# HEAD COACH STEPHANIE WHITE

## Stephanie **WHITE**

Head Coach / First Season



Stephanie White was named the head coach for Vanderbilt women's basketball program on May 25, becoming just the fifth all-time head coach in the history of the Vanderbilt program.

Having enjoyed success at virtually every level of basketball as a player and coach, White arrived at Vanderbilt after spending two seasons as the head coach of WNBA's Indiana Fever. White took the Fever to the playoffs in each of her two seasons, including a trip to the WNBA finals in 2015.

"The opportunity to lead Vanderbilt's women's basketball program is an opportunity that I simply could not pass up," White said. "The combination of Vanderbilt's culture, where achievement -- both on and off the court - is so highly valued, together with the institution's fan support, and a legacy of winning basketball to build upon, is incredibly exciting to me. I appreciate the support and understanding that I have received from the Indiana Fever, from management to the players, regarding my passion to coach college basketball at an elite institution."

White -- who played five seasons in the WNBA after a decorated playing career at Purdue -- was named head coach for the Fever in September 2014. In 2015, she guided the Fever to the WNBA finals, becoming the first rookie coach in league history to lead a team to the finals.

"Above all else, academics, research, scholarship, and service define the Vanderbilt experience, yet we also compete at the highest levels in athletics," Vanderbilt Chancellor Nicholas S. Zeppos said in announcing White. "Coach White's values align perfectly with those in our university community. I welcome Stephanie to Vanderbilt and look forward to working with her as she leads our women's basketball program to fulfill our goals and highest potential."

As a collegiate player, White enjoyed a highly successful career at Purdue, where she earned national Player of the Year honors after helping lead the Boilermakers to the 1999 NCAA championship as a senior. That season, she also received the Wade Trophy (given to the nation's top female player) and was named Big Ten Conference Player of the Year.

"Stephanie White has been a winner in every phase of her career," Vanderbilt athletic director David Williams said. "She was the nation's high school player of the year, she was the NCAA's Player of the Year on a national championship team and she led her WNBA team into the finals in her first year. She was an outstanding scholar. She wants to coach at Vanderbilt and we believe she is just the person to lead our program back into national prominence."

White averaged double-figure scoring in all four seasons of her college career, including 20.2 points per game as a senior. White was inducted into the Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame on April 21, 2006.

White was also a star in the classroom at Purdue. She was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and was an Academic All-American.

White has been coaching in the WNBA since 2007, and has also served as a college basketball analyst for ESPN and the Big Ten Network. She has covered the NBA's Indiana Pacers for FOX Sports Indiana.

She was an assistant coach with the Chicago Sky from 2007-2010, then joined the Fever staff as an assistant in 2011. She was promoted to associate head coach in 2014 before being named head coach after Lin Dunn's retirement.

Prior to coaching in the WNBA, White coached in the college ranks, serving as an assistant at Toledo (2005-07), Kansas State (2004-05) and Ball State (2003-04).

Before beginning her coaching career, White enjoyed a productive five-year WNBA career, spending one season with the Charlotte Sting and four with the Indiana Fever, before retiring in 2004.

At the completion of her four seasons with the Fever, she ranked third in games played (112) and 3-pointers (92), and fourth in scoring (684). She was named to the Fever's All-Decade Team that was announced in 2009.

White and her wife, Michelle, have three boys: Landon, age 5, and twins, Aiden & Avery, age 2.

## THE LOWDOWN ON THE CLASSIC

Riding the momentum of a four-game winning streak, the Vanderbilt women travel to Colorado Springs, Colo., this weekend to participate in the Air Force Classic. The Commodores, who are off to a 5-1 start under first-year head coach Stephanie White, will open the two-day event on Friday night, facing tournament host Air Force at 8 p.m. (CT).

Vanderbilt is only team in the tournament that will carry a winning record into the event. The tourney's other three teams -- Utah Valley, Air Force, S. Illinois-Edwardsville -- have a combined record of 3-15 and have been outscored by an average of 20.6 points in those 15 losses.

