of her 15 points in the second half on 7-of-9 shooting from the floor. Elan Brown fin-ished one rebound shy of a double-double with 10 points and nine rebounds. Brown also added four assists. As a team, Vanderbilt dished out 20 assists on the day, while Arkansas only managed 11. The 20 assists marks the fourth time this season in which Vandy has had 20 or more assists in a game and three of those of come in SEC contests. For the game, the Commodores scorched the Arkansas defense at the tune of 56 percent ( 28 -of-50) from the field and 42 percent ( 8 -of-19) beyond the arc. After turning the ball over 11 times in the first half, the Commodores only turned it over five times in the second half. Arkansas shot 37 percent from the field, but could not find the range from behind the three-point line, as the Razorbacks converted on 1-of-15 (6.7 percent) tries. Quistelle Williams finished with 16 points, six rebounds, three steals and two blocked shots for the Razorbacks, while Sarah Watkins added 10 points and five boards off the bench. Coming out of the locker room after the break, Vanderbilt picked up right where it left off, as the Commodores used a 9-0 run to take a $52-29$ lead. That lead would extend to as many as 24 in the second half. Vanderbilt used a 12-0 run midway through the first half to take a 16-6 lead. Foggie and Lister combined to score 12 of the first 18 points of the game. The Commodores then used an 8-0 run to extend their lead right before the break. Foggie led all scorers with 12 points at the half to lead Vandy to a 43-29 lead. Foggie also contributed three assists, two steals and two rebounds. Lister was the only other player in double-digits with 10 points. For the half, Vandy shot an extremely efficient 60.9 percent (14-of-23) from the field. The Commodores also outrebounded the Razorbacks 19-17 in the first half.

## LSU 54•12-7 (3-3)



BATON ROUGE, La. - Vanderbilt dropped a hard-fought 54-51 decision at LSU on Sunday. The Commodores fell to 13-5, 3-2 in SEC play, while the Lady Tigers improved to 12-7, 3-3 in league action. Vanderbilt was led by a double-double from Tiffany Clarke. The senior forward scored 17 points and grabbed 13 rebounds. Junior guard Christina Foggie contributed 13 points and four assists, while Jasmine Lister had five points and six assists. Elan Brown just missed a double-double with eight points and nine rebounds. LSU was led by 26 points and seven rebounds from Theresa Plaisance. The forward had 21 points in the second half to help LSU rally from a 10-point Vanderbilt lead with 16:10 to play. "I don't think we were tough enough," Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "They manhandled us in the second half. They got more physical, smacking the ball out of our hands and turning the ball over. If you don't defend and rebound the whole game, you're going to struggle." The Commodores struggled out of the gate, missing their first six field goals before Clarke finally connected 4:59 into the game. During that span, Vanderbilt also turned it over three times. The offensive struggles were contagious, as over the first eight minutes of the game, LSU was 3 -for-12 and VU was 2 -for-13 from the field. The teams combined for 10 turnovers in that stretch, as well. Vanderbilt then slowly turned things around, using a 15-2 run over 7:24 to take a 17-10 lead. The Commodores carried that run into halftime, holding a 24-16 lead. Plaisance got the Lady Tigers back in it, scoring all but two points in a 13-3 run to tie the game at 34 with 11:45 to play. LSU continued the run to open up a 38-34 lead before Foggie drilled a three to make it a one-point game, 38-37, with just under 10 minutes to play. Neither team led by more than two points over the next seven minutes until Brown hit a jumper to put Vandy up 50-47 with 2:47 to play. The Commodores then forced a shot clock violation on the defensive end before missing. LSU got it back and a Kady Schrann foul put Webb at the line for a one-and-one. The guard hit both to make it $50-49$ with 1:45 to play. Vanderbilt followed with a turnover before Plaisance connected from three to put the Lady Tigers up $52-50$ with 1:07 remaining. With 50 seconds left, Clarke was fouled in the post and went to the line, missing the first and making the second, trimming the LSU lead to one, 52-51. A foul by Schrann with 36 seconds left put Webb back at the line for a one-and-one. She missed the first, with Brown pulling down the board. Schrann's entry to Clarke in the post was stolen by LSU and a Clarke foul put Lutley at the line in a bonus situation with 7.5 seconds left. She hit both to put LSU up 54-51. Foggie was able to get off a three-point attempt as time expired, but it was off the mark.

