# NEWS, NOTES & NUMBERS

### LOOKING TO EXTEND THE STREAK

The Vanderbilt-Auburn series has been dominated in recent years by the Commodores (13-2, 1-1), who enter today's game having won 20 straight games against the Tigers.

Vanderbilt is 17-0 against Auburn since head coach Melanie Balcomb's arrival in 2002-03.

Today's matchup is the 44th all-time meeting between the teams, with Vanderbilt owning a 27-16 lead in the series. Auburn won 16 of the first 23 games against Vanderbilt before the Commodores started their 20-game win streak against the Tigers with a 74-66 road victory on Jan. 14, 2001.

Auburn's most recent win over Vanderbilt came on Jan. 16, 2000, when the Tigers won 55-54 in Nashville.

### THROWN INTO THE FIRE

The Commodores didn't exactly ease into their SEC schedule.

Instead, they opened their conference slate with back-to-back games against ranked foes, facing No. 19/18 Georgia at home last Thursday and traveling to No. 13/12 South Carolina on Sunday.

Vanderbilt went 1-1 in the two games, downing Georgia 66-58 at Memorial Gym before suffering a 76-66 road loss to South Carolina.

The setback against the Gamecocks ended Vanderbilt's nine-game winning streak that had included victories over Dayton, Elon, Wisconsin, ESTU, Hartford, James Madison, UNC Asheville, UAB and Georgia.

Prior to the South Carolina game, it had been roughly six weeks since Vanderbilt's last loss -- an 88-69 road setback to Duke on Nov. 21, when the Blue Devils were ranked No. 2/2.

Vanderbilt is now 1-2 against foes ranked in the AP poll this season (with the losses coming to South Carolina and Duke). The Commodores are 2-2 against teams ranked in the USA Today poll (with wins over Georgia and Dayton).

Vanderbilt went 2-7 against ranked opponents last season, including wins over Oklahoma State and Texas A&M.

### BEEN THERE, DONE THAT

Auburn comes into the game with a 6-0 mark at home, which is nothing new for the Commodores.

In each of Vanderbilt's past three road games, the Commodores have faced teams with undefeated home records.

James Madison was 2-0 at home before losing to Vanderbilt on Dec. 21; UAB was 5-0 at home before losing to the Commodores on Dec. 30; and South Carolina is now 9-0 at home after beating Vanderbilt on Sunday.

### FOGGIE ON FIRE

Vanderbilt fans entered the season with high expectations for Christina Foggie, and the senior has guard has certainly lived up to them.

Foggie, who entered the week as the SEC's leading scorer, is averaging 18.1 points per game and has scored in double figures in 13 of Vanderbilt's 15 games.

"She's playing really smart basketball," said head coach Melanie Balcomb about Foggie. "She is preparing herself in practice like a senior does, and she is making great decisions."

### PASSING IT UP

Senior Jasmine Lister Jasmine dished out her 500th career assist in the win over UNC Asheville on Dec. 21.

She has since added 18 more assists to her total, and now ranks fourth on Vanderbilt's all-time list. Next up for Lister to pass is Jence Rhodes, who had 547 in her career.

### DAHLMAN SIDELINED

Vanderbilt is still without the services of freshman star Rebekah Dahlman, who is out indefinitely after undergoing two procedures to dissolve a blood clot in December. No timetable has been set for Dahlman's return, and she will continue to be evaluated.

The freshman guard started the first nine games this season, averaging 11.4 points per game. Dahlman led the SEC and ranked 10th in the nation in 3-point percentage at 51.4 percent (18-of-35) at the time of her injury.

Dahlman was a McDonald's All-American as a senior at Braham Area High (Braham, Minn.) and scored a state record 5,060 points in her high school career.

### GAME TIME CHANGE

The tipoff time for Vanderbilt's game against Tennessee at Memorial Gym on Jan. 12 has been pushed back one hour -- from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. -- and the game will now be televised by ESPN. (It was originally scheduled to be aired on ESPN2).

It will be Vanderbilt's first game on ESPN since appearing on ESPN's College Gameday on Jan. 15, 2011 in Knoxville.

### COMEBACK DENIED IN CAROLINA

Vanderbilt opened SEC play by rallying for a win over Georgia last Thursday, but the Commodores' bid for a second straight comeback victory was stopped short by South Carolina in a 76-66 loss on Sunday.

After trailing by as many as 17 points early in the second half, Vanderbilt trimmed the deficit to 63-55 after two free throws by Christina Foggie with roughly seven minutes to play. But South Carolina didn't flinch, responding with two straight baskets and maintaining a double-digit lead the rest of the way.

Vanderbilt, which erased a seven-point second-half deficit in the win over Georgia, wasn't as crisp as normal in the loss to South Carolina. But head coach Melanie Balcomb was more frustrated with her team's defensive effort that was unable to slow down South Carolina's inside attack.

"The positive about this game is the way we fought back," said Balcomb. "But the negative is we couldn't stop them in the paint."

South Carolina post player Alaina Coates finished with a team-high 24 points, including scoring two key baskets in the second half after Vanderbilt had pulled within striking distance. Tiffany Mitchell added 19 for the Gamecocks, who improved to 9-0 at home.

Vanderbilt, which entered the day as the SEC's leader in field-goal percentage, was just 23-of-61 from the floor (37.7 percent).

Christina Foggie finished with 16 points, but was 5-of-16 from the floor. Jasmine Lister added 13 points, Jasmine Jenkins had 12 and Kylee Smith had 11.

"(South Carolina) didn't give our shooters any shots," said Balcomb. "They had a great game plan and they executed it."

Vanderbilt trailed 41-30 at the half after being limited to 41 percent shooting the floor, making just 10-of-24 attempts.

After falling into an early 8-2 hole, the Commodores went on a 13-4 run to take a 15-12 lead. The surge included a 3-pointer by Lister and back-to-back baskets in the paint by Smith and Webb.

