- Vanderbilt returns to the road for an 11 a.m. CT clash at Missouri. The contest was originally scheduled for Oct. 17 and then rescheduled for Dec. 12. On Monday, the Southeastern Conference announced the two teams would play Saturday.
- The Commodores and Tigers played just four times prior to Missouri joining the Southeastern Conference in 2012. Since then, the teams have met annually. Vandy is 4-7-1 against Missouri, with the Commodores winning last year's tilt in Nashville. The victory, a 21-14 decision against the 22nd-ranked Tigers, was Vanderbilt's first against a top-25 foe since topping No. 18 Kansas State 14-7 on Sept. 16, 2017.
- Saturday's quarterback battle will feature the top two freshman passers in the SEC in Vanderbilt's Ken Seals and Missouri's Connor Bazelak. Seals leads the league's freshmen in passing yards with 1,610 while Bazelak is second with 1,304. Seals has averaged 230.0 passing yards/game to Bazelak's 217.3.
- Senior defensive end Dayo Odeyingbo has 28.0 career tackles for loss, just 0.5 away from the top eight in Vanderbilt history. Odeyingbo paces the Commodores with 5.0 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks.
- Fifth-year senior linebacker Andre Mintze is one of 20 semifinalists for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award, one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award and a candidate for the Wuerffel Trophy.
- Vandy's offense has found its footing in its last four games, averaging 428.0 yards of total offense and 22.5 points. In the first three contests, the unit averaged 256.7 offensive yards/game and 8.7 points/game.
- The Commodores have also helped their cause with just one turnover in the last two games after committing five at Mississippi State and averaging 2.8 turnovers during the first five contests.
- In the fourth quarter at Kentucky and during the opening frame against Florida, the Commodores combined to score 24 points. In the first three games, spanning 12 quarters, Vanderbilt totaled 26 points.
- Vandy led Florida 10-7 after the first quarter, marking the first time this season the team had the lead after the opening stanza. Entering the tilt against the Gators, Vanderbilt had been outscored 66-3 in the opening frame.
- Vanderbilt's first-quarter lead after against #6/5 Florida was its first through an opening quarter against an Associated Press top-10 team since holding a 7-0 advantage versus #4/6 Florida on Oct. 13, 2012.
- Seals has already set the Vanderbilt freshmen single-season passing yardage record with 1,610 yards. He is the only true freshman quarterback to have reached the 300-yard plateau in three games this fall.
- Senior wide receiver Chris Pierce Jr. has at least one receiving touchdown in four consecutive games, the first Commodore to do so since 2012. Pierce Jr.'s five touchdown grabs this season are the most for a Commodore since Jared Pinkney (7) and Kalija Lipscomb (9) in 2018. His five touchdown receptions in the last four games are tied for the third most among Power 5 programs during the span.
- Pierce Jr.'s two receiving scores against Florida were the most by a Commodore against an SEC foe since Lipscomb had two against Ole Miss on Nov. 17, 2018.
- Junior wide receiver Cam Johnson leads all FBS players in receptions since Oct. 25 with 35, four more than Boise State's Khalil Shakir has during the span. Johnson's 44 receptions this season are five away from the top 10 by a junior in Vanderbilt history.

1957 • The Vanderbilt defense held Missouri's offense without a touchdown, but the game ended in a 7-7 tie when the Tigers returned an interception for a score in Nashville. The game was Frank Broyles' first on the Missouri sideline. Broyles quickly moved on to Arkansas, where he became a College Football Hall of Fame coach.

1958 • The Commodores and Tigers faced off in a season opener for the second straight year, with Vanderbilt claiming a 12-8 victory in Columbia. The Commodores, under Art Guepe, went on to finish 5-2-3, with victories over Georgia, Virginia, Miami (Fla.) and Tulane, and ties on the road to Alabama, No. 18 Florida and Kentucky. Vanderbilt's two losses that season came by nine points to No. 8 Clemson (12-7) and Tennessee (10-6).

2012 • The Commodores claimed their first SEC road win in nearly two years with a 19-15 win over Missouri in Columbia. Running back Zac Stacy rushed for two touchdowns, including a game-winning, 14-yarder in the fourth quarter.

