THE MATCHUP

- After two weeks away from home, Vanderbilt returns to West End this weekend for a matchup with the South Carolina Gamecocks at noon on ESPNU.
- This will be the 29th all-time meeting between Vanderbilt and South Carolina (Vanderbilt leads 14-7-7).

First Meeting: 09.08.95 (W, 3-0)

Last Meeting: 11.07.19 (L, 0-2 in SEC Tournament)

Last Vanderbilt Win: 10.16.15 (2-1, OT)

Last Opponent Win: 11.07.19 (2-0 in SEC Tournament)

Last Draw: 10.13.19 (0-0)

- Though South Carolina won the last meeting in the 2019 SEC Tournament, each of the previous two regular season meetings have ended in scoreless draws with South Carolina ranking within the Top 10 on both occasions.
- Under Darren Ambrose, Vanderbilt and South Carolina have gone to overtime four times in six meetings. The 2017 meeting in Columbia stands as the only regular season meeting since Ambrose took over the program that has not gone into extra time.
- The Dores and Gamecocks last met in the 2019 SEC Tournament semifinals, where South Carolina earned a 2-0 win on the way to winning the tournament over Arkansas.

LAST TIME OUT

- Falling behind in the opening 15 minutes, Vanderbilt rallied from a 2-0 deficit to cut the lead in half with less than 30 minutes to play but couldn't find the equalizer in the closing minutes in falling 2-1 on the road to Missouri.
- Madi Allen scored Vanderbilt's goal in the 63rd minute when she poked home a free kick from Amber Nguyen.
- With a minute to play, Abi Brighton rose above the Missouri defense in the box to head a free kick from Ella Shamburger, but her attempt floated too far right and rang the goal post to keep Missouri up by a goal.
- To start, Vanderbilt was without Haley Hopkins, Maddie Elwell and Blue Ellis. Between the three, they had amassed 112 starts to date for the Dores. The trio was replaced by Alex Kerr, Amber Nguyen and Olivia Simmons, who had a combined 11 starts between them before the game.

2020 TO DATE

- In the season opener against Kentucky, a Haley Hopkins brace was the difference in a come-from-behind 3-2 win over the Wildcats. The victory came after Kentucky scored the first two goals of the game in the opening half to lead by a pair after 45 minutes. Four Dores -- Leila Azari, Madiya Harriott, Amber Nguyen and Olivia Simmons -- contributed with assists to the three goals in Vanderbilt's win over Kentucky. While Hopkins scored twice, Blue Ellis notched the tying goal. Vanderbilt spent an astounding 41% of the match attacking in Kentucky's defensive zone. Conversely, UK spent only 7% in Vanderbilt's.
- Across Vanderbilt's two losses to Tennessee and Missouri, all three of the opponent goals have come from set pieces with Tennessee scoring on a corner kick and Missouri tallying twice from the direct result of free kicks.

HEAD COACH DARREN AMBROSE

- Now in his sixth season leading Vanderbilt soccer, Darren Ambrose has guided one of the best five-year runs in program history.
 - The Dores have amassed a 62-35-10 record and 30-18-7 SEC mark during his tenure. Ten of those wins were over ranked opponents.
 - · Vanderbilt had three appearances in the NCAA Tournament, an SEC regular season championship and an East Division championship under his leadership.
 - Ambrose is the first Vanderbilt head coach in 21 years to have three consecutive double-digit win seasons (2017-19).
 - Vanderbilt has been tough to beat in both home openers and SEC openers, winning each of its last four under Ambrose from 2017 to 2020.

LATE DECISIONS

- All three of Vanderbilt's games thus far in 2020 have been decided in the second half or later and have been one-goal games.
- All three of Vanderbilt's goals against Kentucky in the season opener came after the 53rd minute mark with the first two were separated by just 6:11 of game action.
- · Last season, nine of the 14 wins were decided after halftime, and five of those wins were away from West End.

DON'T FORGET TO REMEMBER ME

• Haley Hopkins' two goals against Kentucky came off of four shots on goal.

- Last season, she accounted for 36% (13-of-36) of the Commodores' goals. In her time on West End, she has scored 29 times.
- Six of her goals a season ago were game winners.
- She has logged over 3,000 minutes played in her career, and played the entire match seven times a season ago.

