- Vanderbilt hosts Ole Miss for a 3 p.m. CT kick at Vanderbilt Stadium with live television coverage on SEC Network.
- The contest is designated as the team's second annual "Set The Expectation" game. The Commodores became the first SEC program to host a "Set The Expectation" game in the 2019 home opener versus Georgia. The event originated in June of 2019, when Brenda Tracy, a registered nurse from Oregon, shared with the football team her devastating personal story and vital message of preventing sexual violence. Tracy, who spoke with the team again this fall, also serves on the NCAA's Commission to Combat Campus Sexual Violence.
- The Commodores and Rebels have played annually since 1970 with Saturday's tilt marking the 95th in the series. The only team Vandy has played more than Ole Miss is Tennessee with 114 games. Vanderbilt and Ole Miss have split the last two contests with the Commodores winning 36-29 in overtime in 2018 and the Rebels responding in 2019 with a 31-6 victory.
- Vandy has not played since Oct. 10 against South Carolina after it's Oct. 17 date at Missouri was postponed to Dec. 12. The Commodores' scheduled open date was Oct. 24.
- Vanderbilt's Ken Seals became just the third SEC true freshman quarterback to start a season opener, and the first to do so in a true road game, when he took the field at Texas A&M on Sept. 26. His first two games were against top-20 opponents in No. 10 Texas A&M and No. 20 LSU. He is the fourth true freshman since 2012 to make his first two starts against top-20 foes, and the first since Tanner Mangum of BYU did so in 2015 against No. 20 Boise State (Sept. 12) and No. 10 UCLA (Sept. 19).
- After totaling 1.5 sacks against South Carolina, senior defensive end Dayo Odeyingbo paces the Commodores with 3.5 tackles for lost vardage and 2.5 sacks.
- Junior tight end Ben Bresnahan owns a team-leading 11 receptions. He entered the campaign with only seven career catches. Bresnahan finished the South Carolina game with a career-high tying 38 receiving yards.
- Vanderbilt has three offensive touchdowns this season, scored by three Commodores: Bresnahan, junior wide receiver Amir Abdur-Rahman and junior wide receiver Cam Johnson.
- Sophomore Jayden Harrison returned his first career kickoffs against South Carolina, averaging 20.8 yards/return. Overall, the Commodores rank third in the SEC in kickoff return average (24.1).
- Vanderbilt added its first punt returns of the season against the Gamecocks with Johnson running two back for 16 total yards (8.0 yards/return).
- Sophomore linebacker Anfernee Orji, who shifted from safety this season, owns a team-leading 19 tackles in three contests after recording six in nine games as a true freshman.
- The Commodores recovered three fumbles at Texas A&M, the most in a game since jumping on three at No. 10 Florida on Nov. 7, 2015. Vanderbilt added another fumble recovery against South Carolina and is tied for 21st nationally in fumbles recovered (4). The Commodores had five fumble recoveries in all of 2019.
- Vandy has gained five turnovers this season and has at least one turnover gained in each of the first three games. The last time Vanderbilt had caused a turnover in three consecutive games was Aug. 31-Sept. 21, 2019, also in the first three contests of the season.
- Vanderbilt leads the SEC in four penalty categories: fewest penalties/game (3.3), fewest penalty yards/game (26.7), fewest penalties (10) and fewest penalty yards (80).
- Vanderbilt chose seven team captains for the 2020 campaign: Odeyingbo, fifth-year linebacker Andre Mintze, Johnson, junior defensive back Camden Coleman, cornerback Elijah Hamilton, center Grant Miller and punter Harrison Smith.

- This marks the 95th meeting between Vanderbilt and Ole Miss, the 11th most-played series in SEC history.
- The only team Vanderbilt has played more often than Ole Miss is Tennessee (114 games).
- Vanderbilt and Ole Miss have played annually since 1970.
- The Vanderbilt-Ole Miss game has been played at four sites besides the on-campus stadiums in Nashville and Oxford: Memorial Stadium in Jackson, Mississippi, Crump Stadium and the Liberty Bowl in Memphis, and Nissan Stadium in Nashville.

