#### **FOR STARTERS**

The University of South Carolina baseball team visits Hawkins Field in Nashville, Tenn., for a three-game series at No. 2 Vanderbilt to open Southeastern Conference play. The series begins on Friday night at 6:30 p.m. CT (7:30 p.m. ET). The series continues Saturday morning at 11 a.m. CT (12 p.m. ET) and concludes on Sunday afternoon at 1 p.m. CT (2 p.m. ET).

Friday and Sunday's game will be streamed on SEC Network Plus while Saturday's game is on SEC Network with Tom Hart and Kyle Peterson on the call. Every Gamecock contest will be on the Gamecock Radio Network with Derek Scott and Tommy Moody on the call.

The Gamecocks fell, 9-4, to Davidson on Wednesday night (March 18) as Wes Clarke homered for the 10th time this season.

#### SCOUTING VANDERBILT

The Commodores picked up a 4-1 win over Belmont on Tuesday night, as Vanderbilt's pitching staff allowed just three hits in the win. Jayson Gonzalez drove in a pair while Christian Little struck out seven in the win. On the season, Gonzalez is hitting .372 with 14 RBI while Kumar Rocker is 4-0 and has not allowed an earned run in 23 innings of work.

#### **SERIES VS. VANDERBILT**

Carolina holds a 58-36 series lead on Vanderbilt heading into Friday's game. The Commodores swept Carolina in 2019 in Columbia. In the last meeting in Nashville in 2018, Carolina won on Friday and Sunday in a pair of one-run contests. Carlos Cortes and Jonah Bride each drove in three runs in the 10-9 series finale win on that Sunday.

#### **SEC PLAY FOR OPENERS**

The Southeastern Conference begins league play this weekend across the region. It will be the first league contests since the 2019 season as the 2020 ledger was postponed a day before SEC play was about to begin. This will be the first time Carolina has opened with Vanderbilt since 2008 and the first time the Gamecocks will open on the road since they started league play at Tennessee in 2017.

#### **FARR RECORDS CAREER HIGH VS. LONGHORNS**

Thomas Farr struck out a career high 10 batters in Carolina's 4-1 loss to Texas on March 12. Farr went six innings in the start, allowing seven hits and a run with just one walk to go along with the 10 punchouts. On the season, Farr is 2-0 with a 1.54 ERA.

#### WIMMER DOES IT ALL ON SUNDAY IN TEXAS

Braylen Wimmer was a perfect 4-for-4 with two doubles and an RBI in Sunday's 8-5 loss at Texas. Wimmer also made a home run saving catch in center field in the series finale. Wimmer is third on the team with a .370 batting average and is second with six doubles.

#### STELLAR PITCHING LIFTS CAROLINA TO SWEEP OF MERCER

The South Carolina pitching staff struck out 44 batters and allowed just one run in 27 innings pitched in a three-game sweep of Mercer on March 5-7. Thomas Farr earned the win on Friday, allowing six hits and a run with five strikeouts in 5.1 innings pitched. On Saturday, Brannon Jordan recorded a career-high 11 strikeouts in the 4-0 win while Julian Bosnic struck out nine in 5.1 innings in a 1-0 win on Sunday. Jack Mahoney and Brett Kerry pitched twice during the weekend and Andrew Peters struck out five in 2.2 innings of relief on Friday.

#### GAMECOCKS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Carolina has earned a spot in all six of college baseball's national polls after the fourth weekend of play. The Gamecocks are 12th in Baseball America, 16th in D1Baseball, 17th in USA Today, 18th in Collegiate Baseball and 21st in Perfect Game.

#### **RUNS APLENTY VS. WINTHROP**

Carolina scored its most runs in a game since June 5, 2016, in a 19-8 win over Winthrop on Tuesday, March 2. The Gamecocks scored 16 runs in the first four innings of play, helped by five RBI from Joe Satterfield and home runs from Brady Allen and Andrew Eyster. Carolina scored 23 runs in the 2016 Columbia Regional in a win over Rhode Island.

