STORY LINES

SERIES VS. VANDERBILT

• Saturday marks the 14th meeting between the Tigers and the Commodores. Mizzou leads the series, 8-4-1. Since Mizzou joined the Southeastern Conference in 2012, the two teams have met every season. The Tigers lead the league series 6-3. Last time in Nashville, Vanderbilt captured a 21-14 decision.

2020: VANDERBILT AT MIZZOU

The Tigers defeated SEC East foe Vanderbilt, 41-0, on Nov. 28, 2020 at Memorial Stadium. Mizzou used a stout defensive effort, limiting Vanderbilt to 196 total yards, and a dominant rushing attack from Larry Rountree III and Tyler Badie who helped Mizzou rush for 223 yards on the ground in the win. Nick Bolton once again anchored a dominant defensive performance, posting nine tackles with 2.0 tackles for loss and one sack with a pass breakup. Rountree also rushed for a career-high three touchdowns and 160 yards on 21 carries to lead the offense. Thanks to the rushing attack, Mizzou never punted in the game.

LAST TIME OUT: MIZZOU

Prior to the Oct. 23 bye, a 21-point outburst in the first quarter by Texas A&M proved to be too much for the Missouri Tigers to overcome in a 35-14 Aggies victory on Faurot Field. Texas A&M opened the scoring with a two-yard touchdown pass from Zach Calzada to Ainias Smith after the Aggies got the ball at the Missouri 22-yard line following an interception by Jaylon Jones of a Connor Bazalak pass. After the first quarter, the Tigers played Texas A&M even, matching the Aggies on the scoreboard and outgaining them in total yards, 279-248.

Isaiah Spiller rushed 20 times for 168 yards and Devon Achane gained 124 yards on 16 carries. Tyler Badie scored Mizzou's first touchdown on a 32-yard run in the second quarter on a run where he just refused to go down, carrying a defender the final eight yards to the end zone. Missouri closed to within 28-14 in the third quarter when Bazalak led the Tigers on a 97-yard, 14-play drive that culminated with the first career touchdown by Dominic Lovett on a seven-yard misdirection run around the left end. During the drive, Tauskie Dove caught big passes of 24 and 26 yards, and Mizzou took advantage of a fourth-down pass interference penalty at midfield by Jones.

Badie was the workhorse for Missouri, rushing 22 times for 68 yards and catching seven passes for 53 yards. Bazalak completed 29 of 43 passes for 230 yards, with two interceptions. Defensively, Jaylon Carlies had a first-half pass interception at the goal line, his third pick of the season.

LAST TIME OUT: VANDERBILT

Visiting Mississippi State had five scoring drives of 10 plays or more and controlled the narrative from the outset in a 45-6 win over Vanderbilt at Vanderbilt Stadium. Bulldog quarterback Will Rogers threw for 386 yards and completed four touchdown passes — two to Makai Polk — and the Bulldogs had more than 39 minutes of possession. Vanderbilt mustered just 155 total yards of offense and was 1 of 11 on third down. It was the third time this season the Commodores failed to score a touchdown in a league game. Joseph Bulovas got Vanderbilt on the board with a 27-yard field goal on the first snap of the second quarter. Vandy scored the first points of the second half, a 41-yard Bulovas field goal, set up by a Dashaun Jerkins interception.

IN THE ZONE

- Mizzou is 20-for-21 scoring inside the red zone, with the only "blemish" coming when the Tigers took a knee to run out the clock against North Texas.
- The Tigers have scored touchdowns on 81.2 percent of their trips to the red zone.
- Mizzou has nine rushing touchdowns and nine passing touchdowns inside the 20 this season.

ONE & ONLY: TYLER BADIE

- With his 17-yard reception against Tennessee, senior running back Tyler Badie became the first Mizzou Tiger in program history to reach 1,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in his career. He became the first SEC player to reach the mark since Kentucky wide receiver Lynn Bowden, Jr., did so in 2019.
- Another first, Badie is the lone Tiger to score a combination of 15 rushing scores and 10 receiving TDs.
- With a career-high 209 rushing yards against North Texas, Badie became just the third Tiger to ever produce multiple 200-yard rushing performances in a single season.

