- Vanderbilt returns to action with a 3 p.m. CT kick against Tennessee with live coverage on SEC Network. It will be the program's first home game since Nov. 21 and just the second home contest since Nov. 1.
- Saturday marks the 115th meeting between Vanderbilt and Tennessee with the Volunteers leading the series 33-76-5. The Commodores, however, have won five of the last eight contests.
- The Commodores traditionally end their season with a matchup against the cross-state rival Volunteers. The 2020 finale against Georgia will mark the first time since 2013 (Wake Forest) that Vandy has ended the slate with a team other than the Volunteers.
- Vandy and the Volunteers have met annually since 1946. The Vanderbilt-Tennessee series ranks fourth among the SEC's most frequently played rivalries. The Commodores have played Tennessee more than any other team.
- Vandy named Todd Fitch as the team's interim head coach on Nov. 29. Fitch, a 35-year college football veteran, came to West End in 2020 after a successful stint with head coach Skip Holtz at Louisiana Tech, where Fitch helped the Bulldogs to four consecutive postseason victories. The Ohio native will continue to serve as the Commodores' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.
- Twenty academic seniors and graduate students will be recognized prior to kickoff Saturday: wide receiver Tyrell Alexander, offensive lineman Drew Birchmeier, wide receiver James Bostic III, linebacker Brayden DeVault-Smith, cornerback Allan George, cornerback Elijah Hamilton, cornerback Randall Haynie, linebacker Kenny Hebert, long snapper Scott Meyer, offensive lineman Connor Mignone, center Grant Miller, linebacker Andre Mintze, defensive end Davo Odevingbo, linebacker Michael Owusu, wide receiver Chris Pierce Jr., defensive tackle Rutger Reitmaier, defensive tackle Cameron Robinson, wide receiver Keithian Starling, defensive tackle Cameron Tidd and running back Jamauri Wakefield.
- At Missouri (Nov. 28), senior Sarah Fuller kicked off to begin the second half, becoming the first female to play in a Power 5 contest. Fuller's kick went 30 yards and was downed at the Missouri 35-yard line. Fuller, from Wylie, Texas, spent four seasons as a keeper for the Vanderbilt soccer team. The Commodores won the 2020 SEC Tournament with Fuller in goal for all four postseason wins.
- Fifth-year senior linebacker Andre Mintze is one of 20 semifinalists for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award, one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award and a candidate for the Wuerffel Trophy.
- Vandy's offense has committed just two turnovers in the last three games after committing five at Mississippi State (Nov. 7) and averaging 2.8 turnovers during the first five contests.
- In the fourth quarter at Kentucky (Nov. 14) and during the opening frame against Florida (Nov. 21), the Commodores combined to score 24 points. In the first three games, spanning 12 quarters, Vanderbilt totaled 26 points.
- Freshman Ken Seals has already set the Vanderbilt freshmen single-season passing yardage record with 1,689 yards. He is the nation's only true freshman quarterback to have reached the 300-yard plateau in three games this fall.
- Senior wide receiver Chris Pierce Jr. owns five touchdown receptions in the last five games, tied for the sixth most among Power 5 receivers during the span. Pierce Jr.'s five touchdown grabs this season are the most for a Commodore since Jared Pinkney (7) and Kalija Lipscomb (9) in 2018.
- Junior wide receiver Cam Johnson is tied for second among FBS players in receptions since Oct. 25 with 40. Johnson's 49 receptions this season are tied for the 10th most by a junior in Vanderbilt history.

- The Commodores and Volunteers have met annually since 1946.
- The Vanderbilt-Tennessee series ranks fourth among the SEC's most frequently played rivalries. The Commodores have played Tennessee more than any other team.
- Vanderbilt controlled the infancy of the Tennessee rivalry, holding a 19-2-2 record against the Volunteers in the first 23 games played (1892-1926).
- 1892 Vanderbilt captured two victories over Tennessee in 1892, the first year the two schools faced each other. The Commodores won 22-4 at home in October, then traveled to Knoxville to claim a 10-0 decision in a November snowstorm.
- 1901 Bell Buckle's John Tigert guided the Commodores to a 22-0 home win. Later, Tigert would become the first Tennessean selected as a Rhodes Scholar. He eventually became U.S. Education Commissioner, president of the University of Florida, and a College Football Hall of Fame member.
- 1904 First-year Vanderbilt head coach Dan McGugin guided his Commodores to a shutout win at home in early November. From 1904-26, McGugin's teams went 13-2-1 against the Vols.
- 1922 Two touchdown passes for captain Jess Neely helped the Commodores to a 14-6 win.
- 2005 Quarterback Jay Cutler cemented his status among Commodore fans with his play against Tennessee. He threw for more 300 yards against the Volunteers as a junior and senior. In 2005, Cutler's last pass as a Commodore a 5-yarder to wide receiver Earl Bennett proved the winning margin in a 28-24 road win for Vanderbilt.