NASHVILLE - Melanie Balcomb wanted her Vanderbilt Commodores to push the ball inside offensively and focus on defending Taber Spani and Meighan Simmons of Tennessee. They didn't follow the game plan well at all. The Commodores outscored No . 9 Tennessee $38-32$ in the paint and even grabbed 21 offensive rebounds, but they couldn't keep up with the Lady Vols' top scorers Thursday night in losing 83-75. "Believe it or not, the game plan in the first half was the same as it was in the second half", Balcomb said. "We just didn't execute the game plan. Get the ball inside, get the ball to the rim. It all worked in the second half. The first half, we took too many outside shots, weren't aggressive and didn't attack enough." That left Vanderbilt trailing 41-29 at halftime. The Commodores scored the first 12 points of the second half to tie up Tennessee at 41. But that was as close as they would get as the Lady Vols responded by scoring 11 of the next 13 points before hitting 14 of their final 15 free throws in the final $3: 49$ to seal the win. "Just can't celebrate when we make a run," Vanderbilt junior guard Christina Foggie said. Foggie led Vandy with 22 points before foul-ing out in the final minute, Tiffany Clarke had 19 and Kady Schrann 14. Spani scored a career-high 24 points and Simmons added 23 as Tennessee (16-3, 7-0) won its ninth straight. The Lady Vols got a measure of payback for losing in Memorial Gym a year ago, their last SEC loss. "Well, I mean honestly you just want to come in and play your best against a great SEC team," Spani said. "Obviously, this is a great rivalry game. But we also have a lot of respect for Vanderbilt and what they're capable of doing and it's always a great environment."With No. 5 Kentucky losing to No. 18 South Carolina earlier in the night, Tennessee is the Southeastern Conference's last undefeated team in league play. Simmons said that's exactly where the Lady Vols expected to be. Coach Holly Warlick cautioned it's still very early this season. "But yeah, it's great to be undefeated and be on top of the SEC," Warlick said. "But ... we're not satisfied absolutely."The Lady Vols have won 11 straight SEC games dating back to the loss here last season. Bashaara Graves also had 16 points for Tennessee. Vanderbilt (13-6, 3-3) lost for the first time at home this season and has lost three of four overall. The Commodores played without 6 -foot-4 sophomore Clair Watkins, who suffered a knee injury in practice Wednesday. They still pulled down 21 offensive rebounds despite being outrebounded 46-43. The Commodores managed to tie the score twice, the second time at 41 after scoring the first 12 points of the second half. The Lady Vols answered with an 11-2 spurt capped by a drive by Simmons with 12:45 to go, and Vanderbilt couldn't get closer than five the rest of the way.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team snapped a two-game losing streak on Sunday, January 27, at Alabama, defeating the Crimson Tide, $67-58$. The Commodores improved to 14-6, 4-3 in SEC play, while the Tide fell to 12-8, 2-5 in league play. Tiffany Clarke matched her career high with 27 points, while also grabbing 15 rebounds for her seventh double-double of the season and third in a row. Heather Bowe also contributed a double-double with 13 points and 13 rebounds. For Alabama, Dia-sha Simmons led the way with 15 points. Shafontaye Myers added 13, while Jasmine Robinson contributed nine and Meghan Perkins added six, and pulled down a team-best nine rebounds. "I really liked how our kids responded," Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "Alabama) is a team that comes at you for 40 minutes and you have to be tough. When Tiffany Clarke plays two halves, we're going to be a good team." Clarke knew Vanderbilt was in for a challenge facing the Tide. "We needed this," Clarke said. Alabama could get no closer than seven points down the stretch and Vanderbilt held on for a 67-58 victory.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -The Vanderbilt women's basketball team took control early and never looked back on Sunday, defeating Ole Miss, 79-53. With the win the Commodores rise to $15-7,5-4$ in the SEC, while Ole Miss slips to 8-14, 1-8 in the league. Christina Foggie led Vanderbilt with 22 points, while Tiffany Clarke dropped 14 with eight rebounds.
Heather Bowe and Jasmine Lister each added 11 points, and Bowe also grabbed 8 rebounds. For Ole Miss, Tia Faleru scored 15 points, while Courtney Marbra and Diara Moore each added 11 points. Vanderbilt never trailed in the game, dominating the offensive end in both the paint and on the perimeter. The Commodores finished the game with 40 points in the paint to the Rebels' 16 . Vanderbilt also capitalized on opportunities consistently throughout the game, with 40 points scored from 21 Ole Miss turnovers. After returning from the locker room at halftime with a 38-17 lead, the Commodores continued their offensive streak, going on a 16-8 run to start the second half. Two consecutive layups from Clarke, followed by two consecutive layups from Elan Brown led to the dagger being delivered by a Gabby Smith 3-pointer at the 14:16 mark, forcing Ole Miss to take a timeout. Free throws also played a large role for Vanderbilt. Overall, the team shot 18-20 from the line, with five Commodores hitting $100 \%$ on the game. Foggie again led the way, shooting 7-7. It marked just the third time this season Vanderbilt hit at least $90 \%$ from the stripe.