PRESS BOX

- The Memorial Stadium / Faurot Field press box (6th floor, west side) will open to working media 90 minutes prior to kick off. The space is accessible using the elevator at Gate 5W.

STORY LINES

- The senior is averaging 143.6 all-purpose yards this season, good for 11th nationally and first in the SEC.
- Badie's 13 total touchdowns on the season are tied for third in the country and tops in the SEC. All 13 of Badie's touchdowns have come from scrimmage, putting him third in the country.
- Badie ranks second in the SEC with nine rushing touchdowns on the season. He has a touchdown in all seven of Mizzou's games this season. He is the first Tiger since Jeremy Maclin in 2007 to record four rushing and receiving touchdowns in a season.
- His 203-yard performance in the season opener was the first by a Tiger since Larry Rountree went for 204 in Dec. 2018 against Oklahoma State. The 203 rushing yards were the 15th most in Mizzou history.
- Badie surpassed the 2,000-yard mark in all-purpose rushing yards and the 2,500-yard plateau in overall all-purpose yards in the season opener against Central Michigan.
- At Kentucky, Badie hauled in a career-best 10 receptions for 88 yards. He became the first Tiger to catch 10 passes in a game since Emanuel Hall did so against Wyoming in 2018.
- Badie is one of five Tigers to accumulate 500 yards on the ground and receiving alongside:

KAD ALL THE WAY

- Kris Abrams-Draine produced a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Tennessee. It was the first kickoff return touchdown for Mizzou since 2014 when Marcus Murphy housed a 96-yard return at Florida.
- The 100-yard return was just the fifth 100-yarder in program history and the first of its kind since Oct. 30, 1976 when receiver Joe Stewart went endzone-to-endzone against Oklahoma State.
- Abrams-Draine is one of 27 players to take a kickoff back for a touchdown this season.

GOOD ON THIRD

- Mizzou ranks eighth in the country on third downs, converting 50 percent of the time.
- The Tigers' conversion rate ranks second in the SEC through seven games on the season.

HOLD ON TO THAT FOOTBALL

- Mizzou is one of just two teams in the country which has yet to lose a fumble this season.
- The Tigers have put the ball on the ground just once all season, coming in week two at Kentucky.

MEVIS MAGIC

- Sophomore kicker Harrison Mevis has made 16 consecutive field goals, ranking second nationally and leading the SEC.
- Mevis started his season with a bang, drilling a 53-yard field goal in the waning seconds of the first half to give Mizzou a lead over Central Michigan. The kick was a then-career-long for Mevis and had plenty of leg to spare.
- He was equally impressive at Boston College, hitting a career-long 56-yard boot to send the game to overtime.
- Mevis is now 5-for-6 in his career from beyond 50 yards. His 56-yarder is tied for the longest in the country this season.
- He is one of just two Tigers in program history to make five or more kicks of 50+ yards, joining Tom Whelihan (6, 1984-87).

BAZELAK BRINGS GROWTH

- Redshirt sophomore Connor Bazalak has already produced a career-best 12 touchdown passes through seven games on the season. The QB is completing 67.0 percent of his passes in 2021, good for fourth in the SEC and 20th nationally.
- Bazalak has thrown for over 250 yards in five games this season, including three, 300-yard performances.
- The QB is sixth nationally and second in the SEC in completions per game at 26.2.
- The redshirt sophomore has thrown a touchdown pass in five-of-seven games this season.
- Bazalak picked up right where he left off in 2020, going 21-for-32 for 257 yards and two touchdowns against Central Michigan.
- Bazalak and the Tigers jumped out of the gate fast, hitting a 63-yard shot on the first play of the season. The pass was the second-longest of Bazalak's career (69 yds – 2020 vs. LSU).
- At Kentucky, Bazalak matched his career high by slinging four touchdown passes. He finished the day 34-for-51 for 294 yards in the air. The 34 completions mark a career high for the Tiger QB.
- During the Kentucky game, Bazalak passed the 3,000 career passing yards mark in his 15th game played.

