## Vanderbilt Returns To Memorial Gym To Play Ole Miss

The Vanderbilt Commodores take on their first SEC West foe of the season on Wednesday night when Ole Miss visits Memorial Gym for an 8 p.m. CT tip-off. The game tips off at 11 a.m. CT, and can be heard on the Vanderbilt Sports Network from IMG College and vucommodores.com.

The game will also be televised on CSS, with Dave Baker and Barry Booker handling the play-by-play and color duties.

## Vanderbilt-Tennessee Tidbits

The Commodores let a 17 -point lead slip away at Tennessee as the Volunteers rallied for a $67-64$ win in Knoxville on Saturday afternoon. John Jenkins led three Commodores in double-figures with 21 points in the game.

- Vanderbilt is now 69-109 against the University of Tennessee.
- The Commodores fell to $17-67$ when playing in Knoxville.
- Head coach Kevin Stallings dropped to 10-13 against Tennessee and $4-8$ when playing in Thompson-Boling arena.
- John Jenkins made a three-point basket midway through the first half to extend Vanderbilt's consecutive game streak with a three-pointer to 778 games.
- The Commodores outshot the Volunteers $37.9 \%$ (11-29) to $20.0 \%(7-35)$ in the first half and are now 7-2 on the season when doing so.
- Vanderbilt held Tennessee to $20.0 \%(7-35)$ shooting in the first half, the lowest percentage an opponent has had against the Commodores this season.
- Tennessee's seven first-half field goals are the fewest an opponent has made against Vanderbilt this season and is one lower than Western Kentucky had on


December 1.

- For the third time this season, an opponent failed to make a three-pointer in the first half against the Commodores. Tennessee joins Nebraska and North Carolina this season.
- The 17-point first-half lead is the largest first half lead against an SEC opponent this season, topping the 14 point lead it had against South Carolina on January 8.
- Vanderbilt's 42 rebounds are the most it has recorded against an SEC opponent since grabbing 43 against Georgia on March 12, 2010.
- The Commodores 21 turnovers were the most since turning it over 23 times against Western Kentucky on December 1.
- Tennessee's 47 second-half points are the most

Vanderbilt has allowed in the second half this season.

- This marked the first time Vanderbilt has lost when outrebounding an opponent this year, winning the previous eight.


## Player Notes

- John Jenkins has scored in double-digits in all 15 games he has played in this season.
- Jenkins recorded his eighth 20-point game of the season (21 points) and tenth of his career.
- For the eighth time this season, Jenkins was perfect from the free-throw line, going 7-for-7.
- Festus Ezeli's six blocked shots matched a careerhigh set against Missouri on December 8; he now has 104 in his career.
- Brad Tinsley matched a career-high six rebounds against an SEC opponent; he also had a season-high three three-point field goals.

## About Ole Miss

Ole Miss enters the game with a 12-6 overall record and an 0-3 mark in the SEC after dropping their last contest at home to Georgia on Saturday, 98-76.

Seniors Chris Warren (18.4 ppg) and Zach Graham (14.3) lead the Rebels in scoring. Sophomore forward Reginald Buckner leads the team on the glass with 6.7 rebounds per game.

## The Ole Miss Series

Vanderbilt and Ole Miss will meet for the 111th time on Wednesday night at Memorial Gym, with the Commodores holding a 71-39 advantage in the overall series. The Commodores lead 46-5 all-time in games played in Nashville. In Oxford, the Rebels lead the series 30-22, and at neutral sites, Ole Miss holds a 4-3 advantage.

The last meeting between the two schools came in Oxford on February 18, 2010, in a game Vanderbilt won, 82-78. Vanderbilt has won two consecutive games in the series, and eight of the last nine dating back to the 2002-03 campaign.

## Stallings Versus Ole Miss

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is 8-4 in games played against Ole Miss, and is 4-1 against the Rebels at Memorial Gym.

## Stallings In SEC Play

Entering his 12th season of SEC play at the helm of the Commodores, Kevin Stallings has an 85-94 record in SEC play. In 2009-10, Stallings posted his best SEC record as a coach with a 12-4 mark.

## Stallings In Non-Conference Play

 Kevin Stallings is $140-47$ in non-conferencegames and an astounding 103-8 in home nonconference games.

## Vanderbilt Vs. The SEC

Vanderbilt has a 629-627 record against teams that currently comprise the SEC.