- 2016 Sophomore quarterback Kyle Shurmur threw for 416 yards and four scores to guide the Commodores to a 45-34 victory over No. 24 Tennessee. The win earned Vanderbilt a berth in the Independence Bowl.
- 2017 Vanderbilt all-time leading rusher Ralph Webb closed his career by rushing for 163 yards and two scores in a 42-24 Commodore win.
- 2018 Senior quarterback Kyle Shurmur completed his first 15 passes and ended with 367 yards and three scores, leading Vandy to bowl eligibility in a 38-13 win.

- On a side wall of Vanderbilt Stadium, near the south (tunnel) endzone, is a graphic
  in honor of former assistant Osia Lewis, who lost his three-year-plus battle with a
  form of liver cancer called cholangiocarcinoma in May.
- In 2016, Lewis joined the Vanderbilt football staff as senior defensive assistant and outside linebackers coach. Following his diagnosis, Lewis stepped away from his on-field coaching role, but continued his duties as a senior defensive assistant.

## **GSR AMONG THE NATION'S BEST**

- Vanderbilt Athletics finished with an overall Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 95

   the highest of any Southeastern Conference program for the sixth straight year.
- The Commodores led the nation with a 98 GSR for Black male student-athletes and first among Power 5 programs with a 98 GSR for all Black student athletes.
   Vanderbilt's 96 GSR for male student-athletes tied for second nationally.
- Vanderbilt's football program led the SEC with a GSR of 95, third among programs
  affiliated with a Power 5 conference.

## **MESSAGES ON DISPLAY**

- For the 2020 season, Vanderbilt student-athletes were given the option of choosing a
  message to display on their sweat plate on the back of the helmet. Fifteen messages
  will be on display throughout the course of the season, including: Black Lives Matter,
  Equality, I Am Second, Say Their Names, Turner's Heroes and No Justice No Peace.
- When senior Sarah Fuller joined the program, she put Play Like A Girl on her sweat
  plate. The phrase is connected to the national nonprofit, which was established in
  2004 by cancer researcher and philanthropist Dr. Kimberly Clay for the purpose of
  advancing the health and empowerment of girls and women through education.
  Play Like a Girl, which is based in Nashville, Tennessee, serves more than 1,250 girls
  and women annually through a variety of programs and events.

## **HENRY-BROOKS EQUALS OFFENSE**

## **NEEDING TO PROTECT THE FOOTBALL**

- The Commodores have turned it over just twice in the last three games, with an interception in the fourth quarter against Florida and a fumble in the second at Missouri.

- The Commodores are fourth in the league in fewest rushing yards allowed in the
  opening half with 544. Vanderbilt has not surrendered a rush of longer than 32
  yards in the first half and has allowed just six dashes of longer than 20 yards in the
  opening 30 minutes.
- The second half has been a different story as Vandy has yielded a league-high 963 yards and 11 runs of 20 or more yards.

## **BULLDOGS HELD TO MINUS-22 RUSHING YARDS**

- Backed by 3.0 sacks, Vanderbilt held Mississippi State to a program-record minus-22 rushing yards. Vandy did not allow a rush of more than four yards during the contest.
- The contest was the 11th in Southeastern Conference history in which one league foe held another to minus-22 total rushing yards or fewer.
- It marked the first SEC contest in which a program had minus-22 total rushing yards or fewer since the Bulldogs were held to minus-64 yards against Ole Miss in 2008.
- The minus-22 rushing yards allowed is tied for the 20th-best mark in a single game in SEC history. In Vanderbilt history, the previous best was minus-15 yards:

#### **SOLID ON THIRD DOWN**

- Opponents have converted just 41-of-89 third downs against Vanderbilt this season.
   Florida's eight conversions are the most allowed in a single game this fall.
- The Commodores rank 10th in the conference in third-down conversion percentage allowed (46.1%) and fourth in the league in fewest total conversions.

