SO, WE MEET AGAIN

Today's game between Vanderbilt and Duke marks the seventh time the teams have played, and the Blue Devils own a 4-2 lead in the series.

The most recent meeting came in the second round of the 2011-12 NCAA tournament, when Duke downed the Commodores, 96-80, in Nashville.

Today is the third time the teams have played in Durham, with Duke winning the previous two -- posting a 68-59 win during the 1999-2000 season and a 69-48 victory in the 2006-07 season.

HITTING THE ROAD

The trip to Duke is Vanderbilt's first road game of the season after starting the season with four straight home games.

FIRST TASTE OF DEFEAT

After opening the season with three consecutive wins, the Commodores suffered their first loss on Sunday, falling at home to Marquette, 82-77.

The Commodores built a 14-point lead in the first half but then ran into major foul trouble in the final 20 minutes and Marquette closed the game on an 11-4 run to secure the win.

The contest saw the teams combine for a staggering 63 fouls and 74 free throws. Marqu'es Webb, Kylee Smith and Morgan Batey all fouled out for Vanderbilt

Christina Foggie had another huge game for Vanderbilt, scoring 30 points (four shy of her career high) while going 16-of-18 at the foul line. She was joined in double figures by three of her teammates: Jasmine Lister with 13 points, Rebekah Dahlman with 12 and Jasmine Jenkins 10.

But the balanced scoring wasn't enough to offset a second-half comeback by the feisty Golden Eagles, who proved to be the more aggressive team in the second half -- as evidenced by the stat sheet.

Vanderbilt, which owned a 47-36 lead at the half, shot 26 free throws in the first 20 minutes, compared to Marquette's 10. But the second half featured 24 free throws by the Golden Eagles, while Vanderbilt shot 14. Marquette's intensity was also reflected in the rebounding stats, as they won the battle on the glass, 25-13, in the final 20 minutes (and 37-31 for the game).

"The first four minutes of the second half really changed the game," said Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb. "They came out more aggressive after halftime and we didn't. We have to figure out why. ... I really thought we had built confidence and we were going to continue to be the aggressor and we weren't."

FOGGIE ON FIRE

Christina Foggie is off to a great start in her senior season, averaging 20.5 points per game.

She notched her first-career double-double last week against Delaware State (with 16 points and 10 points), and followed that up with a 30-point effort (four points shy of her career high) against Marquette.

Foggie, who led the SEC in scoring as a sophomore, is 31-of-34 (91.2 percent) at the foul line this season.

She made 16-of-18 from the line against Marquette, and fell just short of a record-setting day. She was one short of the Vanderbilt all-time record for free throws attempted (set by Ashley McElhiney with 19 in Feb., 2001) and two shy for free throws made in a game (18 by McElhiney).

AT THE POLLS

Vanderbilt broke into the USA Today poll last week, coming in at No. 25, but fell out of the rankings this week after the loss to Marquette on Sunday at home.

The Commodores received 12 votes this week in the USA Today poll and eight votes in the AP poll.

RIGHT AT HOME

Sunday's loss to Marguette was a rare home defeat for the Commodores, who entered the game having won 32 of their previous 35 games at Memorial Gym.

The Commodores went 12-2 at home last season, with both losses coming to ranked foes -- No. 9/9 Tennessee and No. 10/8 Kentucky.

Prior to the Marguette game, Vanderbilt had only four home losses since the start of the 2011-12 season, falling to South Carolina, Duke (second round of the NCAA Tournament), Tennessee and Kentucky.

FINDING A BLEND

Vanderbilt has used a mixture of veterans and newcomers in the starting lineup this season.

Senior guards Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister have joined three underclassmen -- sophomore Heather Bowe and freshmen Rebekah Dahlman and Marqu'es Webb -- to form the Commodores' first five in each of the first three games.

Foggie has paced the offense, averaging 17.3 points in the three games, and has connected on 9-of-20 shots (45 percent) from 3-point range.

Dahlman is averaging 16. 3 points per game. She set a new Vanderbilt record when she scored 23 points in the season opener, marking the highest point total by a debuting freshman in the history of the program.

LISTER, FOGGIE NAMED FIRST TEAM ALL-SEC

The Commodores are gaining plenty of early-season attention, both collectively and individually.

Senior guards Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie were named First Team All-SEC by the conference's coaches. Vanderbilt was one of only two schools (along with Tennessee) to have two players named to the eight-member First Team.

Lister and Foggie, the lone seniors on the Vanderbilt roster, have been integral parts of the Commodore program for the past four seasons. They both have scored more than 1,000 points in the careers.

Tennessee's Meighan Simmons was the choice of the coaches for SEC Player of the Year with seven votes; the remaining votes were given to Kentucky's DeNesha Stallworth (three), LSU's Theresa Plaisance (three) and Vanderbilt's Foggie (one).