## Road Free Throws

Everyone knows getting to the free-throw line helps your chances in hostile road environments, and the Commodores have done a good job with that after their fourth true road game of the season. In their previous four (at Missouri, Middle Tennessee State, South Carolina, at Tennessee), Vanderbilt has made more free throws than their opponents have attempted. In the four games, VU is 70-104 (.673), while opponents are 41-61 (.672).

## Second Half Woes In SEC Play

In their two SEC losses on the road, the
Commodores have led by as many as 14 (at South Carolina) and 17 (at Tennessee), and their play in the second half has contributed to the losses.

In the three league games so far in the second half, Vanderbilt is being outscored 123-102, outrebounded 70-48 (37-15 on offensive glass), and opponents have attempted 49 more field goal attempts (116 to 67).

## VU Wins 700 At Memorial Gym

The Commodores got their 700th win at Memorial Gym with the win over Belmont on December 4. VU has posted a $704-188$ (.789) all-time record at the 59 -year old facility. Memorial Gym is the oldest basketball building in use in the Southeastern Conference. Vanderbilt has won 20 consecutive non-conference games at Memorial, with its last loss coming against UIC on December 3, 2008.

The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (787) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (662) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3 -pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

The Commodores received 52 points in the poll to finish behind Florida (110), Kentucky (95), Georgia (72), and Tennessee (71). South Carolina was chosen sixth (20).

Mississippi State was chosen to win the SEC West with 118 votes, 34 votes better than Ole Miss (84).

Florida received eight votes from the league's media to win the SEC Championship.

The Commodores (20-5, 9-2 Southeastern Conference) did it their way, grinding down the Rebels (17-8, 5-6) late with a relentless inside game that led to 34 free throw attempts -- three above their average in league play. Vanderbilt hit 19 of 22 free throws over the final 6:07 for its third straight win and 14th in 16 games.
Ogilvy was 8 of 10 from the field and 11 of 13 from the free throw line, while Jeffery Taylor added 19 points. Jermaine Beal hit 9 of 10 free throws to finish with 14 points.
Chris Warren led Mississippi with 23 points, but like many of the Rebels he spent much of the second half in foul trouble and was never a consistent threat.
Ole Miss opened the game with a flurry, scoring 16 points in the first $3: 52$ to take its biggest lead, $16-5$. The Rebels were 5 of 6 from the field and 4 of 4 from 3 -point range in that span. After that, though, they went cold, missing 18 of their next 22 shots and scoring just 12 more points in the half.
The Commodores hit 6 of 6 free throws during an $18-8$ run in which the Rebels missed 4 of 5 attempts from the line. Murphy Holloway missed the first shot of a 1 -and-1 -- his third failure to convert the bonus -- and Reginald Buckner missed two attempts as Vanderbilt made its move.

## Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 59th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 59th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.
"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival
Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 704-188 (.789) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 123 of its last 130 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 170-15 non-conference record at home (. 916 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 103-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

On the deciding play, Denmon deflected a pass toward the Missouri basket, retrieved the ball in plenty of time for a layup while being fouled by Brad Tinsley, then added the free throw.

John Jenkins had 23 points and five 3-pointers for Vanderbilt (7-2), which had won five straight. Tinsley missed on long 3-point attempts at the end of regulation and at the buzzer in overtime.

Jeffery Taylor added 18 points and 10 rebounds and Festus Ezeli had 16 points, nine rebounds and six blocked shots in the Commodores' first road game of the season.

## Notes

- Despite the loss, Vanderbilt still leads the all-time series, 3-2. Both losses have come in Columbia.
- Vanderbilt dropped its first true road contest of the season against Missouri.
- VU played its first overtime game of the 2010-11 campaign, and their first since a $96-94$ win over Georgia on February 25, 2010. The Commodores are now 55-49 in overtime games.
- Vanderbilt's last overtime loss came at Alabama on March 8, 2008 (73-78).
- The Commodores shot $52.5 \%$ for the game against Missouri, the sixth time this season that has happened. Wednesday was the first loss when shooting $50 \%$ or better.

NASHVILLE - Jeffery Taylor and Steve Tchiengang had 15 points each and Vanderbilt hit a season-high 13 3-pointers to breeze past Southeastern Louisiana 85-52.

Eight different Commodores made a 3 -pointer. Vanderbilt (8-2) shot 50 percent ( 13 of 26 ) from long distance, but only a little better from the free-throw line ( 14 of 24 ).

