STAR POWER

Here are a few of the pertinent storylines surrounding the Commodores this season:

- ★ Vanderbilt is ranked No. 4 in the nation in 3-point accuracy at 39.8 percent and leads the SEC in 3-pointers per game at 7.3 (through Feb. 10)
- ★ The Commodores have endured a tough stretch over the past eight weeks, having lost 12 of their past 13 games after jumping out to a 10-1 start
- ★ Vanderbilt's Kayla Overbeck is the top rebounder in the SEC among freshmen (7.5 rpg) and is No. 2 among freshmen in scoring (10.2 ppg)
- ★ The Commodores won nine consecutive games from Nov. 16 to Dec. 18 and lost nine straight from Dec. 21 through Jan. 22.
- ★ Vanderbilt's Kaleigh Clemons-Green is shooting 51.4 percent from 3-point range, which is the highest among SEC freshmen with at least 15 attempts

HEAD COACH STEPHANIE WHITE

Stephanie **WHITE**

Head Coach / First Season



Stephanie White was named the head coach for Vanderbilt women's basketball program on May 24, becoming just the fifth all-time head coach in the history of the Vanderbilt program.

Having enjoyed success at virtually every level of basketball as a player and coach, White arrived at Vanderbilt after spending two seasons as the head coach of WNBA's Indiana Fever. White took the Fever to the playoffs in each of her two seasons, including a trip to the WNBA finals in 2015.

"The opportunity to lead Vanderbilt's women's basketball program is an opportunity that I simply could not pass up," White said. "The combination of Vanderbilt's culture, where achievement -- both on and off the court - is so highly valued, together with the institution's fan support, and a legacy of winning basketball to build upon, is incredibly exciting to me. I appreciate the support and understanding that I have received from the Indiana Fever, from management to the players, regarding my passion to coach college basketball at an elite institution."

White -- who played five seasons in the WNBA after a decorated playing career at Purdue -- was named head coach for the Fever in September 2014. In 2015, she guided the Fever to the WNBA finals, becoming the first rookie coach in league history to lead a team to the finals.

As a collegiate player, White enjoyed a highly successful career at Purdue, where she earned national Player of the Year honors after helping lead the Boilermakers to the 1999 NCAA championship as a senior. That season, she also received the Wade Trophy (given to the nation's top female player) and was named Big Ten Conference Player of the Year.

"Stephanie White has been a winner in every phase of her career," Vanderbilt athletic director David Williams said. "She was the nation's high school player of the year, she was the NCAA's Player of the Year on a national championship team and she led her WNBA team into the finals in her first year. She was an outstanding scholar. She wants to coach at Vanderbilt and we believe she is just the person to lead our program back into national prominence."

White averaged double-figure scoring in all four seasons of her college career, including 20.2 points per game as a senior, and amassed 2,182 points for her career. White was inducted into the Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame on April 21, 2006.

She was also a star in the classroom at Purdue. She was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and was an Academic All-American.

White was an assistant coach with the Chicago Sky from 2007-2010, then joined the Fever staff as an assistant in 2011. She was promoted to associate head coach in 2014 before being named head coach after Lin Dunn's retirement. While coaching in the WNBA, White served as a college basketball analyst for ESPN and the Big Ten Network. She also covered the NBA's Indiana Pacers for FOX Sports Indiana.

Prior to coaching in the WNBA, White coached in the college ranks, serving as an assistant at Toledo (2005-07), Kansas State (2004-05) and Ball State (2003-04).

Before beginning her coaching career, White enjoyed a productive five-year WNBA career, spending one season with the Charlotte Sting and four with the Indiana Fever, before retiring in 2004.

At the completion of her four seasons with the Fever, she ranked third in games played (112) and 3-pointers (92), and fourth in scoring (684). She was named to the Fever's All-Decade Team that was announced in 2009.

White and her wife, Michelle, have three boys: Landon, age 5, and twins, Aiden & Avery, age 2.

THE LOWDOWN ON TODAY'S GAME

After more than two weeks without a home game, the Vanderbilt women return to Memorial Gym on Monday night to host LSU in a game that carries potential postseason implications for both teams.

The Commodores -- who are coming off back-to-back road losses, both against ranked opponents -- enter the game with hopes of kickstarting a late-season surge that could significantly improve their seeding for the SEC tournament.

