- Vanderbilt is set to return home this weekend, as the Commodores welcome Stanford to Vanderbilt Stadium on Saturday evening. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. CT with television coverage live on ESPNU.
- Saturday's game will mark the first-ever meeting between Vanderbilt and Stanford.
- The matchup will mark Vanderbilt's first game against a Pac-12 opponent since Oct. 14, 1961, when Vandy played at UCLA. The Commodores fell, 28-21, at Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum.
- After a span of 651 days between nonconference games for the Commodores, Vanderbilt begins the season with three consecutive nonconference matchups. Prior to the 2021 season opener, Vandy's last nonconference tilt was played on Nov. 23, 2019, against East Tennessee State. The Commodores played a conference-only schedule in 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic.
- The Commodores snapped an 11-game losing streak on Sept. 11 with a 24-21 win over Colorado State. The victory marked the first career win for head coach Clark Lea.
- Vanderbilt kicker Joseph Bulovas earned SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors from the conference office. He became the first Commodore to earn the recognition since Sarah Fuller on Nov. 30, 2020.
- Bulovas is a perfect 2-for-2 in field goal attempts this season. He connected on the game-winning field goal at Colorado State. The 38-yard field goal gave the Commodores their first victory of the season
- Vanderbilt punter Harrison Smith ranks fifth in the SEC in punting, averaging 45.1 yards per punt. Smith punted nine times for 411 yards at Colorado State, including four punts of 50+ yards and three punts downed inside the 20-yard line.
- Vanderbilt wide receiver Chris Pierce Jr. found the end zone for his first receiving touchdown on the season against Colorado State. With the score, Pierce has caught a touchdown in five of his last eight games, dating to 2020.
- Vanderbilt linebacker Ethan Barr leads the team with 22 tackles across the first two games of the season. Barr has registered 11 stops apiece in each contest, and is averaging 9.8 tackles per game across his last four games, dating to last season.
- Lea takes over at Vanderbilt after four years at Notre Dame, including the last three as defensive coordinator. He is one of 10 Power 5 head coaches to lead their alma mater in 2021.
- A native of Nashville, Lea began his collegiate career playing baseball at Birmingham-Southern, leading the club to an NAIA championship his freshman year in 2001, before transferring to Belmont to play baseball in 2002.
- Lea finished his student-athlete experience at Vanderbilt, playing fullback. He began as a walk-on before earning a scholarship with the Commodores. He earned both his undergraduate (2004) and graduate (2007) degrees from Vanderbilt in political science.
- · Lea joins defensive tackles coach Jovan Haye and run game coordinator/running backs coach Norval McKenzie as Vanderbilt alums on the coaching staff.
- Vanderbilt entered the season as one of three Power 5 schools with its head football coach and athletic director as alums, joining Michigan and Oklahoma State.
- Announced in March, the Vandy United Fund will invest \$300 million into athletics, marking the largest investment in Vanderbilt University history. Populous is serving as the master architect for the football operations center and indoor practice facility. Construction on the operations center will begin at the conclusion of the 2021 season.

#### LEA ERA BEGINS

- Vanderbilt alum **Clark Lea**, who graduated from the school in 2004 with a bachelor's in political science, and again in 2007 with a master's in political science, is in his first year as head coach of the Commodores.
- Lea has coached in 10 bowl games, including two College Football Playoff appearances since 2018.

#### HOME SWEET HOME

- Vanderbilt is set for its first home nonconference matchup against a Power 5 opponent since Sept. 16, 2017, when the Commodores welcomed a ranked Kansas State team to Vanderbilt Stadium.
- In that game, Vanderbilt quarterback Kyle Shurmur scored on a 2-yard run with 8:23 left, as the Commodores upset No. 18 Kansas State 14-7 on Saturday night for the program's first victory over a ranked, nonconference opponent since 1946.
- Vanderbilt is 17-5 in its last 22 home, nonconference matchups, dating to the start of the 2013 season.
- The Commodores are 2-0 in their last two home, nonconference matchups against Power 5 opponents, defeating Wake Forest, 23-21, in 2013, in addition to the victory over Kansas State.

### VANDERBILT VS. STANFORD

- The Commodores and Cardinal will be meeting for the very first time in program history, as Vanderbilt returns home this weekend.
- Stanford is one of two opponents that Vanderbilt will match up with for the first time this season. Vanderbilt also faced Colorado State for the first time in program history.