Joining Simmons, Stallworth, Plaisance and Foggie on the All-SEC First Team were Aleighsa Welch, South Carolina; Bashaara Graves, Tennessee; Courtney Walker, Texas A&M; and Lister, Vanderbilt.

The second team consists of Hasina Muhammad, Auburn; Jaterra Bonds, Florida; Shacobie Barbee, Georgia; Samarie Walker, Kentucky; Jennifer O'Neil, Kentucky; Danielle Ballard, LSU; Valencia McFarland, Ole Miss; Martha Alwal, Mississippi State.

MOVING UP THE CHARTS

Foggie and Lister continue to steadily climb the all-time scoring list at Vanderbilt.

Lister has amassed 1,241 points total points, and ranks 22rd on the list. She recently surpassed former Commodore standout and current TV sports personality Carolyn Peck. Foggie currently sits at No. 24 with 1,236 career points, and needs just six points to move past Peek.

Lister and Foggie, close friends off the floor, each surpassed the 1,000-point milestone last season.

Lister became the 36th player in Vanderbilt history to reach the mark In the first half of last season's game at LSU after Foggie accomplished the feat earlier in the season.

The two players have a realistic opportunity of ending their Vanderbilt careers in the top 10 in scoring.

Head coach Melanie Balcomb has been watching the Foggie/Lister combination for the past three years, and she knows how important the senior duo will be this season.



As the season moves along, we'll be charting the progress of seniors Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister as they continue to work their way up the charts in multiple categories among Vanderbilt's all-time leaders.

"They are the bread and butter of our program right now," said Balcomb about the seniors. "They've matured on a consistent level each year and I am excited to see what they are going to do.

"Each year they've improved, each year they've matured and each year they've (gained) a better understanding of what it takes to be successful at the highest level — in the SEC and nationally."

BALCOMB IS NO. 1 ON THE LIST

Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb, now in her 12th season with the Commodores, was honored before the Appalachian State game earlier this week for becoming the school's all-time wins leader in last year's regular season home finale.

Balcomb became the career wins leader with Vanderbilt's 59-44 win over Auburn on Feb. 28, 2013. The win was Balcomb's 257th of her career, and enabled her to surpass former VU coach Jim Foster.

"It wasn't anything I was looking forward to or shooting at, but at the same time, it (is) nice to be recognized," said Balcomb.

"The reason I came here was because of the tradition of success that the coaches before me had," she said. "So it was an honor to be able to surpass the things that had been done here, and that obviously was something that I felt good about."

Balcomb has led her Vanderbilt teams to 20 or more wins in each of her 11 seasons, and the Commodores have advanced to the NCAA tournament each year. Her success has enabled Vanderbilt to underscore its reputation as one of the premiere programs in the nation.

"When you say Vanderbilt, you want (people) to think of the Vanderbilt's women's program," she said.

"We have such a strong history of success for the long term. Bottom line, I think its harder to be consistently good than to have one great season or one great team. That (history of success at Vanderbilt) is the biggest thing that I am proud of and that's what I want people to recognize."

Balcomb believes Vanderbilt can continue its run of excellence in the years ahead, and that the Commodores have the potential to take things to an even higher level.

"We've proven that we can win," she said. "We're not just talking about it like some programs, and hoping and having a vision. It's already been done (here) consistently. And we feel like that puts us in a category where we can just look for some game changers that are going to take us from consistently being very good to being great just by getting a few key results in."

COMMODORES PICKED FOURTH IN SEC

When the SEC coaches released their preseason ballots, the Commodores were tabbed for a fourth-place finish in the conference.

Tennessee was predicted to win the conference's regular-season championship with 167 votes. The reigning SEC regular season champions return three starters from last season's NCAA Elite Eight squad, including 2013 SEC Player of the Year Meighan Simmons and 2013 SEC Freshman of the Year Bashaara Graves.

Kentucky, LSU, Vanderbilt, South Carolina, Texas A&M and Georgia rounded out the top half of the league with Auburn, Missouri, Florida, Mississippi State, Arkansas, Ole Miss and Alabama rounding out the lower half.

The SEC is expected to be as competitive as ever this season, with as many as six teams earning spots in the top 25 in some preseason polls.

Vanderbilt was picked for a fifth-place finish by the SEC's media members in a poll that was released in October.

TURKEY TRADITION RETURNS

Vanderbilt will once again be hosting a Thanksgiving Tournament this season after a one-year break from the event. The tourney will be held Nov. 29-30 at Memorial Gym.

Joining the Commodores at this year's event will be Elon, Wisconsin and Mercer.

Last season marked the first time since 1998-99 that Vanderbilt did not host a Thanksgiving Tournament at Memorial Gym. Instead, the Commodores went to the San Juan Shootout in Guaynabo, Puerto Rico, to take on Virginia and Florida State.

It marked the first time since 1989-90 there was not any type of in-season tournament at Memorial Gym.

EXCITING CLASS

Reaping the rewards of tireless recruiting efforts, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team announced one of the best signing classes in the program's history on Wednesday.

