Mississippi State will spend its ninth straight week ranked among the top five by at least one of the major polls, sitting as high as No. 2 per Baseball America.

- Mississippi State has posted a winning weekend in eighth of nine weekends during the 2021 season, including four of five in SEC play.
- The Diamond Dawgs have won 11 of 12 games in the month of April, including a 5-1 record against ranked opponents and an 8-1 mark in SEC play. That stretch includes seven straight SEC games, which is the longest SEC winning streak by any conference team this season.
- State has now won 13 of its last 16 SEC series dating back to the final regular season weekend of 2018.
- The Bulldog pitching staff has fanned at least 10 batters in a schoolrecord 16 straight games entering the week. State leads the NCAA with 464 strikeouts and is No. 2 nationally in K/BB ratio (3.46).

- After the first two-save weekend of his career, second-year freshman Landon Sims was tabbed SEC Newcomer of the Week. It is his second weekly award from the conference office, after garnering SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week during the opening weekend.
- Junior Rowdey Jordan enters the weekend on a 21-game reached base streak. He is hitting .378 over that stretch with 25 runs scored and 13 RBIs. He has eight walks and 11 hit-by-pitch for a .500 onbase percentage in the 21 games.
- The trio of Jordan, **Tanner Allen** and **Kamren James** are all hitting over .300 in SEC play. Jordan leads the team with a .351 average, followed by Allen at .333 and James at .310.
- On the season, MSU's pitching staff has allowed 35 home runs, but just 10 of them have accounted for multiple runs. State has allowed 25 solo home runs and another eight have been two-run home runs.

- Vanderbilt enters with a 29-6 overall record and an SEC Eastleading 11-4 conference record.
- As an offense, Vanderbilt leads the SEC in batting average (.306) and slugging percentage (.522). The pitching staff is tops in the nation in hits allowed per nine inning (5.61).
- The offense is paced by Dominic Keegan and Carter Young, who are tied for the team lead with 33 RBIs and 43 hits apiece. Keegan paces the squad with a .398 batting average and Young leads with 13 doubles and nine home runs.
- Saturday starter Jack Leiter is 7-0 on the season in nine starts with a 0.98 ERA. In 55 1/3 innings of work, Leiter has 99 strikeouts and 22 walks. He is limiting opposing hitters to a .094 batting average.

CHRIS **LEMONIS**

HEAD COACH (THRID SEASON) **MYRTLE BEACH, S.C.**

ALMA MATER: THE CITADEL, 1992



After arguably the most successful first year by a Southeastern Conference head baseball coach in conference history, Chris Lemonis begins his third season as the leader of the Mississippi State baseball program.

The 18th head coach in the storied history of the program, a journey of nearly 40 years came full circle when he was introduced on June 25, 2018 on Adkerson Plaza inside Dudy Noble Field. The son of a 1973 State graduate, Lemonis resided in Starkville as a child and now leads one of the perennial powerhouses in college baseball.

In his first season at the helm of the Diamond Dawgs, Lemonis became the winningest first-year head coach in SEC history and in the process led the 2019 edition to the second-most victories in program history at 52 (54; 1989). The 40 victories over MSU's first 50 games marked the third-most in the first 50 games of a season in program history and set the tone for State's second straight trip to the College World Series.

Lemonis became one of just three SEC head coaches to advance to the College World Series in their inaugural season in the conference, joining Jake Gibbs (Ole Miss, 1972) and fellow Diamond Dawg skipper Pat McMahon (Mississippi State, 1998).

Over his first two seasons, five Diamond Dawgs earned All-America honors and a trio of pitchers have garnered national specialty awards. Left-handed pitcher Ethan Small was tabbed the 2019 National Pitcher of the Year (College Baseball Foundation; American Baseball Coaches Association), while right-handed pitcher JT Ginn (2019) and left-handed pitcher Christian MacLeod (2020) earned back-to-back National Freshman of the Year honors. Ginn and Small each earned specialty awards from the SEC, as well, grabbing the conference's Freshman and Pitcher of the Year, respectively, in 2019.

After a school-record-tying 11 Diamond Dawgs heard their names called in the 2019 Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft, State tied for the most players drafted in the first two rounds of the 2020 MLR event. Small became the 15th Diamond Dawg taken in the first round of the MLB Draft in 2019, while Justin Foscue and Jordan Westburg each went in the first round of the 2020 event.

