- Vanderbilt is set for its first road trip of the season, as the Commodores will travel to Colorado State this weekend. Kickoff is set for 9 p.m. CT with television coverage live on CBS Sports Network.
- Saturday's game will mark the first-ever meeting between Vanderbilt and Colorado State.
- After a span of 651 days between nonconference games for the Commodores, Vanderbilt begins the season with three consecutive nonconference matchups. Prior to the 2021 season opener, Vandy's last nonconference tilt was played on Nov. 23, 2019, against East Tennessee State. The Commodores played a conference-only schedule in 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic.
- Saturday's matchup marks Vanderbilt's first game in the state of Colorado since Nov. 17, 1979, when Vandy played at Air Force. The Commodores fell, 30-29, in that game
- The Commodores head into Saturday's matchup looking to snap an 11-game losing streak with their last victory coming with the 2019 clash with the East Tennessee State.
- Clark Lea takes over at Vanderbilt after four years at Notre Dame, including the last three as defensive coordinator. He is one of 10 Power 5 head coaches to lead their alma mater in 2021.
- A native of Nashville, Lea began his collegiate career playing baseball at Birmingham-Southern, leading the club to an NAIA championship his freshman year in 2001, before transferring to Belmont to play baseball in 2002.
- Lea finished his student-athlete experience at Vanderbilt, playing fullback. He began as a walk-on before earning a scholarship with the Commodores.
- He earned both his undergraduate (2004) and graduate (2007) degrees from Vanderbilt in political science.
- Lea joins defensive tackles coach Jovan Haye and run game coordinator/running backs coach Norval McKenzie as Vanderbilt alums on the coaching staff.
- Lea has coached in 10 bowl games in his career, including two College Football Playoff appearances, and owns a 5-5 (.500) record in bowl tilts.
- Vanderbilt kicker Joseph Bulovas connected on a 53-yard field goal attempt in last Saturday's matchup with East Tennessee State, marking the longest field goal by a Commodore kicker since Oct. 13, 2018, when Riley Guay converted a 53-yard attempt against Florida. Only four field goals of greater length have been made in school history, with the program record of 55 yards.
- Vanderbilt punter Harrison Smith leads the SEC in punting, averaging 43.5 yards per punt. Smith punted six times for 261 yards against East Tennnessee State, including two punts of 50+ yards and two punts downed inside the 20-yard line.
- Vanderbilt quarterback Ken Seals led all true freshman quarterbacks in passing yardage in 2020 with 1,928. His 12 touchdown passes and 214.2 passing yards/game were third most nationally by a true freshman.
- The Commodores' top six tacklers from the 2020 season all return to the mix, led by junior linebacker Anfernee Orji's 66 stops. The computer engineering major ranked 16th in the SEC in tackles/game with 7.3 in 2020.
- Vanderbilt entered the season as one of three Power 5 schools with its head football coach and athletic director as alums, joining Michigan and Oklahoma State.
- Announced in March, the Vandy United Fund will invest \$300 million into athletics, marking the largest investment in Vanderbilt University history. Populous is serving as the master architect for the football operations center and indoor practice facility. Construction on the operations center will begin at the conclusion of the 2021 season.

LEA ERA BEGINS

- Vanderbilt alum **Clark Lea**, who graduated from the school in 2004 with a bachelor's in political science, and again in 2007 with a master's in political science, is in his first year as head coach of the Commodores.
- Lea has coached in 10 bowl games, including two College Football Playoff appearances since 2018.

NONCONFERENCE ROAD TILTS

- Vanderbilt is set for its first road nonconference matchup against a non-Power 5 opponent since Sept. 24, 2016, when the Commodores faced Western Kentucky on the road. Vandy battled to a 31-30 overtime victory over the Hilltoppers.
- In that game, Vanderbilt used a 5-yard passing score from Kyle Shurmur to Nathan Marcus on the first possession of overtime to take its first lead of the game. After Western Kentucky scored on the following drive, the Commodore defense turned away a 2-point conversion attempt by the Hilltoppers to seal the 31-30 win.
- The trip to Fort Collins marks the lone nonconference road trip for the Commodores this season

VANDERBILT VS. COLORADO STATE

- The Commodores and Rams will be meeting for the very first time in program history, as Vanderbilt travels to Fort Collins this weekend.
- The Rams are one of two opponents that Vanderbilt will match up with for the first time this season. Vanderbilt will also meet Stanford next Saturday for the first time in program history, as well.