#### **GAMECOCKS SECURE SERIES WIN OVER CLEMSON**

For the second time in three seasons, Carolina has won the series over Clemson. This time, after a rain out on Friday night, the Gamecocks had back-to-back walk-off wins over the Tigers on Feb. 27 and 28. Andrew Eyster delivered the walk-off hit in both games of the series. His double in Greenville on Saturday drove in Brady Allen in the bottom of the 11th. He then had a walk-off single in the ninth in Columbia on Sunday. The third game will be played on May 11 in Clemson.

#### **EYSTER SEND EVERYONE HOME -- TWICE**

Andrew Eyster had walk-off hits in back-to-back wins over Clemson on Feb. 27-28. The senior from Ocala, Fla., doubled in the 11th inning in a 3-2 win on Saturday in Greenville. He

then had a walk-off single in the ninth inning in the 8-7 win on Sunday in Columbia. Eyster is hitting .455 with five doubles, a triple, a home run and six RBI in eight games played against the Tigers.

#### **CLARKE HAS A START TO REMEMBER**

Wes Clarke has had a start to remember in 2021. The two-time SEC Co-Player of the Week and National Player of the Week is hitting .382 with 10 home runs, 19 RBI, 53 total bases, 22 runs scored, two doubles and 17 walks. Clarke hit two home runs on Feb. 20 against Dayton and had three in the 12-4 win over Winthrop. It was the first time a Gamecock had three home runs in a game since Justin Smoak had three against USC Upstate on April 15, 2008. The junior then had two home runs, including a three-run shot, in the win over Clemson on Feb. 28. Clarke currently leads the nation with 10 home runs and leads the SEC in home runs and slugging percentage and is tied for the lead in walks.

#### WILL EQUALS WINS IN CLEMSON WEEKEND

Will Sanders earned wins in both Clemson games on Feb. 27 and Feb. 28. He came into the 11th inning with runners on first and second with no outs and induced a double play and groundout to end the Clemson threat. Carolina then went on to win in the bottom of the 11th. On Sunday vs. Clemson, Sanders again came in with runners on first and second with one out in the ninth and got a fly out and groundout to end the Clemson threat. He picked up the win after Carolina walked it off in the ninth.

#### **LUCKY SEVEN**

The Gamecocks hit seven home runs in the 12-4 win over Winthrop on Feb. 23, three from Wes Clarke and one apiece from Andrew Eyster, Braylen Wimmer, David Mendham and Josiah Sightler. It's the first time the Gamecocks have hit seven home runs in a game since May 5, 2010 against Winthrop and Wimmer, Clarke and Mendham went back-to-back-to-

back, the first time the Gamecocks have had three straight longballs since they had five in a row in the 2006 Athens Super Regional against Georgia.

#### **BOSNIC BREAKS A RECORD IN FIRST CAREER START**

Julian Bosnic set a Carolina record with eight consecutive strikeouts in the Sunday win over Dayton (Feb. 21). Bosnic hit the first batter but then struck out eight consecutive Flyers before a walk on a 3-2 count. He broke the record of seven, set by Adam Hill vs. Charleston Southern in 2018 and Alex Farotto vs. Mississippi State in 2007.

#### NO BREAKS IN THE GAMECOCKS' SLATE

South Carolina will have 24 games against teams currently in the D1Baseball.com Top-25 poll during the 2021 season. Carolina has three-game series against No. 1 Arkansas, No. 2 Vanderbilt, No. 3 Mississippi State, No. 4 Ole Miss., No. 5 Florida, No. 10 Texas, No. 13 Tennessee, and No. 19 LSU this spring. This does not include the three-game set with Clemson and three games at Georgia, both of whom are receiving votes in most national polls. In fact, the Gamecocks face the top four teams in the SEC West this season to go along with playing the five SEC East teams.

#### **GAMECOCKS PICKED FOURTH IN THE EAST**

Carolina was picked to finish fourth in the SEC Eastern Division by the league's 14 head coaches.