Owning a head coaching record of 205-110-2, Lemonis was also a nart of nearly 800 wins as an assistant coach and three trips to the College World Series. During his time at Indiana, Lemonis' teams averaged 35.3 wins per season, including a 40-win campaign during his final season in $\dot{\rm Bloomington}.$ He averaged 39.2 victories per year during his career in an assistant role (784 wins), bolstered by a 44.9 wins-per-season average at Louisville. The Cardinals were college baseball's winningest program during that eight-year span and made the program's first three trips to Omaha.

Lemonis not only understands what it takes to get to Omaha as a coach but also as a student-athlete. A 1992 graduate of The Citadel, Lemonis added a 1990 appearance in the College World Series as a student-athlete. The appearance makes The Citadel one of just three schools in Southern Conference history (Duke, Wake Forest) and only current member of the conference to advance to Omaha.

One of the top recruiters and player development coaches in the country, Lemonis has seen success at every coaching stop. After helping his alma mater, The Citadel, to five NCAA Regional appearances in 12 seasons as an assistant coach, Lemonis joined college teammate Dan McDonald's staff at Louisville and quickly turned the Cardinals into a consistent Omaha contender.

After helping Louisville to seven postseason berths in eight years, the 2013 American Baseball Coaches Association/Baseball America Assistant Coach of the Year headed to Indiana to take his first head coaching job with the Hoosier program in 2015.

In each of his head coaching stops, Lemonis has led his team to the NCAA postseason in his first season at the helm. He helped the Hoosiers into the NCAA Tournament field during his initial season in Bloomington. before he guided Mississippi State to the College World Series in 2019 his first season in Starkville

Overall, Lemonis enters his 27th season as a collegiate coach in 2021, making one College World Series appearance as a head coach, taking three trips to Omaha as an assistant, earning 16 NCAA tournament berths and aiding in four 50-win seasons. His pupils have earned 30 All-America honors, 15 Freshman All-America laurels and 82 have signed professional baseball contracts, with 17 getting the call up to Major League Baseball.

RECRUITING AND DEVELOPMENT

Widely regarded as one of the elite recruiters and developers of talent in all of college baseball, a total of 95 student-athletes have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft under Lemonis' watch, with 17 of those reaching the highest level of professional baseball.

Since arriving at Louisville for the 2006-07 academic year, Lemonis has been a part of 13 nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including his first three classes at MSIJ. His initial Bulldog recruiting class was tabbed as the No. 12 class. nationally by Baseball America and Perfect Game, while it earned the No. 9 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. In 2019, he and his staff brought in another top-10 ranked class, finishing as high as No. 6 by Baseball America.

Over his first two seasons in Starkville, Lemonis has tutored 14 picks in the MLB First Year Player Draft, including three first rounders and one second rounder. Sixteen of Lemonis' Indiana players were taken in the MLB Draft in his final four years in Bloomington and 14 signed professional contracts. He also recruited and coached nine of the Hoosier's school-record 10 MLB Draft choices in 2019.

From 2007-14, Lemonis saw seven-straight classes ranked among the top-30 nationally, including the No. 12 national class for the 2011 recruiting cycle. In 2017, Baseball America revisited the Cardinals' 2013 class, re-ranking it No. 2 in the nation after the on-field success under Lemonis' watch. In 2018, the publication tabbed an un-ranked 2014 recruiting class — which included 2015 National Freshman of the Year and 2017 Golden Spikes Award winner Brendan McKay – as the No. 1 class in the publication's re-rankings.

Lemonis mentored and or recruited 47 student-athletes that signed professional contracts after being selected in the MLB Draft during his eight years as the top assistant and recruiting coordinator at Louisville, including a school-record 10 selections in the 2010 MLB Draft. He helped produce 10 first or second round draft choices over a seven-year span.

To date, 15 Cardinals who were recruited by and played for Lemonis have gone on to reach the big leagues. Those players include Nick Burdi, Adam Duvall, Chris Dominguez, Cody Ege, Adam Engel, Chad Green, Dean Kiekhefer, Matt Koch, Trystan Magnuson, Justin Marks, Kyle McGrath, Brendan McKay, B.J. Rosenberg, Nick Solak and Tony Zych. Over \$28 million in signing bonuses were accrued by Lemonis' Louisville draftees.

MISSISSIPPI STATE

Inheriting a team that is coming off of a trip to the College World Series doesn't always translate into immediate success, but Lemonis was able to build off of that momentum as he began writing his chapter in Mississippi State history.

