SERIES HISTORY OVERALL 142-76-1 IN GAINESVILLE 81-24 AWAY 56-47-1 NEUTRAL 5-5

NOTABLE The last three series have been won by the home team (UF in 2018; VU in 2019; UF in 2021). Florida has won five of the last six series overall.

UF-VU PREVIEW: No. 23 Florida visits Vanderbilt for the first time since 2019. Despite being swept in that series, the Gators have won two of the last three series vs. the Dores in Nashville. In last year's series, UF took two of three games from VU in Gainesville, winning the final two matchups (W, 11-8; W, 5-3) after dropping the opener (L, 7-11). Across the last 10 meetings, Florida is 6-4. Over the previous 18 meetings, Florida is 12-6.

The Gators are 29-18 vs. VU under **HC Kevin O'Sullivan** including 8-10 on the road.

LAST TIME OUT: UF dropped a Tuesday matchup at Florida State (L, 0-5) after winning a series over No. 2 Arkansas by taking two of three games (L, 1-8 / W, 7-2 / W, 9-7). UF snapped Arkansas' conference-leading streak of 13-straight SEC series victories, which dated back to May 16-18, 2019. The Gators went 3-1 last week overall, also picking up a midweek victory over Florida A&M (W, 13-3).

IN THE POLLS: Entering week nine of the season, Florida is ranked as highly as No. 17 (USA Today Coaches Poll) and sits at No. 23 in the D1Baseball Top 25.

SULLY WINS 600TH: With a 13-6 victory to clinch the series vs. Alabama on March 19, Coach O'Sullivan won his 600th game as Florida head coach - on the same day Georgia head coach Scott Stricklin accomplished the feat. 2022 represents O'Sullivan's 15th season at UF, during which he owns a 606-290 (.676) record, passing the legendary Dave Fuller (556-354-6) for the most wins in program history on March 9, 2021. O'Sullivan's .676 winning percentage ranks third among all active Division I head coaches, while Florida's .616 clip in SEC play since 2008 stands as the top mark in the conference.

MARCH ON, JUD: During the month of March, **OF Jud Fabian** led the SEC in total bases (54), slugging (.857), walks (22) and home runs (10).

STATE OF THE DEFENSE: With 25 errors in 1,202 defensive chances, Florida ranks 17th nationally with a .979 fielding percentage.

BLAKE TAKES SEC HONORS: After pitching in all four games for Florida last week, **RHP Blake Purnell** was named the SEC Co-Freshman of the Week. Purnell went 1-0 with one save and a 1.29 ERA across seven innings pitched, walking none and striking out four. Purnell recorded a 3.1-inning save in game two vs. Arkansas to even the series, then earned the win in game three to clinch the series by pitching 1.2 perfect innings to finish off the game. Purnell wields a 3-2 record with 3 SV and a 1.19 ERA across 30.1 innings pitched this season, and has only allowed an earned run in three of his 19 appearances.

NATIONAL HR DUO: 2021 All-American **OF Jud Fabian** is tied for the SEC lead with 13 HR (T-9th nationally) while **OF Wyatt Langford** ranks 4th in the SEC and T-21st nationally with 12 HR. Fabian and Langford have combined for the second-most home runs (25) of any two-player duo from the same team in the country (Old Dominion, 27; Andy Garriola & Carter Trice), and are one of four teammate duos in the nation with 12-plus homers apiece (only 13 teams have two 10-plus homer players). Either Fabian or Langford has homered in 6 of the last 8 games, but from March 12-25, one of the two players homered in 8-consecutive games.

HISTORIC HOME RUN PACE: UF ranks fifth in the nation with 61 HR. The Gators are on pace to hit 103 home runs in the regular season, which would mark the program's third-highest total ever, as well as the most under O'Sullivan (2018 - 100) and UF's top total since 2002 (111). **C/DH Mac Guscette** hit the Gators' 50th HR on 3/31/22 at No. 23 Georgia in UF's 26th game of the season. In 2021, **1B/DH Kris Armstrong** hit UF's 50th homer in the 41st game of the season on 4/30/21 off of No. 2 Vanderbilt's Kumar Rocker.

2-TO-4 HAPPY HOUR: The trio of **OF Jud Fabian** (second), **OF Sterlin Thompson** (third) and **OF Wyatt Langford** (fourth) has recorded an RBI in 29 of 33 games this year while picking up hits in 32 of 33 games. Those three hitters have batted two-three-four in Florida's lineup in 32 of 33 games this year -- in the only other instance, they batted one-two-three in the starting lineup.

