NOTING THE RAMS

- Colorado State enters year two - and the first true full season - under head coach **Steve Addazio** who was named the program's 23rd head coach on Dec. 12, 2019. Addazio is in his 11th year as an FBS head coach in 2021 with the Rams after seven seasons at Boston College (2013-19) and two seasons at Temple (2011-12). He is only the second Colorado State head coach (**Earle Bruce**) to have won a bowl game as a head coach with another school.
- Addazio has been a head coach in five bowl games and led his teams to six bowl games. He has coached in more bowl games as a head coach than all other CSU head coaches except Earle Bruce (10 prior to CSU).
- Colorado State returned all but one starter from the 2020 squad and has a roster which includes **33** senior, fifth-year or beyond players.
- Tight end **Trey McBride**, fresh off a 2020 All-American season, elected to return to Colorado State in 2021 and is bringing NFL scouts to campus on a weekly basis. McBride appeared on **Todd McShay's** Big Board as the top tight end and No. 27 overall prospect for the 2022 NFL Draft.
- Senior **Ryan Stonehouse**, a two-time All-American (2018, 2020), is currently the NCAA's all-time career leader in punt average with a **47.1 mark**. The three-time All-Mountain West performer is aiming to finish his career above 46.31.
- SACK MASTERS:** Colorado State enjoyed an offseason of highlights at the professional level as former Ram Shaq Barrett - the NFL's leading sacker in 2019 - won a Super Bowl with Tampa Bay, and Al Baker (1974-77) was unofficially named the NFL's single-season sack record holder based on a review of film by Pro Football Reference for his 23 sacks in his rookie season.
- Speaking of sacks, Colorado State returns every contributor from a defensive front that led the nation in tackles for loss per game last season, including All-Mountain West First Team performer **Scott Patchan** who ranked No. 6 nationally in the category a season ago. The Rams were the most improved defensive line in the nation in 2020.

NOTING THE GAME

- Colorado State hosts Vanderbilt on **Ag Day**, the school's annual celebration of Colorado State's rich agricultural tradition. The celebration began in 1981 to recognize Colorado State's roots as Colorado A&M when the sports teams were the Aggies. **For more information on Ag Day, see pages 13 and 17.**
- Colorado State will also recognize the 20th anniversary of the September 11 terror attacks in the pre-game ceremony.
- This week's opponent, Vanderbilt, is just **the second SEC opponent** to visit Canvas Stadium and third to come to Fort Collins overall (Arkansas, 2018; Mississippi State, 1981). Colorado State won the Arkansas game 34-27.
- Vanderbilt pass game coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Joey Lynch** served as Colorado State's offensive coordinator in 2020 and worked with CSU wide receiver coach **Alex Bailey** at Ball State.
- The Rams are looking to avoid opening **0-2** for the first time since 2018.

Media INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS: To request credentials, submit a request at CSURams.com/FootballCredentials. All requests should be made as early as possible and should be limited to working press only. Requests made on game day will not be approved. Credentials are issued to the individual.

As of August 11, 2021, proof of full vaccination status is required prior to being issued a credential. Individuals who are unvaccinated, cannot provide vaccination proof, or are not fully vaccinated may not receive a credential.

MEDIA/SCOUTS WILL CALL AND PARKING: Due to ease of pick up outside Canvas Stadium, credentials will **NOT** be mailed this season. Credential pick up is available at the northwest corner of Canvas Stadium at a ticket office window and begins three hours prior to kick off.

Parking passes will also be delivered digitally to media and scouts to the phone number listed on the credential application. Parking passes will be sending during game week.

