HEAD COACH STEPHANIE WHITE

Stephanie **WHITE**

Head Coach / First Season



Stephanie White was named the head coach for Vanderbilt women's basketball program on May 24, becoming just the fifth all-time head coach in the history of the Vanderbilt program.

Having enjoyed success at virtually every level of basketball as a player and coach, White arrived at Vanderbilt after spending two seasons as the head coach of WNBA's Indiana Fever. White took the Fever to the playoffs in each of her two seasons, including a trip to the WNBA finals in 2015.

"The opportunity to lead Vanderbilt's women's basketball program is an opportunity that I simply could not pass up," White said. "The combination of Vanderbilt's culture, where achievement -- both on and off the court - is so highly valued, together with the institution's fan support, and a legacy of winning basketball to build upon, is incredibly exciting to me. I appreciate the support and understanding that I have received from the Indiana Fever, from management to the players, regarding my passion to coach college basketball at an elite institution."

White -- who played five seasons in the WNBA after a decorated playing career at Purdue -- was named head coach for the Fever in September 2014. In 2015, she guided the Fever to the WNBA finals, becoming the first rookie coach in league history to lead a team to the finals.

As a collegiate player, White enjoyed a highly successful career at Purdue, where she earned national Player of the Year honors after helping lead the Boilermakers to the 1999 NCAA championship as a senior. That season, she also received the Wade Trophy (given to the nation's top female player) and was named Big Ten Conference Player of the Year.

"Stephanie White has been a winner in every phase of her career," Vanderbilt athletic director David Williams said. "She was the nation's high school player of the year, she was the NCAA's Player of the Year on a national championship team and she led her WNBA team into the finals in her first year. She was an outstanding scholar. She wants to coach at Vanderbilt and we believe she is just the person to lead our program back into national prominence."

White averaged double-figure scoring in all four seasons of her college career, including 20.2 points per game as a senior, and amassed 2,182 points for her career. White was inducted into the Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame on April 21, 2006.

She was also a star in the classroom at Purdue. She was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and was an Academic All-American.

White was an assistant coach with the Chicago Sky from 2007-2010, then joined the Fever staff as an assistant in 2011. She was promoted to associate head coach in 2014 before being named head coach after Lin Dunn's retirement. While coaching in the WNBA, White served as a college basketball analyst for ESPN and the Big Ten Network. She also covered the NBA's Indiana Pacers for FOX Sports Indiana.

Prior to coaching in the WNBA, White coached in the college ranks, serving as an assistant at Toledo (2005-07), Kansas State (2004-05) and Ball State (2003-04).

Before beginning her coaching career, White enjoyed a productive five-year WNBA career, spending one season with the Charlotte Sting and four with the Indiana Fever, before retiring in 2004.

At the completion of her four seasons with the Fever, she ranked third in games played (112) and 3-pointers (92), and fourth in scoring (684). She was named to the Fever's All-Decade Team that was announced in 2009.

White and her wife, Michelle, have three boys: Landon, age 5, and twins, Aiden & Avery, age 2.

THE LOWDOWN ON TODAY'S GAME

The Vanderbilt women will play their first home game in more than two weeks tonight -- and it will be a big one for the Commodores.

Looking to end a three-game losing streak, Vanderbilt (10-4, 0-1) is hosting rival Tennessee (9-4, 1-0) in an SEC match-up at Memorial Gym. The Lady Vols will roll into Nashville on a five-game winning streak that has featured impressive wins over Stanford and Kentucky.

This will be the 76th all-time meeting between the teams, with Tennessee owning a 66-9 lead in the series.

UPDATE ON THE 'DORES

Vanderbilt suffered a tough loss in its SEC opener, as the Commodores saw a 13-point, second-half lead slip away in a 77-72 loss to Texas A&M on Monday. It was the first time this season that the Commodores have lost a game in which they scored 70 points or more. (VU had been 10-0 in those games before the TAMU game).

The Commodores' current three-game losing streak came on the heels of a nine-game winning streak.

Vanderbilt has two players averaging in double figures, with Rachel Bell scoring a team-high 12.4 points per game and Christa Reed averaging 11.3.

Marqu'es Webb is Vanderbilt's top rebounder, and ranks among the SEC's best, with 9.0 boards per game.

The Commodores are 6-1 at home this season and are averaging 77.1 points per game in those seven games.

AMONG THE BEST

Through the first 14 games of the season, the Commodores have proven themselves to be one of the country's best-shooting teams. They lead the SEC -- and rank 11th in the nation -- in 3-point accuracy at 39.8 percent. Vanderbilt is second in the SEC and 24th in the nation in free throw percentage at 76.4.

Here's a look at some other significant numbers for the Commodores:

- ◆ Vanderbilt ranks ninth in the country in free throws made (227) and 22nd in the country in defensive rebounds per game (30).
- ◆ VU ranks eighth in the country (but tellingly, fourth in the SEC) in free throws made (227).
- ◆ Vanderbilt leads the SEC in 3-pointers made per game (7.3) and total 3-pointers made (102).