2015 • The Vanderbilt defense limited Missouri to 188 total yards in a 10-3 victory. It marked coach Derek Mason's first victory in conference play. While the Commodore defense held the Tigers to zero third-down conversions, Vanderbilt running back Ralph Webb rushed for 99 yards and the winning touchdown.

2018 • The Commodores totaled 465 total yards, including 182 rushing yards by Ke'Shawn Vaughn and 249 passing yards by Kyle Shurmur, but could not hold off a late Tiger rally in a 33-28 decision in Columbia. Vaughn rushed for two touchdowns, including a 65-yarder.

2019 • Vanderbilt snapped a three-game losing streak to the Tigers with a ranked win, downing No. 22 Missouri. Riley Neal came off the bench and threw a 21-yard game-winning touchdown to Cam Johnson with 8:57 left. Ke'Shawn Vaughn ran for a touchdown and also took a screen 61 yards for another score.

- The Commodores lead the SEC in all four penalty categories: fewest penalties, fewest penalties/game, fewest penalty yards and fewest penalty yards/game. A year ago, Vanderbilt did not rank within the league's top four in any of the four categories.

 When the coronavirus pandemic arrived in Nashville, Mason and his wife Leighanne came up with a way to give back to the community. As part of the Masons' #FeedOurHeroes initiative, they purchased meals from 10 local restaurants to feed 700 individuals across 16 medical sites.

JOHNSON KEEPS ON CATCHING

- Johnson followed his 14-catch outing against Ole Miss with 10 grabs at Mississippi State. He became the first Commodore with consecutive double-digit reception performances since Kalija Lipscomb against Nevada (11 on Sept. 8, 2018) and Notre Dame (10 on Sept. 15, 2018).
- In the last four games, Johnson has a team-high 35 receptions for a squad-best 321 yards with one touchdown.

- The Commodores had their first turnover-free game of the fall at Kentucky and coughed it up just once against Florida, with an interception in the fourth quarter.
- Vandy is ranked 13th in the SEC in turnovers lost with 15. It owns a minus-8 turnover
 margin, which stands 14th in the league. During the 2019 season, the Commodores
 lost 13 turnovers during the 12 games and posted a minus-2 turnover margin.

RED ZONE SUCCESS

• After going 3-for-8 in the red zone during the first three games, the Commodores have flipped the script in the last four contests, finishing 8-for-9.

YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE IN SEC GAMES

- The Commodores posted 478 yards of total offense at Mississippi State, their most in a Southeastern Conference game since 529 at Tennessee in the 2017 finale.
- Vanderbilt has four consecutive 400-yard total offense performances against SEC foes for the first time under head coach Derek Mason.
- For Vandy, it is the program's first stretch of four consecutive games with 400 or more yards of total offense since five straight from Nov. 20, 2004 - Sept. 24, 2005: vs.
 No. 15 Tennessee (420), at Wake Forest (422), at Arkansas (408), vs. Ole Miss (523) and vs. Richmond (513).

TD PASSES IN SEVEN STRAIGHT GAMES

- The Commodores own at least one passing touchdown in all seven games this season. It is the first time since the final seven contests of 2018 that Vandy has had an aerial score in at least five consecutive contests.
- Vanderbilt threw three passing touchdowns against Kentucky after the Wildcats had not allowed an aerial score since Oct. 3. Mississippi State, Tennessee, Missouri and Georgia were all held without a passing score.

GUIDING THE OFFENSE IN 2020

- The Vanderbilt offense is under new oversight in 2020 with offensive coordinator Todd Fitch taking over the reins. DEFENSE REBOUNDS AGAINST MISSISSIPPI STATE

After allowing a season-high 641 total yards of offense to Ole Miss, the Commodore
defense rallied versus Mississippi State and held the Bulldogs to 204, the second
fewest surrendered to an SEC team under head coach Derek Mason and the least
since 188 to Missouri on Oct. 24, 2015.