MEDIA/STAFF ELEVATOR: An elevator is available for use throughout the game to allow media to travel between the field level, first floor, and sixth floor press box. However, this elevator is also used by food and beverage staff. The elevator may also be held for coaches of either team in the final minutes of each half, and media members are encouraged to use the stairwell if they are physically able to do so.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCE: After a cooling off period and conversation with the team, head coach Steve Addazio and select players will be available to the media. Post-game video is available by request.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Credentials for photographers will be issued on the basis of circulation, with priority granted to agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis. Credentials will not be issued to freelance photographers unless they are employed by a reputable publication or the Communications office of the participating schools. Credentials are issued to photographers for the purpose of media coverage only, and images of the game may not be used for commercial purposes without the expressed, written permission of Colorado State Athletics.

SIDELINE AREAS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive without proper equipment will not be granted sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area. This includes during pre-game activities.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS: Colorado State's locker room is closed at all times.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rule, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their visit (official or unofficial) to campus, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. Contact includes in-person conversations, phone calls, text messages, e-mails, etc. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE: Each Monday during the season, with the exception of the bye week, head coach Steve Addazio holds his weekly press conference beginning at Noon. Video will be available of the full availability courtesy of Colorado State Athletics.

PRACTICES: During the regular season, practices are open for the final 30 minutes of Tuesday and Wednesday practices. Media members should submit interview requests for student-athletes a day prior to the interview. When attending practice, please contact Kyle Neaves or Mike Brohard prior to entering the facility.

Head Coach STEVE ADDAZIO

0-1 // SECOND YEAR

58-59 Overall/11th Year

Steve Addazio, a two-time BCS National Champion with nine years of head coaching experience at two universities prior to coming to Fort Collins, was named the 23rd head football coach at Colorado State on Dec. 12, 2019, the 127th anniversary of the founding of the football program.

Addazio has tallied 58 wins over his 10-year coaching career which included stints at Temple (2011-12) and Boston College (2013-19) where he became the first coach in BC history to lead the program to six bowls in the first seven seasons as a head coach, and the first bowl-winning head coach at Temple in over 30 years in his first season as head coach.

In his first season with the Rams, Addazio was welcomed with a once-in-a-century worldwide pandemic that brought spring practices to a close halfway through, saw the season get cancelled only to return weeks later, and a four-week preseason camp that resulted in just four games. All totaled, three games were lost due to COVID-19 complications at opposing schools, and the Rams played just one game at home in Addazio's initial season.

But what a game it was. The Rams defeated Wyoming to bring the Bronze Boot back to Fort Collins for the first time since 2015.

His 2019 Eagles led the Atlantic Coast Conference in rushing offense and ranked No. 6 nationally

at 267.8 yards per game while also protecting the quarterback at an ACC-best clip of 0.92 sacks allowed per game – third-best nationally.

Known as hard-nosed teams with powerful rushing attacks, the Eagles had a 1,000-yard rusher in five of seven years under Addazio, highlighted by Heisman Trophy finalist and Doak Walker Award Winner Andre Williams' 2,177 yards in 2013. The Eagles spent four weeks in the 2018 AP Top 25 (hitting a peak of No. 17) and appeared in the College Football Playoff rankings for the first time in 2018, the first time the program had been ranked since 2007.

Addazio's first opportunity as a head coach came at Temple where he spent two seasons, leading the Owls to a 9-4 mark in his inaugural season of 2011. That season, the Owls won their first bowl game in 32 years, capturing the New Mexico Bowl with a 37-15 victory over Wyoming.

An offensive line coach by trade, Addazio is considered one of the top teachers nationally at the position and one of the nation's top recruiters. In 2010, Addazio was honored by ESPN.com as the nation's No. 1 recruiter as he helped put together a pair of recruiting classes in 2009 and 2010 that ranked in the top 5 nationally including the nation's best class in 2010. He spent three years as an offensive coordinator, two at Florida under coach Urban Meyer when the Gators won two BCS national championships. He served

