

The National Tenpin Coaches Association 2020-2021 Preseason Poll

October 12, 2020

Preseaon poll produces same uncertainty as the 2020 calendar year.

NASHVILLE, TN---The first National Ten Pin Coaches Association (NTCA) poll of the 2020-21 season reflected some of the same uncertainty as the 2020 calendar year with no less than seven teams earning at least one first-place vote for the first time in poll history.

McKendree and Vanderbilt were picked 1-2 in pre-season balloting despite significant graduation losses with Arkansas State, Nebraska and Sam Houston State rounding out the Top 5.

Maryland-Eastern Shore was sixth with seventh place Stephen F. Austin and ninth-place Louisiana Tech also receiving first-place votes. North Carolina A & T was in eighth and Youngstown State in tenth round out the Top 10.

McKendree's Bearcats took 25 of the 51 first-place votes to top the poll. Despite losing first team All-Americans Breanna Clemmer and Taylor Baily, Coach Shannon O'Keefe's program returns a solid nucleus led by honorable mention All-America Hope Gramley. McKendree has been no lower than third in the last three NCAA Championship matches

Vanderbilt, which has finished third-first and second in the last three NCAA Championships, netted 14 first-place votes despite losing former national Player of the Year Maria Bulanova and second team All-America Adel Wahner. Returning starters Samantha Gainor, Angelique Dalesandro, Mabel Cummins and four promising newcomers including a trio of former Junior Gold champions made a strong impression on the voters.

Arkansas State had five first-team votes to land in third place. The Red Wolves expect to be led by third-team All-American Taylor Davis, Sarah Sanes and a balanced set of returnees. They will miss anchor Julia Huren, a second-team All-America selection in 2020.

Nebraska garnered a pair of first-place votes and is in fourth place. The Big Red must figure out how to replace the 2020 national Player of the Year Raquel Orozco but the addition of Duquesne transfer Crystal Elliott and returning veteran Cassidy Ray give them plenty of firepower.

Sam Houston State sits fifth in the pre-season poll, led by former national Rookie of the Year Bea Hernandez, Elise Chambers and Hayley Conley.


Maryland-Eastern Shore, Stephen F. Austin, North Carolina A & T, Louisiana Tech University and Youngstown State complete the Top 10.

The second 10 include #11 Duquesne, followed by Mount St. Mary's, Fairleigh Dickinson, Sacred Heart, Central Missouri, Wisconsin-Whitewater, Delaware State, Maryville (Saint Louis), Tulane and Adelphi.

UAB, Monmouth, Lincoln Memorial, Wilmington and Long Island University round out the Top 25.

In the nine years since the NTCA has conducted a pre-season poll, only twice has the early coaches' pick gone on to capture the NCAA Championship. Nebraska went wire-to-wire in the 2014-15 season and Maryland-Eastern Shore won in 2012 after being the pre-season choice. Last season Vanderbilt was No. 1 but the Covid-19 pandemic cancelled the post-season tournaments.

The voting is conducted by NCAA head coaches who are members of the NTCA. Coaches ranked their selections from 1 through 25 with 40 points awarded to the No.1 team, 37 to second, 35 to third and so on.

<u>Point system:</u> NTCA submitted ballots rank the top 25 programs in the sport of NCAA bowling. Each position has a designated point value, ranging from 40 points for first place and one point for twenty-fifth place. To be ranked teams need to equal or surpass the minimum vote criteria, which is one vote for every eight ballots submitted. The actual ranking position is determined by using the adjusted point standings, which lists in priority order the total points a school has accumulated after the highest and lowest votes are dropped.

The specific point values follow: 1st place = 40 points, 2nd =37, 3rd =35, 4th =33, 5th =31, 6th =29, 7th =27, 8th =25, 9th =23, 10th =21, 11th =19, 12th =17, 13th =15, 14th =13, 15th =11, 16th =10, 17th =9, 18th =8, 19th =7, 20th =6, 21st =5, 22nd =4, 23rd =3, 24th =2, 25th =1.
