# HEAD COACH STEPHANIE WHITE

## Stephanie WHITE

### Head Coach / First Season

Stephanie White was named the head coach for Vanderbilt women's basketball program on May 24, becoming just the fifth all-time head coach in the history of the Vanderbilt program.

Having enjoyed success at virtually every level of basketball as a player and coach, White arrived at Vanderbilt after spending two seasons as the head coach of WNBA's Indiana Fever. White took the Fever to the playoffs in each of her two seasons, including a trip to the WNBA finals in 2015.

"The opportunity to lead Vanderbilt's women's basketball program is an opportunity that I simply could not pass up," White said. "The combination of Vanderbilt's culture, where achievement -- both on and off the court - is so highly valued, together with the institution's fan support, and a legacy of winning basketball to build upon, is incredibly exciting to me. I appreciate the support and understanding that I have received from the Indiana Fever, from management to the players, regarding my passion to coach college basketball at an elite institution."

White -- who played five seasons in the WNBA after a decorated playing career at Purdue -- was named head coach for the Fever in September 2014. In 2015, she guided the Fever to the WNBA finals, becoming the first rookie coach in league history to lead a team to the finals.

As a collegiate player, White enjoyed a highly successful career at Purdue, where she earned national Player of the Year honors after helping lead the Boilermakers to the 1999 NCAA championship as a senior. That season, she also received the Wade Trophy (given to the nation's top female player) and was named Big Ten Conference Player of the Year.

"Stephanie White has been a winner in every phase of her career," Vanderbilt athletic director David Williams said. "She was the nation's high school player of the year, she was the NCAA's Player of the Year on a national championship team and she led her WNBA team into the finals in her first year. She was an outstanding scholar. She wants to coach at Vanderbilt and we believe she is just the person to lead our program back into national prominence."

White averaged double-figure scoring in all four seasons of her college career, including 20.2 points per game as a senior, and amassed 2,182 points for her career. White was inducted into the Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame on April 21, 2006.

She was also a star in the classroom at Purdue. She was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and was an Academic All-American.

White was an assistant coach with the Chicago Sky from 2007-2010, then joined the Fever staff as an assistant in 2011. She was promoted to associate head coach in 2014 before being named head coach after Lin Dunn's retirement. While coaching in the WNBA, White served as a college basketball analyst for ESPN and the Big Ten Network. She also covered the NBA's Indiana Pacers for FOX Sports Indiana.

Prior to coaching in the WNBA, White coached in the college ranks, serving as an assistant at Toledo (2005-07), Kansas State (2004-05) and Ball State (2003-04).

Before beginning her coaching career, White enjoyed a productive five-year WNBA career, spending one season with the Charlotte Sting and four with the Indiana Fever, before retiring in 2004.

At the completion of her four seasons with the Fever, she ranked third in games played (112) and 3-pointers (92), and fourth in scoring (684). She was named to the Fever's All-Decade Team that was announced in 2009.

White and her wife, Michelle, have three boys: Landon, age 5, and twins, Aiden & Avery, age 2.

## THE LOWDOWN ON THE 'DORES

After putting together a late-season surge that included three wins in their final five games, the Vanderbilt women head into the SEC Tournament with confidence and optimism.

The Commodores, who are the tournament's No. 13 seed after posting a 4-12 SEC record, will face Alabama on Wednesday at 10 a.m. (CT) in the tournament's opening game.

This marks the third consecutive season in which Vanderbilt has been in action on the first day of the event. (The tournament's No. 11-14 seeds play in the first round, while the No. 5-10 seeds get first-round byes, and the top four seeds receive double-byes).

The Commodores have posted victories in each of the past two years on Day 1, including a victory over Alabama in the first round of the 2015 tournament and a win over Ole Miss in the first round last season.

Wednesday's game will be the second match-up of the season between Vanderbilt and Alabama after the Commodores posted an 87-80 victory over the Tide on Jan. 26.

## SURROUNDING STORYLINES

Here's the latest scoop on the Commodores as they head into Wednesday's game:

♦ The Commodores, who suffered a road loss to LSU in the regular-season finale on Sunday, enter the SEC Tournament with two possible paths to the postseason: They can win an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament by winning this week's tourney or they can position themselves for a potential bid to the WNIT by winning two games this week.

♦ Vanderbilt has been one of the most accurate and most prolific 3-point shooting teams in the country throughout the season. The Commodores are ranked No. 3 in the nation in 3-point percentage at 39.1 percent (through Feb. 26) and are averaging an SEC-best 7.3 three-pointers per game. Vanderbilt has four players who are shooting better than 40 percent from 3-point range.

♦ The Commodores have been visiting the foul line with great frequency this season, ranking fifth in the nation in free throws made (459) and 18th in free throws attempted (612) through Feb. 26. Vanderbilt has converted 120 free throws over the past six games (an average of 20.0 per game) and has attempted 157 free throws (26.1 per game) in that stretch.

♦ Vanderbilt's touted freshmen class -- Kayla Overbeck, Kaleigh Clemmons-Green, LeaLea Carter, Cierra Walker, and Erin Whalen -- is combining for 33.3 points, 16.3 rebounds and 7.2 assists per game. They have accounted for 48.2 percent of Vanderbilt's scoring, 41.6 percent of VU's rebounds and 51.3 percent of the team's assists. The numbers would likely be even higher if it weren't for an injury to Cierra Walker that has caused her to be sidelined for most of the past six weeks.



## WHALEN NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Erin Whalen was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Monday, Feb. 27, marking the second time this season that the freshman from Charlotte, N.C., has won the award. (She also took the honor on Dec. 6).

Whalen averaged 16.0 points and 3.0 rebounds per game this past week. She scored 20 points -- including the game-winning free throws with 2.5 seconds to play -- in Vanderbilt's win over Arkansas on Thursday, and followed that up with a 12-point effort in the regular-season finale against LSU on Sunday.

## STUDYING THE BRACKET

Thanks to the somewhat unusual format of a 14-team bracket, Vanderbilt enters the SEC tourney already aware of its potential opponents for the first three rounds of the event.

If the Commodores advance from Wednesday's first-round game against Alabama, they would face No. 5-seeded Tennessee in the second round. If the Commodores were to pull the upset in that match-up, they would face No. 4-seeded Kentucky on Friday.

Vanderbilt posted a 1-4 record against those three potential opponents this season, with a victory over Alabama, a loss to Kentucky and a pair of losses to Tennessee.

### WHALEN DOING HER PART

Freshman Erin Whalen is on a major roll as she heads into her first SEC Tournament.

The 6-1 freshman averaged 18.6 points per game over the final three games of the regular season, and was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Monday.

She scored a career-high 24 points on 8-of-12 shooting in the win over Ole Miss last Sunday, and followed that up with a 20-point effort -- including making the game-winning free throws with 2.5 seconds remaining -- in Thursday's victory over Arkansas.

She closed the regular season with 12 points in Sunday's loss to LSU.

Whalen has averaged a team-high 13.0 points and 3.8 rebounds over the past 11 games after averaging only 1.4 points and 0.8 rebounds in VU's first five SEC games.

She is shooting 92.9 percent from the foul line in the past 10 games, converting 26-of-28 attempts from the foul line.

Whalen is averaging a team-best 18.3 points per game in Vanderbilt's four SEC wins.

### WALKER SLOWED BY INJURIES

Freshmen Cierra Walker continues to be slowed by stress reactions in both of her feet. She dressed out but did not play in Sunday's game against LSU, and has now missed eight of the past 11 games.

Walker has logged a total of just 16 minutes of playing time since Jan. 19.

## Surging Overbeck leads all SEC freshmen in rebounds

Freshman forward Kayla Overbeck has established herself as a candidate for the SEC Freshman of the Year. She is conference's leading rebounder among freshmen (7.2 rebounds per game) and ranks second in scoring (9.5 ppg).

Overbeck, who was slowed by illness in the final week of the regular season, posted her team-leading seventh double-double last Sunday, finishing with 10 points and 11 rebounds, in Vanderbilt's 85-67 victory over Ole Miss.

In the road loss to Kentucky on Feb. 5, Overbeck scored a season-high 19 points and collected a team-high 11 rebounds to notch her second consecutive double-double.



### SMARTER CARTER

Vanderbilt freshman LeaLea Carter has been aggressively going to be the basket in recent games -- and the result has been a noticeable uptick in her trips to the foul line.

Carter has attempted 38 free throws in the past six games (an average of 6.3 per game) after attempting a total of just 19 free throws in the first 10 SEC games (1.9 attempts per game).

### HOLDING FIRM

After making numerous adjustments to the starting lineup during the first three months of the season, Vanderbilt head coach Stephanie White has found a combination she seems to like best.

Prior to last Thursday's game -- when Kayla Overbeck was sidelined with illness -- White had used the same combination for the previous seven games, with two seniors (Marques Webb and Minta Spears) and three freshmen (Kaleigh Clemons-Green, Erin Whalen and Overbeck) filling out the lineup.

For the season, 10 of the 12 players on Vanderbilt's roster have started at least one game.

### MAKING A WISH COME TRUE

The Commodores teamed up with Papa John's this season to support the Make-A-Wish foundation -- and at halftime of Thursday's game, the culmination of the partnership was revealed.

Papa John's presented a \$5,000 check to the Make-A-Wish foundation, and head coach Stephanie White presented a second check that matched the other. Together, they helped send a child and her family to Disney World.

"We are truly honored to have the opportunity to support the Make-A-Wish foundation," said head coach Stephanie White. "Our coaches and players know that we can make an impact in ways that are bigger than basketball, and teaming up with Make-A-Wish is a perfect example of that."

Papa John's made a \$100 donation to the Make-A-Wish foundation each time the Commodores made a 3-pointer during the final home games in January and all home games throughout February.

