### Vanderbilt Returns From Final Exams To Face Southeastern Louisiana

The Vanderbilt Commodores emerge from a 10-day, final-exam break to take on Southeastern Louisiana at 6 p.m. at Memorial Gym. The game can be heard on the Vanderbilt Sports Network from IMG College and vucommodores.com.

There will be no television for the contest, but a live webcast is available on vucommodores.com as a part of the All-Access package.

### Vanderbilt-Missouri Tidbits

The Commodores had a five-game winning streak ended in their last time out at Missouri on December 8th in an 85-82 loss to the Tigers. It was Vanderbilt's first overtime game and first true road game of the season. John Jenkins led all Commodore players with 23 points.

- Vanderbilt dropped its first true road contest of the season against Missouri.
- Vanderbilt is now 82-102 all-time in games against teams ranked in the AP Top 25, 18-123 in games on the road all-time against ranked opponents.
- Vanderbilt is now 27-48 in games played against ranked opponents and 6-24 in road games against ranked teams in the Stallings' era.
- VU played its first overtime game of the 2010-11 campaign, and their first since a 96-94 win over Georgia on February 25, 2010. The Commodores are now 55-49 in overtime games.
- Vanderbilt's last overtime loss came at Alabama on March 8, 2008 (73-78).
- The Commodores shot 52.5% for the game against Missouri, the sixth time this season VU has shot over 50%. Wednesday was the first loss when shooting 50% or better.
- Vanderbilt was 11-for-22 from the charity stripe (50%), its lowest of the season.

The previous low was 69.2% (18-26) against Nebraska on November 18.

- Missouri shot only 38.3% from the floor, the fifth time Vanderbilt has held its opponent to under 40% from the floor. The Commodores are now 3-2 in those games.

- Missouri rebounded Vanderbilt, 45-40, including 21-8 on the offensive glass. The Tigers outscored VU in second-chance points for the game, 12-7.

- Missouri attempted 81 shots in the game, the most by an opponent all season, and the most since South Carolina attempted 81 on February 28, 2009.

- The Commodores made nine threes, compared to eight for Missouri, the eighth time VU has made more threes than their opponent

- The Commodores had 10 blocks as a team, which tied for the most in the Stallings era (10 vs. Southern Miss (1/2/09); vs. MTSU (1/4/10); vs. Manhattan (12/30/09)).

- Ties: 12; Lead Changes: 22; Vanderbilt largest lead: 6, 2nd half (12:59).

- Missouri outscored Vanderbilt 36-32 in the paint, 12-7 off of second chance points, and 15-7 in bench points. VU outscored the Tigers 18-17 off of turnovers and both teams had six fast-break points.

#### Player notes:

- John Jenkins led the team with 23 points, his sixth 20+ effort of the season. He was 7-for-14 from the field, 5-for-10 from three, and 4-for-4 from the free throw line.

- Jeffery Taylor scored 18 points and grabbed 10 rebounds, his sixth career double-double and his first of 2010-11.

- Festus Ezeli tallied 16 points, his seventh double-figure scoring game of the season and 10th of his career. He also pulled down nine rebounds.

- Ezeli was 6-of-7 from the floor. He is now 28-for-35 from the field in his last four contests.

- Ezeli also had a career-high six blocks, the first time since Julian Terrell blocked six against Appalachian State on December 22, 2003.

- Lance Goulbourne scored in double figures with 11 points, his third double-figure game of the season and ninth of his career. He also added a career-high five assists.

- Rod Odom had a career-high four steals, and is now 7-for-8 in his last three games from beyond-the-arc.

- Taylor, 43 minutes, and Jenkins, 41 minutes, each played career highs in minutes.

## Team Notes

### About Southeastern Louisiana

Southeastern Louisiana is 5-3 after dropping a 59-38 decision to Alabama on Wednesday night in Tuscaloosa.

Trent Hutchin leads the Lions in scoring with 16.6 points per game and is shooting over 47.9% from three-point range on the season (23-48). Brandon Fortenberry (10.4) and David Ndoumba (10.4) also average double digits. Ndoumba leads the team on the glass with 7.4 rebounds per contest.

### Ezeli Claims VU's Third SEC POTW Nod

Center Festus Ezeli was honored by the SEC office on Monday with his first career SEC Player of the Week award for his play against Belmont and Western Kentucky during the week of November 29-December 6. Ezeli averaged 19.0 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.0 blocks in the two Commodore wins.

The three awards in the first four weeks of the season mark the first time since the honor's inception in 1985 that one school has won three out of the first four awards.