The 2020 squad was off to a 12-4 start with two wins each over Oregon State and No. 2 Texas Tech, before the season was shut down due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Though many publications didn't hand out postseason honors, Collegiate Baseball Newspaper tabbed left-handed pitcher Christian MacLeod the Co-National Freshman of the Year.


Along with the second-most single-season victories (52) during the 2019 season, his team also posted the second-best 20-, 30- and 40-game starts (18-2, 25-5, 32-8) in program history. He joined Pat McMahon as the only two Diamond Dawg dugout bosses to lead the program to the College World Series in their initial campaign and his 52 wins were the most by a first-year SEC head coach in the conference's history.

State saw four student-athletes earn first-team All-SEC, tying for the fourth-most selections in a single season in program history behind the five selections in 1949, 1971 and 1977. Ethan Small posted one of the most dominant seasons on the mound in program history, leading the nation in strikeouts and earning National and Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Year honors. Right-handed pitcher JT Ginn was tabbed National Freshman of the Year and Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year.

Along with Small, Tanner Allen, Justin Foscue and Jake Mangum each earned top honors from the SEC, and Foscue, Mangum and Small each grabbed at least one first-team All-America honor. Small became Mississippi State's seventh unanimous first-team All-American, joining Jeff Brantley (1985) and Chris Stratton (2012) as the only pitchers to accomplish the feat.

On the team side of things, State's offense led the nation in doubles to mark the first time in program history the Diamond Dawgs led the NCAA in an offensive or pitching category. The 166 doubles set a school record and rank No. 4 all-time in SEC history.

Dudy Noble Field

Biography

The largest on-campus facility in college baseball, Dudy Noble Field hosted its 55th season of Mississippi State baseball at the current site in 2021. With over 1,600 games played at the venue, the Diamond Dawgs own a .730 winning percentage at the facility, which recently received a \$68-million upgrade.

The field is named in honor of longtime MSU baseball coach, athletics director and ABCA Hall of Famer Clarke Randolph "Dudy" Noble. On April 27, 1998 the facility was renamed Dudy Noble Field, Polk-DeMent Stadium, honoring another ABCA Hall of Famer, former Bulldog skipper Ron Polk, and the late Gordon DeMent, a successful businessman and longtime fan of the Diamond Dawgs from Indianola, Mississispipi.

The Origin

From 1929 until 1964, Mississippi State hosted its baseball games at the original on-campus venue, Hardy Field, which was located several hundred yards to the south of the Bulldogs' home football venue, Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field. The baseball field was closed following the 1964 season to make way for the construction of Dorman Hall and for the next two seasons the Diamond Dawgs played their home games at Redbird Park in Columbus, Mississippi, capturing SEC titles both seasons at their temporary home.

The tin-roofed grandstand and 2,000-seat bleachers from the original Dudy Noble Field were transported to the stadium's present site, which became playable for the 1967 campaign. Since that time, facility enhancements have followed at a steady pace to make the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball" one of the final all-around facilities on the road to Omaha. Among with numerous upgrades, the current site has seen two complete demolitions and reconstructions, the latest occurring during a three-year span (2017-19) and opening prior to the start of the 2019 campaign.

Leading the Attendance Boom

With a laundry list of legendary names on its all-time roster, it comes as no surprise that Mississippi State ranks among the nation's attendance leaders year in and year out. The Dudy Noble Field faithful have sold out the reserved seating allotment every season since 1987.

Along with routinely hosting some of the largest crowds in the SEC, 11 of the last 13 three-day Super Bulldog Weekend series have drawn more than 25,000 fans.

MSU eclipsed the 200,000 mark in paid attendance at Dudy Noble Field for six-straight seasons between 2012-17, marking the first such occurrence in the program's history. In 2013, the Diamond Dawgs' five-millionth fan walked through the turnstiles at Dudy Noble Field. Since home attendance figures were charted starting in 1976, the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball" has seen 6,720,459 fans rush through the gates.

In 20 of the last 21 seasons, Mississippi State has averaged 6,000 fans per game, including a record average of 8,899 during the 2019 campaign. Overall, State has eclipsed the 200,000-fan mark 12 times since 2002, with a school-record 373,784 viewing the 2019 home schedule.