Head coach Melanie Balcomb, along with recruiting coordinator Kim Rosamond, landed a collection of five talent-rich players who represent the No. 9 class in the nation, according to Blue Star Report. It marks the second consecutive season in which the Commodores have put together a Top-10 ranked class.

This year's group includes Paris Kea (Greensboro, N.C.), Rachel Bell (Cumberland Furnace), Christa Reed (Bay St. Louis, Miss.,) and twin sisters Audrey-Ann and Khaléann Caron-Goudreau (Gatineau, Quebec).

"I believe we have made a statement of where this program is headed with this recruiting class," said Balcomb. "To be able to sign back-to-back Top 10 classes speaks volumes about the future of Vanderbilt basketball."

A closer look at the signees:

*** Kea, an explosive 5-foot-8 point guard from Page High in Greensboro, N.C., was one of the most sought-after recruits in the nation. She was named the North Carolina Player of the Year last season by the Greensboro News & Record and Greensboro Sports.com after helping her team to a 28-2 record and the North Carolina 4A State Championship game. She averaged 14.2 points and 7.4 assists per game as a junior last season, and scored 31 points in the state championship game.

** Bell, a 5-foot-10 combo guard, is rated the No. 37 overall player by Blue Star Report. As a junior, Bell averaged 20.4 points and 5.5 rebounds per game last season at nearby Creek Wood High, helping the team post a 27-5 record in 2012-13 and earn a spot in sub-state Sweet 16.

** Reed, a 5-foot-11 combo guard, averaged 24.3 points and 4.8 rebounds per game last season while leading Bay High to a 36-0 record and the Mississippi Class 4A State Championship. The gifted shooter was the Gatorade Player of the Year last season in her home state.

** Twin sisters Audrey-Ann and Khaléann Caron-Goudreau, natives of Gatineau, Quebec, are 6-3 forwards from IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla.

Combining for 30 points per game last season -- with Audrey-Ann averaging 15.4 and Khaléann adding 14.9 -- they helped IMG Academy roll up a 42-8 record under head coach Shell Dailey.

Prior to joining IMG, the twins were selected as members of Canada's U-17 Women's National Team after helping the SSF Blizzard to the Canadian Juvenile-AAA State Championship.

"I love the balance we were able to achieve with this group of signees," said Balcomb. "We have answered every need with five players who I feel can come in and make a significant impact as freshmen.

"Each one is very versatile and brings a number of different gifts to the table," she said. "This class, combined with the players we will have returning, gives our program everything we need to compete at the highest level. Memorial Gym is going to be an exciting place to watch basketball for the next several years.

"These are not only outstanding players, they are outstanding young women," Balcomb said. "They all come from fantastic families, and we will be proud to have them represent Vanderbilt on and off the floor."

TOUTED NEWCOMERS

Last year's signing class — which featured Rebekah Dahlman, Marqu'es Webb and Kylee Smith — have brought youthful energy, and immense skill, to this year's team.

Webb, a 6-1 post player, was Miss Basketball in Alabama last season after averaging 15 points and 11 rebounds per game.

Dahlman was a McDonald's All-American during her prep career, and was named Miss Basketball in Minnesota last season following her senior year at Braham Area. She compiled a staggering 5,060 points in her prep career, becoming the first female player in Minnesota to ever surpass the 5,000-point mark.

Smith, from Alpharetta (Ga.) High, was a McDonald's All-America nominee and ranks No. 10 on the state's all-time scoring list with 2,175 career points.

BACK FOR MORE

Although Vanderbilt has a young roster, the Commodores are not short on experience.

Kady Schrann, the lone junior on the roster, missed the back half of last season with an injury, but she saw action in 22 games and averaged 6.4 points and 2.2 rebounds per game.

The Commodore roster will feature a strong collection of sophomores, all of whom saw significant playing time last season. The list features: Heather Bowe, Jasmine Jenkins, Morgan Batey, Kendall Shaw and Rayte'a Long.

Bowe was named to the SEC's All-Freshman team last year after averaging 6.2 points and 4.3 rebounds per game. The 6-0 forward played in 32 games and logged an average of 19 minutes per contest.

Jenkins, a guard, played in 25 games last season, averaging 2.3 points and 2.4 rebounds per game. Her highlights included a 10-point, four-rebound performance in Vanderbilt's win over Missouri.

Batey played in 32 games as a freshman. She came into her own late in the year, averaging 4.2 points and 6.2 rebounds over the final 10 games.

Batey had nine points and nine rebounds in the regular-season finale against Georgia, and was in the starting lineup for all four of the Commodores' post-season games.

Completing the cast of sophomores are Long and Shaw, both of whom have battled injuries. Long had off-season surgery on her wrist but has returned to action, while Shaw is out with a knee injury.