# GAME PREVIEW

## TODAY'S MATCHUP: VANDERBILT (15-14) vs. ALABAMA (17-12)



### SCOUTING THE OPPONENT

- ♦ Alabama is the SEC's top rebounding team, averaging 42 rebounds per game.
- ♦ The Tide ranks fifth in the nation in free throws attempted with an SEC-best 677.
- ♦ Ashley Williams leads the conference in blocked shots with 68.
- ♦ Hannah Cook leads the SEC in 3-point percentage (34.6) and 3-pointers (66).
- ♦ The Tide's leading scorer is Meoshonti Knight, who averages 11.3 ppg.

### SERIES HISTORY

- ♦ Wednesday's game will be the 47th all-time meeting between the teams, with Vanderbilt owning a 34-12 lead in the series.
- ♦ Vanderbilt has won five straight match-ups against the Tide, including posting a 87-80 victory this season on Jan. 26 in Nashville (more on that game below).
- ♦ The Commodores have won 17 of the last 18 games in the series and have posted a 30-6 record against the Tide since the start of the 1984-85 season.

## Commodores withstand Tide's comeback, earn SEC win at home

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** - Combining a hot-shooting start with a determined finish, the Vanderbilt women snapped a nine-game losing streak with an 87-80 victory over Alabama, giving head coach Stephanie White her first SEC win, on Jan. 26, 2017.

After building a 20-point lead in the second quarter, the Commodores (11-10, 1-7) withstood a furious third-quarter charge by Alabama (15-6, 3-5) to notch their first victory since a win over Tennessee Tech on Dec. 18. Vanderbilt improved to 19-1 all-time against the Tide at Memorial Gym.

The Commodores went 8-of-10 from 3-point range in the first half and finished 11-of-19 from behind the arc.

Erin Whalen, who made her first career start, scored a game-high 22 points, going 4-of-7 from 3-point range.

Marques Webb recorded her fifth double-double of the season, finishing with 11 points and 12 rebounds, including eight offensive boards. Rachel Bell and Christa Reed added 15 points each, and Kayla Overbeck had 10 points and eight rebounds.

Hannah Cook led Alabama with 17 points. Shaquera Wade had 16.

Vanderbilt, which ranks among the top five in the nation in 3-point percentage, made 5-of-7 shots from behind the arc in the first quarter and went 3-of-3 in the second.

The early hot shooting helped Vanderbilt build a 36-16 lead with 4:01 to play in the second quarter. Whalen played a key role in the Commodores' quick start, scoring 11 first-quarter points, and Bell hit a pair of 3s early in the second quarter to help pad the lead.

But Alabama outscored the Commodores 29-10 during the next 8½ minutes -- closing the first half with a 12-3 run and opening the third period with a 17-7 spurt -- to slice Vanderbilt's lead to 46-45 with 5:29 to play in the period.

Alabama pulled within one point again just over a minute later when Cook hit a pair of free throws. But the Commodores -- who have suffered five last-minute losses in SEC play -- reversed the momentum by putting together a quick 6-0 run, which began with a jumper by Overbeck, to build a 54-47 cushion with 2:14 remaining in the third quarter. Webb eventually closed the period with a buzzer-beating bank shot to give Vanderbilt a 59-52 lead.

The Commodores extended the lead to 68-55 on a jumper by Overbeck with 7:33 to play in the game.



## LOOKING BACK AT 2016 SEC TOURNAMENT (JACKSONVILLE, FLA.)

### Commodores down Bama, UGA before falling to Miss. State in quarters

*Vanderbilt was a No. 11 seed at last year's SEC Tournament and made a surprising run to the quarterfinals. The Commodores rolled past Ole Miss in the first round and stunned Georgia in the second round before losing to Mississippi State in the quarterfinals. Here's a look at the games:*

#### **Vanderbilt 74, Ole Miss 59 (March 2, 2016)**

Fueled by an explosive shooting performance from Christa Reed, the Commodores opened the SEC Tournament with a convincing 74-59 victory over Ole Miss.

Reed finished 8-of-10 from the floor, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range, while scoring a game-high 21 points.

Minta Spears and Marqu'ees Webb had 13 points each and Morgan Batey added 10 for the Commodores, who roared out to an 18-2 lead in the first quarter, owned a 42-19 lead at the half, and were up by as many as 33 points in the third quarter.

Vanderbilt finished 7-of-10 from 3-point range and shot 56.3 percent from the floor.

Ole Miss put together a 20-0 run down the stretch but the surge was not nearly enough for the Rebels.

#### **Vanderbilt 54, Georgia 49, OT (March 2, 2016)**

After some late-minute heroics from Minta Spears in regulation, the No. 11 seeded Commodores defeated No. 6-seeded Georgia, 54-49, in overtime.

Spears sent the game to OT by making three consecutive free throws with one second remaining in the fourth quarter after she was fouled on a 3-point shot. The Commodores (18-13) then outscored Georgia 8-3 in the extra session.

Georgia finished 0-of-12 from 3-point range and shot just 32 percent from the floor.

Vanderbilt's Christa Reed scored a game-high 18 points before fouling out in overtime. Spears added 17 points for the Commodores, who trailed 43-37 with 1:33 remaining in regulation but rallied back to force overtime on Spears' late free throws.

#### **Miss. State 63, Vanderbilt 46 (March 3, 2016)**

Limited to a season-low 37 attempts from the floor, the Commodores saw their SEC Tournament run come to an end in the quarterfinals with a 63-46 loss to 16th-ranked and No. 3-seeded Mississippi State.

Vanderbilt (18-14) shot just 32 percent from the floor and committed 27 turnovers against the Bulldogs (25-6), who entered the tournament ranked fifth in the nation in turnover margin.

The Commodores managed only five field goals in the first half, going 5-of-21, and were then held to only 16 attempts in the second half to finish 12-of-37 from the floor. MSU shot just 40 percent, but attempted 20 more shots than Vanderbilt, finishing 23-of-57.

Rachel Bell scored a team-high 11 points for the Commodores.

## Saluting the Seniors: Webb, Spears leaving lasting legacy

Veteran duo has served as emotional leaders for the Commodores, on and off the floor

Vanderbilt's 66-64 win over Arkansas on Feb. 23 was especially memorable for Minta Spears and Marqu'ees Webb, who played their final regular-season game at Memorial Gym. The two seniors have each left lasting impressions on the Vanderbilt program and they have both overcome injuries to do so.



- ★ Four-year starter for the Commodores who has compiled more than 850 points and 650 rebounds in her career.
- ★ Was a Second Team All-SEC preseason selection this season, and ranks sixth among active players in the SEC in career rebounds.
- ★ Was elected by her peers as the Chair of the SEC's first-ever Leadership Council and was apart of the voting process at NCAA Convention.
- ★ Finished the regular season ranked fifth in the SEC in rebounds per game at 9.0 and fourth in offensive rebounds at 3.3.
- ★ Has played in 118 career games with the Commodores, including making 79 starts.
- ★ Is shooting 55.9 percent from the floor in her career, including 58.5 percent as a junior.
- ★ Has compiled 10 or more rebounds in 20 career games, and has posted six double-doubles this season.



- ★ Has played in 48 career games, including 42 starts, since joining the Vanderbilt program in 2015 as a graduate student.
- ★ Was named to the SEC's Community Service Team and was a nominee for the Allstate GoodWorks Team.
- ★ Has recovered from knee surgery for a fine senior season that has included 40 assists and only 14 turnovers in past 12 games.
- ★ Led the team and ranked ninth in the SEC in minutes played last season, averaging 32.8 minutes per game.
- ★ Was the team leader in both total assists (127) and assists per game (4.0) last season for the Commodores.
- ★ Averaged 13.8 points per game over the final four games of last season, reaching double figures in three of those games.
- ★ Hit three consecutive free throws with one second remaining to send the game to OT in last year's win over Georgia in the SEC Tourney.

## SPEARS SELECTED FOR "SO YOU WANT TO BE A COACH" PROGRAM IN DALLAS

Vanderbilt senior guard Minta Spears has been selected to participate in The Women's Basketball Coaches Association's 15th annual "So You Want To Be A Coach" program. Each selected member will participate in the three-day workshop held during the Final Four from March 29-31 in conjunction with the WBCA Convention in Dallas.

Spears, who joined the Commodore WBB team in May of 2015 after being accepted into grad school, is interested in the possibility of entering the coaching field when she completes her time at Vanderbilt -- and the "So You Want To Be A Coach" program will be a valuable tool in her preparation.



"I've had the unique experience of having four head coaches and close to 20 assistants during my collegiate career, and I've seen the impact coaches can have on their athletes," said Spears, who transferred to Vanderbilt from Texas Tech.

"While I love the X's and O's and the strategy behind the game of basketball, I'm also interested


in how basketball can be used as a platform to connect to the community, teach transferable skills like leadership and teamwork, and develop young people on and off the court to pursue their passions. I'd be honored one day to be a coach and provide opportunities to young women, just as my coaches have done for me."

In order to be considered as a candidate for the "So" program, players have to be nominated by their head coach. Each participant is selected based on her academics, contributions to women's basketball on and off the court and professional résumé, along with other criteria.

## FRESH AND REFRESH

Vanderbilt captured SEC Freshman of the Week honors twice in December, with Erin Whalen and Kayla Overbeck each winning the honor. Overbeck was given the award on Dec. 13 after scoring 18 points and pulling down 13 rebounds -- establishing new career highs in both categories -- during Vanderbilt's 80-72 road win over ETSU. Whalen was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 6 after averaging 17 points per game and shooting 59 percent from the floor -- making 16-of-27 shots -- during Vanderbilt's wins over Air Force, SIUE and Tulane.

Vanderbilt head coach Stephanie White coached barefoot during the game against Alabama to help raise awareness for Soles4Souls. White also coached barefoot during practice earlier in the week.

"Soles4Souls is such a wonderful organization, and we are excited about doing our part to promote and assist them," said White. "My hope is that coaching barefoot will bring awareness to those who don't have the luxury of wearing shoes every day."

Donation boxes for Soles4Souls were available at the game.

Soles4Souls is a not for profit global social enterprise committed to fighting poverty through the collection and distribution of shoes and clothing.