Having dropped 12 of its past 13 games, including a 1-10 mark in SEC play, Vanderbilt needs to climb five spots in the standings, from 14th to 10th, to earn a first-round bye in the quickly-approaching SEC Tournament. The Commodores (11-13, 1-10) are mathematically alive to make such a move, but they will need a strong finish in their final six games, along with some outside help, in order to make the climb.

LSU, meanwhile, has won two straight games and three of its past four. The recent surge has enabled the Tigers (17-7, 6-5) to move into a tie with Missouri for sixth place in the conference standings, and they are squarely in the hunt to finish among the top four teams in the SEC and subsequently earn a double-bye for the tournament.

More importantly, LSU is wanting to solidify its resume for the NCAA Tournament. The Tigers have an impressive No. 23 RPI ranking (through Feb. 10) and are in line to potentially earn an at-large bid.

UPDATE ON THE 'DORES

Here's the latest scoop on the Commodores as they head into today's game:

◆ Vanderbilt will be looking to rebound from Thursday night's 86-41 loss to No. 4-ranked Mississippi State. The Commodores endured their toughest offensive night of the season in terms of points (41), field-goal percentage (23.5) and assists (four).

◆ The Commodores continue to be one of the most accurate and most prolific 3-point shooting teams in the country. They are ranked No. 4 in the nation in 3-point percentage at 39.8 (though Feb. 10) and are averaging an SEC-best 7.3 three-pointers per game. Vanderbilt has compiled 34 three-pointers in the past four games and has made four or more 3-pointers in 22 of their 23 games this season.

◆ The Commodores were involved in a series of close games at the start of SEC play, with five of Vanderbilt's first six SEC defeats being decided by a combined 21 points -- an average of margin of 4.2 points. In each of those five games, Vanderbilt was either in the lead, tied or trailing by three points or less entering the final minute. *For more on Vanderbilt's last-minute losses, see chart on page 8.*

◆ Vanderbilt's touted freshman class -- Kayla Overbeck, Kaleigh Clemens-Green, LeaLea Carter, Cierra Walker, and Erin Whalen -- continues to shine for the Commodores. The five-member class is combining for 33.4 points, 16.7 rebounds and 8.1 assists per game, and they have accounted for 47.8 percent of Vanderbilt's scoring, 42.1 percent of VU's rebounds and 53.0 percent of the team's assists. *For more on the freshmen, see chart on page .*

WEBB REPRESENTS SEC AT NCAA CONVENTION



Marqu'ees Webb was selected to be one of three student-athletes to represent the SEC at the NCAA Convention in Nashville in late January. While there, Webb was able to vote on proposed governance rule changes under the NCAA's Division I autonomy process.

Webb, a four-year starter for the Commodores, was joined by Brady Bramlett, a former member of the Ole Miss baseball team, and Antoine Marc, a former member of the Texas A&M men's swimming and diving team, as the SEC representatives at the convention.

Webb, a senior from Montgomery, Ala., has been on the Dean's List at Vanderbilt and is a two-time recipient of the Women's Basketball Most Improved Academic Award. Webb, who majors in Sociology with a minor in Corporate Strategy, is chair of the SEC Women's Basketball Leadership Council.

RUNNING HOT AND COLD

As would be expected of a team learning a new system, Vanderbilt has battled inconsistency this season, with the Commodores posting a 10-1 mark through the first 11 games, then dropping 12 of the next 13. THINK PINK

In a continuing effort to raise awareness and support for the fight against breast cancer, Monday's game against LSU has been designated as "Think Pink" night at Memorial Gym.

Throughout the night, the Commodores will host a series of special events, including having Tina Tackett, a breast cancer survivor, serve as an honorary coach.

When the Vanderbilt starting lineup is introduced, each Commodore player will walk out with a breast cancer survivor. Also, the first 250 fans to enter the gym are receiving free "Think Pink" T-shirts, and a banner is being displayed in the Southeast Lobby of Memorial Gym for fans to sign and leave messages of encouragement. The banner will later be moved and put on display at the Medical Center.

"We are excited to host the Think Pink event at Memorial Gym," said head coach Stephanie White. "This game is about celebrating and recognizing the strength and courage of those who have battled breast cancer. We are honored to use our platform to create awareness about a disease that is close to the hearts of everyone in our program."

ERIN EMERGING

Erin Whalen is getting into an SEC groove.

