TOURNAMENT MAINSTAYS

Plain and simple: The Commodores have become a fixture in the NCAA Tournament.

By receiving an at-large bid to this year's tournament, the Commodores have now been a part of March Madness for 15 consecutive seasons, including making 12 straight apperances since the arrival of head coach Melanie Balcomb in 2002.

Here's a closer look at the Commodores' rich tradition at the NCAA Tournament:

- Have made 26 tournament appearances in team history, including 24 of the past 25 seasons.
- Have compiled a total of 39 tournament victories.
- Have won at least one tournament game in 10 of the past 11 seasons.
- Earned a No. 8 seed in last year's tournament, and defeated No. 9-seeded St. Joseph's 60-54. Vanderbilt then fell to eventual national champion UConn, 77-44, in the second round.
- Have made 14 trips to regional semifinals in the program's history, including four times under Balcomb.
- Advanced to Final Four in 1993.
- The 26 tournament appearances by Vanderbilt is the third most in the SEC, behind only Tennessee and Georgia.

EARNING THEIR BID

The Commodores earned an at-large bid to this year's tournament by virtue of an impressive resumé that included a win over in-state rival Tennessee in January.

Here's a look at Vanderbilt's streaks and surges this season:

- Defeated three ranked opponents in the span of 17 days by beating No. 19 Georgia, 66-58, on Jan. 2, beating No. 8 Tennessee, 74-63, on Jan. 12 and beating No. 14 LSU, 79-70, on Jan. 19.
- Put together a nine-game winning streak from Nov. 24 through Jan. 4.
- Winning streak featured victories over Dayton, Wisconsin, and Georgia.
- Earned an impressive road win at James Madison (25-5) on Dec. 18, handing the Dukes their only home loss of the season.
- Won five of six road games from Dec. 15 through Jan. 16, with wins over Hartford, James Madison, UAB, Ole Miss and Auburn.
- Posted a 13-1 record from Nov. 24 through Jan. 25 -- a stretch that included a 74-63 victory over then-No. 8-ranked Tennessee
- Opened SEC play with five wins in first six games.

VANDERBILT'S NCAA TOURNAMENT RESULTS

NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

The Commodores kept their name on the national radar throughout the season in a variety of ways.

In early January, the Commodores knocked off four ranked teams. Then, the Commodores broke into the ranking themselves.

Here's a look at how Vanderbilt has done at the poils this season.

- Climbed as high as No. 16 in the AP poll and held that spot for two consecutive weeks (Jan. 20 and 27) and moved into that spot again on Feb. 10.
- Spent five consecutive weeks ranked in the AP poll -- at No. 24 (Jan. 13), No. 16 (Jan. 20 & Jan. 27), No. 18 (Feb. 3) and No. 16 again (Feb. 10).
- Received votes in AP poll six times -- in the preseason poll, Nov. 11, Nov. 18, Jan. 6, Feb. 17 and Feb.
- Spent six consecutive weeks -- and seven weeks overall -- ranked in the USA Today poll. Were ranked No. 25 in the Nov. 11 poll, then returned to the poll at No. 25 on Jan. 13, No. 19 on Jan. 20, No. 18 on Jan. 27, No. 19 on Feb. 3, No. 20 on Feb. 10, and No. 25 on Feb.
- Was either ranked or received votes in the USA Today poll every week from the preseason poll through Feb. 24.

EXAMANING THE ROSTER

Here's a closer look at the Vanderbilt roster:

- Features two of the most dynamic players in the nation -- senior Christina Foggie, the most prolific 3-point shooter in the program's history, and senior Jasmine Lister, the most durable player to ever wear a Vanderbilt jersey.
- Team has dealt with adversity this season, including losing freshman star Rebekah Dahlman for the year in mid-December, Dahlman, a former McDonald's All-American and the all-time prep scoring leader in Minnesota history, had multiple procedures after being diagnosed with a blood clot. She started the first nine games of the season and led the SEC in 3-point percentage at the time of her injury. She was averaging 11.4 points per game.
- The team also lost sophomore Heather Bowe in late February. Bowe, who started the first 21 games of the season, is no longer enrolled for the spring semester after a violation of academic policy.
- Foggie and Lister are the anchors of a very young team, which features a total of just three upperclassmen (Foggie, Lister and junior Kady Schrann). Freshman Kylee Smith and Marqu'es Webb have both played big minutes this season.

LEAVING A LEGACY

Vanderbilt seniors Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie will be competing in the NCAA tournament for the fourth -- and final -- time in their storied careers.

The backcourt duo has left an indeliable mark on Commodore basketball and they each rank among Vanderbilt's all-time leaders in numerous categories.

Foggie, who won the SEC's regular-season scoring title this season for the second time in her career, is the program's all-time leader in career 3-pointers (274). She ranks seventh on the school's all-time scoring list (1,727), and is averaging 19.1 points per game this season.

Foggie has scored in double figures in all but two games this year, including every SEC game (plus one game in the SEC tournament). She has reached double figures in 85 games in her career, including scoring 20 or more points in 32 games. (She has reached that mark 14 times this season).

Lister has started 128 consecutive games -- every game in her career -- and is Vanderbilt's all-time leader in minutes played by a wide margin. She ranks third on the program's all-time list for assists and recently moved into the Top-10 on Vanderbilt's all-time scoring list.

Lister is averaging 13.9 points per game this season and leads the team in assists (140). She was named espnW's national player of the week on Jan. 12. That same week, she was named the SEC's Player of the Week and the USBWA Player of the Week.

Foggie was one of 30 players named to Naismith Award midseason watch list in January. She was among the 50 players who were named to preseason Naismith watch list, and then remained on the list when it was trimmed to 30.

Foggie is also on the watch list for two other honors -- the Dawn Staley award and the Wade Trophy.

She is joined by Lister on the Staley watch list.

SEEKING MOMENTUM

Vanderbilt traditionally enters the NCAA Tournament with plenty of March momentum. This year, the Commodores are trying to create some.

The Commodores have endured a rough stretch over the past several weeks, and they come into the tournament on a four-game losing skid after dropping their final three regular-season games and then falling to Georgia in the SEC Tournament.

Vanderbilt has posted a 2-9 record since Jan. 25 after going 16-3 prior to that point. Seven of the losses came by six points or less and were decided in the final minute.

FOGGIE IS SEC'S TOP SCORER

Vanderbilt senior Christina Foggie won the SEC's regular-season scoring title, and she enters today game averaging 19.1 points per game. She has scored in double figures in all but two of Vanderbilt's games this season, including scoring 10 or more points in every SEC game.

Foggie also won the SEC scoring title as a sophomore, when she averaged 17.7 points per game.

FOGGIE, LISTER NAMED ALL-SEC SECOND TEAM

Vanderbilt seniors Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie were both named to the All-SEC Second Team when the conference announced its postseason awards voted on by the SEC's coaches.

South Carolina's Dawn Staley, Tiffany Mitchell and Alaina Coates were named Coach, Player and Freshman of the Year, respectively.

The All-SEC First Team selections were: Tyrese Tanner, Auburn; Jaterra Bonds, Florida; Theresa Plaisance, LSU; Martha Alwal, Mississippi State; Bri Kulas, Missouri; Aleighsa Welch, South Carolina; Tiffany Mitchell, South Carolina; Meighan Simmons, Tennessee; Isabelle Harrison, Tennessee; and Courtney Walker, Texas A&M.

Named to the Second Team along with Lister and Foggie were: Jessica Jackson, Arkansas; Shacobia Barbee, Georgia; Jennifer O'Neill, Kentucky; DeNesha Stallworth, Kentucky; Tia Faleru, Ole Miss; Valencia McFarland, Ole Miss; Alaina Coates, South Carolina; and Courtney Williams, Texas A&M.

BOWE TO MISS REMAINDER OF SEMESTER; GAFFNEY DEBUTS FOR COMMODORES

Vanderbilt announced on Feb. 27 that sophomore Heather Bowe would not be enrolled in school for the remainder of the spring semester due to a violation of university academic policy. She is expected to return to class and the team this summer.

Bowe had seen action in 27 games this season, and had made 21 starts. She was averaging 5.1 points and 4.3 rebounds.

Vanderbilt redshirt freshman Kristen Gaffney made her debut for the Commodores on Feb. 27, seeing five minutes of action against Florida. She then logged 29 minutes of action in the regular-season finale against Kentucky.

Gaffney, who has been sidelined by knee injuries since the beginning of last season, scored six points with five rebounds and three assists against the Wildcats.

Gaffney played 18 minutes and had seven rebounds in Vanderbilt's loss to Georgia in the SEC Tournament.

CHANGING THINGS UP

The Commodores have altered the starting lineup several times this season, using a total of five different combinations.

In the past two games, seniors Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister -- who have started all 30 games -- were joined by sophomore Morgan Batey and freshmen Kylee Smith and Marqu'es Webb to form the Commodores starting five.

Batey received her first starting assignments of the season on Dec. 21 against UNC Asheville, and has started each game since then (a stretch of 18 games). Smith, meanwhile, has been in the starting lineup a total of four times -- twice in December and again for the past two games.

Junior Kady Schrann was in the starting lineup from Dec. 21 through Feb. 27. Webb returned to the starting lineup on Feb. 2 -- for the first time since Dec. 3 -- and started each of the next six games. She also started the first nine games of the year.

Smith and sophomore Jasmine Jenkins were each given their first starting assignments of the season against Hartford (Dec. 15) and were in the lineup again in the win over JMU (Dec. 18).

Prior to the Hartford game, Vanderbilt's starting lineup had consisted of Dahlman, Foggie, Lister, Bowe and Webb in each of the first nine games.

AMONG THE BEST

Despite their recent cold snap, the Commodores continue to rank among the naton's best in field goal percentage and 3-point percentage.

The Commodores are shooting 40.2 percent from the 3-point range, the best mark in the SEC. Vanderbilt also ranks third in the conference in field goal percentage (45.9).

The Commodores have ranked among the top-10 nationally in both categories throughout the season.

OH SO CLOSE

The Commodores just keep finding themselves locked in tight games. And lately, the end result hasn't been good for Vanderbilt.

Dating back to Jan. 26, Vanderbilt has been involoved in nine games that have been decided by six points or less -- and the Commodores have dropped seven of those games. Here's a brief recap of the Commodores' recent string of last-minute decisions:

Vanderbilt vs. South Carolina, Jan. 26 -- Trailing by two points, the Commodores committed a turnover with 35 seconds to play, and South Carolina's Tiffany Mitchell converted a layup to push South Carolina's lead to four points. The Gamecocks held on from there for a 61-57 win.

Vanderbilt at Missouri, Jan. 30 -- Trailing by 16 points with just under nine minutes left, the Commodores staged a frantic rally and trimmed the deficit to 55-54 on a three-point play by Kylee Smith with 52 seconds left. After forcing a Missouri turnover, the Commodores had the ball with a chance to take the lead, but a traveling violation with 17 seconds left gave the ball to the Tigers. After Missouri hit two free throws, the Commodores had a chance to tie, but Jasmine Lister's 3-pointer spun off the rim with seven seconds left. Missouri then hit two free throws for a 59-54 win.

Vanderbilt at Texas A&M, Feb. 2 -- In a contest that featured one big basket after the next, Texas A&M's Karla Gilbert converted a three-point play with 10 seconds left to tie the game at 69-69. On Vanderbilt's ensuing possession, Morgan Batey was fouled with 2.9 seconds to play. Batey made both free throws to give the Commodores a 71-69 lead. Texas A&M then had one final shot, but a desperation 3-pointer at the buzzer hit the rim and came off.

Vanderbilt vs. Auburn, Feb. 13 -- After Christina Foggie tied the game with two free throws with 39 seconds left, Auburn's Tyrese Tanner scored on a jumper with 24 seconds remaining to put the Tigers ahead, 64-62. Foggie then missed a 3-pointer on the Commodores' next possession and Auburn hit four straight free throws in the final 15 seconds to beat Vanderbilt, 68-62.

Vanderbilt vs. Miss. State, Feb. 16 -- Christina Foggie tied the game at 62-62 with a fade-away jumper with 15 seconds to play, but Miss. State's Martha Alwal scored in the paint with three seconds left to give the Bulldogs the lead. Vanderbilt then had one final possession, but did not get a shot off and suffered a 64-62 loss.

Vanderbilt vs. Arkansas, Feb. 20 -- With Vanderbilt nursing a two-point lead, the Commodores had the ball in the final minute, but committed a turnover with 28 seconds left. Arkansas then had two chances to tie, but misfired on a pair of open shots, including one from inside the paint. Foggie then hit two free throws with 2.2 seconds left to extend the lead to 64-60 and the Commodores stole the inbound pass and Lister converted a layup at the buzzer for a 66-60 win.

Vanderbilt at Alabama, Feb. 23 -- Trailing by nine points with 5:56 to go, the Commodores rallied and found themselves trailing by just two points, 64-62, after a layup by Heather Bowe with 44 seconds to play. But Alabama's Daisha Simmons hit a clutch jumper with 14 seconds left, giving the Tide a 66-62 lead, and they held on from there.

Florida at Vanderbilt, Feb. 27 -- After opening the game in a shooting funk that resulted in a 23-6 deficit, the Commodores spent the rest of the evening clawing their way back into the game. A fade-away jumper by Foggie with seven seconds left brought the Commodores within three points, but Florida's Carlie Needles sealed the win with a pair of free throws.

Vanderbilt at Kentucky, March 2 -- In a contest in which the teams were never seperated by more than six points in the second half, the Commodores almost pulled out a dramatic win. Vanderbilt trailed 64-58 with 28 seconds left before Foggie hit a 3-pointer to trim the Wildcats' lead to 64-61. Lister then stole the ensuing inbound pass, and Foggie was fouled. She made both free throws to pull Vanderbilt within 64-63 with 13 seconds left. After Kentucky's Bria Goss made 1-of-2 at the line, the Commodores had one final possession, but Jasmine Jenkins' tough shot at the buzzer missed the mark.

LISTER IS DIFFERENCE MAKER

There is no denying how important Jasmine Lister's offensive output is for Vanderbilt.

