OLD WAVERLY GOLF CLUB

About Old Waverly

Since its founding in 1988, Old Waverly has been highly regarded as one of the truly unique private clubs in all of the US. Developed on the site of the historic Waverly Mansion, the club is a result of the vision of the George and Marcia Bryan Family, who sought to create a world-class destination for golf and hospitality in the heart of the Mississippi Black Prairie.

U.S. Open winner Jerry Pate and course designer Bob Cupp were enlisted to craft the golf course from the undeveloped nature of 360 acres of pasture. The golf course opened in September 1988 to rave reviews, and has been a fixture among various “Best Of” lists, including recognition as the top residential golf course in Mississippi.

In addition to world-class golf, Old Waverly offers a host of luxurious lodging accommodations on site that provide members and their guests complete access to the club and its amenities. Nine four-bedroom cottages are available at the club for short term lodging. Villas, condos and single-family luxury homes are also available for rent and are located just steps away from the club’s amenities.

The club experience was elevated again in 2016 with the opening of Mossy Oak Golf Club, located just across the street from Old Waverly. Brought to life by Gil Hanse, architect of the 2016 Olympic Golf Course in Rio, Mossy Oak Golf has quickly become one of the most revered golf courses in all of the US and was recognized in 2018 as one of Golfweek’s Top-100 Modern Golf Courses in the US.

Offering two distinct, world-class golf courses, luxurious accommodations and unrivaled Southern Hospitality, Old Waverly is the premier golf destination in the South.

Golf at Old Waverly

Old Waverly Golf Club has been consistently regarded as one of the absolute premier golf courses in all of the United States.

Designed by the award-winning duo of Jerry Pate (US Open Champion) and Bob Cupp, Old Waverly stretches out to over 7,000 yards from the tips and delivers an unrivaled golf experience highlighted by holes that place a premium on accuracy and shotmaking and a bevy of risk/reward shots, all while navigating through some of the most scenic acreage in the Mississippi Black Prairie.

COURSE LAYOUT



HOLE-BY-HOLE PREVIEW

No. 1**Par 4 // 339 yards**

Hole one is fairly open and straight but becomes narrow closer to the green as Lake Azalea comes into play. The putting surface has two bunkers to the right and one on the left.

**Hole 1****Par 4
HDCP 16****Pro's Advice**

A good drive will find the left center of this wide fairway leaving a short iron second shot. The green is well bunkered with Lake Azalea coming into play if the drive or approach shot is blocked out to the right.

No. 2**Par 5 // 513 yards**

Hole two bends to the right, but should provide opportunities for red numbers. The green is shielded by just a couple of bunkers to the front.

**Hole 2****Par 5
HDCP 12****Pro's Advice**

A good aiming point is to the left bunker on the left. A well hit drive could give you the opportunity to go for this green in two. Pay close attention to the fairway bunkers which are in play especially on your second shot. The raised green lies at a 45 degree angle to the approach and is surrounded back and right by steep mounds.

No. 6**Par 4 // 355 yards**

Hole six is a short par four that bends to the right. The green is protected by a stream piercing the fairway. Players cannot land the ball short on this hole.

HDCP 14****Pro's Advice**

A good aiming point is the fairway bunker on the left. The flat landing area between the two fairway bunkers will leave a short approach that drops some 30 feet to a green that slopes from back to front. Make sure your approach clears the water while avoiding the slope behind the green.

No. 3**Par 3 // 160 yards**

Hole three is the simplest par three on the course. With a small bunker on the front righthand side and one to the left, look for players to be aggressive on this hole.

HDCP 18****Pro's Advice**

With this short par 3, wind will factor in determining the correct club to hit from the tee. Pin placement determines the shot pattern needed to get it close on this two tiered, well-bunkered green.

No. 7**Par 3 // 164 yards**

Hole seven is one of the most picturesque on the front nine. The par three is sliced by a stream with minimal bunkers coming into play.

**Hole 7****Par 3
HDCP 6****Pro's Advice**

This beautifully deceptive par 3 calls for careful club selection. The elevation change can be deceiving when trying to decide the correct tee shot. Steer clear of the greenside bunker on the right. A good safe play is to the center of the green.

No. 4**Par 4 // 386 yards**

Hole four is one of the lengthier par fours on the course. The putting surface is sheltered by a bunker to the right.

HDCP 4****Pro's Advice**

An ideal drive will find the fairway beyond the right side of the pot bunker in the center of the fairway. The contoured green, with a ridge running left to right, lies some 15 feet below the landing area elevation.

No. 8**Par 4 // 172 yards**

Hole eight will test players' shot selection and accuracy. Eleven bunkers line the fairway and surround the green. An errant shot can prove costly.

**Hole 8****Par 4
HDCP 2****Pro's Advice**

This long par 4 is lined with fairway bunkers and the tee shot should favor the right side of the fairway in the direction of the pot bunker. This deep but narrow green is bunkered left and right and requires a mid to long iron approach.

No. 5**Par 4 // 408 yards**

Hole five is in the middle of three straight par fours. The green is protected by a couple of bunkers in the front.

HDCP 8****Pro's Advice**

Take aim at the center of the fairway and beware of hazards on both sides of this hole. Your approach is deceptively uphill to a well-bunkered green, which may call for an extra club.

