THE MATCHUP

- Back in the SEC title game, seventh-seeded Vanderbilt will take on top-seeded Arkansas at 1 p.m. in Orange Beach, Alabama.
- This will be the 35th all-time meeting between Vanderbilt and Arkansas (Vanderbilt leads the series 19-13-2)
 - First Meeting: 1987 (W, 2-1)
 - Last Meeting: 09.25.19 (L, 0-1)
 - Last Vanderbilt Win: 10.09.15 (1-0)
 - Last Opponent Win: 09.25.19 (1-0)
 - Last Draw: 11.02.17 (1-1)
- In his five-plus seasons, Darren Ambrose owns a 1-3-2 record against the Razorbacks.

SEC TOURNAMENT INFO

- Vanderbilt earned the No. 7 seed in this year's tournament and will need to win four games in eight days to capture the 2020 SEC Tournament title.
- The Commodores already defeated Mississippi State in the second round, took out SEC East champion Tennessee Tuesday in the quarterfinals and topped third-seeded Texas A&M in the semifinals on Thursday to reach the title game for the first time since 1998.
- As the No. 7 seed, this marks the second lowest seed Vanderbilt has garnered in an SEC Tournament under Ambrose. Through the years, Vanderbilt was the No. 8 in 2015, No. 6 in 2016, No. 4 in 2017, No. 1 in 2018 and No. 2 in 2019.
- Vanderbilt is the fifth No. 7-seed to reach the title game. Last time it happened was in 2018 when seventh-seeded LSU defeated Arkansas in the championship game. Overall, a team seeded No. 7 or No. 8 has reached the SEC title game in three of the last four seasons.
- Vanderbilt has now reached the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament each of the last six years. In that stretch, it has also now reached the semifinals three times in the last four years.
- With its first two wins at this year's tournament, it marked the first time Vanderbilt has won a pair of games at an SEC Tournament since the 1998 season - the last time Vanderbilt went to the SEC title game. Additionally, its three wins mark a program record with no previous team ever winning three games in a tournament.
- With 11 goals in the tournament thus far, Vanderbilt has matched its offensive output across the eight regular-season games.

WITH A WIN...

- With a victory, Vanderbilt would earn its third SEC Tournament title and first since 1994. A win would also give the Commodores three SEC trophies in three seasons after winning the conference outright in 2018 and the SEC East in 2019.
- Overall, winning would be Vanderbilt soccer's ninth SEC title of any kind.

LAST TIME OUT

- Scoring first against third-seeded Texas A&M, Haley Hopkins found the back of the net in both halves to lead Vanderbilt to a 3-1 victory over the Aggies.
- While Hopkins scored in the opening half, she buried a header from Leila Azari in the late stages of the second half to put Vanderbilt up for good. To cap the night, Raegan Kelley put home her second goal in as many games to ice the win, knocking home a loose ball after a corner kick into the box from Maddie Elwell.

POSTSEASON ACCOLADES

- Haley Hopkins was named a First Team All-SEC honoree Thursday for the second time in her career while Ella Shamburger and Maddie Elwell earned second-straight Second Team All-SEC honors. Abi Brighton rounded out Vanderbilt's postseason honors by earning SEC All-Freshman accolades.

SENIOR NIGHT

- Prior to the regular-season finale, Vanderbilt honored 10 seniors in Haley Hopkins, Olivia Simmons, Kayla Eason, Maddie Elwell, Myra Konte, Leila Azari, Blue Ellis, Sarah Fuller, Madiya Harriott and Rebecca Rossett.
- The 2020 senior class owns a 50-20-5 record, which is good for a .700 winning percentage. The percentage thus far marks the best winning percentage by a four-year class in program history, topping the previous bests of .665 in 1997 and .663 just last year in 2019.
- Overall, this marks the eighth four-year class to win 50 games with the program. The 2019 senior class was also the first group to reach the 50-win mark since six classes in a row did from 1995 to 2000.