Lister has reached double figures in 20 games this season, and the Commodores have gone 15-5 in those games. Vanderbilt has gone just 3-7 when Lister is help below 10 points.

Taking it a step further, Vanderbilt is 9-2 this season when Lister scores 15 or more points. (The two defeats both came on the road against Top-15-ranked oppponents -- a loss to Duke in November and a three-point loss at Kentucky in a contest that wasn't decided until the final minute).

DAHLMAN TO MISS REMAINDER OF SEASON

Vanderbilt recently announced that freshman Rebekah Dahlman will miss the remainder of the season after she underwent surgery on Feb. 5.

Dahlman was diagnosed with a blood clot in her right shoulder in December, and has since had multiple procedures.

She was in the starting lineup for Vanderbilt's first nine games -- averaging 11.4 points per game -- but has not seen action since the Commodores' win over East Tennessee State on Dec. 3. She was leading the SEC and ranked 10th in the nation in 3-point percentage at 51.4 percent (18-of-35) at the time of her injury.

Dahlman was a McDonald's All-America as a senior at Braham Area High (Braham, Minn.). She set the state's all-time scoring record with 5,060 career points.

HEY, WATCH THIS

Vanderbilt senior Christina Foggie was one of 30 players named to Naismith Award midseason watch list.

She was among the 50 players who were named to preseason Naismith watch list, and then remained on the list when it was trimmed to 30.

Foggie is also on the watch list for two other honors -- the Dawn Staley award and the Wade Trophy.

She is joined by teammate Jasmine Lister on the Staley watch list.

LISTER EARNS COMMUNITY SERVICE HONOR

Vanderbilt senior guard Jasmine Lister was recently named to the SEC Women's Basketball Community Service Team.

Lister earned her spot on the team after serving a two-month internship last summer at the Magdalene House -- a residential program for women recovering from addiction, prostitution and trafficking.

BALCOMB IS NO. 1 ON THE LIST

Vanderbilt coach Melanie Balcomb, now in her 12th season with the Commodores, was honored before the Appalachian State game on Nov. 8 for becoming the school's all-time wins leader in last year's regular season home finale.

Balcomb became the career wins leader with Vanderbilt's 59-44 win over Auburn on Feb. 28, 2013. The win was Balcomb's 257th of her career, and enabled her to surpass former VU coach Jim Foster.

"It wasn't anything I was looking forward to or shooting at, but at the same time, it (is) nice to be recognized," said Balcomb. "The reason I came here was because of the tradition of success that the coaches before me had. "So it was an honor to be able to surpass the things that had been done here, and that obviously was something that I felt good about."

Balcomb led her Vanderbilt teams to 20 or more wins in each of her first 11 seasons, and the Commodores have advanced to the NCAA tournament each year.

Her success has enabled Vanderbilt to underscore its reputation as one of the premiere programs in the nation.

"When you say Vanderbilt, you want (people) to think of the Vanderbilt's women's program," she said.

SUDDENLY SEEING 'MO' POINTS

Vanderbilt sophomore Morgan Batey has proven that there is more to her game than rebounding.

The native of Atlanta has been producing plenty of points in recent games. She scored a career-high 18 points in Vanderbilt's win over Arkansas, finishing 8-of-14 from the floor and 2-of-3 from the foul line.

Batey, who leads the team in rebounding, also did her normal work on the glass, collecting six rebounds to share team-high honors with Kady Schrann in that category.

Just four days earlier, Batey had her first career double-double, scoring 14 points with 11 rebounds against Miss. State.

Batey also showcased her offensive skills in the win over Texas A&M earlier this month. She scored 17 points in the victory, including hitting the game-winning free throws with two seconds remaining.

Going into the Alabama game, Batey was averaging 8.5 points per game in SEC play, and shooting 53 percent from the floor in those games.

EXCITING CLASS

Reaping the rewards of tireless recruiting efforts, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team announced one of the best signing classes in the program's history in November.

Head coach Melanie Balcomb, along with recruiting coordinator Kim Rosamond, landed a collection of five talent-rich players who represent the No. 9 class in the nation, according to Blue Star Report. It marks the second consecutive season in which the Commodores have put together a Top-10 ranked class.

This year's group includes Paris Kea (Greensboro, N.C.), Rachel Bell (Cumberland Furnace), Christa Reed (Bay St. Louis, Miss.,) and twin sisters Audrey-Ann and Khaléann Caron-Goudreau (Gatineau, Quebec).

Here's a closer look at the signees:

** Kea, an explosive 5-foot-8 point guard from Page High in Greensboro, N.C., was one of the most sought-after recruits in the nation. She was named the North Carolina Player of the Year last season by the Greensboro News & Record and GreensboroSports.com. She averaged 14.2 points and 7.4 assists per game as a junior.

*** Bell, a 5-foot-10 combo guard, is rated the No. 37 overall player by Blue Star Report. As a junior, Bell averaged 20.4 points and 5.5 rebounds per game last season at nearby Creek Wood High, helping the team post a 27-5 record in 2012-13 and earn a spot in sub-state Sweet 16.

** Reed, a 5-foot-11 combo guard, averaged 24.3 points and 4.8 rebounds per game last season while leading Bay High to a 36-0 record and the Mississippi Class 4A State Championship. The gifted shooter was the Gatorade Player of the Year last season in her home state.

** Twin sisters Audrey-Ann and Khaléann Caron-Goudreau, natives of Gatineau, Quebec, are 6-3 forwards from IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla. Combining for 30 points per game last season -- with Audrey-Ann averaging 15.4 and Khaléann adding 14.9 -- they helped IMG Academy roll up a 42-8 record under head coach Shell Dailey.

Prior to joining IMG, the twins were selected as members of Canada's U-17 Women's National Team after helping the SSF Blizzard to the Canadian Juvenile-AAA State Championship.

"I love the balance we were able to achieve with this group of signees," said Balcomb. "We have answered every need with five players who I feel can come in and make a significant impact as freshmen.

"Each one is very versatile and brings a number of different gifts to the table," she said. "This class, combined with the players we will have returning, gives our program everything we need to compete at the highest level. Memorial Gym is going to be an exciting place to watch basketball for the next several years.

"These are not only outstanding players, they are outstanding young women," Balcomb said. "They all come from fantastic families, and we will be proud to have them represent Vanderbilt on and off the floor."

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know former Vanderbilt star Caroline Williams is not only one of the most accurate 3-point shooters in Commodore history, but is also among the best of all time?

Williams, who played at VU from 2003-2007, shot 46.5 percent from long range for her career, which is the fifth highest mark in the history of women's college basketball.



It is the best-ever career mark by an SEC player.

Williams played 115 career games at Vanderbilt, and made 238 of her 512 attempts from 3-point range.

She trails only Notre Dame's Alicia Ratay (47.6), Samford's Emily London (47.4), Harvard's Erin Mahler (46.7) and Houston's Jana Crosby (46.7) on the NCAA's all-time list for 3-point accuracy.

MELANIE BALCOMB

Head Coach, 12th season

Vanderbilt women's basketball has been a model of consistency during head coach Melanie Balcomb's 12 seasons in Nashville.

The numbers speak for themselves — 12 NCAA Tournaments, 11 campaigns of at least 20 wins, three SEC Tournament Championships, four Sweet 16 trips and eight top-25 finishes under Balcomb, who is the all-time winningest coach in Vanderbilt women's basketball history.

Entering this season, Balcomb is averaging 23.5 wins per season during her tenure in Nashville. On February 28, 2013, against Auburn, Balcomb secured her 257th victory, passing Jim Foster for the program's wins record in exactly as many seasons as the former Commodore coach.

Balcomb's name is also showing up on some of the most exclusive lists in women's basketball. She is one of just five coaches, joining Connecticut's Geno Auriemma, Stanford's Tara VanDerveer, Notre Dame's Muffet McGraw and Georgia's Andy Landers, to lead the same program to each of the last 11 NCAA Tournaments. Balcomb is also the second longest-tenured coach in the Southeastern Conference (behind Landers) and currently serves on the USA Basketball Girls National Junior Team committee alongside Foster, California coach Lindsay Gottlieb, Central Florida coach Joi Williams and 2008 Olympic gold medalist Kara Lawson.

Over her 11 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has coached eight WNBA draft picks, a WBCA National Defensive Player of the Year (Jennifer Risper), a WBCA National Scholar-Athlete of the Year (Christina Wirth) and an SEC scoring champion (Christina Foggie), while graduating 100% of her four-year players.

With 20 years of collegiate head coaching experience, Balcomb is a renowned offensive strategist. Her 11 seasons at Vanderbilt have only enhanced that reputation. Every Commodore squad has finished in the top-50 nationally in field goal percentage, averaging a finish of 11.1 in the country (including four teams that have finished nation's top four). Balcomb's inaugural Commodore team in 2002-03 led the nation in field goal percentage, shooting 51.3%.

The Commodores have shot just as well from three-point range, averaging a top-20 finish in three-point percentage among Division I teams with top-50 finishes every season. Balcomb's 2006-07 squad led the nation in three-point shooting at 43.7%. The Commodores have finished in the top-10 nationally in field-goal percentage seven times and in the top-10 in three-point field-goal percentage six times under Balcomb. Her teams have also finished in the top five in assists per game, free-throw percentage and scoring offense.

Balcomb's teams have been especially successful at home, where Vanderbilt has posted a 143-27 (.841) record at Memorial Gym coming into the 2013-14 season.

Balcomb's success as a head coach is not limited to Vanderbilt. Before arriving at Vanderbilt, Balcomb had successful coaching tenures at Ashland (Ohio) and Xavier. She picked up her 400th career win in the opening round of the 2011 SEC Tournament.

Her 2012-13 squad dealt with serious injury problems, but still won over 20 games and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The team returned over 97% of its scoring, but played stretches without half of that firepower. Three starters — Stephanie Holzer, Christina Foggie and Kady Schrann — combined to miss 60 games, but a combination of seniors Tiffany Clarke and Elan Brown, junior Jasmine Lister and five freshmen. The Commodores scored a pair of huge wins at Florida and over No. 10 Texas A&M late in the year to solidify their 14th straight NCAA Tournament bid.

Clarke led the team in scoring (16.6) and rebounding (8.4) to earn First Team All-SEC honors from the league's coaches, the 11th time a Balcomb coached player has done so. Clarke also earned first team all-conference honors from the Associated Press and All-Region recognition from the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Vanderbilt won its first round game over ninth-seeded Saint Joseph's, giving Balcomb a 10-1 record in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores fell in the second round to top-seeded Connecticut, capping the season at 21-12.

Balcomb started at Vanderbilt in 2002 and wasted no time in implementing her own style of winning. Working to transition veteran players into a new system while building new team chemistry, Balcomb's first year saw the Commodores win six of their last seven regular season games, earn an NCAA Tournament berth, and lead the nation in field goal percentage (51.3) against the fourth toughest schedule in the country. She was named a finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year award.

In 2003-04, Balcomb led the Commodores to their fourth Southeastern Conference Tournament title. She masterfully balanced strong upper-class leadership with exciting freshmen talent, winning 10 consecutive games and advancing to the program's 11th Sweet 16 appearance. One year later, her team made its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Commodores posted the most wins (10) in the program's history in Southeastern Conference play finishing with a 10-4 record.

The Commodores were ranked seventh in the final AP poll of the 2006-07 season, and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament after winning another SEC Tournament title. That Vanderbilt squad was the nation's best three-point shooting team, and ranked among the top 10 in points scored. The team's 28-6 mark was the best record for a VU squad in 14 years

The 2008 season was also one of Balcomb's most impressive coaching jobs. Despite graduating three All-SEC seniors, she led the Commodores to a 25-9 record and the school's 13th appearance in the NCAA sweet 16, all with two freshmen and no seniors in the starting lineup.

In 2009, Vanderbilt won its sixth SEC Tournament title, the third for Balcomb in the last six years. The team also advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 14th time in school history -- Balcomb's fourth trip with the Commodores. Vanderbilt finished the year ranked No. 8 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll after narrowly missing an upset of No. 1 seed Maryland in the Raleigh Regional Semifinal.

National accolades came flooding in for Vanderbilt, including senior Jennifer Risper being named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Defensive Player of the Year. Risper and classmate Christina Wirth, who herself was named an All-American and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, were both selected in the 2009 WNBA Draft. In 2010 Balcomb was faced with one of her most challenging tasks. Faced with replacing National Defensive Player of the Year Jennifer Risper and All-American Christina Wirth,

Balcomb guided an undersized team back to the NCAA Tournament, where they narrowly missed advancing to their third consecutive sweet 16.

Despite having to overcome numerous injuries throughout out the season and a size disadvantage in almost every game, Vanderbilt finished the season 23-11 overall. Individually, Balcomb helped junior point guard Jence Rhoads earn first team All-SEC honors, while senior shooting guard Merideth Marsh earned second team All-SEC accolades

The 2010-11 season featured many obstacles that Balcomb successfully maneuvered through to reach another NCAA Tournament and finish third in the SEC. Injuries took an unfortunate toll on the team throughout the year with at least one of Vanderbilt's five leading scorers unavailable for 14 out of the team's 32 games. Injuries coupled with matching Georgia for the fewest upperclassmen in the SEC challenged Balcomb to use different personnel groupings regularly.

Despite the challenges, Balcomb again reached 20 wins, finishing 20-12 and 10-6 in the SEC. Individually, Balcomb helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention All-America honors from the Associated Press in addition to first team All-SEC recognition. Rhoads was also a WBCA Region 3 All-American. Freshman center Stephanie Holzer was named honorable mention All-SEC, SEC Sixth Woman of the Year and to the SEC All-Freshmen team. Freshman point guard Jasmine Lister was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. In 10 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has won 13 games in the NCAA Tournament, including a 9-1 mark in the opening round. She holds a winning percentage of 65.7 against SEC opponents. In all, Balcomb owns series advantages over 10 of the 11 other schools in the SEC before 2012.

The 2011-12 season saw one of Balcomb's youngest teams, as the squad of 11 featured just one senior, yet she still successfully steered the Commodores to a 23-10 mark and a 13th-straight NCAA Tournament. Leading the way was break-out star Christina Foggie, who became the first Balcomb player to lead the SEC in scoring (17.7 ppg).