#### VANDY VS. THE PAC-12

- Saturday marks just the second time in program history that Vanderbilt will face a Pac-12 opponent.
- The last time the Commodores faced a member of the Pac-12 was Oct. 14, 1961, as Vandy squared off with UCLA in Los Angeles. The Dores fell to the Bruins, 28-21, in that matchup.

#### COMMODORE COMEBACK

- After falling behind to an early 14-0 deficit, Vanderbilt scored 21 unanswered points en route to claiming a 24-21 win at Colorado State on Sept. 11.
- Before the win over the Rams, Vanderbilt's last time overcoming a 14-point deficit in a win was Nov. 26, 2016, against Tennessee. The Commodores battled back from a 21-7 deficit to claim a 45-34 victory over the Volunteers.

#### **BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN**

- The Commodores snapped an 11-game losing streak with a 24-21 win over Colorado State. Before the win over the Rams, Vandy's last win came against East Tennessee State on Nov. 23, 2019, marking a span of 659 days between victories.
- Vanderbilt also snapped a 10-game road losing streak with the win against Colorado State, as the Commodore's last win on the road came at Arkansas on Oct. 27, 2018, a span of 1,051 days.
- The victory marked the first career win for first-year head coach Clark Lea.

- In October, the Commodores host UConn, which also did not play in the fall of 2020.
- $\bullet$  Vandy's other two non-league opponents combined to play just 10 games in 2020 with Colorado State going 1-3 and Stanford 4-2.

#### **TOUCHDOWN TARGET**

- Vanderbilt wide receiver **Chris Pierce Jr.** registered his first score of the season with a 20-yard touchdown grab in the second quarter at Colorado State.
- With the score, Pierce has caught a touchdown in five of his last eight games, dating to the 2020 season.
- The Smithfield, Virginia, native led the Commodores in receiving touchdowns a season ago, with five.

#### SECOND-YEAR SUCCESS FOR SHEPPARD

- After playing sparingly during his rookie season, sophomore wideout **Will Sheppard** is set to have an elevated impact for the Vanderbilt offense in his second year.
- Sheppard turned in an impressive performance in the season opener against East Tennessee State, hauling in a team-high nine catches for a career-high 84 yards.
- The Mandeville, Louisiana, native recorded four receptions for 42 yards in last Saturday's matchup at Colorado State.
- On the season, Sheppard is tied for the team lead in receptions with 13, while ranking second in receiving yards with 126.

#### **BODDIE PRDUCES IN DEBUT**

- Junior wide receiver Devin Boddie Jr. made his Vanderbilt debut in the Commodores' season opener with East Tennessee State.
- Boddie was targeted three times, registering catches in all three of his targets, while finishing with 33 receiving yards on the night.
- The Memphis, Tennessee, native also assisted in kickoff return duties, returning one kick for 10 yards.
- The junior wideout followed up the season opener with a career-high six-catch performance at Colorado State.
- On the season, Boddie has tallied nine catches for 71 yards. His nine receptions place him third on the team.

#### FIRST CAREER STARTS

- Five Commodores have made their first career starts across the first two games of 2021.
- Three Commodores made their first career starts in the season opener, as the duo of sophomore Will Sheppard (WR) and senior Michael Warden (OL) earned their first-ever starts against East Tennessee State, while transfer Re'Mahn Davis earned his first start at Vanderbilt.
- At Colorado State, the tight end duo of senior **Gavin Schoenwald** and junior **Brayden Bapst** made their first career starts.

#### **EVERY PASSING YARD RETURNS**

- Seals and sophomore Mike Wright were the only two Commodores who threw a pass last season. Both returned to the squad in 2021.
- Wright finished his rookie campaign completing 6-of-10 passes for 51 yards and a touchdown while rushing 14 times for 15 yards and a score.

### DAVIS ADDED TO THE RUNNING BACK MIX

- Joining the running back room in 2021 is rising junior **Re'Mahn Davis**, who played 16 games at Temple during the 2019 and 2020 seasons.
- Davis rushed for a season-high 77 yards on 17 carries at Colorado State.
- The San Francisco, California, native finished his Temple career with 271 carries for 1,259 yards (4.6 yards/carry) and nine touchdowns to go along with 27 receptions for 243 yards (9.0

yards/catch) and two scores. He earned Pro Football Focus Freshman All-America first team accolades in 2019.