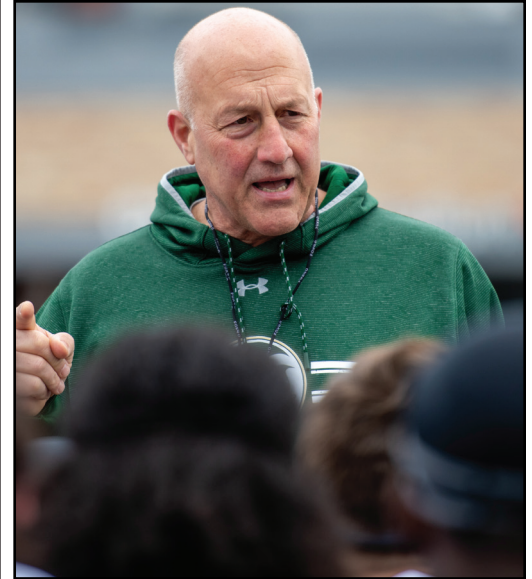
as Indiana's offensive coordinator in 2004.

He began his coaching career at Western Connecticut State as the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator from 1985-87. He then stepped back to coach Cheshire High School from 1988-1994, with that team winning three state championships, 49 consecutive games and sending 20 players to college programs.

He returned to college coaching in 1995, the first of four seasons at Syracuse working with tight ends and the offensive line. In 1999, he spent the first of two seasons at Notre Dame, coaching tackles, tight ends and special teams.

That was followed by three years at Indiana (2002-04), the first two as the offensive line coach. He was with Florida from 2005-10 as the Gators won a pair of national championships, first coaching tackles and tight ends before being promoted to assistant head coach in 2007, still working with the offensive line. In 2009-10, he added the duties as the Gators' offensive coordinator. In 2010, Florida ranked 10th nationally in scoring offense, sixth in total offense.

Addazio and his wife, Kathleen, have three children: Nicole, Jessica and Louie.

Hail to the Colorado Aggies

The Rams revert to their roots this week and once again will don the Aggie orange uniforms, this time with a 1966 throwback Ram logo on their helmets. The celebration of Ag Day goes back more than 40 years as Colorado State honors its heritage when the team went by the name Colorado Aggies from 1890-1945.

Since 2010, CSU has emphasized the orange of the Aggie era with Orange Outs and orange jerseys, one of the original colors of the school when the first football team chose green and orange as the school colors in 1893. The official school colors have been green and gold since 1909, when then college president Charles Lory made the change. The orange in the school's colors, a secondary color with green as the dominant color, was meant to represent pumpkin. Later, the gold was meant to represent the golden corn grown in Colorado by farmers attending the school, it had nothing to do with the mineral mined in the mountains of the great state.

Between 1909 and roughly 1957, that "gold" often appeared as an orange color on uniforms and other college material. These were the days when there were no guidelines to color, the green changed from dark green to light green and back to an exceptionally dark green that was nearly black. Yellow often represented gold as well, but frequently orange was used during the so-called Aggie era.

The Aggie era can be defined as 1899 to 1959. The Aggies represented the agricultural education that CSU was founded upon, farmers were needed to learn about how to grow and engineer food for an ever-expanding nation. Students came from the farms of Colorado and the surrounding states to learn about everything from growing wheat to raising cattle -- something still very necessary in this country today and why we honor this era in our history.

In August 2021, color slides of 1938 Aggies football season surfaced on eBay and have been returned to the school to preserve in the athletic archives. These photos show what the orange of the Aggie era really looked like in the infancy of color photography. These earliest known color photos of CSU football were taken by William Madsen, a senior and editor of the yearbook who aspired to be a journalist. Color photography by the Kodak Corporation became available for still pictures in 1936, just two years before these amazing shots were taken by Madsen.

Madsen captured the close-up look of football from the sidelines and his color images allow us to see for the first time those uniforms and orange helmets brightly shining on a sunny Thanksgiving Day in Albuquerque. Although the Aggies went 1-5-2 in 1938, we can see the legendary Harry Hughes with his trusty assistant coach Hans Wagner sitting on the bench, a young unidentified boy lurking over the team on the light tower. The photo seemingly has a Norman Rockwell feel and might appear as if it came from the cover of The Saturday Evening Post. It shows an era of football none of us have ever known, and by having it in brilliant color, the photos bring the game to life.