SCORE ON D

- Mizzou produced its first defensive score of the season against North Texas, as Trajan Jeffcoat deflected a pass which was intercepted by freshman defensive lineman Mekhi Wingo and returned 40 yards for a touchdown.
- The interception was the first of Wingo's career and marked the first time a Mizzou defensive lineman has scored since Akial Byers in 2018.
- The INT return for TD was part of a three-turnover performance for the Tigers' defense. Kris Abrams-Draine picked off a pass to setup Mizzou's first score of the day and later recovered a fumble forced by corner Akayleb Evans.
- Evans forced two fumbles on the day, the first two FF of his career.
- Mizzou scored 14 points off the three turnovers.

SPREADING THE LOVE

- Nine different Tigers have already hauled in a touchdown reception this season. The nine players with a TD grab are the most since 2018 at Mizzou when nine Tigers also made TD catches that season.
- This season, 16 different Tigers have caught a pass through four games. Five Tigers have made their first career TD grabs.

LONG-RANGE TIGERS

- Mizzou's offense set a historic mark against SEMO, scoring from beyond 45-yards on five occasions. The five touchdowns of 45+ yards mark the most in a single-game in Mizzou history.
- The previous high was four touchdowns of 45+ yards, set against Iowa State in 1942.
- This was the second time under coach Drinkwitz the Tigers had at least four touchdowns of 20+ yards, a feat the squad accomplished against LSU in 2020.
- Mizzou's five TDs of 45+ yards against SEMO were a 49-yard run by Tyler Badie, 55-yard run by Michael Cox, 46-yard catch by Boo Smith from Connor Bazalak, 52-yard reception by Chance Luper from Bazalak and 65-yard pass from Tyler Macon to JJ Hester.



STORY LINES

FOLLOW THE MANUEL

- Mizzou safety Martez Manuel is second on the squad with 45 tackles this season, including a team-leading 36 solo stops.
- 34 of Manuel's 45 tackles have come in the past four games for Mizzou. Over the same stretch, he's logged 4.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks.
- His 2.5 sacks match his single-season best set in 2020.
- He had a career-high 10 solo stops against Tennessee while matching his personal best of 11 total tackles.
- The versatile Manuel is tied for the team lead with a pair of quarterback pressures as well.

TAKE YOUR PICK

- Mizzou's secondary has snagged an interception in six of the seven contests played this season.
- The Tigers have a total of eight interceptions, ranking 21st nationally and fifth in the SEC.
- Five different Tigers have an interception this season, tallying five as a team.
- Jaylon Carlies and Kris Abrams-Draine lead Mizzou with two INTs while Akayleb Evans, Shawn Robinson and Mekhi Wingo have one each.

KAD GETS HIS INT

- Sophomore defensive back Kris Abrams-Draine has quite the journey through his first two seasons at Mizzou. After playing receiver in 2020, he made the switch to DB for his second season.
- Abrams-Draine has been a regular in the defensive backfield, making starts in two of the three games so far this season. He's recorded six total tackles and three pass breakups.
- Against SEMO, KAD notched another milestone with his first interception on a leaping grab over the receiver. The play led to a Mizzou TD on the ensuing drive.
- Abrams-Draine made his second INT on North Texas' first drive of the game, setting up a Mizzou touchdown drive.

BOO'S BIG PLAYS

- Senior Boo Smith was on the receiving end of Mizzou's electric first play, hauling in the 63-yard strike which set up a two-play touchdown drive.
- The 63-yard catch nearly doubled Smith's career yardage, after he hauled in eight passes for 65 yards.
- Smith added another reception to record just his second game with multiple catches as a Tiger. The only previous occurrence was a six-catch performance against LSU last season.
- Against SEMO, Smith recorded his first TD catch at Mizzou, hauling in a 46-yard strike.
- Smith added his first career rushing touchdown on a 4-yard jet sweep against Tennessee.