- To begin the second half at Missouri, senior Sarah Fuller kicked off to become the first Power 5 female football student-athlete.
- Fuller's kick traveled 30 yards and was downed at the Tigers' 35-yard line.
- Notable female kickers at the collegiate level have included:
  - Liz Heaston kicked two extra points for Willamette, then an NAIA program, on Oct. 18, 1997, to become the first woman to score in a college football game.
  - Ashley Martin became the first woman to score at the Division I level when she kicked three extra points for FCS Jacksonville State against Cumberland on Aug. 30, 2001.
  - Katie Hnida became the first woman to score at the FBS level when she kicked two extra points for New Mexico against Texas State on Aug. 30, 2003.
  - Tonya Butler became the first woman to kick a field goal in an NCAA game for Division II West Alabama on Sept. 13, 2003.
  - Brittany Ryan, with 100 points for Division III Lebanon Valley from 2007-10, is the all-time NCAA female scoring leader.
  - April Goss became the second woman to score in an FBS game with an extra point for Kent State against Delaware State in 2015.

#### KICKOFF RETURN FINDING SUCCESS

- Vanderbilt is averaging 22.6 yards/kickoff return, the third-best mark in the SEC.

#### **NEW KICKERS ALL AROUND**

- Vanderbilt deploys a variety of kickers depending on the situation in 2020.
- Junior Pierson Cooke has served as the primary field goal kicker and kickoff specialist. He had not attempted a placement kick in college before the Texas A&M tilt.
- Last fall, Cooke kicked off 29 times for 1,816 yards and 20 touchbacks. This year he
  has handled 23 of the Commodores' 24 kickoffs, averaging 61.0 yards per boot with
  10 touchbacks.
- Cooke owns all seven of Vandy's field goal tries in 2020, going 3-for-7, converting
  his first attempt from 33 yards, missing on next four tries and making his last two
  tries, from 41 yards at Mississippi State and 25 yards versus Florida.
- · Cooke is 9-for-9 on PATs.
- Junior Wes Farley has served as a PAT specialist, drilling all six attempts.
- Farley did not play prep football, but was a three-year starter for the soccer squad at New Canaan (Conn.) High School.

## WHEATLEY BOOKS FIRST CAREER PUNTS

- Sophomore Jared Wheatley filled in for Smith against Ole Miss and recorded his
  first career punts. Wheatley, who did not see action in 2019, booted five balls for
  an average of 33.2 yards/punt and a long of 55 yards.
- Wheatley tallied four boots downed inside the Rebel 20-yard line, one less than Smith had in the first three games this season.
- Wheatley was named the 2018 South Charlotte Punter of the Year while attending Porter Ridge (N.C.) High School.
- Smith led the SEC in total punting yardage (3,313) in 2019 and stood sixth nationally.

## **DUO HELPS FORM BLACK STUDENT-ATHLETE GROUP**

- Senior defensive lineman Cam Robinson and junior linebacker Elijah McAllister teamed up with track's Taiya Shelby and soccer's Olivia Simmons to take action, focusing on improving the Black student-athlete experience at Vanderbilt, among other issues.
- One of their first acts was to help organize a voter registration drive on Tuesday, Sept. 22 at Vanderbilt Stadium. The event was one of several campus efforts planned to encourage voter engagement.
- Also among the students' goals are to create a safe and comfortable space for Black student-athletes, provide a formal support system to offer the necessary actions and conversations to improve the social experience of Black student-athletes at Vanderbilt, work to address racial issues in sports and offer guidance toward professional development and personal growth.

#### ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

- Off the field, the Vanderbilt football team topped the SEC with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 95 for the 2019-20 academic year. The Commodores finished third among Power 5 programs in GSR, trailing only Duke (97) and Northwestern (97).
- Vandy led the nation with a 98 GSR for Black male student-athletes and was first among Power 5 programs with a 98 GSR for all Black student-athletes.

## MINTZE'S OFF-THE-FIELD ACCOLADES CONTINUE TO GROW

- Fifth-year senior linebacker Andre Mintze has enjoyed a growing list of off-the-field
  accolades this fall. He is one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award, which
  focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform
  in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. He is also
  one of 20 semifinalists for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year, presented
  to the college football player who demonstrates a record of leadership through
  exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field.
- Mintze is also a candidate for the Wuerffel Trophy, which is presented annually to the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with leadership achievement on and off the field.