CHALLENGING SLATE

Vanderbilt's 29-game regular season slate includes 10 matchups against teams who made the NCAA tournament last season, and a total of 19 games against opponents who advanced to the postseason (either the NCAA Tournament, WNIT or WBI). The challenging schedule features games against four teams who advanced to the Elite Eight.

When looking at the slate, Balcomb pointed to two games — today's road trip to Duke and a home game against Dayton on Nov. 24 — as key dates for her team.

"We lost at Dayton last year on the road, and they ended up going to the second round at NCAAs . . . So right away (this year), you have a measuring stick from where you were last year to this year. That's a big game for us.

"The other game (is) the Duke game because they're a Top-5 program traditionally and we feel like that's a program that we want to be at that level, consistently, like they have."

AMONG THE 'ELITE EIGHT'

Vanderbilt is one of eight programs to have made the last 14 NCAA Tournaments (since 2000). The Commodores are joined by Connecticut, Duke, Georgia, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Stanford and Tennessee as the only programs to have earned bids each of the last 14 seasons.

VANDERBILT'S POSTSEASON POWER

Vanderbilt made its 26th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 14th consecutive last season. All-time, Vanderbilt is 39-26 in NCAA play, following a first-round win over Saint Joseph's and a second-round loss to Connecticut. It marked the 12th time in 13 seasons the Commodores won at least one game in the tournament. Vanderbilt has made 14 Sweet 16 appearances, including six over the last 12 seasons (most recently in 2009).

Head Coach, 12th season

The numbers say it all - 11 seasons, 11 NCAA Tournaments, 11 campaigns of at least 20 wins. Vanderbilt women's basketball has been a model of consistency under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. That's not to mention three SEC Tournament Championships, four Sweet 16 trips and eight top-25 finishes in over a decade on West End. That record has enabled Balcomb to become the all-time winningest coach in Vanderbilt women's basketball history.

Since arriving in 2002, Balcomb has posted a 259-106 (.710) record at Vanderbilt, averaging 23.5 wins per season. On February 28, 2013, against Auburn, Balcomb secured her 257th victory, passing Jim Foster for the program's wins record in exactly as many seasons as the former Commodore coach.

Balcomb's name is also showing up on some of the most exclusive lists in women's basketball. She is one of just five coaches, joining Connecticut's Geno Auriemma, Stanford's Tara VanDerveer, Notre Dame's Muffet McGraw and Georgia's Andy Landers, to lead the same program to each of the last 11 NCAA Tournaments. Balcomb is also the second longest-tenured coach in the Southeastern Conference (behind Landers) and currently serves on the USA Basketball Girls National Junior Team committee alongside Foster, California coach Lindsay Gottlieb, Central Florida coach Joi Williams and 2008 Olympic gold medalist Kara Lawson.

Over her 11 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has coached eight WNBA draft picks, a WBCA National Defensive Player of the Year (Jennifer Risper), a WBCA National Scholar-Athlete of the Year (Christina Wirth) and an SEC scoring champion (Christina Fogqie), while graduating 100% of her four-year players.

With 20 years of collegiate head coaching experience, Balcomb is a renowned offensive strategist. Her 11 seasons at Vanderbilt have only enhanced that reputation. Every Commodore squad has finished in the top-50 nationally in field goal percentage, averaging a finish of 11.1 in the country (including four teams that have finished nation's top four). Balcomb's inaugural Commodore team in 2002-03 led the nation in field goal percentage, shooting 51.3%.

The Commodores have shot just as well from three-point range, averaging a top-20 finish in three-point percentage among Division I teams with top-50 finishes every season. Balcomb's 2006-07 squad led the nation in three-point shooting at 43.7%. The Commodores have finished in the top-10 nationally in field-goal percentage seven times and in the top-10 in three-point field-goal percentage six times under Balcomb. Her teams have also finished in the top five in assists per game, free-throw percentage and scoring offense.

Balcomb's teams have been especially successful at home, where Vanderbilt has posted a 143-27 (.841) record at Memorial Gym coming into the 2013-14 season.

Balcomb's success as a head coach is not limited to Vanderbilt. Before arriving at Vanderbilt, Balcomb had successful coaching tenures at Ashland (Ohio) and Xavier. She picked up her 400th career win in the opening round of the 2011 SEC Tournament.

Her 2012-13 squad dealt with serious injury problems, but still won over 20 games and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The team returned over 97% of its scoring, but played stretches without half of that firepower. Three starters — Stephanie Holzer, Christina Foggie and Kady Schrann — combined to miss 60 games, but a combination of seniors Tiffany Clarke and Elan Brown, junior Jasmine Lister and five freshmen. The Commodores scored a pair of huge wins at Florida and over No. 10 Texas A&M late in the year to solidify their 14th straight NCAA Tournament bid.