## IMPACTFUL IMPROVEMENTS

The Commodores are on the upswing in numerous categories under the direction of first-year head coach Stephanie White.

\* Through 27 games, Vanderbilt is averaging 69.1 points per game after scoring just 62.5 ppg last season.

\* The Commodores are also making an SEC-best 7.3 three-pointers per game, compared to just 5.4 last season.

\* Vanderbilt is converting 15.8 free throws per game this season after making only 11.4 last season.



## LAST-MINUTE DECISIONS

### *Detailing Vanderbilt's close games in conference play*

*The Commodores have had a series of close games since the start of conference play, with seven of Vanderbilt's 15 SEC games being decided in the final minute. Vanderbilt has gone 2-5 in those seven games, with both of the wins coming in the past two weeks. Prior to that, the Commodores had suffered five last-minute losses that were decided by a combined 21 points -- an average margin of 4.2 points. In all five of those games, Vanderbilt was either in the lead, tied or trailing by three points or less entering the final minute. Here's a closer look at the games:*

#### **Vanderbilt 66, Arkansas 64**

**With one minute remaining:** Vanderbilt led 64-61.

**How it unfolded:** Arkansas' Jessica Jackson knocked down a 3-pointer with 31 seconds remaining to tie the game at 64-64. On Vanderbilt's ensuing possession, Christa Reed missed a 3-pointer, but Erin Whalen pulled the rebound and was fouled. She made both free throws with 0:02.5 seconds remaining, and Arkansas didn't get a shot off on its final possession.

#### **Vanderbilt 70, LSU 68**

**With one minute remaining:** Vanderbilt trailed 68-67.

**How it unfolded:** Following a timeout, Minta Spears found Rebekah Dahlman open in the corner, and Dahlman knocked down a 3-pointer to give Vanderbilt the lead with 27 seconds to play. LSU then had two more possessions, but came up empty each time, including missing two shots in the final six seconds.

#### **Arkansas 59, Vanderbilt 56 (Jan. 19)**

**With one minute remaining:** The score was tied 56-56.

**How it unfolded:** Neither team made a field goal in the final 60 seconds, but Arkansas went 3-of-4 at the foul line to build a 59-56 lead, and Vanderbilt's Rachel Bell missed a desperation 3-pointer at the buzzer on the Commodores' final possession.

#### **Missouri 74, Vanderbilt 68 (Jan. 15)**

**With one minute remaining:** Vanderbilt trailed 66-64.

**How it unfolded:** Rachel Bell's potential go-ahead 3-pointer spun off the rim with 57 seconds to play. Missouri then made eight free throws down the stretch to hold off the Commodores.

#### **Auburn 64, Vanderbilt 59 (Jan. 12)**

**With one minute remaining:** Vanderbilt trailed 61-59.

**How it unfolded:** Vanderbilt's Rebekah Dahlman missed a 3-pointer with 46 seconds to go, and Cierra Walker missed a 3-pointer with 29 seconds to play. Auburn's Brandy Montgomery went 3-of-4 from the foul line in the final 21 seconds to seal the win for the Tigers.

#### **Georgia 70, Vanderbilt 68 (Jan. 8)**

**With one minute remaining:** Vanderbilt led 68-65.

**How it unfolded:** Georgia scored the game's last five points, beginning with a game-tying three-point play with 54 seconds remaining. Vanderbilt then missed a contested layup on its ensuing possession, and Stephanie Paul's short jumper with three-tenths of a second to play was the game-winner for Georgia.

#### **Texas A&M 77, Vanderbilt 72 (Jan. 2)**

**With one minute remaining:** Vanderbilt trailed 72-69.

**How it unfolded:** The Commodores pulled within 73-72 after freshman Erin Whalen knocked down a 3-pointer with 33 seconds to play, but Vanderbilt didn't score again the rest of the way. The Aggies sealed the win with four straight free throws.

### **Hands on: 'Dores spend off day on the farm**

The Vanderbilt WBB team had a day off from practice on Jan. 31, but the Commodores still put in some work. And they were glad to do it.

Showing their continued commitment to being involved in the community, the Commodores volunteered at the Hands On Nashville farm, harvesting vegetables for The Nashville Food Project.

"It was a lot of hard work, but we really enjoyed it," said Vanderbilt freshman guard Kaleigh Clemons-Green.

"For me, it was a totally new experience because I haven't really been exposed to the organic side of life. But I was so glad that I was able to be a part of it. It took me out of my comfort zone -- in a good way."

Hands On Nashville is an organization that works to meet community needs through volunteerism. Annually, Hands On Nashville connects thousands of volunteers to support the needs of schools, nonprofits, community centers, libraries and more.

As Middle Tennessee's volunteer resource center, Hands On Nashville builds stronger communities through service.

The Vanderbilt WBB players did their part by helping winterize the farm, which included pulling up bermuda grass, making new walkways, and harvesting turnips and carrots.

"It was a great experience," said senior guard Minta Spears, "and I have a new appreciation for the people of Hands on Nashville." It was awesome to see how what we helped with will go directly to people in the Nashville community through the Nashville Food Project."

The Vanderbilt women's staff isn't the only collection of standouts on campus. The men's coaching staff combined to score a total of 5,486 collegiate points: Bryce Drew (Valparaiso) 2,142; Casey Shaw (Toledo) 1,562; Roger Powell, Jr. (Illinois) 1,178; and Jake Diebler (Valparaiso) 586.

## Signing Day Success

Comprising the inaugural signing class of Vanderbilt first-year head coach Stephanie White, a pair of highly-rated recruits -- Autumn Newby and Chelsie Hall -- signed National Letters of Intent with the Vanderbilt women's basketball team this November.

Newby is a 6-2 forward from Archer High in Lawrenceville, Ga., who averaged 12.7 points and 12.6 rebounds per game last season. Hall is a 5-7 point guard from Seffner Christian Academy in Tampa, Fla., who averaged 21.2 points per game last year.

Together, the two players form a signing class that was ranked No. 23 in the nation by BlueStar Report. (Newby was ranked by BlueStar as the No. 20 overall prospect and Hall was ranked No. 28).

## Vanderbilt drops regular-season finale at LSU

*Cold-shooting Commodores come up short, remain winless on Tigers' home floor since 2004*

**BATON ROUGE** -- The Vanderbilt women haven't had much luck in Louisiana in recent years, and that didn't change on Sunday.

Playing their regular-season finale at LSU, the Commodores were limited to 18 field goals and suffered a 64-58 loss to the Tigers.

Vanderbilt (14-15, 4-12), which came into the day having won three of its past four games, struggled against LSU's pressure and committed 24 turnovers in the loss.

Rachel Bell scored a team-high 17 points, and Minta Spears added 13 points and nine rebounds for the Commodores, who have now dropped seven straight on LSU's home floor.

Vanderbilt hasn't earned a victory at the Maravich Center since Feb. 19, 2004.

Alexis Hyder and Raigyne Moncrief had 17 points apiece for the Tigers (19-10, 8-8), and Chloe Jackson added 15.

Vanderbilt finished 18-of-43 from the floor, including 8-of-23 from 3-point range.

LSU closed the third quarter with an 11-3 run to build a 44-40 lead, and the Tigers stayed in front throughout the final 10 minutes, never allowing VU to get closer than four points.

The Commodores had a chance to narrow the gap to three with 37 seconds to play, but Spears -- one of VU's best free throw shooters -- missed the back end of a two-shot foul.

Trailing 31-27 at the half, the Commodores opened the third quarter with a 9-2 run. Kaleigh Clemons-Green hit a 3-pointer from the corner that gave the Commodores their first lead of the game, 34-33, with 6:30 to play in the third quarter.

NASHVILLE (AP) --Vanderbilt's new-look offense hit a couple of speed bumps Friday night, but it was mostly a smooth ride for the Commodores in Stephanie White's debut as head coach.

Paced by Rebekah Dahlman's 19 points, Vanderbilt rolled to an 86-54 victory over Kennesaw State in the season opener for both teams. The Commodores scored almost half their points from behind the 3-point arc, making 14 shots from long range in the win.

Marqu'es Webb had a big night for the Commodores (1-0) inside, going 6-of-6 from the floor and producing a double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds.

Vanderbilt committed 18 turnovers, but shoot the ball effectively enough to overcome the miscues.

The Commodores were 8-of-11 from 3-point range in the second half -- 72.7 percent -- and finished 14-of-26 (53.8 percent) for the game. Overall, 10 players reached the scoring column for Vanderbilt, and the Commodores compiled 24 assists on 31 field goals.

It was just the type of offensive performance that White was expected to bring to Vanderbilt in her inaugural season.

After spending the past two seasons as the head coach of the WNBA's Indiana Fever, she is implementing an up-tempo style with the Commodores, who sprinted out to a 23-12 lead at the end of the first quarter against the Owls (0-1) and stretched the lead to 42-20 at the half.

Clara Young and Allison Johnson finished with 15 points each to pace Kennesaw State.

Vanderbilt's touted five-member freshmen class combined for 38 points in their Commodore debuts: Erin Whalen had 11 points, Kaleigh Clemmons-Green had nine, LeaLea Carter had seven, Cierra Walker had six and Kayla Overbeck had five.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. -- Stephanie White picked a tough place -- even though it was familiar territory -- to have her first road game as head coach at Vanderbilt.

Traveling to Bloomington, Ind., the Commodores suffered a 94-61 loss to the No. 23 Hoosiers on Sunday afternoon. It was the 16th consecutive home win for the Hoosiers, who went 14-0 at Assembly Hall last season.

Indiana's Alexis Gassion scored a team-high 22 points and Amanda Cahill added 17 for the Hoosiers (2-0). For Vanderbilt (1-1), Rachel Bell had 11 points and Marqu'es Webb had nine before fouling out.

White, the first-year Vanderbilt head coach, had a big gathering of friends, family and fans at the game. She came to Vanderbilt after spending the past six seasons with the WNBA's Indiana Fever, including the past two as head coach. She also was a fan favorite in Indiana during her playing career, when she was Miss Indiana Basketball as a high school player and was the national player of the year during her career at Purdue.