LOADED WITH YOUNG GUNS

Vanderbilt's freshmen continue to shine for the Commodores, with the five-member class combining for 35 points, 16.4 rebounds and nine assists per game.

Kayla Overbeck has reached double figures in six games, and has also had a pair of double-digit rebounding efforts (13 against ETSU and 13 against Louisville). Kaleigh Clemons-Green has done her part in the past two games, recording a career-high 13 points, five rebounds and three assists in Monday's loss to Texas A&M after having six points, six rebounds and six assists against Memphis.

IN ELITE COMPANY

The Commodores have a host of players who rank among the best in the SEC and in the nation in several categories:

- ◆ Redshirt junior guard Rebekah Dahlman is tied for the SEC lead and ranks 19th in the country in free throw percentage at 90.0 percent.
- ◆ Senior post player Marqu'es Webb ranks sixth in the conference in both rebounds per game at 9.0 and total rebounds (117).
- ◆ Freshman Cierra Walker ranks 13th in the conference in assists at 3.5 per game.
- ◆ Walker also ranks seventh in the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.3.

HOPING TO BOUNCE BACK

The Commodores enter Thursday's game with hopes of ending a three-game skid and regaining the momentum and the firepower that they had during their nine-game winning streak, which stretched from Nov. 16 to Dec. 18. Here's a look at a few of the numbers that have dipped during the past three games.

* VU averaged 77.2 points per game during the nine-game winning streak, compared to 65.7 in the past three games.

* The Commodores shot 45.7 percent from the floor during the winning streak, compared to 37.7 in the past three games.

* Vanderbilt shot 41.2 percent from 3-point range during the winning streak, compared to 32.4 in the past three games

CARTER IS COMING ON

Vanderbilt freshman Lealea Carter has scored a total of 75 points this season -- and 43 of those have come in the past four games.

She has averaged 10.7 points and five rebounds per game during that four-game stretch after averaging only 3.6 points and 1.1 rebounds per game in her first nine contests of the season. Her surge started with the Tennessee Tech game, when she had 18 points, seven rebounds and went 8-of-12 from the floor.

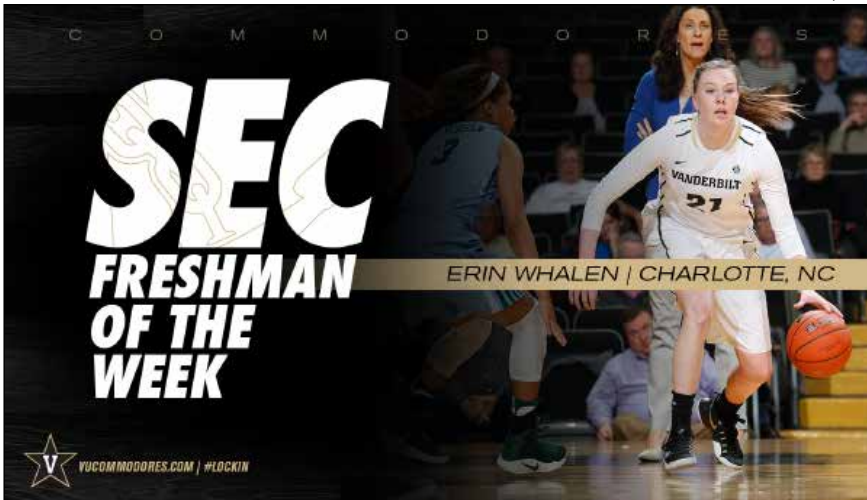

BELL HAS BEEN RINGING FOR COMMODORES

Vanderbilt guard Rachel Bell is thriving in the up-tempo system that has been implemented by first-year head coach Stephanie White this season. Bell, a junior, has reached double figures in scoring in 10 of the Vanderbilt's first 14 games. She scored 10 or more points in seven straight games from Nov. 20 through Dec. 8, and averaged 15.3 points per game during that stretch. Bell leads the team in scoring at 12.4 points per game.

STRONGER AS THEY GO

Through the first two months of the season, the Commodores have shown that they get stronger and sharper as the game progresses.

The fourth quarter, in fact, is statistically Vanderbilt's best quarter in terms of scoring (19.9), field-goal percentage (44.1) and rebounding margin (+1.5). Most impressive, the 'Dores are shooting 48.2 percent from 3-point range in the fourth quarter this season. (See chart, page 12)

SUPER SUBS

The Commodores are getting plenty of production off the bench this season. In Monday's game, Vanderbilt's reserves outscored TAMU's bench, 26-2. It marked the 11th time in the first 14 games that Vanderbilt has won the battle of the benches.

During a three-game stretch from Dec. 5-18, the Vanderbilt reserves outscored the opponents' bench by a combined total of 103-43 (including 30-4 against ETSU, 23-4 against Tulane and 50-35 against Tennessee Tech). The

trend has been prominent again in the past two games, with VU compiling a 53-12 advantage in bench points (against Memphis and TAMU).