### Stallings Versus Southeastern Louisiana

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is 1-0 Southeastern Louisiana. His lone win as a head coach came in the Commodores' lone meeting with the Lions in 2002.

### Stallings In Non-Conference Play

Entering his 12th season at the helm of the Commodores, Kevin Stallings is 136-47 in non-conference games and an astounding 100-8 in home non-conference games.

### Vanderbilt Vs. The Southland Conference

Vanderbilt is 3-0 all-time against the Southland Conference, with wins over Central Arkansas, Nicholls State, and Southeastern Louisiana.

### VU Wins 700 At Memorial Gym

The Commodores got their 700th win at Memorial Gym with the win over Belmont on December 4. VU has posted a 700-188 (.788) all-time record at the 59-year old facility. Memorial Gym is the oldest basketball building in use in the Southeastern Conference.

### Commodores Near The Top In A Number Of SEC Categories

Although it's in the early goings of the 2010-11 campaign (as of 12/16), Vanderbilt has asserted itself near the top of the SEC team rankings in a number of different categories.

The Commodores rank first in free throw percentage (73.5) and rebound margin (+8.0), and second in scoring (79.7), scoring margin (+14.1), field goal percentage (47.6), 3-point field goal percentage defense (28.9), 3-point field goals made (8.1), and assists (15.7).

### Commodores Vs. Ranked Opponents

- Vanderbilt's game with Missouri was their second against a ranked opponent this season.

- Vanderbilt knocked off a top 10 team earlier this year (#8 North Carolina at the Puerto Rico Tip-Off) for the first time since defeating number one Tennessee, 72-69, on Feb. 26, 2008. The Commodores are now 82-102 in games against teams in the AP Top 25 all-time (since 1949). In the Stallings' era, Vanderbilt is now 27-48 in games against ranked opponents.

- In the 61-year history of the AP Poll, VU is 18-123 in road games against ranked opponents, however, their last win on the road came against #14 Tennessee last year in Knoxville, 85-76.

- The win over North Carolina was Vanderbilt's first over a ranked opponent in November in the Stallings era, and the first since defeating #4 UCLA, 75-71, on November 22, 1995.

### Fisher, Thompson Courtside to Call Action on Vanderbilt Radio Network From IMG College

Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson are back courtside this season, describing the action of every Commodore game to Vanderbilt followers throughout the Southeast.

Fisher, the Voice of the Commodores, will anchor Vanderbilt play-by-play for the 13th consecutive year.

A Nashville native, Fisher also handles the play-by-play broadcasting duties for Commodore football and a selected number of baseball games. He also serves as the Director of Broadcasting for Vanderbilt Student Athletics.

Prior to working for Vanderbilt, Fisher served as a television sports anchor in the Nashville market (1987-1996), with stints at WSMV-4 and WKRN-2. He also worked in the public relations field for two years.

Thompson, who is in his 10th year providing color commentary, played for Vanderbilt from 1975-79, receiving the Outstanding Leader and Civitan Sportsmanship Awards. He currently works with Nike College Sports Marketing.

Broadcast Engineer Bob Horner is in his 29th year courtside producing broadcasts of Commodore basketball. During his tenure, Horner has worked more than 750 games for Vanderbilt.

The broadcasts are produced by IMG College, the exclusive multi-media rightsholder for Vanderbilt. Jeff Miller is the general manager.

### 3-Point Streak Continues Through 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 771 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (781) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (658) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

### Vanderbilt Signs Three To NLI's

Vanderbilt head men's basketball coach Kevin Stallings announced the signing of 6'5 point guard **Kedren Johnson (Lewisburg, Tenn.)**, 6'8 forward **Shelby Moats (Waconia, Minn.)**, and 6'4 shooting guard **Dai-Jon Parker (Alpharetta, Ga.)** to National Letters of Intent. All three will be eligible to play for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2011-12.

Many have ranked the Commodores' group in their top 25 recruiting classes. ESPN has the group ranked #23 in the nation.

## Commodores Finish Third In San Juan

Vanderbilt saw some good competition at the 2010 Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off - the Commodores knocked off Nebraska and then-#8 North Carolina, and dropped a tough three-point decision to West Virginia in the tournament semifinals.

## VU Sets Rebounding Mark Against Grambling

Vanderbilt outrebounded Grambling, 65-26, on November 24, its largest margin of the season. The 65 rebounds is also the highest single-game total of the Stallings era.

