FIRST DRAW

- Vanderbilt goes on the road for the first time this season to face Elon at noon CT on Friday.
- A win would mark Vanderbilt's best start to a season since the team won its first five games to start the 2019 season.
- Friday's contest will be the first meeting between Vandy and Elon since 2017. The two previous meetings were decided by a total of four goals.
- Vanderbilt's next three games are all on the road. After Friday, the team heads west for games at Colorado on March 4 and at Denver on March 6 before returning home to host UMass on March 24.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Commodores defeated No. 12 Notre Dame 14-12 behind four goals from Ellie Hilsabeck.
- It was Vanderbilt's first win over Notre Dame since 2011.
- Melissa Hawkins' impressive defensive performance earned her AAC Defensive Player of the Week honors. Hilsabeck was named to the AAC Weekly Honor Roll.
- Notre Dame jumped out to an early 4-0 lead, but the Commodores settled in and held the Fighting Irish to just five second-half goals.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Vanderbilt won its eighth straight home opener on February 12 with an 18-13 victory over Liberty.
- The Commodores went 8-1 at home in 2021 and are 18-6 during Hewitt's tenure.
- Vanderbilt's eight straight home wins last season was a program record.
- 2021 was the 10th season in program history with just one home loss.

#1 IS #1

- $\bullet 5 th-year\ Gabby\ Fornia\ broke\ the\ program's\ career\ assists\ record\ on\ March\ 10,2021\ versus\ Kennesaw\ State.$
- She enters play Friday 133 career assists, ranking second most among active players in NCAA D-I.
- On February 19 vs. Notre Dame, Fornia became just the fifth Commodore to reach 200 career points.
- Fornia finished the 2021 regular season at second in assists nationally with 55.
- She tied the Vandy single-game points record and set the AAC record with 12 at East Carolina on March 28, 2021. She also set the Vandy and AAC single-game assists record on the same day with nine assists.

CHASING MILESTONES

- Head coach Beth Hewitt sits at 99 career wins. The victory over Notre Dame was her third win over a ranked opponent in four season at Vanderbilt.
- Melissa Hawkins ranks fourth in Vanderbilt history with 107 caused turnovers. Ally Carey holds the third spot at 110 and the record belongs to Sasha Cielak with 133.
- Bri Gross sits in third in Vandy's record books with 175 draw controls. Ally Carey holds the record with 263. Gross needs four more draw controls to pass Margie Curran for second.
- Gabby Fornia's 200 career points is fourth-most in Commodore history. Ally Carey is third with 201. Margie Curran holds the record with 244.

ON THE RISE

- The Commodores made their seventh NCAA Tournament appearance in 2021 and first since 2010.
- Vanderbilt's 12 wins last season were the second most in the program's 26 seasons.
- The team's nine-game win streak in the middle of the season was the second-longest in school history.
- Vandy finished above .500 in league play for the first time since 2015. The Dores went 7-3 (.700) in the AAC for the program's best conference win percentage since Vandy went 4-1 (.800) in 2010.

- ILWomen also named Gross the preseason AAC Offensive Player of the Year.

CONFERENCE PRESEASON HONORS

- Gabby Fornia was voted the American Athletic Conference's preseason Attack Player of the Year.
- Fornia, Bri Gross, Melissa Hawkins and Maddie Souza were each named preseason All-AAC.
- Vanderbilt's four all-conference selections were second most in the league behind Florida's six.
- In the preseason coaches' poll, Vanderbilt and Temple each collected 19 points, good for second. Florida was picked to finish first.

GUNNING STARS

- Junior goalkeeper Paige Gunning was a second team All-AAC selection in 2021.
- She set the program-record with 177 saves in the season and led all of NCAA Division I.

DEFENSIVE HERO

- Senior Melissa Hawkins enters the season ranked fourth in school history with 100 caused turnovers.
- The school record is 133 by Sasha Cielak ('08).
- Hawkins' six caused turnovers vs. Temple on April 24, 2021 matched the AAC single-game record.

BREAKING DOWN THE SQUAD

- The Commodores return 26 student-athletes and welcome three transfers plus nine freshmen.
- Twelve states are represented on the 2022 Vanderbilt roster. Maryland and New Jersey lead the way with eight Commodores each. California (4), New York (3), Virginia (3), Connecticut (2), Florida (2), Massachusetts (2), Tennessee (2), Texas (2), Virginia (2), Oregon (1), and Utah (1) are each represented as well.

TWINNING

- The Commodores feature two sets of twins on the roster.
- Ashley and Taylor Sampone join Vanderbilt as sophomores after transferring from Louisville.
- Jackie and Sammy Nuchow are freshmen from Los Angeles, Calif.

BREAKING DOWN THE SCHEDULE

- Vanderbilt opens the season with 10 straight nonconference games before the AAC schedule begins April 2 at Temple.
- The Commodores will face five teams ranked in the preseason 2022 IWLCA/ ILWomen Division I Poll.
- No. 5 Notre Dame comes to Nasvhille Feb. 19. Vandy will travel to No. 14 Denver on March 6 before hosting No. 24 UMass on March 11. The Dores will then visit No. 22 Temple on April 2 and face No. 7 Florida on April 16 in Nashville. (Rankings from preseason poll)
