DORES READY FOR NATIONAL STAGE

Vanderbilt women's golf is set for its 11th NCAA Championships appearance this week, coming off its first NCAA Regional title since 2019 and fourth in program history. Hosted by Arizona State, the NCAA Championships will be held at Grayhawk Golf Club in Scottsdale, Arizona, from May 20-25.

Friday marks the opening round of the NCAA Championships on the Raptor Course, where the Commodores will join 23 other programs.

The 2022 event will mark the seventh consecutive time in which the championships will feature stroke (May 20-23) and match play (May 24-25). The tournament will start with three rounds of stroke play, followed by a final round of stroke play where the field is determined by the top 15 teams and nine individuals not on an advancing team, advancing from the third round.

During the final round of stroke play on Monday, the top eight teams will advance to match play and a 72-hole individual medalist will also be crowned. Ever since it was instituted in 2015, Vandy is seeking its first trip to the final round of stroke play as a team, along with the match-play playoff. The program's best NCAA team finish came in 2004 when it was a stroke play only format.

GOLF Channel will provide live coverage of the NCAA Championships from May 23-25, beginning with the final round of stroke play at 4 p.m. CT Monday when the individual medalist is determined and eight teams advance to match play.

Last season, the Dorees were represented by NCAA individual qualifiers, junior Celina Sattelkau and fifth-year senior Louise Yu. Sattelkau advanced to the final round of stroke play, finishing 23rd after three rounds. After the final round, the German native finished in a tie for 53rd to conclude a successful sophomore campaign.

Vandy is scheduled to tee off at 9:25 a.m. CT Friday following a practice round at Grayhawk on the previous day. The Dorees will try to conquer the Raptor Course's par-72 layout that measures up to 6,384 yards for the championships. For the first two rounds, the Dorees are paired with SEC foe Mississippi State and Purdue, who punched its ticket to Scottsdale after winning a sudden-death playoff against Big Ten foe Northwestern at the NCAA Stanford Regional last week.

CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

The NCAA Championships will start with three rounds of stroke play (Friday-Sunday) with 18 holes per day (54 holes total). After Sunday's third round, the top 15 teams and nine individuals not on an advancing team are determined. Those teams and individuals will play a final round (18 holes) of stroke play on Monday to determine the top eight teams that will advance to match play. A 72-hole individual medalist will also be crowned.

May 20-23 – Stroke Play (72 holes)

- Friday, May 20 – First Round: Tees off at 9:25 a.m. CT from first tee
- Saturday, May 21 – Second Round: Tees off at 2:36 p.m. CT from 10th tee
- Sunday, May 22 – Third Round: – Tee times begin at 8:30 a.m. CT. The top 15 teams and nine individuals not on an advancing team move on to the final round of stroke play.
- Monday, May 23 – Final Round: Tee times begin at noon CT. Top eight teams advance to match play and an individual medalist is crowned.

The top eight teams will advance match play with quarterfinals and semifinals Tuesday and the championship match Wednesday to determine the NCAA champions.

May 24-25 – Match Play

- Tuesday, May 24 – Quarterfinals: Tee times begin at 8:20 a.m. CT. Winners advance to semifinals Tuesday afternoon.
- Tuesday, May 24 – Semifinals: Tee times begin at 2:45 p.m. CT. Winners advance to the championship match Wednesday.
- Wednesday, May 25 – Championship Match: Tees off at 3:35 p.m. CT when an NCAA champion will be crowned.

BACK IN THE WINNER'S CIRCLE

In its 22nd NCAA Regional appearance, Vanderbilt punched its ticket to its 11th NCAA Championships appearance after securing its first NCAA Regional title since 2019 with a 16-under performance in front of Commodore Nation at the Vanderbilt Legends Club in Franklin, Tennessee. The regional title is also the fourth in program history for the Dores.

Their 54-hole score of 848 is the ninth-lowest score in program history, while their final round of 279 (-9) is tied for 17th overall, and was the lowest round of any team throughout the three-day regional event. The Dores had an eight-stroke advantage over second-place Alabama, who's ranked in the top 10 in the latest Golfweek rankings. ACC champion and No. 4, Wake Forest, and No. 19 Texas A&M, round out the four teams advancing to the NCAA Championships at Grayhawk.