The 6-1 freshman has averaged a team-high 13.0 points and 4.8 rebounds over the past six games after averaging just 1.4 points and 0.8 rebounds in the first five SEC games.

Whalen has reached double figures in four of the past five games, and has gone 13-for-28 (46.4 percent) from 3-point range in the past four games.

Making her first career start against Alabama (1/26), she scored a game-high 22 points to fuel Vanderbilt's 87-80 win.

Whalen is shooting 42.5 percent from long range for the season.

AMONG THE BEST

Here's a look at some of the numbers that are defining the season for the Commodores:

- ◆ Vanderbilt ranks fourth in the nation and leads the SEC in 3-point accuracy at 39.8 percent.

- ◆ The Commodores are 25th in the country in free throws made (352).

- ◆ Vanderbilt is fourth in the SEC in free throw percentage at 73.8.

- ◆ The Commodores lead the SEC in 3-pointers made per game (7.3) and total 3-pointers made (176).

WITHOUT WALKER

Freshmen Cierra Walker has missed four of the past five games, including Thursday's loss to Mississippi State, due to stress reactions in both feet.

Walker leads the team in assists per game (3.2) and her assist-to-turnover ratio (2.2) ranks fifth in the SEC and 53rd in the nation.

She has made 31 three-pointers this season, second most on the team.

Overbeck in overdrive: Freshman putting up big numbers

Freshman forward Kayla Overbeck has been a force for the Commodores throughout the season, and in the past month, she has taken her game to an even higher level.

Overbeck, who is the SEC's top rebounder among freshmen, is averaging 11.7 points and 8.4 rebounds in the past nine games, and has reached double figures in seven of those contests. In last Sunday's loss to Kentucky, Overbeck scored a season-high 19 points and collected a team-high 11 rebounds to notch her second consecutive double-double.

Overbeck has posted six double-doubles this season, four of which have come in SEC play. Overbeck is shooting a team-best 54.8 percent from the field for the season.



Beyond the Court

Commodores spend day doing farm work for food project

The Vanderbilt WBB team had a day off from practice on Jan. 31, but the Commodores still put in some work. And they were glad to do it.

Showing their continued commitment to being involved in the community, the Commodores volunteered at the Hands On Nashville farm, harvesting vegetables for The Nashville Food Project.

"It was a lot of hard work, but we really enjoyed it," said Vanderbilt freshman guard Kaleigh Clemons-Green. "For me, it was a totally new experience because I haven't really been exposed to the organic side of life. But I was so glad that I was able to be a part of it. It took me out of my comfort zone -- in a good way."

Hands On Nashville is an organization that works to meet community needs through volunteerism. Annually, Hands On Nashville connects thousands of volunteers to support the needs of schools, nonprofits, community centers, libraries and more. As Middle Tennessee's volunteer resource center, Hands On Nashville builds stronger communities through service.

The Vanderbilt WBB players did their part by helping winterize the farm, which included pulling up bermuda grass, making new walkways, and harvesting turnips and carrots.

"It was a great experience," said senior guard Minta Spears, "and I have a new appreciation for the people of Hands on Nashville."

SCOUTING THE OPPONENT

- ◆ The Tigers are one of the best defensive teams in the SEC and among the best in the country. They are averaging 13 steals per game, which ranks third in the country, and their +7.4 turnover margin is the country's sixth best. LSU has limited opponents to 57.9 points per game, which ranks third in the SEC.
- ◆ Raigyne Moncrief is having a huge season for the Tigers, averaging a team-high 15.4 points per game. She also leads the SEC and ranks sixth in the nation in steals per game at 3.6.
- ◆ The Tigers do not rely on 3-point shooting. They have made only 23 three-pointers this season, and are averaging 1.1 three-pointer by game. LSU has attempted only 117 shots from 3-point range. (Vanderbilt, by comparison, has made taken 442).

SERIES HISTORY

- ◆ Monday's game will be the 45th all-time meeting between the teams, with Vanderbilt owning a 25-19 lead in the series.
- ◆ The series has been dominated by the home team: Vanderbilt is 14-3 against LSU in games at Memorial Gym, but the Tigers own a 13-4 advantage in Baton Rouge.
- ◆ The most recent match-up between the Commodores and Tigers came last season in Nashville, when Vanderbilt posted a 58-42 victory on Jan. 14, 2016 (more on that game below).
- ◆ The teams have split the past six meetings, with each team going 3-0 at home during that stretch.