Of the top 25 all-time college baseball on-campus attendances, Dudy Noble Field finds itself on the list 19 times, most notably owning the all-time on-campus attendance record of 15,586 on April 12, 2014. The Bulldogs own 16 of the top 17 marks in NCAA on-campus history and is the only NCAA baseball program to boast on-campus attendances of 14,000 or more. The five largest NCAA Super Regional crowds have all assembled in Starkville, Mississippi, as well.

From April 11-13, 2014, the Bulldog faithful flooded the gates at Dudy Noble Field to the tune or 39,181 fans for a three-game series versus Ole Miss. The nearly 40,000 fans on the weekend set an NCAA on-campus attendance record for a three-game series.

Dudy Noble Field has ushered in crowds of 10,000 or better 64 times, including 2007 NCAA Super Regional-record draws of 13,715 and 12,620 for nationally-televised, late-morning games against Clemson. In 2019, the first season of the "New Dude," the Diamond Dawgs garnered crowds of 10,000-plus a school-record 10 times.

Mississippi State has hosted 25 postseason events at the facility, including three NCAA District III Tournaments (1973-75), five SEC tournaments (1979, 81, 83, 88 & 95), 15 NCAA Regionals (1979, 84-85, 87-89, 90, 92, 97, 2000, 03, 13, 16 & 19) and three NCAA Super Regionals (2007, 16 & 19).

The Left Field Lounge

The aura of Mississippi State baseball at Dudy Noble Field is certainly not confined to the loyal legions in the impressive grandstand, pro-style luxury sky suites or luxurious Left Field Lofts.

In fact, some of the more highly-prized seats at Bulldog baseball games are found beyond the outfield fence in the Left Field Lounge™. Waiting lists greet those seeking to purchase one of the 96 outfield lounges in the iconic two-level outfield tailgate.

Once a colorful assortment of pickup trucks, motor homes, and trailers — most equipped with grills — lined the outfield fence, completing a circle of humanity at Dudy Noble Field. Now, the permanent lounge spaces are connected to the concourse, allowing everyone to stroll through and experience the iconic lounge culture.

What began in the late 1960s as a popular gathering spot for baseball-loving MSU supporters now forms college baseball's largest tailgate party.

The "New Dude"

The second demolition at the current site occurred following the 2017 season and the \$68 million facility opened its gates for the 2019 campaign. Architect Wier Boerner Allin, along with consultants Populous and farned stadium architect/State alum Janet Marie Smith designed the project, while construction manager ICM and general contractor JESCO Construction, Inc. oversaw the construction.

Covering 12 acres of land on the Mississippi State University campus, the 230,000 square foot facility carries on Dudy Noble Field's legacy as the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball." Installation of the second largest scoreboard in college baseball, measuring 43 feet wide by 60 feet high, started the project in 2017. The board, which was the largest in college baseball upon instillation, is larger than boards owned by three Major League Baseball teams. The addition of 96 permanent Left Field Lounge rigs encircling the outfield followed during the fall of 2018.

The concourse and lower-level grandstands were in place for the 2018 season, with the Diamond Suites, upper-deck reserved seating area and three unique club areas — Farm Bureau Triple Crown Club, Charlie and Dana Stephenson Omaha Club and The Rooftop Club — were completed prior to the 2019 campaign. The newest version of Dudy Noble Field also features increased restroom facilities and concession points of sale.

The player spaces also received an upgrade, expanding to cover 18,000 square feet underneath the facility. The fully-equipped Bruce and Julie Martin Locker Room includes an embedded equipment room, houses 40 wooden lockers and features an oversized, dimensional halo-lit '85 Script Mississippi State sign suspended overhead in the middle of the room.

The more spacious locker room includes an attached training room with whirlpool and fully-functional fueling station. The Mitch Moreland Hitting Tunnel, which is equipped with HitTrax, and Turner & Gloria Wingo Team Lounge are easily accessed from the home dugout, with the eye-popping player entrand Hassell H. Franklin Omaha Room greeting players as they enter the facility. The Pat McMahon Pitching Lab is also housed under the stadium, featuring arm care and conditioning equipment, one oversized turfed mound with three pitching rubbers and state of the art video equipment.

Rowdey's Streak Turns 21

- Junior Rowdey Jordan has reached base safely in a career-best 21 straight games entering the weekend series at Vanderbilt.
- The streak began in the final game of the series with Eastern Michigan and includes 15 games with at least one hit. He has reached base multiple times in 15 of those games.
- Jordan is hitting .378 with a .500 on-base percentage (28 hits, 8 walks, 11 HBP) and 25 runs scored. Of his 28 hits, 10 have gone for extra bases.
- Jordan entered the streak hitting just .245 on the season and now sits at .311 for the season.