No. 9**Par 5 // 485 yards**

Hole nine is the second-longest hole on the course. With multiple bunkers along the fairway, the green is surrounded by four bunkers.

HDCP 10****Pro's Advice**

Fairway bunkers left and right are in play off the tee, so keep it straight. A second shot to the right side of the fairway will set up the best approach into the green. Pay attention to which tier the pin is set.

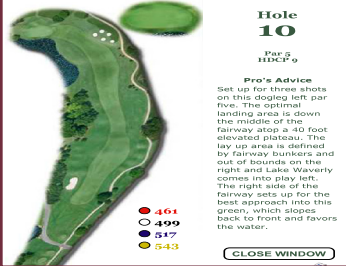

No. 10

Par 5 // 499 yards

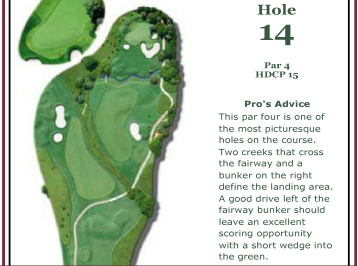
Hole 10 dog-legs from right to left. A grouping of bunkers to the left and Lake Waverly to the right will test players' second shot.



No. 14

Par 4 // 354 yards

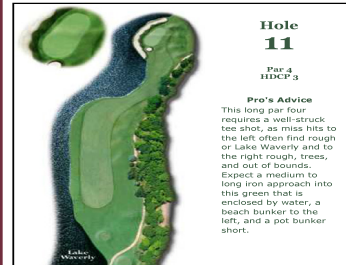
Hole 14 provides players with birdie opportunities if they can manage the split fairway. The green is heavily sheltered by a large bunker to the front.



No. 11

Par 4 // 408 yards

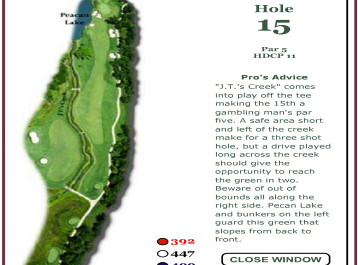
Hole 11's fairway is interrupted by Lake Waverly just before the green. Players will be forced to find a narrow and short fairway.



No. 15

Par 5 // 499 yards

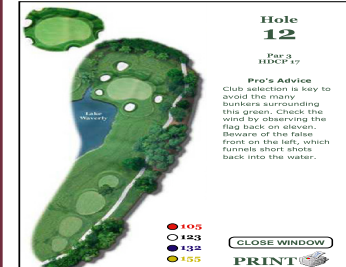
The 15th should warm players up for the final three holes. With minimal bunkers and Pecan Lake coming into play, players will need to take advantage of this par five.



No. 12

Par 3 // 155 yards

Hole 12 is the shortest par three on the course but is heavily sheltered by five bunkers and a water hazard.



No. 16

Par 4 // 388 yards

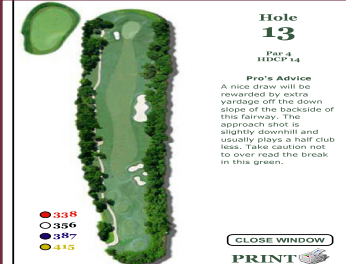
No. 16 is a short par four, but tee shots must clear Lake Camilia and a bunker before reaching the fairway. The green is nestled into a cove of trees with only one bunker.



No. 13

Par 4 // 398 yards

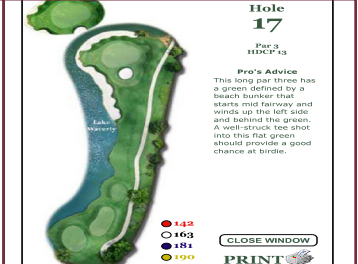
Hole 13 is a long and straight par four. The fairway is bunkered to the right by a large bunker. Only one bunker to the left comes into play near the green.



No. 17

Par 3 // 142 yards

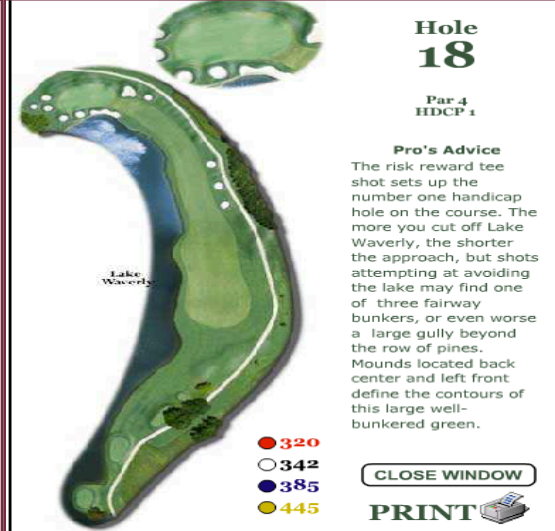
No. 17 is the most challenging par three on the course. With Lake Waverly separating the tee from the green, players must navigate a green that is completely shielded by bunkers.



No. 18

Par 4 // 385 yards

Hole 18 is heralded as one of the best finishing holes in the South. Players will be forced to avoid Lake Waverly to the left and bunkers to the right. The green is protected by seven bunkers, not to mention the lake. With the green nestled down a hill from the clubhouse, hole 18 will provide spectators a great view as teams complete the back nine.