FRESH AND REFRESH

Vanderbilt captured SEC Freshman of the Week honors twice in December, with Erin Whalen and Kayla Overbeck each winning the honor. Overbeck was given the award on Dec. 13 after scoring 18 points and pulling down 13 rebounds -- establishing new career highs in both categories -- during Vanderbilt's 80-72 road win over ETSU. Whalen was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 6 after averaging 17 points per game and shooting 59 percent from the floor -- making 16-of-27 shots -- during Vanderbilt's wins over Air Force, SIUE and Tulane.

LOOKING AHEAD

After Thursday's game, the Commodores head to Athens to face Georgia on Sunday.

No. 0 -- Kayla Overbeck (Freshman)

- ◆ Is the all-time leading scorer (1,988 points) and rebounder (1,355) in Newbury Park High's history, where she also starred in volleyball
- ◆ Is the first player in VU history to wear No. 0 (with a single zero)

No. 1 -- Rebekah Dahlman (RS-Junior)

- ◆ Has recovered from a blood clot in her shoulder that required multiple surgeries and caused her to miss most of her freshman season.
- ◆ Grandfather, John Kundla, is in the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame; he coached the NBA's Minneapolis Lakers and the University of Minnesota.

No. 3 -- Rachel Bell (Junior)

- ◆ Ranked second on the team in both total points (279) and scoring average (9.0 ppg) last season.
- ◆ Worked an internship this summer with the Vanderbilt Police Department as part of the school's unique athlete internship program.

No. 10 -- Cierra Walker (Freshman)

- ◆ Shot 45 percent from 3-point range in her high school career and is Oregon City High's all-time leader in 3-pointers (249) and assists (416).
- ◆ Was a three-time finalist in the national Punt, Pass and Kick competition and is a huge football fan.

No. 12 Myka Dancy (Junior)

- ◆ Scored a basket in the final minute of VU's opening-round SEC Tournament victory over Ole Miss to provide the exclamation point on the win last season.
- ◆ Was a member of the All-District Basketball Team in 2014 and won the A.D. Hancock/ Walter Nipper Sportsmanship Award

No. 21 -- Erin Whalen (Freshman)

- ◆ Multi-sport high school athlete who won three state championships -- two in basketball and one in volleyball.
- ◆ Was the 2016 North Carolina Gatorade Player of the Year and averaged 18.2 points and 5.7 rebounds per game in her prep career.

No. 22 -- Marqu'e Webb (Senior)

- ◆ Was named the chair of the SEC's first-ever Leadership Council; Was selected to the position by her peers.
- ◆ Pulled down her 500th career rebound early this season and ranks among the SEC's Top-10 in career rebounds.

No. 23 -- Minta Spears (RS Senior)

- ◆ Was a member of the drama and debate teams during high school, and competed in regional competitions.
- ◆ Averaged 13.8 points per game over the final four games of last season, reaching double figures in three of those contests.

No. 30 -- LeaLea Carter (Freshman)

- ◆ Member of the USA U-16 national team that captured a Gold Medal last summer.
- ◆ Former McDonald's All-American and considered one of the highest-rated recruits in Commodore WBB history.

No. 33 -- Christa Reed (Junior)

- ◆ Led the team in scoring (11.6 ppg) last season and ranked among the nation's best in 3-point percentage for much of the season.
- ◆ Reached double figures in a team-high 19 games, including five of VU's final six games last season.

No. 35 -- Kaleigh Clemons-Green (Freshman)

- ◆ Was the two-time TSSAA Division II Class AA Miss Basketball (2015, 2016).
- ◆ Visited India during a summer trip while in high school.

No. 41 -- Miaya Seawright (Junior)

- ◆ Earned a spot in the starting lineup last season against Florida on Feb. 18.
- ◆ Her uncle, James Seawright, was an All-American linebacker at the University of South Carolina and was drafted by the Buffalo Bills in the 11th round of the 1985 NFL Draft.

'Dores fall to Aggies after 4th-quarter struggles

Vanderbilt is outscored 27-15 in final 10 minutes, drops SEC opener at Texas A&M

COLLEGE STATION, Texas -- Texas A&M used a balanced scoring attack and a big fourth-quarter surge to down Vanderbilt, 77-72, on Monday night.

Five players finished in double figures for the Aggies (11-3, 1-0), led by Anriel Howard and Jasmine Lumpkin with 17 points each.

Texas A&M outscored Vanderbilt 27-15 in the final 10 minutes to erase the Commodores' seven-point lead and send Vanderbilt (10-4, 0-1) to its third straight loss.

Freshman Kayla Overbeck had 13 points and seven rebounds for Vanderbilt and fellow freshman Kaleigh Clemons-Green added a career-high 13 points. Christa Reed and Rachel Bell had 10 each for the Commodores in the SEC debut for head coach Stephanie White.

