Head Coach Melanie Balcomb



The 2007-08 season marks the sixth year for Melanie Balcomb in the Music City. The New Jersey native brought her uptempo style to the Southeastern Conference prior to the 2002-03 season, and success followed close on her heels.

Last season, the Commodores made their eighth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament after winning the school's fifth SEC Tournament championship. It was Balcomb's second time to cut down the nets as a Commodore, and promises not be her last. She won her 100th game as Vanderbilt's head coach on Nov. 30, 2006, a 85-63 victory at UAB.

Now in her 15th season as a collegiate head coach, Balcomb is nearing 300 career victories and has won more than 65 percent of her games all-time. Before coming to Nashville, Balcomb led her Xavier team to the NCAA Tournament three times, reaching the Elite Eight in 2001.

Balcomb has coached 15 players who have received all-conference accolades, and six of her players have been drafted by the WNBA -- including VU great Chantelle Anderson, who went as the second overall pick to the Sacramento Monarchs in the 2003 draft. Last year, Carla Thomas was a first-round selection while Dee Davis was chosen with the first pick in the second round.

Vanderbilt closes non-conference schedule
Saturday against Ivy League foe

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- The Vanderbilt women's basketball team opens Southeastern Conference play on Thursday, Jan. 10, when Mississippi State visits Memorial Gymnasium for a 7 p.m. CT tip-off.

The Commodores (11-4) opened the 2008 calendar year by closing out their non-conference schedule with a pair of convincing wins against South Florida and at Princeton.

Freshmen Hannah Tuomi and Jence Rhoads were both plugged into the starting lineup following VU's loss to Old Dominion, and both have notched season-high point totals just becoming starters. Senior Liz Sherwood continues to pace the Commodores in scoring while leading the nation in field goal percentage.

Vanderbilt holds an all-time record of 28-11 against Mississippi State, including a 15-1 mark in Memorial Gym.

Sophomore Tysheka Grimes leads the Lady Bulldogs (12-3), averaging 13.5 points and 6.2 rebounds per game. Mississippi State makes its second trip to Nashville this season riding a four-game winning streak. The Lady Bulldogs won at Belmont in mid-November, 66-51.

Vanderbilt holds a record of 15-10 all-time in Southeastern Conference openers. Vanderbilt is 1-2 when playing Mississippi State in its conference opener, but won the only such meeting that was played in Nashville, 78-47 (Dec. 14, 1997).

Following Thursday's game, the Commodores will hit the road to take on LSU Sunday at 4 p.m. CT. Vanderbilt then returns home to play host to Georgia on Jan. 17 before a trip to Knoxville on Jan. 20.

FRESH IDEAS

In VU's first two games of calendar year 2008, Head Coach Melanie Balcomb's starting lineup featured a pair of freshmen. It marks the first time that two freshmen have started a contest since the end of the 2003-04 season.

That season, 33 of VU's 34 games featured a pair of freshmen in the lineup between Davis, Thomas, guard Cherish Stringfield and forward Katie Antony.

CENTER OF ATTENTION

Vanderbilt senior center Liz Sherwood is shooting an unbelievable 71.2 percent from the field this season to lead the Southeastern Conference and the nation in field goal percentage. Sherwood has made 94 of her 132 field goal attempts this season, including a 10-of-11 performance at Clemson. Sherwood's only miss of that game came on her third attempt -- she promptly rebounded the ball, connected on the put-back and would not miss again.

For her career, Sherwood has connected on 66.4 percent of her field goal attempts (395-595). This season Sherwood has moved past the Commodores' all-time leader in career field goal percentage, All-American Chantelle Anderson (1,020-of-1,568, 65.1 percent). Anderson holds the SEC record for career shooting accuracy, and her mark ranks fifth all-time in the NCAA (minimum of 400 made field goals). Entering league play, Sherwood is only five makes away from qualifying to be ranked by the NCAA.

CLEMSON, S.C. (AP) - Liz Sherwood scored 22 points on 10-of-11 shooting and grabbed 12 rebounds to lead No. 19 Vanderbilt to the 74-56 victory over Clemson Tuesday night at Littlejohn Coliseum.

Sherwood, a 6-foot-4 senior, displayed why she entered the contest shooting a robust 81.8 percent from the field. Every time she got the ball within five feet of the basket she scored.

"She's always been this accurate," Vanderbilt coach Melanie Balcomb said of her center. "It's just a matter of how many shots she gets. It's her senior year and she's getting more confident and assertive."

Thanks mostly to Sherwood, the Commodores (3-1) made a tied game to start the second half a blowout with 10 minutes still remaining. Vanderbilt opened the second half by outscoring the Tigers (2-3) 24-8, with 11 of those points coming from Sherwood.

It was quite a contrast from the opening half, where the Commodores raced to a 10-point lead, only to see it evaporate due to 17 first-half turnovers and watched Clemson take its own six-point advantage. By the time the first half was over, the teams were tied at 32-32.

"In the first half, we hesitated like crazy and that led to our turnovers," Balcomb said. "We played not to lose rather than to win. We made a couple of adjustments at halftime that they listened to."

Clemson entered the game shorthanded, having three key players already out for the season due to ACL injuries. Also, sophomore guard Christy Brown had a bad ankle, while senior guard D'Leshia Lloyd had a bad shoulder. Even so, Lloyd managed to pace the Tigers with 17 points.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -- Jessica Mooney scored a career-high 16 points to lead Vanderbilt (No. 18 ESPN/USA Today, No. 23 AP) to a 68-55 win over Duke on Wednesday night, handing the Blue Devils consecutive losses for the first time since 2000.

Mooney was 4-for-7 from the field and added six rebounds for Vanderbilt (6-1). The Commodores ended the game on an 18-3 run that began with 3:35 left to topple Duke (5-2), which lost consecutive games for the first time in eight seasons. The Blue Devils lost to No. 2 Connecticut 74-48 on Sunday in the Paradise Jam championship in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Christina Wirth had 15 points, and Lauren Lueders and Merideth Marsh each added nine points for Vanderbilt. Jasmine Thomas led Duke with 12 points, and Chante Black chipped in with 10 points and 10 rebounds for the Blue Devils, who had a season-high 24 turnovers. Duke's previous high of 23 came against Denver.

Jennifer Risper made four consecutive free throws to give Vanderbilt a 57-52 lead with 3:35 left, and the Commodores kept their cushion with late free throws. Vanderbilt finished 22-for-30 on free throws.

Risper also put the Commodores ahead 44-43 with 12:42 left, taking the lead for the first time since the opening minutes. Both teams were in the free-throw bonus the final 10 minutes that kept the game tight.

Duke got off to another slow start. The Blue Devils had five turnovers in their first five possessions against the Commodores, and fell behind 7-4 in the opening minutes. Duke has trailed in the first 10 minutes in five of its first seven games.

After the Blue Devils went on a 19-7 run, Vanderbilt slowly crept its way back, closing the gap to 33-30 at halftime with a spurt of 3-pointers.