DEFENSE SHOWS RUSHING YARDAGE IMPROVEMENT

 Through seven Southeastern Conference games, the Commodore defense has shown improvement from the last three seasons in rushing yards allowed:

- The Commodores are fifth in the league in fewest rushing yards allowed in the opening half with 454. Vanderbilt has not surrendered a rush of longer than 32 yards in the first half and has allowed just four dashes of longer than 20 yards in the opening 30 minutes.
- The second half has been a different story as Vandy has yielded 830 yards and nine runs of 20 or more yards.

TWO HALVES OF PASS DEFENSE

- Vanderbilt's pass defense has given up the third-fewest yards in the league after halftime with 783. The longest pass the Commodores have allowed in a second half is a 46-vard strike, the third-shortest in the league.
- During the first half, however, the unit has yielded 1,177 yards to stand 13th in the SEC. Opposing quarterbacks have a league-high 175.34 rating during the first half.

BULLDOGS HELD TO MINUS-22 RUSHING YARDS

- Backed by 3.0 sacks, Vanderbilt held Mississippi State to a program-record minus-22 rushing yards. The Commodores did not allow a rush of more than four yards during the contest.
- The contest was the 11th in Southeastern Conference history in which one league foe held another to minus-22 total rushing yards or fewer.
- It marked the first SEC contest in which a program had minus-22 total rushing yards or fewer since the Bulldogs were held to minus-64 yards against Ole Miss in 2008.
- The minus-22 rushing yards allowed is tied for the 20th-best mark in a single game in SEC history. In Vanderbilt history, the previous best was minus-15 yards:

- The Commodores enter the Missouri game tied for 19th nationally in fumbles recovered with six.

PRESSURE ON THE PASSER

- The Commodores were credited with seven quarterback pressures against South Carolina, tied with seven against Middle Tennessee on Sept. 10, 2016, for their most under Mason.

- The Commodores rank ninth in the conference in third-down conversion percentage allowed (44.9%) and fourth in the league in fewest total conversions.

GETTING BEHIND THE LINE

- Vanderbilt booked a season-high 8.0 tackles for loss against South Carolina. The 8.0 stops behind the line of scrimmage were the most for the Commodores against a Power 5 foe since 8.0 against Missouri on Oct. 19, 2019.

NEW KICKERS ALL AROUND

- · Vanderbilt deploys a variety of kickers depending on the situation in 2020.
- Junior Pierson Cooke has served as the primary field goal kicker and kickoff specialist. He had not attempted a placement kick in college before the Texas A&M tilt.
- Last fall, Cooke kicked off 29 times for 1,816 yards and 20 touchbacks. This year he
 has handled all 23 of the Commodores' kickoffs, averaging 61.0 yards per boot with
 10 touchbacks.
- Cooke owns all seven of Vandy's field goal tries in 2020, going 3-for-7, converting
 his first attempt from 33 yards, missing on next four tries and making his last two
 tries, from 41 yards at Mississippi State and 25 yards versus Florida.
- Cooke is 9-for-9 on PATs.
- Junior Wes Farley has served as a PAT specialist, drilling all six attempts.
- Farley did not play prep football, but was a three-year starter for the soccer squad at New Canaan (Conn.) High School.

WHEATLEY BOOKS FIRST CAREER PUNTS

- Sophomore Jared Wheatley filled in for Smith against Ole Miss and recorded his first career punts. Wheatley, who did not see action in 2019, booted five balls for an average of 33.2 yards/punt and a long of 55 yards.
- Wheatley tallied four boots downed inside the Rebel 20-yard line, one less than Smith had in the first three games this season.
- Wheatley was named the 2018 South Charlotte Punter of the Year while attending Porter Ridge (N.C.) High School.
- Smith led the SEC in total punting yardage (3,313) in 2019 and stood sixth nationally.

DUO HELPS FORM BLACK STUDENT-ATHLETE GROUP

- Senior defensive lineman Cam Robinson and junior linebacker Elijah McAllister teamed up with track's Taiya Shelby and soccer's Olivia Simmons to take action, focusing on improving the Black student-athlete experience at Vanderbilt, among other issues.
- One of their first acts was to help organize a voter registration drive on Tuesday, Sept. 22 at Vanderbilt Stadium. The event was one of several campus efforts planned to encourage voter engagement.
- Also among the students' goals are to create a safe and comfortable space for Black student-athletes, provide a formal support system to offer the necessary actions and conversations to improve the social experience of Black student-athletes at Vanderbilt, work to address racial issues in sports and offer guidance toward professional development and personal growth.

