## HEAD COAGH STEPHANIE WHITE

## Head Coach / First Season

Stephanie White was named the head coach for Vanderbilt women's basketball program on May 24, becoming just the fifth all-time head coach in the history of the Vanderbilt program.

Having enjoyed success at virtually every level of basketball as a player and coach, White arrived at Vanderbilt after spending two seasons as the head coach of WNBA's Indiana Fever. White took the Fever to the playoffs in each of her two seasons, includng a trip to the WNBA finals in 2015.
"The opportunity to lead Vanderbilt's women's basketball program is an opportunity that I simply could not pass up,"White said."The combination of Vanderbilt's culture, where achievement -- both on and off the court - is so highly valued, together with the institution's fan support, and a legacy of winning basketball to build upon, is incredibly exciting to me. I appreciate the support and understanding that I have received from the Indiana Fever, from management to the players, regarding my passion to coach college basketball at an elite institution."

White -- who played five seasons in the WNBA after a decorated playing career at Purdue -- was named head coach for the Fever in September 2014. In 2015, she guided the Fever to the WNBA finals, becoming the first rookie coach in league history to lead a team to the finals.
"Above all else, academics, research, scholarship, and service define the Vanderbilt experience, yet we also compete at the highest levels in athletics,"Vanderbilt Chancellor Nicholas S. Zeppos said in announcing White. "Coach White's values align perfectly with those in our university community. I welcome Stephanie to Vanderbilt and look forward to working with her as she leads our women's basketball program to fulfill our goals and highest potential."

As a collegiate player, White enjoyed a highly successful career at Purdue, where she earned national Player of the Year honors after helping lead the Boilermakers to the 1999 NCAA championship as a senior. That season, she also received the Wade Trophy (given to the nation's top female player) and was named Big Ten Conference Player of the Year.
"Stephanie White has been a winner in every phase of her career,"Vanderbilt athletic director David Williams said. "She was the nation's high school player of the year, she was the NCAA's Player of the Year on a national championship team and she led her WNBA team into the finals in her first year. She was an outstanding scholar. She wants to coach at Vanderbilt and we believe she is just the person to lead our program back into national prominence."

White averaged double-figure scoring in all four seasons of her college career, including 20.2 points per game as a senior. White was inducted into the Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame on April 21, 2006.

She was also a star in the classroom at Purdue. She was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and was an Academic All-American.

White was an assistant coach with the Chicago Sky from 2007-2010, then joined the Fever staff as an assistant in 2011. She was promoted to associate head coach in 2014 before being named head coach after Lin Dunn's retirement. While coaching in the WNBA, White served as a college basketball analyst for ESPN and the Big Ten Network. She also covered the NBA's Indiana Pacers for FOX Sports Indiana.

Prior to coaching in the WNBA, White coached in the college ranks, serving as an assistant at Toledo (2005-07), Kansas State (2004-05) and Ball State (2003-04).

Before beginning her coaching career, White enjoyed a productive five-year WNBA career, spending one season with the Charlotte Sting and four with the Indiana Fever, before retiring in 2004.

At the completion of her four seasons with the Fever, she ranked third in games played (112) and 3-pointers (92), and fourth in scoring (684). She was named to the Fever's All-Decade Team that was announced in 2009.

White and her wife, Michelle, have three boys: Landon, age 5, and twins, Aiden \& Avery, age 2.

## THE LOWDOWN ON TODAY'S GAME

Returning to action after the holiday break, the Commodores (10-2) are set for their final test of the non-conference schedule today, as they make the 200-mile trip to Memphis to face the Tigers (6-6).