Auburn Made

- Rowdey Jordan grew up on The Plains, attended games at Plainsman Park and graduated from Auburn High School, so there is a level of comfort when he sees the blue and orange threads.
- Now at Mississippi State, Jordan has played some of his best baseball against his hometown team, with a career .351 batting average in nine games versus Auburn.
- In his first two seasons in Starkville, Jordan used the Auburn series as a springboard to Freshman All-America honors in 2018 and then a second trip to Omaha in 2019.
- In 2020, Jordan made his final trip to his hometown and quided MSU to a series sweep.
- Jordan's numbers against the Tigers are below:
 2018: .375/.625/.375, 3-for-8, 1 R, 1 RBI, 2 2B
 2019: .360/.529/.421, 6-for-17, 4 R, 6 RBIs, 3 2B
 2020: .333/.500/.529, 4-for-12. 6 R, 1 RBI, 2 2B
- In 2018, Jordan hit .392 following the Auburn series and, in 2019, finished on a .345 clip after playing the Tigers.

In the Last Five Games... (MORE ON PAGE 15)

- Mississippi State owns a 4-1 mark over its last five games.
- As a team, State is hitting .302 and the pitching staff is limiting the opposition to just a .263 batting average.
- Of the 52 hits by the offense, State owns 24 extra base hits, including nine home runs.
- Four of MSU's everyday starters own a batting average of .300
 or better, led by Rowdey Jordan's .444 clip. Tanner Allen,
 Scotty Dubrule and Logan Tanner are all above .300, as well
- Tanner and Kamren James pace the club with seven RBIs each, while Dubrule and Jordan have each scored six runs.
- The pitching staff has fanned 58 batters in 45 innings and issued just 22 walks. State has 10-plus strikeouts in each of its last five games to move its current streak to 16 straight games with double-digit strikeouts.
- Seven relief pitchers have tossed at least one inning and not allowed an earned run in that span, led by Landon Sims with two saves and three scoreless innings pitched.

SEC Openers

- This season marks Mississippi State's 88th season as a member of the SEC, with three those not featuring a conference competition in baseball.
- The 1944 and 45 team's did not compete due to World War II, while the COVID-19 pandemic cut the 2020 season short just before the start of conference play.
- In 2021, the Bulldogs opened the SEC slate on the road for the third time in the last five SEC seasons and won two of three games at LSU.
- Since joining the SEC in 1933, Mississippi State has opened conference play on the road in 47 of 85 seasons, including 23 of those SEC openers at LSU.
- From 1998-2003, State won six straight SEC openers its longest streak of SEC opening wins. From 1962-66, MSU won five straight and the Dawgs have three other streak of three straight wins to open SEC play.

Opening Against The Ranks

- Mississippi State opened 2021 against three top 10 opponents for the first time in program history and faced the highestranked season-opening opponent since 2001.
- It was the ninth time since 1990 that MSU played a ranked opponent on opening weekend, with seven season opening games coming against ranked foes during that 31-year span.
- The last time Mississippi State opened the season against a top 10 team was the 2001 season at home against No. 9 Notre Dame.

Big League Talent

- Mississippi State is great at turning out major league talent, with 61 Diamond Dawgs reaching the highest level of the sport, but it is also great at keeping student-athletes on campus.
- The 2021 roster featured three Bulldogs that had been drafted prior to the season,

- The 2020 MLB Draft saw three Diamond Dawgs drafted in the first two rounds, with *Justin Foscue* (No. 14; Texas Rangers) and *Jordan Westburg* (No. 30; Baltimore Orioles) each drafted in the first round. *JT Ginn* was taken in the second round by the New York Mets
- In 2019, Mississippi State saw a program-record 11 studentathletes drafted in the MLB First Year Player Draft, including junior Tanner Allen for the second time in his career.