DORES IN THE POLL

- With three wins in a row, Vanderbilt re-entered the United Soccer Coaches poll on Nov. 3 at No. 13 in the nation, but fell out after its loss to Ole Miss.
- With the loss to Ole Miss, Vanderbilt is currently not ranked.
- In the first release of the poll on Sept. 22, Vanderbilt checked in at No. 10. A week later after falling in overtime to Tennessee, Vanderbilt checked in at No. 13.
- A season ago, Vanderbilt reached as high as No. 9 in the poll.

NOTING 2020

- In the season opener against Kentucky, a Haley Hopkins brace was the difference in a come-from-behind 3-2 win over the Wildcats. The victory came after Kentucky scored the first two goals of the game in the opening half to lead by a pair after 45 minutes.
- Across Vanderbilt's four losses to Tennessee, Missouri, South Carolina and Ole Miss, five of the seven opponent goals have come from set pieces with Tennessee scoring on a corner kick, Missouri tallying twice from the direct result of free kicks, South Carolina winning it on the PK and Ole Miss scoring the winner on a free kick.
- Vanderbilt snapped a three-game losing streak - the longest to date under Darren Ambrose - with the double-overtime win at Florida. It marked the fourth win over UF in program history.

HEAD COACH DARREN AMBROSE

- Now in his sixth season leading Vanderbilt soccer, Darren Ambrose has guided one of the best five-year runs in program history.
 - The Dores have amassed a 67-37-10 record and 33-20-7 SEC mark during his tenure. Twelve of those wins are over ranked opponents.
 - Vanderbilt has three appearances in the NCAA Tournament, an SEC regular season championship and an East Division championship under his leadership.
 - Ambrose is the first Vanderbilt head coach in 21 years to have three consecutive double-digit win seasons (2017-19).

LATE DECISIONS

- Seven of Vanderbilt's eight regular season games in 2020 were decided in the second half or later and have been one-goal games.
- The lone game that wasn't decided in the second half or been a one-goal game came when Vanderbilt scored the game-winner in the 16th minute and beat LSU 2-0, marking Vanderbilt's first first-half goal of the season. Since, it has scored in every first half.
- All three of Vanderbilt's goals against Kentucky in the season opener came after the 53rd minute with the first two separated by just 6:11 of game action.
- Against Florida, Myra Konte's game-winning goal came in the 103rd minute of double overtime.
- Against No. 15 Georgia, Haley Hopkins scored the game-winning goal in the 88th minute.
- Last season, nine of the 14 wins were decided after halftime, and five of those wins were away from West End.
- In postseason play, Vanderbilt flipped the script by scoring four goals in both the opener and the quarterfinals, winning 4-0 and 4-2 thus far against Mississippi State and Tennessee. It also tallied three against Texas A&M to reach 11 goals, the same total in eight regular-season games.

DON'T FORGET TO REMEMBER ME

- Though battling injury most of the season, Haley Hopkins leads Vanderbilt with five goals this season.
- Last season, she accounted for 36% (13-of-36) of the Commodores' goals. In her time on West End, she has scored 32 times. That number ties her for second-most on Vanderbilt's all-time goals list with Jenger Burchett (1993-96) with 32 goals.
- Six of Hopkins' goals a season ago were game winners. This season, three of her five goals serve as game-winners. With 14 in her career, she has the most in program history.
- While starting 43 straight games from 2018-20, Hopkins has been held back by injury in 2020 and did not play at Florida on Oct. 18 before making her return Oct. 25 with the winning goal against No. 15 Georgia.

NEW FACES

- Vanderbilt welcomed seven freshmen to West End for 2020: Abi Brighton, Tina Bruni, Kate Devine, Sophia Gorski, Amber Nguyen, Maya Swinton and Alex Wagner.
- Three freshman Does -- Abi Brighton, Amber Nguyen and Mya Swinton -- all made their debuts against Kentucky in the opener and have seen consistent playing time since.
 - Brighton has started each match thus far for the Does. She scored her first collegiate goal in the SEC Tournament opener against Mississippi State that made SportsCenter Top 10 at No. 3 in top plays.
 - Nguyen is second on the team with two assists and made her first collegiate start against Missouri on Oct. 3.
 - Swinton has come off the bench for significant minutes in every game to date and had the second assist on Vanderbilt's game-winning goal against No. 15 Georgia.
- Sophia Gorski made her debut at Missouri and logged significant minutes off the bench in Vanderbilt's 2-1 victory at Florida. She scored her first collegiate goal in the SEC Tournament opener against Mississippi State.
- Alex Wagner scored her first collegiate goal in Vandy's 2-1 double-overtime loss to South Carolina, tallying the tying goal in the 75th minute.