It will be 15th all-time meeting between the in-state rivals, but the first since Dec. 1, 2004. Vanderbilt has won the last eight match-ups against the Tigers and owns an 11-3 lead in the series.
Vanderbilt comes into today's game will hopes of bouncing back from a 78-66 loss to No. 8-ranked Louisville on Dec. 21 -- a defeat that ended the Commodores' nine-game winning streak.
Vanderbilt has been strong on the road this season, having won four straight games away from Memorial Gym (including three"true" road games and one neutral-site victory). The Commodores' only road loss this season came on their first road trip of the season, when they visited Bloomington, Ind., and fell to the nationally-ranked Hoosiers on Nov. 13.

## UPDATE ON THE ‘DORES

Having adopted quickly to head coach Stephanie White's up-tempo style, Vanderbilt is averaging 75.7 points per game -- compared to 62.5 ppg last season. The Commodores are also making an SEC-best 7.8 three-pointers per game, compared to just 5.4 last season.

The Commodores have three players averaging in double figures, with Racehl Bell scoring a team-high 12.8 points per game, Christa Reed averaging 11.8 and Rebekah Dahlman at 10.1.
Marqu'es Webb is Vanderbilt's top rebounder, and ranks among the SEC's best, with 8.8 boards per game.
Vanderbilt has played just two games in the past 17 days -- a stretch that dates back to Dec. 9 and has included a break for final exams and the holidays.

The Commodores are 10-0 this season when scoring 70 points or more.

## WHAT'S TRENDING

Here's a look at what's trending for Vanderbilt through the first 12 games of the season:

- The Commodores lead the SEC and rank sixth in the nation in 3-point accuracy at 41.2 percent.
- Vanderbilt is second in the SEC and 21st in the nation in free throw percentage (77.2).
- VU ranks fifth in the conference and 48th in the nation in scoring, averaging 75.7 points per game.
- Vanderbilt leads the SEC in 3-pointers made per game (7.8) and total 3-pointers made (94).
- VU ranks third in the SEC and 10th in the country in free throws made (200).
- For the season, Vanderbilt has converted 200 free throws, which is almost as many free throws as their opponents have attempted (202)

## IN ELITE COMPANY

The Commodores have a host of players who rank among the best in the SEC and in the nation in several categories:

- Redshirt junior guard Rebekah Dahlman leads the SEC and ranks 21st in the country in free throw percentage at 89.5 percent.
- Senior post player Marqu'es Webb anks sixth in the conference in rebounding at 8.8 per game.
- Freshman Cierra Walker ranks ninth in the conference in assists at 3.7 per game.
- Walker and Dahlman rank seventh and eighth, respectively, in the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.20 and 2.07.


## STRONGER AS THEY GO

Through the first two months of the season, the Commodores have shown that they get stronger and sharper as the game progresses.
The fourth quarter, in fact, is statistically Vanderbilt's best quarter in terms of scoring (20.4), field-goal percentage (46.8) and rebounding margin.
Most impressive, the'Dores are shooting 53.1 percent from 3-point range in the fourth quarter this season.

## SUPER SUBS

The Commodores are getting plenty of production off the bench thus far this season. That was especially true during a three-game stretch from Dec. 5-18, when the Vanderbilt reserves outscored the opponents' bench by a combined total of 103-43 (including 30-4 against ETSU, 23-4 against Tulane and 50-35 against Tennessee Tech). For the season, VU's bench has outscored the opponents' bench in nine of the first 12 games.

## DANDY IN DECEMBER

Vanderbilt has been thriving in December for the past several seasons, and has posted a 30-4 record in December since 2011.
Prior to the loss to Louisville, they had won 13 straight December games, which dated back to a loss to Dayton on Dec. 21, 2014.

## MARQU'ES WEBB: A LEADER AMONG HER PEERS

After serving as a representative for Vanderbilt at the SEC's first-ever Leadership Council, senior Marqu'es Webb was choosen by her peers to be the chair of the group. Her duties as chair will include participating in conference calls with the league office during the year, attending a portion of the Senior Women's Administrator's meeting during the 2017 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament and potentially attending the SEC Spring Meetings in Destin, Fla., this summer.

