MEDA INFORMATION

The Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office welcomes your interest in the Vanderbilt women's basketball program. We will make every effort to meet your needs throughout the season. Following is information and guidelines to help you during the season and allow our coaches and players to adhere to their schedules.

## Credentials

The Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office issues season media credentials to authorized full-time or specified representatives of media outlets who cover Vanderbilt basketball on a regular basis. Single-game credentials also will be available for media who cover the team less frequently, should space allow. Please e-mail credential requests to the attention of women's basketball contact, David Dawson. Vanderbilt Communications reserves the right to confirm employment by a media outlet. Season credentials are issued jointly for men's and women's basketball.

## Credential Pick-Up

Credentials are available for pick-up at Media Will Call located near the playing floor at Memorial Gymnasium. Those media wishing to access Media Will Call should enter the service tunnel located at the end of Lot 71 behind the outfield wall of Vanderbilt's Hawkins Field baseball stadium. Proceed through the tunnel until you arrive at the Media Will Call table. If enough advance notice is given, credentials can be mailed or sent via next-day carrier at the expense of the media organization making the request.

## Media Parking

Media parking is located inside the 25th Avenue Garage located at the southeast corner of 25th Avenue and Jess Neely Drive. After parking, please enter Memorial Gymnasium through the service tunnel entrance located at the end of Lot 71 behind the outfield wall of Vanderbilt's Hawkins Field baseball stadium. Vehicles parked in Lot 71 without the proper parking pass will be towed.

## Media Seating

Media covering Vanderbilt basketball games are seated at various locations inside Memorial Gymnasium. A select number of seats are available on the floor, usually reserved for Nashville beatwriters and radio crews from both schools. An additiona 20 seats are available inside Suite 5 located on the northside concourse (above Section C), reserved for media following the visiting team and Nashville radio and television media.

## Media Workroom

Memorial Gymnasium's media workroom is located in the northeast corner of the facility, nearest the opponents' bench. This room will serve as a place for pregame meals as well as an area for the media to work after the game. The room is equipped with telephone and data lines, as well as wireless internet. For access to wireless internet, please see a member of the communications staff.

## General Communications Possibilities

Wireless internet is available in all seating areas at Memorial Gym, in addition to a very limited number of data ports. For access to the wireless network, see a member of the communications staff. For data lines, it is recommended you request access in advance from David Dawson. Visiting radio stations are provided with the option of a phone line or ISDN line, in accordance with Southeastern Conference policy. Visiting radios in need of a data line should contact David Dawson at least 24 hours in advance of the game.

## Postgame Interview Format

For non-conference games, Head Coach Melanie Balcomb and two-to-three requested Vanderbilt players will be made available in the media interview room, located down the hall from the work room. Media wishing to speak with coaches or players from the visiting team may coordinate with that institution's sports information representative. For SEC games, in accordance with league policy, the visiting coach will be made available first in the media interview room, followed by the Vanderbilt coach and players. Visiting player requests can be made with that team's sports information representative. Specific player requests for Vanderbilt can be made with David Dawson no later than the final media time out in regulation.

## Road Interview Policy

In accordance with SEC policy, visiting coaches will be made to available to the media within a designated window following the game. The location is at the discretion of the host's sports information staff. Vanderbilt players can be made available through David Dawson, with a location also at the discretion of the home sports information staff.

## Visiting Radio

In accordance with Southeastern Conference policy, a traditional phone line and ISDN line are available to the visiting school's official radio network. Any additional radio broadcasts (including student radio) or any needs beyond phone line or ISDN line (such as data line) should contact David Dawson at least 24 hours in advance of the contest.

## Interviewing the Commodores

It is the policy of Vanderbilt Athletics to coordinate all interviews with coaches and student-athletes through the communications department. Please contact David Dawson at least 24 hours in advance of any needs.

## Practice Coverage

Vanderbilt players and coaches are available for interviews prior to practices on designated days. Practice schedules are sent via e-mail to media multiple times each week during the season to help facilitate coverage. Contact David Dawson if you wish to receive these updates. Player interviews typically begin 45 minutes before practice at Memorial Gymnasium. Interviews with Coach Balcomb follow. Media are typically allowed to attend practices, but must receive permission in advance. Gameday walk-throughs are closed to the media at both Memorial Gymnasium and all road venues.

## Vanderbilt Games on the Radio and Internet

Vanderbilt basketball can be heard live on WNSR-AM 560 AND WNSR-FM 95.9. Selected games will also be carried on networks of affiliate stations across the mid-state area. Charlie Mattos returns for his 19th year as the voice of the Commodores. All games will be streamed and archived on the internet at the Commodores' official web site, vucommodores.com. You can also keep up with the Commodores on the internet through Gametracker live stats. Just check the women's basketball schedule page for the "live stats" link for a running box score throughout the game.

## Photography

All photographers are restricted to the designated areas along the baseline opposite the home and visitor benches and must sign an affidavit agreeing to the SEC's new policy concerning photography. Strobe lights may not be installed in Memorial Gymnasium without permission from the Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office. When using photo images provided by the Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office, please credit: Vanderbilt Photography.

## Guidelines for Granting Media Credentials to Online Media Representatives

The following is a set of guidelines that the Vanderbilt University Athletic Communications Office will use as a basis for issuing media credentials to independent online media representatives (bloggers). Overall, Vanderbilt University strives to work with individuals who adhere to professional standards, demonstrate transparency in their operations, and regularly produce quality content. While what follows shall serve as a guideline, they may be altered for certain events when necessary and are subject to regulations set forth by the Southeastern Conference and/or the NCAA.

- Individuals associated with a web-only media outlet may apply for credentials on a game-by-game basis unless otherwise specified. Requests for credentials must be sent via e-mail, fax or in writing to the requested Athletic Communications Director and be received at least three (3) business days prior to the event. Request should include applicant's legal name, company or blog they are representing, a mailing address and website address.
- The Athletic Communications Office requires that a requesting outlet possess its own domain name (.com, .net, etc.) and will not accept requests from sites based on free services (blogspot, wordpress, etc.).
- First time applicants must submit traffic/subscriber data from an independent source in order to be considered. Sites with fewer than 25,000 legitimate unique visitors per month are not eligible for football or men's basketball credentialing. Sites with fewer than 7,500 legitimate unique visitors per month are not eligible for women's basketball credentialing.
- In the interest of protecting the Vanderbilt University fan base, we require that all applicants that give users ability to submit comments and/or place cookies on user's computers supply a privacy policy that describes in full how the data collected through such activities is used or disseminated.
- Athletic Communications seeks to perpetuate the program and sport being credentialed and therefore prefers to work with online media outlets with an established track record covering our school, our conference or the requested sport. In the request, please provide a short summary of previous relevant experience, if any.
- As a general guideline, we would like to work with outlets that have been in continuous operation for at least 3-6 months. Additionally, an average of $3-5$ substantive postings per week is expected in season from applicant web sites.
- Obtaining media credentials is an opportunity to interview players and team officials for legitimate media purposes only. Bloggers who are granted access to the press box and other areas inside the venue are expected to act professionally and adhere to all SEC and NCAA-mandated media guidelines at all times.
- The standard of professionalism also extends to content posted on the requesting website, whether posted by the requester, user or other agent. Profanity, racial or sexual comments will not be tolerated from credentialed outlets.
- No credentials will be issued to individuals under the age of 18 .
- Vanderbilt University reserves the right of its personnel to deny or revoke credentials without notice and an individual shall surrender their credential upon request for violating the policies and/or safety procedures of security personnel, Vanderbilt University, the Southeastern Conference, or the NCAA.

## New challenges, new leaders

## Commodores enter season with lofty expectations, high standards and numerous fresh faces

When opposing teams try to compile their scouting reports on Vanderbilt this season, they might not know exactly where to begin.

The Commodores - who went 18-13 last year and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 15 th consecutive season - have no seniors on this year's roster and will rely heavily on young players to contribute.

Still, head coach Melanie Balcomb doesn't see that as a disadvantage. In fact, she plans to capitalize on the element of surprise.
"There's basically nothing that is certain for us going into the season," Balcomb said, "but that can be a positive. And that's the way I am looking at it. I think it will be a huge benefit for us because our opponents don't know us like they have before."

Although the Commodores have a core group of proven players - including junior Morgan Batey (the team's leading rebounder last season), sophomore Marqu'es Webb (who led the team in field goal percentage) and redshirt freshman Rebekah Dahlman (who led the SEC in 3-point percentage before being sidelined by an injury) - the team still has an "X-factor" in regard to finding out who will emerge as new leaders.

The void was created by the departures of Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister, who each graduated last year after producing record-breaking careers. Foggie ranks №. 7 on Vanderbilt's career scoring list and is the program's all-time leader in 3-pointers. Lister graduated as the program's all-time leader in minutes played and ranks No. 3 on Vanderbilt's all-time assist list.

Last season, Foggie and Lister combined to score 1,015 points of Vanderbilt's 2,218 total points. They also combined for 133 of the team's 166 three-pointers.

So now the question becomes: Who will fill their shoes? Balcomb believes the answer could come from multiple sources: "Obviously, we will have to replace the points that Christina and Jasmine gave us," said Balcomb. "But I think we are going to get those points from a lot of different places, and that's big.
"Last year, we knew where those points were coming from, and so did the other teams," she said. "This year, we don't know where they are going to come from, but we are excited that they could come from so many different places."

Vanderbilt is expecting to get major contributions from its five-member cast of freshmen: Paris Kea, Christa Reed, Rachel Bell and twin sisters Audrey-Ann and Khalèann Caron-Goudreau. The group was ranked among the Top-10 recruiting classes in the nation by multiple publications.
"It's a very talented group," said Balcomb,"and we are certainly excited to see what they can do."

Three of the Vanderbilt freshmen were members of gold-medal winning teams during the summer. Kea, a standout from Greensboro, N.C., helped lead the USA U-18 team to a title at the FIBA Champions tournament, and the Caron-Goudreau sisters - who are 6 -foot-3 twins from Quebec - were members of the Team Canada squad that won the championship in the William Jones Cup tournament in Taiwan.

## LOOKING BACK

The Commodores ran into plenty of adversity last season - including the loss of several players to injuries - and the team endured a difficult finish. After opening the year with 16 wins in their first 19 games and rising as high as No. 16 in the AP poll, the Commodores lost 10 of their final 12 games, including ending the season on a five-game skid.

Still, the season contained a large collection of highlights for the Commodores, who won 13 of 14 games from Nov. 24 through Jan. 25. That impressive stretch included a 74-63 victory over in-state rival Tennessee at Memorial Gym on Jan. 12 when the Lady Vols were ranked No. $8 / 8$ in the nation. The victory over Tennessee was one of three wins over ranked opponents in the span on 15 days for the Commodores.

Vanderbilt capped its season with an appearance in the NCAA tournament for the 15th consecutive season, including 12 in a row under Balcomb.

Balcomb, the all-time wins leader in Vanderbilt WBB history, is one of only five coaches to have led their teams to the NCAA Tournament in each of the past 12 seasons. The others are: Geno Auriemma (UConn), Tara VanDerveer (Stanford), Muffet McGraw (Notre Dame), Joanne P. McCallie (Mich. State/Duke) and Andy Landers (Georgia).