LAST SEASON'S GAME: VANDERBILT 58, LSU 42 (Jan. 14, 2016)

Commodores get defensive, roll to SEC victory over Tigers

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Buoyed by a gritty defensive effort, Vanderbilt downed LSU, 58-42, last season at Memorial Gym.

The Commodores came into the night ranked eighth in the nation in defense, surrendering just 51.6 points per game. They did even better than that against the short-handed Tigers, who dressed only eight players.

Vanderbilt, which never trailed in the game, limited LSU to 33.3 percent shooting and held the Tigers to single-digit scoring in the second and third quarters while rolling to the win.

Christa Reed, the SEC's leader in 3-point percentage, went 3-of-4 from long range and finished with a game-high 15 points, and Minta Spears added 10 points and four rebounds for Vanderbilt.

Akilah Bethel finished with 11 points to lead LSU, and Alexis Hyder and Jasmine Rhodes added 10 each.

Sparked by a couple of early 3-pointers from Spears, Vanderbilt jumped out to a quick 10-2 lead in the first quarter. But LSU weathered the early surge, and stayed within striking distance for the rest of the half, trailing 15-11 after the first quarter and 27-20 at the half.

The Commodores, however, opened the second half with an 8-0 run, which included 3-pointers by Reed and Rachel Bell, to push the lead to 35-20. Vanderbilt never allowed the lead to dip below 10 points the rest of the way.

Although the game didn't have much flow, Vanderbilt was effective and efficient on the offensive end. The Commodores committed just nine turnovers and shot

50 percent from the floor, finishing 24-of-48. Vanderbilt entered the game ranked 11th in the country in field-goal percentage at 47.7 percent.

The injury-plagued Tigers, meanwhile, are having a tough season offensively. They came into the night ranked 293rd in the country in scoring (57.1 points per game) and were averaging only 2.4 three-pointers per game, which ranks 342nd in the nation.

This game only compounded those problems, as LSU finished just 1-of-2 from 3-point range and made only eight field goals in the second half.

The Tigers, who lost star guard Raigyne Moncrief to an injury early in the season, were without Jenna Deemer for the game. Deemer is LSU's leading scorer over the past two months, averaging 10.1 points per game.

LAST-MINUTE DECISIONS

Detailing Vanderbilt's close games in conference play

The Commodores have endured a series of close losses since the start of conference play, with five of Vanderbilt's SEC defeats being decided by a combined 21 points. In all five of those games, Vanderbilt was either in the lead, tied or trailing by three points or less entering the final minute. Here's a quick look at how the games unfolded:

Texas A&M 77, Vanderbilt 72

The lowdown: Vanderbilt led by as much as 13 points in the third quarter and owned a seven-point lead going into the fourth quarter. But the Commodores were outscored 27-15 in the last 10 minutes.

The final minute: Vanderbilt trailed 72-69 entering the final minute.

How it unfolded: The Commodores pulled within 73-72 after freshman Erin Whalen knocked down a 3-pointer with 33 seconds to play, but Vanderbilt didn't score again the rest of the way. The Aggies sealed the win with four straight free throws.

Georgia 70, Vanderbilt 68

The lowdown: Stephanie Paul's short jumper with three-tenths of a second to play was the game-winner for Georgia. Vanderbilt owned a 13-point lead early in the second quarter before Georgia rallied back. The Commodores, normally one of the SEC's best free-throw shooting teams, made just 18-of-30 attempts from the line in the loss.

The final minute: Vanderbilt carried a 68-65 lead into the final minute.

How it unfolded: Georgia scored the game's last five points, beginning with a three-point play by Pachis Roberts that tied the game with 54 seconds remaining. Vanderbilt then missed a contested layup on its ensuing possession, and Georgia grabbed the rebound. The Lady Dogs held for the last shot, and Paul got free in the lane to score the decisive basket. After watching a replay, the officials put three-tenths of a second back on the clock, but Vanderbilt was unable to get a shot off.

Auburn 64, Vanderbilt 59

The lowdown: After building a 17-point lead in the third quarter, the Commodores struggled late against Auburn's pressure defense and were outscored 22-10 in the fourth quarter. Vanderbilt made just 4-of-12 shots from the floor, including going 0-of-5 from 3-point range, in the final 10 minutes. The Commodores led 53-46 with 6:54 to play in the fourth quarter before Auburn closed the game on an 18-8 run to steal the win.