# Preseason Team Notes

## Commodores Return Nine Scholarship Players From 2009-10

Vanderbilt returns nine scholarship players from 2009-10 and three walk-ons to the fold for the 2010-11 campaign. The Commodores' roster will sport three seniors (Joe Duffy, Darshawn McClellan, Chris Meriwether), seven juniors (Jeffery Taylor, Brad Tinsley, Andre Walker, Festus Ezeli, Steve Tchiengang, Lance Goulbourne, and Aaron Noll), two sophomores (John Jenkins, Jordan Smart), and four freshmen (Kyle Fuller, Josh Henderson, Rod Odom, James Siakam).

## 2009-10 Postseason Player Accolades

Senior guard Jermaine Beal became the 51st Vanderbilt player to make the All-SEC First Team since voting began in the 1948 campaign. The Commodores have had a player on the first team in four out of the last five years, and six in the last nine. Vanderbilt's last first-team selection was Shan Foster in 2008 - Foster also claimed the league's Player of the Year honor.

Jeffery Taylor's selection is his first to the All-SEC second team. He made the All-SEC freshman team in 2009. A.J. Ogilvy's selection to the second team is his third in three years. He was named to the All-Freshman team in 2008, and named to the second team in 2008, 2009, and now 2010.

John Jenkins is the 10th Vanderbilt player to be named to the All-Freshman team, and only the second to claim the league's Sixth Man of the Year award. Scott Hundley was the only other Commodore to be awarded with the honor, when he won it in 2004.

## Stallings Wins SEC Coach of the Year in 2010

Vanderbilt head coach won his second SEC Coach of the Year award in 2010 in a vote by SEC Coaches. He was also awarded with the honor in 2007 by the league's coaches. Stallings was also named the District 21 Coach of

the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, and a finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award.

## Quick 2009-10 Recap

- Vanderbilt made its 11th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and its fourth since 2004. The Commodores lost a heartbreaking, 66-65, decision to Murray State in San Jose, Calif.

- With the win over Ole Miss on February 18, 2010, Kevin Stallings clinched his fifth 20-win season as head coach of the Commodores, and his ninth as a head coach. Stallings is one 20-win season away from tying legendary VU head coach Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76), who had six.

- The Commodores went 12-4 in SEC play in 2009-10, the most conference wins since the 1992-93 season when the Commodores won the SEC regular season title with a 14-2 record. The 12 wins is a new league high under head coach Kevin Stallings.

- Vanderbilt finished SEC play with a 6-2 road record - the six wins is a new Stallings-era record for road league victories in a season, and ties for the most since divisional play began in the SEC in the 1991-92 season. The 1992-93 team also had six road wins in league play.

- The Commodores had a regular season sweep of Florida, the first since 2000-01, and Tennessee, the first time since the 2004-05 campaign. The last time Vanderbilt was unbeaten against Tennessee and Florida in the same season - 1966.

- The Commodores finished the season 14-2 in home games at Memorial Gym, the sixth time in the Stallings' era that Vanderbilt has finished with 14 or more wins at home.

- For the year, VU had 167 blocks, a new record for blocks in a season for a Vanderbilt team. The previous best was 137 blocked shots, which happened in 2008-09.

- Vanderbilt finished the regular season with 23 wins, which tied for third most in school history with the 1965 and 1974 teams ... Only the 1993 and 2008 teams had more regular season victories (25).

- Vanderbilt made 616 free throws in 2009-10, which is the second most in school history and most since making 742 during the 1989-90 season ... VU surpassed its total of 594 from the 1971-72 season.

- Vanderbilt was ranked in the Top 25 10 times in 2009-10 and for eight straight weeks. The number 13 ranking in the AP poll was Vanderbilt's best since January 7, 2008, when the Commodores also came in at the 13 spot in the Associated Press poll.

## Getting to the Line

In 16 SEC games, Vanderbilt went to the free throw line an SEC-best 471 times, an average of 29.4 times per game. In fact, the Commodores made 355 in SEC play, which is more than nine teams in the SEC attempted in league play. VU was first in the league in free throw percentage in all games (72.1, 616-854) and in SEC games only at 75.4% (355-471).

## Beal and Ogilvy Depart

Two Vanderbilt All-SEC players from 2009-10, Jermaine Beal and A.J. Ogilvy, have departed the Commodore roster for the 2010-11 campaign. Beal, who graduated in May, and Ogilvy, who left school early to pursue professional basketball opportunities, combined to score 36.4% of the team's points a year ago. Both also left as 1,000-point scorers.

## International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very wordly roster, with players from four different countries. , Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang and James Siakam are from Cameroon.