## HORTON ELECTED TO ARKANSAS HALL OF FAME

Running back coach Tim Horton, a four-year letter winner at Arkansas, is a member
of the 2021 Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame Class. Horton started as a split end and
punt returner from 1987-89. Serving a team captain in his senior season, Horton
earned second-team All-SWC honors after hauling in 23 catches for 453 yards and
serving as the team's top punt returner. During his career as a Razorback, Arkansas
compiled a 38-11 record, won consecutive SWC titles (1988-89) and appeared in four
straight bowl games.

#### ROSSOMANDO A NORTHEAST-10 CONFERENCE OUTSTANDING INDIVIDUAL

- During the 2020-21 academic year the Northeast-10 is celebrating it's 40th anniversary by honoring 40 outstanding individuals and 40 iconic moments from throughout the conference's history. Offensive line coach Pete Rossomando was tabbed as one of the league's outstanding individuals.
- As the head coach of the University of New Haven (2008-12), Rossomando led the program to a 42-13 record and two NCAA Division II playoff appearances. He was named Liberty Mutual NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year following the 2012 season.

## HAYE A VANDERBILT AND SEC LEGEND

- Second-year defensive line coach Jovan Haye was a two-time captain and All-Southeastern Conference performer for the Commodores while starting 34 games on the defensive line from 2002-04.
- Haye was also tabbed Vanderbilt's SEC legend In 2019.

## **VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY • VANDERBILT ATHLETICS**

- Vanderbilt is ranked 14th among national universities by U.S. News & World Report.
   It ranks ninth in best value schools and 12th in best undergraduate teachings by the magazine.
- According to the 2021 Princeton Review, Vanderbilt ranks second for best quality
  of life, happiest students and most beautiful campuses in the nation.
- The university was founded in 1873 with a \$1 million gift from "Commodore" Cornelius Vanderbilt. Kirkland Hall, which continues as the main administration building on campus, is the only original structure that remains today.
- The 340-acre Vanderbilt campus, situated in an urban setting just two miles from business and governmental core of Nashville, is designated as an arboretum, and features approximately 300 species of trees and shrubs.

- The largest college on campus is Arts & Science with 4,046 undergraduates. The Divinity School is the smallest college with 176 students.
- Vanderbilt teams have captured five NCAA championships, all since 2007. The
  Commodore baseball team won the most recent national trophy, claiming the
  2019 College World Series in June. It was the second NCAA title for head coach Tim
  Corbin and the Vanderbilt baseball team. Other NCAA titles have been earned by
  women's bowling (2007, 2018) and women's tennis (2015).
- In 2019-20, Vanderbilt had the smallest undergraduate enrollment (6,886) and total enrollment (13,131) in the Southeastern Conference.
- · Vanderbilt is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference.
- Vanderbilt athletics director Candice Story Lee is one of five female athletic directors at Power 5 schools, joining University of Washington's Jennifer Cohen, Penn State's Sandy Barbour, Pittsburgh's Heather Lyke and Virginia's Carla Williams.
- Notable Vanderbilt alumni include PGA Tour FedEx Cup winner Brandt Snedeker, LPGA golfer and 2019 Solheim Cup USA team member Marina Alex, NBA champions Will Perdue, Festus Ezeli and Damian Jones, numerous Major League Baseball standouts such as David Price, Sonny Gray, Dansby Swanson and Walker Buehler, and more than 12 players active in the NFL such as cornerbacks Casey Hayward and Joejuan Williams, linebackers Zach Cunningham and Oren Burks, lineman Stephen Weatherly and receiver Trent Sherfield.

#### Something to Build On

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - Isaiah Spiller had 117 yards rushing, Ainias Smith ran for a touchdown and No. 10 Texas A&M overcame three turnovers to beat Vanderbilt 17-12 in the season-opener for both teams.

Spiller had 5 five yards rushing in the first half before getting going after halftime. Smith added 51 yards rushing after switching from receiver to running back this season to steady the offense on a night when Kellen Mond fumbled twice, losing one.

The Aggies didn't trail after the first quarter but were never able to pull away because of three fumbles and a penalty that resulted in a safety.

Vanderbilt started Ken Seals at quarterback, making him just the third true freshman quarterback to start a SEC season opener since freshman eligibility was restored in 1972. He threw for 150 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions.