The Gamecocks earned 55 votes in the coaches' poll, good for fourth in the SEC East division behind Florida (91 votes, 13 first-place votes), Vanderbilt (79 votes, 1 first-place votes) and Tennessee (58 votes). Carolina was followed by Georgia (51 votes), Missouri (28 votes) and Kentucky (23 votes).

Ole Miss has been picked to win the Western Division with 78 votes and seven first-place votes. The Rebels were followed by Missis-sippi State (73 votes, 3 first-place votes), Arkansas (72 votes, 2 first-place votes), LSU (63 votes, 2 first-place votes), Texas A&M (36 votes), Auburn (32 votes) and Alabama (31 votes).

Florida earned 12 votes to win the SEC championship, followed by Mississippi State and Vanderbilt with one vote apiece.

#### CLARKE NAMED A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN; ALL-SEC

Junior Wes Clarke was named to the Collegiate Baseball Preseason All-America third team and the Preseason All-SEC second team before the start of the 2021 season.

Clarke, who also was named a Collegiate Baseball Third Team All-American in 2020, led the SEC and was tied for third in the country with eight home runs last year while driving in 22, which was tied for third in the league. Clarke hit .286 with 14 runs scored in 16 games played for the Gamecocks. He was 3-for-4 with three runs scored, two home runs and seven RBI in a win over Northwestern on Feb. 22. He also hit the game-winning home run in the top of the 12th inning in a 2-1 win at Furman (March 3). Clarke had a .406 on-base percentage and did not commit an error at first base for Carolina.

Garnet and Black. Eyster has a career .308 batting average at Carolina with 15 doubles, 14 home runs and 44 RBI. He also earned the Tom Price Award in 2020, handed out to the Gamecocks' MVP of the Clemson series. Allen led Carolina last season with a .327 batting average in 2020 and has 10 career home runs to go along with 38 RBI.

#### **DEPTH ON THE MOUND**

The Gamecocks will have options when it comes to who will be on the mound. Carolina has 22 pitchers on its 2021 roster, including 2019 Freshman All-SEC honoree Brett Kerry and a pair of weekend starters from last year in Thomas Farr and Brannon Jordan. Kerry is projected to be the Gamecocks' closer this season and Daniel Lloyd also is in that mix. Kerry was 2-0 with a 3.60 ERA and a save in six appearances last season. Lloyd also had a save and struck out 13 batters in nine innings. The quartet of Julian Bosnic, John Gilreath, Brett Thomas and Josiah Sightler did not allow an earned run in 19 innings of work. Carolina returns 11 pitchers who worked last season and Wesley Sweatt, who pitched 43.2 innings in 2019.

#### **FRESH FACES**

Carolina welcomes in 18 newcomers to the 2021 team, 13 high schoolers, three junior college transfers and two grad transfers. This recruiting class was ranked as high as No. 4 in the country by Perfect Game. D1Baseball.com had the class at No. 5 in the country while Baseball America tabbed it at No. 6 in the nation. Collegiate Baseball ranked the class No. 8 in the country. The 18-man recruiting class features six student-athletes (Alek Boychuk, Magdiel Cotto, Jackson Phipps, Will Sanders, Josh Shuler and Jalen Vasquez) that were in Baseball America's Top 500 prospects for the 2020 MLB Draft and had Brandon Fields on the list before he declared that he was coming to school.

#### CAROLINA WELCOMES 2,100 FANS TO FOUNDERS PARK IN 2021

The University of South Carolina Athletic Department has received approval from the South Carolina Department of Commerce and is excited to welcome Gamecock fans to Founders Park for baseball games this season.

Per South Carolina Governor Henry McMaster's Executive Order of July 29, 2020, stadiums and athletics venues were permitted to open and exceed the order's guidelines if the department "can satisfactorily demonstrate an ability to comply with federal and state CO-VID-19 procedures and protocols to the Department of Commerce."