But Sunday's homecoming didn't go as well as White had hoped for her young Commodores, who have five freshmen that are seeing significant playing time. Vanderbilt shot just 36 percent from the floor, and never owned the lead in the game.

"We didn't play very relaxed basketball today," said White. "Indiana is a very good team, and they played exceptionally well in the second half. But have to do a better job of playing our game, and not letting the opponent dictate the game."

With Webb and Bell providing the bulk of the scoring punch, the Commodores stayed within striking distance for much of the first half, and trailed only 35-31 after a bucket by Webb with 4:40 to play in the second quarter.

Then Indiana made its move.

The Hoosiers put together a quick 13-4 run -- which featured a 3-point play by Gassion and a three-pointer by Cahill -- to extend the lead to 48-35, and the Hoosiers carried a 50-38 lead into the locker room.

Indiana then opened the second half with a 12-0 surge, fueled by three 3-pointers, to take command, 62-38. Overall, it was a 27-7 run by the Hoosiers.

**NASHVILLE** -- The Vanderbilt freshmen continue to be impressive, but it was an upperclassman who made the biggest impact in the Commodores' win on Wednesday night.

Rebekah Dahlman, a redshirt junior, scored a career-high 25 points -- including going 15-of-18 at the foul line -- to help Vanderbilt fight off Drexel, 73-63, at Memorial Gym. The Commodores closed the game on a 10-1 run over the final 2:28 to stretch a one-point lead into the double-digit victory.

Marqu'es Webb finished with 12 rebounds, and freshman Kayla Overbeck had 10 points and six rebounds for Vanderbilt (2-1), which bounced back in strong fashion from Sunday's 94-61 road loss to No. 23 Indiana. Sarah Curran scored 19 points for Drexel (2-1), and Jessica Pellechio had 18.

Dahlman battled flu-like symptoms earlier in the week and had to miss practice. But she showed no signs of illness against Drexel, logging 33 minutes of playing time and filling up the stat sheet with six rebounds and five assists to go with her 25 points.

Christa Reed added 10 points, including a couple of big baskets in the fourth quarter that helped the Commodores hold off the Dragons.

Drexel finished 9-of-35 from 3-point range (25.7 percent). The Dragons finished just 2-of-3 at the line in the loss.

Vanderbilt fell behind 11-2 in the first 3½ minutes of the first quarter and trailed 19-15 at the end of period. The Dragons owned an eight-point lead late in the second quarter, but the Commodores closed the period on a 10-0 run to take a 34-32 lead at the half. Overbeck capped the surge with a short jumper with six seconds remaining in the period to give Vanderbilt its first lead of the night.

That set the stage for an intense second half during which the teams were never separated by more than five points until the final three minutes. Drexel took a one-point lead on two occasions in the fourth quarter, and the Dragons trailed only 63-62 with 2:28 to play.

Dahlman then provided one of the night's biggest plays when she converted a 3-point play with 1:39 remaining to extend Vanderbilt's lead to 66-62. The Commodores sealed the win by making 7-of-8 free throws in the final 51 seconds. Vanderbilt finished 22-of-29 at the foul line.

**NASHVILLE** -- The Vanderbilt women faced a distinctive height disadvantage on Sunday. But it didn't prevent the Commodores from winning the rebounding battle -- or, more importantly, from winning the game.

Hosting a Duke team that has size to spare, the Commodores made a series of big plays down the stretch and notched a 77-73 victory over the previously undefeated Devils.

Christa Reed scored a game-high 19 points, and Marqu'es Webb added 10 points and matched her career high with 13 rebounds -- her third double-digit rebounding effort of the season -- for the Commodores (3-1). Cierra Walker and Rachel Bell had 12 points each, and Rebekah Dahlman had 11.

Lexie Brown led Duke (4-1) with 21 points, and Rebecca Greenwell added 17 for the RV/RV Devils.

The game was tied 71-71 after a pair of free throws by Brown with 1:16 to play in the fourth quarter. From there, the Commodores' defense came up huge -- including a pivotal steal by Reed with 1:01 to go -- to help Vanderbilt get to the finish line.

Webb hit a pair of free throws with 48 seconds left to give Vanderbilt a 73-71 lead, and the Commodores stayed in front of there. Vanderbilt secured the win with a couple of big rebounds, one on the defensive end by Webb with 26 seconds to play, followed by an offensive rebound by Walker -- after her own missed free throw -- with 23 seconds to go.

The Commodores made only 4-of-8 free throws in the final 23 seconds, but that proved to be just enough.

Neither team made a field goal in the final 2:06 of the fourth quarter.

Vanderbilt, which led 35-32 at the half, earned the win in large part due to a relentless effort on the glass. The Commodores collected 18 offensive rebounds in the game, and out-rebounded Duke 43-34 overall despite being outsized.

Duke had five players see action who are listed as 6-2 or taller, including a pair of 6-4 players (Oderah Chidom and Erin Mathias) in the starting lineup. Vanderbilt, by comparison, doesn't have any players taller than 6-1 on the roster.

NASHVILLE -- It hasn't taken long for first-year head coach Stephanie White and the five freshmen on her roster to catch on to the concept of Memorial Magic.

With a 75-59 victory over Robert Morris on Tuesday, the Commodores (4-1) grabbed their third home victory in the span off six days -- a stretch that also included wins over Duke and Drexel -- and improved to 4-0 at home overall.

The game, which was the first-ever meeting between Vanderbilt and Robert Morris (3-2), tipped off at 11:30 a.m. as the Commodores held their annual Education Day contest. A large collection of local schools attended the game.

Rachel Bell scored a game-high 20 points for Vanderbilt, and freshman Kayla Overbeck added 15 points, finishing 7-of-8 from the floor. Rebekah Dahlman had 11 points and Marqu'es Webb pulled down a game-high eight rebounds.

Vanderbilt has now won 13 consecutive non-conference games at Memorial Gym, and has posted a 49-3 record against non-con foes since the start of the 2010-11 campaign. Dating back to the start of the 2002-03 season, VU owns a 99-8 record on its home floor in regular-season, non-conference games, including an 18-1 mark since the start of the 2014-15 season.

Tuesday's win was methodical in nature, with the Commodores building a seven-point lead at the end of the first quarter and then gradually extending the lead from there. Vanderbilt led 38-26 at the half and built its largest lead of the game, 51-33, near the midway mark of the third quarter. Vanderbilt maintained a double-digit lead the rest of the way.

The Commodores shot the ball effectively, especially from long range and at the foul line. They finished 12-of-14 from the foul line (85.7 percent) and were 9-of-21 behind the arc (42.9 percent). Vanderbilt shot 48 percent from the floor overall.

Robert Morris senior guard Anna Niki Stamolamprou, the No. 5 all-time scorer in the Colonials' history, finished with a team-high 18 points. Stamolamprou, who came into the game averaging 15 points per contest, was 8-of-16 from the floor.

NASHVILLE -- With Sunday's game hanging in the balance, Rachel Bell came up big -- on both ends of the floor.

Bell scored 14 points in the fourth quarter and also came up with a crucial blocked shot in the final five seconds to help Vanderbilt escape past UT Martin, 79-77. Bell finished with a team-high 22 points for the Commodores (5-1), who won their fourth straight game.

Bell made 5-of-6 shots from the floor in the fourth quarter, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range.

Rebekah Dahlman finished with 17 points while helping Vanderbilt stretch its winning streak in the series to 11 games. The Commodores finished 13-of-22 from 3-point range.

Emanye Robertson scored a game-high 23 points for UT Martin (1-5).

The Commodores owned a 76-70 lead with 2:38 to play after two free throws by Christa Reed, but UT Martin used a 7-2 run to pull within 78-77 with 39 seconds left. UT Martin's Kendall Spray, who is ranked among the national leaders in 3-point proficiency, appeared to have an open look from long range with five seconds remaining, but Bell stepped up and blocked the shot.

Vanderbilt's Cierra Walker then hit the back end of two free throws with 1.1 seconds remaining to give the Commodores a 79-77 lead. On UT Martin's final possession, Emanye Robertson missed a contested shot under the basket.

"I am proud of our team for gutting it out and finding a way to win," said first-year head coach Stephanie White, who posted her first road win with the Commodores. "This was a chance for us to learn and get better. And hopefully that's what we did."

The intense game featured 11 lead changes and five ties.

Vanderbilt appeared to be pulling away early in the second half, building a nine-point lead in the first two minutes of the third quarter. But UT Martin roared back to take a six-point lead early in the fourth quarter.

Bell then brought the Commodores back with a series of big shots. She made a pair of pivotal 3-pointers in the final six minutes, and her jumper in the paint with 50 seconds to play gave Vanderbilt a 78-74 lead.

**USAF Academy, Colo.** -- Freshman Erin Whalen was hot from the floor and fellow freshman Kayla Overbeck was hot from the foul line on Friday night. Together they helped lead Vanderbilt to a 75-49 win over Air Force in the opening round of the Air Force Classic.

Whalen finished 7-of-8 from the floor and scored a season-high 19 points. Overbeck added 15 points, making 11-of-13 free throws, and hauled in seven rebounds to help the Commodores (6-1) extend their winning streak to five games. Whalen fouled out in the fourth quarter, but by then, the Commodores were in command.

Rachel Bell finished with 10 points and six rebounds. Kailin Davis had with 17 points for Air Force (1-6).

The Commodores owned a 34-23 lead at the half and then opened the second half with a quick 6-0 run to extend the lead to 17. Vanderbilt went on to outscore Air Force 24-14 in the period to build a 58-37 lead, with Whalen capping the quarter with a buzzer-beating 3-pointer from the corner.

"I was much more pleased with our energy in the second half," said first-year head coach Stephanie White. "And as for Erin, she had a good week of practice, and I was really happy to see that carry over to the game tonight. She played really well."

Vanderbilt's Marqu'es Webb had a game-high eight rebounds, including pulling down the 500th of her career early in the first quarter.