South Carolina answered with a 13-4 run to build a 25-19 lead and the Commodores never lead again.

## MOVING UP THE CHARTS

Foggie and Lister continue to steadily climb the all-time scoring list at Vanderbilt. Foggie has amassed 1,426 points total points and ranks 14th on the list. Lister is right behind her with 1,424 points, ranking 15th.

Lister and Foggie, close friends off the floor, each surpassed the 1,000-point milestone last season. Lister became the 36th player in Vanderbilt history to reach the mark in the first half of last season's game at LSU after Foggie accomplished the feat earlier in the season.

The two players have a realistic opportunity of ending their Vanderbilt careers in the top 10 in scoring.

Head coach Melanie Balcomb has been watching the Foggie/Lister combination for the past three years, and she knows how important the senior duo will be this season.

"They are the bread and butter of our program right now," said Balcomb about the seniors. "They've matured on a consistent level each year and I am excited to see what they are going to do.

"Each year they've improved, each year they've matured and each year they've (gained) a better understanding of what it takes to be successful at the highest level — in the SEC and nationally."

## COMMODORE STAR STATS

### COACH BALCOMB (Through Jan. 5)

★ With her 434 career wins, Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb is the third-winningest coach in the SEC, trailing only UGA's Andy Landers (917) and Texas A&M's Gary Blair (656).

★ Balcomb has posted 271 wins at Vanderbilt, and is the program's all-time wins leader. Among SEC coaches, only Landers -- who has won 835 games at Georgia -- has more victories at his/her current school than Balcomb.

### TEAM RANKINGS (Through Jan. 5)

★ Vanderbilt is second in the SEC and ranks sixth in the nation in field-goal percentage (48.3).

★ Vanderbilt ranks first in the SEC and two in the nation in 3-point percentage at 42.0 percent.

★ The Commodores rank second in the SEC and 16th in the nation in free throw percentage (76.2).

★ Vanderbilt ranks fourth in the SEC and 32nd in the nation in scoring at 79.9 points per game.

★ The Commodores rank second in the SEC and 22nd in the nation in assists per game (17.8).

★ Vanderbilt has won 435 games at Memorial Gym, and trails only LSU (436) for the most all-time home wins among SEC teams.

### INDIVIDUALLY (Through Jan. 5)

★ Senior Christina Foggie leads the SEC in scoring and ranks 79th in the nation, averaging 18.1 points per game.

★ Jasmine Lister ranks second in the SEC in free throw percentage (88.6) and Jasmine Jenkins ranks fourth in the conference (84.8 percent).

★ Freshman Rebekah Dahlman led the conference and ranked fourth in the nation in 3-point percentage at 51.4 percent (18-of-35) at the time of her injury.

★ Foggie and Lister continue to steadily climb the all-time scoring list at Vanderbilt, ranking 14th and 15th (entering today's action).

### ATTENDANCE

★ Vanderbilt is averaging 3,403 fans per game at Memorial Gym, which ranks fifth in the SEC.

## NEW-LOOK LINE-UPS

With Dahlman sidelined, the Commodores have altered the starting lineup in recent games, and have used a total of three different combinations this season.

Seniors Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister, along with sophomore post player Heather Bowe, have started all 15 games.

For the past four games, junior Kady Schrann and sophomore Morgan Batey -- who each received their first starting assignments of the season on Dec. 21 against UNC Asheville -- have joined Lister, Foggie and Bowe in the lineup.

Freshman Kylee Smith and sophomore Jasmine Jenkins were each given their first starting assignments of the season against Hartford (Dec. 15) and were in the lineup again in the win over JMU (Dec. 18).

Prior to the Hartford game, Vanderbilt's starting lineup had consisted of Dahlman, Foggie, Lister, Bowe and freshman Marqu'es Webb in each of the first nine games.

## FOGGIE NAMED TO NAISMITH WATCH LIST

Senior guard Christina Foggie has proven over the past three years that she is among the elite players in the country -- and it's not just Vanderbilt fans who've noticed.

Foggie was one of 50 players named to the Naismith Trophy Early-Season Watch List last month. The award is given at the end of the season to the Player of the Year.

Foggie has made a huge impact on the Vanderbilt program throughout her career, including leading the SEC in scoring as a sophomore.

## LISTER, FOGGIE NAMED FIRST TEAM ALL-SEC

Senior guards Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie were named First Team All-SEC by the conference's coaches.

Vanderbilt was one of only two schools (along with Tennessee) to have two players named to the eight-member First Team.

Tennessee's Meighan Simmons was the choice of the coaches for SEC Player of the Year with seven votes; the remaining votes were given to Kentucky's DeNesha Stallworth (three), LSU's Theresa Plaisance (three) and Vanderbilt's Foggie (one).

Joining Simmons, Stallworth, Plaisance and Foggie on the All-SEC First Team were Aleighsa Welch, South Carolina; Bashaara Graves, Tennessee; Courtney Walker, Texas A&M; and Lister, Vanderbilt.

The second team consists of Hasina Muhammad, Auburn; Jatterra Bonds, Florida; Shacobie Barbee, Georgia; Samarie Walker, Kentucky; Jennifer O'Neil, Kentucky; Danielle Ballard, LSU; Valencia McFarland, Ole Miss; Martha Alwal, Mississippi State.

## CHALLENGING SLATE

Vanderbilt's 29-game regular-season slate includes 10 matchups against teams who made the NCAA tournament last season, and a total of 19 games against opponents who advanced to the postseason (either the NCAA Tournament, WNIT or WBI).

## COMMODORES PICKED FOURTH IN SEC

When the SEC coaches released their preseason ballots, the Commodores were tabbed for a fourth-place finish in the conference.

Tennessee was predicted to win the conference's regular-season championship with 167 votes. The reigning SEC regular season champions return three starters from last season's NCAA Elite Eight squad, including 2013 SEC Player of the Year Meighan Simmons and 2013 SEC Freshman of the Year Bashaara Graves.