The Aggies always used green as their primary color, but in 1940, Hughes ordered the first orange jerseys to go along with new orange pants. The "Orange-clad Aggies" of 1940 brightly lit up the football field and were mocked at a time prior to the modern era when both pants and jerseys were never the same color. It was not until 2010 that CSU football ever wore an orange jersey again.

As we look back on the Aggie era, it is important to remember why we honor our agricultural roots, not just in sports but in American history. A wise old man once said, "Never make fun of a farmer when you have food on the table." We can thank our agricultural community today for keeping that food on our tables through the research and extension services still possible at Colorado State University.

SEASON CAPTAINS NAMED

Under head coach Steve Addazio, Colorado State names captains for the season as voted on by the team at the end of fall camp.

For 2021, five Rams were voted captains by their teammates: **Trey McBride** (Two-Time Captain), **Dequan Jackson** (Two-Time Captain), **Scott Patchan**, **Toby McBride**, and **Todd Centeio**.

The McBride brothers are the only known pair of brothers serving as captains for their teams in the FBS this season.

STONEHOUSE IS RECORD CHASING

All-American punter Ryan Stonehouse currently ranks as the FBS career leader in punt average. Not just the active career leader. The **all-time** leader.

Todd Sauerbrun's (West Virginia, 1991-94) mark of 46.31 on 167 punts for punters with 150-249 punts stands at the current mark, and Stonehouse will be keeping an eye on that average all season after electing to return in 2021.

NO. 9 MEANS SOMETHING EXTRA FOR STEWART

The story of safety Logan Stewart is well-known around Colorado State. A nearby native from Loveland, Colo., Stewart grew up selling popcorn and sodas in the stands at old Hughes Stadium, dreaming of one day becoming a Ram himself.

After grades forced him to Pima Community College, and then the need for better exposure sent him to Iowa Central, Stewart walked on at Colorado State and slept on teammates' couches just to get by. Then, prior to the 2019 season, Stewart was put on scholarship and subsequently started every game that season.

Stewart switched to No. 9 from No. 37 a year ago to pay homage to his family. Stewart is one of Kari and Jeff Stewart's nine children - six of whom are adopted, including Stewart.

MCBRIDE SETTING THE TIGHT END STANDARD

After a 2019 campaign that saw him fully establish himself as one of the nation's best tight ends, All-American Trey McBride showed no sign of slowing down in 2020. After surprising many and electing to return in 2021, McBride is poised to continue his climb up the Colorado State record book and cement himself as one of the program's all-time greats at the position.

RAMS NEARLY 100% VACCINATED

Colorado State is nearly **100% vaccinated** against COVID-19, a point of pride for head coach Steve Addazio and the locker room as a whole. The Rams lost the opportunity to play four of their eight scheduled games in 2020, three due to COVID-19 complications and team leaders have all mentioned those moments as the driving force for unity within the locker room to all get vaccinated.

R.A.M LIFE EXPANDING UNDER ADDAZIO

Under Steve Addazio, Colorado State's player development program was re-imagined - using Ohio State as a model - with the creation of **R.A.M. Life**. R.A.M stands for Real and Meaningful and provides Colorado State student-athletes with a playbook for life after football.

Each player, scholarship and walk-on, receives a tailored suit that is used for team travel as well as for job interviews. Program director **Ricky Santo** assists with resume workshops, organizing weekly speakers, and coordinates job fairs to help Colorado State student-athletes secure internships while they earn their degrees.

CANVAS STADIUM

Canvas Stadium is the new name for Colorado State University's 36,500-capacity multipurpose stadium that opened on the school's Fort Collins campus in 2017. Canvas Credit Union received naming rights to the facility through a \$37.7 million partnership agreement announced in April 2018. The agreement, which stands as one of the largest collegiate athletic venue naming agreements in history, was part of an ambitious re-branding initiative being undertaken by the previously branded Public Service Credit Union, under the direction of company President and CEO Todd Marksberry.