Clarke led the team in scoring (16.6) and rebounding (8.4) to earn First Team All-SEC honors from the league's coaches, the 11th time a Balcomb coached player has done so. Clarke also earned first team all-conference honors from the Associated Press and All-Region recognition from the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Vanderbilt won its first round game over ninth-seeded Saint Joseph's, giving Balcomb a 10-1 record in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores fell in the second round to top-seeded Connecticut, capping the season at 21-12.

Balcomb started at Vanderbilt in 2002 and wasted no time in implementing her own style of winning. Working to transition veteran players into a new system while building new team chemistry, Balcomb's first year saw the Commodores win six of their last seven regular season games, earn an NCAA Tournament berth, and lead the nation in field goal percentage (51.3) against the fourth toughest schedule in the country. She was named a finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year award.

In 2003-04, Balcomb led the Commodores to their fourth Southeastern Conference Tournament title. She masterfully balanced strong upper-class leadership with exciting freshmen talent, winning 10 consecutive games and advancing to the program's 11th Sweet 16 appearance. One year later, her team made its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Commodores posted the most wins (10) in the program's history in Southeastern Conference play finishing with a 10-4 record. The Commodores were ranked seventh in the final AP poll of the 2006-07 season, and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament after winning another SEC Tournament title. That Vanderbilt squad was the nation's best three-point shooting team, and ranked among the top 10 in points scored. The team's 28-6 mark was the best record for a VU squad in 14 years.

The 2008 season was also one of Balcomb's most impressive coaching jobs. Despite graduating three All-SEC seniors, she led the Commodores to a 25-9 record and the school's 13th appearance in the NCAA sweet 16, all with two freshmen and no seniors in the starting lineup.

In 2009, Vanderbilt won its sixth SEC Tournament title, the third for Balcomb in the last six years. The team also advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 14th time in school history -- Balcomb's fourth trip with the Commodores. Vanderbilt finished the year ranked No. 8 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll after narrowly missing an upset of No. 1 seed Maryland in the Raleigh Regional Semifinal.

National accolades came flooding in for Vanderbilt, including senior Jennifer Risper being named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Defensive Player of the Year. Risper and classmate Christina Wirth, who herself was named an All- American and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, were both selected in the 2009 WNBA Draft.

In 2010 Balcomb was faced with one of her most challenging tasks. Faced with replacing National Defensive Player of the Year Jennifer Risper and All-American Christina Wirth, Balcomb guided an undersized team back to the NCAA Tournament, where they narrowly missed advancing to their third consecutive sweet 16.

Despite having to overcome numerous injuries throughout out the season and a size disadvantage in almost every game, Vanderbilt finished the season 23-11 overall. Individually, Balcomb helped junior point guard Jence Rhoads earn first team All-SEC honors, while senior shooting guard Merideth Marsh earned second team All-SEC accolades.

The 2010-11 season featured many obstacles that Balcomb successfully maneuvered through to reach another NCAA Tournament and finish third in the SEC. Injuries took an unfortunate toll on the team throughout the year with at least one of Vanderbilt's five leading scorers unavailable for 14 out of the team's 32 games. Injuries coupled with matching Georgia for the fewest upperclassmen in the SEC challenged Balcomb to use different personnel groupings regularly.

Despite the challenges, Balcomb again reached 20 wins, finishing 20-12 and 10-6 in the SEC. Individually, Balcomb helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention All-America honors from the Associated Press in addition to first team All-SEC recognition. Rhoads was also a WBCA Region 3 All-American. Freshman center Stephanie Holzer was named honorable mention All-SEC, SEC Sixth Woman of the Year and to the SEC All-Freshmen team. Freshman point guard Jasmine Lister was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. In 10 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has won 13 games in the NCAA Tournament, including a 9-1 mark in the opening round. She holds a winning percentage of 65.7 against SEC opponents. In all, Balcomb owns series advantages over 10 of the 11 other schools in the SEC before 2012.

The 2011-12 season saw one of Balcomb's youngest teams, as the squad of 11 featured just one senior, yet she still successfully steered the Commodores to a 23-10 mark and a 13th-straight NCAA Tournament. Leading the way was break-out star Christina Foggie, who became the first Balcomb player to lead the SEC in scoring (17.7 ppg).

Foggie was a First Team All-SEC selection and was joined by four other Commodores earning All-SEC honors - Jasmine Lister (second team), Tiffany Clarke (second team), Stephanie Holzer (honorable mention) and Kady Schrann (All-Freshman).

Vanderbilt defeated three ranked opponents on the season (No. 12 Oklahoma, No. 17 Georgia and No. 11 Tennessee), earning a seven seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores hosted at Memorial Gym, defeating 10th-seeded Middle Tennessee in the first round before falling to second-seeded Duke.