1999 • Vanderbilt won 37-24 in overtime for its first SEC road victory since 1993. Quarterback Greg Zolman threw for 344 yards, including a last-minute touchdown to Todd Yoder to tie the game. In overtime, Zolman hit tight end Elliott Carson for the win.

2002 • Freshman running back/kickoff returner Kwane Doster posted one of the most productive games in Vanderbilt history, compiling 344 all-purpose yards (101 rushing yards and a league-record 243 yards in kick returns).

2003 • The Commodores received outstanding performances from a pair of sophomores in quarterback Jay Cutler and wide receiver Erik Davis. Cutler completed 20 passes for 248 yards while Davis posted a career-best 138 receiving yards.

2005 • Using rushing touchdowns from Jeff Jennings and Cassen Jackson-Garrison, the Commodores led 24-3 lead before Ole Miss rallied 24-23. In the fourth, Jay Cutler guided a game-clinching touchdown drive. In the final second, linebacker Moses Osemwegie sealed the win with a sack and forced fumble.

2007 • Cassen Jackson-Garrison rushed for 119 yards and three scores to give the Commodores their second straight home win in the series.

2008 • Vandy's defense forced six turnovers in a 23-17 win at Ole Miss. Safety Ryan Hamilton earned national defensive player of the week accolades after tying a team record with three interceptions. The victory was saved late when Chris Marve forced a Rebel fumble into the Ole Miss end zone.

2012 • Vanderbilt rallied from a 23-6 second-half deficit to edge the Rebels 27-26 in Oxford. The deciding score was a 26-yard touchdown toss by quarterback Jordan Rodgers with 52 seconds left on the clock. The victory assured bowl eligibility for the Commodores. Rodgers was 20-of-35 for 267 yards and two touchdowns in the game.

2018 • The Commodores and Rebels went to overtime before Vanderbilt went ahead in the extra period on a Kyle Shurmur-to-Kalija Lipscomb touchdown. Cornerback Joejuan Williams sealed the win by knocking down a fourth-down pass by the Rebels. Running back Ke'Shawn Vaughn gained 127 yards and a score in the Vanderbilt victory.

- On a side wall of Vanderbilt Stadium, near the south (tunnel) endzone, will be a graphic in honor of former assistant Osia Lewis.
- In May, Lewis lost his three-year-plus battle with a form of liver cancer called cholangiocarcinoma.
- In 2016, Lewis joined the Vanderbilt football staff as senior defensive assistant and
 outside linebackers coach. Following his diagnosis, Lewis stepped away from his
 on-field coaching role, but continued his duties as a senior defensive assistant. He
 also carried the title special consultant to Mason.
- On his sweat plate, senior defensive lineman Dayo Odeyingbo wears #LewisStrong.

#FEEDOURHEROES

 When the coronavirus pandemic arrived in Nashville, Mason and his wife Leighanne came up with a way to give back to the community. As part of the Masons' #FeedOurHeroes initiative, they purchased meals from 10 local restaurants to feed 700 individuals across 16 medical sites.

 games of the season. He is the third SEC true freshman to start a season opener

HENRY-BROOKS MAKES 2020 DEBUT

- After missing the first two games, sophomore running back Keyon Henry-Brooks made his 2020 debut against South Carolina and totaled a career-high 72 yards.
- Henry-Brooks has rushed for at least 70 yards in his last two outings, finishing the 2019 campaign with 70 at Tennessee.
- Last fall as a true freshman, Henry-Brooks was the top reserve to Ke'Shawn Vaughn and tallied 252 ground yards, second on the team to Vaughn, and a touchdown on 56 carries. Henry-Brooks added 17 receptions for 64 yards during the campaign.