Foggie was a First Team All-SEC selection and was joined by four other Commodores earning All-SEC honors - Jasmine Lister (second team), Tiffany Clarke (second team), Stephanie Holzer (honorable mention) and Kady Schrann (All-Freshman).

Vanderbilt defeated three ranked opponents on the season (No. 12 Oklahoma, No. 17 Georgia and No. 11 Tennessee), earning a seven seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores hosted at Memorial Gym, defeating 10th-seeded Middle Tennessee in the first round before falling to second-seeded Duke.

Before arriving at Vanderbilt, the Cranbury, N.J., native spent seven seasons at Xavier University. Beginning in 1995, her up-tempo style wreaked havoc on the Atlantic 10 while building the Musketeers into a national contender. In 1998, Xavier recorded its second post- season appearance in school history with a selection to the Women's National Invitational Tournament. Each of the next three seasons, Xavier competed in the NCAA Tournament, capped in 2001 by a victory over perennial power Tennessee and a run to the Elite Eight. En route to earning three invitations to the NCAA Tournament and compiling a 136-78 record during her tenure, Balcomb's offensive schemes helped push Xavier onto the national stage. Musketeer field-goal percentages ranked among the top three in the nation during three different seasons while the 1999 squad led the country in 3-point accuracy at 40.1 percent. Her 2000-01 squad averaged 79.4 points per game, the highest total in program history. Individual records were rewritten as well. Of the 15 Musketeers who have scored at least 1,000 points in a career, six of them played on Balcomb-coached teams.

Before her accomplishments at Xavier, Balcomb took her first head coaching position at Ashland University. Prosperity was immediate as Balcomb's first unit matched the best record in school history at 18-9 while registering its first winning season in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with an 11-7 mark.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Balcomb served three years as an assistant at Providence College (1990-93), during which the Friars went 62-30, made two NCAA Tournament appearances and once (1990-91) led the nation in scoring while they amassed a 26-6 record. In 1989-90, Balcomb was an assistant at Ohio University and she began her coaching career with a four-year stint (1985-89) on the staff at Niagara University. In all, Balcomb has coached 19 players who have received All-SEC accolades. Nine of her players have been drafted by the WNBA, including VU's Chantelle Anderson, Ashley McElhiney, Jenni Benningfield, Ashley Earley, Carla Thomas, Dee Davis and Christina Wirth. Her Xavier teams won two league tournament titles (2000 and 2001) and one regular-season championship in the Atlantic 10 Conference (2001).

Xavier's successes during the Balcomb era helped push for construction of the Cintas Center, a state of the art facility which became home to Xavier basketball at the start of the 2000-01 season and - ironically - was dedicated with a victory over Vanderbilt. That season the program posted a school record for attendance with a total of 40,098 fans, who thrilled in the Musketeers' style of play and their results. Commodore followers have enjoyed the entertainment as well.

Her basketball education began at an early age among some of the most well respected coaches in the game. Balcomb's father, Alan, was a varsity boy's coach for 30 years at South Brunswick (N.J.) High School, and then served as an assistant for four years at Princeton University under Pete Carril, the master of the half-court game. For Balcomb, however, a complete education goes far beyond the hardwood. Every eligible, four-year player

during Balcomb's coaching tenure has earned her degree. In May of 2011, Balcomb's team earned a Public Recognition Award for finishing among the nation's top 10 percent in multi-year Academic Progress Rates (APR). Six of seven squads at Xavier earned team grade point averages that ranked in the Top 25. In 2004-05, 40 percent of the Commodore basketball team was named to the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll. Vanderbilt led the SEC with eight players being named to the honor roll in 2003-04.

Two Commodores have been named SEC Scholar Athletes of the Year under Balcomb. Hillary Hager received the honor in 2004 and Christina Wirth won it in 2009. Wirth was also named a 2009 Lowe's Senior CLASS All-American, while receiving WBCA and NCAA post-graduate scholarships. Hager recently returned to Vanderbilt and received her doctorate in 2010.

Balcomb also stresses the importance of community service to her teams. VU logged more than 95 hours of community service last season, including numerous opportunities to visit with young patients at the Vanderbilt Children's Hospital. After the devastating Nashville flood in 2010, Balcomb and her coaching staff volunteered in helping to clean up flood-damaged areas. Balcomb herself has been active in outreach to the surrounding area, participating in numerous fundraising events for local and national organizations, including Coaches vs. Cancer, the Race for the Cure, Mercy Ministries, Vanderbilt Children's Hospital and the Girl Scouts of America.



NASHVILLE, Tenn. - On a day the Commodores honored head coach Melanie Balcomb before the game for becoming the school's all-time wins leader, it was only fitting that Vanderbilt would put together a textbook offensive game - something Commodore fans have become accustomed to under the 12th-year head coach.

With five players scoring in double figures, led by freshman Rebekah Dahlman's 23, Vanderbilt (1-0) routed Appalachian State (0-1) 96-53 Friday at Memorial Gymnasium as the Commodores opened the 2013-14 season in resounding fashion.

Vanderbilt led by 25 points in the first half and did not let off the gas in the second half, leading by as many as 48 points and rolling to its 28th straight win in a home opener. The Commodores have now won eight straight season openers.

Balcomb became Vanderbilt's wins leader in last year's home finale against Auburn. The Commodores went on to finish 2012-13 with a 21-12 record after advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Like any new season, there were questions after losing two starters off last year's squad.

Although it was just one game, the answers to some of those $% \left\{ 1,2,\ldots ,n\right\}$ questions seemed to become more apparent through the efforts of a balanced scoring attack that was not reliant on preseason All-SEC guards Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister. The duo each scored 10 points, but played sparingly in the second half with the game out of reach.

With the senior leaders on the bench, Vanderbilt got 23 points from Dahlman and 19 points from sophomore guard Jasmine Jenkins. Freshman forward Marqu'es Webb added 13 points and joined Dahlman in Vanderbilt's starting lineup.

It was the first time Vanderbilt had five players in double figures since last January 3 against Mississippi State. It was a balanced attack, but it was Dahlman who stood out

the most. She went 8-of-10 from the floor and 6-of-7 from long range to set a new scoring mark in a freshman debut. No other Vanderbilt freshman has ever scored as many points in their first game as Dahlman did.

The previous record was 22 points scored by Barbara Brackman on November 20, 1981 in an 82-58 win over Belmont. She also collected four rebounds and dished out two assists.

"I was teasing (Rebekah) because I tell everyone what a great defender she is, about her engine and her energy, and I brought her here for her defense, but let's be real, she scored more points in Minnesota than any girl in their history," Balcomb said. "She just knows how to score, and she'll keep scoring if you let her, and they let her keep shooting. She has a lot of confidence on both ends of the floor and it was fun to watch."

As a team, the Commodores shot a blistering 57.1 percent from the floor, including 66.7 percent from the three-point line. Additionally, Vanderbilt was able to get to the free-throw line 34 times and outscored Appalachian State 37-11 in points off turnovers.

The Commodores forced 26 miscues, while committing 19. Vanderbilt not only got the job done on the offensive end, but also defensively. Appalachian State was held to just 29.7 percent shooting in the first half. Vanderbilt also held the Mountaineers without a field goal for nearly 11 minutes.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - A senior and a freshman provided a perfect balance - and a powerful punch - for the Vanderbilt women's basketball team on Monday night. Senior Christina Foggie scored 21 of her game-high 26 points

in the first half and freshman Rebekah Dahlman added 18 points including ripping off 14 straight early in the second half -- to help Vanderbilt overcome a sluggish start and roll past Western Kentucky, 85-60, in a non-conference game at Memorial Gym.

The two Jasmines -- Lister and Jenkins -- also reached double figures, with Lister finishing with 11 points and Jenkins adding 10 for Vanderbilt (2-0). Rayte'a Long had a team-high nine rebounds and Heather Bowe and Morgan Batev added seven boards apiece to help Vanderbilt win the battle on the glass, 48-31.

Alexis Govan scored 18 to pace Western Kentucky (1-1) Foggie scored her 26 points efficiently, taking just 11 shots from the floor, making seven. She finished 5-of-9 from 3-point range and was 7-of-7 of the foul line.

"They were just giving me open shots, and I've been trained to shoot it and knock it down," said Foggie. "So, I just had confidence from the start."

Vanderbilt, which opened the season on Friday with a 96-53 win over Appalachian State, started slowly against Western Kentucky.

But Foggie almost single-handedly kept Vanderbilt afloat in the first half, scoring 12 of the Commodores' first 17 points in the first 11-plus minutes. She was 6-of-8 from the floor in the first 20 minutes, including 4-of-6 from long range, and she was the primary reason that Vanderbilt eventually owned a 37-31 lead at the break.

In the second half, it was Dahlman's turn to dominate. She scored 16 of her 18 points in the final 20 minutes, high-lighted by her 14-point flurry that started with a layup at the 16:24 mark and ended when she nailed a jumper at the 12:32 mark. Vanderbilt owned a 46-34 lead before her explosion, and a 58-38 advantage by the time it ended.

"(The) first half I started out really slow," said Dahlman. "I talked to coach after the game and she (said) 'you just didn't buy in.' I agreed. But the second half I just came out really confident. I just did my thing and knocked down shots."

The Commodores, who host Delaware State on Thursday night, trailed for much of the first half before putting together a dominating 13-minute stretch in which they outscored Western Kentucky, 37-8. The huge surge -- which spanned the final $5\,1/2$ minutes of the first half and the first seven of the second -- enabled Vanderbilt to flip a 28-19 deficit into a 56-35 lead. What led to the big turnaround?

"It was definitely a change in defensive mentality," said Foggie. "Picking up our energy on the defensive end let us get into transi-tion. We didn't get into transition at all during the first half, and that's a big part of our game."

Head coach Melanie Balcomb agreed with Foggie's assessment. "(Western Kentucky) came out very aggressive and ready to play whereas we came out flat," said Balcomb. "We were a little shell shocked at the beginning. The good thing is we made a positive change."

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team woke up just in the nick of time Thursday night.

The RV/No. 25 Commodores trailed for much of the night before seniors Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie took the game over and paved the way for a 73-67 victory over stubborn Delaware State at Memorial Gym.

Vanderbilt (3-0) trailed by 11 points at the half and was down 48-38 at the 13:25 mark of the second half before getting off the deck and outscoring the Hornets 35-19 the rest of the way.

Foggie finished with a double-double, scoring 16 points and pulling down a career-high 10 rebounds. She narrowly missed a triple-double, adding eight assists.

Lister scored 15 points on 7-of-15 shooting and made a series of huge plays down the stretch.

Two underclassmen, freshman Kylee Smith and sophomore Heather Bowe, also were instrumental in the victory, producing timely baskets in the second half to help Vanderbilt avoid the upset.

Bowe finished with eight points and seven rebounds, and Smith had nine points, five rebounds and two assists for the Commodores.

It was Vanderbilt's 32nd win of its past 35 home games, but the Commodores hardly felt like celebrating. Vanderbilt came into the night as substantial favorites against a Delaware State team that lost its season opener to Old Dominion, 97-67.

But the Hornets gave Vanderbilt a huge scare, and Vanderbilt's victory wasn't secured until the last two minutes.

"It's definitely better to learn form a win than a loss, but we want to play Vanderbilt basketball," said Foggie. "We have a lot to learn from (this game). ... Its good that we could fight back and compete and get the win."

The Commodores hadn't faced much adversity in their first two games, but there was plenty of tense moments Thursday. It certainly appeared an upset might be in the making when Delaware State owned a double-digit lead with roughly 13 minutes to play. But the Commodores staged their late rally to avoid what would have been a stunning defeat.

And while head coach Melanie Balcomb wasn't pleased with her

team's overall performance, she was encouraged by the amount of resolve the Commodores showed.
"I challenged them at halftime and they did make a change -- a

big change," Balcomb said.

Lister helped jumpstart the Vanderbilt offense in the second half by knocking down a 3-pointer from the top of the key and she followed that with a layup that trimmed the deficit to 38-32.

Later, Smith added two huge baskets -- a 3-pointer and a bucket in the paint -- to bring the Commodores within one, 52-51, with 8:54 to play, and a pair of free throws by Jasmine Jenkins put Vanderbilt ahead, 53-52.

Delaware State then made one last push and retook the lead 57-55, but the Commodores answered with a 16-5 run to build a 71-60 advantage and held on from there to move to 3-0.

"I think we really changed our mentality," said Lister. "In the first half we were playing as a bunch of individuals, so the focus [at halftime] was to play together more.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - After opening the season with three straight wins, things got all fouled up for the Vanderbilt women's basketball team on Sunday.

Last FG - MU 2nd-00:42, VANDY 2nd-00:03. Largest lead - MU by 6 2nd-00:09, VANDY by 14 1st-00:3

Facing Marquette in front of a lively crowd at Memorial Gym, the RV/No. 25 Commodores built a 14-point lead in the first half but then ran into major foul trouble in the final 20 minutes and suffered their first loss of the season, 82-77. Marquette closed the game on an 11-4 run to secure the win.

The contest saw the teams combine for a staggering 63 fouls and 74 free throws. Marqu'es Webb, Kylee Smith and Morgan Batey all fouled out for Vanderbilt.

Christina Foggie had another huge game for Vanderbilt, scoring 30 points (four shy of matching her career high) while going 16-of-18 at the foul line. She was joined in double figures by three of her teammates: Jasmine Lister with 13 points, Rebekah Dahlman with

12 and Jasmine Jenkins 10.
But the balanced scoring wasn't enough to offset a second-half comeback by the feisty Golden Eagles, who proved to be the more aggressive team in the second half -- as evidenced by the stat sheet. Vanderbilt, which owned a 47-36 lead at the half, shot 26 free throws in the first 20 minutes, compared to Marquette's 10. But the second half featured 24 free throws by the Golden Eagles, while Vanderbilt shot 14. Marquette's intensity was also reflected in the rebounding stats, as they won the battle on the glass, 25-13, in the final 20 minutes (and 37-31 for the game).