It was a career high for Tchiengang, who at 6 feet 9 stepped out and hit two 3 -pointers. Lance Goulbourne had 13 points, and John Jenkins added 12 on a team-high four 3-pointers.

The Lions (5-4) were led by Gary Dixon, who came off the bench to score 16. Antonnio Benton added 10 as the Southeastern Louisiana bench outscored its starters 36-16.

The Commodores rolled up a $53-24$ halftime lead behind a sizzling shooting performance. They converted 62.5 percent ( 20 of 32 ) from the floor. It was the most points they had scored in a first half since Nov. 24, 2007, against Bradley in the Cancun Challenge.

Vanderbilt hit eight 3-pointers in the opening 20 minutes. Jenkins knocked down three of them, and freshman Rod Odom had a pair.

Jenkins' trey with 47 seconds to go until halftime gave Vanderbilt its largest lead of the half at 53-19. The Commodores shot 53.3 percent ( 8 of 15) from long range in the opening stanza.

John Jenkins added 16 points, Festus Ezeli had 15, and Brad Tinsley 10 for Vanderbilt.

The Commodores (9-2) played without forwards Lance Goulbourne and Andre Walker. Goulbourne, the team's second-leading rebounder at 6.7 per game, was not on the bench but was in attendance.

Walker, who started the first seven games, has missed the past four with mononucleosis. He's scheduled to make his return for Vanderbilt's next game, Dec. 29 at home against Marquette.

The Commodores built a 14 -point lead at the half and the Blue Raiders (4-8) never got closer than eight in the second half. Vanderbilt shot 36 free throws, 26 in the second half, to just 14 for Middle Tennessee.

Jason Jones led Middle with 15 points. The Blue Raiders have lost four in a row.

Vanderbilt had its largest lead of the first half, 4127, at the half when Brad Tinsley went coast to coast with an inbounds pass after a free throw by Middle's Kerry Hammonds. Tinsley's layup came a second before the buzzer.

The Blue Raiders had cut the lead to six at 30-24 with 1:53 to go when Jenkins took over. He scored nine of his 11 first-half points in a 60 -second span beginning at 1:38 when he grabbed an offensive rebound along the left baseline and hit a stepback 3-pointer.

Jenkins followed with a steal near halfcourt, drove the right side, made the layup and converted the three-point play after getting fouled by Middle's Kyle Hunt. Forty-nine seconds later Jenkins' long 3 -pointer up top made it 39-26.

Andre Walker scored on a layup with 4.1 seconds left, and No. 24 Vanderbilt held off Marquette 77-76 in its first game since moving into the Top 25 this season.

Marquette (9-4) had the ball last. But JohnsonOdom tripped trying to drive to the basket, losing the ball at the buzzer.

Marquette coach Buzz Williams wasn't sure what exactly happened. Remember, coaches and teams sit on the end lines at Memorial Gym. Williams thought Dwight Buyckes' jumper that put the Golden Eagles up 76-75 with 19.5 seconds left was a 3 instead of a regular bucket.

The Commodores (10-2) improved to 102-8 in nonconference play at home under coach Kevin Stallings despite leading scorer John Jenkins going 2-of-15 from 3-point range. He finished with 13 points. Taylor had a team-high 19 points, Brad Tinsley added 15, Festus Ezeli had 12 and Steve Tchiengang 10.

Butler led Marquette with 15 points. JohnsonOdom finished with 14, Buycks 13, Chris Otule 12 and Vander Blue 10.

This was only the fifth meeting between these programs and the first since 1974 when Marquette beat the Commodores in the NCAA tournament.

Jeffery Taylor scored 22 points for Vanderbilt, while Brad Tinsley and Steve Tchiengang each added 14 and Festus Ezeli chipped in 12. Tinsley, a 6 -foot-3 guard, was the game's leading rebounder with 10 .

Taylor finished 6 of 10 from the field and 9 of 10 from the free throw line. Vanderbilt shot 43.4 percent ( 23 of 53 ) and held Davidson to a season-low 29.3 percent (22 of 75).

Jenkins, a sophomore shooting guard who is averaging 17.8 points per game, and Andre Walker, a 6-7 junior forward who averages 4.1 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.9 assists, both sustained injuries in practice.

Freshman Chris Czerapowicz had 16 points to lead Davidson (7-6). Jake Cohen, the Wildcats' leading scorer at 14.9 points, was held to a season-low two points. He fouled out with 9:06 to play.