VANDY VS. THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- Vanderbilt has a recent history with the Mountain West Conference, as the Commodores have faced an opponent from the league in two of the last three seasons.
- Vandy hosted Nevada during the 2018 season before welcoming UNLV in 2019.
- Vanderbilt owns a 3-4 record against current members of the Mountain West Conference. In program history, the Commodores have faced Air Force (2-3), Nevada (1-0) and UNLV (0-1).
- The Commodores are also set to open the 2022 season against a Mountain West Conference opponent, going on the road to face Hawaii.

NONCONFERENCE WINS

• In the last 25 regular season nonconference regular season contests, since the start of the 2014 season, Vanderbilt is 17-8. When including only non-Power 5 regular season contests, the Commodores are 16-5.

A LENGTHY BREAK FROM NON-LEAGUE GAMES

- After spending the 2020 campaign playing exclusively conference contests, the Commodores begin the 2021 season with three consecutive nonconference games.
- Before last Saturday's season opener against East Tennessee State, Vanderbilt's last nonconference tilt was also against East Tennessee State, on Nov. 23, 2019, marking a span of 651 days between nonconference matchups.
- The Commodores are 11-2 in their last 13 nonconference games against non-Power 5 opponents, falling to East Tennessee State (23-3) last Saturday and UNLV (34-10) on Oct. 12, 2019.

INTERESTING NONCONFERENCE FOES

- Vanderbilt's 2021 nonconference opponents include East Tennessee State, which did not play a fall 2020 schedule, but played eight games in the spring of 2021.
- In October, the Commodores host UConn, which also did not play in the fall of 2020.
- \bullet Vandy's other two non-league opponents combined to play just 10 games in 2020 with Colorado State going 1-3 and Stanford 4-2.

LEA ONE OF VANDY'S THREE ALUMS COACHING

• Lea joins Jovan Haye and Norval McKenzie as Vanderbilt alums on the coaching staff.

• In addition to the trio, **Earl Bennett** serves as Vanderbilt's director of player development and was a three-year letter winner as a wide receiver for the Commodores (2005-07) before going on to a six-year NFL career with the Chicago Bears.

TWO LEADING AT THEIR ALMA MATERS

• With **Lea** and director of athletics **Candice Lee**, Vanderbilt joins Michigan (Ward Manuel, Jim Harbaugh) and Oklahoma State (Mike Holder, Mike Gundy) as the only Power 5 programs to have both their head football coach and athletic director as alumni of the school.

THE NUMBERS GAME

- When **Lea** arrived in January, one of his team building activities was removing each individual's jersey number.
- The program went through spring practice, and the spring game, without jersey numbers.
- Throughout the summer, Commodores made progress to earning their jersey numbers with each member of the team having his by the start of fall camp.

LOTS OF POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE ON STAFF

- Lea and his experienced staff have combined to coach in 50 bowl games, two College Football Playoff contests, six FCS playoff trips, one FCS national championship, one NCAA Division II playoff bid and three NCAA Division III playoff appearances.
- Offensive line coach AJ Blazek claimed the FCS title while with North Dakota State in 2019.
- Two on staff have even coached in Vanderbilt bowl games with **McKenzie** a graduate assistant during the 2008 Music City Bowl and cornerbacks coach **LaMar Morgan** a graduate assistant for the 2012 (Music City) and 2013 (BBVA Compass) games.
- From the NFL side, Lea's group owns two AFC North division titles, three conference championship clashes and nine playoff trips.

FROM THE NFL TO COMMODORES

- Lea brought in **Jesse Minter** to be the team's defensive coordinator and safeties coach, **David Raih** to be Vandy's offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach and **John Egorugwu** to be the Commodores' linebackers coach.
- For the last four years, Minter was with the NFL's Baltimore Ravens, spending the 2020 campaign as the defensive backs coach.
- Raih had spent the last seven seasons in the NFL, two (2019-20) with the Arizona Cardinals as the wide receivers coach and five with the Green Bay Packers (2014-18) in a variety of roles.
- Egorugwu was in the NFL for six years, working for the Buffalo Bills (2017-20) as a defensive quality control coach and assistant linebackers coach and the Ravens for two years (2015-16) as a staff assistant, working primarily with the team's linebackers.
- During Minter's five years with the Ravens, the team captured a pair of AFC North division titles, in 2018 and 2019, and advanced to the playoffs in each of his final three seasons. Raih was part of three consecutive postseason trips with the Packers (2014-16) while Egorugwu experienced a trio of playoff appearances with the Bills (2017, 2019-20).

YOUTHFUL ASSISTANTS

• Vanderbilt's average assistant coach age is 38.6 with six assistants in their 30s. It is the second-youngest assistant coach age among Power 5 programs.