"The first four minutes of the second half really changed the game," said Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb. "They came out more aggressive after halftime and we didn't. We have to figure out why. ... I really thought we had built confidence and we were going to continue to be the aggressor and we weren't." Katherine Plouffe scored a team-high 16 points for the Golden Eagles (3-0) and was one of five Marquette players in double figures.

The loss dropped the Commodores to 3-1 as they head into their first road test of the season, a visit to No. 2/2 Duke on Thursday

"It's just going to be a really big test for us," said sophomore post player Heather Bowe. "Duke is obviously a great team, so we've got to go out and be tough and aggressive against them."

Foggie fell just shy of a record-setting day Sunday. She was one short of the Vanderbilt all-time record for free throws attempted (set by Ashley McElhiney with 19 in Feb., 2001) and two shy for free throws made in a game (18 by McElhiney).
Foggie, coming off her first career double-double (16 points and

10 rebounds) in Thursday's win over Delaware State, said the Commodores need to do a better job of maintaining their intensity for 40 minutes.

"We need to play both halves and put in good basketball in both halves," she said. "I think in the second half Marquette was . outworking us, and that's something we need to learn. We need to play both halves.

After Vanderbilt carried its 47-36 lead into the locker room. Marquette opened the second half with an 11-2 run to pull within 49-47 with 15:17 left to play, and the contest stayed tight the rest

DURHAM, N.C. - For more than 30 minutes, Vanderbilt hung tight with the No. 2/2 Duke Blue Devils on their home floor But down the stretch, the Blue Devils -- and Tricia Liston, in particular -- proved to be too much.

Liston went 5-of-6 from 3-point range while scoring 15 of her team-high 18 points in the second half, and Duke pulled away for an 88-69 victory over the Commodores on Thursday night. The Blue Devils improved to 4-0; Vanderbilt fell to 3-2.

Vanderbilt was down only 36-34 at the half and was still within striking distance at the midway mark of the second half, trailing

But the Commodores then endured a cold snap, missing seven straight shots from the floor, and Duke begin to extend its advan-

A basket by Duke's Alexis Jones, followed by a 3-pointer by Liston, pushed the lead to 66-54, and the Blue Devils maintained a double-digit lead the rest of the way.

Jasmine Lister scored a game-high 23 points for Vanderbilt, including going 4-of-7 from 3-point range, but that wasn't enough to offset the Commodores' 28 turnovers in the loss. Christina Foggie added 18 for Vanderbilt, and freshman Kylee

Smith pulled down a team-high seven rebounds in the first road game of her college career.

The Commodores showed plenty of fight in the opening half, when they essentially traded baskets with Duke and also won the rebounding battle, 18-16. But the Devils flipped the game around in the second half, outscoring Vanderbilt 52-35 and out-rebounding the Commodores, 16-11.

Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb said her team got a little impatient in the second half when the tempo picked up.

"I think we shot ourselves in the foot a little bit by taking really quick shots," she said. "Once they got hot, and hit shots, I felt like we hit the panic button. And instead of executing and getting the ball inside and out ... we took quick shots to try to stay with them." For Duke, Liston finished 6-of-8 shots from 3-point range to account for all 18 of her points, and was one of six Duke players in double figures. Chelsea Gray also had a huge game, scoring 14

points with 12 assists and eight rebounds. Alexis Jones had 17 points, and Elizabeth Williams had 13. Haley Peters, who left the game with an apparent knee injury in the first

half but returned to the floor in the second half, finished with 11 points, as did Chloe Wells. The Blue Devils, who went 11-of-19 from 3-point range, have

now won 125 straight games against unranked opponents on their home floor. For Vanderbilt, Lister provided a series of key baskets in the first

half to help keep Vanderbilt close. She led all scorers in the first 20 minutes with 11 points, including a pair of 3-pointers. "I think (Lister) was great," said Balcomb. "I think she played very

calm, never lost control. When it got crazy, she didn't get crazy, so I really just liked how her demeanor never changed."

The Commodores were scrappy on the boards in the first half, out-rebounding Duke, 18-16. Bowe led the way with four rebounds, and Smith added three.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - It's hard to classify a game in November as a "must-win" -- but Sunday's contest sure felt like one for Vanderbilt.

And the Commodores certainly responded as if it were. Putting together their most solid 40-minute effort of the season, the hot-shooting Commodores snapped a two-game losing skid in emphatic fashion, storming past Dayton, 82-52, at Memorial

The RV/RV Commodores (4-2) shot 57 percent from the floor, including going 8-of-11 (72 percent) from 3-point range, and went 20-of-22 (90 percent) from the foul line while sailing past

the RV/No. 24 Flyers. Rebekah Dahlman scored a team high 17 points and Christina Foggie added 16. The two players combined to go 7-of-9 from 3-point range (Foggie was 4-of-5; Dahlman 3-of-4;). Morgan Batey added 10 points and a team-high seven rebounds.

Freshman Marques Webb also added 10 points while helping Vanderbilt gain revenge for last November's road loss to Dayton. More importantly, the win helped the Commodores regain some momentum after they had suffered back-to-back setbacks -- losing to No. 2/2 Duke, 88-69, on the road on Thursday night and falling to Marquette last Sunday at home.

"Vanderbilt has a great tradition, and losing three games in a row is unacceptable," said Batey, who provided a huge boost off the bench with her energetic play. "We had to win this game."

After the teams battled to an 18-18 tie, Vanderbilt closed the first half with a 15-5 run to build a 33-23 lead. The Commodores then opened the second half with 17-8 spurt -- which included two 3s by Foggie and one by Jasmine Jenkins -- to push the advantage to 50-31, and they maintained a comfortable lead the rest of the way.

With Dahlman disrupting Dayton's offense by applying full court pressure, the Flyers endured a frustrating game in which they shot just 33.3 percent from the field and made only four of their 21 attempts from 3-point range (19 percent). "(Dayton) is a great shooting team with a lot of firepower," said

head coach Melanie Balcomb. "I felt like we wore them down, which I wanted to do. I think we made the right adjustments in our matchup that we needed to make."

Dayton's Ally Malott, who came into the game averaging 17.3 points per game, was held to five points on 2-of-9 shooting. Cassie Sant led the Flyers with 20 points.

Balcomb said the win over the Flyers -- who advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament last season -- was a prime example of what her team is capable of doing when they execute

"Everybody was on the bus today, trying to execute, trying to do the same things and we were fun to watch," she said.

The Commodores got off to a slow start, trailing 8-2 early. But a 3-pointer by Foggie at the 14:48 mark ignited Vanderbilt's offense, and the Commodores ripped off a 16-4 run to grab an 18-12 lead with 8:33 left in the half. Dahlman capped the surge with a 3-pointer

Dayton battled back to tie the game at 18-18, but Vanderbilt closed the half with its 15-5 spurt to build its 33-23 lead.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team delivered a golden performance on Black Friday.

And it proved to be a great bargain for Commodores' fans. With free admission for all fans at Memorial Gym, a crowd of 4,446 saw the Commodores storm out to a 24-point halftime lead and sail to an 88-66 win over Elon in the opening game of the Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament.

Jasmine Lister scored a team-high 22 points and Christina Foggie had 18 for the Commodores, who improved to 5-2 on the season and 27-0 in the history of the Thanksgiving tourney.

Vanderbilt earned its spot in the tourney's championship game after putting together a red-hot start from long range against Elon (2-3).

The Commodores went 9-of-14 (64.3) from 3-point territory in the opening 20 minutes, with Foggie going 5-of-6. Vanderbilt shot 58 percent (20-of-34) from the floor overall while building a 55-31 lead.

Vanderbilt cooled off considerably in the second half, shooting just 40 percent from the floor (and going 2-of-7 from 3-point range) but still managed to maintain a comfortable cushion throughout the final 20 minutes.

Vanderbilt won the rebounding war, 41-28, and outscored Elon 38-26 in the paint.

"I was pleased with our effort on both ends of the floor tonight," said head coach Melanie Balcomb, "especially with our rebounding."

While Vanderbilt's seniors, Foggie and Lister, combined for 40 points, a pair of freshmen, Kylee Smith and Marqu'es Webb, also made big offensive contributions, scoring 10 points each. Morgan Batey and Jasmine Jenkins scored eight apiece.

Lister finished 9-of-17 from the floor and was aggressive going to the basket throughout much of the night. She also flashed her range, hitting 4-of-9 shots from 3-point range.

Smith finished 5-of-6 from the floor and also pulled down a teamhigh seven rebounds for the Commodores Webb scored her 10 points in just 14 minutes of action.

Balcomb said she was pleased with her team's energy early in the game.

"The big thing was that we came out ready to play," she said. "We shot the ball extremely well in the first half. In the second half, we continued to get great shots, but we didn't convert."

Vanderbilt exploded for 55 points in the first 20 minutes, representing the Commodores' highest scoring half of the season.

Foggie, who was named the Naismith Trophy Watch List earlier

Foggie, who was named the Naismith Trophy Watch List earlier this week, scored 17 first-half points, going 6-of-7 from the floor, including 5-of-6 from 3-point range.

Foggie needed less than seven minutes to reach double figures.

Foggie needed less than seven minutes to reach double figures. After hitting three early 3-pointers, she added an offensive putback at the 14-47 mark. That basket gave Foggie 11 points and gave Vanderbilt an 11-point lead, 19-8.

Vanderbilt continued to extend the lead from there, pushing the advantage to 35-14 after a layup by Lister and a jumper by Schrann. Lister then addd a pair of 3s in the final six minutes of the half, helping the Commodores carry a 55-31 lead into the locker room.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball coaching staff was reminded again on Saturday how thankful they are to have Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie as members of the program.

And they are grateful to have some rising young stars, too.

Facing a stubborn Wiscosin team in the championship game of the Thanksgiving Tournament, the Commodores used the clutch play of Foggie and Lister -- combined with some pivotal plays from a trio of freshman -- to ear-1 an 81-69 victory at Memorial Gym.

The win was the Commodores' third straight, and pushed them to 6-2 on the season. NR/RV Vanderbilt now owns a 28-0 all-time record in the Thanksgiving tourney.

Foggie scored a game-high 23 points, going 9-of-14 from the floor, and was named the tourney's MVP. Lister added 14 points on 6-of-11 shooting and was named to the All-Tournament Team. Both of them made huge plays down the stretch, helping Vanderbilt close the game on a 22-10 run to pull away from the Badgers (4-2).

"I told them after the game, "The two of you played like seniors

"I told them after the game, "The two of you played like seniors tonight," said head coach Melanie Balcomb about Foggie and Lister. "And they said, 'We had to. That's who we are."

The three freshman made big contributions, too. Kylee Smith finished with a career-high 16 points and helped Vanderbilt secure the win by making clutch free throws in the closing minutes. She also earned a spot on the All-Tournament team.

Marqu'es Webb added nine points and Rebekah Dahlman notched a team-high eight rebounds, the most of her young career. Smith entered the night just 1-of-11 at the foul line for the season, and missed her first attempt of the game. But she was automatic after that, making six straight in the second half to help Vanderbilt null away.

"The three freshman showed courage tonight," said Balcomb. "I was very excited about what they did."

Vanderbilt owned a 41-30 lead at the half, but Wisconsin charged back to tie the game on three occasions, the final time coming on a basket by Taylor Wurtz that tied the game at 59-59 with 8:18 to play.

Then the seniors stepped up. Again.

Foggie knocked down a 3-pointer that gave Vanderbilt the lead for good and sparked an 11-0 spurt by the Commodores. Lister's layup capped the surge, and Wisconsin never got closer than nine points the rest of the way.

Foggie said the Commodores fed off the lively crowd.

"They really gave us a lift," she said. "Even when (Wisconsin made its run), they didn't get quiet." Wurtz finished with a team-high 18 points for the Badgers and was named to the All-Tournament team. The Commodores built their 41-30 lead at the half, thanks in large

The Commodores built their 41-30 lead at the half, thanks in large part to their aggressiveness on the glass. Vanderbilt out-rebounded the Badgers, 23-12, and were especially active on the offensive end, pulling down 10 offensive rebounds.

Vanderbilt's senior duo, Foggie and Lister, combined for 20 firsthalf points and went 8-of-14 from the floor. Foggie scored a teamhigh 11 points on 4-of-8 shooting, and Lister added nine points, going 4-of-6 from the field.

The Commodores opened the game on a 7-0 run, capped by a layup from Heather Bowe, and stretched the advantage to 21-10 at the 11:45 mark of the first half on a layup by Foggie.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - It wasn't nearly as dramatic as a gameending buzzer-beater, but the 3-pointer that Vanderbilt's Jasmine Lister made in the first half of Tuesday's game was crucial for the Commodores.

Off to a sluggish start, heavily-favored Vanderbilt found itself trailing East Tennessee State by four points with roughly six minutes left until halftime. But Lister's 3-pointer ignited the Commodores, setting off a 14-3 run that put NR/RV Vanderbilt in charge and set the tone for a 92-71 victory at Memorial Gym.

The 3-pointer was just one of many big shots for Lister. The senior guard finished with a game-high 26 points, four shy of matching her career high, while making 7-of-11 attempts from the floor and going 10-of-11 at the line to lead Vanderbilt (7-2) to its fourth straight win.

"(Lister) is just awesome," said head coach Melaine Balcomb.
"Every day she is focused and puts in effort. The way she prepares is like a senior, and that is why we see consistency from her. When we weren't playing well, "Jas' just kept playing harder and smarter."

Sophomore Heather Bowe also had a huge game, scoring a careerhigh 19 points and pulling down a team-high eight rebounds. Bowe credited her teammates with making the right passes at the right times.

"Tonight, Morgan did a really good job feeding the post, and so did Christina and Jasmine," Bowe said."There was good chemistry on offense."

Senior Christina Foggie and freshman Kylee Smith added 13 points each in the win. Foggie also had five assists and four steals. Jasmine Jenkins finished with seven rebounds.

Vanderbilt's offense scored 58 points in the final 20 minutes, thanks in large part to their ability to continuously get to the foul line and convert free throws. Vanderbilt went 20-of-24 (83.3 percent) from the line in the second half and was 29-of-38 (76.3 percent) for the game.

Despite the lopsided final score, ETSU (2-5) certainly didn't roll over the Commodores. The feisty Bucs scored 44 points in the second half, and had four players finish the game in double figures. Brianna McQueen led the way with 16 points.