SCANNING THE BARCO: As one of 45 players named to the Golden Spikes Award Midseason Watch List last week, **LHP Hunter Barco** ranks fourth in the SEC with a 2.23 ERA, third with 65 strikeouts (T-24th nationally) T-third with 48.1 IP and T-fourth with a .174 BAA. The UF ace also ranks 12th in the nation and fifth in the SEC with a 0.83 WHIP. Barco's ratios translate to 12.1 K/9, 1.9 BB/9 and a 6.5 K-to-BB ratio. The sophomore* southpaw is 12-3 across his last 18 starts dating back to the 2021 season.

NOTE ON SPROAT: Saturday starter **RHP Brandon Sproat** is coming off back-to-back strong outings, allowing a combined 4 ER across 11.2 IP with 13 K vs. 3 BB against No. 23 Georgia and No. 2 Arkansas. Sproat has thrown 5+ IP with 3 ER or fewer in five of seven weekend starts this year, with his best outing at now-No. 2 Miami (W, 6.1 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 8 K) earning him SEC Pitcher of the Week honors. Sproat has thrown 216 pitches (107, 109) over his last two starts.

JUDDY JACKS: After becoming the fifth player in program history to eclipse 20 HR in a season in 2021, **OF Jud Fabian** is not only leading the SEC with 13 HR, but also ranks T-third in the conference with 30 BB (T-21st nationally) - with just 28 K. Fabian recorded his 7th career multi-HR game on 3/22 vs. BCU and now sits at 45 career HR, which ranks 6th all-time at UF. The Ocala, Fla. native's next HR milestone will come at 47 HR, where Gator great Mike Zunino awaits in fifth.

MEDIA SERVICES

The 2022 Florida Baseball Media Supplement was compiled and written for the benefit of all readers interested in learning detailed information regarding the University, coaches, staff and student-athletes of the Gator Baseball program. Any additional media information, special requests or needs should be directed to the UF Communications Department, specifically Sullivan Bortner. Members of the media will also be supplied with weekend release packages that contain updated statistics and preview information.

CREDENTIALS AND PRESS GATE

All media attending Florida baseball home games must present a media pass for admission to Florida Ballpark. Credentials for home games are issued for working media only and should be requested as early as possible, at least 48 hours in advance, to Sullivan Bortner. The press entrance is located next to Gate 4 of Florida Ballpark, which is along the first base side of the ballpark. Credentials not mailed or picked up will be left at this entrance and may be picked up by showing proper identification. Florida reserves the right to refuse any credential request deemed not to be in the best interest of the University.

INTERVIEW POLICY

Player interviews are arranged through the Communications Department. We will do our best to coordinate an interview time that is convenient to both the student-athlete and the media member. The best time to interview an athlete or head coach Kevin O'Sullivan is during the afternoon before practice. Following each game, O'Sullivan will do a brief interview with the Gators IMG Sports Network (official radio partner) and then meet with the media. Following games, players will be available upon request. All interview requests should be provided to Sullivan Bortner in the press box prior to the conclusion of the game. The UF clubhouse and dugout are closed to the media.

Due to new NCAA policies, no player media interviews may be granted on official days off. During the season, the team is typically off on Mondays.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

All photographers are required to shoot from designated areas. There are to be no cameras allowed behind the center field fence other than the originating TV network. Photographers are also not permitted in or between the dugouts. Please stay within these parameters.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Updated cumulative statistics, game notes and scorecards will be available in the press box at each home game. A final NCAA box score will be furnished to the media at the completion of each game. An official scorer is assigned to all home games, and Zach Dirlam will keep the media informed of all scoring decisions, notable facts and records. Florida Ballpark's press box will be available for writers to work from after each game.

O'SULLIVAN BREAKS SCHOOL RECORD

O'Sullivan passed Dave Fuller for the most wins in program history on March 9, 2021 with a 5-1 win vs. Georgia State. Fuller finished his illustrious Gators head coaching career with 556 wins from 1948-75. O'Sullivan picked up his 435th career win against Kentucky (5/19/17) to pass Joe Arnold for the second-most wins in UF history. He also became the quickest UF baseball coach to reach the 400-win mark against Miami (2/24/17), taking just 590 games to accomplish the feat. The national championship coach broke the record in a 5-1 victory against Georgia State on March 9.

On February 8, 2019, the University Athletic Association broke ground on Florida Ballpark. Construction on the (estimated) \$65 million ballpark, located on the southwest part of the University of Florida campus adjacent to Disney Stadium, was completed in June 2020.



Florida Ballpark features a 360-degree open concourse, shade structure for fans, multiple seating and game experience options, high-definition video and sound, enhanced concession space and food options, and multiple prominent entry gates.



All permanent seats feature chairbacks and there are multiple premium seating options, in addition to grass berms and non-traditional seating that will bring capacity to more than 7,000. There are over 4,000 chairback seats, and 700-plus fans are able to enjoy new club level seating.