## UPDATE ON THE 'DORES

With a 79-77 road victory over UT Martin on Sunday afternoon, the Commodores earned their first road win of the Stephanie White Era and stretched their overall winning streak to four games.

Individually, the Commodores are led in scoring by Rebekah Dahlman at 14.5 points per game. Dahlman also leads the team in assists at 4.8 apg and ranks among the SEC leaders in multiple categories (More on Dahlman below). Marqu'és Webb is averaging a team-high 9.7 rebounds per game.

## WHAT'S TRENDING

Although the season is young, the Commodores are already establishing several encouraging trends. Here's a look at some of the noteworthy numbers (stats are as of Wednesday):

- ◆ The Commodores are shooting 42.7 percent from 3-point range through the first six games, which ranks fifth in the nation (as of Wednesday) and ranks No. 1 in the SEC.
- ◆ Vanderbilt is averaging 8.8 three-pointers per game, which leads the SEC and ranks 19th in the nation.
- ◆ The Commodores are ranked 22nd in the nation and No. 2 in the SEC in free throw percentage (78.0).
- ◆ Vanderbilt is ranked No. 2 in the SEC and 37th in the country in total assists.

## DAHLMAN GETTING IT DONE

Redshirt junior guard Rebekah Dahlman is thriving in Stephanie White's up-tempo style.

Dahlman is averaging a team-high 14.5 points per game -- compared to 8.6 ppg last season -- and is shooting a sizzling 60.9 percent from 3-point range, which ranks fifth in the nation and second in the SEC. Dahlman also leads the conference in free throw percentage (90.6) and 3-pointers made (14).

## MARQU'ES MARCHING TOWARD 500

Marqu'és Webb is zooming toward the 500-rebound mark for her career. With her four boards on Sunday against UT Martin, she now has 498. Webb has posted double-digit rebounding totals in three games this season.

## THIS AND THAT

Here are a few notes and numbers to keep an eye on as the Commodores enter the Classic:

- ◆ With Sunday's victory at UT Martin, the Commodores finished November with a 5-1 record. It was the first time since the 2011 that Vanderbilt emerged from November with less than two losses. (VU went 5-2 in November in each of the past two seasons, 6-2 in 2013 and 4-3 in 2012. Vanderbilt was 7-0 in November of 2011).
- ◆ Vanderbilt has three players who rank among the SEC's Top-10 in career 3-pointers among active players: Rebekah Dahlman ranks sixth with 115, Christa Reed ranks ninth with 83, and Rachel Bell is 10th with 79.
- ◆ The Commodores made 14 3-pointers against Kennesaw State in the season opener (finishing 14-of-26), which represents the most 3-pointers by an SEC team in a game this season.

## OUR NEW LEADER

Stephanie White is in her first season with the Commodores after being named head coach on May 24. Becoming just the fifth head coach in the program's history, White replaced former head coach Melanie Balcomb, who resigned in April after 14 seasons with the team.

White came to Vanderbilt after spending two seasons as head coach of the WNBA's Indiana Fever. She led the team to the playoffs each season, including guiding the Fever to the 2015 WNBA Finals in her rookie season to become the first rookie coach in league history to take a team to the finals.

During her playing career, she was a standout at Purdue, where she earned national player of the year honors after helping lead the Boilermakers to the 1999 NCAA championship. Her coach that season was Carolyn Peck, who now the associate coach on White's staff at Vanderbilt.

## MAD SUCCESS AT MEMORIAL

With Tuesday's win over RMU, the Commodores have now posted a 49-3 record against non-conference foes at Memorial Gym since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, and have won 13 straight non-con home games.

Dating back to the start of the 2002-03 season, VU owns a 99-8 record on its home floor in regular-season, non-conference games, including going 18-1 against non-conference opponents at home since the start of the 2014-15 season.

## SIGNING DAY SUCCESS

Comprising the inaugural signing class of Vanderbilt first-year head coach Stephanie White, a pair of highly-rated recruits -- Autumn Newby and Chelsie Hall -- signed National Letters of Intent with the Vanderbilt women's basketball team on Wednesday, the first day of the early signing period.