Lister said the Commodores weren't especially pleased with their performance, especially in the first half.

"We just came out flat at the start of the game, and we weren't taking away their strengths. We were letting ETSU get whatever they wanted," she said. "We weren't doing what Vanderbilt basketball does. ... (But) in the second half, we got our hands up a lot more on defense, and we were also feeding the posts a lot more."

Despite struggling with their shooting from the floor in the first 20 minutes, the Commodores carried a 34-27 lead into the half, and Foggie opened the second half with a 3-pointer that pushed the advantage to double-digits for the first time, 37-27.

ETSU answered with five straight points to cut the lead to 37-32 but Vanderbilt soon begin to pull away, putting together an 11-2 run that featured Lister and Smith scoring two baskets each. The big run gave Vanderbilt a 48-34 lead with 15:16 left in the game.

The teams essentially traded baskets for the game's first $12\,\text{min}$ -utes -- with five ties and six lead changes in that span -- and were tied at $20\text{-}20\,\text{with}$ 7:53 left before halftime.

HARTFORD, Conn. - The combination of a long layoff followed by a long road trip seemed to take a toll on the Vanderbilt women's basketball team on Sunday.

But the Commodores broke out of the funk just when it mattered

Finishing the game with an 18-9 run, Vanderbilt earned a hardfought 65-56 road victory over Hartford at the Chase Arena in Hartford, Conn., to extend their winning streak to five games. It was Vanderbilt's first game since Dec. 3, and was also the Com-

modores first game without freshman star Rebekah Dahlman. The sharp-shooting guard, who leads the SEC in 3-point percentage and is a defensive catalyst for Vanderbilt, is out indefinitely after having two procedures to dissolve a blood clot last week.

In her absence, the Commodores (8-2) needed someone to supply an extra dose of energy, and Jasmine Lister took on the assignment. After being hampered by foul trouble in the first half, Lister scored 14 points and made a series of pivotal plays in the final 20 minutes to help Vanderbilt escape with the win. Lister, who had a team-high seven rebounds and three assists, finished 4-of-6 from the floor and 5-of-5 at the foul line.

The Commodores trailed by as many as nine points early in the first half, and found themselves locked in a 47-47 late in the second half before putting together the game-ending run to finally pull

"Give credit to Hartford; they outworked us today," said Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb. "We didn't play with a sense of urgency until the final four minutes of the game. ... But it was good for us to get out of here with a win."

Heather Bowe also had a huge game, scoring 11 points on 5-of-10 shooting. She also had six rebounds, two steals and two assists.

Christina Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, was held to a seasonlow eight points but scored two huge buckets in the second half. Marqu'es Webb also finished with eight points.

Perhaps showing the effects of not having played a game in nearly two weeks, the Commodores got off to a slow start. After Bowe scored the game's first basket, Vanderbilt surrendered eight straight points and eventually saw the deficit grow to as many as nine points, 13-4.

Then Vanderbilt came to life.

Back-to-back baskets by Webb got the Commodores rolling, and they outscored Hartford 27-12 in the final 13 minutes of the half to take a 31-25 lead into the locker room. During that surge, Bowe scored in the paint to give Vanderbilt a 20-19 advantage, marking the Commodores' first lead since the opening minute.

Schrann and Webb came off the bench to give Vanderbilt a big spark. Webb scored eight first-half points and Schrann added six. Vanderbilt will return to the court Wednesday when the Commodores travel to James Madison.

HARRISONBURG, Va. - Even when her shots weren't falling in the first half, Christina Foggie didn't stop firing.

As the game wore on, she started heating up -- and she eventually

hit the game's biggest shot.

With Vanderbilt seemingly in trouble in overtime against James Madison, Foggie hit a clutch 3-pointer that tied the game and sparked an 11-4 game-ending run that lifted Vanderbilt to a gutsy 89-85 road victory.
Foggie finished with 29 points, making 9-of-22 from the floor,

including 5-of-12 from 3-point range, to help the Commodores (9-2) extend their winning streak to six games.

James Madison fell to 8-3 and saw its three-game winning streak

come to an end.

Jasmine Lister added 16 points with four rebounds and six assists. Lister and Foggie both played all 45 minutes during the contest, which featured plenty of emotion and intensity.

"I like to test my team with road games before we get into SEC play," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "And I knew we'd have to play well to win tonight. This felt like an NCAA tournament game,

Freshman Marqu'es Webb had a breakout game, scoring a seasonhigh 15 points before fouling out. Webb finished 6-of-9 from the floor and delivered a series of powerful post moves that energized the other Vanderbilt players.

The Commodores finished 23-of-30 (76.7 percent) at the foul line, doing their best work at the beginning and end of the game. They went 11-for-11 from the line in the first half, and were 7-of-10 in overtime.

Vanderbilt won the game despite the absence of Rebekah Dahlman, who missed her second straight game and is out indefinitely after undergoing two procedures for a blood clot last week.

Heather Bowe had eight points and a team-high seven rebounds. Bowe hit the go-ahead jumper that gave Vanderbilt an 83-81 lead in overtime, and the Commodores stayed in front from there.

The tightly-contested game featured eight ties and five lead changes. And in the end, it proved to be one of Vanderbilt's most impressive wins of the season.

James Madison was led in scoring by Toia Giggetts' 25 points. The Dukes owned a 73-70 lead with 1:41 left in regulation, but Lister delivered a clutch 3-pointer that tied it up with just over a minute to play. After the teams traded baskets in the final minute, the Commodores had a chance to win the game on their final possession, but Bowe's short jumper rolled off the rim as the buzzer

IMU then built an 81-78 lead in overtime, but Vanderbilt roared back with a 7-0 run that included Foggie's game-tying 3-pointer, followed by a bucket by Bowe and two free throws by Morgan Batey.

Early in the game, Vanderbilt fell behind 10-2 before the Com-modores ripped off a 26-8 run to reverse the game's momentum. Webb ignited the surge with some strong work inside, scoring six straight points and showcasing a soft touch in the paint. Vanderbilt eventually took a 39-36 lead into the half.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team gave their fans an early Christmas present Saturday by delivering a dominating performance, and Jasmine Lister provided a stocking stuffer by reaching a career milestone.

Freshman Kylee Smith scored a game-high 17 points, Heather Bowe added 16 and Lister notched her 500th career assist as the Commodores extended their winning streak to seven games by rolling past UNC Asheville, 83-57, before a crowd of 3,201 at Memorial Gym.
Smith finished 7-of-9 from the floor and pulled down six rebounds in

23 minutes of action. Sophomore Jasmine Jenkins added 12 points and Marqu'es Webb had 10 as the Commodores put four players in double figures. Christina Foggie and Lister had nine points each. Tianna Knuckles scored 17 to lead UNC Asheville (4-7).

Lister finished with a team-high seven assists, including the 500th of her career when she fed Marqu'es Webb for a short jumper late in the

Lister now has 503 career assists, the sixth most in Vanderbilt history. and is likely to soon pass former Commodore Rhonda Blades (505) for fifth place on the all-time list.

"Iasmine has done nothing but overachieve since she (got to Vanderbilt)," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "She's set a standard here."

The NR/RV Commodores improved to 10-2, and will now head into the holidays on a high note.

Bowe, who finished 6-of-10 from the floor and 4-of-4 from the foul line, said Saturday's game was a good momentum builder as the Commodores move closer to the conference schedule.

"This was a solid win before the break," said Bowe. "UNC Asheville was a

good team ... (and) we play some great teams in January." Saturday's win helped highlight a big day for the Vanderbilt program, which hosted a women's and men's doubleheader. (The men defeated Georgia Tech later in the day). Also, the women's game featured the popular Teddy Bear Toss promotion -- which provides stuffed animals for local children and was sponsored by Erie Insurance.

The Vanderbilt players were certainly in the giving spirit, as they produced a season-high 28 assists in the victory.

Smith said Vanderbilt's ball movement was the key to the victory, and said her teammates showed faith in her by getting her open shots.

"Having the confidence of the team behind you can boost you to do anything," said Smith.

The freshman from Alpharetta, Ga., said the Commodores are pleased with their 10-2 record but they know they have plenty of work ahead of them: "We're not content," she said.

The Commodores have been plagued by slow starts in several home games this season, but that wasn't the case against UNC Asheville

Vanderbilt jumped out to an 8-2 lead on the strength of six early points from Bowe, stretched the advantage to 20-10 on a 3-pointer by Foggie and then used a 10-0 run -- which featured six points from Jenkins -- to take a 38-17 lead late in the half.

Smith had 11 points and four rebounds in the first 20 minutes, and Bowe added 10 points and three rebounds.

Vanderbilt built its big lead despite struggling from 3-point range. The Commodores, who came into the day as the SEC's top 3-point shooting team, were just 2-of-9 from long range in the first half and finished 3-of-13.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. - Vanderbilt senior Christina Foggie might soon request that the Commodores wear their road jerseys all the time -- home or away.

Foggie continued her trend of big performances on the road Monday night, scoring a team-high 29 points to help Vanderbilt extend its winning streak to eight games by downing UAB, 87-76.

Foggie finished 5-of-12 from 3-point range as the Commodores (11-2) closed out their non-conference schedule by handing the Blazers (8-5) their first home loss of the season.

Heather Bowe added 15 points in the win and Jasmine Lister had 14 points and eight rebounds. Morgan Batey pulled down a team-high 10 rebounds and freshman Marqu'es Webb had 10 points while playing in front of a large number of friends and family in her

But Foggie was the central figure of the win, as she scored 18 of her 29 points in the second half. It was her second straight 29-point $\,$ road outing -- she also reached that mark at James Madison on Dec. 18 -- and she's averaging 21 points per game in Vanderbilt's four road contests this year.

"You really have to focus through the crowd (on the road) and sometimes its easier for me to play in a tough environment," said Foggie, "It forces me to really lock in and play my best basketball," Foggie has been strong at home, too. She entered the night averaging 18 points per game for the season.

"She's playing really smart basketball," said head coach Melanie Balcomb about Foggie. "She is preparing herself in practice like a

senior does, and she is making great decisions."

Vanderbilt raced out to an early 26-13 lead against UAB. But the Blazers battled back, eventually cutting the lead to 44-41 at the half. Vanderbilt then opened the second half with a 12-0 run, and this time, the Commodores stayed in control, with the lead never dipping below double figures the rest of the way.

It was Vanderbilt's 12th straight December win, dating back to the 2011-12 season.

"I felt like this was a big game for us," said Balcomb. "We wanted to have momentum going into SEC play."

Vanderbilt was buoyed by strong free throw shooting, finishing

18-of-22 at the line. The Commodores also went 7-of-16 from 3-point range.

For UAB (8-5), three players did the bulk of the scoring. Chelsee Black finished with 29 points, Karisma Chapman added 27 and Ashlev Grimes had 16.

The contest held some extra meaning for Vanderbilt's Webb, the freshman from Hoover, Ala. She was playing against one of her former high school teammates, Kayla Anderson, and was also playing in the same building where Hoover High held its graduation

ceremony last spring.

Vanderbilt shot 58 percent from the floor in the first half and took a 44-41 lead into the locker room. Foggie had the hot hand early, connecting on three of her first four attempts from 3-point range to help Vanderbilt build a 19-9 lead.

The Commodores led by as many as 13 points, 26-13, after a 3-point play by Webb roughly midway through the half. UAB trimmed the lead to 44-41 at the half, but Vanderbilt opened the second half with 12-0 run to set the tone.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Even while reeling off a long series of victories, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team still didn't have that signature win that would allow the Commodores to grab national

attention. Now they do.

With Jasmine Lister scoring 24 points and propelling a second-half comeback, Vanderbilt upset No. 19/18 Georgia, 66-58, on Thursday night at Memorial Gym in the SEC opener for both teams. The victory stretched the Commodores' winning streak to nine games and pushed them to 12-2 overall as they head to South Carolina on Sunday. Vanderbilt hasn't a lost a game since Nov. 21, when

the Commodores lost at Duke. Lister -- who finished 8-of-12 from the floor, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range -- scored 10 points in the span of less than five minutes late in the second half while fueling a 17-5 run that allowed

Vanderbilt to flip a 47-43 deficit into a 60-52 lead with 3:40 to go. Christina Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, also hit a key 3-pointer during the game-changing surge. Foggie finished with 11 points, and was the only other Commodore in double figures.

"They are our senior leaders, and we look up to them," said sopho-

more Morgan Batey about Lister and Foggie, the lone seniors on the roster. "When they hit big shots, it ignites the rest of us."

Batey finished with seven points and three rebounds despite being limited to just 11 minutes of action due to foul trouble.

Vanderbilt has now won nine of the past 12 meetings against Georgia, including five straight in Nashville.

In Thursday's game, the Commodores trailed by as many as seven points in the second half before surging back to capture the victory in the hotly-contested game, which featured five ties and 10 lead

changes.

Vanderbilt was down 49-45 when Lister stepped up and scored all seven points during a 7-0 run. She hit perhaps the biggest shot of the night -- a 3-pointer that cut Georgia's lead to one -- with 7:56 to play, and followed that up with a jumper that gave Vanderbilt the lead for good. She then capped off her spree with another 3-pointer that pushed the lead to 53-49 with 5:52 to go.

"She's got ice water in her veins," said head coach Melanie

Thursday's matchup featured strength against strength, with Vanderbilt's high-powered offense (which entered the night averaging 80.9 points per game) pitted against a Georgia defense that was ranked third in the nation (allowing just 50 points per game). Early on, Georgia's defense seemed to have the upper hand, as the

Lady Dogs pestered Vanderbilt into 11 first-half turnovers, helping Georgia take a 25-24 lead into the locker room. But the Commodores solved Georgia's pressure in the second half and committed just six turnovers while flipping the game around.

Vanderbilt's bench played a pivotal role in the win, outscoring Georgia's reserves 16-5.

"That says a lot about our depth," said Balcomb. "It's players coming off the bench and playing with a sense of urgency."
Lister said the Commodores played with more energy in the

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Vanderbilt's offense wasn't as crisp as normal on Sunday, but that wasn't what upset head coach Melanie Balcomb.