## MILESTONE FOR MARQU'ES

Senior post player Marqu'es Webb notched her 500 th career rebound in the first quarter of Vanderbilt's win against Air Force on Dec. 2. ... Webb ranks seventh among active SEC players in career rebounds with 545.

## ON THE RADAR

The Commodores have been among the teams receiving votes in the Associated Press Top- 25 poll in each of the past three weeks. It is the first time since the preseason poll of the 2015-16 season that Vanderbilt has been in the "receiving votes" category. Vanderbilt was last ranked in the AP poll in Week 15 of the 2013-14 season, when the Commodores were ranked No. 16.

## FRESH AND RE-FRESH

Vanderbilt captured SEC Freshman of the Week honors twice in December, with Erin Whalen and Kayla Overbeck each winning the honor. Overbeck was given the award on Dec. 13 after scoring 18 points and pulling down 13 rebounds -- establishing new career highs in both categories -- during Vander-
bilt's 80-72 road win over ETSU. It was her first career double-double. Whalen was named the SEC Freshman of the Week the previous week after averaging 17 points per game and shooting 59 percent from the floor -- making 16-of-27 shots -- during Vanderbilt's wins over Air Force, SIUE and Tulane.

## THIS AND THAT

Here are a few notes and numbers to keep an eye on entering today's game:

- Vanderbilt has three players who rank among the SEC's Top-10 in career 3-pointers among active players: Rebekah Dahlman ranks sixth with 116, Christa Reed ranks ninth with 90 , and Rachel Bell is 10 th with 86.
- The Commodores made 143-pointers against Kennesaw State in the season opener (finishing 14-of-26), which represents the most 3-pointers by an SEC team in a game this season.

# Vanderbilt falls to No. 8 Louisville, win streak ends 

## Rachel Bell leads Commodores, scores team-high 21 points in hard-fought loss

## By The Associated Press

NASHVILLE (AP) -- Myisha Hines-Allen, the ACC player of the year last season and preseason pick to repeat, scored 24 points and had a career-high 15 rebounds to help No. 8-ranked Louisville hold off Vanderbilt 7866.

Rachel Bell scored 21 points for Vanderbilt (10-2), which saw its nine-game winning streak end. Cierra Walker added 12 points, and LeaLea Carter and Kayla Overbeck each had 10.
Walker opened the fourth with a 3-pointer that pulled Vanderbilt within 58-56. But Hines-Allen scored the next five points as Louisville (12-2) finally got some breathing room against the Commodores. Louisville pushed the lead to double digits on a layup by Durr with 44 seconds left.

Hines-Allen had 12 rebounds and hit six of eight shots by halftime, and she played 39 minutes in helping Louisville win its sixth straight. She notched her third double-double in the past seven games. Now the Cardinals can have a few days off before their ACC opener on Dec. 29.
Asia Durr added 16 points for the Cardinals.
The teams swapped the lead four times in the opening minutes of the first quater before Briahanna Jacksons layup broke a $7-7$ tie with 7 minutes to go to give Louisville the lead for good.
The Commodores stayed close much of the way, playing aggressively and getting to the free throw line, outshooting Louisville 18 of 27 compared to 9 of 14 . Louisville led 58-53 after an ugly third quarter when the teams combined to make only 8 of 34 shots.