Individually, all five Dores finished in the top-25 with three in the top 10. Senior Austin Kim led the way for Vandy, tied for fourth at 5-under. Junior duo Jayna Choi and Tess Davenport notched their first top-10 finishes as Commodores, tied for seventh and ninth, respectively. Sattelkau finished with an even-par to finish in the top-15, while Yu had a performance to remember on the final day of competition, posting a bogey-free round to finish 3-under on the day.

THE WINNING LINEUP

The Dores will stick with the same lineup that was used in their regional winning performance last week at Vanderbilt Legends Club in Franklin. Kim, Yu and a trio of juniors – Sattelkau, Davenport and Choi – feature this week's lineup going into the NCAA Championships in Scottsdale.

Kim, an ANNIKA Award candidate and two-time Augusta National Women's Amateur participant stays in the top spot after she finished her home career with a 5-under performance, tied for fourth. She also still leads the team's scoring average for the season at 72.19.

Yu, a fifth-year senior who recently earned her graduate degree in marketing, stays steady at No. 2 after finishing her home career with a bogey-free 3-under final round, matching a season-low round of 69 for the third time on the season.

2021 NCAA Championship individual qualifier and SEC Golfer of the Week (March 10), Sattelkau, stays at No. 3, after a steady performance at the NCAA Franklin Regional last week.

Rounding out the last two spots of the starting five lineup are Davenport and Choi, who both earned their first career top-10 finishes tied for ninth and seventh, respectively, at the NCAA Franklin Regional. Davenport fired a career-low 69 during the second round, while Choi a career-low 4-under.

SCOUTING THE NCAA FIELD

The Dores will be part of a competitive 24-team field to conclude the postseason as 21 out of 24 teams in the field are ranked inside Golfweek's top 25. All of the program's in Golfweek's top 10 are represented at Grayhawk this week, including No. 1 seed and top-ranked Stanford.

All Power 5 conference champions are represented in this week's field – No. 2 seed Oregon (Pac-12), No. 4 seed Wake Forest (ACC), Texas (Big 12), LSU (SEC) and Michigan (Big Ten). With eight teams, the SEC represents a third of the field, including Vandy who's the only team from the conference to win an NCAA Regional title this season. South Carolina is the conference's highest seed at No. 3. Host Arizona State enters the week as the No. 7 seed.

The individual field includes 24 of the top 25 collegiate golfers according to Golfweek with Chiara Tamburlini of Ole Miss as the only one competing as an individual.

BEHIND THE SCENES AT GRAYHAWK

The 2022 NCAA Championships mark the second consecutive year for the event to be contested at Grayhawk Golf Club in Scottsdale. Arizona State will play host to the NCAA combined golf championships, which has been held at Grayhawk since 2021 and will continue through 2023.

The Tom Fazio-designed Raptor course offers thrilling challenges that command players' respect through a high-stakes game of risk and reward. Stretching over 6,384 yards for the championships, the par-72 course unfolds over the gentle hills and across shaded natural arroyos found in this picturesque corner of the Sonoran Desert.

Since Raptor's debut in 1995, it has hosted several professional and top amateur golf tournaments including the PGA TOUR's Frys.com Open (2007-09), Pro-Ams for the WM Phoenix Open (1996-2012), Tommy Bahama Challenge (2004-05), AJGA Thunderbird International Junior (2000-19) and PGA Jr. League Championship through 2022.

NCAA HISTORY LESSON – VANDERBILT AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Vandy will be making its 11th NCAA Championships appearance this week, with its last being in 2019 at Blessings Golf Club in Fayetteville, Arkansas. They also played in the 2014, 2013, 2012, 2011, 2010, 2007, 2004, 2003 and 2002 NCAA Championships.

Since it was instituted in 2015, the Dorees are seeking to make their first trip to the match-play playoff. Their best NCAA finish as a team and individually came at the 2004 NCAA Championships in Auburn, Alabama. Vandy finished fifth as a team, while Sarah Jacobs tied for sixth with a score of 287.

The Dorees also previously hosted the 2012 NCAA Championships at the Vanderbilt Legends Club where they finished 11th overall.