Spiller got things going for A&M after halftime when he ran for 57 yards on the first play of the third quarter. Texas A&M pushed the lead to 14-5 when Mond connected with Caleb Chapman on a 17-yard TD pass two plays later.

Seals threw an interception on Vanderbilt's next drive, but the Aggies couldn't cash in on the mistake after Mond fumbled at the end of a run on the ensuing possession.

The Commodores cut the lead to 14-12 late in the third quarter when Seals threw a perfect strike to Amir Abdur-Rahman in the corner of the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown. Abdur-Rahman had five receptions for 72 yards — both career highs.

The Aggies added a field goal early in the fourth quarter to make it 17-12. Texas A&M was driving later in the quarter when Daevion Davis forced a fumble after a reception by Jalen Preston and recovered it to give Vanderbilt the ball at their own 42.

But a pass by Seals was tipped and intercepted by Leon O'Neal. He returned it 35 yards and the Aggies got 15 more yards after Chris Pierce was flagged for a late hit when he threw O'Neal down at the end of the run while he was out of bounds on the A&M sideline.

The Aggies came away empty on their next drive when Mond fumbled the handoff on fourth-and-1. But Vanderbilt had to punt it back to allow Texas A&M to hold on for the victory.

Vanderbilt led 3-0 in the first quarter before Smith ran 25 yards for a touchdown to put A&M on top.

There were about eight minutes left in the second quarter when Andre Mintze hit Mond to force a fumble which was recovered by Dashaun Jerkins. The Commodores couldn't move the ball and had to punt. But Brian George received a personal foul for a blind side block in the end zone to give Vanderbilt a safety to cut the lead to 7-5.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Myles Brennan threw for 337 yards and four touchdowns and No. 20 LSU beat Vanderbilt 41-7.

The defending national champs never trailed after losing their season opener to Mississippi State when Brennan was sacked seven times. LSU also extended its winning streak over the Commodores to nine in a series it leads 24-7-1.

The Tigers outgained Vanderbilt 498-266, and the defense came up with two interceptions and a pair of sacks.

Brennan completed passes to 11 different receivers against a Vanderbilt defense that had consistent pressure against Kellen Mond in an opening loss at Texas A&M.

Terrace Marshall Jr. finished with two TDs on two catches, and Jontre Kirklin had 65 yards receiving and two TD catches, the second a toe-tapper at the back of the end zone off a flea flicker. John Emery ran for 103 yards and a TD.

Vanderbilt had its chances with freshman Ken Seals making his home debut. When Randall Haynie picked off an overthrown pass from Brennan, Seals hit tight end Ben Bresnahan with an 8-yard TD pass to pull the Commodores to 14-7 in the second quarter.

Todd Harris Jr. picked off Seals' pass at the goal line early in the fourth quarter.

#### **Fighting the Uncontrollables**

 $NASHVILLE, Tenn. - South Carolina \ quarterback \ Collin \ Hill \ ran \ for \ two \ touchdowns \ and \ Kevin \ Harris \ ran \ for \ two \ TDs \ and \ a \ career-high \ 171 \ yards \ as \ the \ Gamecocks \ beat \ Vanderbilt \ 41-7.$ 

South Carolina won its 12th straight in this series by dominating Vanderbilt 486-249 in total offense and three sacks on a rainy day. The Gamecocks had more yards rushing (290) than the Commodores had total yards.

Harris ran for a 25-yard TD early in the third and added a career-long 88-yarder early in the fourth

Vanderbilt remains winless after having 56 scholarship players available for this game, just three above the limit set by the Southeastern Conference for a team to play a game. The Commodores already had six players opt out of this season.

Vanderbilt coach Derek Mason said he learned Thursday that his numbers would be limited by injuries and contact tracing during a pandemic.

Parker White kicked a pair of field goals, including a 43-yarder that gave the Gamecocks the lead for good in the first quarter.

Vanderbilt had its chances early to either tie or take a lead. Pierson Cooke missed a 29-yard field goal wide right for Vanderbilt and is now 1 of 4 this season.

In the second quarter, the Commodores went for it on fourth-and-2 at the South Carolina 3. Freshman Ken Seals rolled right and wound up being tackled, missing the chance to throw to a receiver in the end zone when open or run himself.