Rather, she was frustrated with her team's defensive effort after a 76-66 loss to No. 13/12 South Carolina that ended the Commodores' nine-game winning streak.

Unable to slow down South Carolina's inside attack, Vanderbilt lost for the first time since Nov. 21 at Duke.

After trailing by as many as 17 points early in the second half, Vanderbilt (12-3, 1-1) trimmed the deficit to 63-55 after two free throws by Christina Foggie with roughly seven minutes to play. But South Carolina (14-1, 2-0) didn't flinch, as the Gamecocks quickly

rebuilt a double-digit advantage, and maintained the lead the rest of the

"The positive about this game is the way we fought back," said Balcomb. "But the negative is we couldn't stop them in the paint."

South Carolina post player Alaina Coates finished with a team-high 24 points, including scoring two key baskets in the second half after Vanderbilt had pulled within striking distance.

Tiffany Mitchell added 19 for the Gamecocks, who improved to 9-0 at

Vanderbilt, which entered the day as the SEC's leader in field-goal percentage, was just 23-of-61 from the floor (37.7 percent). Christina Foggie finished with 16 points, but was 5-of-16 from the floor.

Jasmine Lister added 13 points, Jasmine Jenkins had 12 and Kylee Smith

"(South Carolina) didn't give our shooters any shots," said Balcomb. "They had a great game plan and they executed it."

Vanderbilt trailed 41-30 at the half after being limited to 41 percent shooting the floor, making just 10-of-24 attempts. Foggie was 1-of-4 from the floor and had two points in the half.

After falling into an early 8-2 hole, the Commodores went on a 13-4 run to take a 15-12 lead. The surge included a 3-pointer by Lister and backto-back baskets in the paint by Smith and Webb.

South Carolina answered with a 13-4 run to build a 25-19 lead as the Gamecocks began to take over inside. Vanderbilt then reeled off three quick 3-pointers -- by Smith, Jenkins and Lister -- to stay within striking distance, trailing 31-25 late in the half.

But South Carolina closed the half with a 6-0 run, including a basket by Coates at the buzzer, to take a 41-30 lead, the largest advantage of the half for either team.

AUBURN, Ala. - It has become a tradition for Vanderbilt to beat Auburn, and seniors Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister made sure the Commodores continued the custom Thursday night.
Foggie scored a team-high 26 points, including going 6-of-11 from

3-point range, and Lister had a double-double with 23 points and 10 assists to lead Vanderbilt to a 74-65 road victory over Auburn. It was Vanderbilt's 21st straight win over the Tigers, and head coach Melanie Balcomb improved to 18-0 against Auburn since her

arrival at Vanderbilt in 2002. "I don't know what it is (about Auburn)," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "It's all about match-ups. (And) we do look at the history

and tradition, and that gives us confidence against them." Vanderbilt (13-3, 2-1) used a 17-2 run late in the first half to build a 43-30 lead at the half, and the Commodores maintained a doubledigit lead against the Tigers (10-5, 1-1) until the final 90 seconds. Auburn made it interesting by cutting Vanderbilt's lead to 70-63

with less than a minute to play, but Lister hit four straight free throws to help Vanderbilt hang on.
Kady Schrann scored a season-high 14 points, and Morgan Batey

had nine rebounds. Lister was 8-of-15 from the floor and 6-of-7 from the foul line while playing 39 minutes.

Vanderbilt, the SEC's best 3-point shooting team, was 8-of-17 from

long range. The Commodores were also 20-of-24 from the foul line. Auburn -- which hasn't beaten Vanderbilt since posting a 55-54

win in Nashville on Jan. 16, 2000 -- came into Thursday's game with a 6-0 record at home but saw that run end after shooting just 41 percent against the Commodores. Vanderbilt didn't shoot it well, either, finishing at 43 percent.

Vanderbilt produced two big scoring runs in the first half -- one at the beginning and at near the end -- while building a 43-30 halftime

After falling into a quick 4-0 hole, Vanderbilt reeled off a 20-2 spurt that was fueled by three 3-pointers by Foggie to take a 20-6 lead. After Auburn battled back to trim Vanderbilt's lead to 21-19, the Commodores ripped off a 17-2 spurt to rebuild a comfortable lead, 38-21, late in the first half.

Foggie was 5-of-10 from the floor in the first half, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range. Lister added nine points and five assists in the first 20 minutes.

Vanderbilt limited Auburn to 28 percent shooting in the first half (11-of-28) and the Tigers were 0-of-4 from 3-point range.

NOTE: Thursday's game was the fourth consecutive road game

that Vanderbilt had faced a team with an undefeated record at home: James Madison was 2-0 at home before losing to Vanderbilt on Dec. 21; UAB was 5-0 at home before losing to the Commodores on Dec. 30; and South Carolina improved to 9-0 at home after beating Vanderbilt last Sunday.e

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Given the chance to be in the national spotlight on Sunday, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team decided to steal the show.

With the ESPN cameras rolling -- and a huge crowd of 9,412 in the house -- the Commodores earned a victory that is certain to generate a large amount of attention as they rallied from a 10-point second deficit and stunned No. 8/8 Tennessee, 74-63, at Memorial

Vanderbilt (14-3, 3-1) trailed 39-29 early in the second half before getting off the deck and outscoring Tennessee 45-24 during the final 16½ minutes to upset the Lady Vols (13-3, 2-2).

Vanderbilt seniors Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie, who were facing their in-state rivals on their home court for the final time, propelled the Commodores' comeback. Lister, who finished with a game-high 26 points, scored seven straight for Vanderbilt during a crucial stretch in the second half. Foggie added 21 points, including two pivotal baskets in the final six minutes that helped Vanderbilt hang on for the win.

"We kept our composure; we didn't put our head down or anything like that," said Lister. "We went into this game believing we were going to win it, so even when things didn't go our way, or when they did start to go our way, we stayed level headed and just kept chipping away at that lead."

Freshman Marqu'es Webb added 12 points, and Morgan Batey had nine points and eight rebounds. Batey's jumper with 6:44 left to play gave Vanderbilt a 51-50 lead, and the Commodores never

trailed again.

It was Vanderbilt's first win over Tennessee since a 93-79 victory on Feb. 9, 2010 in Nashville. Foggie and Lister were sophomores on that team -- and their senior leadership on Sunday was instrumen-

"It means a lot (when) you have two seniors who are going to have the ball in their hands most of the time," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "You're going to have to play them 40 minutes, and they know that, so the media and TV timeouts help a lot. They had both beaten Tennessee here before ... so they have experienced this, as well as Kady Schrann, who was a freshman."

Meighan Simmons finished with 19 points for the Lady Vols, but was just 8-of-21 from the floor.

Coming into the game, the Commodores were staring at some ugly numbers: They had lost 10 of the past 11 games against Tennessee, and the Lady Vols owned a 61-8 lead in the series that dates back to the 1979-80 season. But Vanderbilt wasn't interested in history Sunday. The Commodores were simply focused on the moment and that certainly turned out to be the right mind-set.

"We absolutely believed that it was just another game," said Foggie. "Like I said earlier this week, we don't want to treat it any differently because then we start playing out of our comfort zone and out of

Trailing 30-29 at the half, Vanderbilt surrendered a 9-0 run to Tennessee to open the second half. But the next 10 minutes belonged to the Commodores, who outscored Tennessee 26-11 during that stretch to flip the game around and build a 55-50 lead with 5:38

OXFORD, Miss. - Four days after generating a big upset, the Vanderbilt women managed to avoid being the victims of one.

The No. 24/25 Commodores, who stunned Tennessee on Sunday, survived a scare Thursday night and used a strong finish to down Ole

Christina Foggie scored 20 of her team-high 28 points in the second half as the Commodores improved to 4-1 in the SEC (15-3 overall). Vanderbilt has now won three straight games and 11 of its past 12.

Foggie finished 9-of-14 from the floor and was 3-of-6 from 3-point range. Vanderbilt -- which ranks first in the SEC and second in the nation in field-goal percentage -- shot 57 percent from the floor (32-of-56).

Valencia McFarland had 28 points for Ole Miss (9-9, 0-4) and Tia Faleru had 20. Jasmine Lister finished with 17 points and Morgan Batey added 11 to help the Commodores grind out the win in a contest that wasn't

decided until the final two minutes.
"It wasn't easy," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "But that's OK. In the SEC, it's not going to be easy. This was a game we needed."

By posting the victory, Vanderbilt prevented history from repeating itself. Two seasons ago, the Commodores followed up an upset of Tennessee by losing their next game to Georgia. Vanderbilt, in fact, lost three of

its next four games after downing Tennessee during the 2011-12 season. But the Commodores avoided a letdown Thursday, thanks to the play of the seniors, Lister and Foggie, and some clutch work by freshman Kylee Smith. She scored all nine of her points in the final 4:40 while helping Vanderbilt turn a three-point lead into a 10-point cushion down the

"I like her aggressiveness," said Balcomb.

Ole Miss was on fire in the first half, hitting 17-of-25 shots (68 percent) from the floor and carrying a $38\mbox{-}37$ lead into the locker room. Vanderbilt

also shot the ball effectively, making 16-of-29 shots in the half.

The Commodores ran out to a quick 9-2 lead, but Ole Miss, fueled McFarland and Faleru, charged back with a 28-14 surge to take a 30-23 lead. The Commodores whittled the deficit to one point at halftime after scoring on their final two possessions of the first half, including a buzzerbeating jumper by Batey.

Lister led all scorers with 15 points in the first half. McFarland and

Faleru had 13 points each for the Rebels.

 $\mbox{\bf NASHVILLE}, \mbox{\bf Tenn.}$ - The shooting percentages just continue to rise for the Vanderbilt women's team. And chances are, the No. 24/25 Commodores will see their national ranking rise this week,

Vanderbilt was effective from all over the floor Sunday -- long range, inside and the foul line -- during an impressive 79-70 victory over No. 14/14 LSU before a large and energetic crowd of 6,020 at Memorial Gym.

Senior Jasmine Lister scored a game-high 25 points and fellow senior Christina Foggie added 19 for the Commodores (16-3, 5-1), who built a 20-point lead in the second half and then fought off an LSU comeback bid down the stretch. The win was the Commodores' fourth straight and their 13th in the past 14 games.

Danielle Ballard finished with 23 points for LSU (14-4, 3-2) and

Theresa Plaisance added 16.

Foggie and Lister combined to go 13-of-24 from the floor, including 5-of-9 from 3-point range. Lister, the reigning SEC and espnW Player of the Week, was 10-of-10 from the foul line and also dished out a team-high seven assists.

Morgan Batey added 11 points, four rebounds and three assists for Vanderbilt.

Lister said she and Foggie were simply being opportunistic while leading Vanderbilt to its third win over a ranked opponent this month.

"We just both took what the defense gave us, and what the offense gave us as well," said Lister. "Our team just executed well and set good screens. ... It's a team effort and our team did a great job of finding us shots."

Vanderbilt entered the weekend as the SEC leaders -- and ranked among the Top-5 in the nation -- in field goal percentage and 3-point percentage. And the Commodores showed why against LSU. They shot 52 percent from the floor, including 59 percent in the second half, and finished 7-of-11 from 3-point range (63.6).

Vanderbilt also made 24-of-30 attempts from the foul line and the solid work at the line came in handy down the stretch. After seeing LSU trim Vanderbilt's 20-point lead down to seven with 90 seconds to play. Vanderbilt hit 5-of-6 free throws to close out the win.

Freshman Kylee Smith finished with eight points and five rebounds for the Commodores, and made a series of big plays down the stretch. Kady Schrann also had eight points, and Marqu'es Webb had six rebounds.

Early in the game, it appeared that Vanderbilt was in for dogfight against LSU. The first half featured seven lead changes and four ties, and the Commodores owned a 29-26 lead at the break.

But Vanderbilt opened the second half with a 15-5 run that included 3-pointers by Foggie and Schrann to extend the lead to 44-31 with 14:37 to go. The advantage eventually swelled to 62-42 after a pull-up jumper by Jasmine Jenkins with 6:58 to play.

At that point, it seemed the Commodores were cruising. But LSU wasn't finished. The Tigers reeled off a 19-6 run to get back in the game, and twice drew as close as seven points, the final time coming at 70-63 after two free throws by Plaisance with 1:30 left.

But Foggie converted a layun on Vanderbilt's next possession and Lister followed with a pair of free throws to push the lead back to 11 points, and Commodores held on from there

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - For the past two months, the Vanderbilt women's team has been in high gear on its home floor.

On Sunday afternoon, the Commodores ran into a road block. Facing a South Carolina team that used its size and aggressiveness to block eight shots and limit Vanderbilt to a season-low 37 percent shooting from the floor, the No. 16/19 Commodores lost a nail-biter in Nashville, suffering a 61-57 loss to the No. 10/11 Gamecocks.

Tiffany Mitchell scored a team-high 14 points for South Carolina (18-2, 6-1), including two pivotal baskets in the final 50 seconds to break open a tie game and help the Gamecocks down Vanderbilt (16-4, 5-2) for the second time this season. South Carolina did a great job," said head coach Melanie Balcomb.

They stayed disciplined on our personnel for 40 minutes and don't think we did that as well as them."

The loss ended the Commodores' four-game SEC winning streak and their eight-game home winning streak that dated back to a loss to Marquette on Nov. 17.

"It's definitely a frustrating loss," said senior guard Christina Foggie, who finished with a team-high 20 points for Vanderbilt, "but we still had a lot of positives in the game. We played pretty tough for the whole game. So we will watch the film and keep moving on to the next game."

The Commodores came into the day with hopes of continuing their trend of special Sundays. They knocked off LSU at home last Sunday, and beat Tennessee seven days before that. But South Carolina's defense prevented Vanderbilt from adding another upset to the list.

The Commodores entered the day as the SEC leaders in field-goal percentage and 3-point percentage, but finished just 1-of-5 from 3-point range and were 22-of-59 from the floor overall.

South Carolina -- which leads the SEC in blocked shots and ranks second in 3-point defense -- held Jasmine Lister to a season-low four points. She came into the game averaging 16.8 points per game, and was averaging a team-high 20.7 points per game in conference play.