SEC COUNCIL MEMBERS

 Head coach Derek Mason, along with Vanderbilt baseball head coach Tim Corbin and athletic director Candice Lee, currently serve on the SEC Council on Racial Equity and Social Justice, a league-wide body consisting of a diverse group of student-athletes, administrators, coaches and SEC staff.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

- Off the field, the Vanderbilt football team topped the SEC with a Graduation Success
 Rate (GSR) of 95 for the 2019-20 academic year. The Commodores finished third
 among Power 5 programs in GSR, trailing only Duke (97) and Northwestern (97).
- Vandy led the nation with a 98 GSR for Black male student-athletes and was first among Power 5 programs with a 98 GSR for all Black student-athletes.

MINTZE'S OFF-THE-FIELD ACCOLADES CONTINUE TO GROW

- Fifth-year senior linebacker Andre Mintze has enjoyed a growing list of off-the-field
 accolades this fall. He is one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award, which
 focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform
 in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. He is also
 one of 20 semifinalists for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year, presented
 to the college football player who demonstrates a record of leadership through
 exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field.
- Mintze is also a candidate for the Wuerffel Trophy, which is presented annually to the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with leadership achievement on and off the field.

HORTON ELECTED TO ARKANSAS HALL OF FAME

Running back coach Tim Horton, a four-year letter winner at Arkansas, is a member
of the 2021 Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame Class. Horton started as a split end and
punt returner from 1987-89. Serving a team captain in his senior season, Horton
earned second-team All-SWC honors after hauling in 23 catches for 453 yards and
serving as the team's top punt returner. During his career as a Razorback, Arkansas
compiled a 38-11 record, won consecutive SWC titles (1988-89) and appeared in four
straight bowl games.

ROSSOMANDO A NORTHEAST-10 CONFERENCE OUTSTANDING INDIVIDUAL

- During the 2020-21 academic year the Northeast-10 is celebrating it's 40th anniversary by honoring 40 outstanding individuals and 40 iconic moments from throughout the conference's history. Offensive line coach Pete Rossomando was tabbed as one of the league's outstanding individuals.
- As the head coach of the University of New Haven (2008-12), Rossomando led the program to a 42-13 record and two NCAA Division II playoff appearances. He was named Liberty Mutual NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year following the 2012 season.

VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY • VANDERBILT ATHLETICS

- Vanderbilt is ranked 14th among national universities by U.S. News & World Report.
 It ranks ninth in best value schools and 12th in best undergraduate teachings by the magazine.
- According to the 2021 Princeton Review, Vanderbilt ranks second for best quality
 of life, happiest students and most beautiful campuses in the nation.
- The university was founded in 1873 with a \$1 million gift from "Commodore" Cornelius Vanderbilt. Kirkland Hall, which continues as the main administration building on campus, is the only original structure that remains today.
- In September, the university launched Destination Vanderbilt, a \$100 million university excellence initiative to recruit new faculty. Over the next two to four years, the university will leverage the investment to recruit approximately 60 faculty who are leaders and rising stars in their fields.