## GAME 1: Vanderbilt vs. Kennesaw St.



NASHVILLE (AP) --Vanderbilt's new-look offense hit a couple of speed bumps Friday night, but it was mostly a smooth ride for the Commodores in Stephanie White's debut as head coach.
Paced by Rebekah Dahlman's 19 points, Vanderbilt rolled to an 86-54 victory over Kennesaw State in the season opener for both teams. The Commodores scored almost half their points from behind the 3-point arc, making 14 shots from long range in the win.
Marques Webb had a big night for the Commodores (1-0) inside, going 6 -of-6 from the floor and producing a double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds.
Vanderbilt committed 18 turnovers, but shoot the ball effectively enough to overcome the miscues.
The Commodores were 8 -of-11 from 3-point range in the second half -72.7 percent -- and finished 14 -of- 26 ( 53.8 percent) for the game. Overall, 10 players reached the scoring column for Vanderbilt, and the Commodores compiled 24 assists on 31 field goals.
It was just the type of offensive performance that White was expected to bring to Vanderbilt in her inaugural season.
After spending the past two seasons as the head coach of the WNBA's Indiana Fever, she is implementing an up-tempo style with the Commodores, who sprinted out to a 23-12 lead at the end of the first quarter against the Owls (0-1) and stretched the lead to 42-20 at the half.
Clara Young and Allison Johnson finished with 15 points each to pace Kennesaw State.
Vanderbilt's touted five-member freshmen class combined for 38 points in their Commodore debuts: Erin Whalen had 11 points, Kaleigh Clem-ons-Green had nine, LeaLea Carter had seven, Cierra Walker had six and Kayla Overbeck had five. combined to hit just 8 of 34 shots.

## GAME 2: Vanderbilt vs. Indiana



BLOOMINGTON, Ind. -- Stephanie White picked a tough place -- even though it was familiar territory -- to have her first road game as head coach at Vanderbilt.
Traveling to Bloomington, Ind., the Commodores suffered a 94-61 loss to the No. 23 Hoosiers on Sunday afternoon. It was the 16th consecutive home win for the Hoosiers, who went 14-0 at Assembly Hall last season.
Indiana’s Alexis Gassion scored a team-high 22 points and Amanda Cahill added 17 for the Hoosiers (2-0). For Vanderbilt (1-1), Rachel Bell had 11 points and Marques Webb had nine before fouling out.
White, the first-year Vanderbilt head coach, had a big gathering of friends, family and fans at the game. She came to Vanderbilt after spending the past six seasons with the WNBA's Indiana Fever, including the past two as head coach. She also was a fan favorite in Indiana during her playing career, when she was Miss Indiana Basketball as a high school player and was the national player of the year during her career at Purdue.
But Sunday's homecoming didn't go as well as White had hoped for her young Commodores, who have five freshmen that are seeing significant playing time. Vanderbilt shot just 36 percent from the floor, and never owned the lead in the game.
"We didn't play very relaxed basketball today," said White. "Indiana is a very good team, and they played exceptionally well in the second half. But have to do a better job of playing our game, and not letting the opponent dictate the game."
With Webb and Bell providing the bulk of the scoring punch, the Commodores stayed within striking distance for much of the first half, and trailed only 35-31 after a bucket by Webb with 4:40 to play in the second quarter. Then Indiana made its move.
The Hoosiers put together a quick 13-4 run -- which featured a 3-point play by Gassion and a three-pointer by Cahill -- to extend the lead to 48-35, and the Hoosiers carried a $50-38$ lead into the locker room.
Indiana then opened the second half with a $12-0$ surge, fueled by three 3 -pointers, to take command, $62-38$. Overall, it was a $27-7$ run by the Hoosiers.

