Head Coach Melanie Balcomb



The 2007-08 season marks the sixth year for Melanie Balcomb in the Music City. The New Jersey native brought her uptempo style to the Southeastern Conference prior to the 2002-03 season, and success followed close on her heels.

Last season, the Commodores made their eighth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament after winning the school's fifth SEC Tournament championship. It was Balcomb's second time to cut down the nets as a Commodore, and promises not be her last. She won her 100th game as Vanderbilt's head coach on Nov. 30, 2006, a 85-63 victory at UAB.

Now in her 15th season as a collegiate head coach, Balcomb is nearing 300 career victories and has won more than 65 percent of her games all-time. Before coming to Nashville, Balcomb led her Xavier team to the NCAA Tournament three times, reaching the Elite Eight in 2001.

Balcomb has coached 15 players who have received all-conference accolades, and six of her players have been drafted by the WNBA -- including VU great Chantelle Anderson, who went as the second overall pick to the Sacramento Monarchs in the 2003 draft. Last year, Carla Thomas was a first-round selection while Dee Davis was chosen with the first pick in the second round.

Commodore Notes

Commodores Travel To No. 2 Tennessee

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. -- The Vanderbilt women's basketball team faces its third-consecutive highly ranked opponent this weekend, making a cross-state trip to Thompson-Boling Arena to take on No. 2 Tennessee Sunday. The game is scheduled to tip-off at 2 p.m. CT and will be televised live on FSN (Fox Sports Net) South.

On Thursday, the Commodores (13-5, 2-1 Southeastern Conference) opened with a 16-0 run and beat No. 12/11 Georgia, 67-59. Freshman forward Hannah Tuomi scored 14 of Vanderbilt's first 23 points and finished the game 7-of-9 from the field. Junior Christina Wirth scored a team-high 16 points for the Commodores, while sophomore Merideth Marsh had 12 points.

Tennessee (15-1, 3-0 SEC) won at Kentucky on Thursday thanks to 23 points from All-American Candace Parker. The Lady Vols' lone loss of the season came on Dec. 22 at then-No. 5 Stanford, 73-69.

Through their first three conference games, the Commodores are led in scoring by the triple-threat attack of Tuomi, Wirth and senior Liz Sherwood -- all averaging 11.0 points per game. Sherwood continues to lead the nation in field-goal percentage, shooting 71.1 percent from the field this year. The two-time SEC Sixth Woman of the Year has is again filling a reserve role for the Commodores this season.

Vanderbilt will enjoy a bye week before returning to Memorial Gymnasium on Sunday, Jan. 27, when Ole Miss visits for a 2 p.m. CT tip-off. All tickets to the Ole Miss game will go for one dollar (\$1) and the Commodores will offer free headbands for the first 1,000 fans who "jam the gym." Other activities surrounding the game include mascot basketball at halftime and a postgame clinic and autograph session.

COMMON OPPONENTS

The Commodores and Lady Vols have faced only one common opponent this season: Old Dominion. The Commodores lost to the Lady Monarchs, 80-65, while the Lady Vols defeated ODU, 83-51.

FRESH IDEAS

In VU's first five games of calendar year 2008, Head Coach Melanie Balcomb's starting lineup featured a pair of freshmen. It marks the first time that two freshmen have started a contest since the end of the 2003-04 season.

That season, 33 of VU's 34 games featured a pair of freshmen in the lineup between Davis, Thomas, guard Cherish Stringfield and forward Katie Antony.

SENSATIONAL SHOOTING

Vanderbilt ranked first in the nation in three-point field-goal percentage and second in overall shooting percentage last season. During the 2006-07 season, the Commodores connected on at least 60% of their field goal attempts during a total of 15 halves of basketball. CENTER OF ATTENTION

Vanderbilt senior center Liz Sherwood is shooting an unbelievable 71.1 percent from the field this season to lead the Southeastern Conference and the nation in field goal percentage. Sherwood has made 108 of her 152 field goal attempts this season, including a 10-of-11 performance at Clemson. Sherwood's only miss of that game came on her third attempt -- she promptly rebounded the ball, connected on the put-back and would not miss again.