- Vanderbilt teams have captured five NCAA championships, all since 2007. The
 Commodore baseball team won the most recent national trophy, claiming the
 2019 College World Series in June. It was the second NCAA title for head coach Tim
 Corbin and the Vanderbilt baseball team. Other NCAA titles have been earned by
 women's bowling (2007, 2018) and women's tennis (2015).
- In 2019-20, Vanderbilt had the smallest undergraduate enrollment (6,886) and total enrollment (13,131) in the Southeastern Conference.
- Vanderbilt is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference.
- Vanderbilt Athletics is the only Power 5 Conference member, and one of two FBS programs, with an African American in the key roles of athletics director (Candice Storey Lee), football head coach (Derek Mason) and men's basketball head coach (Jerry Stackhouse).
- Vanderbilt athletics director Candice Story Lee is one of five female athletic directors at Power 5 schools, joining University of Washington's Jennifer Cohen, Penn State's Sandy Barbour, Pittsburgh's Heather Lyke and Virginia's Carla Williams.
- Notable Vanderbilt alumni include PGA Tour FedEx Cup winner Brandt Snedeker, LPGA golfer and 2019 Solheim Cup USA team member Marina Alex, NBA champions Will Perdue, Festus Ezeli and Damian Jones, numerous Major League Baseball standouts such as David Price, Sonny Gray, Dansby Swanson and Walker Buehler, and more than 12 players active in the NFL such as cornerbacks Casey Hayward and Joejuan Williams, linebackers Zach Cunningham and Oren Burks, lineman Stephen Weatherly and receiver Trent Sherfield.



Something to Build On

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - Isaiah Spiller had 117 yards rushing, Ainias Smith ran for a touchdown and No. 10 Texas A&M overcame three turnovers to beat Vanderbilt 17-12 in the season-opener for both teams.

Spiller had 5 five yards rushing in the first half before getting going after halftime. Smith added 51 yards rushing after switching from receiver to running back this season to steady the offense on a night when Kellen Mond fumbled twice, losing one.

The Aggies didn't trail after the first quarter but were never able to pull away because of three fumbles and a penalty that resulted in a safety.

Vanderbilt started Ken Seals at quarterback, making him just the third true freshman quarterback to start a SEC season opener since freshman eligibility was restored in 1972. He threw for 150 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions.

Spiller got things going for A&M after halftime when he ran for 57 yards on the first play of the third quarter. Texas A&M pushed the lead to 14-5 when Mond connected with Caleb Chapman on a 17-yard TD pass two plays later.

Seals threw an interception on Vanderbilt's next drive, but the Aggies couldn't cash in on the mistake after Mond fumbled at the end of a run on the ensuing possession.

The Commodores cut the lead to 14-12 late in the third quarter when Seals threw a perfect strike to Amir Abdur-Rahman in the corner of the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown. Abdur-Rahman had five receptions for 72 yards — both career highs.

The Aggies added a field goal early in the fourth quarter to make it 17-12. Texas A&M was driving later in the quarter when Daevion Davis forced a fumble after a reception by Jalen Preston and recovered it to give Vanderbilt the ball at their own 42.

But a pass by Seals was tipped and intercepted by Leon O'Neal. He returned it 35 yards and the Aggies got 15 more yards after Chris Pierce was flagged for a late hit when he threw O'Neal down at the end of the run while he was out of bounds on the A&M sideline.

The Aggies came away empty on their next drive when Mond fumbled the handoff on fourth-and-1. But Vanderbilt had to punt it back to allow Texas A&M to hold on for the victory.

Vanderbilt led 3-0 in the first quarter before Smith ran 25 yards for a touchdown to put A&M on top.

There were about eight minutes left in the second quarter when Andre Mintze hit Mond to force a fumble which was recovered by Dashaun Jerkins. The Commodores couldn't move the ball and had to punt. But Brian George received a personal foul for a blind side block in the end zone to give Vanderbilt a safety to cut the lead to 7-5.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Myles Brennan threw for 337 yards and four touchdowns and No. 20 LSU beat Vanderbilt 41-7.

The defending national champs never trailed after losing their season opener to Mississippi State when Brennan was sacked seven times. LSU also extended its winning streak over the Commodores to nine in a series it leads 24-7-1.

The Tigers outgained Vanderbilt 498-266, and the defense came up with two interceptions and a pair of sacks.

Brennan completed passes to 11 different receivers against a Vanderbilt defense that had consistent pressure against Kellen Mond in an opening loss at Texas A&M.

Terrace Marshall Jr. finished with two TDs on two catches, and Jontre Kirklin had 65 yards receiving and two TD catches, the second a toe-tapper at the back of the end zone off a flea flicker. John Emery ran for 103 yards and a TD.