NASHVILLE, Tenn. - A'dia Mathies spent some extra time practicing from beyond the arc in Kentucky's shootaround, trying to work out a kink in her form. The senior guard found what she needed. Mathies scored a season-high 28 points, including five 3 -pointers, and 10th-ranked Kentucky beat Vanderbilt 75-53 Sunday for the Wildcats'second straight road victory. "She was hot from the 3-point line," Kentucky coach Matthew Mitchell said. "She was aggressive today. She made them pay for open looks at the 3-point stripe, and it's difficult to beat us when she's playing that well. I think that A'dia knew how important this game was and how difficult it is to play here. And I thought she played like the player of the year that she is." The Wildcats (21-3, $9-2$ ) came in tied for third in the Southeastern Conference, and they are finishing the regular season with five of their final seven league games on the road. Mathies had gone a combined 2 of 9 from 3-point range in the previous two games, and she said she was just glad she took the extra shots in the shootaround. "It started feeling like it used to feel, and it showed today," Mathies said. The Wildcats followed up an overtime win at Arkansas by taking control late in the first half in this one. Kentucky has won five straight in this series while handing Vanderbilt its worst loss this season. "It's always tough to beat Vanderbilt," Mitchell said. Vanderbilt (15-8, 5-5) has lost five of eight, and the Commodores are 1-6 against teams currently ranked in the Top 25. Tiffany Clarke led the Commodores with 20 points. Christina Foggie had 12 before being knocked out of the game with an injured knee, and Jasmine Lister had 10. Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer last season and sixth this season averaging 15.9 points per game, hurt her knee with 4:43 left and Kentucky up 66-47. She was reaching for a loose ball when Azia Bishop of Kentucky dived for the ball and banged into Foggie. That left Foggie on the court for a couple minutes before she walked with assistance to the edge of the court. She was then carried to the locker room. The collision was just in front of the Kentucky bench, and Mitchell said Bishop was hustling for the ball after missing a layup when she dived for the ball. Vanderbilt coach Melanie Balcomb said Foggie would have an MRI as soon as it can be scheduled. This game was decided well before then. The Wildcats also hit 10 of 22 from 3-point range. Kentucky led 31-22 at halftime after finishing the half outscoring Vanderbilt 16-7.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Playing in its first game without second-leading scorer, Christina Foggie, Vanderbilt used a solid defensive effort to shut down the Missouri Tigers, 62-46, Thursday night at Memorial Gym. Vanderbilt ( $16-8,6-5$ ) won the first ever meeting between the two women's basketball programs, while sending Missouri (15-10, 4-7) to its second straight loss. Four Commodores recorded double-digit scoring efforts to pick up some of the scoring that was missing from Foggie. Jasmine Lister led Vanderbilt with 18 points on 8-of-13 shooting, while Elan Brown scored 11 of her 13 points in the first half. Brown also pulled down seven rebounds and tied for the team lead with four assists. KNOXVILLE - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team, playing without starters Christina Foggie and Kady Schrann, dropped an 83-64 decision at No. 12/10 Tennessee on Sunday, February 17. The Commodores dropped to 16-9, 6-6 in SEC play, while the Lady Vols improved to 20-5, 11-1 in league action. Junior guard Jasmine Lister led a valiant Vanderbilt effort, scoring 24 points while dishing out four assists. Freshmen Heather Bowe and Morgan Batey each added 10 points, while Batey contributed a team-best six rebounds. Already missing Schrann and Foggie, Vanderbilt also played the second half without Tiffany Clarke, who became ill in the locker room at halftime. The Commodores played four freshmen, Bowe, Batey, Rayte'a Long and Jasmine Jenkins, along with Lister for most of the second half. Tennessee had five players in double-figures, led by 17 from Meighan Simmons. Ariel Massengale added 14, while Bashaara Graves contributed 13 and Taber Spani and Jasmine Jones each added a dozen. The Commodores improved to 17-9, 7-6 in SEC play, while the Gators fell to 15-12, 4-9 in league action. Clarke scored a game high 26 points while grabbing seven rebounds and blocking four shots. Lister scored 16 points, including 4-of-6 from three, while dishing out four assists. Heather Bowe contributed eight points, while fellow freshmen Jasmine Jenkins and Morgan Batey each added seven points. Florida was led by double-double efforts from Sydney Moss and Jennifer George. Moss scored 15 points and grabbed 10 boards, while also handing out four assists. George scored 13 points and pulled down 11 boards, while matching Moss'four helpers." "Tiffany and Jasmine (Lister) both showed up for the entire game," Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "When they show up for 40 minutes, we're going to be hard to beat." Play was back-and-forth early, as neither team led by more than two points until a Clarke basket put Vanderbilt up, 12-8, at the 10:52 mark. NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb became the school's all-time leader in career wins Thursday as the Commodores defeated Auburn, 59-44, on Senior Night at Memorial Gymnasium. With the win, Vanderbilt improved its win streak over Auburn to 20 games and moved to 19-9 overall and 9-6 in the SEC. Auburn dropped to 15-13 on the season and 4-11 in the league. The win was Balcomb's 257th in 11 seasons at Vanderbilt, surpassing the previous school record held by Jim Foster. The game also marked the final home game for three seniors, as Tiffany Clarke, Elan Brown and Gabby Smith were all recognized at center court for Senior Night. Clarke recorded her eighth double-double of the season with a game-high 22 points and 14 rebounds. Playing in her final home game as a Commodore, Clarke shot 6 -of-14 from the field and 10 -of- 12 from the free throw line. Clarke made and attempted more free throws than the entire Auburn team tonight ( $5-0 \mathrm{f}-9$ ). Jasmine Lister scored 12 of her 20 points in the second half to help the Commodores extend their lead late in the game. Lister shot 6 -of- 12 from the field and 5 -of-6 from the charity stripe. Auburn's zone defense gave the Commodores fits for a good portion of the night, as Vanderbilt turned the ball over 26 times and shot just 39 percent (16-of-41) from the field. However, Vanderbilt was able to get to the free throw line 27 times on the night, while converting 23-of-27 ( 85 percent). Despite forcing the 26 Vandy turnovers, Auburn couldn't translate them into points on the other end, as the Tigers scored just 15 points off turnovers. A major reason for that, Auburn shot just 31 percent (19-of-61) from the field and made just 1-of-14 (7 percent) from three-point range. Auburn had only one player score in double-figures on the night, as Tyrese Tanner scored 14 points and also pulled down six rebounds. Hasina Muhammad and Najat Ouardad each recorded four steals. As a team, the Tigers had 14 steals on the night. Vanderbilt led 27-18 at the half, but the Commodores were unable to shake free of the Tigers for much of the second half. Auburn pulled within three, $38-35$, with 10:07 to play, but that would be as close as it would get. Vanderbilt would go on and extend its lead to 12 with $3: 13$ to play. Lister led Vanderbilt with eight points at halftime, while Clarke added seven points and nine boards.