"I thought they did a great job trailing Jas, sticking with her and not giving her enough open looks," said head coach Melanie Balcomb."They really used their size advantage to take her out of being able to make those big plays (that she usually makes)."

Vanderbilt also struggled from the foul line, going 12-of-19 (63.2), which is well below the Commodores' 77 percent season average. But despite all the cold shooting, Vanderbilt was in position to possible pull off the win. Battling back from a six-point deficit, the Commodores tied the game at 55-55 on a pair of free throws by Marqu'es Webb with 1:20 to play.

Then Mitchell went to work.

With the shot clocking winding down, she hit a twisting layup to give the Gamecocks a 57-55 lead with 50 seconds left. On Vanderbilt's ensuing possession, Mitchell came up with a pivotal steal that she converted into a layup to put South Carolina ahead, 59-55 with 32 seconds left and the Gamecocks held on from there.

"We definitely believe we were in a really good spot -- tied with less than a minute left," said Foggie. "We talked about how we need to dig down and play smarter in that last possession where we left an open layup. That's just where we need to get better as a team.'

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Vanderbilt's Jasmine Lister broke a school record Thursday night, but she didn't feel like celebrating.

Although Lister became the program's all-time leader in minutes played, that was little consolation on a night when a huge Commodore comeback bid ultimately fell short and No. 16/18 Vanderbilt suffered a 59-54 loss to Missouri on the road. Missouri (14-7, 3-5) snapped a four-game SEC losing skid, while Vanderbilt (16-5, 5-3) lost its second straight.

The Commodores endured an uncharacteristically poor shooting night -- finishing 22.2 percent from the floor -- but still had a chance to win in the final minute.

Down by 16 early in the second half, the Commodores charged back to cut it to 55-54 after a three-point play by Kylee Smith with 52 seconds left. Vanderbilt then had the ball with a chance to take the lead, but a traveling call gave the ball back to the Tigers.

Missouri hit four straight free throws in the final 16 seconds to win it.

Lister played all 40 minutes of the game, bringing her career total to 4,260 and enabling her to surpass former Vanderbilt record holder Zuzi Klimesova, who played 4,249 minutes in her career from 1999-02. Christina Foggie scored a team-high 10 points for Vanderbilt, but was 1-of-9 from the floor, including 0-for-6 from 3-point range. No other Vanderbilt player reached double figures, and the Commodores, who are the SEC's best 3-point shooting team, finished 2-of-16 from long range Vanderbilt was 14-of-63 from the floor for the game.

Missouri's Bri Kulas led all scorers with 15 points. The Commodores endured a frustrating first half -- making just 7-of-30 shots (23.3 percent) -- and went to the locker room trailing 33-20. Vanderbilt went the final 6:48 of the half without a field goal, a rare stretch for a team that entered the night ranked second in the SEC and

seventh in the nation in field goal percentage (48.6). Lister and Foggie both were just 1-of-4 from the floor in the opening half. Lister's 3-pointer with 8:55 left in the half tied the game at 13-13,

but Missouri broke things open with a 16-2 run to build a 29-15 lead. Vanderbilt went 5-of-6 at the foul line in the final 2:39 of the half to keep the deficit from becoming even larger.

The game featured the SEC's top two scorers -- Vanderbilt's Foggie (who

entered the night averaging 19.5 points per game) and Missouri's (18.8).

Entering the game, Vanderbilt was shooting 42.2 percent from 3-point range for the season, which ranked first in the conference and second in the nation.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb was under the weather on Sunday morning

Sophomore Morgan Batey helped her coach feel much better by mid-afternoon.

Batey scored a career-high 17 points, including knocking down the game-winning free throws with 2.2 seconds remaining that lifted No. 16/18 Vanderbilt to a 71-69 victory over No. 17/15 Texas A&M at Memorial Gym.

The victory enabled the Commodores (17-5, 6-3 SEC) to snap a two-game losing skid and saddle Texas A&M (17-6, 7-2) with its first road SEC loss of the season.

Batey finished 5-of-7 from the floor and 7-of-7 from the foul line while easily surpassing her previous career high of 11 points. She also pulled down a team-high six rebounds.

"I've talked to Morgan for the last two weeks about just getting back to doing her job," said Balcomb. "She knows what her job and her role is, and ... when she does that, she all of a sudden becomes a star, doing the little things."

Texas A&M's Karla Gilbert, who finished with a game-high 26 points, tied the score at 69-all when she converted a three-point play with 10 seconds left.

Batey was fouled on the Commodores' next possession, and hit both free throws. The Aggies then had one final chance, but Jordan Jones' desperation shot from long range bounced off the rim at the

"My heart skipped a beat," said Batey about the near-miss. Batey provided a series of pivotal plays in the final three minutes Sunday, scoring nine of Vanderbilt's final 11 points, including going 5-of-5 at the foul line in that stretch.

"I just tried to take what the defense gave me," she said. She had to sit out long stretches during the game due to foul trouble, but she contributed when it mattered most.

"I'm just really proud of how she was in foul trouble, but she didn't let that take her out of her job," said Balcomb. "She was very intentional on what she was doing. In the first half, she was in foul trouble and that can really take kids out of it. For her to be able to finish the game and not foul out was a big growth for her."

Balcomb said the victory was a nice boost, although she couldn't officially relax until Jones' last-second shot bounced off the rim.

"That last shot? Absolutely, I thought that shot was in," she said. "I

was like, 'No this is not happening.'" Christina Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, added 14 points and Jasmine Lister had 11 for the Commodores, who rebounded nicely from their worst shooting performance of the season during Thursday's loss to Missouri.

Vanderbilt, which ranks 10th in the nation in field-goal percentage, shot a season-low 22 percent against Missouri, but the Commodores regained their form against the Aggies by shooting $55\ percent$ in the second half. Vanderbilt was also solid at the foul line, finishing 16-of-17 (94 percent).

The Commodores were plagued by foul trouble much of the way, but were buoyed by the efforts of Raytea Long, Kylee Smith and Jasmine Jenkins off the bench.

They combined for 15 points while going 6-of-11 from the floor, and they each contributed big plays down the stretch.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team won't have much time to reflect on Monday's game. And it's doubtful the Commodores will even want to.

Traveling to Knoxville for a rare Monday night game, No. 16/19 Vanderbilt was handed its worst loss of the season, falling to No. 8/8 Tennessee, 81-53, before a crowd of 11,384.

The Commodores (17-6, 6-4) entered the game with hopes of registering a season sweep of the Lady Vols (20-4, 9-2) after they beat Tennessee 74-63 in Nashville last month. But Vanderbilt fell behind by 11 points at the half and then saw the deficit swell throughout the final 20 minutes.

"We didn't get stops on the defensive end and that made us tight on offense," said Vanderbilt senior guard Jasmine Lister. "We just didn't execute the game plan in the second half. We came out really

Christina Foggie finished with 22 points to lead the Commodores (17-6, 6-4), who will have to regroup quickly. They have two games in the next six days -- hosting Auburn on Thursday and traveling to Miss. State on Sunday -- and will be looking to correct the defensive

problems they had against Tennessee on Monday.

Meighan Simmons scored 22 points and Isabelle Harrison added 18 for the Lady Vols (20-4, 9-2). The two players combined to go 17-of-25 from the floor.

"They were very aggressive from the tip," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "They set the tone inside (early on). They dictated what they wanted to do and stayed with that throughout the game."

Fueled by five early 3-pointers by Foggie, the Commodores faced a workable 32-28 deficit with 3:21 left before halftime. Then Tennessee took over.

The Lady Vols closed the first half on a 10-3 surge to extend their lead to 42-31 and then opened the second half with an 18-2 run to push the advantage to 60-33.

Vanderbilt missed 12 straight shots to open the second half before Jasmine Lister hit a 3-pointer at 10:35 mark for the Commodores' first field goal of the half.

For the night, Tennessee outscored Vanderbilt in the paint, 36-18 and won the rebounding war, 34-20.

The Lady Vols shot 65 percent from the floor in the first half and 58 percent for the game. The Commodores, normally one of the best shooting teams in the conference, shot just 41 percent from the floor.

For Tennessee, Harrison was 8-of-10 from the floor and Simmons was 9-of-15.

Vanderbilt freshman Marqu'es Webb scored 12 points and was the only Commodore to join Foggie in double figures.

NOTE: With her five three pointers, Foggie now has 254 for her career, and needs just two more to tie the Vanderbilt all-time record set by Meredith Marsh (256).

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Senior Christina Foggie continues to move up the charts on several of Vanderbilt's all-time lists. But for now, it's a sure bet that she and the No. 16/20 Commodores are more concerned with the fact that they aren't moving up the standings in the SEC.

Last FG - AU 2nd-00:24, VANDY 2nd-02:08. Largest lead - AU by 8 1st-17:37, VANDY by 2 2nd-02:08.

Thursday night's 68-62 home loss to Auburn -- which ended Vander-bilt's staggering 21-game winning streak against the Tigers -- was the Commodores' fourth loss in the past five games and dropped them to 6-5 in the conference (17-7 overall).

Foggie had another huge game, scoring 23 of her game-high 24 points in the second half. In the process, she reached two monumental milestones -- tying former star Merideth Marsh for the program's record for career 3-pointers (with 256) and moving into the Top-10 on Vanderbilt's alltime scoring list.

But her explosive second half wasn't enough for the Commodores, who saw Auburn (14-10, 5-6) score the final six points of the game after the teams were tied at 62-62 with 39 seconds left.

"Foggie's a great offensive player, but we're not going to win a lot of games with one kid scoring," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "Every-body in this program can score and, if we would execute and stick to our game plan, they would score. But we're not doing a good job of sticking with our game plan."

Auburn's Tyrese Tanner scored a game-high 18 points, including a basket in the paint with 24 seconds left that put the Tigers ahead for good. Auburn's defense then came up with two straight stops, and the Tigers hit four straight free throws -- two each by Peyton Davis and Kiani Parker -- to seal the win.

Brandy Montgomery finished with 13 points for the Tigers, who earned their first win over the Commodores since beating Vanderbilt 55-54 in Nashville on Jan. 16, 2000.

Vanderbilt was hoping Thursday's game would be the perfect opportunity to bounce back from Monday's 81-53 defeat to Tennessee. Instead, the Commodores suffered a home loss for only the third time this season.

"We thought we learned from our mistakes against Tennessee," said Jasmine Lister, who was limited to eight points, "but I don't think we made those adjustments in the game.

Vanderbilt trailed 29-21 at the half and was down 52-47 with 7:30 to play before the Commodores put together a 6-0 run to take their first lead of the second half, 53-52, on a pair of free throws by Morgan Batey with 5:48 to go.

The teams then traded clutch baskets for the next five minutes, with six lead changes and three ties in that stretch, while playing to a 62-62 tie with under a minute to go. But Auburn made the big plays in the final 30seconds to grab the win

"Auburn came out ready to play," said Lister. "I don't think we came out as aggressive and intense as we should have coming off a loss."

Foggie was the lone player to finish in double figures for the Commodores, who shot just 43 percent from the floor -- including 33 percent in

the first half -- during the loss.

The upside to the defeat was that Foggie certainly provided some notable highlights. With her second 3-pointer of the second half, which came at the 8:30 mark, she tied Marsh for the program's all-time record for career 3-pointers.

Foggie also climbed three spots on Vanderbilt's all-time scoring list and moved into the Top-10 by surpassing two former Commodore legendary players, Heidi Gillingham and Christina Wirth. Foggie now has 1,613 points in her career, and ranks eighth on the all-time list.

STARKVILLE, **Miss**. - After a joyous January, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team is enduring a frustrating February. And not even a record-setting achievement by Christina Foggie could ease the pain Sunday.

could ease the pain Sunday.

The No. 16/20 Commodores lost their third straight game, falling to Miss. State, 64-62, in Starkville.

Martha Alwal's basket in the paint with three seconds left broke a 62-62 tie and lifted the Bulldogs (17-9, 4-8) to their first win over Vanderbilt (17-8, 6-6) since the 2009-10 season. Alwal finished with a game-high 23 points.

"You don't want a game to come down to the last possession on the road," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "When it does, it's not going to be in your favor."

Foggie, who scored a team-high 15 points despite being hampered by foul trouble, became Vanderbilt's all-time leader in 3-pointers when she knocked down a shot from the corner with 4:37 left in the first half. It was the 257th of her career, enabling her to surpass former Commodore standout Merideth Marsh atop the list. Marsh made 256 during her career from 2007-10.

But Foggie's record-breaking basket ultimately proved to be the day's most memorable element for the Commodores, who continued their recent trend of hard-luck losses. They've gone 1-5 in their past six games, and four of the losses have been decided in the final minute.

Sophomore Morgan Batey had a double-double, finishing with 13 points and 11 rebounds for the Commodore, and Jasmine Lister also had 13 points for Vanderbilt.

Breanna Richardson finished with 16 for Miss. State, which ended a six-game losing streak in the series.

Vanderbilt built a 10-point lead midway through the first half, and owned a 28-21 lead at the break. But Miss. State rallied back to take its first lead of the game, 50-49, on a basket by Dominique Dillingham with 7:17 to go, and the teams traded clutch baskets the rest of the way.

Foggie tied the game at 62-62 with a fade-away jumper with 15 seconds to go, but Alwal answered with the game-winner with 3.3 seconds left. Vanderbilt then had one final possession, but didn't get a shot off.

Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, was limited to 27 minutes of action due to foul problems, and Balcomb said the Commodores didn't respond well when she out of the game.

"When Foggie is out, she can't win the game because she's sitting on the side," said Balcomb. "You've got to make plays when your scorer isn't on the floor anymore."

Balcomb said some of her players need to be willing to take more shots.

"I think we've got a lot of players just hiding and they're now being exposed," she said. "They've got to make plays on both ends of the

Both teams shot the ball effectively in the second half, with Vanderbilt making 13-of-21 attempts (61.9 percent) and Miss. State going 15-of-25 (60 percent). But the Commodores missed some costly free throws, going 6-of-11 in the final 20 minutes and they finished 12-of-19 for the game. Miss. State was 16-of-20 at the line.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. - If the Vanderbilt women are going to make any noise in March, they need to regain the form they showed in lanuary.