Vanderbilt had its chances with freshman Ken Seals making his home debut. When Randall Haynie picked off an overthrown pass from Brennan, Seals hit tight end Ben Bresnahan with an 8-yard TD pass to pull the Commodores to 14-7 in the second quarter.

Todd Harris Jr. picked off Seals' pass at the goal line early in the fourth quarter.

 $NASHVILLE, Tenn. - South Carolina \ quarterback \ Collin \ Hill \ ran \ for \ two \ touchdowns \ and \ Kevin \ Harris \ ran \ for \ two \ TDs \ and \ a \ career-high \ 171 \ yards \ as \ the \ Gamecocks \ beat \ Vanderbilt \ 41-7.$

South Carolina won its 12th straight in this series by dominating Vanderbilt 486-249 in total offense and three sacks on a rainy day. The Gamecocks had more yards rushing (290) than the Commodores had total yards.

Harris ran for a 25-yard TD early in the third and added a career-long 88-yarder early in the fourth

Vanderbilt remains winless after having 56 scholarship players available for this game, just three above the limit set by the Southeastern Conference for a team to play a game. The Commodores already had six players opt out of this season.

Vanderbilt coach Derek Mason said he learned Thursday that his numbers would be limited by injuries and contact tracing during a pandemic.

Parker White kicked a pair of field goals, including a 43-yarder that gave the Gamecocks the lead for good in the first quarter.

Vanderbilt had its chances early to either tie or take a lead. Pierson Cooke missed a 29-yard field goal wide right for Vanderbilt and is now 1 of 4 this season.

In the second quarter, the Commodores went for it on fourth-and-2 at the South Carolina 3. Freshman Ken Seals rolled right and wound up being tackled, missing the chance to throw to a receiver in the end zone when open or run himself.

Hill hit Nick Muse with a 32-yard pass, starting a 12-play, 96-yard drive that the South Carolina quarterback capped himself for a 14-point swing. Hill went over the top for a 1-yard touchdown and a 10-0 lead with 2:09 left in the first half.

South Carolina scored the final 24 points. Hill ran for a 10-yard TD in the third, and Harris broke loose for his 88-yarder and Dakeron Joyner had a 47-yard TD, both in the fourth.

Vandy Falls at Home to Ole Miss

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The Ole Miss offense was too much for Vanderbilt to overcome during the Rebels' 54-21 win over Vanderbilt at Vanderbilt Stadium.

A 21-0 lead in the first quarter helped Ole Miss take control of the game early. The Rebels wound up totaling 645 yards of total offense and averaged 8.2 yards per play. They also put together six scoring drives of at least 70 yards.

Vandy got within 33-14 in the second quarter, but could not get any closer. Freshman quarterback Ken Seals finished 31-for-40 passing for 319 yards with two touchdowns while wide receiver Cam Johnson caught 14 passes for 97 yards.

Keyon Henry-Brooks had 66 yards rushing and scored the game's final touchdown on a 1-yard plunge in the fourth quarter.

Ole Miss won the toss, elected to receive and quickly marched 71 yards for the game's first touchdown. Snoop Conner polished off the series with a 1-yard plunge into the end zone, giving the Rebels a 7-0 lead less than 3 1/2 minutes into the affair.

A 9-yard touchdown lob from Matt Corral to tight end Kenny Yeboah put Ole Miss up 14-0 with 2:49 to go in the first quarter. That play capped a 93-yard drive that took just 4:13 off the clock.

Exactly two minutes later, Corral threw a 36-yard touchdown pass down the right sideline to Elijah Moore giving Ole Miss a 21-0 advantage going into the second quarter.

Vanderbilt finally responded after that when Seals found tight end Ben Bresnahan on a 43-yard touchdown pass down the left sideline. A quick pump fake followed by a long throw to an open Bresnahan cut the Vandy deficit to 21-7. The grab was the longest of Bresnahan's career.

Moore scored his next touchdown with a one-yard reception that capped an eight-play, 77-yard drive and gave Ole Miss a 27-7 lead. Six minutes and 28 seconds later, Moore caught a 28-yard touchdown to put the Rebels ahead 33-7.