Vanderbilt used a $15-0$ run to take a 23-6 lead with 11:05 to go in the first half. Tchiengang started the run with a 3 -pointer on the right wing, and Tinsley capped it 5 minutes later with a 3 -pointer from almost the identical spot.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina was up eight and as the final seconds ticked away, Vanderbilt went up for what appeared to be a meaningless layup.

But the Gamecocks' Sam Muldrow leaped up, got his fingertips on the ball, and ended up in his school's record books, getting just the second triple-double in South Carolina's history in an $83-75$ win over the No. 22 Commodores in Columbia.

Muldrow owned overtime, getting five points, including a crucial 3 , and four blocks in the extra period.
Freshman Bruce Ellington, in his first league game, got the Gamecocks ( $10-4,1-0$ ) to overtime. He scored 12 of the Gamecocks final 15 points in regulation -- burying four 3-pointers in seven minutes, including the final points of the second half that tied it at 72 with 2:09 to go.

He then gave South Carolina its first lead of the game with a layup on the first possession of overtime and his quick pass to Muldrow for an open 3 put South Carolina up 81-75 with 2:18 to go.

Ellington finished with 22 points and has scored at least 20 in five of the first 14 games of his college career.

John Jenkins led Vanderbilt (11-3, 0-1) with 27 points after missing the last game with a concussion. Jeffery Taylor added 14 points and Lance Goulbourne had nine points and 14 rebounds for the Commodores.
Vanderbilt jumped to an 11-point lead in the first 14 minutes of the game. But the Commodores could never put the Gamecocks away.

NASHVILLE - The Vanderbilt Commodores insist they learned a very painful lesson about protecting a lead in the Southeastern Conference.

John Jenkins and Festus Ezeli scored 18 points apiece and Vanderbilt beat No. 24 Georgia 73 - 66 on to snap the Bulldogs' nine-game winning streak and ruin their first game back in the Top 25 since the end of the 2003 season.

The Commodores (12-3, 1-1) bounced back after blowing their SEC opener with an overtime loss at South Carolina last weekend that knocked them out of the rankings. This time, they never trailed while improving to 52-13 against the Bulldogs at home.
Georgia (12-3, 1-1) had its own problems, having to bus in from Athens, Ga., on Tuesday because of a winter storm. The Bulldogs had such trouble even getting a bus they missed practice.

Coach Mark Fox refused to blame the travel problems for the poor play and his Bulldogs' first loss since Nov. 26 against Temple.

The Bulldogs never got closer than three in the second half. Travis Leslie led the Bulldogs with 21 points, Gerald Robinson added 20 and Trey Thompkins had 13.

Jeffery Taylor had 15 points for Vandy. Ezeli had a double-double, also grabbing 10 rebounds.

Vanderbilt couldn't protect a lead at South Carolina and lost $83-75$ even though they never trailed in regulation. This time, before a sold-out crowd, the Commodores led 40-32 at halftime and stayed in front throughout.

- Vanderbilt had a season-high eight steals, which tied a season-best.

After Harris' layup with 1:09 left and a timeout, John Jenkins stepped out of bounds with 44 seconds left. Melvin Goins missed two shots for the Vols, and Brad Tinsley fouled Brian Williams with 2.7 seconds left as he grabbed the rebound.

Instead of letting Tennessee take the ball in bounds, Rod Odom fouled Tobias Harris, sending him to the line for one-and-one. Harris hit both shots, and Williams stole the ball as Tinsley threw it in bound and the clock ran out.

It was the second time this season the Commodores watched a solid lead unravel. In an 83-75 overtime loss to South Carolina on Jan. 8, the Dores led by 11 points with $8: 42$ in the second half when the Gamecocks went on a $20-9$ run to close out regulation.

Vanderbilt pushed the first-half margin to 17 points on a free throw by Tinsley with 2:03 before halftime, but Tennessee put together a modest 7-0 run to close the half and cut the halftime margin to 30-20 in favor of the Dores.

The Vols used 48.7 percent shooting after the break to slowly chip away at the Commodores' lead, and a 3-pointer by Cameron Tatum with 3:03 to go gave them their first lead of the second half. Harris finished with 15 points, Tatum had 12 and Skylar McBee had 10 .

Jenkins led the Commodores (12-4, 1-2) with 21 points, Jeffery Taylor had 14 and Tinsley 12.