Before arriving at Vanderbilt, the Cranbury, N.J., native spent seven seasons at Xavier University. Beginning in 1995, her up-tempo style wreaked havoc on the Atlantic 10 while building the Musketeers into a national contender. In 1998, Xavier recorded its second post- season appearance in school history with a selection to the Women's National Invitational Tournament. Each of the next three seasons, Xavier competed in the NCAA Tournament, capped in 2001 by a victory over perennial power Tennessee and a run to the Elite Eight. En route to earning three invitations to the NCAA Tournament and compiling a 136-78 record during her tenure, Balcomb's offensive schemes helped push Xavier onto the national stage. Musketeer field-goal percentages ranked among the top three in the nation during three different seasons while the 1999 squad led the country in 3-point accuracy at 40.1 percent. Her 2000-01 squad averaged 79.4 points per game, the highest total in program history. Individual records were rewritten as well. Of the 15 Musketeers who have scored at least 1,000 points in a career, six of them played on Balcomb-coached teams.

Before her accomplishments at Xavier, Balcomb took her first head coaching position at Ashland University. Prosperity was immediate as Balcomb's first unit matched the best record in school history at 18-9 while registering its first winning season in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with an 11-7 mark.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Balcomb served three years as an assistant at Providence College (1990-93), during which the Friars went 62-30, made two NCAA Tournament appearances and once (1990-91) led the nation in scoring while they amassed a 26-6 record. In 1989-90, Balcomb was an assistant at Ohio University and she began her coaching career with a four-year stint (1985-89) on the staff at Niagara University. In all, Balcomb has coached 19 players who have received All-SEC accolades. Nine of her players have been drafted by the WNBA, including VU's Chantelle Anderson, Ashley McElhiney, Jenni Benningfield, Ashley Earley, Carla Thomas, Dee Davis and Christina Wirth. Her Xavier teams won two league tournament titles (2000 and 2001) and one regular-season championship in the Atlantic 10 Conference (2001).

Xavier's successes during the Balcomb era helped push for construction of the Cintas Center, a state of the art facility which became home to Xavier basketball at the start of the 2000-01 season and - ironically - was dedicated with a victory over Vanderbilt. That season the program posted a school record for attendance with a total of 40,098 fans, who thrilled in the Musketeers' style of play and their results. Commodore followers have enjoyed the entertainment as well.

Her basketball education began at an early age among some of the most well respected coaches in the game. Balcomb's father, Alan, was a varsity boy's coach for 30 years at South Brunswick (N.J.) High School, and then served as an assistant for four years at Princeton University under Pete Carril, the master of the half-court game. For Balcomb, however, a complete education goes far beyond the hardwood. Every eligible, four-year player during Balcomb's coaching tenure has earned her degree. In May of 2011, Balcomb's team earned a Public Recognition Award for finishing among the nation's top 10 percent in multi-year Academic Progress Rates (APR). Six of seven squads at Xavier earned team grade point averages that ranked in the Top 25. In 2004-05, 40 percent of the Commodore basketball team was named to the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll. Vanderbilt led the SEC with eight players being named to the honor roll in 2003-04.

Two Commodores have been named SEC Scholar Athletes of the Year under Balcomb. Hillary Hager received the honor in 2004 and Christina Wirth won it in 2009. Wirth was also named a 2009 Lowe's Senior CLASS All-American, while receiving WBCA and NCAA post-graduate scholarships. Hager recently returned to Vanderbilt and received her doctorate in 2010.

Balcomb also stresses the importance of community service to her teams. VU logged more than 95 hours of community service last season, including numerous opportunities to visit with young patients at the Vanderbilt Children's Hospital. After the devastating Nashville flood in 2010, Balcomb and her coaching staff volunteered in helping to clean up flood-damaged areas. Balcomb herself has been active in outreach to the surrounding area, participating in numerous fundraising events for local and national organizations, including Coaches vs. Cancer, the Race for the Cure, Mercy Ministries, Vanderbilt Children's Hospital and the Girl Scouts of America. She joined colleagues to represent the SEC in the 2008 4Kay Golf Classic to benefit the Kay Yow Cancer Fund. An avid golfer, Balcomb finds time to make it to beach on her rare weeks off, and also enjoys reading.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - On a day the Commodores honored head coach Melanie Balcomb before the game for becoming the school's all-time wins leader, it was only fitting that Vanderbilt would put together a textbook offensive game - something Commodore fans have become accustomed to under the 12th-year head coach.

With five players scoring in double figures, led by freshman Rebekah Dahlman's 23, Vanderbilt (1-0) routed Appalachian State (0-1) 96-53 Friday at Memorial Gymnasium as the Commodores opened the 2013-14 season in resounding fashion.

Vanderbilt led by 25 points in the first half and did not let off the gas in the second half, leading by as many as 48 points and rolling to its 28th straight win in a home opener. The Commodores have now won eight straight season openers. Balcomb became Vanderbilt's wins leader in last year's home

finale against Auburn. The Commodores went on to finish 2012-13 with a 21-12 record after advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Like any new season, there were questions after losing two starters off last year's squad.

Although it was just one game, the answers to some of those questions seemed to become more apparent through the efforts of a balanced scoring attack that was not reliant on preseason All-SEC guards Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister. The duo each scored 10 points, but played sparingly in the second half with the game out of reach.

