Head Coach Melanie Balcomb



The 2008-09 season marks the seventh year for Melanie Balcomb in the Music City. The New Jersey native brought her uptempo style to the Southeastern Conference prior to the 2002-03 season, and success followed close on her heels.

Last season, the Commodores made their ninth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament after winning a school-record 11 Southeastern Conference games. Vanderbilt made it to the regional semifinal, marking the school's 13th trip and Balcomb's fourth Sweet 16. She won her 300th game overall on Feb. 3, 2008, a 61-54 victory at No. 12/11 Georgia.

Now in her 16th season as a collegiate head coach, Balcomb has won more than 66 percent of her games all-time. Before coming to Nashville, she led Xavier to the NCAA Tournament three times, reaching the Elite Eight in 2001.

Balcomb has coached 17 players who have received all-conference accolades, and six of her players have been drafted by the WNBA -- including VU great Chantelle Anderson, who went as the second overall pick to the Sacramento Monarchs in the 2003 draft. In 2007, Carla Thomas was a first-round selection and Dee Davis was chosen with the first pick in the second round.

About Today's Game

Thursday's game marks the 41st all-time meeting between Vanderbilt and Mississippi State. The Commodores hold a 29-11 advantage in the series. Vanderbilt has won five straight over the Lady Bulldogs, dating back to the 2002-03 season. Vanderbilt is 9-8 all-time against MSU in games played in Starkville, Miss, while the Commodores hold a 16-1 advantage over Mississippi State in Nashville. Last season the Commodores defeated the Lady Bulldogs 72-50 in Nashville. VU has won the last three meetings with Mississippi State by an average of 27 points.

Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb is 5-1 against Mississippi State as VU's head coach.

Christina Wirth became the 30th member of Vanderbilt's 1,000-Point Club when she hit her fourth three-pointer against West Virginia in the second round of the 2008 NCAA Tournament. Wirth's 21 points led VU to the Sweet 16 and made her the 13th Commodore to score 1,000 points in three seasons.

Wirth entered the 2008-09 season in 28th place on Vanderbilt's career scoring list with 1,014 career points.

A total of nine Commodores have reached 1,000 points under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb since the beginning of the 2002-03 season. Carla Thomas, a 2007 graduate, is the leading scorer of the Balcomb era with 1,774 career points.

Additional Game Notes

MEDIA TABS VANDERBILT AS SEC FAVORITE

The Vanderbilt Commodores have been predicted to win the 2009 Southeastern Conference women's basketball championship in a vote by a select panel of both SEC and national media members.

The Commodores are coming off a 25-9 season that included the school's 13th trip to the NCAA Sweet 16 and a school-record 11 conference victories. Head Coach Melanie Balcomb's seventh Vanderbilt squad earned 12 first-place votes, topping cross-state rival Tennessee's nine and Georgia's four.

Vanderbilt topped the order of finish with 273 points, with Tennessee (261), Auburn (246), Georgia (216), LSU (183) and Florida (174) rounding out the top half of the league.

Vanderbilt's Christina Wirth, a first-team All-SEC selection, received a vote for Player of the Year, which went to Auburn's DeWanna Bonner.

COACHES FOLLOW SUIT WITH PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

When the SEC released its preseason coaches' poll and all-conference squad, league coaches agreed with many of the prognostications from the media poll a week earlier. Vanderbilt was chosen as the favorite to win the 2009 SEC championship. Tennessee, Auburn, Georgia, LSU and Florida rounded out the top half of the league.

Commodore senior Christina Wirth joined Auburn's DeWanna Bonner as the only two unanimous selections to the All-SEC first team. Fellow VU captain Jennifer Risper, a member of the league's all-defensive team last year after leading the Commodores in rebounding and steals, was picked by the coaches to the All-SEC second team.

BEST SEC FINISH

Last season's March 2 win over Alabama gave Vanderbilt a school-record 11 conference wins. The Commodores had claimed 10 SEC victories on three prior occasions. VU's 78.6 league winning percentage (11-3) marks the team's second-best conference record. The Commodores won 81.8 percent of their games (9-2) in both the 1993 and 1994 seasons.