Whalen filled out the stat sheet with five rebounds, two steals and an assist to go with her 19 points.

The Commodores -- playing without leading scorer Rebekah Dahlman (hamstring injury) -- shot just 33 percent from the floor in the first half and 42 percent for the game. They were especially cold from long range, making just 2-of-11 shots. But Vanderbilt made up for that at the foul line, finishing 27-of-32 (84.4 percent) to continue their season-long trend of effective work from the line.

The Commodore defense also played a key role in the victory, limiting Air Force to just 27 percent shooting.

The teams combined for 57 free throws in the game, with VU making 27-of-32 and Air Force going 15-of-25.

**USAF Academy, Colo.** --- Fueled by freshman Cierra Walker's explosive performance, the Vanderbilt women captured the first championship of the Stephanie White Era on Saturday afternoon.

Vanderbilt fans hope, and expect, there will be many more to come.

Walker scored 21 points, making 5-of-7 shots from 3-point range, to help the Commodores defeat Southern Illinois-Edwardsville 73-63 in the championship game of the Air Force Classic.

Walker also had a season-high six rebounds and added four assists while logging 37 minutes of playing time for the Commodores (7-1), who stretched their winning streak to six games.

Vanderbilt closed the game on a 9-1 run in the final 2:03 to pull away from the Cougars (2-5) in a tight contest that featured nine lead changes and eight ties.

The Commodores finished 12-of-25 from 3-point range. Walker played a big role in the outside attack, including going 4-of-6 from long range in the first half.

Three other Commodores also reached double figures in the win: Christa Reed had 13 points, Erin Whalen added 12 and Rachel Bell had 10. Whalen and Bell both made the All-Tournament team.

Donshel Beck had 14 points for SIUE (2-5). Marqu'es Webb had 10 rebounds for the Commodores.

Vanderbilt committed 18 turnovers and lost the rebounding battle, 47-37, including surrendering 23 offensive boards to the Cougars. But the Commodores were able to offset those issues with the strong outside shooting.

"I was very disappointed in our effort and our energy in the first half," said White, the first-year head coach. "But I was pleased to see that we found a way to win. We've got some things that we need to clean up, but it's a process."

Perhaps the biggest 3-pointer of the game belonged to Bell, who knocked down a jumper from the corner with 1:13 to play to give Vanderbilt a 69-62 lead. Reed also made a key 3-pointer near the midway mark of the fourth quarter to help the Commodores fend off SIUE.

Erupting for 30 points in the final 10 minutes, the Commodores downed Tulane 74-63 on Monday night and extended their winning streak to seven games. Rachel Bell scored 14 points to lead five players in double figures for Vanderbilt (8-1), and Marqu'es Webb pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds. Morgan poured in 34 points, going 14-of-26 from the floor, for Tulane (5-3). She also had seven rebounds and five steals. But Vanderbilt overcame Morgan's heroics by generating a dominating second-half performance, during which the Commodores outscored Tulane 48-30. Vanderbilt was especially sharp in the fourth quarter, making 10-of-17 shots from the floor, including 5-of-7 from 3-point range. For the period, Vanderbilt outscored Tulane, 30-18. The Commodores trailed by as many as 10 points in the first half and were down 45-44 entering the fourth quarter. But Cierra Walker's 3-point-er in the opening minute of the fourth quarter gave Vanderbilt the lead for good. Christa Reed finished with 13 points and Walker had 12 points, going 4-of-7 from 3-point range. Kayla Overbeck added 11 points and eight rebounds, and Erin Whalen scored 10 points and had a team-high four assists for the Commodores, who were playing their third game in the span of four days. (Vanderbilt won the Air Force Classic on Saturday with a win over SIUE after defeating Air Force on Friday). Vanderbilt's defense limited Tulane to 37 percent shooting from the floor (26-of-70). The Green Wave entered the night shooting 48 percent from the floor -- which ranked among the top 15 in the nation. The Commodores also kept Tulane off the free throw line, as the Green Wave finished just 4-of-6.

**JOHNSON CITY, Tenn.** -- Freshman Kayla Overbeck had 18 points and 13 rebounds -- establishing new career highs in both categories -- to help Vanderbilt earn an 80-72 road win over ETSU on Thursday night. The victory enabled the Commodores (9-1) to extend their winning streak to eight games. Christa Reed scored a team-high 20 points and Rachel Bell added 19 for the Commodores, who withstood an explosive performance by ETSU's Tianna Tarter. The junior guard scored a game-high 35 points, going 15-of-28 from the floor, for the Bucs (5-5). Vanderbilt dominated the glass during the comeback victory, winning the rebounding battle 53-27. The Commodores trailed by as many as 12 points in the first quarter and were behind 50-43 with 6:58 left in the third. But Vanderbilt charged back with a 14-2 run -- which started with a jumper and a 3-pointer from Cierra Walker -- to take a 57-52 lead with 1:07 left in the quarter. Miaya Seawright helped fuel the surge with a 3-pointer from the corner that gave the Commodores their first lead of the night, 51-50, with 4:53 remaining in the period. After a pair of lead changes, Vanderbilt carried a 59-57 lead into the fourth quarter, and the Commodores stayed in front from there, outscoring ETSU 21-15 in the final 10 minutes. Vanderbilt made just four field goals in the fourth quarter, but went 12-of-15 from the foul line. VU finished 25-of-31 from the foul line for the game, while ETSU was 8-of-19. Overbeck scored eight points and pulled down five rebounds in the fourth quarter, and Reed went 5-of-6 from the foul line in the final 10 minutes to help the Commodores secure the win. For the night, Vanderbilt's bench outscored ETSU's reserves, 30-4. The Commodores now have a long break for exams before playing their next game on Dec. 18, hosting Tennessee Tech.

NASHVILLE -- Sunday was filled with career highs for the Vanderbilt women, but the Commodores endured a scary moment, too.

Christa Reed scored 25 points, Erin Whalen added 23 and LeaLea Carter had 18 -- new career highs for all three -- to help the Commodores extend their winning streak to nine games with an 89-57 victory over Tennessee Tech at Memorial Gym. Whalen also pulled down a career-best 11 rebounds for Vanderbilt (10-1). Yaktavia Hickson led all scorers with 31 points for Tennessee Tech (3-8).

The Commodores played much of the second half without senior star Marqu'ees Webb, who was taken off the floor on a stretcher after a collision. The extent of Webb's injury was not known after the game, and head coach Stephanie White said the team would have more information on Monday after Webb was evaluated.

Vanderbilt owned a 17-16 lead after the first quarter, but then dominated the next 10 minutes, outscoring Tennessee Tech 28-6 to carry a 45-22 lead into the half.

The Commodores -- who were playing their first game since Dec. 8 -- opened the second quarter with a 15-2 run and finished 9-of-15 from the floor and 9-of-10 from the foul line during the period. The Commodores capped the quarter with a no-look pass from Cierra Walker to Whalen for a layup in the final minute.

Vanderbilt, which came into the game as the SEC leaders in 3-point percentage and ranked No. 2 in the conference in free throw percentage, went 18-of-21 from the foul line (85.7 percent) and 7-of-19 (36.8 percent) from 3-point range in the win.

The game was a homecoming for Tennessee Tech first-year head coach Kim Rosamond, who was an assistant coach at Vanderbilt for nine years.

Reed scored her 25 points while going 10-of-12 from the floor. She also pulled down six rebounds. Carter, a freshman, was 8-of-12 from the floor and had seven rebounds. Carter's 18 points easily surpassed her previous season high of seven, which she had done twice this season.

NASHVILLE (AP) -- Myisha Hines-Allen, the ACC player of the year last season and preseason pick to repeat, scored 24 points and had a career-high 15 rebounds to help No. 8-ranked Louisville hold off Vanderbilt 78-66.

"That's something that we're going to need," Louisville coach Jeff Walz said. "She has the ability to do that every night. I mean that's what she did the entire ACC season all last year. Now we're going to need that consistency from her."

Rachel Bell scored 21 points for Vanderbilt (10-2), which saw its nine-game winning streak end. Cierra Walker added 12 points, and LeaLea Carter and Kayla Overbeck each had 10.

Walker opened the fourth with a 3-pointer that pulled Vanderbilt within 58-56. But Hines-Allen scored the next five points as Louisville (12-2) finally got some breathing room against the Commodores. Louisville pushed the lead to double digits on a layup by Durr with 44 seconds left.

Hines-Allen had 12 rebounds and hit six of eight shots by halftime, and she played 39 minutes in helping Louisville win its sixth straight. She notched her third double-double in the past seven games. Now the Cardinals can have a few days off before their ACC opener on Dec. 29.

"It feels good going into this break and just knowing that we have Syracuse coming back up, so we can't get too lackadaisical on this break," Hines-Allen said. "We still have to work and get better because there are some things we have to improve on."

Asia Durr added 16 points for the Cardinals.

The teams swapped the lead four times in the opening minutes before Briahanna Jackson's layup broke a 7-7 tie with 7 minutes to go to give Louisville the lead for good.

Bell scored eight straight, including the first seven of the third quarter, to pull Vanderbilt within 48-45. Sydney Zambrotta hit a 3-pointer for Louisville's first bucket of the quarter with 7:24 to go to pad the lead. Louisville led 58-53 after an ugly third quarter

**MEMPHIS, Tenn.** — Hampered by foul trouble and uncharacteristic cold shooting, the Vanderbilt women suffered a 75-59 road loss to Memphis on Wednesday.

The Commodores (10-3), playing their final non-conference game before SEC play, shot just 35 percent from the floor, including going 4-of-13 (30 percent) from 3-point range. Vanderbilt came into the game shooting an SEC-best 41 percent from behind the arc.

Kayla Overbeck, Cierra Walker, Erin Whalen and Kaleigh Clemons-Green all fouled out for the Commodores, who trailed 43-27 at the half and were unable to cut the deficit under 10 in the second half.

Cheyenne Creighton had 26 points and 13 rebounds, new career highs in both categories, for Memphis (7-6). Whalen finished with a team-high 14 points for Vanderbilt.