The final minute: Vanderbilt trailed 61-59 entering the final minute.

How it unfolded: Vanderbilt's Rebekah Dahlman missed a 3-pointer with 46 seconds to go, and after Commodores got the offensive rebound, Cierra Walker missed a 3-pointer with 29 seconds to play. Auburn's Brandy Montgomery then hit two free throws with 21 seconds remaining to give Auburn a four-point lead, and she went 1-of-2 at the line with nine seconds to go to seal it.

Missouri 74, Vanderbilt 68

The lowdown: In a typically intense SEC game, Vanderbilt and Missouri traded baskets for 40 minutes. The game featured 16 ties and 12 lead changes, and the teams were never separated by more than six points after the first quarter. Vanderbilt led by three with 2:15 remaining in the fourth quarter, but Missouri closed the game on a 13-4 run, which included Amber Smith's pivotal 3-pointer with 1:17 to go that put the Tigers on top.

The final minute: Vanderbilt trailed 66-64 going into the final minute.

How it unfolded: Rachel Bell's potential go-ahead 3-pointer spun off the rim with 57 seconds to play. Missouri then made eight free throws down the stretch to hold off the Commodores.

Arkansas 59, Vanderbilt 56

The lowdown: Vanderbilt owned a 48-41 lead heading into the fourth quarter, but couldn't hold off the Razorbacks in the final 10 minutes. The game featured nine ties and 10 lead changes.

The final minute: The game was tied 56-56 entering the final minute.

How it unfolded: Vanderbilt had two opportunities to move in front, but came up empty on back-to-back possessions -- missing a jumper on the first possession (with 41 seconds to play) and missing two free throws on the second possession (with 20 seconds remaining). Arkansas finally broke the tie when Malica Monk hit 1-of-2 free throws with 10.2 seconds remaining. On their ensuing possession, the Commodores were unable to get a shot off, as a loose-ball tie-up in the lane created a turnover. (The possession arrow went to Arkansas). Devin Cospier then made two free throws with four seconds to play, and Rachel Bell's desperation 3-pointer was off the mark at the buzzer.

SPEARS SELECTED FOR "SO" PROGRAM

Vanderbilt senior guard Minta Spears has been selected to participate in The Women's Basketball Coaches Association's 15th annual "So You Want To Be A Coach" program. Each selected member will participate in the three-day workshop held during the Final Four from March 29-31 in conjunction with the WBCA Convention in Dallas.

Spears, who joined the Commodore WBB team in May of 2015 after being accepted into grad school, is interested in the possibility of entering the coaching field when she completes her time at Vanderbilt -- and the "So You Want To Be A Coach" program will be a valuable tool in her preparation.

"I've had the unique experience of having four head coaches and close to 20 assistants during my collegiate career, and I've seen the impact coaches can have on their athletes," said Spears, who transferred to Vanderbilt from Texas Tech.

"While I love the X's and O's and the strategy behind the game of basketball, I'm also interested in how basketball can be used as a platform to connect to the community, teach transferable skills like leadership and teamwork, and develop young people on and off the court to pursue their passions. I'd be honored one day to be a coach and provide opportunities to young women, just as my coaches have done for me."

In order to be considered as a candidate for the "So" program, players have to be nominated by their head coach. Each participant is selected based on her academics, contributions to women's basketball on and off the court and professional résumé, along with other criteria.

MARQU'ES WEBB: A LEADER AMONG HER PEERS

After serving as a representative for Vanderbilt at the SEC's first-ever Leadership Council, senior Marqu'es Webb was chosen by her peers to be the chair of the group. Her duties as chair will include participating in conference calls with the league office during the year, attending a portion of the Senior Women's Administrator's meeting during the 2017 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament and potentially attending the SEC Spring Meetings in Destin, Fla., this summer.

Webb is a four-year starter for the Commodores, and the standout from Montgomery, Ala., has led the team in field goal percentage is each of the past three seasons, including shooting 59.5 percent as a sophomore and 58.5 percent last season.

Spears nominated for Good Works Team

Minta Spears and Vanderbilt men's basketball player Luke Kornet were selected as nominees for the 2017 Allstate WBCA and NABC Good Works Teams.