Newby is a 6-2 forward from Archer High in Lawrenceville, Ga., who averaged 12.7 points and 12.6 rebounds per game last season. Hall is a 5-7 point guard from Seffner Christian Academy in Tampa, Fla., who averaged 21.2 points per game last year.

Together, the two players form a signing class that was ranked No. 23 in the nation by BlueStar Report on Wednesday. (Newby was ranked by BlueStar as the No. 20 overall prospect and Hall was ranked No. 28).

## MOST RECENT GAME VS. AIR FORCE

### Nov. 30, 2015: Vanderbilt 86, Air Force 29

The Vanderbilt offense put together a terrific shooting performance and an even better defensive effort while rolling to an 86-29 victory over Air Force last season at Memorial Gym.

Vanderbilt (5-2) forced Air Force into 30 turnovers and limited the winless Falcons (0-6) to single-digit scoring in the first, second and fourth quarters.

The Vanderbilt offense got rolling midway through the first quarter and never slowed down. The Commodores shot 69 percent from the floor for the game -- including a staggering 75 percent in the second half -- and had 10 different players reach the scoring column. It was the first time since Jan. 3, 2010 (against Ole Miss) that Vanderbilt shot 70 percent or better in a half.

Rachel Bell led the way with a career-high 20 points, going 4-of-4 from 3-point range, as the Commodores extended their winning streak to four games. Bell went 8-of-11 from the floor and had two rebounds and one steal.

Bell was one of three VU players in double figures. Jasmine Jenkins scored 12 points, finishing 6-of-7 from the floor, and Marqués Webb had 11 points and a team-high five rebounds. Webb was 5-of-5 from the field and 1-of-1 at the foul line.

Sarah Fotsh led Air Force with 11 points. Vanderbilt's Rayte'a Long had nine points, and Morgan Batey had eight points and four steals for the Commodores, who finished with 15 steals.

Air Force came into the night averaging only 40 points per game -- and the Falcons' offensive difficulties were compounded by the Commodores' stingy defense that limited Air Force to 36 percent shooting from the field (13-of-36).

The final score represented the biggest margin of victory -- and the fewest points allowed -- by the Commodores since Dec. 21, 2008, when Vanderbilt beat UT-Martin by the identical score of 86-29.

The Commodores got off to a slow start on offense, and owned an 8-7 lead near the midway mark of the first quarter. But Vanderbilt reeled off a 27-0 run -- scoring the final 13 points of the first quarter and the first 14 of the second -- to build a 35-7 lead, and steadily padded the advantage from there.

## Bell comes up big as 'Dores clip UT Martin

*Junior guard scores 14 points in the fourth quarter to help Vanderbilt extend win streak*

NASHVILLE - With Sunday's game hanging in the balance, Rachel Bell came up big -- on both ends of the floor.

Bell scored 14 points in the fourth quarter and also came up with a crucial blocked shot in the final five seconds to help Vanderbilt escape past UT Martin, 79-77. Bell finished with a team-high 22 points for the Commodores (5-1), who won their fourth straight game.

"I am proud of our team for gutting it out and finding a way to win," said first-year head coach Stephanie White, who posted her first road win with the Commodores. "This was a chance for us to learn and get better. And hopefully that's what we did."

Bell made 5-of-6 shots from the floor in the fourth quarter, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range.

Rebekah Dahlman finished with 17 points while helping Vanderbilt stretch its winning streak in the series to 11 games. The Commodores finished 13-of-22 from 3-point range.

Emanye Robertson finished with a game-high 23 points for UT Martin (1-5).

The Commodores owned a 76-70 lead with 2:38 to play after two free throws by Christa Reed, but UT Martin used a 7-2 run to pull within 78-77 with 39 seconds left.

UT Martin's Kendall Spray, who is ranked among the national leaders in 3-point proficiency, appeared to have an open look from long range with five seconds remaining, but Bell stepped up and blocked the shot.

Vanderbilt's Cierra Walker then hit the back end of two free throws with 1.1 seconds remaining to give the Commodores a 79-77 lead. On UT Martin's final possession, Emanye Robertson missed a contested shot under the basket.

The intense game featured 11 lead changes and five ties.