Vanderbilt trailed by six in the fourth quarter but battled back to trim the deficit to 73-72 on a 3-pointer by Erin Whalen with 32 seconds to play. But that proved to be the final points for the Commodores, and Texas A&M sealed the deal with four straight free throws.

The Commodores led by as much as 13 points early in the third quarter, but Texas A&M chipped away for the remainder of the period and then put together a surge in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter to move in front.

Vanderbilt owned a 35-26 lead at the half, thanks in large part to some impressive play from the Commodore freshmen, who combined for 26 points in the first 20 minutes.

Overbeck lead the way, going 5-of-7 from the floor and scoring 12 points.

Lady Vols sweep season series from Commodores

Tennessee downed Vanderbilt twice last season and stretched its winning streak in the series to five games. Here's a look at the two contests from last season:

Jan. 21, 2016: Tennessee 58, Vanderbilt 49 (in Knoxville): Vanderbilt's defense delivered a gritty performance, but the Commodores struggled on offense for much of the night during a 58-49 loss to No. 18/22 Tennessee.

Rebekah Dahlman finished with a game-high 17 points for Vanderbilt (13-5, 2-3), and Marques Webb pulled down a career-high 13 rebounds.

Te'a Cooper led Tennessee with 13 points for the Lady Vols (12-6, 3-2).

Vanderbilt was looking to end its 30-game losing streak on the Lady Vols' home floor -- and the Commodores appeared to have a golden chance to do it.

After staging a big fourth-quarter comeback, Vanderbilt trailed by three points in the final minute. But the Commodores came up empty on back-to-back possessions -- turning the ball over each time -- and the Lady Vols made six straight free throws in the final 15 seconds to escape with the win.

Feb. 11, 2016: Tennessee 69, Vanderbilt 51 (in Nashville): The Commodores trimmed a 19-point third-quarter deficit down to six with roughing five minutes remaining in the game, but the Lady Vols

pulled away down the stretch and handed Vanderbilt a 69-51 loss at Memorial Gym.

Jaime Norred scored a game-high 18 points for the Lady Vols (15-9, 6-5), who finished 0-of-12 from 3-point range but outscored Vanderbilt 42-20 in the paint. Rebekah Dahlman scored 13 points, Minta Spears had 11 and Jasmine Jenkins had 10 for Vanderbilt (15-9, 4-7).

The Commodores trailed 43-24 at the 5:39 mark of the third quarter but put together a 22-9 run to slice the Lady Vols' lead to 52-46 with 5:32 remaining in the game. Tennessee, however, outscored Vanderbilt 17-5 the rest of the way.

Hipps selected as SEC Tournament Co-Chair

Former Vanderbilt great Caroline (Williams) Hipps has been named the Co-Chair of the 2018 SEC Tournament, which will be held in Nashville.

Hipps, who played for the Commodores from 2004-07, was one of the most accurate 3-point shooters in the history of women's college basketball.

Williams shot 46.5 percent from 3-point range (238-of-512) in her career, which is the best in SEC history and ranks No. 5 on the NCAA's all-time list for career 3-point percentage.

Williams remains close with the WBB program, and was a member of the search committee that paved the way for the hiring of head coach Stephanie White. Hipps also served as a color analyst for the Commodores' home games on SEC Network Plus during the 2014-15 season.

NASHVILLE (AP) --Vanderbilt's new-look offense hit a couple of speed bumps Friday night, but it was mostly a smooth ride for the Commodores in Stephanie White's debut as head coach.

Paced by Rebekah Dahlman's 19 points, Vanderbilt rolled to an 86-54 victory over Kennesaw State in the season opener for both teams. The Commodores scored almost half their points from behind the 3-point arc, making 14 shots from long range in the win.

Marqu'es Webb had a big night for the Commodores (1-0) inside, going 6-of-6 from the floor and producing a double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds.

Vanderbilt committed 18 turnovers, but shoot the ball effectively enough to overcome the miscues.

The Commodores were 8-of-11 from 3-point range in the second half -- 72.7 percent -- and finished 14-of-26 (53.8 percent) for the game. Overall, 10 players reached the scoring column for Vanderbilt, and the Commodores compiled 24 assists on 31 field goals.

It was just the type of offensive performance that White was expected to bring to Vanderbilt in her inaugural season.

After spending the past two seasons as the head coach of the WNBA's Indiana Fever, she is implementing an up-tempo style with the Commodores, who sprinted out to a 23-12 lead at the end of the first quarter against the Owls (0-1) and stretched the lead to 42-20 at the half.

Clara Young and Allison Johnson finished with 15 points each to pace Kennesaw State.

Vanderbilt's touted five-member freshmen class combined for 38 points in their Commodore debuts: Erin Whalen had 11 points, Kaleigh Clemons-Green had nine, LeaLea Carter had seven, Cierra Walker had six and Kayla Overbeck had five. combined to hit just 8 of 34 shots.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. -- Stephanie White picked a tough place -- even though it was familiar territory -- to have her first road game as head coach at Vanderbilt.