The pair of Vanderbilt standouts, who are among the 278 nominees for the prestigious honor, have shown dedication to helping and serving the Nashville community -- and beyond -- throughout their playing careers.

Spears, a senior, has volunteered at the Boys and Girls Club of Nashville and helped plan a Nashville-wide FCA at Vanderbilt.

She has also served meals at Luke 14:12, served as the women's basketball representative on the Student Athlete Advisory Committee, and orchestrated a project in which she and her teammates helped buy new school shoes for a family in Nashville through Soles 4 Souls.

Spears has also spent time volunteering as a social media intern for the YWCA of Middle Tennessee MEND program.

The Vanderbilt women's staff isn't the only collection of standouts on campus. The men's coaching staff combined to score a total of 5,486 collegiate points: Bryce Drew (Valparaiso) 2,142; Casey Shaw (Toledo) 1,562; Roger Powell, Jr. (Illinois) 1,178; and Jake Diebler (Valparaiso) 586.

Signing Day Success

Comprising the inaugural signing class of Vanderbilt first-year head coach Stephanie White, a pair of highly-rated recruits -- Autumn Newby and Chelsie Hall -- signed National Letters of Intent with the Vanderbilt women's basketball team this November.

Newby is a 6-2 forward from Archer High in Lawrenceville, Ga., who averaged 12.7 points and 12.6 rebounds per game last season. Hall is a 5-7 point guard from Seffner Christian Academy in Tampa, Fla., who averaged 21.2 points per game last year.

Together, the two players form a signing class that was ranked No. 23 in the nation by BlueStar Report. (Newby was ranked by BlueStar as the No. 20 overall prospect and Hall was ranked No. 28).

Storm Trooper Stephanie

When Vanderbilt hosted Bellarmine in a preseason game on Oct. 30, the game had a Halloween costume contest -- and head coach Stephanie White certainly did her part to enhance the night. She emerged from the locker room at halftime dressed as a storm trooper and passed out candy to those who participated in a costume contest and fans in the stands.

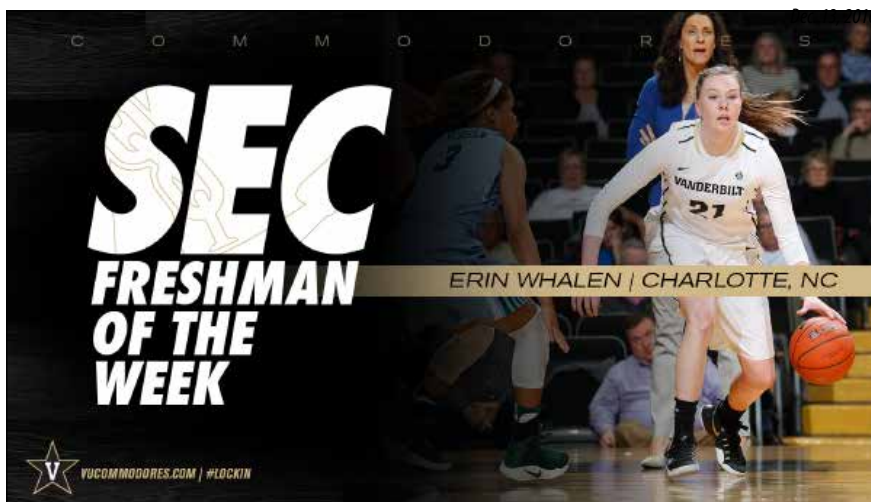

* Freshman Cierra Walker ranks fifth in the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.2.

* Kayla Overbeck ranks ninth in the conference in rebounds per game at 7.5.

* VU has three players who rank among the SEC's top-10 in career 3-pointers: Rebekah Dahlman (seventh with 122), Rachel Bell (seventh with 105) and Christa Reed (eighth with 104).

SHOELESS STEPH

Vanderbilt head coach Stephanie White coached barefoot during the game against Alabama to help raise awareness for Soles4Souls. White also coached barefoot during practice earlier in the week.

"Soles4Souls is such a wonderful organization, and we are excited about doing our part to promote and assist them," said White. "My hope is that coaching barefoot will bring awareness to those who don't have the luxury of wearing shoes every day."

IMPACTFUL IMPROVEMENTS

The Commodores are on the upswing in numerous categories under the direction of first-year head coach Stephanie White.