Kentucky, LSU, Vanderbilt, South Carolina, Texas A&M and Georgia rounded out the top half of the league with Auburn, Missouri, Florida, Mississippi State, Arkansas, Ole Miss and Alabama rounding out the lower half.

## DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know former Vanderbilt star Caroline Williams is not only one of the most accurate 3-point shooters in Commodore history, but is also among the best of all time?

Williams, who played at VU from 2003-2007, shot 46.5 percent from long range for her career, which is the fifth highest mark in the history of women's college basketball.

Williams played 115 career games at Vanderbilt, and made 238 of her 512 attempts from 3-point range.

She trails only Notre Dame's Alicia Ratay (47.6), Samford's Emily London (47.4), Harvard's Erin Mahler (46.7) and Houston's Jana Crosby (46.7) on the NCAA's all-time list for 3-point accuracy.

## MAKING SOME NOISE

Even while reeling off a long series of victories, the Commodores still didn't have that signature win that would allow them to grab national attention.

Until last Thursday.

With Jasmine Lister scoring 24 points and propelling a second-half comeback, Vanderbilt pulled off the upset of No. 19/18 Georgia, 66-58, at Memorial Gym in the SEC opener for both teams.

Lister -- who finished 8-of-12 from the floor, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range -- scored 10 points in the span of less than five minutes late in the second half while fueling a 17-5 run that allowed Vanderbilt to flip a 47-43 deficit into a 60-52 lead with 3:40 to go.

Christina Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, also hit a key 3-pointer during the game-changing surge. Foggie finished with 11 points, and was the only other Commodore in double figures.

"They are our senior leaders, and we look up to them," said sophomore Morgan Batey about Lister and Foggie, the lone seniors on the roster. "When they hit big shots, it ignites the rest of us."

Batey finished with seven points and three rebounds despite being limited to just 11 minutes of action due to foul trouble.

The Commodores trailed by as many as seven points in the second half before surging back to capture the victory in the hotly-contested game, which featured five ties and 10 lead changes.

Vanderbilt was down 49-45 when Lister stepped up and scored all seven points during a 7-0 run. She hit perhaps the biggest shot of the night -- a 3-pointer that cut Georgia's lead to one -- with 7:56 to play, and followed that up with a jumper that gave Vanderbilt the lead for good. She then capped her spree with another 3-pointer that pushed the lead to 53-49 with 5:52 to go.

"She's got ice water in her veins," said head coach Melanie Balcomb.

Early on, Georgia's defense seemed to have the upper hand, as the Lady Dogs pestered Vanderbilt into 11 first-half turnovers, helping Georgia take a 25-24 lead into the locker room. But the Commodores solved Georgia's pressure in the second half and committed just six turnovers while flipping the game around.

Vanderbilt's bench played a pivotal role in the win, outscoring Georgia's reserves 16-5. "That says a lot about our depth," said Balcomb. "It's players coming off the bench and playing with a sense of urgency."

## BALCOMB IS NO. 1 ON THE LIST

Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb, now in her 12th season with the Commodores, was honored before the Appalachian State game on Nov. 8 for becoming the school's all-time wins leader in last year's regular season home finale.

Balcomb became the career wins leader with Vanderbilt's 59-44 win over Auburn on Feb. 28, 2013. The win was Balcomb's 257th of her career, and enabled her to surpass former VU coach Jim Foster.

"It wasn't anything I was looking forward to or shooting at, but at the same time, it (is) nice to be recognized," said Balcomb.

"The reason I came here was because of the tradition of success that the coaches before me had.

"So it was an honor to be able to surpass the things that had been done here, and that obviously was something that I felt good about."

Balcomb has led her Vanderbilt teams to 20 or more wins in each of her 11 seasons, and the Commodores have advanced to the NCAA tournament each year. Her success has enabled Vanderbilt to underscore its reputation as one of the premiere programs in the nation.

"When you say Vanderbilt, you want (people) to think of the Vanderbilt's women's program," she said.

"We have such a strong history of success for the long term. Bottom line, I think it's harder to be consistently good than to have one great season or one great team. That (history of success at Vanderbilt) is the biggest thing that I am proud of and that's what I want people to recognize."



# MELANIE BALCOMB

## Head Coach, 12th season

The numbers say it all - 11 seasons, 11 NCAA Tournaments, 11 campaigns of at least 20 wins. Vanderbilt women's basketball has been a model of consistency under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. That's not to mention three SEC Tournament Championships, four Sweet 16 trips and eight top-25 finishes in over a decade on West End. That record has enabled Balcomb to become the all-time winningest coach in Vanderbilt women's basketball history.

Entering this season, Balcomb is averaging 23.5 wins per season during her tenure in Nashville. On February 28, 2013, against Auburn, Balcomb secured her 257th victory, passing Jim Foster for the program's wins record in exactly as many seasons as the former Commodore coach.

Balcomb's name is also showing up on some of the most exclusive lists in women's basketball. She is one of just five coaches, joining Connecticut's Geno Auriemma, Stanford's Tara VanDerveer, Notre Dame's Muffet McGraw and Georgia's Andy Landers, to lead the same program to each of the last 11 NCAA Tournaments. Balcomb is also the second longest-tenured coach in the Southeastern Conference (behind Landers) and currently serves on the USA Basketball Girls National Junior Team committee alongside Foster, California coach Lindsay Gottlieb, Central Florida coach Joi Williams and 2008 Olympic gold medalist Kara Lawson.

Over her 11 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has coached eight WNBA draft picks, a WBCA National Defensive Player of the Year (Jennifer Risper), a WBCA National Scholar-Athlete of the Year (Christina Wirth) and an SEC scoring champion (Christina Foggie), while graduating 100% of her four-year players.