#### NEARLY EVERY PASS CATCHER RETURNS

- Vanderbilt entered 2021 returning 77.1 percent of its receptions from the 2020 season.
- Senior wide receiver Amir Abdur-Rahman was Vanderbilt's long-ball threat last season, leading the squad with 15.0 yards/catch.
- Four of five Commodores who hauled in more than 10 passes in 2020 are back in 2021.

#### JOHNSON EXCELS DOWN THE STRETCH

- Senior wide receiver **Cam Johnson** developed into one of the SEC's prime targets during the latter part of the 2020 season. In the last six games of the campaign, Johnson caught 47 passes, an average of 7.8 grabs/game.
- Johnson led all Power 5 receivers in receptions from Oct. 25 Dec. 13, 2020, with 47 and was second nationally over the stretch:

#### RAISING THE BARR

- After ending the 2020 season on a high note, sophomore linebacker Ethan Barr has continued his impressive play throughout the first two games of the season.
- The second-year linebacker has registered 11 tackles apiece in each of the first two games of the season, marking a career-high.
- The Flower Mound, Texas, native leads the team with 22 total tackles on the campaign, while tying for third in the SEC.
- Barr saved some of his best work for the end of his rookie season. He booked 10 tackles at Missouri, including a personal-best seven during the first half alone, before following up with seven stops in the season finale versus Tennessee.
- Barr is averaging 9.8 tackles per game across his last four contests, dating to last season.

#### ORJI EXPECTED TO LEAD

- Vanderbilt's leading tackler from 2020 is back in junior linebacker Anfernee Orji.
- Orji registered a team-high 13 tackles last Saturday at Colorado State, which matches his career high.
- The Rockwall, Texas, native ranks second on the team in total tackles with 21, while tying for fifth in the SEC in tackles/game with 10.5.
- After shifting down from safety in 2019, when he had six total tackles, Orji ranked 16th in the SEC in tackles/game with 7.3 in 2020.
- Orji, a communication of science and technology major, booked a career-high 13 tackles in the season finale against Tennessee, marking the most for a Commodore during the season.
- Among underclassmen in the league last fall, Orji stood seventh in tackles/game with 7.3.

#### LINEBACKERS ANCHORING THE DEFENSE

• The linebacker duo of **Ethan Barr** and **Anfernee Orji** lead the team in total tackles, while both rank among the tops of the SEC in tackles/game.

#### **DEFENDING FROM THE TRENCHES**

- Junior defensive lineman Daevion Davis registered a career-high three pass breakups last Saturday against Colorado State.
- Davis has registered four pass breakups this season, averaging 2.0 per contest. He is tied for first in the SEC in passes defended.

### TALE OF TWO HALVES

- After giving up 14 points to Colorado State in the first half, the Vanderbilt defense settled in to limit the Ram offense the rest of the game.
- The Commodores allowed 245 total yards on Colorado State's first five drives of the game, before holding the Rams to just 75 yards of offense on the next five drives, including two 3-and-outs.
- Vanderbilt held Colorado State to five three-and-outs across its final 10 drives of the game, while the Rams were just 2-of-8 on third downs in the second half.
- The Commodores kept Colorado State off the scoreboard in the third quarter, while holding the Rams to just 44 yards of total offense, including 12 passing yards.

#### ODEVINGRO TO THE COITS

- Vanderbilt defensive end Dayo Odeyingbo was selected 54th overall by the Indianapolis Colts in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- With that selection, the Commodores have had at least one pick in each of the past six NFL Drafts, one year shy of the program record, set from 1955-61.
- Vandy has also had at least one selection in the third round or higher in each of the last five drafts, the longest stretch in program history.

#### NEARLY A WHOLE NEW DEFENSIVE LINE

- Vandy will feature a defensive line that's almost brand new after the departures of **Odeyingbo** and **Cameron Tidd**.
- Odeyingbo finished his career playing in 44 games with 29 starts and ranked fifth in Vanderbilt history in tackles for loss with 31.0.
- Tidd also played in 44 career games and booked 80 tackles with 6.0 TFL.
- In their places step juniors Daevion Davis, Nate Clifton and senior Malik Langham.