## THE SLATE

Vanderbilt＇s non－conference schedule，which complements the always－tough SEC slate，features eight games（including an exhibition game）at Memorial Gym．The list of visitors includes James Madison and Dayton，both of whom advanced to the NCAA Tourna－ ment last season．

The Commodores＇non－conference lineup also includes road trips to Wisconsin，Elon and Marquette，along with a visit to Estero，Fla．，to compete in the Gulf Coast Showcase during Thanksgiving week．

Including the SEC schedule，the Commodores will face at least nine teams that made the NCAA tournament last year－non－conference foes James Madison and Dayton，along with SEC rivals Tennessee，Georgia，Texas A\＆M，South Carolina，Florida，LSU and Kentucky．

The Commodores could potentially face several more NCAA tournament teams during the Gulf Coast Showcase，which will feature defending national champion UConn，along with Georgia Tech and Arizona State（which beat Vanderbilt in the first round of last year＇s NCAA Tournament）．
＂It＇s a challenging schedule，＂said Balcomb．＂Going on the road during Thanksgiving will be a very important time for us．And the road trips to Wisconsin and Marquette also jump out at you when you look at our schedule．Those are big games and big challenges for us．And then having two NCAA tournament teams，James Madison and Dayton，in December will be huge for us in terms of preparing us for SEC play．＂

## Juniors

－Morgan Batey（5－10，Guard，Atlanta，Ga．）produced a fine sophomore campaign， including leading the team in rebounding（ 5.3 per game）and reaching double figures in scoring in seven games．She was inserted into the starting lineup on Dec． 21 and remained there the rest of the season．
Quoting Balcomb：＂Morgan gave us a lot of good minutes last season，and played a lot of different roles．She played well in all of our big wins，which tells you something．She is very versatile，and in order for us to be successful，we need a player like that．＂
－Heather Bowe（6－0，Forward，Eau Claire，Wis．）followed up her fine freshman season with a solid sophomore campaign，averaging 5.1 points and 4.3 rebounds per game．She saw action in 27 games，including 21 starts．Bowe will miss the first half of this season while completing a suspension（violation of university academic policy）that started last season．
Quoting Balcomb：＂Heather is a versatile small forward，and a strong inside presence．She runs the floor very well，and has extended her range in the offseason．＂
－Jasmine Jenkins（5－8，Guard，Gainesville，Ga．）saw action in all 31 games last season， including two starts．The point guard averaged 5.3 points and 2.3 rebounds per game． Quoting Balcomb：＂Jasmine learned a lot from playing behind Jasmine Lister the past two seasons，and we believe she has a really good feel for our system and for what it takes to be successful in the SEC．＂
－Rayte＇a Long（6－0，Forward，Dayton，Ohio）provided depth in the post，playing in 26 games and averaging 1.8 points and 2.3 rebounds per game．
Quoting Balcomb：＂Rayte＇a gave us some big baskets and big rebounds last year，and she really worked hard defending the low post．She＇s a physical presence．＂

## Redshirt sophomores

－Kristen Gaffney（6－1，Forward，Cary，N．C．）is expected to be a big contributor this season．After missing her freshman season with an ACL injury and then sitting out most of last season with her second ACL tear，Gaffney played in VU＇s final four games last season．She aver－ aged 18.8 minutes of playing time in the four games，compiling 12 points and 18 rebounds． Quoting Balcomb：＂Kristen really gave us some good minutes down the stretch．She＇s strong， physical and doesn＇t back down．We liked the toughness she showed last year．No one could take the ball from her，and she＇s a calming force for our team．＂
－Kendall Shaw（ $6-4$, Center，Mont Belvieu，Texas）missed all of last season with a knee injury after playing in 23 games as a freshman，averaging 3.5 points and 2.0 rebounds． Quoting Balcomb：＂Having Kendall coming back from an injury will be exciting．We are really looking forward to having her back out there．It＇s nice to have a 6－4 player who has great touch and can pass the basketball，too．＂

## Sophomore

－Marqu＇es Webb（6－1，Forward，Hoover，Ala．）quickly established herself as an impact player at Vanderbilt，seeing action in all 31 games，including appearing in the starting lineup 18 times．She finished the season averaging 7.1 points and 4.0 rebounds per game， and scored in double figures in nine games，including three straight in mid－December． She capped her freshman season with an 18－point，eight－rebound performance against Arizona State in first－round NCAA Tournament loss on March 22.
Quoting Balcomb：＂It＇s exciting to see where Marqu＇es is right now．She had a great finish last season，and her conditioning and health has improved this year．She struggled with her consistency last year，as all freshmen do，and she was dealing with the back injury．But this year I think she can be that dominating low post player that we need．The more minutes she played last year，the better we did．＂

## Redshirt Freshman

－Rebekah Dahlman（5－9，Guard，Braham，Minn．）missed the final 22 games of last season after being diagnosed with a blot clot in her shoulder，which required multiple procedures．She was in the starting lineup for Vanderbilt＇s first nine games and averaged 11.4 points per game．Dahlman was leading the SEC and ranked 10th in the nation in 3 －point percentage at 51.4 percent（ 18 －of－35）at the time of her injury．
Quoting Balcomb：＂When she left us last year，she was leading our team in four or five categories．And she was really our engine．She just plays so hard and has all the intangibles． She brings such passion to the floor．Her and（Marqu＇es）both play so hard，but they also have fun－－and that is something we are really looking for with such a young team．＂

## Freshmen

－Rachel Bell（5－10，Guard，Cumberland Furnace，Tenn．）averaged 24.8 points and 6.2 rebounds per game as a senior and was a McDonald＇s All－American nominee and Gatorade Player of the Year nominee．
Quoting Balcomb：＂She is extremely athletic．Her best game is her mid－range game，and she is very good off the dribble．And one of the things we really love about her is her confidence．In high school，she faced a lot of double and triple teams，so her ability to create off the dribble is really strong．＂
－Audrey－Ann Caron－Goudreau and Khalèann Caron－Goudreau（6－3，Forwards， Gatineau，Quebec）were both members of the Canadian Senior B national team that cap－ tured the championship of the William Jones Cup International Tournament in Taiwan．The twins were also both selected to the inaugural SchollyMe All－World Game，in Irvine，Calif．， and they were both McDonald＇s All－American nominees while starring at IMG Academy in Florida．Khalèann averaged 18.8 points and 8.8 rebounds per game as a senior and shot 44 percent from 3－point range．Audrey－Ann averaged seven points and 6.5 rebounds per game as a senior．

－Christa Reed（5－11，Guard，Bay St．Louis，Miss．）averaged 26.2 points， 7 rebounds， 1.7 assists and 2.2 steals as a senior．She was named to Clarion Ledger＇s Dandy Dozen as a junior and a senior，and was a McDonald＇s All－American nominee．
Quoting Balcomb：＂Christa has a flat－out consistent stroke from 3－point range．But there is more to her game than shooting the basketball．She is long and strong，and she can get to the rim and she can rebound．She＇s a very smart player．＂

Head Coach
13th Season

Over the past dozen seasons, head coach Melanie Balcomb has established herself as an iconic figure for the Vanderbilt women's basketball team while becoming the program's all-time leader in victories.

Balcomb, who arrived in Nashville prior to the 2002-03 season, has guided the Commodores to the NCAA Tournament in each of her 12 seasons at the helm, including earning a No. 8 seed in the 2014 tournament that enabled Vanderbilt to stretch its overall streak of NCAA appearances to 15 consecutive years.

Balcomb led the Commodores to 18 wins in the regular season during the 2013-14 campaign, bringing her Vanderbilt win total to 277. The team, which climbed as high No. 16 in the Associated Press poll, reeled off 13 wins in 14 games during one stretch midway through the season. The productive stretch included a victory over in-state rival Tennessee, marking the third time in the past six seasons that one of Balcomb's teams has defeated the Lady Vols.

Balcomb has led the program to at least 20 wins in 11 seasons of her 12 seasons at the helm in Nashville. She has won three SEC Tournament Championships, made four Sweet 16 trips and had eight top- 25 finishes at VU. On February 28, 2013, against Auburn, Balcomb secured her 257th victory, passing Jim Foster for the program's wins record in exactly as many seasons as the former Commodore coach.

Her 2013-14 squad featured two players -- Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister -- that formed one of the most dynamic backcourts in team history. Foggie, who led the SEC in scoring at 19.0 point per game as a senior, became the program's all-time leader in 3-pointers and Lister became the team's all-time leader in minutes played by a wide margin. Both players were named WBCA All-America Honorable Mentions. Foggie was a secondround WNBA draft pick by the Minnesota Lynx and Lister was invited to the Seattle Storm's training camp.

Over her first 12 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb coached nine WNBA draft picks, a WBCA National Defensive Player of the Year (Jennifer Risper), a WBCA National Scholar-Athlete of the Year (Christina Wirth) and a two-time SEC scoring champion (Christina Foggie), while graduating 100\% of her four-year players.

With 20-plus years of collegiate head coaching experience, Balcomb is a renowned offensive strategist. Her first 12 seasons at Vanderbilt have enhanced that reputation. Every Commodore squad has finished in the top-50 nationally in field goal percentage (including four teams that have finished nation's top four). Balcomb's inaugural Commodore team in 2002-03 led the nation in field goal percentage, shooting 51.3 percent. The 201314 squad ranked 12th in the nation, and second in the SEC, by shooting 45.9 percent.

The Commodores are also one of the nation's best 3-point shooting teams on a routine basis. In 2013-14, the Commodores ranked third in the nation, and led the SEC, in 3-point shooting at 40.0 percent. Balcomb's 2006-07 squad led the nation in three-point shooting at 43.7 percent.

Balcomb's teams have been especially successful at home, where Vanderbilt has posted a 155-32 (.829) record at Memorial Gym.

Balcomb's success as a head coach is not limited to Vanderbilt. Before arriving at Vanderbilt, Balcomb had successful coaching tenures at Ashland (Ohio) and Xavier. She picked up her 400th career win in the opening round of the 2011 SEC Tournament.

When Vanderbilt won its first-round NCAA Tournament game in 2013 over ninth-seeded Saint Joseph's, it gave Balcomb a 10-1 record in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores fell in the second round to top-seeded Connecticut, capping the season at 21-12.

Balcomb started at Vanderbilt in 2002 and wasted no time in implementing her own style of winning. Working to transition veteran players into a new system while building new team chemistry, Balcomb's first year saw the Commodores win six of their last seven regular season games, earn an NCAA Tournament berth, and lead the nation in field goal percentage (51.3) against the fourth toughest schedule in the country. She was named a finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year award.

In 2003-04, Balcomb led the Commodores to their fourth Southeastern Conference Tournament title. She masterfully balanced strong upper-class leadership with exciting freshmen talent, winning 10 consecutive games and advancing to the program's 11 th Sweet 16 appearance. One year later, her team made its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Commodores posted the most wins (10) in the program's history in Southeastern Conference play finishing with a 10-4 record.
The Commodores were ranked seventh in the final AP poll of the 2006-07 season, and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament after winning another SEC Tournament title. That Vanderbilt squad was the nation's best three-point shooting team, and ranked among the top 10 in points scored. The team's $28-6$ mark was the

best record for a VU squad in 14 years.
The 2008 season was also one of Balcomb's most impressive coaching jobs. Despite graduating three All-SEC seniors, she led the Commodores to a $25-9$ record and the school's 13th appearance in the NCAA sweet 16 , all with two freshmen and no seniors in the starting lineup.

In 2009, Vanderbilt won its sixth SEC Tournament title, the third for Balcomb in the last six years. The team also advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 14th time in school history -Balcomb's fourth trip with the Commodores. Vanderbilt finished the year ranked No. 8 in the ESPN/ USA Today Coaches Poll after narrowly missing an upset of No. 1 seed Maryland in the Raleigh Regional Semifinal.

National accolades came flooding in for Vanderbilt, including senior Jennifer Risper being named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Defensive Player of the Year. Risper and classmate Christina Wirth, who herself was named an All- American and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, were both selected in the 2009 WNBA Draft.

In 2010 Balcomb was faced with one of her most challenging tasks. Faced with replacing National Defensive Player of the Year Jennifer Risper and All-American Christina Wirth, Balcomb guided an undersized team back to the NCAA Tournament, where they narrowly missed advancing to their third consecutive sweet 16 .

Despite having to overcome numerous injuries throughout out the season and a size disadvantage in almost every game, Vanderbilt finished the season 23-11 overall. Individually, Balcomb helped junior point guard Jence Rhoads earn first team All-SEC honors, while senior shooting guard Merideth Marsh earned second team All-SEC accolades.

The 2010-11 season featured many obstacles that Balcomb successfully maneuvered through to reach another NCAA Tournament and finish third in the SEC. Injuries took an unfortunate toll on the team throughout the year with at least one of Vanderbilt's five leading scorers unavailable for 14 out of the team's 32 games. Injuries coupled with matching Georgia for the fewest upperclassmen in the SEC challenged Balcomb to use different personnel groupings regularly.