## GAME 3: Vanderbilt vs. Drexel



NASHVILLE -- The Vanderbilt freshmen continue to be impressive, but it was an upperclassmen who made the biggest impact in the Commodores win on Wednesday night.
Rebekah Dahlman, a redshirt junior, scored a career-high 25 points -including going 15-of-18 at the foul line -- to help Vanderbilt fight off Drexel, 73-63, at Memorial Gym. The Commodores closed the game on a 10-1 run over the final 2:28 to stretch a one-point lead into the double-digit victory.
Marques Webb finished with 12 rebounds, and freshman Kayla Overbeck had 10 points and six rebounds for Vanderbilt (2-1), which bounced back in strong fashion from Sunday's 94-61 road loss to No. 23 Indiana. Sarah Curran scored 19 points for Drexel (2-1), and Jessica Pellechio had 18.
Dahlman battled flu-like symptoms earlier in the week and had to miss practice. But she showed no signs of illness against Drexel, logging 33 minutes of playing time and filling up the stat sheet with six rebounds and five assists to go with her 25 points.
Christa Reed added 10 points, including a couple of big baskets in the fourth quarter that helped the Commodores hold off the Dragons.
Drexel finished 9-of-35 from 3-point range (25.7 percent). The Dragons finished just 2-of-3 at the line in the loss.
Vanderbilt feel behind 11-2 in the first $31 / 2$ minutes of the first quarter and trailed 19-15 at the end of period. The Dragons owned an eight-point lead late in the second quarter, but the Commodores closed the period on a 10-0 run to take a 34-32 lead at the half. Overbeck capped the surge with a short jumper with six seconds remaining in the period to give Vanderbilt its first lead of the night.
That set the stage for an intense second half during which the teams were never separated by more than five points until the final three minutes.
Drexel took a one-point lead on two occasions in the fourth quarter, and the Dragons trailed only 63-62 with 2:28 to play.
Dahlman then provided one of the night's biggest plays when she converted a 3-point play with 1:39 remaining to extend Vanderbilt's lead to 66-62. The Commodores sealed the win by making 7 -of- 8 free throws in the final 51 seconds. Vanderbilt finished 22-of-29 at the foul line.

## GAME 4: Vanderbilt vs. Duke



NASHVILLE -- The Vanderbilt women faced a distinctive height disadvantage on Sunday. But it didn't prevent the Commodores from winning the rebounding battle -- or, more importantly, from winning the game. Hosting a Duke team that has size to spare, the Commodores made a series of big plays down the stretch and notched a 77-73 victory over the previously undefeated Devils.
Christa Reed scored a game-high 19 points, and Marques Webb added 10 points and matched her career high with 13 rebounds -- her third double-digit rebounding effort of the season -- for the Commodores (3-1). Cierra Walker and Rachel Bell had 12 points each, and Rebekah Dahlman had 11.
Lexie Brown led Duke (4-1) with 21 points, and Rebecca Greenwell added 17 for the RV/RV Devils.
The game was tied 71-71 after a pair of free throws by Brown with 1:16 to play in the fourth quarter. From there, the Commodores' defense came up huge -- including a pivotal steal by Reed with 1:01 to go -- to help Vanderbilt get to the finish line.
Webb hit a pair of free throws with 48 seconds left to give Vanderbilt a 73-71 lead, and the Commodores stayed in front of there. Vanderbilt secured the win with a couple of big rebounds, one on the defensive end by Webb with 26 seconds to play, followed by an offensive rebound by Walker -- after her own missed free throw -- with 23 seconds to go.
The Commodores made only 4-of- 8 free throws in the final 23 seconds, but that proved to be just enough.
Neither team made a field goal in the final 2:06 of the fourth quarter. Vanderbilt, which led 35-32 at the half, earned the win in large part due to a relentless effort on the glass. The Commodores collected 18 offensive rebounds in the game, and out-rebounded Duke 43-34 overall despite being outsized.
Duke had five players see action who are listed as 6-2 or taller, including a pair of 6-4 players (Oderah Chidom and Erin Mathias) in the starting lineup. Vanderbilt, by comparison, doesn't have any players taller than 6-1 on the roster.