Traveling to Bloomington, Ind., the Commodores suffered a 94-61 loss to the No. 23 Hoosiers on Sunday afternoon. It was the 16th consecutive home win for the Hoosiers, who went 14-0 at Assembly Hall last season.

Indiana's Alexis Gassion scored a team-high 22 points and Amanda Cahill added 17 for the Hoosiers (2-0). For Vanderbilt (1-1), Rachel Bell had 11 points and Marqu'es Webb had nine before fouling out.

White, the first-year Vanderbilt head coach, had a big gathering of friends, family and fans at the game. She came to Vanderbilt after spending the past six seasons with the WNBA's Indiana Fever, including the past two as head coach. She also was a fan favorite in Indiana during her playing career, when she was Miss Indiana Basketball as a high school player and was the national player of the year during her career at Purdue.

But Sunday's homecoming didn't go as well as White had hoped for her young Commodores, who have five freshmen that are seeing significant playing time. Vanderbilt shot just 36 percent from the floor, and never owned the lead in the game.

"We didn't play very relaxed basketball today," said White. "Indiana is a very good team, and they played exceptionally well in the second half. But have to do a better job of playing our game, and not letting the opponent dictate the game."

With Webb and Bell providing the bulk of the scoring punch, the Commodores stayed within striking distance for much of the first half, and trailed only 35-31 after a bucket by Webb with 4:40 to play in the second quarter.

Then Indiana made its move.

The Hoosiers put together a quick 13-4 run -- which featured a 3-point play by Gassion and a three-pointer by Cahill -- to extend the lead to 48-35, and the Hoosiers carried a 50-38 lead into the locker room.

Indiana then opened the second half with a 12-0 surge, fueled by three 3-pointers, to take command, 62-38. Overall, it was a 27-7 run by the Hoosiers.

NASHVILLE -- The Vanderbilt freshmen continue to be impressive, but it was an upperclassman who made the biggest impact in the Commodores win on Wednesday night.

Rebekah Dahlman, a redshirt junior, scored a career-high 25 points -- including going 15-of-18 at the foul line -- to help Vanderbilt fight off Drexel, 73-63, at Memorial Gym. The Commodores closed the game on a 10-1 run over the final 2:28 to stretch a one-point lead into the double-digit victory.

Marqu'ès Webb finished with 12 rebounds, and freshman Kayla Overbeck had 10 points and six rebounds for Vanderbilt (2-1), which bounced back in strong fashion from Sunday's 94-61 road loss to No. 23 Indiana. Sarah Curran scored 19 points for Drexel (2-1), and Jessica Pellechio had 18.

Dahlman battled flu-like symptoms earlier in the week and had to miss practice. But she showed no signs of illness against Drexel, logging 33 minutes of playing time and filling up the stat sheet with six rebounds and five assists to go with her 25 points.

Christa Reed added 10 points, including a couple of big baskets in the fourth quarter that helped the Commodores hold off the Dragons.

Drexel finished 9-of-35 from 3-point range (25.7 percent). The Dragons finished just 2-of-3 at the line in the loss.

Vanderbilt feel behind 11-2 in the first 3½ minutes of the first quarter and trailed 19-15 at the end of period. The Dragons owned an eight-point lead late in the second quarter, but the Commodores closed the period on a 10-0 run to take a 34-32 lead at the half. Overbeck capped the surge with a short jumper with six seconds remaining in the period to give Vanderbilt its first lead of the night.

That set the stage for an intense second half during which the teams were never separated by more than five points until the final three minutes. Drexel took a one-point lead on two occasions in the fourth quarter, and the Dragons trailed only 63-62 with 2:28 to play.

Dahlman then provided one of the night's biggest plays when she converted a 3-point play with 1:39 remaining to extend Vanderbilt's lead to 66-62. The Commodores sealed the win by making 7-of-8 free throws in the final 51 seconds. Vanderbilt finished 22-of-29 at the foul line.

NASHVILLE -- The Vanderbilt women faced a distinctive height disadvantage on Sunday. But it didn't prevent the Commodores from winning the rebounding battle -- or, more importantly, from winning the game.

Hosting a Duke team that has size to spare, the Commodores made a series of big plays down the stretch and notched a 77-73 victory over the previously undefeated Devils.

Christa Reed scored a game-high 19 points, and Marqu'ès Webb added 10 points and matched her career high with 13 rebounds -- her third double-digit rebounding effort of the season -- for the Commodores (3-1). Cierra Walker and Rachel Bell had 12 points each, and Rebekah Dahlman had 11.

Lexie Brown led Duke (4-1) with 21 points, and Rebecca Greenwell added 17 for the RV/RV Devils.

The game was tied 71-71 after a pair of free throws by Brown with 1:16 to play in the fourth quarter. From there, the Commodores' defense came up huge -- including a pivotal steal by Reed with 1:01 to go -- to help Vanderbilt get to the finish line.