Despite the challenges, Balcomb again reached 20 wins, finishing 20-12 and 10-6 in the SEC. Individually, Balcomb helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention All-America honors from the Associated Press in addition to first team All-SEC recognition. Rhoads was also a WBCA Region 3 All-American. Freshman center Stephanie Holzer was named honorable mention All-SEC, SEC Sixth Woman of the Year and to the SEC All-Freshmen team. Freshman point guard Jasmine Lister was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. In 10 seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has won 13 games in the NCAA Tournament, including a 9-1 mark in the opening round. She holds a winning percentage of 65.7 against SEC opponents. In all, Balcomb owns series advantages over 10 of the 11 other schools in the SEC before 2012.

The 2011-12 season saw one of Balcomb's youngest teams, as the squad of 11 featured just one senior, yet she still successfully steered the Commodores to a 23-10 mark and a 13th-straight NCAA Tournament. Leading the way was break-out star Christina Foggie, who became the first Balcomb player to lead the SEC in scoring ( 17.7 ppg ).

Foggie was a First Team All-SEC selection and was joined by four other Commodores earning All-SEC honors - Jasmine Lister (second team), Tiffany Clarke (second team), Stephanie Holzer (honorable mention) and Kady Schrann (All-Freshman).

Vanderbilt defeated three ranked opponents on the season (No. 12 Oklahoma, No. 17 Georgia and No. 11 Tennessee), earning a seven seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores hosted at Memorial Gym, defeating 10th-seeded Middle Tennessee in the first round before falling to second-seeded Duke.

Before arriving at Vanderbilt, the Cranbury, N.J., native spent seven seasons at Xavier University. Beginning in 1995, her up-tempo style wreaked havoc on the Atlantic 10 while building the Musketeers into a national contender. In 1998, Xavier recorded its second post- season appearance in school history with a selection to the Women's National Invitational Tournament. Each of the next three seasons, Xavier competed in the NCAA Tournament, capped in 2001 by a victory over perennial power Tennessee and a run to the Elite Eight. En route to earning three invitations to the NCAA Tournament and compiling a 136-78 record during her tenure, Balcomb's offensive schemes helped push Xavier onto the national stage. Musketeer field-goal percentages ranked among the top three in the nation during three different seasons while the 1999 squad led the country in 3 -point accuracy at 40.1 percent. Her 2000-01 squad averaged 79.4 points per


game, the highest total in program history. Individual records were rewritten as well. Of the 15 Musketeers who have scored at least 1,000 points in a career, six of them played on Balcomb-coached teams.

Before her accomplishments at Xavier, Balcomb took her first head coaching position at Ashland University. Prosperity was immediate as Balcomb's first unit matched the best record in school history at 18-9 while registering its first winning season in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with an 11-7 mark.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Balcomb served three years as an assistant at Providence College (1990-93), during which the Friars went 62-30, made two NCAA Tournament appearances and once (1990-91) led the nation in scoring while they amassed a $26-6$ record. In 1989-90, Balcomb was an assistant at Ohio University and she began her coaching career with a four-year stint (1985-89) on the staff at Niagara University. In all, Balcomb has coached 19 players who have received All-SEC accolades. Nine of her players have been drafted by the WNBA, including VU's Chantelle Anderson, Ashley McElhiney, Jenni Benningfield, Ashley Earley, Carla Thomas, Dee Davis and Christina Wirth. Her Xavier teams won two league tournament titles (2000 and 2001) and one regular-season championship in the Atlantic 10 Conference (2001).

Xavier's successes during the Balcomb era helped push for construction of the Cintas Center, a state of the art facility which became home to Xavier basketball at the start of the 2000-01 season and - ironically - was dedicated with a victory over Vanderbilt. That season the program posted a school record for attendance with a total of 40,098 fans, who thrilled in the Musketeers' style of play and their results. Commodore followers have enjoyed the entertainment as well.

Her basketball education began at an early age among some of the most well respected coaches in the game. Balcomb's father, Alan, was a varsity boy's coach for 30 years at South Brunswick (N.J.) High School, and then served as an assistant for four years at Princeton University under Pete Carril, the master of the half-court game.
For Balcomb, however, a complete education goes far beyond the hardwood. Every eligible, four-year player during Balcomb's coaching tenure has earned her degree. In May of 2011, Balcomb's team earned a Public Recognition Award for finishing among the nation's top 10 percent in multi-year Academic Progress Rates (APR). Six of seven squads at Xavier earned team grade point averages that ranked in the Top 25. In 2004-05, 40 percent of the Commodore basketball team was named to the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll. Vanderbilt led the SEC with eight players being named to the honor roll in 2003-04.

Two Commodores have been named SEC Scholar Athletes of the Year under Balcomb. Hillary Hager received the honor in 2004 and Christina Wirth won it in 2009. Wirth was also named a 2009 Lowe's Senior CLASS All-American, while receiving WBCA and NCAA post- graduate scholarships. Hager recently returned to Vanderbilt and received her doctorate in 2010.

Balcomb also stresses the importance of community service to her teams. VU logged more than 95 hours of community service last season, including numerous opportunities to visit with young patients at the Vanderbilt Children's Hospital. After the devastating Nashville flood in 2010, Balcomb and her coaching staff volunteered in helping to clean up flood-damaged areas.

Balcomb herself has been active in outreach to the surrounding area, participating in numerous fundraising events for local and national organizations, including Coaches vs. Cancer, the Race for the Cure, Mercy Ministries, Vanderbilt Children's Hospital and the Girl Scouts of America. She joined colleagues to represent the SEC in the 2008 4Kay Golf Classic to benefit the Kay Yow Cancer Fund.

An avid golfer, Balcomb finds time to make it to beach on her rare weeks off, and also enjoys reading.

Tom Garrick, a former head coach at the University of Rhode Island, joined Vanderbilt's staff as an assistant coach in the summer of 2009 and was promoted to associate head coach in 2013.

Garrick focuses on working with the team's guards, and his impact has been impressive. He played an instrumental role in the success of Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie, who completed their outstanding careers with the Commodores in the spring of 2014. Foggie led the SEC in scoring as a senior, became the school's all-time leader in 3-pointers and was a second-round WNBA draft pick. Lister, meanwhile, left her mark at Vanderbilt by shattering the program's record for minutes played and ranking No. 3 on the all-time list for assists. Both Foggie and Lister rank among VU's Top-10 all-time leading scorers in WBB.

In his first year with the Commodores, Garrick helped Vanderbilt advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, and also played a role in Vanderbilt ranking second in the SEC in field-goal percentage and three-point field-goal percentage.

In 2010-11, Garrick helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention AllAmerica honors and first team All-SEC, and Lister earned SEC All-Freshman honors at point guard.

## Assistant Coach Eighth Season

Kim Rosamond is entering her eighth season at Vanderbilt as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for head coach Melanie Balcomb's Commodores.

Hired at Vanderbilt before the 2007-08 season, Rosamond brought 10 years of SEC experience as a player and coach with her to the Commodore staff. Rosamond coordinates Vanderbilt's recruiting efforts while also contributing to every facet of scouting, player development and on-court strategy.

Her relentless efforts on the recruiting trail have made an enormous impact for the program. The recruiting classes that she has helped coordinate have been ranked among the nation's best each year since she took on the role.

The 2014 recruting class extended that tradition, and the five highly-talented signees -- Paris Kea (Greensboro, N.C.),Rachel Bell (Cumberland Furnace), Christa Reed (Bay St. Louis, Miss.,) and twin sisters Audrey-Ann and Khaléann CaronGoudreau (Gatineau, Quebec) -- combined to form the No. 9-ranked class in the nation, according to Blue Star Report.

Rosamond's ability to help land impact players has been vital in enabling the Commodores to continue their string of NCAA tournament appearances. The streak reached 15 consecutive seasons after Vanderbilt advanced to the NCAA tournament at the end of the 2013-14 season.
"Kim has come in and made recruiting a full-time job," Balcomb said. "She is really helping us get ahead on the recruiting front, and get after that next-level talent. Kim is high energy and takes a great deal of pride in her job. On top of doing a tremendous amount of relationship-building for us, Kim has an outstanding knowledge of the game of basketball."

The 2013 signing class included Minnesota native Rebekah Dahlman, who became the first player in state history to score over 5,000 career points while

The progress was even more noticeable in 2011-12, as Foggie averaged 17.7 points per game to lead the SEC in scoring and earn First Team All-SEC Honors. Lister led the conference in assists ( 5.3 per game) and was a second team honoree.

Before arriving at Vanderbilt, Garrick spent the past 11 years coaching at his alma mater, including 2005-09 as the head coach of the Rams' women's basketball team.

Garrick began his coaching career as an assistant for the Rhode Island men's team in 1998-99, helping the Rams win the Atlantic-10 Championship in his first year. In 2001, he moved to the women's side to work under head coach Boe Pearman. When Pearman took a leave of absence in 2004, Garrick was named the acting head coach. He then took an assistant coaching position at the University of Virginia that spring before returning to Rhode Island in August to become the school's sixth head coach.

An outstanding player at Rhode Island, Garrick was drafted by the Los Angeles Clippers in 1988 and played in the NBA for four seasons, including stints in San Antonio, Minnesota and Dallas. Garrick's professional career also took him overseas to play in Germany, Turkey and Spain during a five-year span.

Garrick earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Rhode Island, where he was a four-year letterwinner for the men's basketball team. Nicknamed "the Chief," he led the 1988 squad to the Sweet 16, while compiling a program-best 28-7 record. Garrick still ranks among the school's all-time Top 10 in scoring (1,573 points) steals (189) and assists (407), and was inducted into the URI Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998.

During his prep career, Garrick was a two-time all-state basketball player for West Warwick (R.I.) High School, while also excelling in football.
earning player of the year honors from both Gatorade and the Associated Press. It also featured Marqu'es Webb, who picked up Gatorade Player of the Year and Miss Basketball honors in Alabama.

The six-member 2012-13 freshman class earned a top-25 ranking from ESPN HoopGurlz, while including two top-100 ESPN players in Morgan Batey and Jasmine Jenkins, while Kristen Gaffney and Heather Bowe were each named Associated Press Players of the Year in North Carolina and Wisconsin, respectively. Gaffney and Bowe also picked up Parade All-America honors.

Several players Rosamond helped bring to Vanderbilt have earned SEC AllFreshman honors, including Elan Brown, Tiffany Clarke, Stephanie Holzer, Jasmine Lister and Heather Bowe.

Before coming to VU, Rosamond spent two seasons on the staff at MTSU, where she was hired by Stephany Smith in 2003 as an assistant coach. She served as the interim head coach when Smith left in 2005. During her tenure in Murfreesboro, the Lady Raiders had consecutive 24-win seasons while capturing a pair of Sun Belt Conference championships and scoring two first-round NCAA Tournament upsets (over North Carolina and North Carolina State).

Prior to her time at MTSU, Rosamond spent five years as an assistant at her alma mater, Ole Miss. She was hired onto Coach Ron Aldy's staff in 1998 just months after graduating and would be promoted to recruiting coordinator in 2001.

Rosamond was responsible for bringing a pair top-50 classes to Oxford. Two Tennessee Miss Basketball selections were included in her Lady Rebel classes, with her final group of signees -- highlighted by All-American Armintie Price -having reached the NCAA Elite Eight in 2007.

Rosamond attended high school at Winston Academy in Louisville, Miss., where she was recruited to Ole Miss by Van Chancellor. She was a four-year letterwinner for the Lady Rebels (1995-98). Following her senior year, Rosamond was the recipient of the team's Lady Rebel Award, which is given to the player who excels on and off the court.

As a student-athlete at Ole Miss, Rosamond was the first Lady Rebel to earn All-SEC Academic honors in all four years of her collegiate career.

After serving as the Interim Head Coach at MTSU following the 2005 season, Rosamond worked in the private sector prior to coming to Vanderbilt.

Second Season

Ashley Earley, a former Vanderbilt star who graduated in 2005, returns for her second season on head coach Melanie Balcomb's staff.