NASHVILLE -- It hasn't taken long for first-year head coach Stephanie White and the five freshmen on her roster to catch on to the concept of Memorial Magic.
With a 75-59 victory over Robert Morris on Tuesday, the Commodores (41) grabbed their third home victory in the span off six days -- a stretch that also included wins over Duke and Drexel -- and improved to 4-0 at home overall.
The game, which was the first-ever meeting between Vanderbilt and Robert Morris (3-2), tipped off at 11:30 a.m. as the Commodores held their annual Education Day contest. A large collection of local schools attended the game. Rachel Bell scored a game-high 20 points for Vanderbilt, and freshman Kayla Overbeck added 15 points, finishing 7-of-8 from the floor. Rebekah Dahlman had 11 points and Marques Webb pulled down a game-high eight rebounds.
Vanderbilt has now won 13 consecutive non-conference games at Memorial Gym, and has posted a 49-3 record against non-con foes since the start of the 2010-11 campaign. Dating back to the start of the 2002-03 season, VU owns a 99-8 record on its home floor in regular-season, non-conference games, including an 18-1 mark since the start of the 2014-15 season.
Tuesday's win was methodical in nature, with the Commodores building a seven-point lead at the end of the first quarter and then gradually extending the lead from there. Vanderbilt led 38-26 at the half and built it's largest lead of the game, 51-33, near the midway mark of the third quarter. Vanderbilt maintained a double-digit lead the rest of the way.
The Commodores shot the ball effectively, especially from long range and at the foul line. They finished 12 -of- 14 from the foul line ( 85.7 percent) and were 9 -of- 21 behind the arc ( 42.9 percent). Vanderbilt shot 48 percent from the floor overall.
Robert Morris senior guard Anna Niki Stamolamprou, the No. 5 alltime scorer in the Colonials' history, finished with a team-high 18 points. Stamolamprou, who came into the game averaging 15 points per contest, was 8 -of- 16 from the floor.

## GAME 6: Vanderbilt vs. UT Martin



NASHVILLE -- With Sunday's game hanging in the balance, Rachel Bell came up big -- on both ends of the floor.
Bell scored 14 points in the fourth quarter and also came up with a crucial blocked shot in the final five seconds to help Vanderbilt escape past UT Martin, 79-77. Bell finished with a team-high 22 points for the Commodores (5-1), who won their fourth straight game.
Bell made 5 -of- 6 shots from the floor in the fourth quarter, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range.
Rebekah Dahlman finished with 17 points while helping Vanderbilt stretch its winning streak in the series to 11 games. The Commodores finished 13-of-22 from 3-point range.
Emanye Robertson scored a game-high 23 points for UT Martin (1-5).
The Commodores owned a 76-70 lead with 2:38 to play after two free throws by Christa Reed, but UT Martin used a 7-2 run to pull within 78-77 with 39 seconds left. UT Martin's Kendall Spray, who is ranked among the national leaders in 3-point proficiency, appeared to have an open look from long range with five seconds remaining, but Bell stepped up and blocked the shot.
Vanderbilt's Cierra Walker then hit the back end of two free throws with 1.1 seconds remaining to give the Commodores a 79-77 lead. On UT Martin's final possession, Emanye Robertson missed a contested shot under the basket.
"I am proud of our team for gutting it out and finding a way to win," said first-year head coach Stephanie White, who posted her first road win with the Commodores. "This was a chance for us to learn and get better. And hopefully that's what we did."
The intense game featured 11 lead changes and five ties.
Vanderbilt appeared to be pulling away early in the second half, building a nine-point lead in the first two minutes of the third quarter. But UT Martin roared back to take a six-point lead early in the fourth quarter.
Bell then brought the Commodores back with a series of big shots. She made a pair of pivotal 3-pointers in the final six minutes, and her jumper in the paint with 50 seconds to play gave Vanderbilt a 78-74 lead.

## GAME 7: Vanderbilt vs. Air Force



USAF Academy, Colo. -- Freshman Erin Whalen was hot from the floor and fellow freshman Kayla Overbeck was hot from the foul line on Friday night. Together they helped lead Vanderbilt to a $75-49$ win over Air Force in the opening round of the Air Force Classic.
Whalen finished 7 -of- 8 from the floor and scored a season-high 19 points. Overbeck added 15 points, making 11-of-13 free throws, and hauled in seven rebounds to help the Commodores (6-1) extend their winning streak to five games. Whalen fouled out in the fourth quarter, but by then, the Commodores were in command.
Rachel Bell finished with 10 points and six rebounds. Kailin Davis had with 17 points for Air Force (1-6).
The Commodores owned a 34-23 lead at the half and then opened the second half with a quick 6-0 run to extend the lead to 17 . Vanderbilt went on to outscore Air Force 24-14 in the period to build a 58-37 lead, with Whalen capping the quarter with a buzzer-beating 3-pointer from the corner.