NEW FACES

- · Vanderbilt welcomed seven freshmen to West End for 2020: Abi Brighton, Tina Bruni, Kate Devine, Sophia Gorski, Amber Nguyen, Maya Swinton and Alex Wagner.
- Three freshman Dores -- Abi Brighton, Amber Nguyen and Mya Swinton -- all made their debuts against Kentucky in the opener and have seen consistent playing time since.
 - Brighton has started all three matches thus far for the Dores.
 - Nguyen leads the team with two assists already and made her first collegiate start against Missouri on Oct. 3.
 - Swinton has come off the bench for significant minutes in all three games to date.

WINNING IN BUNCHES

- In all, the Dores have defeated 16 ranked opponents with 10 of those coming since Ambrose took over ahead of the 2015 season.
- This 2020 senior class has led the Commodores to three straight NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since the 1994-98 seasons.
 - Vanderbilt has a mark of 44-18-4 over the last three-plus campaigns since the start of the 2017 season.

DORES IN THE POLL

- Last week in the United Soccer Coaches poll, Vanderbilt checked in at No. 13.
- In the first poll of the season released Sept. 22, the Commodores came in at No. 10.
- A season ago, Vanderbilt reached as high as No. 9 in the poll.

LOOKING BACK

- Last season, the Commodores won their third SEC East championship, and first since 1997 (the SEC recognized divisional championships from 1995-2012 and reinstated divisional play a season ago).
- Vanderbilt went 4-1-1 against the division in 2019 with the lone loss coming in a 1-0 heartbreaker to Florida and a scoreless draw on the road against No. 7 South Carolina.
- Nine of the 14 wins were decided after half or later, and five of those were away from West End.
- Eight midfielders accounted for half of Vanderbilt's goals (18-of-36). Each of these midfielders -- Madi Allen, Leila Azari, Mairin Boyle, Peyton Cutshall, Blue Ellis, Maddie Elwell, Raegan Kelley and Alex Kerr -- returned for the 2019 season.
- Of the 36 goals scored last season, there were 37 total assists.
 - Maddie Elwell's 10 assists in 2019 tied for second in the SEC, only three shy of the conference's leader.

TOUGH ON THE SEC EAST

• In the last three-plus seasons going back to 2017, the Dores have won 13 of 20 games against divisional opponents.

HURRY HOME

- The Commodores have won 35 matches at the Vanderbilt Soccer Complex since Darren Ambrose took over ahead of 2015, including 17 straight from 2017-18.
 - \bullet The 10-0-1 home mark in 2018 was the best home record since 1990's unblemished 9-0 record.
 - The Commodores have beat five ranked foes over the past five years at home.
 - Both of 2019's home setbacks were by one-goal margins (1-0 and 2-1 [OT]).
 - \bullet Vanderbilt has not conceded more than 2 goals in a match on West End since 2017.

OUR STATE

• In their last 12 against Tennessee schools (Chattanooga, Lipscomb, Tennessee and Tennessee Tech), the Dores are 9-2-1.

GOOD LUCK...

- In the past five seasons from 2015 to 2019, Vanderbilt notched 39 shutouts with 21 of those coming since 2018-19.
 - The 39 shutouts were the highest in a five-year stretch since 45 from 2005-09.
 - Vanderbilt recorded 11 shutouts in 2019.
 - The 11 clean sheets were the most in a single season since 2005 (15).

GOING THE DISTANCE

- Four Dores -- Maddie Elwell, Haley Hopkins, Raegan Kelley and Ella Shamburger -- played in and started every match in 2019.
 - Hopkins and Shamburger each have started in 43 straight, dating to 2018.
 - Shamburger played the entire match 17 times last season.
- Thus far this year, six Dores Leila Azari, Raegyn Kelley, Abi Brighton, Madiya Harriott, Ella Shamburger, Kimya Raietparvar and Sophie Guilmette have started every game for Vandy.

WHERE I COME FROM

- Two Commodores hail from Tennessee.
 - Blue Ellis, a senior midfielder, is from Collierville. She netted the game-winner against the Vols in 2017 off a set piece.
 - Freshman goalkeeper, Kate Devine, is from nearby Brentwood.
- Of the 30-athlete roster, Florida is the most represented with five coming from the Sunshine State.
- Other states represented include: California (4), Georgia (4), Texas (3), Nevada (2), Pennsylvania (2), New Jersey (1), North Carolina (1), Ohio (1), South Carolina (1) and Virginia (1).
- Additionally, two hail from Canadian provinces.

THE DANCE

• Vanderbilt is one of seven SEC schools to make it to the NCAA Tournament at least three times in the past five years.