ATHENS, Ga. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team concluded its regular season with a $55-50$ setback at $\mathrm{N} 0.11 / 11$ Georgia Sunday. The Commodores finished the regular season at 19-10, 9-7 in SEC play, while the Lady Bulldogs conclude the year at 25-4, 12-4 in league action. The Vanderbilt effort was led by 17 points from Jasmine Lister. The junior guard added three assists. Senior forward Tiffany Clarke scored 13 points while grabbing nine rebounds. She played just 29 minutes due to foul trouble. Freshman guard Morgan Batey added nine points and nine rebounds. Georgia was led by 16 points and six rebounds from Jasmine Hassell. Jasmine James contributed 10 points and five assists. Shacobia Barbee added nine points and five boards. "They pressured us, got us back on our heels, and we weren't strong with the basketball," Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "They took us out of our timing on offense, so even when we got a good look, we didn't knock it down." Both teams got off to a slow offensive start, with Clarke scoring the first two points from the foul line at 18:42 of the first half. Clarke continued most the early scoring, helping Vanderbilt build a 10-4 lead early. The Lady Bulldogs responded with a 7-0 run to take their first lead at 11-10 and force Balcomb to take timeout at the 14:42 mark. Hassell then responded with eight points during a 12-2 run to help Georgia go up 25-15 with just over four minutes until the break. Vanderbilt went nearly seven minutes without a point during the stretch. The teams traded baskets early in the second half before a Griffin three put Georgia up 38-26, the Lady Bulldogs'largest lead of the game. Lister and Bowe scored back-to-back baskets, with the defensive plays in between seeing Clarke and Bowe take charges, as Vanderbilt cut it to eight, 38-30. After a few more baskets were traded, Batey came up with a steal and layup to cut it to 42-35. The run was halted when Erika Ford hit a jumper to push it to 44-37 on a play that saw Lister injure her shoulder, forcing the Commodores to play defense with four players. Lister did return, but not before Ford scored again to push the Georgia lead back to nine, 46-37. Jasmine James then pushed the Georgia lead to $12,50-38$, with $4: 02$ to play, forcing Vanderbilt to take another timeout. With Vanderbilt trailing by 10 with just over a minute remaining, Lister scored, followed by a Batey steal and another Lister score to cut it to 52-46. After Vanderbilt briefly had a steal, Brown turned it back over. Vanderbilt sent Armstrong to the line and she missed the front end of a one-and-one before Batey scored to make it 52-48. James then got in the open court and hit a layup to make it $54-48$ with just over 20 seconds remaining. A quick Clarke layup at the other end made it $54-50$ with 12.6 seconds left, as Vanderbilt took its last timeout. It took six seconds before Brown could foul Barbee with 6.5 left. She hit the first and missed the second, but Vanderbilt missed its final attempt and fell, 55-50.