The Commodores -- playing without leading scorer Rebekah Dahlman (hamstring injury) -- shot just 33 percent from the floor in the first half and 42 percent for the game. They were especially cold from long range, making just 2 -of- 11 shots. But Vanderbilt made up for that at the foul line, finishing 27-of-32 (84.4 percent) to continue their season-long trend of effective work from the line.
The Commodore defense also played a key role in the victory, limiting Air Force to just 27 percent shooting.
The teams combined for 57 free throws in the game, with VU making 27-of-32 and Air Force going 15-of-25.

## GAME 8: Vanderbilt vs. SIUE



USAF Academy, Colo. --- Fueled by freshman Cierra Walker's explosive performance, the Vanderbilt women captured the first championship of the Stephanie White Era on Saturday afternoon.
Vanderbilt fans hope, and expect, there will be many more to come. Walker scored 21 points, making 5-of-7 shots from 3-point range, to help the Commodores defeat Southern Illinois-Edwardsville 73-63 in the championship game of the Air Force Classic.
Walker also had a season-high six rebounds and added four assists while logging 37 minutes of playing time for the Commodores (7-1), who stretched their winning streak to six games.
Vanderbilt closed the game on a 9-1 run in the final 2:03 to pull away from the Cougars (2-5) in a tight contest that featured nine lead changes and eight ties.
The Commodores finished 12-of-25 from 3-point range. Walker played a big role in the outside attack, including going 4 -of-6 from long range in the first half.
Three other Commodores also reached double figures in the win: Christa Reed had 13 points, Erin Whalen added 12 and Rachel Bell had 10. Whalen and Bell both made the All-Tournament team.

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. -- Freshman Kayla Overbeck had 18 points and 13 rebounds -- establishing new career highs in both categories -- to help Vanderbilt earn an 80-72 road win over ETSU on Thursday night.
The victory enabled the Commodores (9-1) to extend their winning streak to eight games.
Christa Reed scored a team-high 20 points and Rachel Bell added 19 for the Commodores, who withstood an explosive performance by ETSU's Tianna Tarter. The junior guard scored a game-high 35 points, going 15of 28 from the floor, for the Bucs (5-5).
Vanderbilt dominated the glass during the comeback victory, winning the rebounding battle 53-27.
The Commodores trailed by as many as 12 points in the first quarter and were behind $50-43$ with $6: 58$ left in the third. But Vanderbilt charged back with a 14-2 run -- which started with a jumper and a 3-pointer from Cierra Walker -- to take a $57-52$ lead with 1:07 left in the quarter.
Miaya Seawright helped fuel the surge with a 3-pointer from the corner that gave the Commodores their first lead of the night, 51-50, with 4:53 remaining in the period.
After a pair of lead changes, Vanderbilt carried a $59-57$ lead into the fourth quarter, and the Commodores stayed in front from there, outscoring ETSU 21-15 in the final 10 minutes. Vanderbilt made just four field goals in the fourth quarter, but went 12 -of- 15 from the foul line. VU finished 25 -of- 31 from the foul line for the game, while ETSU was 8-of-19. Overbeck scored eight points and pulled down five rebounds in the fourth quarter, and Reed went 5-of-6 from the foul line in the final 10 minutes to help the Commodores secure the win.
For the night, Vanderbilt's bench outscored ETSU's reserves, 30-4.
The Commodores now have a long break for exams before playing their next game on Dec. 18, hosting Tennessee Tech.