Earley -- who works with the VU post players and contributes significantly to recruiting -- joined the Commodore staff in the summer of 2013. She spent the previous season as an assistant coach at the University of Virginia.

In her first season on the VU bench last year, she played a key role in the development of rising stars Heather Bowe, Marqu'es Webb and Kristen Gaffney, among numerous others. Earley's efforts helped Vanderbilt earn an NCAA tournament berth for the 15th consecutive season.

Earley has an immediate connection with the Commodore players, thanks to her own terrific career as a player at Vanderbilt from 2001-05. During that time, she helped lead her teams to the Elite Eight in 2002, the Sweet 16 in 2004 and 2005 and SEC Tournament Championships in 2002 and 2004.

As a senior, she was a unanimous first-team All-SEC selection, Kodak All-Region, Associated Press honorable mention All-American and Full Court Press second-team All-American. She paced the Southeastern Conference in field goal percentage and offensive rebounds and was a candidate for both the Naismith Trophy and Wooden

Award. She capped her career with 1,382 points, which ranks 20th in program history. After being drafted by the WNBA's Indiana Fever, Earley played professionally for the Maccabi Tel Kabir in the Safsal Israeli League. She embarked upon a career in coaching following her playing career, first as a graduate assistant at the University of Alabama. From Tuscaloosa, she went on to spend two seasons as an assistant coach at Tennessee Tech before spending one season on the staff at the University of Rhode Island.

Earley then moved to Marquette in 2010, helping the Golden Eagles to the second round NCAA Tournament and a 24-9 mark. She was in Milwaukee for one more season before moving to Virginia in April 2012.

A native of Memphis, Tenn., Earley was an outstanding prep player who was the 2001 Gatorade Tennessee Player of the Year.She was also named High School All-America by Parade, the Women's Basketball Coaches Association and USA Today for her senior season at Briarcrest High School. She earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from the College of Arts and Science at Vanderbilt, while also earning a master's in marketing from the University of Alabama in 2007

## Nicholas Zeppos • Chancellor



Chancellor Nicholas S. Zeppos was raised in Milwaukee, where he spent many an afternoon watching the great Hank Aaron of the Braves slug home runs in the old County Stadium.

Named Vanderbilt's eighth chancellor in 2008, Zeppos has taken a keen interest in athletics at Vanderbilt during his more than two decades at the university. Zeppos' appreciation for athletics was on frequent display in the last year, including being the first to welcome Tim Corbin and the Commodore baseball team back to Nashville after they captured the College World Series national crown and playing a vital role last January in the recruitment of Derek Mason as the 28th football head coach in team history.
"I don't do the operations," Zeppos said. "I don't call the plays, I don't throw the passes. I see my job as simply trying to do whatever I can to support all of the talented people who do these things."

This support has included the endorsement of an athletics capital improvement plan that has surpassed $\$ 60$ million, which orchestrates efforts to improve the student experience for athletes and assists with recruiting.
"One thing I consider the ultimate compliment is when a coach calls me and says, 'I've got a couple of recruits here. Could you meet them?'"

A distinguished legal scholar, teacher and executive, Zeppos served from 2002 to February 2008 as Vanderbilt's chief academic officer, overseeing the university's undergraduate, graduate and professional education programs and research in liberal arts and sciences, engineering, music, education, business, law and divinity. As provost and vice chancellor, he chaired Vanderbilt's budgeting and capital planning council, as well as oversaw the dean of students and dean of admissions.

Zeppos has led a number of important initiatives at Vanderbilt, including the planning process for The Ingram Commons, a landmark
transformation of the first-year experience; the recent university-wide strategic planning process; innovative efforts in undergraduate admissions and financial aid; and the development of new programs in Jewish studies, law and economics and genetics, among others.

In a bold move to strengthen Vanderbilt's commitment to admitting undergraduates on the basis of accomplishment and achievement, rather than their ability to pay, Zeppos significantly expanded the financial aid program in 2009. By replacing undergraduate, need-based loans with grant and scholarship assistance, the university opened its doors wider to highly talented and qualified students of all economic, cultural and geographical backgrounds. The expanded aid program is funded by a combination of strategic budget allocations and gifts from thousands of generous donors to the current Opportunity Vanderbilt campaign.

Zeppos was recognized with five teaching awards at the law school before serving as an associate dean, associate provost, and provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs. He also served as interim chancellor for eight months prior to being formally appointed as Vanderbilt's eighth chancellor on March 1, 2008.

Zeppos is the president of the Southeastern Conference (SEC).
He also serves on the National Security Higher Education Advisory Board; the Newseum Institute, Inc. Board; and as co-chair of the Senateappointed Task Force on Government Regulation of Higher Education.

From 1982 to 1987, Zeppos practiced law in Washington, D.C., at the United States Department of Justice and at Wilmer, Cutler \& Pickering, where he specialized in appellate litigation involving complex regulatory, statutory and constitutional matters.

Zeppos is a 1979 magna cum laude graduate of the University of Wisconsin Law School, where he served as editor in chief of the Wisconsin Law Review and was selected as the outstanding graduate of his class. He studied history during his undergraduate years at the university, where he was a 1976 Phi Beta Kappa graduate.

He is married to Lydia A. Howarth, a graduate of the University of Chicago and Lawrence University. They have two sons, Benjamin and Nicholas.

## David Williams • Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics <br> Williams has kept top coaches and staffs on campus. Recently, he



Since 2003, David Williams II has guided the Commodores into arguably the "Golden Era" of Vanderbilt athletics as the university's Director of Atheltics.

Williams ranks among the university's most prominent leaders, serving in numerous capacities since arriving in Nashville in 2000. Aside from his role in McGugin Center, Williams holds the titles of Vice Chancellor for University Affairs and Athletics and law professor at Vanderbilt. He also is active with the SEC and NCAA in matters of negotiations, reforms, regulations and planning.

Today, Williams has firmly placed his stamp on the program, and has positioned Vanderbilt athletics among the most innovative in the nation. Just in the past year, Williams has been instrumental in directing the Commodores toward national prominence. Under his leadership, a \$31 million multi-purpose indoor facility opened in November. The state-of-the-art complex houses a practice field and a 300-meter indoor track. In January, he hired Derek Mason, one of the country's most well-respected and brightest coordinators, as head coach of the football team. And, in June, the baseball team won the first men's national championship in school history by reigning supreme at the College World Series.

The cumulative grade point for Vanderbilt student-athletes has continued to improve through Williams' tenure, reaching its highest level in more than two decades. Competitive successes, such as a schoolrecord three straight bowl appearances (including two consecutive bowl wins) in football, recent SEC titles in baseball, women's cross country and women's golf is becoming an expectation on campus. Individual accomplishment has been increasing, with 12 Vanderbilt athletes being selected in the first round of their respective professional drafts in the last 10 years.

In addition to the hiring of Mason, Williams also demonstrated his leadership within the Vanderbilt program by orchestrating successful searches for exceptional coaches to guide Commodore sports. In 2012, Williams also directed the search for new men's golf coach Scott Limbaugh. This past May, Limbaugh, in just his second season, guided Vanderbilt to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2007.
orchestrated extensions for baseball coach Tim Corbin and men's tennis coach Ian Duvenhage.

Williams has addressed numerous facility upgrades, including an extensive refurbishing of Vanderbilt Stadium and football locker rooms, expansion of Hawkins Field, addition of new tennis courts and amenities at Brownlee O. Currey Tennis Center and renovations in Memorial Gym, the Hendrix Room and the McGugin Center.

An initiative to allow more overseas travel and study for Vanderbilt student-athletes also has become reality during Williams' tenure. Last year, 21 athletes ventured to Tanzania during the summer of 2013 for a 10-day service trip to bring shoes to underprivileged communities in Africa in conjunction with Soles4Souls.

In association with Vanderbilt Athletics, Williams has served as a member of the SEC team that negotiated recent ESPN and CBS television partner contracts. Williams also serves as Chair of the NCAA Infraction Appeals Committee and is a member of the NCAA Enforcement Working Group.
Williams joined Vanderbilt from The Ohio State University in 2000 as Vice Chancellor, General Counsel and University Secretary. His role expanded to Vanderbilt Athletics in 2002.

Williams served numerous administrative roles at Ohio State over 14 years. When he accepted the Vanderbilt role, Williams was Vice President of Student and Urban/Community Affairs and Professor of Law at Ohio State.

A native of Detroit, Williams received a Bachelor of Science in Social Science and Master of Arts in Education from Northern Michigan University, where he ran track. He also earned a Master of Business Administration and a Doctor of Jurisprudence from the University of Detroit, and an L.L.M. in taxation from New York University. Before entering law school, Williams spent 10 years as a teacher and coach in the Detroit public school system.

Williams has taught at the law schools of the University of Detroit, Capital University, Ohio State and Vanderbilt, and twice directed the Ohio State Law Program in Oxford, England. He was elected outstanding law professor at both the University of Detroit and The Ohio State University.

Williams is active in the Nashville area community, serving as a board member with several organizations.

Currently, Williams is serving a second term on Nashville Mayor Karl Dean's Procurement Standards Board. He is also a former two-term member of the Nashville branch of the Atlanta Federal Reserve Board.

Williams and his wife, Gail, have four children: Erika, who is a grade school teacher in Detroit and graduate of Eastern Michigan University; David Williams III, who is a two-time graduate of Bowling Green State University and is an academic counselor at Michigan State where he is working toward a doctorate; Samantha, a Brown University graduate and swimmer now attending Vanderbilt Law School after working for U.S. Senator Lamar Alexander; and Nick, who was named a scholar athlete as a freshman member of the High Point (N.C.) University track team and graduated from University School of Nashville where he was selected as 2012-13 co-Athlete of the Year after competing in cross country, basketball, track and soccer.

Williams' wife, Gail, is a graduate of the University of Michigan and the University of Detroit College of Law and serves as the Associate Director of Community Relations of Vanderbilt. She is a past president and current board member of the University School of Nashville Board of Trustees and is the past Chair of the Metro Transit Authority where she continues to serve as a board member. In addition, Gail serves on the Boards of many non-profit organizations, including The Frist Center, The Women's Fund Advisory Board, and the YWCA.


## HOT START, TOUGH FINISH

To say that Vanderbilt experienced an up-and-down season in 2013-14 would certainly be accurate.
Although the Commodores earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament for the 15th consecutive year, the season featured plenty of adversity -- including the loss of several key players to injuries and various other reasons -- and a difficult finish.
After opening the year with 16 wins in their first 19 games and rising as high as No. 16 in the Associated Press poll, the Commodores lost 10 of their final 12 games, including ending the season on a five-game skid to finish 18-13.
Still, the season contained a large collection of highlights for the Commodores, as head coach Melanie Balcomb led her team to the NCAA tournament for the 12th time in her 12 seasons at Vanderbilt.
Here's a look at a few of the Commodores' other noteable moments from the 2013-14 campaign:

- Posted a 74-63 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on Jan. 12 at Memorial Gym. The Lady Vols were ranked No. $8 / 8$ in the nation at the time, and went on to be a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament.
- Put together a nine-game winning streak from Nov. 24 through Jan. 4 which featured victories over Dayton, Wisconsin and Georgia.
- Earned an impressive road win at James Madison (25-5) on Dec. 18, which represented James Madison's only home loss of the season.
- Won five of six road games from Dec. 15 through Jan. 16, with wins over Hartford, James Madison, UAB, Ole Miss and Auburn.
- Posted a 13-1 record from Nov. 24 through Jan. 25, with the only loss in that stretch being to nationally-ranked South Carolina.
- Opened SEC play with five wins in first six games.
- Defeated three ranked opponents in the span of 15 days by beating No. 19 Georgia, 66-58, on Jan. 2, beating No. 8 Tennessee, 74-63, on Jan. 12 and beating No. 14 LSU, 79-70, on Jan. 19.