FIRST CAREER STARTS

- Three Commodores earned their first career starts in Saturday's season opener against East Tennessee State.
- The duo of sophomore **Will Sheppard** (WR) and senior **Michael Warden** (OL) earned their first-ever starts, while transfer **Re'Mahn Davis** earned his first start at Vanderbilt.

SECOND-YEAR SUCCESS FOR SHEPPARD

- After playing sparingly during his rookie season, sophomore wideout **Will Sheppard** is set to have an elevated impact for the Vanderbilt offense in his second year.
- Sheppard turned in an impressive performance against East Tennessee State last Saturday, hauling in a team-high nine catches for a career-high 84 yards.
- With the performance, Sheppard has already surpassed his season totals from his freshman campaign.

BODDIE PRDUCES IN DEBUT

- Junior wide receiver Devin Boddie Jr. made his Vanderbilt debut in Saturday's season opener with East Tennessee State.
- Boddie was targeted three times, registering catches in all three of his targets, while finishing with 33 receiving yards on the night.
- The Memphis, Tennessee, native also assisted in kickoff return duties, returning one kick for 10 yards.

EVERY PASSING YARD RETURNS

- **Seals** and sophomore **Mike Wright** were the only two Commodores who threw a pass last season. Both returned to the squad in 2021.
- Wright finished his rookie campaign completing 6-of-10 passes for 51 yards and a touchdown while rushing 14 times for 15 yards and a score.

DAVIS ADDED TO THE RUNNING BACK MIX

- Joining the running back room in 2021 is rising junior **Re'Mahn Davis**, who played 16 games at Temple during the 2019 and 2020 seasons.
- Davis finished his Temple career with 271 carries for 1,259 yards (4.6 yards/carry) and nine touchdowns to go along with 27 receptions for 243 yards (9.0 yards/catch) and two scores. He earned Pro Football Focus Freshman All-America first team accolades in 2019.

NEARLY EVERY PASS CATCHER RETURNS

- Vanderbilt entered 2021 returning 77.1 percent of its receptions from the 2020 season.
- Senior wide receiver Amir Abdur-Rahman was Vanderbilt's long-ball threat last season, leading the squad with 15.0 yards/catch.
- Four of five Commodores who hauled in more than 10 passes in 2020 are back in 2021.

RAISING THE BARR

- After ending the 2020 season on a high note, sophomore linebacker **Ethan Barr** continued his impressive play in last Saturday's season opener with East Tennessee State. The second-year linebacker turned in a career-high 11 tackles against the Buccaneers to lead the team.
- Barr saved some of his best work for the end of his rookie season. He booked 10 tackles at Missouri, including a personal-best seven during the first half alone, before following up with seven stops in the season finale versus Tennessee.
- The Flower Mound, Texas, native finished third among SEC freshmen in tackles/game (4.1) and totaled 37 total stops during the 2020 campaign.
- Barr is averaging 9.3 tackles per game across his last three contests.

ORJI EXPECTED TO LEAD

- Vanderbilt's leading tackler from 2020 is back in junior linebacker Anfernee Orji.
- After shifting down from safety in 2019, when he had six total tackles, Orji ranked 16th in the SEC in tackles/game with 7.3 in 2020.
- Orji, a communication of science and technology major, booked a career-high 13 tackles in the season finale against Tennessee, marking the most for a Commodore during the season.
- Among underclassmen in the league last fall, Orji stood seventh in tackles/game with 7.3.

ODEYINGBO TO THE COLTS

- Vanderbilt defensive end **Dayo Odeyingbo** was selected 54th overall by the Indianapolis Colts in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- With that selection, the Commodores have had at least one pick in each of the past six NFL Drafts, one year shy of the program record, set from 1955-61.
- Vandy has also had at least one selection in the third round or higher in each of the last five drafts, the longest stretch in program history.

NEARLY A WHOLE NEW DEFENSIVE LINE

- Vandy will feature a defensive line that's almost brand new after the departures of **Odeyingbo** and **Cameron Tidd**.
- Odeyingbo finished his career playing in 44 games with 29 starts and ranked fifth in Vanderbilt history in tackles for loss with 31.0.
- Tidd also played in 44 career games and booked 80 tackles with 6.0 TFL.
- In their places step juniors **Daevion Davis**, **Nate Clifton** and senior **Malik Langham**.

NEEDING TO FIND NEW BACKFIELD RUSHERS

- The Commodores tallied 14.0 sacks in 2020 with just 4.5 (32.1 percent) returning to the squad.
- One possibility to help reach the backfield is true freshman lineman **Marcus Bradley**. A Quince Orchard High School product, Bradley was Vanderbilt's highest ranked signee in December. He was a consensus four-star prospect as well as the No. 170 prospect nationally by ESPN.com and No. 188 by 247Sports.com.