Memphis missed 20 free throws -- finishing 14-of-34 -- but made up for it with some surprisingly effective outside shooting, making 7-of-16 shots from 3-point range. The Tigers came into the game shooting just 26 percent from behind the arc for the season, and were averaging only 3.0 three-pointers per game.

Three Memphis players combined to score 55 of the Tigers' 75 points. In addition to Creighton's 26 points, Brea Elmore added 18 and Breigha Wilder-Cochran added 11.

The Commodores collected just six offensive rebounds, and five of those came in the fourth quarter.

Memphis put together an early 14-0 run to build a 16-4 lead with 3:32 left in the first quarter and owned a 43-27 lead at the half. Vanderbilt used a 10-3 surge to trim the margin to 47-37 with 3:40 to play in the third quarter, but Memphis pushed the lead back to 14 at the end of the quarter, and never allowed Vanderbilt to get closer than 12 points in the final 10 minutes.

**COLLEGE STATION** -- Texas A&M used a balanced scoring attack and a big fourth-quarter surge to down Vanderbilt, 77-72, on Monday night.

Five players finished in double figures for the Aggies (11-3, 1-0), led by Anriel Howard and Jasmine Lumpkin with 17 points each.

Texas A&M outscored Vanderbilt 27-15 in the final 10 minutes to erase the Commodores' seven-point lead and send Vanderbilt (10-4, 0-1) to its third straight loss.

Freshman Kayla Overbeck had 13 points and seven rebounds for Vanderbilt and fellow freshman Kaleigh Clemons-Green added a career-high 13 points. Christa Reed and Rachel Bell had 10 each for the Commodores in the SEC debut for head coach Stephanie White.

Vanderbilt trailed by six in the fourth quarter but battled back to trim the deficit to 73-72 on a 3-pointer by Erin Whalen with 32 seconds to play. But that proved to be the final points for the Commodores, and Texas A&M sealed the deal with four straight free throws.

The Commodores led by as much as 13 points early in the third quarter, but Texas A&M chipped away for the remainder of the period and then put together a surge in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter to move in front for good.

Vanderbilt owned a 35-26 lead at the half, thanks in large part to some impressive play from the Commodore freshmen, who combined for 26 points in the first 20 minutes. Overbeck lead the way, going 5-of-7 from the floor and scoring 12 points.

**NASHVILLE** -- Unable to overcome a cold-shooting first quarter, the Vanderbilt women fell to rival Tennessee, 70-57, on Thursday night at Memorial Gym.

The Commodores (10-5, 0-2), who dropped their fourth straight game, made just 3-of-14 shots from the floor in the opening 10 minutes, and trailed 20-7 at the end of first quarter. Vanderbilt played even with the Lady Vols (10-4, 2-0) the rest of the way, but could not erase the early deficit.

All five starters finished in double figures for the Lady Vols, who won their sixth straight game. Diamond DeShields led Tennessee with 16 points and Mercedes Russell posted a double-double with 15 points and 13 rebounds.

Jaime Nared added 12 points, Jordan Reynolds had 11 and Meme Jackson had 10 to help the Lady Vols defeat the Commodores for the sixth consecutive time.

For Vanderbilt, freshman LeaLea Carter continued her recent surge. She scored a game-high 17 points, representing her third double-digit showing in the past five games. Fellow freshman Cierra Walker added 10 points, and Marqu'ees Webb had 11 rebounds and five points.

The Commodores finished just 19-of-55 from the floor (34.5 percent) and were forced into 21 turnovers while being held to their lowest point total of the season.

Tennessee also endured a tough night from the floor, going 22-of-62 (35.5 percent). But the Lady Vols were 21-of-27 at the foul line (77.8 percent), compared to Vanderbilt's 14-of-22 (63.6).

**ATHENS, Ga.** -- Stephanie Paul's short jumper with three-tenths of a second to play was the difference maker for Georgia on Sunday afternoon. But that's not the only shot that will haunt Vanderbilt in its 70-68 loss in Athens.

The Commodores, normally one of the SEC's best free-throw shooting teams, made just 18-of-30 attempts from the line, and the missed opportunities proved costly, as Vanderbilt (10-6, 0-3) dropped its fifth straight game.

Shanea Armbrister finished with a team-high 18 points for Georgia (10-6, 2-1), and Pachis Roberts added 13 points and nine rebounds. Paul came off the bench to score 12 points -- including the game-winner in the paint -- and Caliya Robinson had 10.

Kayla Overbeck and Marqu'ees Webb had 12 points each for Vanderbilt. Cierra Walker and Rachel Bell added 10 points each.

Vanderbilt owned a 68-65 lead after an offensive putback by Webb with 1:18 to play in the fourth quarter, but Georgia scored the game's final five points, beginning with a three-point play by Roberts that tied the game with 54 seconds remaining.

Vanderbilt then missed a contested layup on its ensuing possession, and Georgia grabbed the rebound. The Lady Dogs held the ball for the last shot, and Paul got free in the lane to score the decisive basket just as the horn sounded, setting off a big celebration by the Georgia players and fans.

After watching a replay, the officials put three-tenths of a second back on the clock, but Vanderbilt was unable to get a shot off on the game's final play.

Vanderbilt finished 8-of-15 from 3-point range in the loss, and out-rebounded the Lady Bulldogs, 42-38, despite being outsized.

**NASHVILLE --** The Vanderbilt women went cold at the wrong time Thursday night.

After building a 17-point lead in the third quarter, the Commodores struggled late against Auburn's pressure defense and suffered a 64-59 loss at Memorial Gym.

The Commodores (10-7, 0-4), who dropped their sixth straight game, were outscored 22-10 in the fourth quarter by the Tigers (13-5, 3-1). Vanderbilt made just 4-of-12 shots from the floor, including going 0-of-5 from 3-point range, in the final 10 minutes.

Janiah McKay's layup gave Auburn a 61-59 lead with 59 seconds to play, and the Tigers held on for the win by making 3-of-4 free throws down the stretch.

Freshman Kayla Overbeck finished with a double-double for Vanderbilt with 16 points and 10 rebounds. Auburn's Katie Frerking had a game-high 18 points, and Brandy Montgomery scored 14 of her 16 points in the fourth quarter to help fuel the Tigers' comeback.

Rachel Bell also scored 16 points for the Commodores, who led 53-46 with 6:54 to play in the fourth quarter before Auburn closed the game on an 18-8 run to steal the win. The Tigers have now won four straight against Vanderbilt, including the past three match-ups in Nashville.

"We saw glimpses tonight of the way we want to play," said Vanderbilt first-year head coach Stephanie White. "But we can't just keep making the same mistakes over and over again."

Auburn, which ranks No. 3 in the nation in turnovers forced per game, forced Vanderbilt into 24 turnovers. The disruptive defense enabled the Tigers to overcome a poor shooting performance. Auburn missed its first 13 attempts from 3-point range, and went just 2-of-17 from long range for the game.

**NASHVILLE --** Vanderbilt and Missouri combined to attempt 52 shots from 3-point range on Sunday afternoon. So it was only fitting that the game's biggest shot came from beyond the arc.

With the Commodores owning a one-point lead with just over a minute to play, Missouri's Amber Smith knocked down a 3-pointer that gave the Tigers the lead for good in an eventual 74-68 victory over Vanderbilt.

Missouri (12-7, 2-3), which finished 13-of-28 from 3-point range, closed the game on a 13-4 run over the final 2:15 to send the Commodores (10-8, 0-5) to their seventh straight loss.

The game featured 16 ties and 12 lead changes, and the teams were never separated by more than six points after the first quarter.

Sierra Michaelis finished with a game-high 19 points for the Tigers, who snapped a three-game losing streak.

Freshman Kayla Overbeck led the Commodores with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Senior Marqu'es Webb also registered a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds for Vanderbilt, which went 10-of-24 from 3-point range in the loss.

The Commodores trailed 61-56 with 4:24 to play in the fourth quarter before putting together an 8-0 run -- capped by a pair of free throws by Webb -- to take a 64-61 lead with 2:15 to go. But Missouri answered with five quick points, including Smith's go-ahead 3-pointer with 1:17 to play, to take a 66-64 edge.

On Vanderbilt's ensuing possession, Rachel Bell's open 3-pointer spun off the rim, and Smith pulled the defensive rebound. Cierra Porter then made two free throws with 27 seconds remaining to push Missouri's lead to four, and the Tigers made six straight free throws down the stretch to seal the win.

**FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. --** The Vanderbilt women were saddled with another last-minute loss on Thursday night.

Continuing a theme that has followed them since the start of conference play, the Commodores delivered a gritty effort but came up short on the scoreboard, falling to Arkansas, 59-56, at Bud Walton Arena. It was the eighth consecutive loss for Vanderbilt (10-9, 0-6).

The Commodores owned a 56-53 lead after a layup by Marqu'es Webb with 2:58 remaining, but Vanderbilt went scoreless the rest of the way, and Arkansas (13-6, 2-4) closed the game on a 6-0 run to steal the win.

Malica Monk made 1-of-2 free throws with 10.2 seconds remaining to give the Razorbacks a 57-56 lead. The Commodores then came up empty on their ensuing possession, and Arkansas' Devin Cosper hit two more free throws with four seconds to play to extend the Razorbacks' lead to 59-56.

On Vanderbilt's final possession, Rachel Bell's desperation 3-point attempt was off the mark as the buzzer sounded.

The Commodores' 0-6 mark in the conference has included five games that were decided by a combined 21 points. Each of the five defeats was decided in the game's final minute.

"We seem to get to a certain part of the ballgame where we just clam up," said head coach Stephanie White. "And the teams in this league are just waiting to pounce. Tonight, Arkansas made the hustle plays that made the difference in the game."

Jailyn Mason finished with a game-high 17 points for Arkansas, and Devin Cosper had 11.

Marqu'es Webb had a double-double for Vanderbilt, finishing with 10 points and 11 rebounds. Christa Reed had 12 points, and Bell added 11.