BRESNAHAN ENJOYING STRONG START TO 2020

- Junior tight end Ben Bresnahan, in his first year as a starter, has eclipsed his career reception total. The medicine, health and society major had seven grabs in 2019 and has a team-leading 11 in 2020.
- Against No. 20 LSU, Bresnahan caught his first career touchdown pass and finished
 with three receptions for 31 yards. A week earlier at No. 10 Texas A&M, Bresnahan
 caught three balls for 31 yards.
- Bresnahan is second on the team with five receptions for first downs. He paces the squad in receptions on first downs with five.

ABDUR-RAHMAN RETURNS, STARTS STRONG

- After playing in just one game in 2019 due to a season-ending injury suffered against No. 3 Georgia in the opener, junior wide receiver Amir Abdur-Rahman has turned in an impressive start to 2020.
- He finished with a career performance at No. 10 Texas A&M, catching a personal-best five passes for a career-high 72 yards and a touchdown.
- Within the SEC, Abdur-Rahman ranks 15th in receiving yards on third down with 68, tied for 14th in catches on third down with five and tied for 12th in catches on third down that went for a first down with four.
- Abdur-Rahman has already doubled his career receptions total (four) this season alone (eight) and has surpassed the yardage total with 122 this fall after entering the campaign with 108.

LOOOKING TO RUN INTO THE END ZONE

 Vanderbilt is looking for its first rushing touchdown of the season and first against a Power 5 program since Vaughn's five-yard dash against Kentucky on Nov. 16, 2019.

REPLACING KE'SHAWN VAUGHN

- Vanderbilt's run game entered the 2020 season with just two career starts returning from its running backs, tied for the 15th fewest in the country.
- The Commodores are replacing Vaughn, who was selected by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the third round of the 2020 NFL Draft. Over the last two seasons, no SEC player had rushed for more yards than Vaughn:

SUSTAINING DRIVES

- Vandy has owned the ball for an average of 31:06 minutes/game this fall, up from a 29:10 average last fall. The 31:06 average is the program's highest since a 31:48 mark in 2016.
- In the season opener at No. 10 Texas A&M, the Commodores had a 7:58 edge in time of possession.

JUST ONE FUMBLE LOST

- Vanderbilt lost its first fumble of the season against South Carolina. The team lost

GUIDING THE OFFENSE IN 2020

- The Vanderbilt offense is under new oversight in 2020 with offensive coordinator Todd Fitch taking over the reins. Fitch, a 35-year college football veteran, came to West End after a successful stint with head coach Skip Holtz at Louisiana Tech, where he helped the Bulldogs to four consecutive postseason victories.
- Vandy welcomed two more new offensive assistant coaches in 2020 with Tony Ball (wide receivers) and Pete Rossomando (offensive line).
- Fitch (1986) and Vanderbilt baseball head coach Tim Corbin (1984) are graduates of Ohio Wesleyan.

Defense

RUN DEFENSE SHOWS IMPROVEMENT

- Through three Southeastern Conference games in 2019, the Commodores surrendered 917 rushing yards, an average of 305.7 yards/game.
- Vandy has yielded 633 ground yards (211.0 yards/game).
- The Commodore rush defense had allowed just two rushing touchdowns in 2020 before surrendering five to South Carolina.

ODEYINGBO NEARS VANDERBILT CAREER TOP 10 IN TACKLES FOR LOSS

 With 1.5 sacks against South Carolina, senior defensive end Dayo Odeyingbo upped his career total to 26.5 tackles for loss, just shy of the Vanderbilt top 10:

- Odeyingbo leads the Commodores with 3.5 tackles for loss, tied for 16th in the SEC, and 2.5 sacks this season, tied for the 10th-highest league total.
- During the first quarter against the Gamecocks, Odeying bo finished with four tackles,
 1.5 sacks and a quarter back pressure.