With the senior leaders on the bench, Vanderbilt got 23 points from Dahlman and 19 points from sophomore guard Jasmine Jenkins. Freshman forward Marqu'es Webb added 13 points and joined Dahlman in Vanderbilt's starting lineup.

It was the first time Vanderbilt had five players in double figures since last January 3 against Mississippi State. It was a balanced attack, but it was Dahlman who stood out

the most. She went 8-of-10 from the floor and 6-of-7 from long range to set a new scoring mark in a freshman debut. No other Vanderbilt freshman has ever scored as many points in their first game as Dahlman did.

The previous record was 22 points scored by Barbara Brackman on November 20, 1981 in an 82-58 win over Belmont. She also collected four rebounds and dished out two assists.

"I was teasing (Rebekah) because I tell everyone what a great defender she is, about her engine and her energy, and I brought her here for her defense, but let's be real, she scored more points in Minnesota than any girl in their history," Balcomb said. "She just knows how to score, and she'll keep scoring if you let her, and they let her keep shooting. She has a lot of confidence on both ends of the floor and it was fun to watch."

As a team, the Commodores shot a blistering 57.1 percent from the floor, including 66.7 percent from the three-point line. Additionally, Vanderbilt was able to get to the free-throw line $34\ \text{times}$ and outscored Appalachian State $37\text{-}11\ \text{in points}$ off turnovers.

The Commodores forced 26 miscues, while committing 19. Vanderbilt not only got the job done on the offensive end, but also defensively. Appalachian State was held to just 29.7 percent shooting in the first half. Vanderbilt also held the Mountaineers without a field goal for nearly 11 minutes.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - A senior and a freshman provided a perfect balance - and a powerful punch - for the Vanderbilt women's basketball team on Monday night.

Senior Christina Foggie scored 21 of her game-high 26 points in the first half and freshman Rebekah Dahlman added 18 points - including ripping off 14 straight early in the second half -- to help Vanderbilt overcome a sluggish start and roll past Western Kentucky, 85-60, in a non-conference game at Memorial Gym.

The two Jasmines -- Lister and Jenkins -- also reached double figures, with Lister finishing with 11 points and Jenkins adding 10 for Vanderbilt (2-0). Rayte'a Long had a team-high nine rebounds and Heather Bowe and Morgan Batey added seven boards apiece to help Vanderbilt win the battle on the glass, 48-31.

Alexis Govan scored 18 to pace Western Kentucky (1-1). Foggie scored her 26 points efficiently, taking just 11 shots from the floor, making seven. She finished 5-of-9 from 3-point range and was 7-of-7 of the foul line.

"They were just giving me open shots, and I've been trained to shoot it and knock it down," said Foggie. "So, I just had confidence from the start'

Vanderbilt, which opened the season on Friday with a 96-53 win over Appalachian State, started slowly against Western Kentucky.

But Foggie almost single-handedly kept Vanderbilt afloat in the first half, scoring 12 of the Commodores' first 17 points in the first 11-plus minutes. She was 6-of-8 from the floor in the first 20 minutes, including 4-of-6 from long range, and she was the primary reason that Vanderbilt eventually owned a 37-31 lead at the break.

In the second half, it was Dahlman's turn to dominate.

She scored 16 of her 18 points in the final 20 minutes, highlighted by her 14-point flurry that started with a layup at the 16:24 mark and ended when she nailed a jumper at the 12:32 mark. Vanderbilt owned a 46-34 lead before her explosion, and a 58-38 advantage by the time it ended.

"(The) first half I started out really slow," said Dahlman. "I talked to coach after the game and she (said) 'you just didn't buy in.' I agreed. But the second half I just came out really confident. I just did my thing and knocked down shots."

The Commodores, who host Delaware State on Thursday night, trailed for much of the first half before putting together a dominating 13-minute stretch in which they outscored Western Kentucky, 37-8. The huge surge -- which spanned the final 5 1/2 minutes of the first half and the first seven of the second -- enabled Vanderbilt to flip a 28-19 deficit into a 56-35 lead. What led to the big turnaround?

"It was definitely a change in defensive mentality," said Foggie. "Picking up our energy on the defensive end let us get into transition. We didn't get into transition at all during the first half, and that's a big part of our game."

Head coach Melanie Balcomb agreed with Foggie's assessment. "(Western Kentucky) came out very aggressive and ready to play whereas we came out flat," said Balcomb. "We were a little shell shocked at the beginning. The good thing is we made a positive change."

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team woke up just in the nick of time Thursday night.

The RV/No. 25 Commodores trailed for much of the night before seniors Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie took the game over and paved the way for a 73-67 victory over stubborn Delaware State at Memorial Gym.