Webb hit a pair of free throws with 48 seconds left to give Vanderbilt a 73-71 lead, and the Commodores stayed in front of there. Vanderbilt secured the win with a couple of big rebounds, one on the defensive end by Webb with 26 seconds to play, followed by an offensive rebound by Walker -- after her own missed free throw -- with 23 seconds to go.

The Commodores made only 4-of-8 free throws in the final 23 seconds, but that proved to be just enough.

Neither team made a field goal in the final 2:06 of the fourth quarter. Vanderbilt, which led 35-32 at the half, earned the win in large part due to a relentless effort on the glass. The Commodores collected 18 offensive rebounds in the game, and out-rebounded Duke 43-34 overall despite being outsized.

Duke had five players see action who are listed as 6-2 or taller, including a pair of 6-4 players (Oderah Chidom and Erin Mathias) in the starting lineup. Vanderbilt, by comparison, doesn't have any players taller than 6-1 on the roster.

NASHVILLE -- It hasn't taken long for first-year head coach Stephanie White and the five freshmen on her roster to catch on to the concept of Memorial Magic.

With a 75-59 victory over Robert Morris on Tuesday, the Commodores (4-1) grabbed their third home victory in the span off six days -- a stretch that also included wins over Duke and Drexel -- and improved to 4-0 at home overall.

The game, which was the first-ever meeting between Vanderbilt and Robert Morris (3-2), tipped off at 11:30 a.m. as the Commodores held their annual Education Day contest. A large collection of local schools attended the game.

Rachel Bell scored a game-high 20 points for Vanderbilt, and freshman Kayla Overbeck added 15 points, finishing 7-of-8 from the floor. Rebekah Dahlman had 11 points and Marqu'es Webb pulled down a game-high eight rebounds.

Vanderbilt has now won 13 consecutive non-conference games at Memorial Gym, and has posted a 49-3 record against non-con foes since the start of the 2010-11 campaign. Dating back to the start of the 2002-03 season, VU owns a 99-8 record on its home floor in regular-season, non-conference games, including an 18-1 mark since the start of the 2014-15 season.

Tuesday's win was methodical in nature, with the Commodores building a seven-point lead at the end of the first quarter and then gradually extending the lead from there. Vanderbilt led 38-26 at the half and built its largest lead of the game, 51-33, near the midway mark of the third quarter. Vanderbilt maintained a double-digit lead the rest of the way.

The Commodores shot the ball effectively, especially from long range and at the foul line. They finished 12-of-14 from the foul line (85.7 percent) and were 9-of-21 behind the arc (42.9 percent). Vanderbilt shot 48 percent from the floor overall.

Robert Morris senior guard Anna Niki Stamolamprou, the No. 5 all-time scorer in the Colonials' history, finished with a team-high 18 points. Stamolamprou, who came into the game averaging 15 points per contest, was 8-of-16 from the floor.

The Commodores owned a 34-23 lead at the half and then opened the second half with a quick 6-0 run to extend the lead to 17. Vanderbilt went on to outscore Air Force 24-14 in the period to build a 58-37 lead, with Whalen capping the quarter with a buzzer-beating 3-pointer from the corner.

"I was much more pleased with our energy in the second half," said first-year head coach Stephanie White. "And as for Erin, she had a good week of practice, and I was really happy to see that carry over to the game tonight. She played really well."

Vanderbilt's Marqu'es Webb had a game-high eight rebounds, including pulling down the 500th of her career early in the first quarter.

Whalen filled out the stat sheet with five rebounds, two steals and an assist to go with her 19 points.

The Commodores -- playing without leading scorer Rebekah Dahlman (hamstring injury) -- shot just 33 percent from the floor in the first half and 42 percent for the game. They were especially cold from long range, making just 2-of-11 shots. But Vanderbilt made up for that at the foul line, finishing 27-of-32 (84.4 percent) to continue their season-long trend of effective work from the line.

The Commodore defense also played a key role in the victory, limiting Air Force to just 27 percent shooting.

The teams combined for 57 free throws in the game, with VU making 27-of-32 and Air Force going 15-of-25.

USAF Academy, Colo. --- Fueled by freshman Cierra Walker's explosive performance, the Vanderbilt women captured the first championship of the Stephanie White Era on Saturday afternoon.

Vanderbilt fans hope, and expect, there will be many more to come.

Walker scored 21 points, making 5-of-7 shots from 3-point range, to help the Commodores defeat Southern Illinois-Edwardsville 73-63 in the championship game of the Air Force Classic.

Walker also had a season-high six rebounds and added four assists while logging 37 minutes of playing time for the Commodores (7-1), who stretched their winning streak to six games.

Vanderbilt closed the game on a 9-1 run in the final 2:03 to pull away from the Cougars (2-5) in a tight contest that featured nine lead changes and eight ties.