With 20 years of collegiate head coaching experience, Balcomb is a renowned offensive strategist. Her 11 seasons at Vanderbilt have only enhanced that reputation. Every Commodore squad has finished in the top-50 nationally in field goal percentage, averaging a finish of 11.1 in the country (including four teams that have finished nation's top four). Balcomb's inaugural Commodore team in 2002-03 led the nation in field goal percentage, shooting 51.3%.

The Commodores have shot just as well from three-point range, averaging a top-20 finish in three-point percentage among Division I teams with top-50 finishes every season. Balcomb's 2006-07 squad led the nation in three-point shooting at 43.7%. The Commodores have finished in the top-10 nationally in field-goal percentage seven times and in the top-10 in three-point field-goal percentage six times under Balcomb. Her teams have also finished in the top five in assists per game, free-throw percentage and scoring offense.

Balcomb's teams have been especially successful at home, where Vanderbilt has posted a 143-27 (.841) record at Memorial Gym coming into the 2013-14 season.

Balcomb's success as a head coach is not limited to Vanderbilt. Before arriving at Vanderbilt, Balcomb had successful coaching tenures at Ashland (Ohio) and Xavier. She picked up her 400th career win in the opening round of the 2011 SEC Tournament.

Her 2012-13 squad dealt with serious injury problems, but still won over 20 games and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The team returned over 97% of its scoring, but played stretches without half of that firepower. Three starters – Stephanie Holzer, Christina Foggie and Kady Schranz – combined to miss 60 games, but a combination of seniors Tiffany Clarke and Elan Brown, junior Jasmine Lister and five freshmen. The Commodores scored a pair of huge wins at Florida and over No. 10 Texas A&M late in the year to solidify their 14th straight NCAA Tournament bid.

Clarke led the team in scoring (16.6) and rebounding (8.4) to earn First Team All-SEC honors from the league's coaches, the 11th time a Balcomb coached player has done so. Clarke also earned first team all-conference honors from the Associated Press and All-Region recognition from the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Vanderbilt won its first round game over ninth-seeded Saint Joseph's, giving Balcomb a 10-1 record in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores fell in the second round to top-seeded Connecticut, capping the season at 21-12.

Balcomb started at Vanderbilt in 2002 and wasted no time in implementing her own style of winning. Working to transition veteran players into a new system while building new team chemistry, Balcomb's first year saw the Commodores win six of their last seven regular season games, earn an NCAA Tournament berth, and lead the nation in field goal percentage (51.3) against the fourth toughest schedule in the country. She was named a finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year award.

In 2003-04, Balcomb led the Commodores to their fourth Southeastern Conference Tournament title. She masterfully balanced strong upper-class leadership with exciting freshmen talent, winning 10 consecutive games and advancing to the program's 11th Sweet 16 appearance. One year later, her team made its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Commodores posted the most wins (10) in the program's history in Southeastern Conference play finishing with a 10-4 record.

The Commodores were ranked seventh in the final AP poll of the 2006-07 season, and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament after winning another SEC Tournament title. That Vanderbilt squad was the nation's best three-point shooting team, and ranked among the top 10 in points scored. The team's 28-6 mark was the best record for a VU squad in 14 years.

The 2008 season was also one of Balcomb's most impressive coaching jobs. Despite graduating three All-SEC seniors, she led the Commodores to a 25-9 record and the school's 13th appearance in the NCAA Sweet 16, all with two freshmen and no seniors in the starting lineup.

In 2009, Vanderbilt won its sixth SEC Tournament title, the third for Balcomb in the last six years. The team also advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 14th time in school history -- Balcomb's fourth trip with the Commodores. Vanderbilt finished the year ranked No. 8 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll after narrowly missing an upset of No. 1 seed Maryland in the Raleigh Regional Semifinal.

National accolades came flooding in for Vanderbilt, including senior Jennifer Risper being named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Defensive Player of the Year. Risper and classmate Christina Wirth, who herself was named an All-American and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, were both selected in the 2009 WNBA Draft.

In 2010 Balcomb was faced with one of her most challenging tasks. Faced with replacing National Defensive Player of the Year Jennifer Risper and All-American Christina Wirth, Balcomb guided an undersized team back to the NCAA Tournament, where they narrowly missed advancing to their third consecutive Sweet 16.

Despite having to overcome numerous injuries throughout out the season and a size disadvantage in almost every game, Vanderbilt finished the season 23-11 overall. Individually, Balcomb helped junior point guard Jence Rhoads earn first team All-SEC honors, while senior shooting guard Merideth Marsh earned second team All-SEC accolades.

The 2010-11 season featured many obstacles that Balcomb successfully maneuvered through to reach another NCAA Tournament and finish third in the SEC. Injuries took an unfortunate toll on the team throughout the year with at least one of Vanderbilt's five leading scorers unavailable for 14 out of the team's 32 games. Injuries coupled with matching Georgia for the fewest upperclassmen in the SEC challenged Balcomb to use different personnel groupings regularly.

Despite the challenges, Balcomb again reached 20 wins, finishing 20-12 and 10-6 in the SEC. Individually, Balcomb helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention All-America honors from the Associated Press in addition to first team All-SEC recognition. Rhoads was also a WBCA Region 3 All-American. Freshman center Stephanie Holzer was named honorable mention All-SEC, SEC Sixth Woman of the Year and to the SEC All-Freshmen team. Freshman point guard Jasmine Lister was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. In 10 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has won 13 games in the NCAA Tournament, including a 9-1 mark in the opening round. She holds a winning percentage of 65.7 against SEC opponents. In all, Balcomb owns series advantages over 10 of the 11 other schools in the SEC before 2012.

The 2011-12 season saw one of Balcomb's youngest teams, as the squad of 11 featured just one senior, yet she still successfully steered the Commodores to a 23-10 mark and a 13th-straight NCAA Tournament. Leading the way was break-out star Christina Foggie, who became the first Balcomb player to lead the SEC in scoring (17.7 ppg).