MAHONEY TALLIES PAIR OF TACKLES FOR LOSS

 Sophomore cornerback Jaylen Mahoney booked 2.0 tackles for lost yardage against South Carolina, eclipsing his 2019 season total of 1.5.

LIVING BEHIND THE LINE

- Vanderbilt booked a season-high 8.0 tackles for loss against South Carolina. The 8.0 stops behind the line of scrimmage were the most for the Commodores against a Power 5 foe since 8.0 against Missouri on Oct. 19, 2019.
- Vandy had 4.0 total tackles for loss in each of the first two games before doubling the total against the Gamecocks.
- The Commodores were credited with seven quarterback pressures against South Carolina, tied with seven against Middle Tennessee on Sept. 10, 2016, for their most under head coach Derek Mason.

KAUFMAN BOOKS DOUBLE-DIGIT TACKLES

- True freshman safety Donovan Kaufman booked a career-high 10 tackles, as well as his first career pass breakup, against No. 20 LSU.
- · Kaufman ranks fifth on the team with 15 tackles.
- Among freshmen in the SEC, Kaufman stands second in tackles per game with 7.5:

- Sophomore linebacker Anfernee Orji has adjusted to his new role and has been one
 of the Commodores' leading tacklers. Last fall, Orji played in nine games at safety
 and on special teams before shifting to linebacker for this season.
- Orji booked a career-high eight stops against South Carolina.
- He tops on the team in tackles with 19.

BALL HAWKS

- The Commodores are tied for 11th in the SEC in total turnovers gained with five (1.7 turnovers gained/game), coming from four fumbles and one interception.
- Vandy finished the entire 2019 campaign with just 11 turnovers gained in 12 games (0.9 turnovers gained/game).
- Vanderbilt recovered three fumbles at Texas A&M, a first for the Commodores since jumping on three at No. 10 Florida on Nov. 7, 2015, and second time under Mason.
- The Commodores enter the Ole Miss game tied for 21st nationally in fumbles recovered with four.
- Junior safety Brendon Harris forced his first career fumble in the fourth quarter against South Carolina with junior defensive lineman Raashaan Wilkins Jr. making his first career fumble recovery.

LOCKING DOWN ON THIRD DOWN

Opponents have converted just 14-of-36 third downs against Vanderbilt this season. The Commodores rank seventh in the conference in third-down conversion percentage allowed (38.9%), and are first in number of third downs allowed.

LEADING TACKLERS ARE BACK

 Vanderbilt brought back its top tackler in linebacker Dimitri Moore (99) as well as the team leader in tackles for loss in Odeyingbo (12.0) and sacks in linebacker Andre Mintze (4.5).

DEFENSE UNDER NEW LEADERSHIP IN 2020

- The Vanderbilt defense features a new coordinator for 2020 with Ted Roof coming to West End. Roof, a championship-winning defensive coordinator and former Power Five head coach, marks his 33rd year in college football.
- Vandy welcomes two more new defensive assistant coaches in 2020 with Aaron Henry (cornerbacks) and Kenechi Udeze (linebackers).

Special Teams

KAUFMAN TURNS ON THE JETS

- Freshman kickoff returner Donovan Kaufman turned in a solid performance against No. 20 LSU with three runbacks for 101 yards.
- Kaufman exploded with a 58-yard kickoff return in the second quarter, the longest for Vanderbilt since Darrius Sims' 95-yard return at Georgia on October 15, 2016.

HARRISON ADDS KICKOFF RETURN DUTIES

 Sophomore Jayden Harrison returned his first career kickoffs against South Carolina and ran back five for 104 yards (20.8 yards/return). The Nashville product ranks fourth in the SEC in kickoff return average:

- Vanderbilt had its first punt return of 2020 in the opening quarter against South Carolina with junior Cam Johnson running one back 10 yards. Johnson added another six-yard punt return later in the contest.
- At No. 10 Texas A&M, both Aggie punts both sailed out of bounds. Against No. 20 LSU, the Tigers' first punt went out of bounds and the second and third were fair caught by Johnson.
- Last season's top return option was Justice Shelton-Mosley, who handled 33 of Vanderbilt's 40 (82.5%) kickoff or punt returns. He averaged 9.1 yards per punt return in 2019.