DULUTH, Ga. - Vanderbilt overcame a slow offensive start to defeat Missouri, 53-40, and advance to the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament. The Commodores improved to 20-10 on the season, while the Tigers dropped to 17-14. Vanderbilt advances to play second-seeded Kentucky in tomorrow's quarterfinals. The win also gives the Commodores 20 victories for the 14th-consecutive season, including all 11 years under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. Vanderbilt was led by a double-double effort from Tiffany Clarke, playing in her native Duluth, Ga. The senior posted 14 points and 11 rebounds. Of her 14 points, 12 came in the second half. Christina Foggie also started to look like she is finally overcoming a knee injury suffered on February 10, scoring 12 points and shooting 3-of-6 from three-point range. The Missouri effort was led by center Liz Smith, who scored 16 points and grabbed eight rebounds. Balcomb was very pleased with the way her team continued to focus on the defensive end, in spite of the offensive struggles in the first half. "The ability to just play through it is very difficult", Balcomb said. "I thought we showed a lot of maturity with a combination of some upperclassmen but also a lot of underclassmen. I'm proud of the defense, the comeback and the resilience that we showed as a team in the second half." Lister was also thrilled to see her classmate and fellow guard, Foggie, hitting shots again. "It's great (having Foggie back)," Lister explained. "There's not as much pressure (on me) to shoot or score. I've always been comfortable playing with Foggie that she'll knock a shot down. There's more energy on the court when she's out there."The first half saw both teams struggle offensively. Vanderbilt shot just 17.1\% (6-35) from the floor and 2-10 from three-point range. Missouri managed just 18 field goal attempts in the opening period while turning the ball over 10 times. Smith helped the Tigers take a 17-16 advantage into the locker room, scoring 10 points in the first frame. Defensively, Smith also helped limit VU's Clarke, who entered the game with the league's third-best field goal percentage at $52.7 \%$, to 1-of-8 from the floor in the opening period. During the stretch, the Commodores got a jumper from Clarke, then three-pointers from Foggie and Lister on ensuing possessions to retake the lead, 27-26, with 11:17 to play. Foggie followed with another three, Clarke and Foggie each made layups, Foggie hit a foul shot and Clarke made a pair from the line before Missouri finally ended the drought on a three from Liene Priede with 6:08 to play, cutting the Vanderbilt lead to eight, 37-29. By then the damage was done, as after Vanderbilt's 18-0 run, Missouri would get no closer than eight in the closing minutes. The last Commodore field goal, a layup by Batey, made it 41-31 with $3: 59$ left. The Commodores then made 12 free throws over the final four minutes to provide the final margin of 53-40.