MAHONEY SETTLES INTO STARTING ROLE

- Junior cornerback **Jaylen Mahoney** ranked second on the team in tackles with 57, a year after totaling 23 in 12 games.
- The human and organizational development major tallied a career-high 10 tackles against both South Carolina and Mississippi State and finished the campaign on a strong note, booking at least eight stops in five of the final seven tilts.

MARRIED AND BACK FOR MORE

- Head coach Clark Lea handed out his first scholarships in March, presenting them to defensive back Camden Coleman and linebacker Michael Spencer, in addition to punter Harrison Smith.
- Coleman entered played his first collegiate game in 2019 against LSU. Instead of growing up in football, Coleman's family is musically-oriented and his parents are both music professors.
- Coleman's mother, Cynthia, is a Grammy-nominated opera singer. His father, Barrington, is a three-time college graduate with a doctorate in music arts from Julliard School of Music.

BULOVAS SHINES IN DEBUT

- Fifth-year kicker **Joseph Bulovas** shined in his Vanderbilt debut against East Tennessee State.
- The graduate transfer from Alabama connected on a 53-yard field goal in the first quarter, his lone attempt of the game.
- The 53-yard field goal marked the longest made field goal since Oct. 13, 2018, when Riley Guay connected on a 53-yard attempt against Florida.

SMITH LEADS SEC IN PUNTING

- Following the season opener with East Tennessee State, senior **Harrison Smith**, a fourth team preseason all-SEC selection by Athlon, currently leads the conference in punting average with a mark of 43.5 yards per punt.

VANDY UNITED FUND

- In March, Vanderbilt publicly launched the Vandy United Fund, an ambitious fundraising vehicle that will invest \$300 million in Vanderbilt's student-athletes and athletics programs through major facilities and operational enhancements.
- For Commodore football, the Vandy United Fund will aid in the construction of a football operations center, which will house team-specific needs, such as meeting rooms, offices, training room, expanded locker room and more. The fund will also allow for the construction of an indoor football practice facility, including a full-length practice field, which will be adjacent to outdoor practice fields.
- \bullet Construction on the football operations center is expected to begin after the conclusion of the 2021 football season.



Dores Fall in Opener

 $NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Visiting \ East Tennessee \ State scored \ 23 \ unanswered \ points \ and \ ruined \ the Vanderbilt head coaching \ debut \ of \ Clark \ Lea \ with \ a \ 23-3 \ win \ at \ Vanderbilt \ Stadium.$

The Commodores (0-1) took a 3-0 lead early but couldn't dent the scoreboard after that. East Tennessee State had a 10-3 lead at the break before adding on 13 more points in the second half

Lea's team will hope to put together a stronger performance in that contest than what transpired at Vanderbilt Stadium on opening night. The Dores had 318 yards of total offense – just 82 on the ground – and were penalized eight times.

Defensively, the Dores surrendered 5.3 yards per play and registered only four tackles for loss.

Vandy had 11 offensive drives – six ended in punts, one ended with a turnover on downs, another with a field goal and three resulted in turnovers.

Vanderbilt opened the scoring with 4:15 left in the first quarter thanks to a Joseph Bulovas field goal from 53 yards out. That would be the only lead they enjoyed.

East Tennessee State retook the advantage midway through the second quarter. An 80-yard drive ended on the ninth play, a third-down pass from Tyler Riddell to Malik Murray from the 5 that gave the Buccaneers a 7-3 lead.

Tyler Keltner added to the East Tennessee State lead with a 41-yard field goal at the 2:24 mark making it 10-3.

That's the way the score looked at the half. The Commodores mustered just 130 yards of offense, had five penalties and were 2 of 9 on third down.

Keltner booted a 25-yard field goal with 8:42 remaining in the third quarter upping the East Tennessee State lead to 13-3. That completed a 10-play drive that ate 6:18 off the clock and covered 68 yards.

The Buccaneers (1-0) would take that 10-point lead into the fourth quarter.

East Tennessee State linebacker Stephen Scott ended all doubt by picking up a Ken Seals fumble and returning it 22 yards for a touchdown with 8:26 to play. That made it 20-3.

Vandy looked like it may finally punch one into the end zone late in the fourth, but Seals was picked off at the 1 yard line. Keltner added a 34-yard field goal moments later to provide the final margin.

Vanderbilt running back Re'Mahn Davis ran for 54 yards on 14 carries. Seals finished the night 20-for-34 for 195 yards.