The \$220 million, 727,000-square-foot stadium proved immensely popular and attractive to fans in its inaugural season of 2017, and drew rave reviews from local and national media, as well national television networks that broadcast Colorado State's games to large audiences. The Rams set an all-time attendance record with a total of 192,369 fans and a per-game average of 32,062, representing a 16-percent attendance increase from 2016—eighth-highest in all of college football. Season ticket sales also reached an all-time high of 15,477, a 40-percent increase from the 2016 total of 11,054.

The return of CSU football games to campus from Hughes Stadium in 2017 brought the pageantry and celebration of Rams game days back to the heart of the university for the first time in 50 years, providing countless new engagement opportunities for the entire university. The stadium's design embraces Colorado's natural beauty, topography and visual connections to the Rocky Mountains from campus and ensures functionality for both game-day and non-game day usage.

The agreement with Canvas Credit Union combined with \$20 million given in 2016 to name Sonny Lubick Field brings the total naming rights revenues at Colorado State to \$57 million for the stadium. This compares favorably with the recently announced \$69 million United Airlines Memorial Coliseum at University of Southern California and the \$41 million Alaska Airlines Field at Husky Stadium at the University of Washington. The Colorado State agreement with Canvas Credit Union is for 15 years and includes annual escalator clauses for inflation, as well as a signing bonus, in recognition of the visibility and success of the stadium.

2021 RULE CHANGES

Each offseason, college football's rules and regulations are reviewed. The below are three changes that will be in place for the 2021 season.

Team Area and Coaching Box

After evaluating the adjustment in 2020 for COVID-19 and to allow for social distancing, the Rules Committee has made a permanent extension of the Team Area and Coaching Box. On each side of the field, a team area in back of the limit line and between the 20-yard lines shall be marked for the exclusive use of substitutes, athletics trainers and other persons affiliated with the team. The front of the coaching box shall be marked with a solid line six feet outside the sideline between the 20-yard lines.

Extra Periods

In Football Bowl Subdivision competition during the 2020 season, overtime accounted for an average of 16.8 additional plays per overtime period in those games. There shall be an equal number of possession series unless Team B scores other than on the try. Beginning with the second extra period, teams scoring a touchdown must attempt a two-point try. Although not illegal, a one-point try attempt by Team A will not result in a score. Beginning with the third extra period, a team's possession series will be one play for a two-point try from the three-yard line, unless relocated by penalty.

Feigning Injuries Emphasis

Feigning an injury for any reason is unethical. An injured player must be given full protection under the rules, but feigning an injury is dishonest, unsportsmanlike, and contrary to the spirit of the rules. For questionable game action, an institution or conference has the option to consult the National Coordinator of Football Officials who would then facilitate a video review. After the review, the National Coordinator will communicate any findings with the Director of Athletics at the institution for further action.