For her career, Sherwood has connected on 66.5 percent of her field goal attempts (409-615). This season Sherwood has moved past the Commodores' all-time leader in career field goal percentage, All-American Chantelle Anderson (1,020-of-1,568, 65.1 percent). Anderson holds the SEC record for career shooting accuracy, and her mark ranks fifth all-time in the NCAA (minimum of 400 made field goals). Entering league play, Sherwood is only one make away from qualifying to be ranked by the NCAA.

Vanderbilt's Melanie Balcomb has won 297 games in 15 seasons as a head coach. She stands only three wins away from reaching the 300-victory plateau.

Currently, only four coaches in the Southeastern Conference can boast 300-plus career victories -- UT's Pat Summitt, Georgia's Andy Landers, LSU's Van Chancellor and Mississippi State's Sharon Fanning.

MEDIA PRESEASON PICKS

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth overall in the Southeastern Conference, according to media voting that preceded 2007 Media Day.

Melanie Balcomb's sixth squad at Vanderbilt was predicted to finish behind Tennessee, LSU and Georgia.

Commodore junior forward Christina Wirth was chosen as an All-SEC Second Team honoree by the media.

PRESEASON COACHES' PICKS

Vanderbilt was also chosen fourth overall by a vote of Southeastern Conference coaches.

In the coaches' All-SEC selections, Christina Wirth earned first-team honors, while Liz Sherwood was chosen to the second team.

Clemson entered the game shorthanded, having three key players already out for the season due to ACL injuries. Also, sophomore guard Christy Brown had a bad ankle, while senior guard D'Leshia Lloyd had a bad shoulder. Even so, Lloyd managed to pace the Tigers with 17 points.

Mooney was 4-for-7 from the field and added six rebounds for Vanderbilt (6-1). The Commodores ended the game on an 18-3 run that began with 3:35 left to topple Duke (5-2), which lost consecutive games for the first time in eight seasons. The Blue Devils lost to No. 2 Connecticut 74-48 on Sunday in the Paradise Jam championship in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Christina Wirth had 15 points, and Lauren Lueders and Merideth Marsh each added nine points for Vanderbilt. Jasmine Thomas led Duke with 12 points, and Chante Black chipped in with 10 points and 10 rebounds for the Blue Devils, who had a season-high 24 turnovers. Duke's previous high of 23 came against Denver.

Jennifer Risper made four consecutive free throws to give Vanderbilt a 57-52 lead with 3:35 left, and the Commodores kept their cushion with late free throws. Vanderbilt finished 22-for-30 on free throws.

Risper also put the Commodores ahead 44-43 with 12:42 left, taking the lead for the first time since the opening minutes. Both teams were in the free-throw bonus the final 10 minutes that kept the game tight.

Duke got off to another slow start. The Blue Devils had five turnovers in their first five possessions against the Commodores, and fell behind 7-4 in the opening minutes. Duke has trailed in the first 10 minutes in five of its first seven games.

After the Blue Devils went on a 19-7 run, Vanderbilt slowly crept its way back, closing the gap to 33-30 at halftime with a spurt of 3-pointers.

PRINCETON, N.J. -- Sophomore Meredith Marsh scored 17 points and the Vanderbilt women's basketball team, unranked for the first time all year, pulled away in the second half Saturday and handily beat Princeton 81-48 in the team's final tune-up before beginning Southeastern Conference play next week.

Marsh, who entered the game shooting just 39 percent from the field for the year, connected on 6-of-8 shot attempts, including 4-of-6 from three-point range, a game after scoring a career high 19 points on 4-of-5 shooting from three-point-range against South Florida Wednesday.

The Commodores, who improved to 11-4 on the year, struggled defensively early, as Princeton hit four of its first six shots out of the gate, allowing the Tigers to hang around early.

But a 14-2 run during the first 5:12 of the second half boosted a 13-point halftime lead to 25, and effectively ended any remaining suspense.

Vanderbilt's attacking, pressure defense ultimately wore Princeton down, forcing the Tigers into just 32 percent shooting from the field as a team for the game and limiting Princeton to just 19 second half points.

Princeton senior forward Meagan Cowher, the team's leading scorer, was held to just 11 points - her second lowest output of the season - on just 2-for-13 shooting from the field.

Junior Christina Wirth scored 12 points and pulled down six rebounds, despite being limited by foul trouble to only 17 minutes.