"STARTING SEVEN"

Last year, Head Coach Melanie Balcomb stressed the importance of a strong bench, often using the term "starting seven" to refer to the importance of the first reserves off the Commodore bench. Since the SEC established a Sixth Woman of the Year award in 2006, a Commodore has earned at least a share of the award each year. Liz Sherwood was so-honored in 2006 and 2007, while Jessica Mooney shared the award in 2008.

This year, the term "Starting Seven" has reemerged, with Mooney and Rhoads switching between switching starting roles in the backcourt and sophomore Chanel Chisholm coming into her own in the post.

RETURNING FIREPOWER

Vanderbilt returned most of its offensive production from last year's squad, in stark contrast to the 2007-08 Commodores. Heading in the 2007-08 season, VU was returning only 53 percent of its scoring output from the previous year, but the 2008-09 Commodores have 85 percent of their points back.

The Commodores snapped Tennessee's 16-game winning streak in this series. Jessica Mooney led five Commodores in double figures with 15 points. Jennifer Risper and Hannah Tuomi each had 12, Merideth Marsh added 11 and Christina Wirth had 10.

Tennessee (12-3, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) has simply dominated this series between schools separated by 190 miles along Interstate 40, winning 52 of the first 58 by the Lady Vols' count. This loss keeps coach Pat Summitt stuck on 995 wins as she closes in on 1,000 for her career.

Vanderbilt (13-4, 2-0) was the preseason pick to win the SEC title, and the Commodores used their speed and experience to grab their first win over the Lady Vols since Feb. 2, 2002, also on their home floor at Memorial Gym.

These teams last met in the SEC tournament semifinals with the Lady Vols winning by 25 before winning their second straight national championship and eighth overall.

But Summitt has a much younger team this season, starting three freshmen and a sophomore. That makes Vanderbilt seem grizzled in comparison with two seniors and two juniors in the starting lineup.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -- Merideth Marsh scored a career-high 21 points to help Vanderbilt (No. 22 ESPN/USA Today, No. 20 AP) beat Arkansas 72-61 in overtime on Thursday night.

Marsh was 5-for-6 on 3-pointers and made two free throws during a 13-0 run by Commodores (16-5, 5-1 Southeastern Conference) to close the game.

Arkansas (12-9, 1-5) overcame a 15-point second-half deficit with a dominating rebounding effort and career highs of 20 points and 15 rebounds by Ashley McCray. The Razorbacks finished with a 58-28 edge in rebounds.

"We played the first five minutes great of each half great," Melanie Balcomb, VU head coach, said, "and it was really tough to watch us play rough the rest of the time. It was just hard to watch, but we came through in overtime."

A driving layup by Ceira Ricketts with 3:33 left in the extra period gave the Razorbacks their only lead of the contest, 61-59.

Jessica Mooney answered with four straight free throws and put Vanderbilt back in front to stay. Mooney finished with 14 points, and Jennifer Risper and Christina Wirth each had 13.

McCray shot 9-for-13 from the field and her layup with 1:12 remaining tied it 59-59. She missed a putback as the buzzer sounded at the end of regulation.

The Razorbacks outscored Vanderbilt 19-4 over the final 8:41 of regulation. They tied the score twice in the final 2:20, the first when Lyndsay Harris banked in a 3-pointer which made it 57-57.

"Every game has been tough and the nice thing is that we've been on the winning side of the SEC except for one game," noted Balcomb. "We can't beat ourselves up about it, we have to move forward."

Arkansas outrebounded Vanderbilt 32-13 in the first half and scored 12 second-chance points on 16 offensive rebounds. They allowed just three points in the final 5:13 of the first half and closed to 27-26 at halftime.

Vanderbilt held the Razorbacks scoreless for the first 5:48, built a 9-0 lead and never trailed during regulation. The largest margin was 55-40 after a layup by Risper.

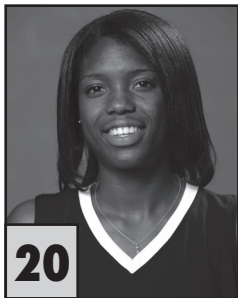