## SENIOR DUO COLLECTS HONORS, BREAKS RECORDS

Vanderbilt seniors Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie produced a stream of awards and honors throughout the season and postseason, including being named WBCA All-American Honorable Mentions in March after being named All-Region selections for the award.
Also, Foggie became the school's all-time leader in 3-pointers (276) and moved into seventh place on the all-time scoring list ( 1,743 ). Lister broke the school record for minutes played $(4,626)$ and rose to No . 10 on the school's alltime scoring list $(1,618)$.
Foggie was named First Team All-SEC by the Associated Press, and was a Third Team All-American by College Sports Madness. She was also named to the Naismith early-season and mid-season watch lists, along with being named to the watch list for the Wade Trophy.
Foggie and Lister were both named to the All-SEC Second Team by the conference's coaches, and both were named to the Dawn Staley Award watch list.

## TOURNAMENT TRADITION CONTINUES

Vanderbilt is one of eight programs to have made the last 15 NCAA Tournaments (dating to 2000).
The Commodores are joined by Connecticut, Duke, Georgia, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Stanford and Tennessee as the only programs to have earned bids each of the last 15 seasons.

## FOGGIE IS SEC'S TOP SCORER

Senior Christina Foggie won the SEC regular-season scoring title after averaging a career-high 19.0 points per game. She scored in double figures in all but two of Vanderbilt's games. Foggie also won the SEC scoring title as a sophomore, when she averaged 17.7 points per game.

## NOT MUCH MADNESS

Although the Commodores usually make a postseason push, there wasn't much magic in March of 2014.
Vanderbilt lost its first game of the SEC Tournament -- falling to Georgia, 53-43, in Duluth, Ga. -- which marked the first time since 1999 that the Commodores failed to win at least one game in the tournament.
Vanderbilt also made a rare early exit from the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores, who were the No. 8 seed in the Notre Dame Region, suffered a 69-61 first-round loss to No. 9-seeded Arizona State. It was only the second time in Balcomb's 12 seasons that Vanderbilt did not post at least one win in the NCAA Tournament.

## SHOOTER'S TOUCH

As they have so often done during Melanie Balcomb's tenure, the Commodores once again proved to be one of the best-shooting teams in the nation.
They finished the season ranked 12th in the country -- and second in the SEC -- in field goal percentage at 45.9 percent.
The Commodores were especially strong from 3-point range. They led the SEC and ranked third in the nation by shooting 40.0 percent from long range.

## COMMODORES FINISH SHORT-HANDED

By the end of the season, the Commodores were operating with a thin roster.
Vanderbilt announced in late February that sophomore Heather Bowe would not be enrolled in school for the remainder of the spring semester due to a violation of university academic policy. Bowe had seen action in 27 games and had made 21 starts. She averaged 5.1 points and 4.3 rebounds.
Just a few weeks earlier, Vanderbilt announced that freshman Rebekah Dahlman would miss the remainder of the season after she underwent surgery on Feb. 5. Dahlman was diagnosed with a blood clot in her right shoulder in December, and underwent multiple procedures.
She was in the starting lineup for Vanderbilt's first nine games -- averaging 11.4 points per game -- but did not see action after the Commodores' win over East Tennessee State on Dec. 3.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - On a day the Commodores honored head coach Melanie Balcomb before the game for becoming the school's all-time wins leader, it was only fitting that Vanderbilt would put together a textbook offensive game - something Com modore fans have become accustomed to under the 12th-year head coach.
With five players scoring in double figures, led by freshman Rebekah Dahlman's 23, Vanderbilt (1-0) routed Appalachian State (0-1) 96-53 Friday at Memorial Gymnasium as the Commodores opened the 2013-14 season in resounding fashion.
Vanderbilt led by 25 points in the first half and did not let off the gas in the second half, leading by as many as 48 points and rolling to its 28th straight win in a home opener. The Commodores have now won eight straight season openers.
Balcomb became Vanderbilt's wins leader in last year's home finale against Auburn. The Commodores went on to finish 2012 13 with a 21-12 record after advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Like any new season, there were questions after losing two starters off last year's squad.
Although it was just one game, the answers to some of those questions seemed to become more apparent through the efforts of a balanced scoring attack that was not reliant on preseason All-SEC guards Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister. The duo each scored 10 points, but played sparingly in the second half with the game out of reach.
With the senior leaders on the bench, Vanderbilt got 23 points from Dahlman and 19 points from sophomore guard Jasmine enkins. Freshman forward Marqu'es Webb added 13 points and joined Dahlman in Vanderbilt's starting lineup.
It was the first time Vanderbilt had five players in double figures since last January 3 against Mississippi State
It was a balanced attack, but it was Dahlman who stood out the most. She went 8 -of-10 from the floor and 6 -of- 7 from long range to set a new scoring mark in a freshman debut. No other Vanderbilt freshman has ever scored as many points in their first game as Dahlman did
The previous record was 22 points scored by Barbara Brackman on November 20, 1981 in an 82-58 win over Belmont. She also collected four rebounds and dished out two assists.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - A senior and a freshman provided a perfect balance - and a powerful punch - for the Vanderbilt women's basketball team on Monday night.
Senior Christina Foggie scored 21 of her game-high 26 points in the first half and freshman Rebekah Dahlman added 18 points -- including ripping off 14 straight early in the second half -- to help Vanderbilt overcome a sluggish start and roll past Western Kentucky, 85-60, in a non-conference game at Memorial Gym. The two Jasmines -- Lister and Jenkins -- also reached double figures, with Lister finishing with 11 points and Jenkins adding 10 for Vanderbilt (2-0). Rayte'a Long had a team-high nine rebounds and Heather Bowe and Morgan Batey added seven boards apiece to help Vanderbilt win the battle on the glass, 48-31.
Alexis Govan scored 18 to pace Western Kentucky (1-1)
Foggie scored her 26 points efficiently, taking just 11 shots from the floor, making seven. She finished 5-of-9 from 3-point range and was 7 -of- 7 of the foul line.
"They were just giving me open shots, and I've been trained to shoot it and knock it down," said Foggie. "So, I just had confidence from the start."
Vanderbilt, which opened the season on Friday with a 96-53 win over Appalachian State, started slowly against Western Kentucky.
But Foggie almost single-handedly kept Vanderbilt afloat in the first half, scoring 12 of the Commodores first 17 points in the first 11-plus minutes. She was 6 -of- 8 from the floor in the first 20 minutes, including 4 -of- 6 from long range, and she was the primary reason that Vanderbilt eventually owned a 37-31 lead at the break
In the second half, it was Dahlman's turn to dominate. She scored 16 of her 18 points in the final 20 minutes, highlighted by her 14-point flurry that started with a layup at the 16:24 mark and ended when she nailed a jumper at the 12:32 mark. Vanderbilt owned a 46-34 lead before her explosion, and $58-38$ advantage by the time it ended.
"(The) first half I started out really slow," said Dahlman. "I talked to coach after the game and she (said) `you just didn't buy in.' I agreed. But the second half I just came out really confident. I just did my thing and knocked down shots."

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team woke up just in the nick of time Thursday night.
The RV/No. 25 Commodores trailed for much of the night before seniors Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie took the game over and paved the way for a 73-67 victory over stubborn Delaware tate at Memorial Gym.
Vanderbilt (3-0) trailed by 11 points at the half and was down $48-38$ at the 13:25 mark of the second half before getting off the deck and outscoring the Hornets 35-19 the rest of the way.
Foggie finished with a double-double, scoring 16 points and pulling down a career-high 10 rebounds. She narrowly missed a triple-double, adding eight assists.
Lister scored 15 points on 7 -of- 15 shooting and made a series of huge plays down the stretch
Two underclassmen, freshman Kylee Smith and sophomore Heather Bowe, also were instrumental in the victory, producing timely baskets in the second half to help Vanderbilt avoid the pset
Bowe finished with eight points and seven rebounds, and Smith had nine points, five rebounds and two assists for the Commodores.
It was Vanderbilt's 32nd win of its past 35 home games, but the Commodores hardly felt like celebrating. Vanderbilt came into the night as substantial favorites against a Delaware State team that lost its season opener to Old Dominion, 97-67.
But the Hornets gave Vanderbilt a huge scare, and Vanderbilt's
victory wasn't secured until the last two minutes.
"It's definitely better to learn form a win than a loss, but we want to play Vanderbilt basketball," said Foggie. "We have a lot to learn from (this game). ... Its good that we could fight back and compete and get the win."
The Commodores hadn't faced much adversity in their first two games, but there was plenty of tense moments Thursday. It certainly appeared an upset might be in the making when Delaware State owned a double-digit lead with roughly 13 minutes to play. But the Commodores staged their late rally to avoid what would have been a stunning defeat.
"I challenged them at halftime and they did make a change -- a big change," head coach Melanie Balcomb said.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - After opening the season with three straight wins, things got all fouled up for the Vanderbilt women's basketball team on Sunday.
Facing Marquette in front of a lively crowd at Memorial Gym, the RV/No. 25 Commodores built a 14-point lead in the first half but then ran into major foul trouble in the final 20 minutes and suffered their first loss of the season, 82-77. Marquette closed the game on an 11-4 run to secure the win
The contest saw the teams combine for a staggering 63 fouls and 74 free throws. Marqu'es Webb, Kylee Smith and Morgan Batey all fouled out for Vanderbilt.
Christina Foggie had another huge game for Vanderbilt, scoring 30 points (four shy of matching her career high) while going 16-of-18 at the foul line. She was joined in double figures by three of her teammates: Jasmine Lister with 13 points, Rebekah Dahlman with 12 and Jasmine Jenkins 10.
But the balanced scoring wasn't enough to offset a second-half comeback by the feisty Golden Eagles, who proved to be the more aggressive team in the second half -- as evidenced by the stat sheet. Vanderbilt, which owned a 47-36 lead at the half, shot 26 free throws in the first 20 minutes, compared to Marquette's 10. But the second half featured 24 free throws by the Golden Eagles, while Vanderbilt shot 14. Marquette's intensity was also reflected in the rebounding stats, as they won the battle on the glass, $25-13$, in the final 20 minutes (and 37-31 for the game)
"The first four minutes of the second half really changed the game," said Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb. "They came out more aggressive after halftime and we didn't. We have to figure out why. ... I really thought we had built confidence and we were going to continue to be the aggressor and we weren't." Katherine Plouffe scored a team-high 16 points for the Golden Eagles (3-0) and was one of five Marquette players in double figures.
Foggie fell just shy of a record-setting day. She was one short of the Vanderbilt all-time record for free throws attempted (set by Ashley McElhiney with 19 in Feb., 2001) and two shy for free throws made in a game ( 18 by McElhiney)