Foggie was a First Team All-SEC selection and was joined by four other Commodores earning All-SEC honors - Jasmine Lister (second team), Tiffany Clarke (second team), Stephanie Holzer (honorable mention) and Kady Schrann (All-Freshman).

Vanderbilt defeated three ranked opponents on the season (No. 12 Oklahoma, No. 17 Georgia and No. 11 Tennessee), earning a seven seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores hosted at Memorial Gym, defeating 10th-seeded Middle Tennessee in the first round before falling to second-seeded Duke.

Before arriving at Vanderbilt, the Cranbury, N.J., native spent seven seasons at Xavier University. Beginning in 1995, her up-tempo style wreaked havoc on the Atlantic 10 while building the Musketeers into a national contender. In 1998, Xavier recorded its second post-season appearance in school history with a selection to the Women's National Invitational Tournament. Each of the next three seasons, Xavier competed in the NCAA Tournament, capped in 2001 by a victory over perennial power Tennessee and a run to the Elite Eight. En route to earning three invitations to the NCAA Tournament and compiling a 136-78 record during her tenure, Balcomb's offensive schemes helped push Xavier onto the national stage. Musketeer field-goal percentages ranked among the top three in the nation during three different seasons while the 1999 squad led the country in 3-point accuracy at 40.1 percent. Her 2000-01 squad averaged 79.4 points per game, the highest total in program history. Individual records were rewritten as well. Of the 15 Musketeers who have scored at least 1,000 points in a career, six of them played on Balcomb-coached teams.

Before her accomplishments at Xavier, Balcomb took her first head coaching position at Ashland University. Prosperity was immediate as Balcomb's first unit matched the best record in school history at 18-9 while registering its first winning season in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with an 11-7 mark.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Balcomb served three years as an assistant at Providence College (1990-93), during which the Friars went 62-30, made two NCAA Tournament appearances and once (1990-91) led the nation in scoring while they amassed a 26-6 record. In 1989-90, Balcomb was an assistant at Ohio University and she began her coaching career with a four-year stint (1985-89) on the staff at Niagara University. In all, Balcomb has coached 19 players who have received All-SEC accolades. Nine of her players have been drafted by the WNBA, including VU's Chantelle Anderson, Ashley McElhiney, Jenni Benningfield, Ashley Earley, Carla Thomas, Dee Davis and Christina Wirth. Her Xavier teams won two league tournament titles (2000 and 2001) and one regular-season championship in the Atlantic 10 Conference (2001).

Xavier's successes during the Balcomb era helped push for construction of the Cintas Center, a state of the art facility which became home to Xavier basketball at the start of the 2000-01 season and - ironically - was dedicated with a victory over Vanderbilt. That season the program posted a school record for attendance with a total of 40,098 fans, who thrilled in the Musketeers' style of play and their results. Commodore followers have enjoyed the entertainment as well.

Her basketball education began at an early age among some of the most well respected coaches in the game. Balcomb's father, Alan, was a varsity boy's coach for 30 years at South Brunswick (N.J.) High School, and then served as an assistant for four years at Princeton University under Pete Carril, the master of the half-court game. For Balcomb, however, a complete education goes far beyond the hardwood. Every eligible, four-year player during Balcomb's coaching tenure has earned her degree. In May of 2011, Balcomb's team earned a Public Recognition Award for finishing among the nation's top 10 percent in multi-year Academic Progress Rates (APR). Six of seven squads at Xavier earned team grade point averages that ranked in the Top 25. In 2004-05, 40 percent of the Commodore basketball team was named to the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll. Vanderbilt led the SEC with eight players being named to the honor roll in 2003-04.

Two Commodores have been named SEC Scholar Athletes of the Year under Balcomb. Hillary Hager received the honor in 2004 and Christina Wirth won it in 2009. Wirth was also named a 2009 Lowe's Senior CLASS All-American, while receiving WBCA and NCAA post-graduate scholarships. Hager recently returned to Vanderbilt and received her doctorate in 2010.

Balcomb also stresses the importance of community service to her teams. VU logged more than 95 hours of community service last season, including numerous opportunities to visit with young patients at the Vanderbilt Children's Hospital. After the devastating Nashville flood in 2010, Balcomb and her coaching staff volunteered in helping to clean up flood-damaged areas. Balcomb herself has been active in outreach to the surrounding area, participating in numerous fundraising events for local and national organizations, including Coaches vs. Cancer, the Race for the Cure, Mercy Ministries, Vanderbilt Children's Hospital and the Girl Scouts of America. She joined colleagues to represent the SEC in the 2008 4Kay Golf Classic to benefit the Kay Yow Cancer Fund. An avid golfer, Balcomb finds time to make it to beach on her rare weeks off, and also enjoys reading.

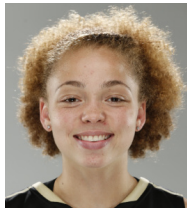

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** - On a day the Commodores honored head coach Melanie Balcomb before the game for becoming the school's all-time wins leader, it was only fitting that Vanderbilt would put together a textbook offensive game - something Commodore fans have become accustomed to under the 12th-year head coach.

With five players scoring in double figures, led by freshman Rebekah Dahlman's 23, Vanderbilt (1-0) routed Appalachian State (0-1) 96-53 Friday at Memorial Gymnasium as the Commodores opened the 2013-14 season in resounding fashion.

Vanderbilt led by 25 points in the first half and did not let off the gas in the second half, leading by as many as 48 points and rolling to its 28th straight win in a home opener. The Commodores have now won eight straight season openers.

Balcomb became Vanderbilt's wins leader in last year's home finale against Auburn. The Commodores went on to finish 2012-13 with a 21-12 record after advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Like any new season, there were questions after losing two starters off last year's squad.

Although it was just one game, the answers to some of those questions seemed to become more apparent through the efforts of a balanced scoring attack that was not reliant on preseason All-SEC guards Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister. The duo each scored 10 points, but played spryly in the second half with the game out of reach.

