2015 IN REVIEW



The 2015 season marked a historic year for the Vanderbilt lacrosse program as the Commodores joined a new conference.

After knowing only one league for 13 years, Vanderbilt joined the eight-team BIG EAST Conference as affiliate members for lacrosse. The Commodores and Florida were added after the American Lacrosse Conference, which VU was a charter member of, dissolved after 13 years.

Their first conference game in the BIG EAST came on March 22 against familiar foe No. 6 Florida at the VU Lacrosse Complex. The game was also the first VU lacrosse game aired on SEC Network +, a digital platform of the brand new network which launched in August 2014. Vanderbilt's first BIG EAST win came at home against Temple with a 14-8 victory on April 4. The Commodores finished league play with a 4-3 mark for their first winning record in conference action in five years. Vanderbilt fell one win short of making the four-team league tournament.

The Commodores started off the season 3-0 for the first time since 2008. But they then dropped eight straight during a tough stretch in which they faced eight teams that were ranked or began the season ranked. All eight teams also made the NCAA Tournament in 2014 and seven made the 2015 field.

A four-game winning streak followed and was highlighted by arguably the team's biggest victory of the season. The Commodores knocked off Connecticut 10-9 in double overtime on April 12 after trailing by three goals with less than 20 minutes left. Amanda Lockwood, who scored a career-high four goals, tied the game 8-8 with 5:37 left in regulation to force overtime. The teams traded goals in the first overtime and goalkeeper Maddie Kratz made a huge save as time expired to send the game into double overtime. Two minutes into double overtime, Lockwood found Caroline Peters, who scored the game-winner to cap off the comeback victory.

The Commodores finished 2015 with a 7-9 record for their most wins in three years. They also placed six players earn All-BIG EAST Conference honors, the most since the 2004 squad had seven named All-American Lacrosse Conference.

Senior captain Alex Duckenfield, who led the team with 27 caused turnovers, earned First-Team All-Conference honors. Attacker Mal-lory Schonk was also tabbed to the first team. For the second straight year, the junior led the team with 52 points. She also topped the team with 32 goals in addition to 20 assists. She has started all 50 games of her career and entered 2016 as the team's active leader in goals with 82.

Emma Dagues, Jill Doherty, Maddie Kratz and Alexa Kunowsky were tabbed to the All-BIG EAST Second Team. Dagues, the fastest player on the team, emerged as a threat in the circle after midfielder Kelly Chandler suffered a season-ending injury just five games in. Dagues, a junior, led the team with 33 draw controls while also scoring 12 goals and handing out nine assists.

Doherty, named to the ALC All-Tournament Team as a freshman, showed no signs of a sophomore slump as she led the team with 23 assists — third-most in the BIG EAST. She also scored 25 goals and ranked second on the team with 48 points. Her 19 caused turnovers were the most by a non-defender.

Kunowsky, an ALC All-Tournament Team selection in 2013, was just behind Schonk with 27 goals. The junior also had 26 ground balls and scored a career-high tying five goals against Liberty. She has started all 50 games of her career. Kratz overcame a back injury to notch 95 saves in 12 games, including 74 in the last eight games. Her 7.92 saves a game were the third-most in the BIG EAST.

The Commodores continued their excellence off the field with 25 players being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll. In addition, Schonk, Doherty, Kunowsky, Ashin Dolan and Gabby Nesi participated in Soles4Souls service trips to Costa Rica and Cuba.

HEAD COACH CATHY SWEZEY



The 2016 Vanderbilt lacrosse season will mark the 19th season under the direction of head coach Cathy Swezey. Her tenure at the helm of the Commodores has included six NCAA Tournament appearances and a 2004 trip to the NCAA Final Four.

In addition, Swezey led Vanderbilt into the American Lacrosse Conference as one of the charter members in 2001 and the Commodores twice won the league title. In 2015, Swezey again took the program into uncharted territory as they joined the BIG EAST Conference after the ALC dissolved after 13 years.

Swezey has built Vanderbilt lacrosse into a nationally recognized program, both on the field and off of it. In 2012, graduating senior Ally Carey was named a first-team IWLCA All-American for the third consecutive season and retained her spot on the U.S. women's national senior team. In the classroom, six of Swezey's student-athletes were named to the 2012 IWLCA Academic Honor Roll, while a total of 23 Commodores were so honored by the American Lacrosse Conference.

A native of Moorestown, N.J., and a three-time Division III national champion, Swezey was hired as Vanderbilt lacrosse's second varsity head coach in 1997. Swezey has played a large part in the growth of the sport of lacrosse both at Vanderbilt and throughout Tennessee.

Swezey was the first to bring a team from outside of the eastern time zone to the NCAA Final Four. Her Commodores earned four consecutive berths in the NCAA Tournament between 2007 and 2010. Swezey was named the American Lacrosse Conference Coach of the Year in 2008, the same year she was honored as Vanderbilt's Coach of the Year for women's athletics. Nashville played host to a first-round game in the NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse Tournament for the first time in history in 2007.

Swezey began building her powerful program prior to the 1998 season. Her first team went 7-9, but it was a mere two years later that Swezey's 2000 squad would defeat a Top-10 team, Boston University, for the first time in the history of the program. Vanderbilt ended that year ranked 13th in the nation — one spot from reaching the NCAA Tournament — and Swezey was nominated as Coach of the Year by the IWLCA.

In 2002, Vanderbilt became a charter member of the American Lacrosse Conference. For guiding her team to its highest ranking ever, No. 8, and its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament, Swezey earned Coach of the Year honors from the ALC and InsideLacrosse.com.

The Commodores' success has produced a snowball effect in Middle Tennessee. Swezey moved her team into a state-of-the-art facility, the Vanderbilt Lacrosse and Soccer Complex, in 2003. A number of former Commodore lacrosse players now work in the Nashville area as high school and youth lacrosse coaches, and Vanderbilt regularly hosts camps and clinics on campus.

Swezey's coaching career began at her alma mater, Trenton State College (now the College of New Jersey). She was a graduate assistant coach for both field hockey and lacrosse from 1994-1996. During that time, the lacrosse team earned two NCAA championship titles, and the field hockey team earned the title in 1995. While coaching, Swezey earned her master's degree in teaching with a health education specialization.

The three-time All-American had an impressive two-sport career at Trenton State, winning eight national championships in field hockey and lacrosse as a player and graduate assistant coach. Swezey started for Trenton State's national championship lacrosse teams in 1991, 1992 and 1994, and for the 1990 national runner-up squad. Swezey missed the 1993 season with a knee injury, but returned to the field the following year.

Not only was she an All-American in 1992, she received the honor again in 1994. Swezey was named to the NCAA Final Four All-Tournament team in 1992 and 1994, and earned the Attack Player of the Year award from the South Jersey Lacrosse Club her senior season. She became a member of the U.S. Lacrosse squad upon graduation in 1994.

Swezey, husband Scooter Gross and their three children reside in Nashville.