PUNTER DUTIES HANDLED BY SMITH

- Junior Harrison Smith is back to punt after averaging 43.0 yards/boot last fall.
- Smith led the SEC in total punting yardage (3,313) in 2019 and stood sixth nationally.
- Smith is now averaging 42.8 yards/kick to rank 35th nationally. He has caused six fair catches with five punts downed inside the 20-yard line and eight boots of 50 or more yards.

NEW KICKER FOR 2020

- Junior Pierson Cooke has taken over the kicking duties after appearing in nine games as a kickoff specialist in 2019.
- Cooke kicked off 29 times for 1,816 yards and 20 touchbacks last fall but had not attempted a placement kick in college before the Texas A&M tilt.
- Cooke, who has also handled all seven of the Commodores' kickoffs this fall, is 1-of-4
 on field goal tries, converting from 33 yards on his first attempt before misses from
 45 yards, 22 yards and 29 yards. He has drilled all three extra point tries.

DUO HELPS FORM BLACK STUDENT-ATHLETE GROUP

- Senior defensive lineman Cam Robinson and junior linebacker Elijah McAllister teamed up with track's Taiya Shelby and soccer's Olivia Simmons to take action, focusing on improving the Black student-athlete experience at Vanderbilt, among other issues.
- One of their first acts was to help organize a voter registration drive on Tuesday, Sept. 22 at Vanderbilt Stadium. The event was one of several campus efforts planned to encourage voter engagement.
- Also among the students' goals are to create a safe and comfortable space for Black student-athletes, provide a formal support system to offer the necessary actions and conversations to improve the social experience of Black student-athletes at Vanderbilt, work to address racial issues in sports and offer guidance toward professional development and personal growth.
- A three-day event in January at the University of Texas, the Black Student-Athlete Summit, motivated Shelby and McAllister to be change agents in West End. It was there they met student-athletes from around the country, participated in workshops and discussions, and heard from guest speakers like journalist Jemele Hill.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

- Off the field, the Vanderbilt football team topped the SEC with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 95 for the 2018-19 academic year.
- Vanderbilt was one of seven schools to earn Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) Public Recognition Award for four straight years (2016-19): Air Force, Duke, Michigan, Northwestern, Stanford and Wisconsin were the others.

GEORGE-MINTZE VLOG GOES VIRAL

- On Sept. 4, senior cornerback Allan George proposed to his girlfriend Katlyn Richardson, who is a member of the Vanderbilt cheerleading squad. Senior linebacker
 Andre Mintze filmed the moment, which took place inside Vanderbilt Stadium, and
 posted it on his YouTube Channel Dre Mintze TV.
- The video has received more than 20,000 views and was picked up by SportsCenter and Bleacher Report.

HAYE A VANDERBILT AND SEC LEGEND

- Second-year defensive line coach Jovan Haye was a two-time captain and All-Southeastern Conference performer for the Commodores while starting 34 games on the defensive line from 2002-04.
- Haye was also tabbed Vanderbilt's SEC legend In 2019.

ROSSOMANDO A NORTHEAST-10 CONFERENCE OUTSTANDING INDIVIDUAL

- During the 2020-21 Academic Year the Northeast-10 is celebrating it's 40th anniversary by honoring 40 outstanding individuals and 40 iconic moments from throughout the conference's history. Vanderbilt offensive line coach Pete Rossomando was tabbed as one of the leagaue's outstanding individuals.
- Rossomando was named the head coach of the University of New Haven in December 2007, after the university reinstated its football program following a five-year hiatus.
 During his five years leading the Chargers, the program went 42-13 and made two NCAA Division II playoff appearances. Rossomando was named Liberty Mutual NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year following the 2012 season.