Hill hit Nick Muse with a 32-yard pass, starting a 12-play, 96-yard drive that the South Carolina quarterback capped himself for a 14-point swing. Hill went over the top for a 1-yard touchdown and a 10-0 lead with 2:09 left in the first half.

South Carolina scored the final 24 points. Hill ran for a 10-yard TD in the third, and Harris broke loose for his 88-yarder and Dakeron Joyner had a 47-yard TD, both in the fourth.

#### Vandy Falls at Home to Ole Miss

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The Ole Miss offense was too much for Vanderbilt to overcome during the Rebels' 54-21 win over Vanderbilt at Vanderbilt Stadium.

A 21-0 lead in the first quarter helped Ole Miss take control of the game early. The Rebels wound up totaling 645 yards of total offense and averaged 8.2 yards per play. They also put together six scoring drives of at least 70 yards.

Vandy got within 33-14 in the second quarter, but could not get any closer. Freshman quarterback Ken Seals finished 31-for-40 passing for 319 yards with two touchdowns while wide receiver Cam Johnson caught 14 passes for 97 yards.

Keyon Henry-Brooks had 66 yards rushing and scored the game's final touchdown on a 1-yard plunge in the fourth quarter.

Ole Miss won the toss, elected to receive and quickly marched 71 yards for the game's first touchdown. Snoop Conner polished off the series with a 1-yard plunge into the end zone, giving the Rebels a 7-0 lead less than 3 1/2 minutes into the affair.

A 9-yard touchdown lob from Matt Corral to tight end Kenny Yeboah put Ole Miss up 14-0 with 2:49 to go in the first quarter. That play capped a 93-yard drive that took just 4:13 off the clock.

Exactly two minutes later, Corral threw a 36-yard touchdown pass down the right sideline to Elijah Moore giving Ole Miss a 21-0 advantage going into the second quarter.

Vanderbilt finally responded after that when Seals found tight end Ben Bresnahan on a 43-yard touchdown pass down the left sideline. A quick pump fake followed by a long throw to an open Bresnahan cut the Vandy deficit to 21-7. The grab was the longest of Bresnahan's career.

Moore scored his next touchdown with a one-yard reception that capped an eight-play, 77-yard drive and gave Ole Miss a 27-7 lead. Six minutes and 28 seconds later, Moore caught a 28-yard touchdown to put the Rebels ahead 33-7.

Vandy wasn't done just yet and had enough time left on the clock to put something together. Seals orchestrated an eight-play drive that ended with a 16-yard pass to Chris Pierce Jr. into the left side of the end zone.

The Commodores would have to settle for a 33-14 halftime score.

Seals finished 15 of 18 passing in the first half totaling 158 yards to go along with two touchdown throws. Corral was 22 of 25 for 318 yards and four touchdowns and the Rebels piled up 413 yards of total offense on 46 plays.

After Vandy was forced to punt to begin the second half, Ole Miss put together another long scoring drive that ended with Corral's 14-yard touchdown pass to Ontario Drummond. That put the Rebels ahead 41-14.

The Commodores fumbled the ensuing kickoff, which allowed Corral to add a 9-yard touchdown pass to Yeboah a few minutes later making it 48-14. John Rhys Plumlee connected with Braylon Sanders on a 37-yard touchdown pass before the end of the third period.

Corral finished 31 of 34 passing for 412 yards and six touchdowns while Moore caught 14 balls for 238 yards and three scores.

#### **Comeback Comes Up Short**

STARKVILLE, Miss. — Vanderbilt cut a 17-0 deficit down to 17-14 in the second half at Davis Wade Stadium, but five turnovers ultimately led to the Commodores' demise in a 24-17 loss to Mississippi State.

Down 17-14 late, Vandy appeared intent on driving for a chance at a game-tying or gamewinning score, but quarterback Ken Seals threw his third interception of the day with 8:02 to play. The Dores still got the back with 6:11 to go, only to see Seals lose a fumble at his own 13 with 4:18 to play.

Jo'Quavious Marks punched in a 1-yard touchdown run shortly thereafter to ice the game for the Bulldogs.

Pierson Cooke was able to hit a 41-yard field goal with 38 ticks remaining making it a touchdown game. The Bulldogs recovered the ensuing onside kickoff to clinch victory.

Running back Keyon Henry-Brooks finished with 115 yards on 20 carries and caught 11 passes for 97 yards. His 27-yard touchdown run got the Commodores within three late in the game.