DULUTH，Ga．－Unlike its first round game with Missouri，the Vanderbilt women＇s basketball team was unable to overcome a slow offensive start and was eliminated from the SEC Tournament by second－seeded Kentucky， $76-65$ ．Vanderbilt（ $20-11$ ）was led by 24 points and 12 rebounds from Duluth native Tiffany Clarke．The senior forward averaged 19.0 points and 11.5 rebounds in two games at her final SEC Tournament．Jasmine Lister contributed 17 points and four assists．Kentucky（26－4）was led by 16 points from A＇dia Mathies．＂Kentucky＇s defense to start the game was really good，really aggressive，really physical and they created a lot of offense off their defense，＂Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said．＂Want to give them credit for how they came out and attacked us right away and put us on our heels．Then we just tried to fight back for the rest of the game．＂The first half saw the seventh－ranked Wildcats come out with a defensive intensity that forced Vanderbilt into 16 turnovers in the opening period，more than the Commodores had the entire game the previous night against Missouri．Off those turnovers，Kentucky scored 17 points．The second half looked early as if it would be more of the same，as Kentucky built a 22－point lead just over five minutes into the period．The Wildcats held Vanderbilt to just four points over the first 6 minutes of the second stanza．Then Vanderbilt began to show some life．With Kentucky leading $54-34$ with 12：29 remaining，Vanderbilt went on a $9-0$ run to cut the lead to 11，54－43．Foggie made a layup to start the run，which was followed by another layup from Lister，a jumper from Kendall Shaw and a three from Lister．Kastine Evans halted the run，connecting from beyond the arc for her only points of the game and pushing the Kentucky lead back to 14， 57－43．A free throw from Elan Brown cut it back to 13 with 7：57 remaining， but Vanderbilt could get no closer until the closing minute of the game． Clarke was not going to go silently in her home town，scoring 13 points over the final four minutes of the game，but it was too little，too late，and the Commodores fell， $76-65$ ．Vanderbilt shot $47.3 \%$ for the contest，while shooting $33.3 \%$ from three－point range．The Commodores were just 9－19 （47．4\％）from the foul line and turned it over 23 times．Kentucky outscored $\mathrm{VU}, 24-16$ ，off turnovers，offsetting a 40－26 Vanderbilt average on points in the paint．Kentucky＇s depth also kept the Commodores from fighting back．Head Coach Matthew Mitchell used 12 players in the game and continued his usual pattern of substituting for all five players on the court at one time．The UK bench outscored the Vanderbilt bench，32－12．Lister felt Vanderbilt＇s good stretches in the game came when the Commodores played solid defense．＂Our runs came from getting stops on defense，going slow，kicking out and playing like we know how to do，＂the point guard said．＂On the flip side，when we sped up and wanted to play like them，we turned the ball over and we weren＇t getting stops．＂

STORRS，Conn．－Vanderbilt kept its composure after losing a double－ digit second－half lead to advance to the second round of the NCAA tournament．Tiffany Clarke had 16 points and 12 rebounds to lead the Commodores（21－11）to a $60-54$ win Saturday over ninth－seeded Saint Joseph＇s．Jasmine Lister added 14 points for the No． 8 seed，which will play either top－seeded Connecticut or No． 16 seed Idaho on Monday night．＂It was ugly，but the first round，first game，usually is，＂＇Vanderbilt coach Melanie Balcomb said．＂In the end we made some clutch baskets down the stretch．＂Chatilla van Grinsven scored 14 points，all in the second half，for Saint Joseph＇s（23－9）．Natasha Cloud and IIze Gotfrida each chipped in 10 ．Vanderbilt led most of the way and was up 40－30 after Lister＇s 3－pointer with 15：54 to play．Saint Joseph＇s would not go away，tying it at 48 on a layup by Van Grinsven with 6：48 to go．She had six points in the 8－0 run that closed the gap．＂I tried to give it everything I had my senior year，my last game，＂Van Grinsven said．
But Heather Bowe＇s driving layup gave the Commodores the lead back， and Vanderbilt held it down the stretch．Van Grinsven cut the deficit back to two twice after offensive rebounds．But Lister＇s driving layup with 40 seconds left made it 58－54，and Van Grinsven fouled out with 28 seconds remaining．＂At that point，the game was going really，really fast and everybody was scrambling everywhere，＂Lister said．＂So it was a key that we all came together．＂Van Grinsven came in averaging 15 points and 10.5 rebounds but picked up two fouls less than 3 minutes into the game．She sat on the bench for the rest of the first half．Gotfrida made up for her absence，coming off the bench to score eight of the Hawks＇ first 15 points．The teams were tied at 25 before Vanderbilt went on an $8-2$ run to close the half．The Commodores outrebounded St．Joe＇s 47－32， a key because neither team shot well．Vanderbilt was just 22 for 59 from the floor but held the Hawks to 19 baskets in 55 attempts．＂They made a run，but we regrouped and we had confidence in ourselves，＂Clarke said．Vanderbilt is playing in its 14th straight NCAA tournament despite an injury－plagued season that forced Balcomb to use seven different starting lineups．Saint Joseph＇s was making its 12th NCAA tournament appearance，but its first since 2000．The Hawks beat top－seeded Dayton in the Atlantic 10 semifinals and won the championship game by a point over Fordham．The game was the 127th in the career of Saint Joseph＇s guard Ashley Prim，tying Michelle Baker＇s school record．Vanderbilt advanced to the second round of the tournament for the 13th time in the past 14 seasons but has been to the Final Four just once，in 1993.