SEC COUNCIL MEMBERS

Head coach Derek Mason, along with Vanderbilt baseball head coach Tim Corbin
and athletic director Candice Lee, currently serve on the SEC Council on Racial
Equity and Social Justice, a league-wide body consisting of a diverse group of
student-athletes, administrators, coaches and SEC staff.

VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY • VANDERBILT ATHLETICS

- Vanderbilt is ranked 14th among national universities by U.S. News & World Report.
 It ranks ninth in best value schools and 12th in best undergraduate teachings by the magazine.
- According to the 2021 Princeton Review, Vanderbilt ranks second for best quality
 of life, happiest students and most beautiful campuses in the nation.
- The university was founded in 1873 with a \$1 million gift from "Commodore" Cornelius Vanderbilt. Kirkland Hall, which continues as the main administration building on campus, is the only original structure that remains today.
- In September, the university launched Destination Vanderbilt, a \$100 million university excellence initiative to recruit new faculty. Over the next two to four years, the university will leverage the investment to recruit approximately 60 faculty who are leaders and rising stars in their fields.
- An internationally renowned political scientist and management scholar, Daniel Diermeier is the ninth chancellor of Vanderbilt University. He began his term as chancellor on July 1, 2020.

- Vanderbilt Athletics is the only Power 5 Conference member, and one of two FBS programs, with an African American in the key roles of athletics director (Candice Storey Lee), football head coach (Derek Mason) and men's basketball head coach (Jerry Stackhouse).
- Vanderbilt athletics director Candice Story Lee is one of five female athletic directors at Power 5 schools, joining University of Washington's Jennifer Cohen, Penn State's Sandy Barbour, Pittsburgh's Heather Lyke and Virginia's Carla Williams.
- Notable Vanderbilt alumni include PGA Tour FedEx Cup winner Brandt Snedeker, LPGA golfer and 2019 Solheim Cup USA team member Marina Alex, NBA champions Will Perdue, Festus Ezeli and Damian Jones, numerous Major League Baseball standouts such as David Price, Sonny Gray, Dansby Swanson and Walker Buehler, and more than 12 players active in the NFL such as cornerbacks Casey Hayward and Joejuan Williams, linebackers Zach Cunningham and Oren Burks, lineman Stephen Weatherly and receiver Trent Sherfield.





Something to Build On

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - Isaiah Spiller had 117 yards rushing, Ainias Smith ran for a touchdown and No. 10 Texas A&M overcame three turnovers to beat Vanderbilt 17-12 in the season-opener for both teams.

Spiller had 5 five yards rushing in the first half before getting going after halftime. Smith added 51 yards rushing after switching from receiver to running back this season to steady the offense on a night when Kellen Mond fumbled twice, losing one.

The Aggies didn't trail after the first quarter but were never able to pull away because of three fumbles and a penalty that resulted in a safety.

Vanderbilt started Ken Seals at quarterback, making him just the third true freshman quarterback to start a SEC season opener since freshman eligibility was restored in 1972. He threw for 150 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions.

Spiller got things going for A&M after halftime when he ran for 57 yards on the first play of the third quarter. Texas A&M pushed the lead to 14-5 when Mond connected with Caleb Chapman on a 17-yard TD pass two plays later.

Seals threw an interception on Vanderbilt's next drive, but the Aggies couldn't cash in on the mistake after Mond fumbled at the end of a run on the ensuing possession.

The Commodores cut the lead to 14-12 late in the third quarter when Seals threw a perfect strike to Amir Abdur-Rahman in the corner of the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown. Abdur-Rahman had five receptions for 72 yards — both career highs.