* Through 23 games, Vanderbilt is averaging 69.8 points per game after scoring just 62.5 ppg last season.

* The Commodores are also making an SEC-best 7.3 three-pointers per game, compared to just 5.4 last season.

* Vanderbilt is converting 14.7 free throws per game this season after making only 11.4 last season.

BELL HAS BEEN RINGING FOR COMMODORES

Junior guard Rachel Bell has established herself as a consistent force for the Commodore offense. Bell, who leads the team in scoring at 11.8 points per game, has reached double figures in 16 games, including six of past nine. Bell is shooting 40.5 percent from behind the arc for the season. She averaged 15.3 points per game during a seven-game stretch from Nov. 20 through Dec. 8.

Former Vanderbilt great Caroline (Williams) Hipps has been named the Co-Chair of the 2018 SEC Tournament, which will be held in Nashville.

Hipps, who played for the Commodores from 2004-07, was one of the most accurate 3-point shooters in the history of women's college basketball.

Williams shot 46.5 percent from 3-point range (238-of-512) in her career, which is the best in SEC history and ranks No. 5 on the NCAA's all-time list for career 3-point percentage.

Williams remains close with the WBB program, and was a member of the search committee that paved the way for the hiring of head coach Stephanie White. Hipps also served as a color analyst for the Commodores' home games on SEC Network Plus during the 2014-15 season.

Bulldogs show explosiveness, roll past Vanderbilt

No. 4-ranked Mississippi State limits Commodores to a season-low 23 percent shooting

STARKVILLE, Miss. (AP) - Mississippi State remained unbeaten on its home floor on Thursday night.

The fourth-ranked Bulldogs beat Vanderbilt 86-41 for their fourth straight victory -- jumping out to leads of 20-2 and 40-8 by midway through the second quarter -- while improving to 10-0 at home.

"When the lights came on tonight, we were really special," Mississippi State coach Vic Schaefer said.

Victoria Vivians led the Bulldogs with 21 points, Roshunda Johnson scored 17 and Breanna Richardson added 12. Mississippi State shot 35 of 70 (50 percent) from the field, including 9 of 20 (45 percent) from 3-point range.

Vivians was pleased that the Bulldogs never let up on the Commodores.

"We finished the whole game," Vivians said. "We played all four quarters. ... That was our main focus -- finish the game."

The Bulldogs (24-1, 10-1) dominated from the opening tip, suffocating Vanderbilt defensively and then pushing for quick baskets in transition. They led 42-15 at halftime.

The 6-foot-1 Vivians made eight of her first 10 shots and scored all 21 of her points in the first half to push the Bulldogs ahead early. Johnson made 5 of 8 shots from 3-point range, needing just 13 minutes on the court to score her 17 points.

Vanderbilt (11-13, 1-10) shot just 12 of 51 (23.5 percent) from the field.

Rachel Bell and Erin Whalen led Vanderbilt with nine points. It was the lowest offensive output of the season for the Commodores -- their previous low was 56 points in a loss to Arkansas.

- Has earned 27 berths in the NCAA Tournament, including a run of 15 straight from 2000-2014.
- Has captured six SEC Tournament championships (2009, 2007, 2004, 2002, 1995, 1993).

Head Coach Stephanie White:

- Won her first game at Vanderbilt, and her first as a college head coach when the Commodores beat Kennesaw State, 86-54 on Nov. 11.
- Spent the previous two seasons as the head coach of the WNBA's Indiana Fever, and guided the team to the playoffs each year.
- Led the Fever to the WNBA Finals in 2015, becoming the first rookie coach in league history to guide a team to the finals.
- During her playing career at Purdue, she was the National Player of the Year in 1999 after helping the Boilermakers capture the NCAA title that season.

- ◆ Was the 2016 North Carolina Gatorade Player of the Year and averaged 18.2 points and 5.7 rebounds per game in her prep career.

No. 22 -- Marqu'e Webb (Senior)

- ◆ Was named the chair of the SEC's first-ever Leadership Council; Was selected to the position by her peers.
- ◆ Pulled down her 500th career rebound early this season and ranks among the SEC's Top-10 in career rebounds.

No. 23 -- Minta Spears (RS Senior)

- ◆ Averaged 13.8 points per game over the final four games of last season, reaching double figures in three of those contests.