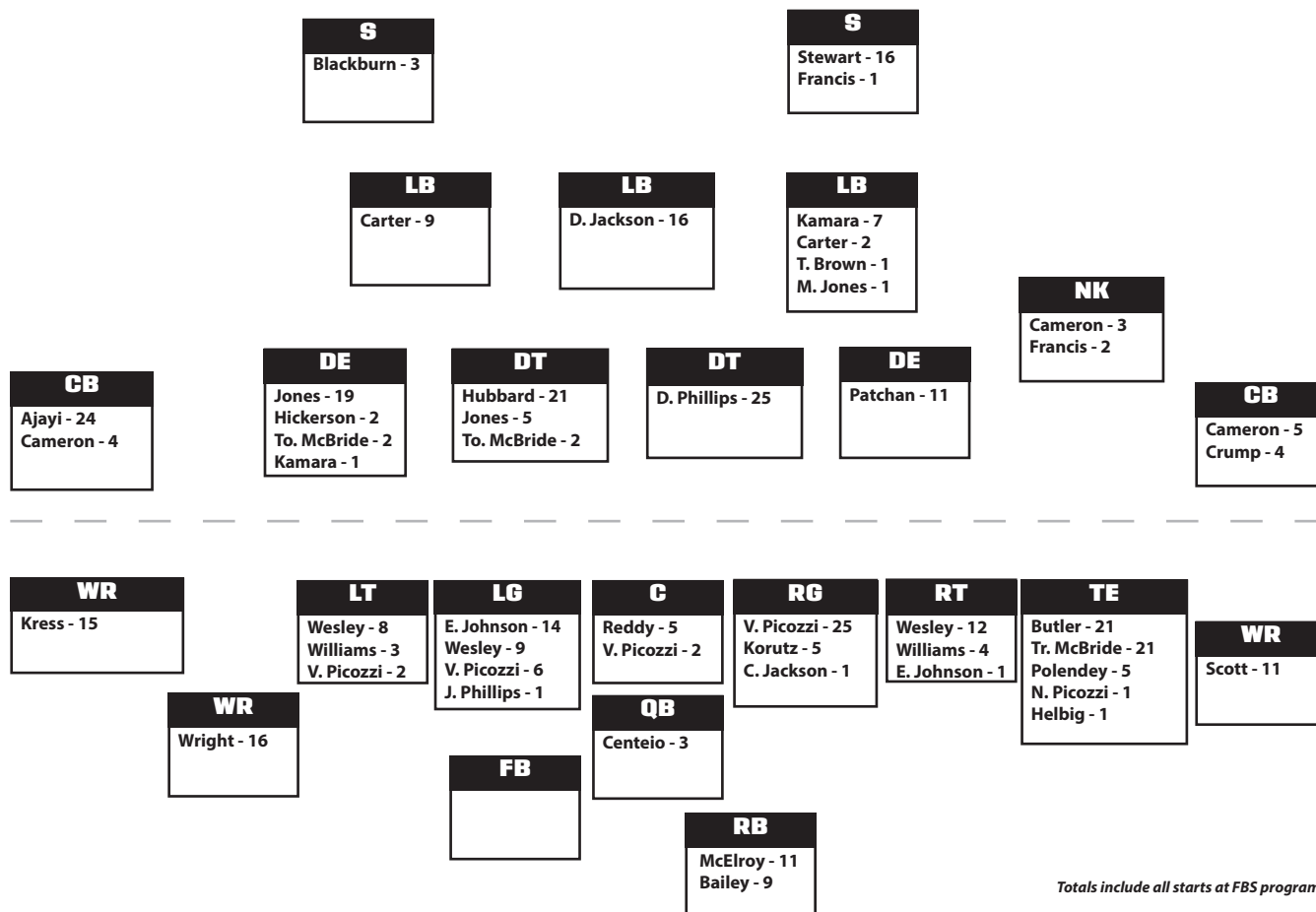

FORT COLLINS, Colo. (AP) — Chris Oladokun passed for 224 yards with two touchdowns and ran for another, Pierre Strong, Jr. rushed for two more scores as South Dakota State thundered past Colorado State 42-23 on Friday night.

Oladokun, who came to SDSU as a graduate transfer (Samford, USF) over the summer was 18-for-28 passing without an interception. Strong piled up 106 yards by halftime, finishing with 138. Sophomore Isaiah Davis rushed for 84 yards and a TD, most in the second half. Jadon Janke caught six passes for 92 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

The Rams failed to convert a risky fourth-and-1 in their own territory on their first possession of the third quarter when David Bailey was stopped for no gain at the 38. The Jackrabbits scored in two plays when Oladokun passed for 21 and 17 yards, the latter to Janke, pushing the lead to 28-10.

After pinning South Dakota State at the 3 with a deep punt, Colorado State regained possession at midfield, but Todd Centeio was sacked and fumbled. Davis capped SDSU's eight play drive with three straight carries including a fourth-down conversion from the 3 and a touchdown from the 2.