COMMODORES ON THE BIG STAGE

At the 10th edition of the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate (Feb. 28-March 2), the Dorees were challenged by the Pete Dye Course at Long Cove Club in Hilton Head Island, South Carolina. No team had a 54-hole score that finished under par during the tournament.

Vandy finished 9-over-par to finish the 54-hole tournament with a score of 35-over-par 887. The Dorees were led by Sattelkau, who matched a career-best finish tied for third with a 212 (-1). Ding tied for 50th while L. Yu and Kim each tied for 59th. After struggles the first two rounds, Kim moved up 16 spots after a 1-over-par performance in the final round. Freshman Natasha Kiel rounded out the Dorees contingent tied for 68th.

KIM TO THE MAJORS

Kim booked her ticket to her third U.S. Women's Open after winning individual medalist honors at a qualifying event in Pittsburgh on May 4. The senior shot a 4-under-par 138 to earn the event's low score. This year's major event will be held at Pine Needles Lodge & Golf Club in Southern Pines, North Carolina.

After her freshman season, Kim fired a 1-under-par 70 in the second round of the 2019 U.S. Women's Open, while she earned exemption into the 2020 U.S. Women's Open where Kim shot a 149 over two rounds at the Champions Golf Club in Houston, Texas.

SENIOR FAREWELL

The NCAA Championships will be a prime opportunity for Kim and Yu to make a lasting memory representing the Black and Gold. With only four NCAA Regional team titles in program history, Kim and Yu helped contributed to two of those wins – 2019 in Auburn and last week on Vandy's home course in Franklin.

With accomplished careers on and off the course, the senior duo have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll every season since competing as a Doree, while Kim is also a three-time All-American (Third Team - 2019 and Honorable Mention - 2019, 2020) and two-time SEC honoree (First team - 2019 and Second Team - 2020).

Afterwards, Kim is set to start her professional career, competing in the U.S. Women's Open from June 2-5, while Yu has accepted a position as a Transformation Delivery Advisory Associate with KPMG.

A TRIP DOWN MAGNOLIA LANE

Kim was invited to compete in the third annual Augusta National Women's Amateur (ANWA), which was held March 30-April 2 and seen by a national audience on NBC and Peacock.

This marked Kim's second appearance in the ANWA after she was invited in January 2020. Her appearance was delayed a year by the COVID-19 pandemic, but made the cut and finished tied for 25th overall at the event in 2021. This year, Kim just missed the cut to the final after fighting hard in a four-player playoff for the final spot.

POSTSEASON RESET

The Dorees had an up-and-down season – mostly due to nagging injuries throughout the starting lineup – having finished as high as second and as low as 13th (twice). But Vandy started its postseason with an SEC Championships showing that saw them finish seventh in stroke play and as quarterfinalists in match play, falling to eventual SEC champions, LSU.

Vandy joined Auburn and South Carolina as the only three teams to advance to the match-play portion of the event every season since the format was instituted in 2018.

Three Dorees earned top-30 individual finishes. Leading the way was Kim, who had her best SEC Championships finish in a tie for sixth-place. Sattelkau tied for 15th and Yu had her third straight top 30 finish in a tie for 26th.

DORES DUO GARNER SEC HONORS

As announced by the league office last Thursday, Natasha Kiel was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team and Choi was selected for the league's Community Service Team.

Kiel is Vandy's first All-Freshman honoree since 2019 and competed in four events this season, which included three rounds under par. In only her second career start and first on the road, Kiel shot a career-low 67 in the final round of the FAU Paradise Invitational, where she earned her first career top-five finish (tied for fifth-overall). With a career-low 208 (-8), she's tied for the 12th lowest 54-hole score in program history.

Choi competed in seven events this season, including Vanderbilt's win at the NCAA Franklin Regional, where she posted a career-best 54-hole score of 212 (-4). The junior has spent her time serving the community as a team captain with Miracle Network Dance Marathon, a student-led movement on campus supporting Children's Miracle Network Hospitals that raises funds all year long for children at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt by hosting various events and fundraisers around campus. In the classroom, Choi has made the SEC Academic Honor Roll as a freshman and sophomore during her Vandy career.

Greg Allen, Head Coach



For Greg Allen, who is considered one of the outstanding collegiate golf coaches in the NCAA, the 2021-22 season is his 15th at the helm of the Vanderbilt women's golf program.