Shutout Streak

- On Saturday, March 12 the Mississippi State pitching staff closed out a 14-0 shutout of Eastern Michigan to mark its fourth straight shutout.
- State's four shutouts ran from March 7-12 and the overal scoreless innings streak spanned five games.
- The streak ultimately ended at 39 innings to set the school record for consecutive shutout innings. It spanned five games, included 65 strikeouts and featured just 21 base runners - only four of which reached third base.
- Only the 1909 team owned a longer streak, at that team shutout five straight opponents.
- It is the 10th time in program history that an MSU pitching staff put together three-or-more straight shutouts:

Every Day is Bump Day

Sims Shutting 'Em Down

- Bases loaded, no outs is never an ideal situation for a reliever to enter the game, however that is the situation Landon Sims started his season.
- The second-year freshman proceeded to strike out the side against No. 9 Texas and retired all 12 batters he faced in four perfect innings of work.
- Of his 12 outs, 10 were strikeouts, and he hasn't slowed that pace down since.
- In 24 1/3 innings pitched, 47 of his 73 outs have come via strikeout and he has surrendered just one run on 11 hits. His strikeouts per nine innings sits at 17.3.
- He owns a 2-0 record with five saves and has been a part of three shutouts, including State's first no-hitter since 1999.
- Opponents are hitting just .133 against the reliever.

20K Club

- On Wednesday, March 3 in Pearl, Mississippi, the Bulldog pitching staff accomplished something that hadn't been done in 19 years: strike out 20 batters in a game.
- The MSU staff fanned 20 Golden Eagles, with Houston Harding (9), Preston Johnson (6), Cam Tullar (2) and Stone Simmons (5) combining to reach the mark.
- Prior to that, State last racked up 20 strikeouts exactly 19 years prior on March 3, 2002 against Jacksonville State. That day, Joey Collums (15) and Jonathan Papelbon (5) helped MSU reach the 20 K mark.
- The 20 strikeouts rank tied for No. 3 in the NCAA this season and one of just four 20-plus K games in the country in 2021.

Ks for Days

- The Mississippi State pitching staff struck out 43 batters in its second weekend series of 2021 against Tulane to mark the second time in as many weekends it reached the 40 K mark.
- State also fanned 41 batters on the opening weekend at the State Farm College Baseball Classic.
- The 43 strikeouts of Green Wave batters are tied for the most in a three-game series for MSU since at least 2005, which equaled the 43 punchouts against Youngstown State to open the 2019 campaign.
- State then equaled that total against Arkansas during the opening weekend of SEC play. MSU fanned 13 in the series opener, 19 in the middle game and 13 in the finale.

No-No Against the Flashes

- For the ninth time in program history, MSU spun a no-hitter on the mound, as the quartet of Jackson Fristoe (6 IP), Landon Sims (1 IP), Mikey Tepper (1 2/3 IP) and Cam Tullar (1/3 IP) combined for the first no-hitter at Mississippi State since 1999.
- A seventh inning error and walk, along with a ninth inning free pass were the only blemishes on the scorecard.
- The 1999 no-hitter came on March 16 against Alcorn State in a 21-1 victory, as Scott Polk, Justin Estel and Brian Compton combined on the feat.
- Against the Braves, Polk allowed an unearned run over six innings pitched with two walks and nine strikeouts. Estel fired one inning and walked one, while Compton walked one and struck out three in two innings of work.

10 Ks in 16 Straight

- Mississippi State has piled up double-digit strikeouts in programrecord 16 straight games entering the week, including at least 12 strikeouts in 12 of those games.
- The 15-game streak is five more than the previous mark of 10, which occurred twice. Earlier in 2021, State fanned at least 10 batters in 10 straight from February 26 against Tulane to March 12 versus Eastern Michigan.
- The current streak features 144 innings pitched and just 131 hits allowed to go along with 205 strikeouts. State has walked just 68 batters and owns a .237 batting average against.
- Earlier this season, State tossed 90 innings over 10 straight games of 10-plus Ks. MSU recorded 56 percent of the outs via strikeout. Of the 270 total outs, 150 of those came via strikeout for 15.0 strikeouts per nine innings.
- The 10 straight games equaled a streak from the 2001 pitching staff from April 11-22. That staff struck out 119 batters in 92 innings of work, an 11.6 strikeout per nine innings ratio.

 Spencer Price missed 2018 due to injury and didn't collect a save in 2019, before claiming back-to-back saves versus Texas Tech to close out the 2020 campaign.
- There were 1,055 days between saves for Price, who posted his final save of 2017 versus Alabama on April 20 and his next save came on March 10, 2020 against No. 2 Texas Tech.
- He picked up his second save of the season the next night, with another three-out save over the Red Raiders.
- Price ranks tied for No. 16 on the NCAA's active career charts with his 16 saves and needs just four saves to become the fifth Diamond Dawg to reach the 20-save mark.