The Commodores finished 12-of-25 from 3-point range. Walker played a big role in the outside attack, including going 4-of-6 from long range in the first half.

Three other Commodores also reached double figures in the win: Christa Reed had 13 points, Erin Whalen added 12 and Rachel Bell had 10. Whalen and Bell both made the All-Tournament team.

Donschel Beck had 14 points for SIUE (2-5). Marqu'es Webb had 10 rebounds for the Commodores.

Vanderbilt committed 18 turnovers and lost the rebounding battle, 47-37, including surrendering 23 offensive boards to the Cougars. But the Commodores were able to offset those issues with the strong outside shooting.

"I was very disappointed in our effort and our energy in the first half," said White, the first-year head coach. "But I was pleased to see that we found a way to win. We've got some things that we need to clean up, but it's a process."

Perhaps the biggest 3-pointer of the game belonged to Bell, who knocked down a jumper from the corner with 1:13 to play to give Vanderbilt a 69-62 lead. Reed also made a key 3-pointer near the midway mark of the fourth quarter to help the Commodores fend off SIUE.

NASHVILLE -- Tulane's Kolby Morgan had a big night, but it was the Vanderbilt players who hit the biggest shots in the fourth quarter. Erupting for 30 points in the final 10 minutes, the Commodores downed Tulane 74-63 on Monday night and extended their winning streak to seven games. Rachel Bell scored 14 points to lead five players in double figures for Vanderbilt (8-1), and Marqu'es Webb pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds. Morgan poured in 34 points, going 14-of-26 from the floor, for Tulane (5-3). She also had seven rebounds and five steals. But Vanderbilt overcame Morgan's heroics by generating a dominating second-half performance, during which the Commodores outscored Tulane 48-30. Vanderbilt was especially sharp in the fourth quarter, making 10-of-17 shots from the floor, including 5-of-7 from 3-point range. For the period, Vanderbilt outscored Tulane, 30-18. The Commodores trailed by as many as 10 points in the first half and were down 45-44 entering the fourth quarter. But Cierra Walker's 3-point-er in the opening minute of the fourth quarter gave Vanderbilt the lead for good. Christa Reed finished with 13 points and Walker had 12 points, going 4-of-7 from 3-point range. Kayla Overbeck added 11 points and eight rebounds, and Erin Whalen scored 10 points and had a team-high four assists for the Commodores, who were playing their third game in the span of four days. (Vanderbilt won the Air Force Classic on Saturday with a win over SIUE after defeating Air Force on Friday). Vanderbilt's defense limited Tulane to 37 percent shooting from the floor (26-of-70). The Green Wave entered the night shooting 48 percent from the floor -- which ranked among the top 15 in the nation. The Commodores also kept Tulane off the free throw line, as the Green Wave finished just 4-of-6.

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. -- Freshman Kayla Overbeck had 18 points and 13 rebounds -- establishing new career highs in both categories -- to help Vanderbilt earn an 80-72 road win over ETSU on Thursday night. The victory enabled the Commodores (9-1) to extend their winning streak to eight games. Christa Reed scored a team-high 20 points and Rachel Bell added 19 for the Commodores, who withstood an explosive performance by ETSU's Tianna Tarter. The junior guard scored a game-high 35 points, going 15-of-28 from the floor, for the Bucs (5-5). Vanderbilt dominated the glass during the comeback victory, winning the rebounding battle 53-27. The Commodores trailed by as many as 12 points in the first quarter and were behind 50-43 with 6:58 left in the third. But Vanderbilt charged back with a 14-2 run -- which started with a jumper and a 3-pointer from Cierra Walker -- to take a 57-52 lead with 1:07 left in the quarter. Miaya Seawright helped fuel the surge with a 3-pointer from the corner that gave the Commodores their first lead of the night, 51-50, with 4:53 remaining in the period. After a pair of lead changes, Vanderbilt carried a 59-57 lead into the fourth quarter, and the Commodores stayed in front from there, outscoring ETSU 21-15 in the final 10 minutes. Vanderbilt made just four field goals in the fourth quarter, but went 12-of-15 from the foul line. VU finished 25-of-31 from the foul line for the game, while ETSU was 8-of-19. Overbeck scored eight points and pulled down five rebounds in the fourth quarter, and Reed went 5-of-6 from the foul line in the final 10 minutes to help the Commodores secure the win. For the night, Vanderbilt's bench outscored ETSU's reserves, 30-4. The Commodores now have a long break for exams before playing their next game on Dec. 18, hosting Tennessee Tech.

NASHVILLE -- Sunday was filled with career highs for the Vanderbilt women, but the Commodores endured a scary moment, too.

Christa Reed scored 25 points, Erin Whalen added 23 and LeaLea Carter had 18 -- new career highs for all three -- to help the Commodores extend their winning streak to nine games with an 89-57 victory over Tennessee Tech at Memorial Gym. Whalen also pulled down a career-best 11 rebounds for Vanderbilt (10-1). Yaktavia Hickson led all scorers with 31 points for Tennessee Tech (3-8).