The Aggies added a field goal early in the fourth quarter to make it 17-12. Texas A&M was driving later in the quarter when Daevion Davis forced a fumble after a reception by Jalen Preston and recovered it to give Vanderbilt the ball at their own 42.

But a pass by Seals was tipped and intercepted by Leon O'Neal. He returned it 35 yards and the Aggies got 15 more yards after Chris Pierce was flagged for a late hit when he threw O'Neal down at the end of the run while he was out of bounds on the A&M sideline.

The Aggies came away empty on their next drive when Mond fumbled the handoff on fourth-and-1. But Vanderbilt had to punt it back to allow Texas A&M to hold on for the victory.

Vanderbilt led 3-0 in the first quarter before Smith ran 25 yards for a touchdown to put A&M on top.

There were about eight minutes left in the second quarter when Andre Mintze hit Mond to force a fumble which was recovered by Dashaun Jerkins. The Commodores couldn't move the ball and had to punt. But Brian George received a personal foul for a blind side block in the end zone to give Vanderbilt a safety to cut the lead to 7-5.

The defending national champs never trailed after losing their season opener to Mississippi State when Brennan was sacked seven times. LSU also extended its winning streak over the Commodores to nine in a series it leads 24-7-1.

The Tigers outgained Vanderbilt 498-266, and the defense came up with two interceptions and a pair of sacks.

Brennan completed passes to 11 different receivers against a Vanderbilt defense that had consistent pressure against Kellen Mond in an opening loss at Texas A&M.

Terrace Marshall Jr. finished with two TDs on two catches, and Jontre Kirklin had 65 yards receiving and two TD catches, the second a toe-tapper at the back of the end zone off a flea flicker. John Emery ran for 103 yards and a TD.

Vanderbilt had its chances with freshman Ken Seals making his home debut. When Randall Haynie picked off an overthrown pass from Brennan, Seals hit tight end Ben Bresnahan with an 8-yard TD pass to pull the Commodores to 14-7 in the second quarter.

Todd Harris Jr. picked off Seals' pass at the goal line early in the fourth quarter.

Fighting the Uncontrollables

 $NASHVILLE, Tenn. - South Carolina \ quarterback \ Collin \ Hill \ ran \ for \ two \ touchdowns \ and \ Kevin \ Harris \ ran \ for \ two \ TDs \ and \ a \ career-high \ 171 \ yards \ as \ the \ Gamecocks \ beat \ Vanderbilt \ 41-7.$

South Carolina won its 12th straight in this series by dominating Vanderbilt 486-249 in total offense and three sacks on a rainy day. The Gamecocks had more yards rushing (290) than the Commodores had total yards.

Harris ran for a 25-yard TD early in the third and added a career-long 88-yarder early in the fourth

Vanderbilt remains winless after having 56 scholarship players available for this game, just three above the limit set by the Southeastern Conference for a team to play a game. The Commodores already had six players opt out of this season.

Vanderbilt coach Derek Mason said he learned Thursday that his numbers would be limited by injuries and contact tracing during a pandemic.

Parker White kicked a pair of field goals, including a 43-yarder that gave the Gamecocks the lead for good in the first quarter.

Vanderbilt had its chances early to either tie or take a lead. Pierson Cooke missed a 29-yard field goal wide right for Vanderbilt and is now 1 of 4 this season.

In the second quarter, the Commodores went for it on fourth-and-2 at the South Carolina 3. Freshman Ken Seals rolled right and wound up being tackled, missing the chance to throw to a receiver in the end zone when open or run himself.

Hill hit Nick Muse with a 32-yard pass, starting a 12-play, 96-yard drive that the South Carolina quarterback capped himself for a 14-point swing. Hill went over the top for a 1-yard touchdown and a 10-0 lead with 2:09 left in the first half.

South Carolina scored the final 24 points. Hill ran for a 10-yard TD in the third, and Harris broke loose for his 88-yarder and Dakeron Joyner had a 47-yard TD, both in the fourth.