With the senior leaders on the bench, Vanderbilt got 23 points from Dahlman and 19 points from sophomore guard Jasmine Jenkins. Freshman forward Marqu'e Webb added 13 points and joined Dahlman in Vanderbilt's starting lineup.

It was the first time Vanderbilt had five players in double figures since last January 3 against Mississippi State. It was a balanced attack, but it was Dahlman who stood out the most. She went 8-of-10 from the floor and 6-of-7 from long range to set a new scoring mark in a freshman debut. No other Vanderbilt freshman has ever scored as many points in their first game as Dahlman did.

The previous record was 22 points scored by Barbara Brackman on November 20, 1981 in an 82-58 win over Belmont. She also collected four rebounds and dished out two assists.

"I was teasing (Rebekah) because I tell everyone what a great defender she is, about her engine and her energy, and I brought her here for her defense, but let's be real, she scored more points in Minnesota than any girl in their history," Balcomb said. "She just knows how to score, and she'll keep scoring if you let her, and they let her keep shooting. She has a lot of confidence on both ends of the floor and it was fun to watch."

As a team, the Commodores shot a blistering 57.1 percent from the floor, including 66.7 percent from the three-point line. Additionally, Vanderbilt was able to get to the free-throw line 34 times and outscored Appalachian State 37-11 in points off turnovers.

The Commodores forced 26 miscues, while committing 19. Vanderbilt not only got the job done on the offensive end, but also defensively. Appalachian State was held to just 29.7 percent shooting in the first half. Vanderbilt also held the Mountaineers without a field goal for nearly 11 minutes.

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** - A senior and a freshman provided a perfect balance - and a powerful punch - for the Vanderbilt women's basketball team on Monday night.

Senior Christina Foggie scored 21 of her game-high 26 points in the first half and freshman Rebekah Dahlman added 18 points -- including ripping off 14 straight early in the second half -- to help Vanderbilt overcome a sluggish start and roll past Western Kentucky, 85-60, in a non-conference game at Memorial Gym.

The two Jasmies -- Lister and Jenkins -- also reached double figures, with Lister finishing with 11 points and Jenkins adding 10 for Vanderbilt (2-0). Rayte'a Long had a team-high nine rebounds and Heather Bowe and Morgan Batey added seven boards apiece to help Vanderbilt win the battle on the glass, 48-31.

Alexis Govan scored 18 to pace Western Kentucky (1-1).

Foggie scored her 26 points efficiently, taking just 11 shots from the floor, making seven. She finished 5-of-9 from 3-point range and was 7-of-7 of the foul line.

"They were just giving me open shots, and I've been trained to shoot it and knock it down," said Foggie. "So, I just had confidence from the start."

Vanderbilt, which opened the season on Friday with a 96-53 win over Appalachian State, started slowly against Western Kentucky.

But Foggie almost single-handedly kept Vanderbilt afloat in the first half, scoring 12 of the Commodores' first 17 points in the first 11-plus minutes. She was 6-of-8 from the floor in the first 20 minutes, including 4-of-6 from long range, and she was the primary reason that Vanderbilt eventually won a 37-31 lead at the break.

In the second half, it was Dahlman's turn to dominate. She scored 16 of her 18 points in the final 20 minutes, highlighted by her 14-point flurry that started with a layup at the 16:24 mark and ended when she nailed a jumper at the 12:32 mark. Vanderbilt opened a 46-34 lead before her explosion, and a 58-38 advantage by the time it ended.

"(The) first half I started out really slow," said Dahlman. "I talked to coach after the game and she (said) 'you just didn't buy in.' I agreed. But the second half I just came out really confident. I just did my thing and knocked down shots."

The Commodores, who host Delaware State on Thursday night, trailed for much of the first half before putting together a dominating 13-minute stretch in which they outscored Western Kentucky, 37-8. The huge surge -- which spanned the final 5 1/2 minutes of the first half and the first seven of the second -- enabled Vanderbilt to flip a 28-19 deficit into a 56-35 lead.

What led to the big turnaround?

"It was definitely a change in defensive mentality," said Foggie. "Picking up our energy on the defensive end let us get into transition. We didn't get into transition at all during the first half, and that's a big part of our game."

Head coach Melanie Balcomb agreed with Foggie's assessment. "(Western Kentucky) came out very aggressive and ready to play whereas we came out flat," said Balcomb. "We were a little shell shocked at the beginning. The good thing is we made a positive change."

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team delivered a golden performance on Black Friday.

And it proved to be a great bargain for Commodores' fans. With free admission for all fans at Memorial Gym, a crowd of 4,446 saw the Commodores storm out to a 24-point halftime lead and sail to an 88-66 win over Elon in the opening game of the Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament.

Jasmine Lister scored a team-high 22 points and Christina Foggie had 18 for the Commodores, who improved to 5-2 on the season and 27-0 in the history of the Thanksgiving tourney.

Vanderbilt earned its spot in the tourney's championship game after putting together a red-hot start from long range against Elon (2-3).

The Commodores went 9-of-14 (64.3) from 3-point territory in the opening 20 minutes, with Foggie going 5-of-6. Vanderbilt shot 58 percent (20-of-34) from the floor overall while building a 55-31 lead.

Vanderbilt cooled off considerably in the second half, shooting just 40 percent from the floor (and going 2-of-7 from 3-point range) but still managed to maintain a comfortable cushion throughout the final 20 minutes.

Vanderbilt won the rebounding war, 41-28, and outscored Elon 38-26 in the paint.

"I was pleased with our effort on both ends of the floor tonight," said head coach Melanie Balcomb, "especially with our rebounding."

While Vanderbilt's seniors, Foggie and Lister, combined for 40 points, a pair of freshmen, Kylee Smith and Marqu'es Webb, also made big offensive contributions, scoring 10 points each. Morgan Batey and Jasmine Jenkins scored eight apiece.