The Commodores played much of the second half without senior star Marqu'ees Webb, who was taken off the floor on a stretcher after a collision. The extent of Webb's injury was not known after the game, and head coach Stephanie White said the team would have more information on Monday after Webb was evaluated.

Vanderbilt owned a 17-16 lead after the first quarter, but then dominated the next 10 minutes, outscoring Tennessee Tech 28-6 to carry a 45-22 lead into the half.

The Commodores -- who were playing their first game since Dec. 8 -- opened the second quarter with a 15-2 run and finished 9-of-15 from the floor and 9-of-10 from the foul line during the period. The Commodores capped the quarter with a no-look pass from Cierra Walker to Whalen for a layup in the final minute.

Vanderbilt, which came into the game as the SEC leaders in 3-point percentage and ranked No. 2 in the conference in free throw percentage, went 18-of-21 from the foul line (85.7 percent) and 7-of-19 (36.8 percent) from 3-point range in the win.

The game was a homecoming for Tennessee Tech first-year head coach Kim Rosamond, who was an assistant coach at Vanderbilt for nine years.

Reed scored her 25 points while going 10-of-12 from the floor. She also pulled down six rebounds. Carter, a freshman, was 8-of-12 from the floor and had seven rebounds. Carter's 18 points easily surpassed her previous season high of seven, which she had done twice this season.

NASHVILLE (AP) -- Myisha Hines-Allen, the ACC player of the year last season and preseason pick to repeat, scored 24 points and had a career-high 15 rebounds to help No. 8-ranked Louisville hold off Vanderbilt 78-66.

"That's something that we're going to need," Louisville coach Jeff Walz said. "She has the ability to do that every night. I mean that's what she did the entire ACC season all last year. Now we're going to need that consistency from her."

Rachel Bell scored 21 points for Vanderbilt (10-2), which saw its nine-game winning streak end. Cierra Walker added 12 points, and LeaLea Carter and Kayla Overbeck each had 10.

Walker opened the fourth with a 3-pointer that pulled Vanderbilt within 58-56. But Hines-Allen scored the next five points as Louisville (12-2) finally got some breathing room against the Commodores. Louisville pushed the lead to double digits on a layup by Durr with 44 seconds left.

Hines-Allen had 12 rebounds and hit six of eight shots by halftime, and she played 39 minutes in helping Louisville win its sixth straight. She notched her third double-double in the past seven games. Now the Cardinals can have a few days off before their ACC opener on Dec. 29.

"It feels good going into this break and just knowing that we have Syracuse coming back up, so we can't get too lackadaisical on this break," Hines-Allen said. "We still have to work and get better because there are some things we have to improve on."

Asia Durr added 16 points for the Cardinals.

The teams swapped the lead four times in the opening minutes before Briahanna Jackson's layup broke a 7-7 tie with 7 minutes to go to give Louisville the lead for good.

Bell scored eight straight, including the first seven of the third quarter, to pull Vanderbilt within 48-45. Sydney Zambrotta hit a 3-pointer for Louisville's first bucket of the quarter with 7:24 to go to pad the lead. Louisville led 58-53 after an ugly third quarter when the teams combined to hit just 8 of 34 shots.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Hampered by foul trouble and uncharacteristic cold shooting, the Vanderbilt women suffered a 75-59 road loss to Memphis on Wednesday.

The Commodores (10-3), playing their final non-conference game before SEC play, shot just 35 percent from the floor, including going 4-of-13 (30 percent) from 3-point range. Vanderbilt came into the game shooting an SEC-best 41 percent from behind the arc.

Kayla Overbeck, Cierra Walker, Erin Whalen and Kaleigh Clemons-Green all fouled out for the Commodores, who trailed 43-27 at the half and were unable to cut the deficit under 10 in the second half.

Cheyenne Creighton had 26 points and 13 rebounds, new career highs in both categories, for Memphis (7-6). Whalen finished with a team-high 14 points for Vanderbilt.

Memphis missed 20 free throws -- finishing 14-of-34 -- but made up for it with some surprisingly effective outside shooting, making 7-of-16 shots from 3-point range. The Tigers came into the game shooting just 26 percent from behind the arc for the season, and were averaging only 3.0 three-pointers per game.

Three Memphis players combined to score 55 of the Tigers' 75 points. In addition to Creighton's 26 points, Brea Elmore added 18 and Breigha Wilder-Cochran added 11.

The Commodores collected just six offensive rebounds, and five of those came in the fourth quarter.

Memphis put together an early 14-0 run to build a 16-4 lead with 3:32 left in the first quarter and owned a 43-27 lead at the half. Vanderbilt used a 10-3 surge to trim the margin to 47-37 with 3:40 to play in the third quarter, but Memphis pushed the lead back to 14 at the end of the quarter, and never allowed Vanderbilt to get closer than 12 points in the final 10 minutes.