DURHAM, N.C. - For more than 30 minutes, Vanderbilt hung tight with the No. 2/2 Duke Blue Devils on their home floor. But down the stretch, the Blue Devils -- and Tricia Liston, in particular -- proved to be too much
Liston went 5 -of-6 from 3-point range while scoring 15 of her team-high 18 points in the second half, and Duke pulled away for an 88-69 victory over the Commodores on Thursday night. The Blue Devils improved to 4-0; Vanderbilt fell to 3-2.
Vanderbilt was down only 36-34 at the half and was still within striking distance at the midway mark of the second half, trailing 61-54.
But the Commodores then endured a cold snap, missing seven straight shots from the floor, and Duke begin to extend its advantage.
A basket by Duke's Alexis Jones, followed by a 3-pointer by Liston, pushed the lead to 66-54, and the Blue Devils maintained a doubledigit lead the rest of the way.
Jasmine Lister scored a game-high 23 points for Vanderbilt, including going 4-of-7 from 3-point range, but that wasn't enough to offset the Commodores' 28 turnovers in the loss.
Christina Foggie added 18 for Vanderbilt, and freshman Kylee Smith pulled down a team-high seven rebounds in the first road game of her college career.
The Commodores showed plenty of fight in the opening half, when they essentially traded baskets with Duke and also won the rebounding battle, 18-16. But the Devils flipped the game around in the second half, outscoring Vanderbilt 52-35 and out-rebounding the Commodores, 16-11
Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb said her team got a little impatient in the second half when the tempo picked up. "I think we shot ourselves in the foot a little bit by taking really quick shots," she said. "Once they got hot, and hit shots, I felt like we hit the panic button. And instead of executing and getting the ball inside and out ... we took quick shots to try to stay with them" For Duke, Liston finished 6-of-8 shots from 3-point range to account for all 18 of her points, and was one of six Duke players in double figures. Chelsea Gray also had a huge game, scoring 14 points with 12 assists and eight rebounds.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - It's hard to classify a game in November as a "must-win" -- but Sunday's contest sure felt like one for Vanderbilt.
And the Commodores certainly responded as if it were. Putting together their most solid 40-minute effort of the season, the hot-shooting Commodores snapped a two-game losing skid in emphatic fashion, storming past Dayton, 82-52, at Memorial Gym.
The RV/RV Commodores (4-2) shot 57 percent from the floor including going 8-of-11 (72 percent) from 3-point range, and went 20 -of-22 ( 90 percent) from the foul line while sailing past the RV/No. 24 Flyers.
Rebekah Dahlman scored a team high 17 points and Christina Foggie added 16. The two players combined to go 7 -of- 9 from 3 -point range (Foggie was 4-of-5; Dahlman 3-of-4; ). Morgan Batey added 10 points and a team-high seven rebounds. Freshman Marques Webb also added 10 points while helping Vanderbilt gain revenge for last November's road loss to Dayton. More importantly, the win helped the Commodores regain some momentum after they had suffered back-to-back setbacks -- losing to No. 2/2 Duke, 88-69, on the road on Thursday night and falling to Marquette last Sunday at home.
"Vanderbilt has a great tradition, and losing three games in a row is unacceptable," said Batey, who provided a huge boost off the bench with her energetic play. "We had to win this game." After the teams battled to an 18-18 tie, Vanderbilt closed the first half with a 15-5 run to build a 33-23 lead. The Commodores then opened the second half with $17-8$ spurt -- which included two 3s by Foggie and one by Jasmine Jenkins -- to push the advantage to 50-31, and they maintained a comfortable lead the rest of the way.
With Dahlman disrupting Dayton's offense by applying full court pressure, the Flyers endured a frustrating game in which they shot just 33.3 percent from the field and made only four of their 21 attempts from 3-point range (19 percent).
(Dayton) is a great shooting team with a lot of firepower," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "I felt like we wore them down, which I wanted to do. I think we made the right adjustments in our matchup that we needed to make."

And it proved to be a great bargain for Commodores' fans.
With free admission for all fans at Memorial Gym, a crowd of 4,446 saw the Commodores storm out to a 24 -point halftime lead and sail o an 88-66 win over Elon in the opening game of the Vanderbilt
Thanksgiving Tournament.
Jasmine Lister scored a team-high 22 points and Christina Foggie had 18 for the Commodores, who improved to 5-2 on the season and 27-0 in the history of the Thanksgiving tourney.
Vanderbilt earned its spot in the tourney's championship game after putting together a red-hot start from long range against Elon (2-3).
The Commodores went 9-of-14 (64.3) from 3-point territory in the opening 20 minutes, with Foggie going 5 -of- 6 . Vanderbilt shot 58 percent (20-of-34) from the floor overall while building a 55-31 lead.

Morgan Batey and Jasmine Jenkins scored eight apiece.
Lister finished 9-of-17 from the floor and was aggressive going to the basket throughout much of the night. She also flashed her range hitting 4 -of- 9 shots from 3 -point range.
Smith finished 5-of-6 from the floor and also pulled down a teamhigh seven rebounds for the Commodores Webb scored her 10 points in just 14 minutes of action.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Vanderbilt women's basketball coaching staff was reminded again on Saturday how thankful they are to have Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie as members of the program. And they are grateful to have some rising young stars, too.
Facing a stubborn Wiscosin team in the championship game of the Thanksgiving Tournament, the Commodores used the clutch play of Foggie and Lister -- combined with some pivotal plays from a trio of freshman -- to earn an 81-69 victory at Memorial Gym.
The win was the Commodores' third straight, and pushed them to 6-2 on the season. NR/RV Vanderbilt now owns a 28-0 all-time record in the Thanksgiving tourney.
Foggie scored a game-high 23 points, going 9 -of- 14 from the floor, and was named the tourney's MVP. Lister added 14 points on 6 -of- 11 shooting and was named to the All-Tournament Team. Both of them made huge plays down the stretch, helping Vanderbilt close the game on a 22-10 run to pull away from the Badgers (4-2).
"I told them after the game, "The two of you played like seniors tonight," said head coach Melanie Balcomb about Foggie and Lister. "And they said, 'We had to. That's who we are.
The three freshman made big contributions, too. Kylee Smith finished with a career-high 16 points and helped Vanderbilt secure the win by making clutch free throws in the closing minutes. She also earned a spot on the All-Tournament team.
Marqu'es Webb added nine points and Rebekah Dahlman notched a team-high eight rebounds, the most of her young career.
Smith entered the night just 1-of-11 at the foul line for the season, and missed her first attempt of the game. But she was automatic after that, making six straight in the second half to help Vanderbilt pull away
"The three freshman showed courage tonight," said Balcomb. "I was very excited about what they did."
Vanderbilt owned a 41-30 lead at the half, but Wisconsin charged back to tie the game on three occasions, the final time coming on a basket by Taylor Wurtz that tied the game at 59-59 with 8:18 to play. Then the seniors stepped up. Again.
Foggie knocked down a 3-pointer that gave Vanderbilt the lead for good and sparked an 11-0 spurt by the Commodores. Lister's layup capped the surge, and Wisconsin never got closer than nine points the rest of the way.

In her absence, the Commodores (8-2) needed someone to supply an extra dose of energy, and Jasmine Lister took on the assignment. Tiffany Mitchell added 19 for the Gamecocks, who improved to 9-0 at home.

AUBURN, Ala. - It has become a tradition for Vanderbilt to beat Auburn, and seniors Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister made sure the Commodores continued the custom Thursday night.
Foggie scored a team-high 26 points, including going 6 -of- 11 from 3 -point range, and Lister had a double-double with 23 points and 10 assists to lead Vanderbilt to a $74-65$ road victory over Auburn. It was Vanderbilt's 21st straight win over the Tigers, and head coach Melanie Balcomb improved to 18-0 against Auburn since her arrival at Vanderbilt in 2002.
"I don't know what it is (about Auburn)," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "It's all about match-ups. (And) we do look at the history and tradition, and that gives us confidence against them..
Vanderbilt (13-3, 2-1) used a 17-2 run late in the first half to build a 43-30 lead at the half, and the Commodores maintained a doubledigit lead against the Tigers (10-5, 1-1) until the final 90 seconds. With the ESPN cameras rolling -- and a huge crowd of 9,412 in the house -- the Commodores earned a victory that is certain to generate a large amount of attention.
Overomcoming a 10-point second-half deficit, Vanderbilt stunned No. 8/8 Tennessee, 74-63, at Memorial Gym to post their 11th win in the past 12 games.
Vanderbilt (14-3, 3-1) trailed 39-29 early in the second half before getting off the deck and outscoring Tennessee 45-24 during the final $161 / 2$ minutes to upset the Lady Vols (13-3, 2-2).

Freshman Marqu'es Webb added 12 points, and Morgan Batey had nine points and eight rebounds. Batey's jumper with 6:44 left to play gave Vanderbilt a 51-50 lead, and the Commodores never trailed again.
It was Vanderbilt's first win over Tennessee since a 93-79 victory on Feb. 9, 2010 in Nashville.
Meighan Simmons finished with 19 points for the Lady Vols, but was just 8 -of- 21 from the floor.
Coming into the game, the Commodores were staring at some ugly numbers: They had lost 10 of the past 11 games against Tennessee, and the Lady Vols owned a 61-8 lead in the series that dates back to the 1979-80 season. But Vanderbilt wasn't interested in history Sunday. The Commodores were simply focused on the moment.
"We absolutely believed that it was just another game," said Foggie. "Like I said earlier this week, we don't want to treat it any differently because then we start playing out of our comfort zone and out of characteristic."

OXFORD, Miss. - Four days after generating a big upset, the Vanderbilt omen managed to avoid being the victims of one.
The No. 24/25 Commodores, who stunned Tennessee on Sunday, survived a scare Thursday night and used a strong finish to down Ole Miss, 80-74.
Christina Foggie scored 20 of her team-high 28 points in the second half as the Commodores improved to 4-1 in the SEC (15-3 overall). Vanderbilt has now won three straight games and 11 of its past 12 .
Foggie finished 9 -of- 14 from the floor and was 3-of-6 from 3-point range. Vanderbilt -- which ranks first in the SEC and second in the nation in field-goal percentage -- shot 57 percent from the floor (32-of-56). Valencia McFarland had 28 points for Ole Miss (9-9, 0-4) and Tia Faleru had 20. Jasmine Lister finished with 17 points and Morgan Batey added 11 to help the Commodores grind out the win in a contest that wasn't decided until the final two minutes.
"It wasn't easy," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "But that's OK. In the SEC, it's not going to be easy. This was a game we needed."
By posting the victory, Vanderbilt prevented history from repeating itself. Two seasons ago, the Commodores followed up an upset of Tennessee by losing their next game to Georgia. Vanderbilt, in fact, lost three of its next four games after downing Tennessee during the 2011-12 season. But the Commodores avoided a letdown Thursday, thanks to the play of the seniors, Lister and Foggie, and some clutch work by freshman Kylee Smith. She scored all nine of her points in the final $4: 40$ while helping Vanderbilt turn a three-point lead into a 10-point cushion down the stretch.
"I like her aggressiveness," said Balcomb.
Ole Miss was on fire in the first half, hitting 17 -of- 25 shots ( 68 percent) from the floor and carrying a 38-37 lead into the locker room. Vanderbilt also shot the ball effectively, making 16-of-29 shots in the half.
The Commodores ran out to a quick 9-2 lead, but Ole Miss, fueled McFarland and Faleru, charged back with a 28-14 surge to take a 30-23 lead. The Commodores whittled the deficit to one point at halftime after scoring on their final two possessions of the first half, including a buzzerbeating jumper by Batey.
Lister led all scorers with 15 points in the first half. McFarland and Faleru had 13 points each for the Rebels.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The shooting percentages just continue to rise for the Vanderbilt women's team. And chances are, the No. 24/25 Commodores will see their national ranking rise this week, too.
Vanderbilt was effective from all over the floor Sunday -- long range, inside and the foul line -- during an impressive 79-70 victory over No. 14/14 LSU before a large and energetic crowd of 6,020 at Memorial Gym.
Senior Jasmine Lister scored a game-high 25 points and fellow senior Christina Foggie added 19 for the Commodores (16-3, 5-1), who built a 20-point lead in the second half and then fought off an LSU comeback bid down the stretch. The win was the Commodores fourth straight and their 13th in the past 14 games.
Danielle Ballard finished with 23 points for LSU (14-4, 3-2) and Theresa Plaisance added 16.
Foggie and Lister combined to go 13 -of- 24 from the floor, including 5 -of- 9 from 3-point range. Lister, the reigning SEC and espnW Player of the Week, was 10 -of-10 from the foul line and also dished out a team-high seven assists.
Morgan Batey added 11 points, four rebounds and three assists for Vanderbilt.
Lister said she and Foggie were simply being opportunistic while leading Vanderbilt to its third win over a ranked opponent this month.
"We just both took what the defense gave us, and what the offense gave us as well," said Lister. "Our team just executed well and set good screens.... It's a team effort and our team did a great job of finding us shots."
Vanderbilt entered the weekend as the SEC leaders -- and ranked among the Top-5 in the nation -- in field goal percentage and 3-point percentage. And the Commodores showed why against LSU. They shot 52 percent from the floor, including 59 percent in the second half, and finished 7 -of- 11 from 3-point range (63.6)
Vanderbilt also made 24 -of- 30 attempts from the foul line and the solid work at the line came in handy down the stretch. After seeing LSU trim Vanderbilt's 20-point lead down to seven with 90 seconds to play, Vanderbilt hit 5-of-6 free throws to close out the win. The loss ended the Commodores' four-game SEC winning streak and their eight-game home winning streak that dated back to a loss to Marquette on Nov. 17
"It's definitely a frustrating loss," said senior guard Christina Foggie, who finished with a team-high 20 points for Vanderbilt, "but we still had a lot of positives in the game. We played pretty tough for the whole game. So we will watch the film and keep moving on to the next game."