Capacity for this season will be reduced to approximately 2,100 ticketed patrons (25.4 percent of normal capacity) with ticket pods of two and four seats. There will be approximately six feet of distance between the pods. Facial coverings will be required for staff and fans at all times at the stadium, and patrons also will be required to follow the SEC and University fan safety guidelines.

#### **10-YEAR CHAMPIONSHIP ANNIVERSARY**

The University of South Carolina baseball program will celebrate the 10-year anniversary of the 2011 national championship team all season long at Founders Park. Throughout the season, members of the 2011 squad will throw out virtual first pitches at select Carolina home games. There also will be in-game promos geared towards that historic season. Fans also can relive the 2011 season on the Gamecock baseball social platforms throughout the year. Each Thursday, there will be a post highlighting the successes of the team during that week in 2011, leading up to the national championship run in Omaha.

#### **UP NEXT**

Carolina starts a five-game homestand on Tuesday night (March 23) as the Gamecocks host The Citadel. First pitch at Founders Park is set for 7 p.m. and the game will be televised on SEC Network.

# HEAD COACH 4TH SEASON AT SOUTH CAROLINA - 12TH SEASON AS HEAD COACH NORTH CAROLINA (1995)

**Mark Kingston** was named the head baseball coach at the University of South Carolina on June 30, 2017. He became the 30th head coach in the history of Gamecock Baseball.

Kingston's first team at Carolina (2018) advanced to the Super Regionals in Arkansas after going 3-0 in the Greenville Regional at East Carolina. The Gamecocks won each of their last five SEC series in 2018, as Carolina swept LSU and won series against Vanderbilt, Ole Miss, Missouri and Texas A&M on

its way to a third place finish in the SEC East (17-13) and fifth-place overall conference finish. Carolina handed Arkansas its only postseason loss until the College World Series championship series, defeating the Razorbacks 8-5 in game two of the super regional. The Carolina team finished seventh in the country in fielding percentage (.980) and 12th in home runs (79). Kingston coached 10 players that were picked in the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft and had 12 players selected to the Spring SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The 2019 team saw five players picked in the MLB First-Year Player Draft, including TJ Hopkins in the ninth round. The Gamecocks earned a Palmetto Point, winning 2-of-3 games against Clemson in early March. Success against the ACC continued with wins over N.C. State and North Carolina in Charlotte. South Carolina earned a trip to Hoover on the final day of the regular season, defeating College World Series participant Mississippi State in Starkville. Kingston coached Brett Kerry, who was named to the SEC All-Freshman team and was named a Freshman All-American by three different organizations.

Kingston came to Carolina following a three-year stint as the head coach at USF. He compiled a 100-78-1 record while in Tampa, helping the Bulls to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances. Kingston owns a career mark of 350-238-1 in nine seasons as a head coach, including five at Illinois State, with four NCAA appearances in that nine-year span.

Kingston has helped lead 12 teams to NCAA Tournament berths as an assistant and head coach — with five of those teams appearing in the NCAA Super Regionals, two participating in the College World Series and one winning a national championship. As a player at the University of North Carolina, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped UNC win the ACC Tournament and advance to the NCAA Regionals in 1990. As an assistant coach, Kingston helped the Miami Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. His 21-year collegiate coaching career also includes stops at Tulane, where he helped guide the Green Wave to the 2005 College World Series, and Purdue.

Kingston guided USF to a 42-19 mark in 2017, the first time since 1996 that the team had reached the 40-win mark. Under Kingston's leadership, the Bulls earned their second trip to the NCAA Tournament in three years. USF won 19-straight games from Feb. 19 - March 22, the second-longest streak in program history. During that streak, USF defeated then No. 3 Florida State in Tallahassee, its first victory against FSU since 1989. On May 9, the Bulls defeated then-No. 5 Florida in Gainesville. It marked the first time in program history that the Bulls beat both FSU and Florida on the road in the same season. The victories were just USF's second and third wins over top-five teams in program history. Kingston reached the 100-win mark at the helm of the program in the Gainesville Regional opener with a 9-1 win over Bethune-Cookman, making him the second-fastest coach in program history to reach 100 victories.