STORRS，Conn．－Vanderbilt showed this season it can play with some very good offensive teams and other very good defensive teams in the Southeastern Conference．But it was no match Monday night for Connecticut．Kaleena Mosqueda－Lewis scored 22 points as the Huskies routed the Commodores $77-44$ in the second round of the NCAA Tournament．＂They are excellent at both ends of the floor，＂Vanderbilt coach Melanie Balcomb said．＂And that＇s what our team saw tonight and that＇s why you saw the big difference in scoring compared to the Texas A\＆Ms，the Kentuckys，and the Tennessees that we stayed with better．＂ Freshman Breanna Stewart added 14 points and Stefanie Dolson had 12 points and nine rebounds for the Huskies（31－4），who are seeking their sixth straight trip to the Final Four and eighth national championship． Tiffany Clarke had 16 points for Vanderbilt（21－12），which dropped three of its last six games．Kendall Shaw came off the bench to add 12 points for the Commodores．Vanderbilt had lost its starting center，Stephanie Holzer，in the preseason to a knee injury．And with sharp－shooter Christina Foggie（two points）limited by a late－season knee sprain，the Commodores just didn＇t have the depth to stay with UConn．＂When injury on top of injury came，we could have just gave up．＂Clarke said ＂I don＇t think we became the victim．I think we came closer together and fought through and proved a lot of people wrong because we made it here，and a lot of people had written us off．＂Connecticut focused on stopping point guard Jasmine Lister，who averages more than 34 minutes， 12 points and five assists a game．She finished with just two points and five turnovers．UConn forced 23 turnovers while committing 12．The Huskies also outrebounded Vanderbilt 34－24，holding Clarke to two boards．The Huskies led by 13 at halftime and opened the second half on a 17－0 run to put the game out of reach．＂I thought we competed until halftime，＂Balcomb said．＂Coming out of that locker room the first four minutes of the second half I felt like we were on our heels and they were very，very aggressive．＂UConn held Vanderbilt without a field goal for more than 7 minutes after intermission，and the Commodores missed 11 consecutive shots．UConn used stifling defense to hold Vanderbilt without a field goal for the first 4 minutes of the game and opened on an 8－1 run．Shaw，who averages only three points，came off the bench to hit her first three shots for the Commodores and the Huskies led just 14－9 at the second media timeout．UConn led 25－20 before scoring 12 straight points late in the first half．Mosqueda－Lewis tied the school record for $3 s$ during that run．

## Notable Accomplishments

- Jenni Benningfield was named a team captain for the 2003 USA Basketball Pan American Games squad that won a silver medal.
- Chantelle Anderson and Ashley McElhiney were teammates on the 2001 World University Games team that won a gold medal. Also working with the US team were Vanderbilt managers Kristen Carter and Chanell Sutton. Carter and Sutton worked the training camps in Colorado Springs while Sutton traveled with the team to China.
- Zuzi Klimesova competed in the 2001 World University Games for her native Czech Republic and won a bronze medal. Her complete statistics were not available, but she did total 19 rebounds and nine points in a $91-71$ win over Lithuania for the bronze medal.
- Sheri Sam was selected to the 10 -member senior College All-Star team which played an exhibition game against the USA Basketball Women's National Team on April 6, 1996. Sam led the All-Stars with 18 points, second only to USA's Lisa Leslie with 28, and was the second-leading rebounder with four.
- Karen Booker played on the 1991 US World University Games team and won a gold medal. She averaged 5.3 points and 4.8 rebounds a game. She also totaled 11 steals.