WINNING IN BUNCHES

- In all, the Does have defeated 19 ranked opponents with 13 of those coming since Ambrose took over ahead of the 2015 season.
- This 2020 senior class has led the Commodores to three straight NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since the 1994-98 seasons.
 - Vanderbilt has a mark of 50-20-5 over the last three-plus campaigns since the start of the 2017 season with a 24-11-3 mark in SEC play.

LOOKING BACK

- Last season, the Commodores won their third SEC East championship, and first since 1997 (the SEC recognized divisional championships from 1995-2012 and reinstated divisional play a season ago).
- Vanderbilt went 4-1-1 against the division in 2019 with the lone loss coming in a 1-0 heartbreaker to Florida and a scoreless draw on the road against No. 7 South Carolina.
- Nine of the 14 wins were decided after half or later, and five of those were away from West End.
- Eight midfielders accounted for half of Vanderbilt's goals (18-of-36). Each of these midfielders -- Madi Allen, Leila Azari, Mairin Boyle, Peyton Cutshall, Blue Ellis, Maddie Elwell,

Raegan Kelley and Alex Kerr -- returned for the 2020 season.

- Of the 36 goals scored last season, there were 37 total assists.
 - Maddie Elwell's 10 assists in 2019 tied for second in the SEC, only three shy of the conference's leader.

HURRY HOME

- The Commodores have won 36 matches at the Vanderbilt Soccer Complex since Darren Ambrose took over ahead of 2015, including 17 straight from 2017-18.
 - The 10-0-1 home mark in 2018 was the best home record since 1990's unblemished 9-0 record.
 - The Commodores have beat four ranked foes over the past five years at home and own a 4-4-1 record against ranked teams at home under Ambrose.
 - Vanderbilt has not conceded more than two goals in a match on West End since 2017.

OUR STATE

- In their last 13 games against Tennessee schools (Chattanooga, Lipscomb, Tennessee and Tennessee Tech), the Does are 10-2-1.

GOOD LUCK...

- In the past six seasons from 2015 to 2020, Vanderbilt notched 42 shutouts with 24 of those coming since 2018-19.
 - The 39 shutouts from 2015-19 were the most in a five-year stretch since 45 from 2005-09.
 - Vanderbilt recorded 11 shutouts in 2019.
 - The 11 clean sheets were the most in a single season since 2005 (15).

GOING THE DISTANCE

- Four Does -- Maddie Elwell, Haley Hopkins, Raegan Kelley and Ella Shamburger -- played in and started every match in 2019.
 - Shamburger has started in 50 straight games dating to 2018 and played the entire match 17 times last season.
- Thus far this year, four Does - Leila Azari, Raegyn Kelley, Abi Brighton and Ella Shamburger - have started every game for Vandy.

WHERE I COME FROM

- Two Commodores hail from Tennessee.
 - Blue Ellis, a senior midfielder, is from Collierville.
 - Freshman goalkeeper, Kate Devine, is from nearby Brentwood.
- Of the 30-athlete roster, Florida is the most represented with five coming from the Sunshine State.
- Other states represented include: California (4), Georgia (4), Texas (3), Nevada (2), Pennsylvania (2), New Jersey (1), North Carolina (1), Ohio (1), South Carolina (1) and Virginia (1).
- Additionally, two hail from Canadian provinces.

THE DANCE

- Vanderbilt is one of seven SEC schools to make it to the NCAA Tournament at least three times in the past five years.

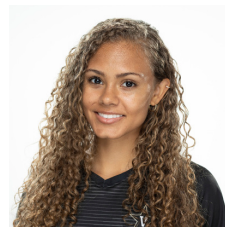

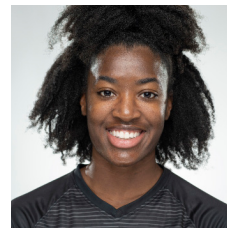