Seals threw for a career-high 336 yards on 31 of 46 passing and a touchdown. The freshman also threw three interceptions and lost a fumble.

Wide receiver Cam Johnson had 10 grabs for 114 yards and Chris Pierce made six receptions for 76 yards and a score.

After Vanderbilt's opening offensive series ended with an interception on the fourth play, Mississippi State needed just five plays to go 27 yards to take a 7-0 lead. Mississippi State quarterback Will Rogers found Osirus Mitchell on a 6-yard pass a little more than three minutes into the game.

The Bulldogs then upped their lead to 14-0 with an 11-play drive that covered 68 yards and chewed up 5:05 of clock. Dillon Johnson's 4-yard touchdown run polished the series off and came on the heals of Cooke's missed 50-yard field goal for Vandy.

Mississippi State's Brandon Ruiz added a 25-yard field goal later in the second quarter and that would turn out to be the final score of the half.

Vanderbilt had 156 yards of total offense in the first two quarters, but turned the ball over twice, missed a field goal and failed on one of two fourth-down conversions.

The Commodores finally put a dent into the lead toward the end of the third quarter thanks to an eight-play, 71-yard drive that ended in seven points. Seals found Pierce from the 2 to make the score 17-7 with 4:27 to go in the period.

Suddenly Vandy had life and road the legs of Henry-Brooks from there. The sophomore capped a 12-play, 85-yard drive with a 27-yard sprint to the end zone making it 17-14 with 12:27 to go.

#### **Dores Drop Road Test at Kentucky**

LEXINGTON, Ky. — A slow start out of the gates turned out to be critical in the race to victory for Vanderbilt as the Commodores lost 38-35 to Kentucky at Kroger Field.

After falling behind 14-0, Vandy had outscored the Wildcats 21-17 at one point, but couldn't come all the way back. Kentucky's Chris Rodriguez virtually iced the game with a 74-yard touchdown run with 9:14 to go in the contest, making it 38-21.

Quarterbacks Mike Wright and Ken Seals – both true freshmen – each had solid days for the Commodores. Wright threw a 2-yard touchdown pass and ran for a 2-yard score. Seals finished 21 of 32 for 225 yards and two touchdowns.

Vandy running back Keyon Henry-Brooks totaled 121 yards on the ground over a career-high 29 carries. The sophomore has racked up 302 yards rushing on 72 attempts the past three games.

Running back Mitchell Pryor scored on a 2-yard run for the Dores with 3:13 to play and Seals found Cam Johnson on a 7-yard touchdown pass with 30 seconds left. It was too little, too late.

Kentucky began the day by marching 75 yards in nine plays and went up 7-0 when Terry Wilson found Justin Rigg on a 15-yard touchdown pass. That series chewed up nearly five minutes of clock.

Wilson added a score with his feet when he rushed around right end for a 32-yard touchdown sprint putting the Wildcats ahead 14-0 with 3:48 to go in the opening stanza.

Vanderbilt regrouped to start the second quarter and got on board with a Seals 34-yard touchdown pass to Chris Pierce on a flag route into the right corner of the end zone. That play got the Commodores within 14-7.

The Wildcats didn't waste time with a response, scoring on Wilson's second touchdown pass of the day – this one coming from 21 yards out to Keaton Upshaw. Kentucky's scoring drive covered 79 yards in just seven plays.

The Commodores, who were 11 of 17 on third down, kept coming back and got within seven with 3:40 left in the half. A 17-play drive that covered 78 yards ended with Wright rolling right on fourth down and dumping a two-yard touchdown pass to tight end Ben Bresnahan.

It was Wright's first career touchdown pass.

Chance Moore kicked a 28-yard field for Kentucky before the end of the half, allowing the Wildcats to go into the locker room up 24-14.

 $V and erbilt gave up 277\ yards of offense over the first two quarters and allowed the Wildcats to average 8.9\ yards per play.$ 

Kentucky opened the scoring in the third quarter with a 3-yard touchdown run from Rodriguez. Vandy responded with a 75-yard drive that was capped off by Wright's 2-yard touchdown sprint on another fourth down call.

The Commodores trailed 31-21 with 2:53 to go in the third quarter and that would be how the scoreboard would read going into the final 15 minutes.

#### Vandy Falls to No. 6 Florida

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — No. 6 Florida scored 24 unanswered points at Vanderbilt Stadium to defeat Vanderbilt 38-17.