Lister finished 9-of-17 from the floor and was aggressive going to the basket throughout much of the night. She also flashed her range, hitting 4-of-9 shots from 3-point range.

Smith finished 5-of-6 from the floor and also pulled down a team-high seven rebounds for the Commodores. Webb scored her 10 points in just 14 minutes of action.

Balcomb said she was pleased with her team's energy early in the game.

"The big thing was that we came out ready to play," she said. "We shot the ball extremely well in the first half. In the second half, we continued to get great shots, but we didn't convert."

Vanderbilt exploded for 55 points in the first 20 minutes, representing the Commodores' highest scoring half of the season.

Foggie, who was named the Naismith Trophy Watch List earlier this week, scored 17 first-half points, going 6-of-7 from the floor, including 5-of-6 from 3-point range.

Foggie needed less than seven minutes to reach double figures. After hitting three early 3-pointers, she added an offensive putback at the 14:47 mark. That basket gave Foggie 11 points and gave Vanderbilt an 11-point lead, 19-8.

Vanderbilt continued to extend the lead from there, pushing the advantage to 35-14 after a layup by Lister and a jumper by Schran. Lister then add a pair of 3s in the final six minutes of the half, helping the Commodores carry a 55-31 lead into the locker room.

**HARTFORD, Conn.** - The combination of a long layoff followed by a long road trip seemed to take a toll on the Vanderbilt women's basketball team on Sunday.

But the Commodores broke out of the funk just when it mattered most.

Finishing the game with an 18-9 run, Vanderbilt earned a hard-fought 65-56 road victory over Hartford at the Chase Arena in Hartford, Conn., to extend their winning streak to five games.

It was Vanderbilt's first game since Dec. 3, and was also the Commodores first game without freshman star Rebekah Dahلمان. The sharp-shooting guard, who leads the SEC in 3-point percentage and is a defensive catalyst for Vanderbilt, is out indefinitely after having two procedures to dissolve a blood clot last week.

In her absence, the Commodores (8-2) needed someone to supply an extra dose of energy, and Jasmine Lister took on the assignment.

After being hampered by foul trouble in the first half, Lister scored 14 points and made a series of pivotal plays in the final 20 minutes to help Vanderbilt escape with the win. Lister, who had a team-high seven rebounds and three assists, finished 4-of-6 from the floor and 5-of-5 at the foul line.

The Commodores trailed by as many as nine points early in the first half, and found themselves locked in a 47-47 late in the second half before putting together the game-ending run to finally pull away.

"Give credit to Hartford; they outworked us today," said Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb. "We didn't play with a sense of urgency until the final four minutes of the game. ... But it was good for us to get out of here with a win."

Heather Bowe also had a huge game, scoring 11 points on 5-of-10 shooting. She also had six rebounds, two steals and two assists.

Christina Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, was held to a season-low eight points but scored two huge buckets in the second half. Marques Webb also finished with eight points.

Perhaps showing the effects of not having played a game in nearly two weeks, the Commodores got off to a slow start. After Bowe scored the game's first basket, Vanderbilt surrendered eight straight points and eventually saw the deficit grow to as many as nine points, 13-4.

Then Vanderbilt came to life.

Back-to-back baskets by Webb got the Commodores rolling, and they outscored Hartford 27-12 in the final 13 minutes of the half to take a 31-25 lead into the locker room. During that surge, Bowe scored in the paint to give Vanderbilt a 20-19 advantage, marking the Commodores' first lead since the opening minute.

Schranz and Webb came off the bench to give Vanderbilt a big spark. Webb scored eight first-half points and Schranz added six.

Vanderbilt will return to the court Wednesday when the Commodores travel to James Madison.

**HARRISONBURG, Va.** - Even when her shots weren't falling in the first half, Christina Foggie didn't stop firing.

As the game wore on, she started heating up -- and she eventually hit the game's biggest shot.

With Vanderbilt seemingly in trouble in overtime against James Madison, Foggie hit a clutch 3-pointer that tied the game and sparked an 11-4 game-ending run that lifted Vanderbilt to a gutsy 89-85 road victory.

Foggie finished with 29 points, making 9-of-22 from the floor, including 5-of-12 from 3-point range, to help the Commodores (9-2) extend their winning streak to six games.

James Madison fell to 8-3 and saw its three-game winning streak come to an end.

Jasmine Lister added 16 points with four rebounds and six assists. Lister and Foggie both played all 45 minutes during the contest, which featured plenty of emotion and intensity.

"I like to test my team with road games before we get into SEC play," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "And I knew we'd have to play well to win tonight. This felt like an NCAA tournament game, really."

Freshman Marques Webb had a breakout game, scoring a season-high 15 points before fouling out. Webb finished 6-of-9 from the floor and delivered a series of powerful post moves that energized the other Vanderbilt players.

The Commodores finished 23-of-30 (76.7 percent) at the foul line, doing their best work at the beginning and end of the game. They went 11-for-11 from the line in the first half, and were 7-of-10 in overtime.

Vanderbilt won the game despite the absence of Rebekah Dahلمان, who missed her second straight game and is out indefinitely after undergoing two procedures for a blood clot last week.

Heather Bowe had eight points and a team-high seven rebounds. Bowe hit the go-ahead jumper that gave Vanderbilt an 83-81 lead in overtime, and the Commodores stayed in front from there.

The tightly-contested game featured eight ties and five lead changes. And in the end, it proved to be one of Vanderbilt's most impressive wins of the season.

James Madison was led in scoring by Toia Giggettts' 25 points.

The Dukes owned a 73-70 lead with 1:41 left in regulation, but Lister delivered a clutch 3-pointer that tied it up with just over a minute to play. After the teams traded baskets in the final minute, the Commodores had a chance to win the game on their final possession, but Bowe's short jumper rolled off the rim as the buzzer sounded.