## Wendy Scholtens • 1990

Wendy Scholtens, a 6-4 center from Ft. Smith Arkansas, holds the Vanderbilt record for most rebounds in a career. She holds a total of 15 Commodore records, including all of the free throw categories. She was the SEC Freshman of the Year and earned All-SEC honors three times, while earning All-SEC Academic Honors twice. She was also selected SEC Player of the Week eight times. She is the only woman at Vanderbilt to have her jersey retired. She was inducted into the Tennessee Sports
Hall of Fame in 1999 and Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in 2009.

## Heidi Gillingham • 1993

Heidi Gillingham, a 6-8 center from Floresville, Texas, holds six Vanderbilt records, including an SEC record 131 blocks in a season. Gillingham is the tallest player in Vanderbilt history. She was a three-time All-SEC first team selection and was chosen SEC Player of the Week once. She was selected to the 1993 NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team and was named Sports Illustrated National Player of the Week. She was also named Homecoming Queen at Vanderbilt. She was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame in 2000 and Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in 2010.

## Sheri Sam • 1996

Sheri Sam, a 6-1 forward from Duson, La., is the third Kodak All-American from Vanderbilt. Sam ranks in five statistical categories and totaled double digits in scoring in 77 games and in rebounding in 22 games. Sam was a Naismith Finalist in 1996 and was named to the 1996 NCAA Tournament AllRegional Team.

## Chantelle Anderson • 2002, 2003

Chantelle Anderson is Vanderbilt's first two-time Kodak All-American earning the honor her junior and senior seasons. She was the first Commodore to earn SEC Player of the Year honors (2002) and was also named ESPN The Magazine Center of the Year. She was named MVP of the NCAA Midwest Regional and was a Naismith Finalist in 2001, 2002 and 2003. As a sophomore, the 6-6 center from Vancouver, Wash., set the NCAA record for field goal percentage connecting on 292-404 from the field for a 72.3 percentage. She is also the VU career leader in points with 2,604 points. She was inducted into the Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in 2008.

## MEMORIAL GYM

The Southeastern Conference's most historic home for college basketball, Memorial Gymnasium serves as the home court for the Vanderbilt Commodores. Dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II, the arena was built as a combination gymnasium and concert hall by the late master architect Edwin Keeble.

Six decades later, the unique style of Memorial Gymnasium - with its benches situated on the baseline, a playing court that sits above portions of the crowd and deafening acoustics - continues to make the Commodores' home a dreaded stop for opponents. "Memorial Magic," with its capacity crowds, overflowing student section and lively pep band have assisted in numerous Commodore victories. In the stands, fans across Middle Tennessee have helped Memorial Gymnasium (capacity 14,326 ) rank among the NCAA's Top 30 attendance leaders on numerous occassions.

On the floor, Vanderbilt has a 426-96 record at home, winning 81.6 percent of its games. Vanderbilt has never had a losing season at home and under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb, Vanderbilt has won 84.1 percent (143-27) of its home games. The Commodores finished 12-2 at home last season and have not lost more than four games at home since finishing 9-5 during the 1998-99 season.

When the 2012-13 season tipped off, Memorial Gym featured a new video board, installed during the summer of 2012. The display, manufactured by Utah's Young Electric Sign Company, features four screens that measure 16 feet by 9 feet and includes a 2 foot tall LED display that wraps around the bottom of the board.

Before the 2008-09 season, Vanderbilt's locker rooms, the video room, the training room and media room were renovated and are now state-of-the-art. The floor was also replaced before the 08-09 season. During the 2009-10 season, the building received new championship banners.

In 2002, a $\$ 25$ million renovation of Memorial Gymnasium was completed, highlighted by yet another one-of-a-kind feature. Connected to the facility sits a new practice gym that includes a three cross-court playing floor, coaching offices, a donor room and a Hall of Champions. Other aspects of the renovation included upgrades of the seating areas, private suites, a new lighting and sound system and a new court design.

In all, Memorial Gym has been expanded three times. Constructed with a seating capacity of 6,583 , the University saw its first need to increase seating in 1965 with the addition of two north-side balconies. Two years later, a pair of balancing balconies were erected on the south side of the gym and dubbed "The Balconies That Clyde Lee Built."

Capacity has fluctuated throughout the history of the building. It reached its highest number of 15,646 in 1969 when 4,000 seats were added in the east and west ends. When chairback seats in the end zones and suites on the north side were installed in the late 1990s capacity lowered to 14,168 . Prior to last season, university officials removed portions of media press row on the south side in an effort to expand the student section by nearly 150 seats. Official capacity for the 2012-13 season will be 14,326 .