## Commodores Add Four Freshmen In 2010-11

The Commodores have added four freshmen to the roster in 2010-11. Freshman point guard Kyle Fuller (6'1, 180), center Josh Henderson (6'11, 220), forward Rod Odom (6'9, 207), and James Siakam (6'7, 210) have joined the Vanderbilt roster.

## Vanderbilt And National Rankings

The Commodores ended the season ranked 26th in the nation in blocks (5.2 bpg), 29th in scoring offense (76.9), and 34th in field goal percentage (47.0).

## McClellan Redshirting

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings announced after the Alabama Huntsville game that senior forward Darshawn McClellan will redshirt the 2010-11 season. He is on track to graduate in May with a degree in Human and Organizational Development and will have one year of eligibility remaining.

# Individual Notes

## #44 Jeffery Taylor

- Tallied first double-double of the season with 18 points and 10 rebounds against Missouri (12/8).
- Had 16 points and 8 rebounds vs. Belmont (12/4).
- Scored 13 points vs. Western Kentucky (12/1) his 50th career double-digit scoring game.
- Scored a career-high 27 points in season opener against Presbyterian on 11-of-12 shooting.
- A preseason All-SEC selection by the media and the league's coaches, put on 25 pounds of muscle this offseason and is ready for a breakout season in 2010-11. Taylor has scored in double-digits in 45 career games, and has started every game of his Vanderbilt career.

## #23 John Jenkins

- Led team with 23 points at Missouri (12/8), 22 points against Grambling (11/24), 21 vs. App. State (11/27), and 21 vs. WKU (12/1) - has led the team in scoring in seven of nine games this season.
- Scored 20 or more points in six games this season; made at least 5 threes in four games.
- Won SEC Player of the Week for his play at the Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off... Averaged 21.7 points and 3.0 rebounds in three games, and led the Commodores in scoring in each of the three games during the tournament. Jenkins finished the tournament having made 25-of-28 free throws (.893) and was selected to the Puerto Rico Tip-Off All-Tournament team.
- Scored career-high 27 points vs. WVU (11/19); also had a career-high in FG attempts (19), 3-point FG attempts (11), and was a perfect 10-for-10 from the FT line (both career highs).
- Named as a second-team, All-SEC pre-season selection by the league's coaches prior to the 2010-11 season.
- Named to the SEC All-Freshman team and was named the Sixth Man of the Year by the league's coaches in 2009-10...Averaged 11.0 points per game, and shot 48.3% (72-149) from three in his freshman season.

- Played in all 33 games and made 27 starts as a sophomore at the two guard...Averaged 6.9 points, 2.5 rebounds, and 2.8 assists per game...Scored in double figures in eight games, including a season-best 18-point performance at Georgia (2/25).
- Played in all 31 games and started 28 in his true freshman campaign...Averaged 11.0 points, 2.5 rebounds, and 2.8 assists per game in 31.0 minutes of action per game... Made 69 threes in his freshman season, which tied Shan Foster (2004-05) for the school's then-single season three-point field goals made record by a freshman.

The Commodores received 52 points in the poll to finish behind Florida (110), Kentucky (95), Georgia (72), and Tennessee (71). South Carolina was chosen sixth (20).

Mississippi State was chosen to win the SEC West with 118 votes, 34 votes better than Ole Miss (84).

Florida received eight votes from the league's media to win the SEC Championship.

- In **32 seasons** as a player and coach, his teams have made **25 tournament appearances**, including **17 NCAA berths** and **three Final Fours**.
- He has posted **20-win seasons 22 times** and has won **12 conference championships**.
- Stallings has posted just one losing season in **32 seasons as a player and coach**.
- Stallings is the **second winningest coach in Vanderbilt history** with 220 victories.
- Stallings is the **first Vanderbilt coach to lead two Commodore squads to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16** since the field expanded to as many as 64 teams in 1985.
- Stallings is only the **second coach in Vanderbilt history to register five 20-win seasons** (Roy Skinner - six).
- **All 29 of his seniors at Vanderbilt have earned their degree or are working towards it.**
- **One of only three Vanderbilt coaches with 150 or more wins.**
- Led 2007-08 team to a **perfect 19-0 record at home, the most single-season home wins in the history of the program.**

# Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952

## HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 59TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 59th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 700-188 (.788) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 120 of its last 127 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 167-15 non-conference record at home (.916 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 100-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

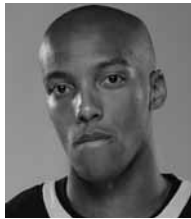

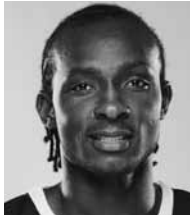