JMU then built an 81-78 lead in overtime, but Vanderbilt roared back with a 7-0 run that included Foggie's game-tying 3-pointer, followed by a bucket by Bowe and two free throws by Morgan Batey.

Early in the game, Vanderbilt fell behind 10-2 before the Commodores ripped off a 26-8 run to reverse the game's momentum. Webb ignited the surge with some strong work inside, scoring six straight points and showcasing a soft touch in the paint. Vanderbilt eventually took a 39-36 lead into the half.

**BIRMINGHAM, Ala.** - Vanderbilt senior Christina Foggie might soon request that the Commodores wear their road jerseys all the time -- home or away.

Foggie continued her trend of big performances on the road Monday night, scoring a team-high 29 points to help Vanderbilt extend its winning streak to eight games by downing UAB, 87-76.

Foggie finished 5-of-12 from 3-point range as the Commodores (11-2) closed out their non-conference schedule by handing the Blazers (8-5) their first home loss of the season.

Heather Bowe added 15 points in the win and Jasmine Lister had 14 points and eight rebounds. Morgan Batey pulled down a team-high 10 rebounds and freshman Marqu'es Webb had 10 points while playing in front of a large number of friends and family in her home state.

But Foggie was the central figure of the win, as she scored 18 of her 29 points in the second half. It was her second straight 29-point road outing -- she also reached that mark at James Madison on Dec. 18 -- and she's averaging 21 points per game in Vanderbilt's four road contests this year.

"You really have to focus through the crowd (on the road) and sometimes it's easier for me to play in a tough environment," said Foggie. "It forces me to really lock in and play my best basketball."

Foggie has been strong at home, too. She entered the night averaging 18 points per game for the season.

"She's playing really smart basketball," said head coach Melanie Balcomb about Foggie. "She is preparing herself in practice like a senior does, and she is making great decisions."

Vanderbilt raced out to an early 26-13 lead against UAB. But the Blazers battled back, eventually cutting the lead to 44-41 at the half.

Vanderbilt then opened the second half with a 12-0 run, and this time, the Commodores stayed in control, with the lead never dipping below double figures the rest of the way.

It was Vanderbilt's 12th straight December win, dating back to the 2011-12 season.

"I felt like this was a big game for us," said Balcomb. "We wanted to have momentum going into SEC play."

Vanderbilt was buoyed by strong free throw shooting, finishing 18-of-22 at the line. The Commodores also went 7-of-16 from 3-point range.

For UAB (8-5), three players did the bulk of the scoring. Chelsea Black finished with 29 points, Karisma Chapman added 27 and Ashley Grimes had 16.

The contest held some extra meaning for Vanderbilt's Webb, the freshman from Hoover, Ala. She was playing against one of her former high school teammates, Kayla Anderson, and was also playing in the same building where Hoover High held its graduation ceremony last spring.

Vanderbilt shot 58 percent from the floor in the first half and took a 44-41 lead into the locker room. Foggie had the hot hand early, connecting on three of her first four attempts from 3-point range to help Vanderbilt build a 19-9 lead.

The Commodores led by as many as 13 points, 26-13, after a 3-point play by Webb roughly midway through the half. UAB trimmed the lead to 44-41 at the half, but Vanderbilt opened the second half with 12-0 run to set the tone.

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** - Even while reeling off a long series of victories, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team still didn't have that signature win that would allow the Commodores to grab national attention.

Now they do.

With Jasmine Lister scoring 24 points and propelling a second-half comeback, Vanderbilt upset No. 19/18 Georgia, 66-58, on Thursday night at Memorial Gym in the SEC opener for both teams.

The victory stretched the Commodores' winning streak to nine games and pushed them to 12-2 overall as they head to South Carolina on Sunday. Vanderbilt hasn't a lost a game since Nov. 21, when the Commodores lost at Duke.

Lister -- who finished 8-of-12 from the floor, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range -- scored 10 points in the span of less than five minutes late in the second half while fueling a 17-5 run that allowed Vanderbilt to flip a 47-43 deficit into a 60-52 lead with 3:40 to go.

Christina Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, also hit a key 3-pointer during the game-changing surge. Foggie finished with 11 points, and was the only other Commodore in double figures.

"They are our senior leaders, and we look up to them," said sophomore Morgan Batey about Lister and Foggie, the lone seniors on the roster. "When they hit big shots, it ignites the rest of us."

Batey finished with seven points and three rebounds despite being limited to just 11 minutes of action due to foul trouble.

Vanderbilt has now won nine of the past 12 meetings against Georgia, including five straight in Nashville.

In Thursday's game, the Commodores trailed by as many as seven points in the second half before surging back to capture the victory in the hotly-contested game, which featured five ties and 10 lead changes.

Vanderbilt went down 49-45 when Lister stepped up and scored all seven points during a 7-0 run. She hit perhaps the biggest shot of the night -- a 3-pointer that cut Georgia's lead to one -- with 7:56 to play, and followed that up with a jumper that gave Vanderbilt the lead for good. She then capped off her spree with another 3-pointer that pushed the lead to 53-49 with 5:52 to go.

"She's got ice water in her veins," said head coach Melanie Balcomb.

Thursday's matchup featured strength against strength, with Vanderbilt's high-powered offense (which entered the night averaging 80.9 points per game) pitted against a Georgia defense that was ranked third in the nation (allowing just 50 points per game).

Early on, Georgia's defense seemed to have the upper hand, as the Lady Dogs pestered Vanderbilt into 11 first-half turnovers, helping Georgia take a 25-24 lead into the locker room. But the Commodores solved Georgia's pressure in the second half and committed just six turnovers while flipping the game around.

Vanderbilt's bench played a pivotal role in the win, outscoring Georgia's reserves 16-5.

"That says a lot about our depth," said Balcomb. "It's players coming off the bench and playing with a sense of urgency."

Lister said the Commodores played with more energy in the second half.

"We picked up the defensive intensity and communication," said Lister.