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Vanderbilt's Jasmine Lister broke a school record Thursday night, but she didn't feel like celebrating.
Although Lister became the program's all-time leader in minutes played, that was little consolation on a night when a huge Commodore comeback bid ultimately fell short and No. 16/18 Vanderbilt suffered a $59-54$ loss to Missouri on the road. Missouri (14-7, 3-5) snapped a four-game SEC losing skid, while Vanderbilt (16-5,5-3) lost its second straight. The Commodores endured an uncharacteristically poor shooting night -finishing at 22.2 percent from the floor -- but still had a chance to win in the final minute.
Down by 16 early in the second half, the Commodores charged back to cut it to 55-54 after a three-point play by Kylee Smith with 52 seconds left. Vanderbilt then had the ball with a chance to take the lead, but a traveling call gave the ball back to the Tigers.
Missouri hit four straight free throws in the final 16 seconds to win it. Lister played all 40 minutes of the game, bringing her career total to 4,260 and enabling her to surpass former Vanderbilt record holder Zuzi Klimesova, who played 4,249 minutes in her career from 1999-02. Christina Foggie scored a team-high 10 points for Vanderbilt, but was 1 -of-9 from the floor, including 0 -for-6 from 3-point range. No other Vanderbilt player reached double figures, and the Commodores, who are the SEC's best 3-point shooting team, finished 2-of-16 from long range. Vanderbilt was 14-of-63 from the floor for the game.
Missouri's Bri Kulas led all scorers with 15 points.
The Commodores endured a frustrating first half -- making just 7-of-30 shots (23.3 percent) -- and went to the locker room trailing 33-20. Vanderbilt went the final 6:48 of the half without a field goal, a rare stretch for a team that entered the night ranked second in the SEC and seventh in the nation in field goal percentage (48.6).
Lister and Foggie both were just 1 -of- 4 from the floor in the opening half. Lister's 3-pointer with 8:55 left in the half tied the game at 13-13 but Missouri broke things open with a 16-2 run to build a 29-15 lead. Vanderbilt went 5-of-6 at the foul line in the final 2:39 of the half to keep the deficit from becoming even larger.

Sophomore Morgan Batey helped her coach feel much better by mid-afternoon.
Batey scored a career-high 17 points, including knocking down the game-winning free throws with 2.2 seconds remaining that lifted No. 16/18 Vanderbilt to a 71-69 victory over No. 17/15 Texas A\&M at Memorial Gym.
The victory enabled the Commodores (17-5, 6-3 SEC) to snap a two-game losing skid and saddle Texas A\&M (17-6, 7-2) with its first road SEC loss of the season.
Batey finished 5-of-7 from the floor and 7-of-7 from the foul line while easily surpassing her previous career high of 11 points. She also pulled down a team-high six rebounds.
"I've talked to Morgan for the last two weeks about just getting back to doing her job," said Balcomb. "She knows what her job and her role is, and ... when she does that, she all of a sudden becomes a star, doing the little things."

Traveling to Knoxville for a rare Monday night game, No. 16/19 Vanderbilt was handed its worst loss of the season, falling to No. 8/8 Tennessee, 81-53, before a crowd of 11,384 .
The Commodores (17-6, 6-4) entered the game with hopes of completing a season sweep of the Lady Vols (20-4, 9-2) after they beat Tennessee 74-63 in Nashville last month. But Vanderbilt fell behind by 11 points at the half and then saw the deficit swell throughout the final 20 minutes.
"We didn't get stops on the defensive end and that made us tight on offense," said Vanderbilt senior guard Jasmine Lister. "We just didn't execute the game plan in the second half. We came out really flat."
Christina Foggie finished with 22 points to lead the Commodores (17-6, 6-4), who will have to regroup quickly before hosting Auburn on Thursday and traveling to Miss. State on Sunday.
Meighan Simmons scored 22 points and Isabelle Harrison added 18 for the Lady Vols (20-4, 9-2). The two players combined to go 17 -of- 25 from the floor.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Senior Christina Foggie continues to move up the charts on several of Vanderbilt's all-time lists. But for now, it's a sure be that she and the No. 16/20 Commodores are more concerned with the fact that they aren't moving up the standings in the SEC
Thursday night's 68-62 home loss to Auburn -- which ended Vander bilt's staggering 21 -game winning streak against the Tigers -- was the Commodores' fourth loss in the past five games and dropped them to 6-5 in the conference (17-7 overall).
Foggie had another huge game, scoring 23 of her game-high 24 points in the second half. In the process, she reached two monumental milestones -- tying former star Merideth Marsh for the program's record for career 3 -pointers (with 256) and moving into the Top-10 on Vanderbilt's alltime scoring list.
But her explosive second half wasn't enough for the Commodores, who saw Auburn (14-10, 5-6) score the final six points of the game after the teams were tied at $62-62$ with 39 seconds left.
"Foggie's a great offensive player, but we're not going to win a lot of games with one kid scoring," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "Everybody in this program can score and, if we would execute and stick to our game plan, they would score. But we're not doing a good job of sticking with our game plan."
Auburn's Tyrese Tanner scored a game-high 18 points, including a bas ket in the paint with 24 seconds left that put the Tigers ahead for good. Auburn's defense then came up with two straight stops, and the Tigers hit four straight free throws to seal the win.
Brandy Montgomery finished with 13 points for the Tigers, who earned their first win over the Commodores since beating Vanderbilt 55-54 in Nashville on Jan. 16, 2000.
Vanderbilt was hoping Thursday's game would be the perfect opportunity to bounce back from Monday's 81-53 defeat to Tennessee. Instead, the Commodores suffered a home loss for only the third time this season Vanderbilt trailed 29-21 at the half and was down 52-47 with 7:30 to play before the Commodores put together a 6-0 run to take their first lead of the second half, $53-52$, on a pair of free throws by Morgan Batey with 5:48 to go.
The teams then traded clutch baskets for the next five minutes, with six lead changes and three ties in that stretch, while playing to a 62-62 tie with under a minute to go. But Auburn made the big plays in the final 30 seconds to grab the win.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - After a joyous January, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team is enduring a frustrating February. And not even a record-setting achievement by Christina Foggie could ease the pain Sunday for the No. 16/20 Commodores, who lost their third straight game Sunday, falling to Miss. State, 64-62, in Starkville.
Martha Alwal's basket in the paint with three seconds left broke a 62-62 tie and lifted the Bulldogs (17-9, 4-8) to their first win over Vanderbilt (17-8, 6-6) since the 2009-10 season. Alwal finished with a game-high 23 points.
"You don't want a game to come down to the last possession on the road," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "When it does, it's not going to be in your favor."
Foggie, who scored a team-high 15 points despite being hampered by foul trouble, became Vanderbilt's all-time leader in 3-pointers when she knocked down a shot from the corner with 4:37 left in the first half. It was the 257th of her career, enabling her to surpass former Commodore standout Merideth Marsh atop the list. Marsh made 256 during her career from 2007-10.
But Foggie's record-breaking basket ultimately proved to be the day's only memorable element for the Commodores, who continued their recent trend of hard-luck losses. They've gone $1-5$ in their past six games, and four of the losses have been decided in the final minute.
Sophomore Morgan Batey had a double-double, finishing with 13 points and 11 rebounds for the Commodores, and Jasmine Lister also had 13 points for Vanderbilt.
Breanna Richardson finished with 16 for Miss. State, which ended a six-game losing streak in the series.
Vanderbilt built a 10-point lead midway through the first half, and owned a 28-21 lead at the break. But Miss. State rallied back to take its first lead of the game, 50-49, on a basket by Dominique Dillingham with 7:17 to go, and the teams traded clutch baskets the rest of the way.
Foggie tied the game at 62-62 with a fade-away jumper with 15 seconds to go, but Alwal answered with the game-winner with 3.3 seconds left. Vanderbilt then had one final possession, but didn't get a shot off.
Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, was limited to 27 minutes of action due to foul problems.

Arkansas battled back to make it tight down the stretch, but the Commodores never gave up the lead.
Vanderbilt entered the night having lost five of its past six game - a stretch that included four close-call losses that were decided in the final minute. Vanderbilt shot just 40 percent from the floor in those six games.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Traditionally, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team has dominated the two SEC teams from the state of Alabama. This season, the routine has been altered.
Just 10 days after being upset by Auburn on their home floor, the Commodores suffered another stinging loss Sunday when Alabama posted its first-ever win in Nashville with a 66-62 victory.
Vanderbilt came into the day having won 12 straight against Alabama and 17 of the past 18 matchups between the teams. But this time, the Tide came up with the big plays.
Alabama's Daisha Simmons, who finished a game-high 21 points, scored the game-clinching basket with 14 seconds left, giving the Tide (13-14, 6-8) a four-point lead and essentially sealing another lastminute loss for Vanderbilt (18-9, 7-7).
It was the sixth defeat in the past eight games for the Commodores, and five of the losses have been decided in the final 60 seconds. Now, with two games remaining in the regular season, the Vanderbilt players know they need to finish strong.
"We really don't want to end the season on a down note," said senior Christina Foggie, who finished with a game-high 22 points. "We have two choices and we want to choose to fight back and end the season in the (most) positive way we can. It's just about bouncing back from this loss.' Vanderbilt had history on its side Sunday, with the Commodores owning a 17-0 record against Alabama in Nashville. But the success of the past hasn't been a propelling factor in recent days for the Commodores, who saw their 21-game winning streak against Auburn come to end last week.
Head coach Melanie Balcomb said her team is relying too heavily on its seniors to carry the offensive load after watching her team lose to Alabama for the first time since the 2003-2004 season.
"Offensively, we were living and dying off of Christina Foggie's 3s instead of executing our offense," said Balcomb, who is now 13-2 against the Tide in her career at Vanderbilt. "There were too many outside shots that we expected to go in."
Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, finished 7-of-19 from the floor, includ ing 3-of-12 from 3-point range. Jasmine Lister had seven points and eight assists.
Freshman Kylee Smith had one of her best games of the season, finishing with nine points and nine rebounds.
"Kylee Smith -- she did everything we asked," said Balcomb. "She was fearless and relentless."

On an emotional Senior Night at the historic gym, the Commodores suffered a 73-68 loss to Florida before a crowd of 3,338. It was Vanderbilt's seventh loss in the past nine games, and dropped the Commodores to 18-10 overall and 7-8 in the SEC. Florida improved to 18-10, 8-7.
Foggie scored a game-high 24 points and Lister added nine points and seven rebounds for the Commodores, who fell behind 23-6 in the opening 10 minutes of the first half and then saw a second-half comeback bid fall short.
Lister and Foggie, who are two of the most celebrated players in team history, were hoping for one last taste of Memorial Magic in their final regular-season home game, but the Gators prevented it. Although Vanderbilt trimmed Florida's lead to three points on four occasions in the final eight minutes, the Gators always had an answer. Florida's Cassie Peoples hit one of the night's biggest shots when she knocked down a 3-pointer with 3:57 to go after Vanderbilt had pulled within three points.
"I think it was just about (us not) getting a stop when we needed to," said Foggie. "I don't think we communicated as much as we needed to, and I think they just made timely 3 s in clutch situations." Florida's Carlie Needles sealed the win for the Gators when she. it two free throws with five seconds remaining to push Florida's lead to 73-68 after Foggie had pulled the Commodores within three ead to 73-68 after Foggie had pulled the Commodores within three oints on a jumper with seven seconds remaining.
Head coach Melanie Balcomb said her team continues to struggle to come up with timely plays on defense.
"We changed every defense you could possibly change," she said, "(but) at some point you have to stop somebody and all be on the same page."
Freshman Kylee Smith finished with 15 points and five rebounds for the Commodores, and sophomore Morgan Batey had her second career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds.
Vanderbilt's Kristen Gaffney, who has been sidelined by knee injuries since the beginning of last season, made her debut with the Commodores. Logging five minutes of action, Gaffney had two rebounds and two assists.