FLORIDA BALLPARK at ALFRED A. MCKETHAN FIELD (Capacity: 7,000)

Student-athletes have a private nutrition area, team lounge, film room, team meeting room, expanded locker room, indoor pitching and batting cages, and an enhanced training and rehabilitation area. The staff has individual office space for all coaches and a reception area celebrating the program's achievements.

REMEMBERING ALFRED A. MCKETHAN STADIUM at PERRY FIELD



2020 marked the final season at Alfred A. McKethan Stadium at Perry Field. The friendly confines of McKethan Stadium were an important ingredient to the success of Gators Baseball for more than two decades. From its opening in 1988 until its final season in 2020, Florida was one of the toughest teams in the nation to defeat at home, posting a 911-303 (.750) record at McKethan Stadium.

Head coach **Kevin O'Sullivan** logged a 366-104 (.779) overall record, and an eye-popping 85-16 (.837) mark in regular-season series at McKethan Stadium in the first 13 years of his tenure.

The Gators ran off a school-record 29-game home winning streak from May 2015 through April 8, 2016, won 12 NCAA Regionals, and captured eight NCAA Super Regional titles at McKethan Stadium.

McKethan Stadium (also referred to as "The Mac"), formerly located on Stadium Road, gave the Gators one of the most unique ballparks in college baseball upon its inaugural season in 1988.

The \$2.4-million stadium's initial construction and refurbishment – which featured a 2,500-seat grandstand with 800 chair backs, a new press box, concession stands, and restrooms – in 1987 was made possible through the generosity of Alfred A. McKethan, a major benefactor to the University of Florida in many ways throughout his lifetime.

"Baseball always had been my first love. The facility we have at home (Emerson Field at Hernando High School) looked better than at the university," McKethan told The Tampa Tribune for its Feb. 23, 1988 story which detailed the project's completion. "I challenged fellow (Bull Gator Club) members to match me dollar for dollar and let us bring baseball at Florida to the level with football and basketball facilities."

McKethan, who was chairman of the board of Brooksville's Sun Bank & Trust at the time, presented the University Athletic Association with just over 10,000 shares

MCKETHAN STADIUM ATTENDANCE NOTES

Florida broke its attendance record in 2018, hosting 165,551 fans – a school record – over 41 home games and its highest ever average attendance (4,038). In 2016, the Gators recorded their highest game attendance in school history (6,244 vs. Mississippi State, 4/9).

of Sun Bank stock, which amounted to a \$500,000 donation. Matching funds from the state and McKethan's fellow Bull Gator Club members covered the remaining costs.

Although the Gators dropped their first home game of the 1988 season (a 3-1 loss to Western Carolina), they won the first game of a double-header against Miami on Feb. 23, when an official stadium dedication was held in McKethan's honor. McKethan threw out the ceremonial first pitch ahead of Florida's 3-2 victory over the Hurricanes.

McKethan Stadium was built around Perry Field, which became Florida's home ballpark in 1949. The field drew its namesake from Carl E. "Tootie" Perry, a two-way offensive and defensive lineman for the Gators football team in 1916 and 1919-21; he earned All-Southern honors in 1920 and 1921, and served as team captain the latter season. A Gainesville product, Perry's family owned the land which became the Gators' home baseball stadium and track and field complex. Perry's family donated the land to the University with the stipulation the field be named for their son. Upon graduation, Perry became the official "Waterboy" for the baseball team and faithfully attended numerous Gators games.

The ballpark was also named Percy Beard Stadium before it was re-named Alfred A. McKethan Stadium at Perry Field in 1988.

Lights were installed at Perry Field in 1977, courtesy of a generous contribution from New York Yankees owner George Steinbrenner. Florida christened Steinbrenner's donation with an exhibition game against the Yankees that season.

A home team dugout was constructed at Perry Field in 1981, thanks to a \$10,000 donation by former Gators catcher and football quarterback Tom Shannon. The construction included a training room and storage area.

"Its roof serves as a photographer's paradise and the whole thing looks like a 7-Eleven," an editor for The Tampa Tribune wrote in a March 10, 1981 story about the project and another Gators-Yankees exhibition game the day prior – which saw Reggie Jackson finish 0-for-2 as a designated hitter against Gators starting pitcher Larry Mikesell.

At that time, Perry Field was infamous for a hill in left field which rose 30 feet to the wall. The Tampa Tribune story described how "a left fielder must chug uphill over an old sewer line in pursuit of a ball" and that "Steinbrenner winced each time outfielder Dave Winfield risked those expensive legs of his in the mountain climb" throughout the March 9, 1981 exhibition game.