Kingston's Bulls dominated on the mound in 2017, posting a 3.24 team ERA and allowing 7.64 hits per nine innings, both in the top-10 nationally. The pitchers led the country with 10.1 strikeouts per nine innings and set a program record with 620 strikeouts. Offensively, shortstop Kevin Merrell set an American Athletic Conference record with a .384 average, the third-straight year he led the Bulls in hitting. Merrell was named an All-American by four separate publications and was named to the AAC First Team for a second-straight year. He was one of five Bulls named to All-American Athletic Conference teams, the most since 2009. Merrell was drafted by the Oakland Athletics with the 33rd overall pick in the MLB Amateur Draft, becoming the third-highest drafted player in program history. Overall, four USF players were selected in the draft, as Phoenix Sanders went in the 10th round to the Tampa Bay Rays, Joe Cavallaro was taken in the 24th round by the New York Mets and Ryan Valdes was selected in the 33rd round by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

In 2016, the Bulls recorded 517 strikeouts, logging back-to-back seasons of over 500 strikeouts for the first time in school history. Merrell posted a team-high .320 batting average and a first-team all-conference selection in the AAC. Pitcher Brandon Lawson also notched over 100 strikeouts on his way to a second-team all-conference honor. The Bulls won two series against ranked teams (No. 25 Michigan State, at No. 22 East Carolina), and had three players drafted - pitcher Tommy Eveld (ninth round, Arizona), pitcher Brandon Lawson (13th round, Tampa Bay), and outfielder Luke Maglich (34th round, Philadelphia).

Kingston made an immediate impact at USF in 2015, leading the Bulls to an NCAA Regional for the first time since 2002. Kingston and his staff increased the Bulls' 2014 win total by seven and earned the team's first NCAA Tournament win in 13 years. Coach Kingston's guidance helped produce four players who were drafted by Major League Baseball clubs, including pitcher Jimmy Herget (sixth round, Cincinnati), pitcher Tommy Peterson (12th round, Washington), infielder Kyle Teaf (30th round, Tampa Bay), and pitcher Casey Mulholland (37th round, Dodgers). Merrell was recognized as a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, and catcher Levi Borders was named to the Johnny Bench Watch list and was a unanimous selection on The American's First Team. Herget was also named to The American's First Team, and Peterson earned second-team honors. Merrell, first baseman Buddy Putnum, and Teaf were also named to the NCAA Gainesville Regional All-Tournament team.

Kingston came to USF with a long track record as a top-level recruiter and a producer of offensively explosive teams. He spent 2010-2014 as the head coach at Illinois State University, where he led the Redbirds to two MVC regular season championships and one conference tournament title while twice breaking the program's season wins record. He won more than 30 games in each of his five seasons at ISU, a program-record string that included a season-record 39 wins in 2013. He reached the MVC Tournament championship game three times and compiled an overall record of 173-102 (.629 winning percentage). Kingston was twice named a "Rising College Coach" by Kendall

Rogers of Perfect Game USA during a five-year tenure at Illinois State (2010-2014) in which he earned MVC Coach of the Year honors in 2010 and 2013 and helped 18 Redbirds earn First-Team all-MVC honors. Two of his players were named MVC Player or Pitcher of the Year and eight were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Kingston led ISU to rapid success, as the Redbirds ranked second in conference wins (64) from 2010-14 while posting two first-place finishes and no worse than a fourth-place conclusion in the MVC. His overall winning percentage of .629 and average of 35 wins per season were a strong improvement over previous seasons. ISU's average RPI rating of 69.50 from 2010-13 ranked fifth among all northern Division I programs and Kingston's recruiting classes contained 15 players ranked in the Top-20 in the state of Illinois by Prep Baseball Report, more than any other university.

He took over the ISU program after serving one season as the team's associate head coach and promptly posted the most successful first-year head coaching stint in program history. Kingston led the 2010 Redbirds to their first-ever share of the MVC regular-season title, their first MVC Tournament title since 1994 and their first NCAA Tournament victory since 1976. ISU's 32-24 record was the most wins for the Redbirds since 1999.