**KNOXVILLE, Tenn. --** The Vanderbilt women had a tough start and a rough finish on Sunday during a 91-63 loss to rival Tennessee.

The Commodores (10-10, 0-7), who dropped their ninth straight game, were outscored 30-12 in the first quarter and were down 56-29 at the half. Vanderbilt used a late surge in the third quarter to narrow the deficit to 15 points, but the Lady Vols (12-7, 3-3) finished strong, outscoring Vanderbilt 25-12 in the final 10 minutes.

Tennessee has now won seven straight match-ups against Vanderbilt, and the Commodores fell to 0-32 all-time on the Lady Vols' home floor.

The Lady Vols opened the game with a 10-2 run, pushed the lead to 18-5 near the midway mark of the quarter, and owned a 25-7 advantage after a 3-pointer by Jaime Nared with 3:47 left in the period.

"Tennessee set the tone from the opening tip," said head coach Stephanie White. "That's what great teams do -- and Tennessee is a great team."

Diamond DeShields scored a game-high 23 points for the Lady Vols, and Alexa Middleton came off the bench to score 19. Nared added 17 points and Mercedes Russell had 15 points and nine rebounds.

Freshman Erin Whalen finished with 13 points, four rebounds, and three assists for the Commodores. Senior Marqu'es Webb had 13 points and seven rebounds, and freshman Kayla Overbeck had 12 points and eight rebounds.

Vanderbilt trailed 61-33 after a pair of free throws by Nared with 7:13 remaining in the third quarter. But the Commodores closed the period with an 18-5 run -- including a 12-2 spurt over the final 4:15 -- to trim the margin to 66-51. Whalen had seven points during the surge, including a 3-pointer.

DeShields then went to work for Tennessee, scoring the first six points of the fourth quarter to spark a 12-4 run that enabled the Lady Vols to push the lead to 78-55 with 5:02 to play.

**NASHVILLE** - Combining a hot-shooting start with a determined finish, the Vanderbilt women snapped a nine-game losing streak on Thursday night with an 87-80 victory over Alabama, giving head coach Stephanie White her first SEC win.

After building a 20-point lead in the second quarter, the Commodores (11-10, 1-7) withstood a furious third-quarter charge by Alabama (15-6, 3-5) to notch their first victory since a win over Tennessee Tech on Dec. 18. Vanderbilt improved to 19-1 all-time against the Tide at Memorial Gym.

The Commodores went 8-of-10 from 3-point range in the first half and finished 11-of-19 from behind the arc.

Erin Whalen, who made her first career start, scored a game-high 22 points, going 4-of-7 from 3-point range. Marqu'es Webb recorded her fifth double-double of the season, finishing with 11 points and 12 rebounds, including eight offensive boards. Rachel Bell and Christa Reed added 15 points each, and Kayla Overbeck had 10 points and eight rebounds.

Hannah Cook led Alabama with 17 points. Shaquera Wade had 16.

Vanderbilt, which ranks among the top five in the nation in 3-point percentage, made 5-of-7 shots from behind the arc in the first quarter and went 3-of-3 in the second.

The early hot shooting helped Vanderbilt build a 36-16 lead with 4:01 to play in the second quarter. Whalen played a key role in the Commodores' quick start, scoring 11 first-quarter points, and Bell hit a pair of 3s early in the second quarter to help pad the lead.

But Alabama outscored the Commodores 29-10 during the next 8½ minutes -- closing the first half with a 12-3 run and opening the third period with a 17-7 spurt -- to slice Vanderbilt's lead to 46-45 with 5:29 to play in the period.

**NASHVILLE** - The Vanderbilt women were unable to slow down the SEC's leading scorer on Sunday.

Florida's Ronni Williams exploded for a career-high 43 points and also pulled down a game-high 14 rebounds to help the Gators saddle the Commodores with a 93-73 loss at Memorial Gym.

Williams, who came into the game averaging a conference-best 18.3 points per game, went 14-of-23 from the floor and 15-of-17 from the foul line. She scored 27 of her 43 points in the second half to lead Florida (11-10, 2-6) to its third straight win on Vanderbilt's home court.

The Commodores (11-11, 1-8), who were coming off an 87-80 win over Alabama on Thursday night, were led by Rebekah Dahlman's 18 points. Kayla Overbeck had her fifth double-double of the season, finishing with 14 points and 13 rebounds.

Erin Whalen and Rachel Bell added 14 points apiece for Vanderbilt. Delicia Washington had 20 points for Florida.

The Commodores, who entered the day ranked third in the country in 3-point accuracy, went 11-of-27 from long range. But the outside shooting wasn't enough to offset the huge performance by Williams and the Gators.

Florida led 37-28 at the half and held a 65-46 lead after a free throw by Williams with 8:40 to play in the game before the Commodores reeled off a 10-0 run to trim the deficit to 65-56 with 5:16 remaining. Dahlman ignited the run with five quick points, including a 3-pointer and a pair free throws.

But Williams halted the Commodores' run with a jumper at the 4:57 mark, and she followed that with a pair of free throws to push Florida's lead to 69-56. Vanderbilt cut the deficit to 74-64 on a 3-pointer by Dahlman with 3:11 to go, but Sydney Morang responded with a 3-pointer for the Gators, and Vanderbilt never got closer than 11 points the rest of the way.

**LEXINGTON, Ky.** - The Kentucky trio of Makayla Epps, Evelyn Akhatov and Taylor Murray carried the bulk of the scoring load on Sunday -- and in the process, they carried the No. 25-ranked Wildcats to a 71-63 victory over Vanderbilt.

The three players combined to score 61 of Kentucky's 71 points. Epps finished with a game-high 23, Akhatov had 20 and Murray added 18 for the Wildcats (16-8, 7-4), who snapped a two-game skid and atoned for last season's home loss to Vanderbilt.

Kayla Overbeck had a career-high 19 points and 11 rebounds, team highs in both categories, for the Commodores (11-12, 1-9). Christa Reed had 12 points and Erin Whalen added 11.

Vanderbilt -- which has now dropped 11 of its past 12 games -- attempted just four free throws in the loss, finishing 3-of-4, and committed 21 turnovers. Kentucky was 19-of-22 from the foul line, and committed only 10 turnovers.

The Commodores trailed 38-31 at the half but battled back to tie the game at 46-46 after back-to-back 3-pointers by Cierra Walker and Rachel Bell with 3:13 remaining in the third quarter. Kentucky, however, closed the period with a 9-0 run to rebuild a 55-46 lead.

Vanderbilt trimmed the deficit to 55-52 after Whalen and Kaleigh Clemons-Green each knocked down 3-pointers in the first 90 seconds of the fourth quarter. But Kentucky answered back with a methodical 10-3 run to extend the lead to 65-55 with under two minutes to play, and the Wildcats held on from there.

Vanderbilt, which entered the day ranked No. 3 in the nation in 3-point percentage at 40.7 percent, finished 8-of-24 from long range. Kentucky was 2-of-14 from behind the arc.

The Commodores dominated the glass, winning the rebounding battle, 41-29. But Kentucky outscored Vanderbilt 42-22 in the paint, and 10-0 in fast-break points.

**STARKVILLE, Miss. (AP)** - Mississippi State remained unbeaten on its home floor on Thursday night.

The fourth-ranked Bulldogs beat Vanderbilt 86-41 for their fourth straight victory -- jumping out to leads of 20-2 and 40-8 by midway through the second quarter -- while improving to 10-0 at home.

"When the lights came on tonight, we were really special," Mississippi State coach Vic Schaefer said.

Victoria Vivians led the Bulldogs with 21 points, Roshunda Johnson scored 17 and Breanna Richardson added 12. Mississippi State shot 35 of 70 (50 percent) from the field, including 9 of 20 (45 percent) from 3-point range.

Vivians was pleased that the Bulldogs never let up on the Commodores: "We finished the whole game," Vivians said. "We played all four quarters. ... That was our main focus -- finish the game."

The Bulldogs (24-1, 10-1) dominated from the opening tip, suffocating Vanderbilt defensively. They led 42-15 at halftime.

The 6-foot-1 Vivians made eight of her first 10 shots and scored all 21 of her points in the first half to push the Bulldogs ahead early. Johnson made 5 of 8 shots from 3-point range, needing just 13 minutes on the court

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** - Marqu'es Webb had a big night and Rebekah Dahlman hit a big shot.

Together, the two Vanderbilt veterans helped send the Commodores to a 70-68 victory over LSU on Monday night at Memorial Gym.

Dahlman connected on a go-ahead 3-pointer from the corner with 28 seconds remaining and it proved to be the game-winner for the Commodores (12-13, 2-10), who outscored LSU 20-11 in the final 10 minutes to earn the comeback victory.

Webb recorded a double-double with a career-high 20 points and 10 rebounds. She finished 6-of-6 from the floor and 8-of-9 from the foul line. Her final rebound of the night came after LSU's Rina Hill missed a potential game-tying shot just before the buzzer.

Raigyne Moncrief paced LSU (17-8, 6-6) with 20 points. Christa Reed added 10 for Vanderbilt.

The Commodores trailed 59-50 with 9:22 to play in the fourth quarter before closing the game on a 20-9 run to earn the win. Dahlman's clutch shot from the corner capped the comeback and gave Vanderbilt the lead for the first time since early in the third quarter.

After Dahlman's 3-pointer, LSU had two possessions in the final 23 seconds, but the Tigers came up empty both times, including missing two shots in the final six seconds.

Alexis Hyder finished with 13 points before fouling out for the Tigers. Chloe Jackson had 11 points and Ayanna Mitchell had 10.

The victory was an emotional boost for a Vanderbilt team that has suffered a series of close losses since the start of SEC play. Five of the Commodores' conference defeats were decided by a combined 21 points, with all five games being determined in the final minute.

Vanderbilt finished 8-of-18 from 3-point range in Monday's win. LSU went only 1-of-3 from 3-point range to continue a season-long theme. The Tigers have made only 28 3-pointers this season.