Vandy wasn't done just yet and had enough time left on the clock to put something together. Seals orchestrated an eight-play drive that ended with a 16-yard pass to Chris Pierce Jr. into the left side of the end zone.

The Commodores would have to settle for a 33-14 halftime score.

Seals finished 15 of 18 passing in the first half totaling 158 yards to go along with two touchdown throws. Corral was 22 of 25 for 318 yards and four touchdowns and the Rebels piled up 413 yards of total offense on 46 plays.

After Vandy was forced to punt to begin the second half, Ole Miss put together another long scoring drive that ended with Corral's 14-yard touchdown pass to Ontario Drummond. That put the Rebels ahead 41-14.

The Commodores fumbled the ensuing kickoff, which allowed Corral to add a 9-yard touchdown pass to Yeboah a few minutes later making it 48-14. John Rhys Plumlee connected with Braylon Sanders on a 37-yard touchdown pass before the end of the third period.

Corral finished 31 of 34 passing for 412 yards and six touchdowns while Moore caught 14 balls for 238 yards and three scores.

Comeback Comes Up Short

STARKVILLE, Miss. — Vanderbilt cut a 17-0 deficit down to 17-14 in the second half at Davis Wade Stadium, but five turnovers ultimately led to the Commodores' demise in a 24-17 loss to Mississippi State.

Down 17-14 late, Vandy appeared intent on driving for a chance at a game-tying or game-winning score, but quarterback Ken Seals threw his third interception of the day with 8:02 to play. The Dores still got the back with 6:11 to go, only to see Seals lose a fumble at his own 13 with 4:18 to play.

Jo'Quavious Marks punched in a 1-yard touchdown run shortly thereafter to ice the game for the Bulldogs.

Pierson Cooke was able to hit a 41-yard field goal with 38 ticks remaining making it a touchdown game. The Bulldogs recovered the ensuing onside kickoff to clinch victory.

Running back Keyon Henry-Brooks finished with 115 yards on 20 carries and caught 11 passes for 97 yards. His 27-yard touchdown run got the Commodores within three late in the game.

Seals threw for a career-high 336 yards on 31 of 46 passing and a touchdown. The freshman also threw three interceptions and lost a fumble.

Wide receiver Cam Johnson had 10 grabs for 114 yards and Chris Pierce made six receptions for 76 yards and a score.

After Vanderbilt's opening offensive series ended with an interception on the fourth play, Mississippi State needed just five plays to go 27 yards to take a 7-0 lead. Mississippi State quarterback Will Rogers found Osirus Mitchell on a 6-yard pass a little more than three minutes into the game.

The Bulldogs then upped their lead to 14-0 with an 11-play drive that covered 68 yards and chewed up 5:05 of clock. Dillon Johnson's 4-yard touchdown run polished the series off and came on the heals of Cooke's missed 50-yard field goal for Vandy.

Mississippi State's Brandon Ruiz added a 25-yard field goal later in the second quarter and that would turn out to be the final score of the half.

Vanderbilt had 156 yards of total offense in the first two quarters, but turned the ball over twice, missed a field goal and failed on one of two fourth-down conversions.

The Commodores finally put a dent into the lead toward the end of the third quarter thanks to an eight-play, 71-yard drive that ended in seven points. Seals found Pierce from the 2 to make the score 17-7 with 4:27 to go in the period.

Suddenly Vandy had life and road the legs of Henry-Brooks from there. The sophomore capped a 12-play, 85-yard drive with a 27-yard sprint to the end zone making it 17-14 with 12:27 to go.

Quarterbacks Mike Wright and Ken Seals – both true freshmen – each had solid days for the Commodores. Wright threw a 2-yard touchdown pass and ran for a 2-yard score. Seals finished 21 of 32 for 225 yards and two touchdowns.

Vandy running back Keyon Henry-Brooks totaled 121 yards on the ground over a career-high 29 carries. The sophomore has racked up 302 yards rushing on 72 attempts the past three games.

Running back Mitchell Pryor scored on a 2-yard run for the Dores with 3:13 to play and Seals found Cam Johnson on a 7-yard touchdown pass with 30 seconds left. It was too little, too late.