## GAME 11: Vanderbilt vs. Tenn Tech



NASHVILLE -- Sunday was filled with career highs for the Vanderbilt women, but the Commodores endured a scary moment, too.
Christa Reed scored 25 points, Erin Whalen added 23 and LeaLea Carter had 18 -- new career highs for all three -- to help the Commodores extend their winning streak to nine games with an 89-57 victory over Tennessee Tech at Memorial Gym. Whalen also pulled down a career-best 11 rebounds for Vanderbilt (10-1). Yaktavia Hickson led all scorers with 31 points for Tennessee Tech (3-8).
The Commodores played much of the second half without senior star Marques Webb, who was taken off the floor on a stretcher after a collision. The extent of Webb's injury was not known after the game, and head coach Stephanie White said the team would have more information on Monday after Webb was evaluated.
Vanderbilt owned a 17-16 lead after the first quarter, but then dominated the next 10 minutes, outscoring Tennessee Tech 28-6 to carry a 45-22 lead into the half.
The Commodores -- who were playing their first game since Dec. 8 -opened the second quarter with a $15-2$ run and finished 9 -of- 15 from the floor and 9 -of- 10 from the foul line during the period. The Commodores capped the quarter with a no-look pass from Cierra Walker to Whalen for a layup in the final minute.
Vanderbilt, which came into the game as the SEC leaders in 3-point percentage and ranked No. 2 in the conference in free throw percentage, went 18-of-21 from the foul line (85.7 percent) and 7-of-19 (36.8 percent) from 3 -point range in the win.
The game was a homecoming for Tennessee Tech first-year head coach Kim Rosamond, who was an assistant coach at Vanderbilt for nine years. Reed scored her 25 points while going 10 -of- 12 from the floor. She also pulled down six rebounds. Carter, a freshman, was 8 -of- 12 from the floor and had seven rebounds. Carter's 18 points easily surpassed her previous season high of seven, which she had done twice this season.

GAME 12: Vanderbilt vs. Louisville

12/21/16 7 p.m. at Nashville, Tenn. (Memorial Gym)


NASHVILLE (AP) -- Myisha Hines-Allen, the ACC player of the year last season and preseason pick to repeat, scored 24 points and had a career-high 15 rebounds to help No. 8-ranked Louisville hold off Vanderbilt 78-66.
"That's something that we're going to need," Louisville coach Jeff Walz said. "She has the ability to do that every night. I mean that's what she did the entire ACC season all last year. Now we're going to need that consistency from her."
Rachel Bell scored 21 points for Vanderbilt (10-2), which saw its nine-game winning streak end. Cierra Walker added 12 points, and LeaLea Carter and Kayla Overbeck each had 10.
Walker opened the fourth with a 3-pointer that pulled Vanderbilt within 58-56. But Hines-Allen scored the next five points as Louisville (12-2) finally got some breathing room against the Commodores. Louisville pushed the lead to double digits on a layup by Durr with 44 seconds left.
Hines-Allen had 12 rebounds and hit six of eight shots by halftime, and she played 39 minutes in helping Louisville win its sixth straight. She notched her third double-double in the past seven games. Now the Cardinals can have a few days off before their ACC opener on Dec. 29.
"It feels good going into this break and just knowing that we have Syracuse coming back up, so we can't get too lackadaisical on this break," Hines-Allen said. "We still have to work and get better because there are some things we have to improve on."
Asia Durr added 16 points for the Cardinals.
The teams swapped the lead four times in the opening minutes before Briahanna Jackson's layup broke a $7-7$ tie with 7 minutes to go to give Louisville the lead for good.
Bell scored eight straight, including the first seven of the third quarter, to pull Vanderbilt within 48-45. Sydney Zambrotta hit a 3-pointer for Louisville's first bucket of the quarter with 7:24 to go to pad the lead. Louisville led 58-53 after an ugly third quarter when the teams combined to hit just 8 of 34 shots.