**COLUMBIA, S.C.** -- Kaela Davis and Alaina Coates each scored 15 points to help No. 6 South Carolina beat Vanderbilt 82-51 on Thursday night.

A'ja Wilson added 10 points and eight rebounds for the Gamecocks, who rebounded nicely from Monday's loss to top-ranked UConn by defeating Vanderbilt for the eighth consecutive time.

Christa Reed finished with 11 points and Minta Spears had 10 for Vanderbilt. Marqu'es Webb had 12 rebounds before fouling out in the fourth quarter.

South Carolina (22-3, 12-1) outscored Vanderbilt 50-10 in the paint. The Commodores (12-14, 2-11) had 20 turnovers and made 12 shots from the field -- the second time in SEC play a team has had fewer field goals than turnovers against South Carolina.

The Commodores, who were facing a ranked opponent for the third time in four games, shot just 22.6 percent from the floor and were limited to 12 field goals for the game (finishing 12-of-53). Vanderbilt was just 4-of-18 from 3-point range, but went 23-of-28 from the foul line.

The Gamecocks never trailed in the game. They opened the first quarter on a 20-3 run, and led 23-6 at the end of the period. The Commodores had 10 turnovers and attempted just 10 shots in the first 10 minutes, and were outscored 16-0 in the paint during the quarter.

Vanderbilt climbed back into the game by putting together an 11-2 run early in the second quarter to trim South Carolina's lead to 27-17. The surge started with a pair of free throws by LeaLea Carter and was capped by a jumper from Spears at the 5:31 mark of the quarter.

South Carolina, however, answered back with a 12-2 spurt -- which began with a jumper by Davis and ended with a 3-pointer by Bianca Cuevas-Moore -- to rebuild a 20-point lead, 39-19, with 2:17 to play in the first half. Vanderbilt never got closer than 18 points the rest of the way.

**NASHVILLE** -- Fueled by their freshmen, the Vanderbilt women maintained their dominance over Ole Miss.

Freshman Erin Whalen scored a career-high 24 points and fellow freshman Kaleigh Clemons-Green added a career-high 16 to lead the Commodores to an 85-67 home victory on Sunday afternoon.

Vanderbilt has now won 18 consecutive games against Ole Miss at Memorial Gym, with the Rebels going winless on Vanderbilt's home floor since 1987.

Two more freshmen -- Kayla Overbeck and LeaLea Carter -- also made significant contributions for the Commodores (13-14, 3-11).

Overbeck recorded her team-leading seventh double-double, finishing with 10 points and 11 rebounds, and Carter had 13 points and six rebounds while helping Vanderbilt win for the third time in the past four home games.

Together, the four freshmen combined for 63 points and 25 rebounds in the victory.

Leading 58-56 at the end of the third quarter, the Commodores reeled off 13 straight points to open the fourth period, and they sailed home from there.

Madinah Muhammed scored a team-high 19 points for Ole Miss (16-11, 5-9). Shandricka Sessom added 16 points for the Rebels, who finished just 4-of-28 from 3-point range (14 percent).

Sessom was 0-of-11 from the floor in the first half but went 6-of-12 in the second half to finish 6-of-23.

Ole Miss had four players foul out during the physical game, which saw the teams combined for 55 fouls, including 34 by the Rebels.

Vanderbilt finished 34-of-41 from the foul line. Ole Miss was 11-of-18.

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** - Thanks to two clutch free throws by a freshman, a pair of Vanderbilt seniors were able to celebrate a victory in their final regular-season game at Memorial Gym.

With Vanderbilt and Arkansas locked in a 64-64 tie, freshman Erin Whalen was fouled while attempting an offensive putback under the basket with three seconds remaining. Whalen walked to the line and calmly sank both free throws, and the Commodores held on for a 66-64 victory when Arkansas was unable to get a shot off on its final possession.

Whalen finished with a game-high 20 points and fellow freshman LeaLea Carter added 11 points while helping the Commodores (14-14, 4-11) extend their late-season surge. They've won three of their past four games, and posted a 4-1 record on their home floor in February. Arkansas (13-15, 2-13) has now dropped nine straight.

Thursday's victory came on Senior Night at Memorial Gym, and the Commodores honored Marques Webb and Minta Spears after the game. Fittingly, each of the seniors delivered typically gritty performances during the win.

Webb finished with eight points and 10 rebounds, representing her 13th double-digit rebounding effort of the season. Spears had four points, three rebounds, two assists -- and no turnovers -- in 30 minutes of action.

Aaliyah Wilson had 14 points for Arkansas, Jessica Jackson had 11 and Keiryn Swenson had 10.

Both teams were plagued by cold shooting, with Vanderbilt going 19-of-51 from the floor (37 percent) and Arkansas finishing 25-of-64 (39 percent).

After erasing an early Arkansas lead, the Commodores stayed in front for most of the night, leading 18-13 at the end of the first quarter, 33-25 at the half and 51-42 going into the final 10 minutes.

## GAME 30: Vanderbilt vs. Alabama

**BATON ROUGE, La.** -- The Vanderbilt women haven't had much luck in Louisiana in recent years, and that didn't change on Sunday.

Playing their regular-season finale at LSU, the Commodores were limited to 18 field goals and suffered a 64-58 loss to the Tigers.

Vanderbilt (14-15, 4-12), which came into the day having won three of its past four games, will be the No. 13 seed at next week's SEC Tournament in Greenville, S.C., and will play a yet-to-be-determined opponent in the first round on Wednesday.

Rachel Bell scored a team-high 17 points in Sunday's loss. Minta Spears added 13 points and nine rebounds for the Commodores, who have now dropped seven straight games on LSU's home floor. Vanderbilt hasn't earned a victory at the Maravich Center since Feb. 19, 2004.

Alexis Hyder and Raigyne Moncrief had 17 points apiece for the Tigers (19-10, 8-8), and Chloe Jackson added 15.

Vanderbilt finished 18-of-43 from the floor, including 8-of-23 from 3-point range.

LSU closed the third quarter with an 11-3 run to flip a 36-33 deficit into a 44-40 lead, and the Tigers stayed in front throughout the final 10 minutes, never allowing Vanderbilt to get closer than four points. The Commodores had a chance to narrow the gap to three with 37 seconds to play, but Spears -- one of VU's best free throw shooters -- missed the back end of a two-shot foul.

Trailing 31-27 at the half, the Commodores opened the second half with a 9-2 run. Kaleigh Clemons-Green hit a 3-pointer from the corner that gave the Commodores their first lead of the game, 34-33, with 6:30 to play in the third quarter, and Bell followed that with a pair of free throws to push the lead to 36-33.

But LSU answered back quickly with an 8-2 run to move back in front, 41-36. The Tigers owned a 44-40 edge at the end of the third quarter, and stayed in front from there.

## PROGRAM NOTES:

- Has earned 27 berths in the NCAA Tournament, including a run of 15 straight from 2000-2014.
- Has captured six SEC Tournament championships (2009, 2007, 2004, 2002, 1995, 1993).
- Last year marked the 31st time in the past 33 seasons that the Commodores compiled a winning record -- an impressive stretch that dates back to the 1983-84 campaign.

## Head Coach Stephanie White:

- Won her first game at Vanderbilt, and her first as a college head coach when the Commodores beat Kennesaw State, 86-54 on Nov. 11.
- Spent the previous two seasons as the head coach of the WNBA's Indiana Fever, and guided the team to the playoffs each year.
- Led the Fever to the WNBA Finals in 2015, becoming the first rookie coach in league history to guide a team to the finals.
- During her playing career at Purdue, she was the National Player of the Year in 1999 after helping the Boilermakers capture the NCAA title that season.
- Her college coach was Carolyn Peck, who is now an associate coach on her staff at Vanderbilt.

### No. 0 -- Kayla Overbeck (Freshman)

- ◆ Is the all-time leading scorer (1,988 points) and rebounder (1,355) in Newbury Park High's history, where she also starred in volleyball
- ◆ Is the first player in VU history to wear No. 0 (with a single zero)

### No. 1 -- Rebekah Dahlman (RS-Junior)

- ◆ Has recovered from a blood clot in her shoulder that required multiple surgeries and caused her to miss most of her freshman season.
- ◆ Grandfather, John Kundla, is in the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame; he coached the NBA's Minneapolis Lakers and the University of Minnesota.

### No. 3 -- Rachel Bell (Junior)

- ◆ Ranked second on the team in both total points (279) and scoring average (9.0 ppg) last season.
- ◆ Worked an internship this summer with the Vanderbilt Police Department as part of the school's unique athlete internship program.

### No. 10 -- Cierra Walker (Freshman)

- ◆ Shot 45 percent from 3-point range in her high school career and is Oregon City High's all-time leader in 3-pointers (249) and assists (416).
- ◆ Was a three-time finalist in the national Punt, Pass and Kick competition and is a huge football fan.

### No. 12 Myka Dancy (Junior)

- ◆ Scored a basket in the final minute of VU's opening-round SEC Tournament victory over Ole Miss to provide the exclamation point on the win last season.
- ◆ Was a member of the All-District Basketball Team in 2014 and won the A.D. Hancock/ Walter Nipper Sportsmanship Award

### No. 21 -- Erin Whalen (Freshman)

- ◆ Multi-sport high school athlete who won three state championships -- two in basketball and one in volleyball.
- ◆ Was the 2016 North Carolina Gatorade Player of the Year and averaged 18.2 points and 5.7 rebounds per game in her prep career.

### No. 22 -- Marqu'e Webb (Senior)

- ◆ Was named the chair of the SEC's first-ever Leadership Council; Was selected to the position by her peers.
- ◆ Pulled down her 500th career rebound early this season and ranks among the SEC's Top-10 in career rebounds.

### No. 23 -- Minta Spears (RS Senior)

- ◆ Averaged 13.8 points per game over the final four games of last season, reaching double figures in three of those contests.
- ◆ Was a member of the drama and debate teams during high school, and competed in regional competitions.

### No. 30 -- LeaLea Carter (Freshman)

- ◆ Member of the USA U-16 national team that captured a Gold Medal last summer.