#### NEEDING TO FIND NEW BACKFIELD RUSHERS

- The Commodores tallied 14.0 sacks in 2020 with just 4.5 (32.1 percent) returning to the squad in 2021.
- One possibility to help reach the backfield is true freshman lineman **Marcus Bradley**. A Quince Orchard High School product, Bradley was Vanderbilt's highest ranked signee in December. He was a consensus four-star prospect as well as the No. 170 prospect nationally by ESPN.com and No. 188 by 247Sports.com.

#### MAHONEY SETTLES INTO STARTING ROLE

- Junior cornerback **Jaylen Mahoney** picked up his second career interception in the win over Colorado State. His interception set up a Vanderbilt scoring drive, as the Commodores marched down the field to even the score at 14.
- Mahoney ranks third on the team in total tackles with 10 this season, including nine unassisted stops. Last year, the Rock Hill, South Carolina, native finished second on the team in tackles with 57 in 2020, a year after totaling 23 in 12 games as a freshman.

#### HUNTING INTERCEPTIONS

- Vanderbilt picked off its first pass of the season against Colorado State, as junior Jaylen Mahoney secured Vandy's first turnover of the new campaign.
- The Commodores finished with just two interceptions in nine games during the 2020 season.
- Since 1996, the previous low for the Commodores was five interceptions in 2016.

- Coleman entered played his first collegiate game in 2019 against LSU. Instead of growing up in football, Coleman's family is musically-oriented and his parents are both music professors.

#### **BULOVAS EARNS WEEKLY CONFERENCE HONORS**

- Fifth-year kicker **Joseph Bulovas** was named SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 13 for his efforts at Colorado State.
- Bulovas converted the game-winning field goal from 38 yards out to help Vanderbilt pick up its first win under Clark Lea.
- On the season, the Mandeville, Louisiana, native is a perfect 2-for-2 on field goal tries, while also converting each of his three extra-point attempts.
- The graduate transfer from Alabama connected on a 53-yard field goal in the season opener against East Tennessee State, marking the longest made field goal since Oct. 13, 2018, when Riley Guay connected on a 53-yard attempt against Florida.
- Only four field goals of greater length have been made in school history, with the program record of 55 yards.

## SMITH CONTINUES TO SHINE

- Senior **Harrison Smith** posted a standout performance at Colorado State, punting nine times for 411 yards.
- Four of Smith's nine punts traveled over 50 yards, while three landed inside Colorado State's 20-vard line
- The Franklin, Tennessee, native tied his career-long with a punt of 66 yards in the first quarter against the Rams, which also marks the longest punt by an SEC punter this season.
- $\bullet$  Five of Smith's 15 punts this season have landed inside the opponent 20-yard line.

• A fourth team preseason all-SEC selection by Athlon, currently ranks fifth in the conference in punting average with a mark of 45.1 yards per punt.

## **VANDY UNITED FUND**

- In March, Vanderbilt publicly launched the Vandy United Fund, an ambitious fundraising vehicle that will invest \$300 million in Vanderbilt's student-athletes and athletics programs through major facilities and operational enhancements.
- For Commodore football, the Vandy United Fund will aid in the construction of a football operations center, which will house team-specific needs, such as meeting rooms, offices, training room, expanded locker room and more. The fund will also allow for the construction of an indoor football practice facility, including a full-length practice field, which will be adiacent to outdoor practice fields.
- Construction on the football operations center is expected to begin after the conclusion of the 2021 football season.

#### **Dores Fall in Opener**

 $NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Visiting \ East Tennessee \ State scored \ 23 \ unanswered \ points \ and \ ruined \ the Vanderbilt head coaching \ debut \ of \ Clark \ Lea \ with \ a \ 23-3 \ win \ at \ Vanderbilt \ Stadium.$ 

The Commodores (0-1) took a 3-0 lead early but couldn't dent the scoreboard after that. East Tennessee State had a 10-3 lead at the break before adding on 13 more points in the second half

Lea's team will hope to put together a stronger performance in that contest than what transpired at Vanderbilt Stadium on opening night. The Dores had 318 yards of total offense – just 82 on the ground – and were penalized eight times.