A construction project in the summer of 1995 added 1,000 seats to the main grandstand of McKethan Stadium, which replaced seating the facility lost as a result of prior construction and an expansion of the press box.

The following year, a \$350,000 plaza development project created a courtyard atmosphere around the main grandstand, as well as a new main entrance to the ballpark.

In the fall of 1996, the press box was rebuilt with a gift of \$300,000 from Mr. McKethan.

Two significant upgrades were made in the summer of 1997. First, the playing field was leveled and new grass was planted. Second, the stadium's capacity increased to 5,000 after the addition of seats along the left field line and beyond the left field fence.

Those improvements made "The Mac" one of the best stadiums in college baseball. When Baseball America released a list of the Best College Baseball Stadiums in its January 1998 magazine issue, McKethan Stadium was ranked No. 7 nationally and No. 1 in the state of Florida.

REMEMBERING ALFRED A. MCKETHAN STADIUM at PERRY FIELD

A \$13-million expansion to McKethan Stadium and the adjacent Lerner and Athletic Center further enhanced the complex upon its completion in September 2006.

The construction project created additional stadium seating and a baseball-specific building which included a training facility, video room, offices and locker rooms, as well as a new bullpen and batting cage building. The building's roof became the Don and Irene Disney Plaza, a viewing deck which overlooked the field from foul territory in left field. Other major donors for the plaza included Gary and Nancy Condron, Rob Gidel, Tommy Oakley, George Sanders, and W. Kelly Smith.

Those projects brought McKethan Stadium's seating capacity up to 5,500 (5,100 grandstand seats; 400 bleacher seats in left field).

From 1911 through 1948, Florida played its home baseball games at Fleming Field, which stretched from Thomas Hall to Gale Lernerand Drive (east to west), and University Avenue to what is currently the north end zone of Ben Hill Griffin Stadium at Steve Spurrier-Florida Field. Florida fielded its first varsity baseball team in 1912.

Five Major League Baseball teams participated in exhibition games, and at least 23 Hall of Fame inductees – including Babe Ruth and Mel Ott – played at Fleming Field between 1919 and 1929, according to a story published by The Gainesville Sun.

Fleming Field, which also served as the home of Florida football games from 1911 through 1930, was named in honor of Francis Philip Fleming, Florida's 15th governor, in October 1915. Before it was renamed, the site was referred to as the University Athletic Grounds, or the University Athletic Field.

Prior to 1911, the university's home baseball and football games were held at a downtown stadium in the Porters Community. In January 1911, the UAA purchased the ballpark's wooden fence and grandstand and moved them to the site which eventually became Fleming Field.

ALFRED A. MCKETHAN (1908-2002)

A native Floridian, Mr. Alfred A. McKethan distinguished himself in his profession and service to the state of Florida. He served as President and Chief Executive Officer of the Sun Bank and Trust Company



(formerly Hernando State Bank) from 1942-94, at which time he retired. At the age of 38, McKethan became the youngest president of the Florida Bankers Association. Along with his brother, John W. McKethan, he established the Brooksville Rock Company, which later became known as the Florida Mining and Materials Corporation.

McKethan was also a citrus grower, serving as the Director and Chairman of the Brooksville Citrus Growers Association for 40 years, and as Director of the Florida Citrus Exchange for 15 years. He was a board member and Chairman for the Florida State Road Department and was the first Chairman of the Southwest Florida Water Management District. In addition, the Sunshine Skyway Bridge across Tampa Bay was due in part from the works of McKethan, as well as the initial planning of the Florida Turnpike.

He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from the University of Florida as an honors graduate in 1931, and maintained close ties as an alumnus. In 1981, it was McKethan who became the first eminent scholar under a new law that provided matching funds from the state to create chairs at Florida universities if the private sector donated \$600,000. He later made his donation to UF's College of Business Administration. Also active on campus, McKethan was a member of the President's Council, a long-time Bull Gator and had been an instrumental and active member of Gator Boosters.

A Distinguished Director of Gator Boosters, he was a major benefactor to the University of Florida in many ways over the years. An avid baseball fan, McKethan attended games whenever possible each Gator season. The original 1988 stadium construction and refurbishment was made possible through his generous \$2.4-million contribution. In 1996, college baseball's fanciest and most luxurious press box was rebuilt with the aid of an additional gift of \$300,000 from McKethan.

"When you talk of Gator spirit and love for the University," said former Florida football coach Steve Spurrier, "Alfred McKethan embodies what that is all about."

McKethan passed away in April of 2002 at the age of 93 and the Gator players and coaching staff honored him by wearing black A.A.M. patches on their hats. His initials were also put above the scoreboard at the stadium bearing his name.
