SERIES RECON

- This is the first all-time meeting between the two sides.

LOOKING AHEAD

- Last time out on Feb. 28, No. 25 Vanderbilt fell by a 17-6 final score at No. 1 North Carolina.
- Elizabeth Scarrone scored two goals to lead the offense.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Paige Gunning tied a career high 13 saves on the day.

AAC HONORS

- Senior Elizabeth Scarrone earned American Athletic Conference Attack Player of the Week on March 1.
- She won the honor after putting up a combined seven goals in Vanderbilt's last two games.
- Scarrone posted five goals in the win over Central Michigan and two against No. 1 North Carolina.
- She is the second Commodore to win an award this season, joining Paige Gunning - the AAC Defensive Player of the Week from Feb. 22.

GUNNING SOLID

- Sophomore goalkeeper Paige Gunning's 46 saves are the most among NCAA Division I players this season.
- Gunning is tied for sixth among NCAA Division I goalkeepers with 11.5 saves per game.
- She has made 10 or more saves in three games in 2021.
- Gunning made 13 saves in the Feb. 21 win over Colorado to earn American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Week.

CENTURY MARK

- In the game at North Carolina, junior Bri Gross recorded her 100th career draw control.
- She is the 11th player in school history to reach 100 career draw controls.
- Gross leads the Commodores with 19 draw controls this season.
- With 101 career draw controls, she ranks ninth in program history.
- The Vanderbilt record for career draw controls is 263 set by Ally Carey ('12).

DON'T BACK DOWN

- Vanderbilt has already faced three ranked opponents in 2021 season: No. 1 North Carolina, No. 2 Notre Dame and No. 24 Colorado.
- In AAC play, the Commodores will meet Florida twice in Gainesville. The Gators are ranked in the top 10.
- The last time the Commodores played three or more ranked opponents away from West End was 2017.

NATIONAL ATTENTION

- Vanderbilt was ranked No. 25 in the Feb. 22 IWLCA Top 25 poll.
- The ranking came after beating No. 24 Colorado in an 11-10 overtime thriller on Feb. 21 in Nashville.
- It was Vanderbilt's first appearance in the IWLCA national poll since ranking No. 20 on April 23, 2012.
- The Commodores fell out of the rankings after dropping a 17-6 decision to No. 1 UNC on Feb. 28.

ON DECK

- The Commodores continue their homestand with a March 7 game versus High Point at noon.
- The game will be played at Vanderbilt Stadium.

NASHVILLE IS OUR HOME

- Vanderbilt has won every home opener dating back to 2015, including both in the Beth Hewitt era.
- Now in year three at the helm, Hewitt is 10-5 in home games.
- The Commodores have nine scheduled home games in 2021, which will be played in three different on-campus venues: Vanderbilt Lacrosse Complex - 6; David Williams II Recreation and Wellness Center -1; Vanderbilt Stadium - 2

TOUGH TESTS

- Counting the last four games of 2020 and the first four of 2021, the Commodores faced seven ranked opponents in an eight-game stretch. The seven are: No. 10 Denver, No. 13 Michigan, No. 21 Penn State, No. 2 Notre Dame (twice), No. 24 Colorado and No. 1 North Carolina.
- The Dores are no stranger to tough schedules — Vanderbilt has had stretches of playing at least three ranked opponents in four games six times since 2013 (the 2013 squad faced eight ranked teams in 17 games, including seven of nine).

CONTINUING 2021

- The Dores were tabbed to finish No. 2 in the AAC's preseason poll as selected by league coaches.
- The 2021 season will see first meetings against five opponents: No. 24 Colorado, Central Michigan, Mercer, High Point and new AAC foe, Old Dominion.
- By season's end, the Dores will have traveled 4,732 miles roundtrip with five trips from West End to four states (Indiana, North Carolina, Ohio and Florida).

GOING THE DISTANCE

- Seven returning Dores -- Karlie Bucci, Gabby Forna, Bri Gross, Melissa Hawkins, Megan MacGillis, Halle Regan and Callie Sundin -- played and started every game in 2020.

2020 RUNBACK

- A season ago, the Dores were fifth nationally in clearing percentage. Vanderbilt moved the ball to its attackers nearly 92% (.916) of the time, which was second in the AAC.
- In 2020, Vanderbilt was 28th in the country in both assists per game (6.6) and caused turnovers (9.8). They were 31st in points per game with 19.8.
- A majority (50.4% or 60-of-119) of Vanderbilt's goals in 2020 were assisted.
- The Commodores were quite careful with possessions — they turned over the ball just under 13 times a game (12.7) in 2020 which ranked 13th in the country.
- Vanderbilt was well disciplined last year, only committing 11 violations that resulted in yellow cards in nine games.
- The two highest point-scorers return for the 2020 season: Bri Gross (35 - 25 G, 10 A) and Gabby Forna (29 - 12 G, 17 A). Both were named First Team All-AAC.
- When the Dores were a woman up, Vanderbilt outscored opponents by a 10-6 margin.
- When opponents were a woman up, the Dores only allowed a goal in six percent of opportunities in 2020.
- For only the second time in three seasons, the Dores scored 10+ in eight consecutive games. In 2020, Vanderbilt averaged 13.2 goals per game.
- Three returners — Bri Gross, Mikela McCauley and Cassidy Orban— claimed at least 16 draw controls in 2020.
- Two defenders — Halle Regan and Melissa Hawkins — caused 15 and 14 turnovers, respectfully, last season. Both were named preseason All-AAC.
- The Dores' 2-1 road record marked the seventh straight season with at least two wins in the first three road tilts.

COMMENDABLE COMMODORES

- Three were honored as players of the week by the AAC in 2020. Gabby Forna and Sophie Furlong were recognized for their skills at attack, while Mikela McCauley was tabbed as a freshman of the week.
- Gabby Forna, Bri Gross, Melissa Hawkins and Halle Regan were selected as members of the preseason All-AAC team. Forna was a unanimous pick.

STUDENTS, THEN ATHLETES

- Vanderbilt achieved a perfect score (1,000) in the latest NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR). The Dores were tied for first in both the NCAA and the AAC.
- Nine Dores — Paige Finneran, Paige Gunning, Shaye Henderson, Lila Huddles, Mikela McCauley, Kate Murphy and Kayla Rieu — were named to the SEC's First-Year Academic Honor Roll.
- 22 (15 current) student-athletes were named to the SEC's Spring (2020) Academic Honor Roll. Lacrosse was tied with track and field for the best program at Vanderbilt in terms of student-athletes.

FANTASTIC FORNIA

- Senior attacker, Gabby Forna, needs 12 more assists to claim the top spot in program history (Sarah Downing, 88).
- She was a unanimous selection to the AAC's All-Conference team.
- A native of Mount Laurel, New Jersey, Forna also holds the single-season school record with 36 assists in 2019.
- With eight more assists, Forna will pass current assistant coach Jill Doherty (2014-17), who finished her career in black and gold with 84.

WHERE I COME FROM

- This year's squad spans all four time zones in the contiguous United States.
- Of the 35 Commodores on the team, New Jersey is the most represented state on the roster, 13 call the Garden State home.
- Other states represented are: Maryland (7), California (2), Connecticut (2), Massachusetts (2), New York (2), Tennessee (2), Texas (2), Florida (1), Oregon (1) and Utah (1).

WELCOME ABOARD

- Vanderbilt brought on nine freshmen to West End for the 2021 season: Maggie Arnold, Cailin Bracken, Lexie de Roziere, Haley Gochbauer, Megan Graziano, Ellie Hilsabeck, Lindsey Maxwell, Remy Ricciardi and Ella Smith.