The Gators trailed 10-7 early before building an insurmountable lead. Quarterback Kyle Trask threw for 383 yards and three touchdowns for Florida.

Vandy entered the fourth quarter down 31-17 and had serious momentum when De'Rickey Wright recovered a Florida fumble with 14:25 to play. But a drive to the Florida 26 stalled and the Dores were forced to punt 4 1/2 minutes later.

On the ensuing possession, Emory Jones found tight end Kenmore Gamble on a 30-yard touchdown pass with 6:46 remaining to put the game to rest.

Vanderbilt came out firing in the opening minutes and went up 7-0 at the 10:50 mark. Quarterback Ken Seals (5-for-5 on the opening possession) hit Chris Pierce Jr. on 16-yard, third-down pass to give the Dores an early lead.

That marked the fourth straight game with a touchdown reception for Pierce Jr.

Florida answered immediately with a 76-yard drive that lasted just less than three minutes. Trask found Kadarius Toney on a 27-yard, third-down pass to tie the score at 7-all.

Vandy retook the lead thanks to a Pierson Cooke 25-yard field goal that made it 10-7 with 2:45 left in the opening frame and that's how the scoreboard would read going into the second.

The Gators tied it up with Evan McPherson's 33-yard field goal at the 4:13 mark.

Florida then took the lead just before the break when Trask threw a jump ball for Trevon Grimes from 34-yards out making it 17-10. Vandy would settle for that deficit going into the break.

Vanderbilt had 209 yards of total offense in the first half and held Florida to 37 yards rushing. But Trask was 14 of 19 for 193 yards and two scores.

The Gators opened the second half with a long scoring drive on their opening offensive series. Dameon Pierce finished off a 75-yard drive that took up 5:13 with a 1-yard plunge that put Florida ahead 24-10.

Trask found Gamble six minutes later on a 2-yard touchdown pass to give the Gators a 31-10 lead with 2:55 to go in the third quarter.

Vandy needed just three plays to answer as Seals found Pierce Jr. on a 58-yard scoring strike. Pierce caught a long slant and broke multiple tackles on his way to the end drawing the Commodores within 31-17 going into the fourth quarter.

Seals finished 22 of 34 for 319 yards and two touchdowns.

#### **Dores Drop Road Contest at Missouri**

COLUMBIA, Mo. — Vanderbilt's offense could never get into gear on an otherwise historic day at Memorial Stadium, where the Commodores lost 41-0 to Missouri.

Sarah Fuller, a senior and keeper on the Vanderbilt soccer team, took the opening kickoff of the second half to become the first woman to ever play in a Southeastern Conference and Power 5 Conference football game.

Fuller and her teammates, however, could not keep pace with a Missouri offense that totaled 603 yards. The Tigers jumped out to a 7-0 lead early and never looked back from there.

Vanderbilt got off to a tough start when it went for a 4th-and-1 on its own 44 and was stuffed at the line of scrimmage. Missouri went the other direction quickly by going 44 yards on six plays to take a 7-0 lead on a Larry Rountree 7-yard touchdown run.

Vandy's defense held Missouri to a 45-yard field goal attempt later in the first quarter, which hit off the upright to keep it a 7-0 game.

That's where the score would stay until midway through the second quarter when Rountree found pay dirt again – another 7-yard scoring run capped off a nine-play, 82-yard drive. The Tigers had a 14-0 lead with 7:51 to go in the first half.

The Tigers added to that lead with 1:08 on the clock before the break. After Tyler Badie was ruled short of the goal line on a 28-yard reception, the running back punched it in a play later to make it 21-0.

Vandy was held to just 93 yards of total offense in the first half, was 2 of 8 on third down and 0-for-1 on fourth down. Missouri, meanwhile, racked up 325 yards of offense.

After Fuller made history to start the half with a kickoff that traveled 30 yards, Missouri had a 62-yard drive stall at the 3. Harrison Mevis came out and split the uprights on a 21-yard field goal to up the Tigers' lead to 24-0.

Mevis added a 44-yard field goal with 3:31 left in the third period making it 27-0.

Rountree's 25-yard touchdown run to begin the fourth made it 34-0. Damon Hazelton scored on a 25-yard pass from Brady Cook with 6:46 to go providing the final margin.

Rountree finished with 160 yards on the ground for Missouri.