Kentucky began the day by marching 75 yards in nine plays and went up 7-0 when Terry Wilson found Justin Rigg on a 15-yard touchdown pass. That series chewed up nearly five minutes of clock.

Wilson added a score with his feet when he rushed around right end for a 32-yard touchdown sprint putting the Wildcats ahead 14-0 with 3:48 to go in the opening stanza.

Vanderbilt regrouped to start the second quarter and got on board with a Seals 34-yard touchdown pass to Chris Pierce on a flag route into the right corner of the end zone. That play got the Commodores within 14-7.

The Wildcats didn't waste time with a response, scoring on Wilson's second touchdown pass of the day – this one coming from 21 yards out to Keaton Upshaw. Kentucky's scoring drive covered 79 yards in just seven plays.

The Commodores, who were 11 of 17 on third down, kept coming back and got within seven with 3:40 left in the half. A 17-play drive that covered 78 yards ended with Wright rolling right on fourth down and dumping a two-yard touchdown pass to tight end Ben Bresnahan.

It was Wright's first career touchdown pass.

Chance Moore kicked a 28-yard field for Kentucky before the end of the half, allowing the Wildcats to go into the locker room up 24-14.

Vanderbilt gave up 277 yards of offense over the first two quarters and allowed the Wildcats to average 8.9 yards per play.

Kentucky opened the scoring in the third quarter with a 3-yard touchdown run from Rodriguez. Vandy responded with a 75-yard drive that was capped off by Wright's 2-yard touchdown sprint on another fourth down call.

The Commodores trailed 31-21 with 2:53 to go in the third quarter and that would be how the scoreboard would read going into the final 15 minutes.

Vandy Falls to No. 6 Florida

 $NASHVILLE, Tenn.-No.\,6\,Florida\,scored\,24\,unanswered\,points\,at\,Vanderbilt\,Stadium\,to\,defeat\,Vanderbilt\,38-17.$

The Gators trailed 10-7 early before building an insurmountable lead. Quarterback Kyle Trask threw for 383 yards and three touchdowns for Florida.

Vandy entered the fourth quarter down 31-17 and had serious momentum when De'Rickey Wright recovered a Florida fumble with 14:25 to play. But a drive to the Florida 26 stalled and the Dores were forced to punt 4 1/2 minutes later.

On the ensuing possession, Emory Jones found tight end Kenmore Gamble on a 30-yard touchdown pass with 6:46 remaining to put the game to rest.

Vanderbilt came out firing in the opening minutes and went up 7-0 at the 10:50 mark. Quarterback Ken Seals (5-for-5 on the opening possession) hit Chris Pierce Jr. on 16-yard, third-down pass to give the Dores an early lead.

That marked the fourth straight game with a touchdown reception for Pierce Jr.

Florida answered immediately with a 76-yard drive that lasted just less than three minutes. Trask found Kadarius Toney on a 27-yard, third-down pass to tie the score at 7-all.

Vandy retook the lead thanks to a Pierson Cooke 25-yard field goal that made it 10-7 with 2:45 left in the opening frame and that's how the scoreboard would read going into the second.

The Gators tied it up with Evan McPherson's 33-yard field goal at the 4:13 mark.

Florida then took the lead just before the break when Trask threw a jump ball for Trevon Grimes from 34-yards out making it 17-10. Vandy would settle for that deficit going into the break.

Vanderbilt had 209 yards of total offense in the first half and held Florida to 37 yards rushing. But Trask was 14 of 19 for 193 yards and two scores.

The Gators opened the second half with a long scoring drive on their opening offensive series. Dameon Pierce finished off a 75-yard drive that took up 5:13 with a 1-yard plunge that put Florida ahead 24-10.

Trask found Gamble six minutes later on a 2-yard touchdown pass to give the Gators a 31-10 lead with 2:55 to go in the third quarter.

Vandy needed just three plays to answer as Seals found Pierce Jr. on a 58-yard scoring strike. Pierce caught a long slant and broke multiple tackles on his way to the end drawing the Commodores within 31-17 going into the fourth quarter.

Seals finished 22 of 34 for 319 yards and two touchdowns.