Defensively, the Dores surrendered 5.3 yards per play and registered only four tackles for loss.

Vandy had 11 offensive drives – six ended in punts, one ended with a turnover on downs, another with a field goal and three resulted in turnovers.

Vanderbilt opened the scoring with 4:15 left in the first quarter thanks to a Joseph Bulovas field goal from 53 yards out. That would be the only lead they enjoyed.

East Tennessee State retook the advantage midway through the second quarter. An 80-yard drive ended on the ninth play, a third-down pass from Tyler Riddell to Malik Murray from the 5 that gave the Buccaneers a 7-3 lead.

Tyler Keltner added to the East Tennessee State lead with a 41-yard field goal at the 2:24 mark making it 10-3.

That's the way the score looked at the half. The Commodores mustered just 130 yards of offense, had five penalties and were 2 of 9 on third down.

Keltner booted a 25-yard field goal with 8:42 remaining in the third quarter upping the East Tennessee State lead to 13-3. That completed a 10-play drive that ate 6:18 off the clock and covered 68 yards.

The Buccaneers (1-0) would take that 10-point lead into the fourth quarter.

East Tennessee State linebacker Stephen Scott ended all doubt by picking up a Ken Seals fumble and returning it 22 yards for a touchdown with 8:26 to play. That made it 20-3.

Vandy looked like it may finally punch one into the end zone late in the fourth, but Seals was picked off at the 1 yard line. Keltner added a 34-yard field goal moments later to provide the final margin.

Vanderbilt running back Re'Mahn Davis ran for 54 yards on 14 carries. Seals finished the night 20-for-34 for 195 yards.

#### **Dores Fall in Opener**

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - Joseph Bulovas drilled a 38-yard field goal with 19 seconds left and Vanderbilt beat Colorado State 24-21 at Canvas Stadium.

The victory was the first for head coach Clark Lea at his alma mater.

The Commodores (1-1) trailed 14-0 at one point, but scored 21 straight and then recovered from a late Rams touchdown to break an 11-game losing streak dating to 2019. Vandy had also lost 10 straight road games and 13 straight against Football Bowl Subdivision opponents.

Vandy started the final quarter leading 21-14 and held that lead until less than four minutes remained on the clock. But Colorado State quarterback Todd Centeio found tight end Trey McBride on a fourth-down pass from the 3 that tied the score at 21-all with 3:07 to play.

That gave the Dores plenty of time to march down the field and set up Bulovas' heroics.

Vanderbilt quarterback Ken Seals finished the night 26 of 41 for 236 yards and accounted for all three of his team's touchdowns – two passing and one rushing. Re'Mahn Davis ate up 77 yards on the ground and Anfernee Orji made a team-high 13 tackles.

Vandy's end to the night, however, was in stark contrast to its start.

Colorado State wasted no time getting on the scoreboard after the opening kickoff. A five-play, 75-yard drive ended with Todd Centeio rolling right and finding an open David Bailey in the flat for an easy 3-yard touchdown pass making it 7-0.

On the first play of the second quarter, Seals fumbled the ball away on his own 27. Two plays later Bailey split the Vanderbilt defense up the middle for a 20-yard touchdown run making it 14-0.

Vandy got right back in it before halftime thanks to a key special teams play. Allan George came off the left edge on a Colorado State (0-2) and got his hand on the kick making for a short, wobbly punt that rested at the Vandy 42.

The Commodores offense quickly took advantage and drove to the 20 – after a Colorado State personal foul penalty – and scored when Seals found Chris Pierce down the right side of the field.

That allowed Vanderbilt to head into the break down just 14-7 with 30 minutes left to play.

Vandy had only 120 yards of offense, lost a fumble and have five penalties in the first half – yet found itself down a single score at halftime.

The Vanderbilt defense came big in the third quarter when Jaylen Mahoney picked off a Centeio pass at the Vanderbilt 47. That placed momentum firmly in the hands of the Commodores and Seals led the offense on a nine-play drive that ended with a 9-yard touchdown pass to Cam Johnson

With 9:36 to go in the third quarter, Vandy had tied the score at 14-all.

Seals would give the Commodores the lead four minutes later with a 1-yard plunge over left guard making it 21-14 at the 5:32 mark.

That's where the score would remain going into the fourth quarter.