In 2011, Kingston guided the team to a then-record season win total (36-18), including a marquee victory at Miami (Fla.), and placed seven players on the All-MVC team. The following year (2012) ISU went 33-19 and posted a 10-game win-streak, the program's longest since 1984. Closer Kenny Long was selected by the Houston Astros in the 22nd round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft, marking three-consecutive seasons in which a Redbird was selected in the MLB draft.

In 2013, Kingston guided ISU to a program-best 39 wins (39-19), posted a school-record 12-game winning streak, won the MVC outright for the first time in school history and set a Valley-record with eight first-team All-MVC selections. Offensively, ISU paced the MVC in batting average, on-base percentage, slugging percentage and home runs and the pitching staff fired a program-record 13 complete games, including 10 shutouts.

Prior to his stint at ISU, Kingston was part of 500 wins (500-279-2) in 13 seasons as an assistant coach and was widely respected as one of the top assistants in the nation. He spent the previous seven years at Tulane University, serving as recruiting coordinator throughout his tenure and as associate head coach the final five seasons with the responsibility of overseeing recruiting, coaching hitters and developing catchers and infielders.

At Tulane, Kingston's recruiting and coaching efforts helped the Green Wave to six postseason appearances, two NCAA Super Regionals and a berth in the 2005 College World Series. The 2005 Green Wave team was seeded as the top team overall while also receiving the top academic honor in Omaha. Tulane averaged nearly 42 wins per season with Kingston on staff.

Kingston recruited or coached seven players who became All-Americans at Tulane, including James Jurries (2002) and Michael Aubrey (2003). The Green Wave sluggers became the first hitters in 18 years to hit .400 for the season and both earned Conference USA Player of the Year recognition. Aubrey was selected by the Cleveland Indians 11th overall in 2003, the highest Tulane player ever taken in the draft.

Prior to Tulane, Kingston spent two years at Miami (Fla.), where he helped the Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. While at Miami, the Hurricanes finished with top-five school single-season marks in batting average, runs scored and slugging percentage, and led the nation with 228 stolen bases in 2001. In the

run to the 2001 national title, the `Canes had an NCAA-best 17-0 run to end the season and set a College World Series record with 12.3 runs per game while hitting .373 as a team in Omaha.

Kingston spent one year as an assistant at Illinois State, helping the 1999 Redbirds set then-school records for wins in a season (35), runs scored, RBI, doubles, hits and walks, while finishing second in school history in home runs, total bases and batting average.

Kingston began his coaching career with two seasons at Purdue, helping the Boilermakers post three of the top-seven batting averages in school history and place five position players on the All-Big Ten team after not posting any the year before his arrival.

A 1995 graduate of North Carolina with a degree in communications, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped the team win the ACC Tournament and advance to NCAA Regionals in 1990 as a sophomore. Kingston received the Trippe Bourne "Most Dedicated Player" Award for his outstanding work ethic and leadership during his junior campaign, and was named a team captain his senior season.

Drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers out of North Carolina in 1992, the Northern Virginia native played professionally for five seasons with Milwaukee and the Chicago Cubs organizations. In 2019, Kingston was named as an assistant coach to the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, which played in tournaments in Taiwan and Japan.

Kingston attended Potomac High School (Virginia), where he developed into a Collegiate Baseball Top-50 Prospect and was drafted by the New York Yankees after leading his team to the 1988 state championship. In 2006, Kingston was inducted into the Potomac Hall of Fame.

Kingston and his wife, the former Letitia Kelly, have three children, Kailyn Grace, Cameron James and Kathryn Patricia. He also wrote and produced two instructional videos for Championship Productions, "Keys to Consistent Hitting" and "Catching Drills and Fundamentals." He also was the only assistant coach chosen to write a chapter in "The Baseball Drill Book" produced by the American Baseball Coaches Association.