And that's what the Commodores did on Thursday night.
Relocating their shooting touch that has been absent in recent
days, the Commodores snapped a three-game losing skid by outlasting Arkansas 56-50 in an SEC thriller in Fayetteville.
Vanderbilt (18-8, 7-6) was clinging to a two-point lead in the final

vanderbilt (18-8, 7-6) was enliging to a two-point lead in the fina 30 seconds before Christina Foggie hit 2-of-2 free throws with 2.9 seconds left to stretch the lead to four. Vanderbilt then stole the inbounds pass to secure the win over the stubborn Razorbacks (17-9, 4-9).

Morgan Batey scored a career-high 18 points, finishing 8-of-14

from the floor, before fouling out with 1:12 to go. Christina Foggie added 11 for Vanderbilt, which shot 46.9 percent from the floor. Jessica Jackson led Arkansas with 18.

The Commodores trailed 26-25 at the half, but opened the second half with a 13-2 run -- capped by Lister's 3-pointer -- for a 38-28 lead with 14:26 to play.

Arkansas battled back to make it tight down the stretch, but the Commodores never gave up the lead.

Vanderbilt entered the night having lost five of its past six games -- a stretch that included four close-call losses that were decided in the final minute of the game. Vanderbilt shot just 40 percent from the floor in these six games.

the floor in those six games.

Prior to that, Vanderbilt had been on a tear, winning five of its first six SEC games while shooting 47 percent from the floor.

Against Arkansas, the Commodores shot 52 percent in the first half and 46 percent for the game, which helped them overcome a rough night at the foul line, where they made just 8-of-18 attempts. Arkansas has been one of the nation's best defensive teams this

Arkansas has been one of the nation's best defensive teams this season. The Razorbacks entered Thursday's game allowing only 52.2 points per game, which ranks first in the conference and second in the nation.

Arkansas owned a 26-25 at the end of a hotly-contested first half that featured seven ties and eight lead changes. Batey had a big first half for Vanderbilt, hitting 5-of-6 shots and

Batey had a big first half for Vanderbilt, hitting 5-of-6 shots and scoring 10 points. Webb added six points for the Commodores, who shot 52 percent from the floor (12-of-23).

Kady Schrann made Vanderbilt's only 3-pointer of the first half, as the Commodores were limited to two attempts from long range. Vanderbilt shot just one free throw in the opening half.

Struggling to find a flow on the offensive end, Vanderbilt trailed 21-17 late in the first half before putting together a 6-0 run -- with baskets from Foggie, Batey and Webb -- to jump in front 23-21. Foggie then gave Vanderbilt a 25-23 lead with 47 seconds left in the half, but Arkansas answered with a 3-point play for a 26-25 halftime lead.

Despite their recent struggles, Vanderbilt entered Thursday's game ranked first in the SEC -- and fourth in the nation -- in field goal percentage (40.9 percent). Vanderbilt also ranked second in the conference and ninth in the nation in 3-point percentage (46.8).

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Traditionally, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team has dominated the two SEC teams from the state of Alabama. This season, the routine has been altered.

Just 10 days after being upset by Auburn on their home floor, the Commodores suffered another stinging loss Sunday, when Alabama posted its first-ever win in Nashville with a 66-62 victory.

Vanderbilt came into the day having won 12 straight against Alabama and 17 of the past 18 matchups between the teams. But this time, the

Tide came up with the big plays.

Alabama's Daisha Simmons, who finished a game-high 21 points, scored the game-clinching basket with 14 seconds left, giving the Tide (13-14, 6-8) a four-point lead and essentially sealing another last-minute loss for Vanderbilt (18-9, 7-7).

It was the sixth defeat in the past eight games for the Commodores -and five of those losses have been decided in the final 60 seconds. Now, with two games remaining in the regular season, the Vanderbilt

players know they need to finish strong.
"We really don't want to end the season on a down note," said senior
Christina Foggie, who finished with a game-high 22 points. "We have two
choices and we want to choose to fight back and end the season in the
(most) positive way we can. It's just about bouncing back from this loss."

Vanderbilt had history on its side Sunday, with the Commodores owning a 17-0 record against Alabama in Nashville. But the success of the past hasn't been a propelling factor in recent days for the Commodores, who saw their 21-game winning streak against Auburn come to end last week. Head coach Melanie Balcomb said her team is relying too heavily on

Head coach Melanie Balcomb said her team is relying too heavily on its seniors to carry the offensive load after watching her team lose to Alahama for the first time since the 2003-2004 season.

Alabama for the first time since the 2003-2004 season. "Offensively, we were living and dying off of Christina Foggie's 3's instead of executing our offense," said Balcomb, who is now 13-2 against the Tide in her career at Vanderbilt. "There were too many outside shots that we expected to go in."

Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, finished 7-of-19 from the floor, including 3-of-12 from 3-point range. Jasmine Lister had seven points and eight assists.

Freshman Kylee Smith had one of her best games of the season, finishing with nine points and nine rebounds while helping fuel a Vanderbilt comeback bid in the second half.

"Kylee Smith -- she did everything we asked," said Balcomb. "She was fearless and relentless, didn't hang her head at mistakes, and was aggressive. I think Heather (Bowe) did a good job. ... They were both bright spots."

Trailing 59-50 with 5:56 to play, the Commodores roared back with a 10-3 run -- which featured two baskets by Foggie and one each by Smith and Bowe -- to pull within 62-60 on Foggie's layup with 1:14 to go.

Alabama's Ashley Williams, who scored 18 points, then pushed the Tide's lead back to four points with a basket in the paint with 50 seconds remaining before Vanderbilt cut the lead back to two on Bowe's layup with 44 seconds left.

Alabama, however, had one last answer, as Simmons scored in the lane with 14 seconds left to essentially secure the win.

with 14 seconds left to essentially secure the win.

"Defensive awareness was one of our keys to the game, and I don't think we as a whole team we were determined to get a stop," said Lister. "I think just being more consistent on defense was something we really needed to do."

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Over the past four years, Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister have compiled a massive collection of happy memories at Memorial Gym.

Their final home game won't be one of them.

On an emotional Senior Night at the historic gym, the Commodores suffered a 73-68 loss to Florida before a crowd of 3,338. It was Vanderbilt's seventh loss in the past nine games, and dropped the Commodores to 18-10 overall and 7-8 in the SEC. Florida improved to 18-10, 8-7.

Foggie scored a game-high 24 points and Lister added nine points and seven rebounds for the Commodores, who fell behind 23-6 in the opening 10 minutes of the first half and then saw a second-half comeback bid fall short.

It was an unfitting farewell for Lister and Foggie. The record-breaking backcourt duo, who are two of the most celebrated players in team history, were hoping for one last taste of Memorial Magic in their final regular-season home game, but the Gators prevented it.

Although Vanderbilt trimmed Florida's lead to three points on four occasions in the final eight minutes, the Gators always had an answer whenever Vanderbilt threatened. Florida's Cassie People's hit one of the night's biggest shots when she knocked down a 3-pointer with 3:57 to go after Vanderbilt had pulled within three points.

"I think it was just about (us not) getting a stop when we needed to," said Foggie. "I don't think we communicated as much as we needed to, and I think they just made timely 3s in clutch situations."

Florida's Carlie Needles sealed the win for the Gators when she hit two free throws with five seconds remaining to push Florida's lead to 73-68 after Foggie had pulled the Commodores within three points on a jumper with seven seconds remaining. Head coach Melanie Balcomb said her team continues to struggle

to come up with timely plays on defense.

"We changed every defense you could possibly change," she said, "(but) at some point you have to stop somebody and all be on the same page. The tough thing is we keep putting ourselves in that situation and we did a great job of fighting back to get there but then we have to be able to finish it."

Freshman Kylee Smith finished with 15 points and five rebounds for the Commodores, and sophomore Morgan Batey had her second career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds.

Vanderbilt's Kristen Gaffney, who has been sidelined by knee

injuries since the beginning of last season, made her debut with the Commodores. Logging five minutes of action, Gaffney had two rebounds and two assists.

Jaterra Bonds finished with 18 to lead Florida.

Foggie and Lister, who were honored before the game, have rewritten the record book at Vanderbilt. Foggie is the program's alltime leader in 3-pointers and is ranked No. 7 on the school's career scoring list. Lister is Vanderbilt's all-time leader in minutes played and ranks third in career assists.

Together, they have been apart of 54 victories at Memorial Gym during their careers, including two memorable victories over instate rival Tennessee and a series of other wins over ranked foes. But the final stretch of home games for the two seniors hasn't

gone as expected, with Vanderbilt losing three straight games in Nashville

LEXINGTON, Kv. - Although Vanderbilt lost another down-to-thewire contest Sunday, the Commodores came away feeling encouraged -- not dejected.

Facing No. 12-ranked Kentucky in the regular-season for both teams, the Commodores gave the high-powered Wildcats all they could handle before eventually being saddled with a 65-63 loss in Lexington.

Jasmine Jenkins' potential game-trying shot missed the mark at the buzzer, sending the Commodores -- who had fought back from a 17-point first-half-deficit -- to their third straight loss. Kentucky made seven of eight attempts from the foul line in the final 50 seconds to fend off the Commodores.

Vanderbilt (18-11, 7-9), which lost for the eighth time in the past 10 games, will now head into the SEC tournament as the No. 8 seed. and will face No. 9-seeded on Thursday in Duluth, Ga. The Wildcats (22-7, 10-6) will be the No. 4 seed and will get a double-bye into Friday's quarterfinals.

"Losing is a great teacher," said Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb. "We haven't lost (this many games) in years, so we are learning a lot. (And) I like how my team is responding. I like our chances in postseason, to be honest with you."
Christina Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, had a game-high 23

points and Jasmine Lister added 15 for the Commodores. DeNasha Stallworth led the Wildcats with 18.

Vanderbilt's Kristen Gaffney, who made her college debut on Thursday, scored the first points of her career, finishing with six points and five rebounds.

The forward from Cary, N.C., who has been sidelined by knee inju-

ries since the start of last season, logged 29 minutes of playing time. The frantic finish to the contest was nothing new for the Commodores, who have now lost seven games by six points or less since Jan. 26. All six came down to the final minute.

But Sunday's game, unlike some of the others, didn't leave the Commodores feeling disheartened. If anything, it gave the Vanderbilt players and coaches a sense of optimism about next week's

"I'm really proud of my team and their effort," said Balcomb. "We were down 17 points and fought back in a very tough environment against the No. 12 team in the country. My heart is not broken. It gives us a lot of hope for next week."

Foggie agreed, saying the Commodores gained confidence despite

the outcome.
"I felt like it was the best teamwork we have had in a long time," said Foggie. I felt a lot of unity and communication. I really trusted that everyone had each other's back on defense and on offense. I wasn't hitting shots right away, but my teammates had a lot of belief in me. I think that is huge going into the tournament is sticking together and having that team work."

Vanderbilt appeared to be in big trouble Sunday when the Wildcats -- the top-scoring team in the conference -- ripped off 10 straight points to build a 32-15 lead at the 6:47 mark of the first

But the Commodores quickly fought back, putting together an 18-2 run that quieted the energetic crowd of 6,551. Unable to break out of the funk that they have been trapped in for the past several weeks, the No. 8-seeded Commodores lost their SEC Tournament opener on Thursday, falling to No. 9-seeded Georgia, 53-43, at the Arena at Gwinnett Center.

The defeat stretched the Commodores' losing streak to four games, and marked the first time since 1999 that Vanderbilt has failed to win at least one game in the SEC Tournament.

Georgia's Khaalidah Miller scored 12 points to lead the Lady Bulldogs (20-10), who will face top-seeded South Carolina on Friday.

Christina Foggie finished with a game-high 19 points and Kylee Smith had 10 for the Commodores (18-12), who have gone 2-9 since Jan. 20. "We've been on a stretch where we haven't finished games," said head

coach Melanie Balcomb. "I don't think our mentality was where it needed to be (today)."

Now, the Commodores -- who lost six of their final seven games in the regular season -- will have to wait to see if they receive a bid to the NCAA Tournament. Vanderbilt has made the NCAA tournament 14 consecutive seasons, including making 11 straight appearances since Balcomb's

The Commodores were hoping to use Thursday's game as a chance to strengthen their case to make this year's tournament. Instead, they endured a rough afternoon in which they produced their lowest scoring total of the season and struggled badly at the free throw line, making just 6-of-20 attempts.

Georgia's defense limited Vanderbilt to 17 total field goals, and Lady Bulldogs won the rebounding battle, 35-28, including collecting 13 rebounds on the offensive glass.

"Georgia came ready to play and worked really hard, dominated us on

the boards, was more physical, more aggressive, got a lot more shots," said Balcomb. "They earned this victory. They did a great job." Vanderbilt, which beat Georgia 66-58 in the SEC opener for both teams on Jan. 2, shot just 30 percent from the floor in the first 20 minutes and trailed 28-15 at the half. The Commodores trimmed Georgia's lead to 32-24 when Foggie converted a 3-point play at the 16:19 mark of the second half, but Georgia responded with back-to-back 3-pointers by Erika Ford and Miller to push the lead back to 38-24.

The Commodores never got within 10 points the rest of the way.

"We weren't as aggressive as (they were) from the jump, neither on defense or offense," said Vanderbilt senior Jasmine Lister, who finished with six points after being limited to only six shots from the floor. "We let them take us out of our offense."

The afternoon started promisingly for the Commodores when Foggie hit

a pair of early 3-pointers to give Vanderbilt a quick 6-0 lead, but Georgia responded with seven straight points to move in front. Vanderbilt briefly rebuilt a three-point lead, 12-9, when Foggie hit a layup with 9:44 left in the half. Then the Commodores went cold.

They went the next nine minutes without a field goal -- and were

outscored 19-1 in that stretch -- before Marqu'es Webb finally ended the drought with a basket in the paint with 34 seconds left in the half. Vanderbilt went to the locker room trailing 28-15 after their lowestscoring first half of the season.

The Commodores opened the second half with a quick flurry of success, making their first four shots in the opening 3:40 of the half. But Vander-bilt then endured another lull, making just two baskets during the next eight-plus minutes as Georgia pulled away for good.