CARLIES CREATING HAVOC

- Sophomore safety Jaylon Carlies has been a force at the back of Mizzou's defense, creating four turnovers for the Tigers.
- The safety picked up his third INT of the season against Texas A&M, tying Carlies for seventh nationally and second in the SEC this season.
- Carlies recorded his first collegiate interception in the season opener against Central Michigan. He made it two-straight games with an INT by pulling in a deflected pass from Kentucky QB Will Levis in week two.
- The back-to-back INTs made Carlies the first Mizzou player to pick off a pass in consecutive games since Adam Sparks accomplished the feat against Vanderbilt and Arkansas in 2017.
- The safety also made one of the biggest plays of the game, forcing a UK fumble late in the first half which was recovered by the Tigers in the end zone. The play led to a Mizzou touchdown with four seconds to play in the half, pull the Black & Gold within seven at the break.

TIGHT ENDS MAKING PLAYS

- Mizzou featured its tight ends heavily in the game at Kentucky, with Daniel Parker, Jr. and Niko Hea combining for eight catches.
- Parker was a favorite target in the red zone, hauling in a pair of touchdown receptions. It was Parker's first touchdown catch since 2018 and his first multi-score game in his collegiate career.
- Hea made five grabs on the night, setting a career high for the junior. He totaled 37 yards on the five catches which also set a new career best.

YOUNG FINDS PAYDIRT

- Sophomore Elijah Young ripped off a 32-yard scamper for his first collegiate touchdown against Central Michigan.
- Young, who saw action in seven games and recorded 10 rushes as a freshman in 2020 showed Tiger fans the 1-2 punch in the backfield is going nowhere after the departure of Larry Rountree to the NFL last season.
- The 32-yard run is the second-longest for Young in his Mizzou career. He went for 35 yards against Vanderbilt a season ago.
- Against SEMO, Young recorded his first receiving touchdown, coming out of the backfield for a three-yard grab against the Redhawks.

KICKOFF KING

- Mizzou's Sean Koetting leads the nation with 5.86 touchbacks per game this season. His 41 touchbacks are tied for third nationally, behind only Arkansas and Virginia kickers who have each played an additional game.
- Only three of Koetting's kickoffs have been returnable, going for a total of 56 yards. Those 56 yards rank as the fourth fewest in the country this season.
- The 18.67 yards per return ranks 34th nationally.

MIZZOU GRADUATES

- Chase 2 Dreams is a mantra for the Mizzou coaching staff and student-athletes. It's simple, *life after football*. The 2021 roster boasts 15 student-athletes who've earned their bachelor's degrees and eight who will finish their undergraduate degree this fall.

Mizzou's five SEC wins are the second-most ever behind its 7-1 mark that it posted en route to winning back-to-back SEC East crowns in 2013 and 2014.

Despite playing with less than 60 scholarship players for more than half of their games in 2020 and having just three games played on their original dates, the Tigers overcame an 0-2 start to win five of their final eight games down the stretch, a run that included:

- A goal-line stand in the closing minute to hold off defending National Champion LSU, 45-41.
- Snapping Kentucky's five-game series win streak with a 20-10 victory that wasn't nearly as close as the final score indicated.
- Mizzou's first win in Columbia East since 2014, a 17-10 decision at South Carolina and a thrilling come-from-behind 50-48 walk-off victory over Arkansas, its fifth-straight in the series.
- An appearance at No. 25 in the College Football Playoff rankings Dec. 7, only the third season the program has appeared in the CFP's seven-year run.

Of the SEC's four new head coaches to begin work in the nation's toughest conference in 2020, Drinkwitz's 5-5 regular-season record was the league's best, ahead of Ole Miss' Lane Kiffin (4-5), Mississippi State's Mike Leach (3-7) and Arkansas' Sam Pittman (3-7). In addition, Drinkwitz and his staff signed a top-25 recruiting class currently ranked No. 20 by Rivals.com (highest ranking in program history) to help secure a promising future for the storied Mizzou program.

Drinkwitz's offensive acumen has been a key element in his team's winning five conference championships while compiling a perfect 8-0 bowl game record in 11 seasons at the FBS level. The combined record of his teams from 2010-20 is 103-39 overall (.725), including a 62-27 conference mark (.687).

The 2019 campaign saw Drinkwitz turn in one of the most impressive FBS head coaching debut seasons ever. His Mountaineers set a Sun Belt record with their 12 wins, and also set the mark for the best regular season in conference history (11-1). They claimed the Sun Belt Championship with a 45-38 win against Louisiana on Dec. 7.