Vanderbilt (3-0) trailed by 11 points at the half and was down 48-38 at the 13:25 mark of the second half before getting off the deck and outscoring the Hornets 35-19 the rest of the way. Foggie finished with a double-double, scoring 16 points and

pulling down a career-high 10 rebounds. She narrowly missed a triple-double, adding eight assists.

Lister scored 15 points on 7-of-15 shooting and made a series of huge plays down the stretch.

Two underclassmen, freshman Kylee Smith and sophomore Heather Bowe, also were instrumental in the victory, producing timely baskets in the second half to help Vanderbilt avoid the upset.

Bowe finished with eight points and seven rebounds, and Smith had nine points, five rebounds and two assists for the Commodores.

It was Vanderbilt's 32nd win of its past 35 home games, but the Commodores hardly felt like celebrating. Vanderbilt came into the night as substantial favorites against a Delaware State team that lost its season opener to Old Dominion, 97-67.

But the Hornets gave Vanderbilt a huge scare, and Vanderbilt's victory wasn't secured until the last two minutes.

"It's definitely better to learn form a win than a loss, but we want to play Vanderbilt basketball," said Foggie. "We have a lot to learn from (this game). ... Its good that we could fight back and compete and get the win."

The Commodores hadn't faced much adversity in their first two games, but there was plenty of tense moments Thursday. It certainly appeared an upset might be in the making when Delaware State owned a double-digit lead with roughly 13 minutes to play. But the Commodores staged their late rally to avoid what would have been a stunning defeat.

And while head coach Melanie Balcomb wasn't pleased with her team's overall performance, she was encouraged by the amount

of resolve the Commodores showed.
"I challenged them at halftime and they did make a change -- a big change," Balcomb said.

Lister helped jumpstart the Vanderbilt offense in the second half by knocking down a 3-pointer from the top of the key and she followed that with a layup that trimmed the deficit to 38-32.

Later, Smith added two huge baskets -- a 3-pointer and a bucket in the paint -- to bring the Commodores within one, 52-51, with 8:54 to play, and a pair of free throws by Jasmine Jenkins put Vanderbilt ahead, 53-52.

Delaware State then made one last push and retook the lead 57-55, but the Commodores answered with a 16-5 run to build a 71-60 advantage and held on from there to move to 3-0. "I think we really changed our mentality," said Lister: "In the first

half we were playing as a bunch of individuals, so the focus [at halftime] was to play together more.'

Facing Marquette in front of a lively crowd at Memorial Gym, the RV/No. 25 Commodores built a 14-point lead in the first half but then ran into major foul trouble in the final 20 minutes and suffered their first loss of the season, 82-77. Marquette closed the game on an 11-4 run to secure the win.

The contest saw the teams combine for a staggering 63 fouls and $74\ free$ throws. Marqu'es Webb, Kylee Smith and Morgan Batey all fouled out for Vanderbilt.

Christina Foggie had another huge game for Vanderbilt, scoring 30 points (four shy of matching her career high) while going 16-of-18 at the foul line. She was joined in double figures by three of her teammates: Jasmine Lister with 13 points, Rebekah Dahlman with 12 and Jasmine Jenkins 10.

But the balanced scoring wasn't enough to offset a second-half comeback by the feisty Golden Eagles, who proved to be the more aggressive team in the second half -- as evidenced by the

Vanderbilt, which owned a 47-36 lead at the half, shot 26 free throws in the first 20 minutes, compared to Marquette's 10. But the second half featured 24 free throws by the Golden Eagles, while Vanderbilt shot 14. Marquette's intensity was also reflected in the rebounding stats, as they won the battle on the glass, 25-13, in the final 20 minutes (and 37-31 for the game).

"The first four minutes of the second half really changed the game," said Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb. "They came out more aggressive after halftime and we didn't. We have to figure out why. ... I really thought we had built confidence and we were going to continue to be the aggressor and we weren't." Katherine Plouffe scored a team-high 16 points for the Golden Eagles

(3-0) and was one of five Marquette players in double figures. The loss dropped the Commodores to 3-1 as they head into their first road test of the season, a visit to No. 2/2 Duke on Thursday

night.
"It's just going to be a really big test for us," said sophomore post player Heather Bowe. "Duke is obviously a great team, so we've

got to go out and be tough and aggressive against them." Foggie fell just shy of a record-setting day Sunday. She was one short of the Vanderbilt all-time record for free throws attempted (set by Ashley McElhiney with 19 in Feb., 2001) and two shy for free throws made in a game (18 by McElhiney).

Foggie, coming off her first career double-double (16 points and 10 rebounds) in Thursday's win over Delaware State, said the Commodores need to do a better job of maintaining their intensity for 40 minutes.

"We need to play both halves and put in good basketball in both halves," she said. "I think in the second half Marquette was .. outworking us, and that's something we need to learn. We need to play both halves."

After Vanderbilt carried its 47-36 lead into the locker room, Marquette opened the second half with an 11-2 run to pull within 49-47 with 15:17 left to play, and the contest stayed tight the rest