LEXINGTON, Ky. - Although Vanderbilt lost another down-to-the wire contest Sunday, the Commodores came away feeling encouraged -- not dejected.
Facing No. 12-ranked Kentucky in the regular-season for both teams, the Commodores gave the high-powered Wildcats all they could handle before eventually being saddled with a 65-63 loss in Lexington.
Jasmine Jenkins' potential game-trying shot missed the mark at the buzzer, sending the Commodores -- who had fought back from a 17-point first-half-deficit -- to their third straight loss. Kentucky made seven of eight attempts from the foul line in the final 50 seconds to fend off the Commodores.
Vanderbilt (18-11, 7-9), which lost for the eighth time in the past 10 games, will now head into the SEC tournament as the No. 8 seed, and will face No. 9-seeded Georgia on Thursday in Duluth, Ga. Kentucky (22-7, 10-6) will be the No. 4 seed and will get a doublebye into Friday's quarterfinals
"Losing is a great teacher," said Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb. "We haven't lost (this many games) in years, so we are learning a lot. (And) I like how my team is responding. I like our chances in postseason, to be honest with you."
Christina Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, had a game-high 23 points and Jasmine Lister added 15 for the Commodores. DeNasha Stallworth led the Wildcats with 18.

DULUTH, Ga. - The start of the postseason was similar to the end of the egular season for the Vanderbilt women.
Unable to break out of the funk that they have been trapped in for the past several weeks, the No. 8-seeded Commodores lost their SEC Tournament opener on Thursday, falling to No. 9-seeded Georgia, 53-43, at the Arena at Gwinnett Center.
The defeat stretched the Commodores' losing streak to four games, and marked the first time since 1999 that Vanderbilt has failed to win at least ne game in the SEC Tournament.
The Commodores -- who lost six of their final seven games in the regular season -- will now have to wait to see if they receive a bid to the NCAA Tournament. Vanderbilt has made the NCAA tournament 14 consecutive seasons, including making 11 straight appearances since Balcomb's arrival in 2002.
Christina Foggie finished with a game-high 19 points and Kylee Smith had 10 for the Commodores (18-12), who have gone 2-9 since Jan. 20. Georgia's Khaalidah Miller scored 12 points to lead the Lady Bulldogs (20-10), who will face top-seeded South Carolina on Friday.
"We've been on a stretch where we haven't finished games," said head coach Melanie Balcomb. "I don't think our mentality was where it needed to be (today)."

The Commodores were hoping to use Thursday's game as a chance to strengthen their case to make this year's NCAA tournament. Instead, they endured a rough afternoon in which they produced their lowest scoring total of the season and struggled badly at the free throw line, making just 6-of-20 attempts.
Georgia's defense limited Vanderbilt to 17 total field goals, and Lady Bulldogs won the rebounding battle, 35-28, including collecting 13 rebounds on the offensive glass.
"Georgia came ready to play and worked really hard, dominated us on the boards, was more physical, more aggressive, got a lot more shots," said Balcomb. "They earned this victory. They did a great job"
Vanderbilt, which beat Georgia 66-58 in the SEC opener for both teams on Jan. 2, shot just 30 percent from the floor in the first 20 minutes and trailed 28-15 at the half. The Commodores trimmed Georgia's lead to $32-$ 24 when Foggie converted a 3-point play at the 16:19 mark of the second half, but Georgia responded with back-to-back 3-pointers by Erika Ford and Miller to push the lead back to 38-24.
The Commodores never got within 10 points the rest of the way. "We weren't as aggressive as (they were) from the jump, neither on defense or offense," said Vanderbilt senior Jasmine Lister, who finished with six points after being limited to only six shots from the floor.

## Commodores' season ends with NCAA opening-round loss

TOLEDO, Ohio - The month of March didn't contain much madness for the Vanderbilt basketball team this year.
Unable to generate their traditional postseason push, the Commodores were ousted from the NCAA Tournament with a 69-61 first-round loss to Arizona State at Savage Arena in Toledo, Ohio.
The defeat was the capper on a tough late-season stretch for the Commodores, who lost 10 of their final 12 games, including making rare first-round exits from both the SEC and NCAA tournaments.
Vanderbilt (18-13) had won at least one game at the NCAA tournament in 10 of the past 11 seasons under head coach Melanie Balcomb. But this time, the Commodores -- who were making their 15th consecutive appearance at the tournament -- exited quickly after being unable to slow down an Arizona State team that was red-hot from the floor.
The No. 9 -seeded Sun Devils (23-9) shot 61 percent for the game, including 67 percent in the second half, and had four players finish in double figures. Katie Hempen scored a team-high 16 points, going 6 -of- 8 from the floor, including 4 -of-5 from 3-point range.
Sophie Brunner added 14 points, Eisha Davis had 11 and Promise Amukamara had 10 for the Sun Devils, who advanced to play Notre Dame in the second round.
For Vanderbilt, freshman Marqu'es Webb had a terrific performance, scoring a season-high 18 points and pulling down eight rebounds. Christina Foggie added 16 points and Jasmine Lister had nine. But their efforts weren't enough to enable the Commodores to overcome a frustrating performance during which they continually missed shots inside the paint and went just 14-of-27 at the foul line.
Vanderbilt entered March with hopes of recapturing the success they had in December and January, when they reeled off 13 wins in the span of 14 games, including a victory over Tennessee.
But the postseason didn't go as planned for the Commodores, who suffered a first-round loss to Georgia in the SEC Tournament -- marking the first time since 1999 that Vanderbilt didn't win at least one game at the tourney -- and then saw their season end with Saturday's first-round loss to Arizona State.
The defeat marked the end to the storied careers of Foggie and Lister, who are both ranked among Vanderbilt's Top-10 on the all-time scoring list. Foggie is the program's all-time leader in 3 -pointers and Lister played more minutes than any Commodore in team history.
"It was an honor to have played with them," said Webb. "I learned so much from them and my basketball IQ increased (from being around them). It was a blessing to be their teammate."
Balcomb also raved about the two outgoing seniors, who participated in the NCAA tournament each year of their careers.
"There are just so many positives Jas and Foggie have left in their legacy here," she said. "There could not be any better ambassadors for Vanderbilt than those two."
Foggie finished 2-of-6 from 3-point range against Arizona State. Her 3-pointer midway through the second half enabled Vanderbilt to pull within two points at 44-42, but Arizona State then put together a 10-3 run, capped by Hempen's jumper from the foul line, to push the lead 54-45 with 6:27 to go, and the Commodores never got within six points the rest of the way.
That sequence essentially summed up the game for the Commodores, who made a series of runs throughout the day, only to see the Sun Devils answer with a big shot each time.
"Emotionally, it deflates you a little bit when that happens," said Foggie. "But you just can't dwell on it."
Vanderbilt trailed 30-24 after an entertaining first half that featured one big scoring run by each team and some hot shooting by Arizona State's Hempen. The junior guard went 4 -for- 4 from 3-point range in the half, and led all scorers with 12 points.
The Sun Devils had the first surge, putting together a 10-2 run to build an 18-8 lead. The Commodores then responded, outscoring Arizona State 14-2 over the next five minutes to take their first lead of the game, 22-20, on a layup by Batey at the 3:19 mark. Arizona State answered with pair of 3s by Hempen to retake the lead, and the Sun Devils eventually carried a 30-24 lead into the locker room after Davis scored in the paint right before the buzzer. Arizona State then maintained the lead throughout the second half.

## Notable Accomplishments

## Wendy Scholtens - 1990

Wendy Scholtens, a 6-4 center from Ft. Smith Arkansas, holds the Vanderbilt record for most rebounds in a career. She holds a total of 15 Commodore records, including all of the free throw categories. She was the SEC Freshman of the Year and earned All-SEC honors three times, while earning All-SEC Academic Honors twice. She was also selected SEC Player of the Week eight times. She is the only woman at Vanderbilt to have her jersey retired. She was inducted into the Tennessee Sports
Hall of Fame in 1999 and Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in 2009.

## Heidi Gillingham • 1993

Heidi Gillingham, a 6-8 center from Floresville, Texas, holds six Vanderbilt records, including an SEC record 131 blocks in a season. Gillingham is the tallest player in Vanderbilt history. She was a three-time All-SEC first team selection and was chosen SEC Player of the Week once. She was selected to the 1993 NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team and was named Sports Illustrated National Player of the Week. She was also named Homecoming Queen at Vanderbilt. She was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame in 2000 and Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in 2010.

## Sheri Sam • 1996

Sheri Sam, a 6-1 forward from Duson, La., is the third Kodak All-American from Vanderbilt. Sam ranks in five statistical categories and totaled double digits in scoring in 77 games and in rebounding in 22 games. She was selected SEC Player of the Week once and was a two-time All-SEC team selection. She was also named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll. Sam was a Naismith Finalist in 1996 and was named to the 1996 NCAA Tournament AllRegional Team.

## Chantelle Anderson • 2002, 2003

Chantelle Anderson is Vanderbilt's first two-time Kodak All-American earning the honor her junior and senior seasons. She was the first Commodore to earn SEC Player of the Year honors (2002) and was also named ESPN The Magazine Center of the Year. She was named MVP of the NCAA Midwest Regional and was a Naismith Finalist in 2001, 2002 and 2003. As a sophomore, the 6-6 center from Vancouver, Wash., set the NCAA record for field goal percentage connecting on 292-404 from the field for a 72.3 percentage. She is also the VU career leader in points with 2,604 points. She was inducted into the Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in 2008.

## MEMORIAL GYM

The Southeastern Conference's most historic home for college basketball, Memorial Gymnasium, serves as the home court for the Vanderbilt Commodores. Dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II, the arena was built as a combination gymnasium and concert hall by the late master architect Edwin Keeble.

Six decades later, the unique style of Memorial Gymnasium - with its benches situated on the baselines, a playing court that sits above portions of the crowd and deafening acoustics - continues to make the Commodores' home a dreaded stop for opponents. "Memorial Magic," with its capacity crowds, overflowing student section and lively pep band have assisted in numerous Commodore victories. In the stands, fans across Middle Tennessee have helped Memorial Gymnasium (capacity 14,316 ) rank among the NCAA's Top 30 attendance leaders on numerous occassions.

On the floor, Vanderbilt has a 438-101 record at home, winning 81.3 percent of its games, and has only had one losing season at home (1982-83). Under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb, Vanderbilt has won 82.9 percent (155-32) of its home games. The Commodores finished 12-5 at home last season.

When the 2012-13 season tipped off, Memorial Gym featured a new video board, installed during the summer of 2012. The display, manufactured by Utah's Young Electric Sign Company, features four screens that measure 16 feet by 9 feet and includes a 2 foot tall LED display that wraps around the bottom of the board.

Before the 2008-09 season, Vanderbilt's locker rooms, the video room, the training room and media room were renovated and are now state-of-the-art. The floor was also replaced before the 08-09 season. During the 2009-10 season, the building received new championship banners.

In 2002, a $\$ 25$ million renovation of Memorial Gymnasium was completed, highlighted by yet another one-of-a-kind feature. Connected to the facility sits a new practice gym that includes a three cross-court playing floor, coaching offices, a donor room and a Hall of Champions. Other aspects of the renovation included upgrades of the seating areas, private suites, a new lighting and sound system and a new court design.

In all, Memorial Gym has been expanded three times. Constructed with a seating capacity of 6,583, the University saw its first need to increase seating in 1965 with the addition of two north-side balconies. Two years later, a pair of balancing balconies were erected on the south side of the gym and dubbed "The Balconies That Clyde Lee Built."

Capacity has fluctuated throughout the history of the building. It reached its highest number of 15,646 in 1969 when 4,000 seats were added in the east and west ends. When chairback seats in the end zones and suites on the north side were installed in the late 1990s capacity lowered to 14,168 . Prior to last season, university officials removed portions of media press row on the south side in an effort to expand the student section by nearly 150 seats. Official capacity for the 2012-13 season will be 14,326.