Also in 2019, App State became the first-ever Sun Belt program to earn a top 20 ranking in the Associated Press poll, while also becoming the first team in league history to receive an in-season ranking in the College Football Playoff poll. Drinkwitz's team also made history in 2019 with a pair of Power 5 road wins (at bowl-eligible North Carolina, and later at South Carolina) – making it the first-ever Sun Belt team to register two Power 5 wins in a season. In all, the Mountaineers claimed an FBS-best six road wins en route to becoming the first-ever 12-win team among North Carolina's FBS members.

For his efforts, Drinkwitz was named a finalist for the 2019 Eddie Robinson Award, a prestigious award which goes annually to the nation's top coach. He was also named the North Carolina Coach of the Year by the North State Journal.

App State proved to be one of the nation's most balanced teams in 2019, thanks in large part to an efficient offense that ranked ninth nationally in scoring (39.4 points per game), coupled with a stingy defense that ranked 22nd nationally in points allowed (20.2 ppg). The Mountaineers also excelled in the critical turnover category, ranking eighth nationally in 2019 with a plus-12 turnover margin. App State junior running back Darrynton Evans was named the Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year, after rushing for 1,323 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Prior to App State, Drinkwitz spent three years as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for record-setting NC State teams (2016-18), after excelling in a similar role at Boise State for two years (2014-15), where the Broncos won the Mountain West title in 2014 and finished 12-2 and ranked 16th nationally. In 2015, Drinkwitz was promoted to offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, and he helped the Bronco offense rank in the top 15 nationally in points (39.1) and yards (501.3) per game.

Before Boise, Drinkwitz was a key figure in back-to-back Sun Belt Championships in 2012-13 as running backs coach and co-offensive coordinator at Arkansas State. He got his first taste at the FBS level in the Southeastern Conference, as he served as a quality control assistant at Auburn for the 2010-11 seasons. The Tigers won the SEC in 2010, and went on to the BCS Championship that season with a perfect 14-0 record.

Following a 7-6 season in 2016 at NC State, Drinkwitz helped the Wolfpack to consecutive nine-win seasons (2017-18) for the first time since 1991-92. With an average of 35.6 points per game under his direction in 2018, NC State had a 1,000-yard rusher for the third-straight year, two 1,000-yard receivers and a quarterback with nearly 4,000 passing yards. The Wolfpack made a steady rise from 63rd nationally in total offense in his first season in 2016 to 25th in 2017 and 16th in 2018. He was a Broyles Award nominee as one of the nation's top assistant coaches in his final year with the Wolfpack.

The Wolfpack offense had six players selected in the 2018 and 2019 NFL Drafts combined, including record-setting quarterback Ryan Finley, who was a fourth-round selection in 2019 by the Cincinnati Bengals.

In his six seasons as an offensive coordinator and head coach, Drinkwitz has produced five 1,000-yard rushers, four 3,000-yard passers and four 1,000-yard receivers. Three of those years (2015, 2017, 2018) his offenses produced at least one in each category.

Drinkwitz, 38, graduated magna cum laude and was the student body president at Arkansas Tech (bachelor's, education) before beginning his coaching career at the prep level in his hometown of Alma, Ark., in 2005. He and his wife, Lindsey (Sivils), have four daughters: Addison, Emerson, Ella and Parker Lynn.

A winner at every stage of his coaching career, Eliah Drinkwitz – considered one of college football's top offensive minds – was introduced as Mizzou's 33rd head football coach in December of 2019, and despite all the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, led his 2020 Tigers to a 5-5 record against an All-SEC slate.

Drinkwitz, who took over the Tiger program following an impressive 2019 season at Appalachian State that saw the 20th-ranked Mountaineers win the Sun Belt Conference title en route to a 12-1 record, joined Warren Powers as the only head coaches in Mizzou history to earn a bowl bid in their first season patrolling the sidelines in Columbia. Drinkwitz joins Frank Broyles, Dan Devine and Powers as the only first-year Mizzou head coaches to reach five victories in year one of their Tiger tenures.