Allen has made a big impact at Vanderbilt, leading the Commodores to 13 postseason appearances while advancing to seven NCAA Championships including five consecutive from 2010-14 for the first time in program history.

Following the 2018-19 campaign, Allen was recognized as Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year, the first such honor in his career, after guiding the Commodores to a program-record six victories. The 2019 postseason was highlighted by winning

the NCAA Auburn Regional Championship in early May, which propelled Allen's nationally-ranked Vanderbilt squad into the NCAA Championships. One of his top pupils, freshman standout Auston Kim, also swept the 2019 NCAA Auburn Regional Championships individual title.

Allen has guided the Commodores to 15 tournament titles in his tenure on West End, including four NCAA Regional crowns after the program claimed the title at the NCAA Franklin Regional held on its home course (Vanderbilt Legends Club) from May 9-11 during the 2021-22 season.

Allen's seventh Vanderbilt team in 2013-14 ranks with the 2018-19 among his most successful to date, winning four tournaments including the 2014 SEC Championship and the NCAA East Regional, the Commodores' first victories at the events since 2004. Simin Feng also won medalist honors at the SEC Championships and the Central District Invitational, while Jennifer Hahn won the NCAA East Regional individual title. Additionally, three different Vanderbilt golfers finished in the top five in 2013-14.

During his tenure at Vanderbilt, Allen's teams advanced to seven NCAA Championships (2010-14, 2019, 2022), including five consecutive from 2010-14. He has coached two first-team All-Americans in Marina Alex — a two-time SEC Player of the Year recipient — and Lauren Stratton, NCAA regional champions in Kim and Hahn, and SEC Freshman of the Year Feng.

Annually, Allen's Commodores are among the SEC's leaders in academic achievement. In 2017, he mentored the program's SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year in Kate Sborov.

Allen has guided three teams to conference championships — the 2001 and 2002 Pac-10 titles at Arizona and the 2014 SEC crown at Vanderbilt.

In 2010, his first NCAA Championships team at Vanderbilt broke through to finish seventh in Wilmington, North Carolina. Also in 2010, he coached the SEC Player of the Year in Alex and had two freshmen make the All-SEC Freshman team in Anna Leigh Keith and Stratton.

In 2011, his Commodore team qualified for the NCAA Championships after winning a one-hole playoff against Florida State in the NCAA East Regional. It was Allen's second consecutive trip to the national championship as Vanderbilt's coach and eighth overall. He also guided Vanderbilt to its first back-to-back top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships after his 2011 squad ended the event in a tie for 10th place. Two of his players, Alex and senior Megan Grehan, were named to the All-SEC second team at the end of the regular season.

In 2012, Vanderbilt advanced to the NCAA Championships for the third consecutive season and a date on their home course when the Commodores finished in second place at the NCAA Central Regional in Columbus, Ohio. The Commodores' second-place finish was the second-best at a regional in program history — only the 2004 team's win at the Central Regional was better. Vandy finished in 11th place at the national championship, and Alex and Stratton were each named NGCA First-Team All-Americans. It was the first time in the history of the program that the Commodores had two first-team All-Americans in the same season.

Allen came to Vanderbilt after a seven-year tenure as the head coach at Arizona, where he twice won the Pac-10 Conference, finished as NCAA runner-up in 2002 and coached Lorena Ochoa — the number one ranked player on the LPGA Tour before her retirement in 2010 — among nine other All-Americans.

COACHING STAFF

Allen had a lengthy record of achievement at Arizona during his seven years there. In addition to his Pac-10 titles and 10 All-Americans, he coached eight NCAA All-Scholars, 13 Academic All-Pac-10 student-athletes, three NCAA Players of the Year, two National Freshman of the Year, three Pac-10 Players of the Year, two Curtis Cup selections and 21 All-Pac-10 performers. Two of his players won the Golfstat Cup Award for the nation's lowest stroke average on three different occasions. His Wildcat teams also won nine tournament championships and registered 28 individual victories.

Allen arrived at Arizona after serving as assistant men's golf coach at Texas from 1998-2000. He helped lead the 1999-2000 Longhorns to a banner year that included the NCAA Central Region championship and a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships, its their best result in five years. The squad ended the season ranked No. 8 in the final MasterCard Collegiate Rankings. The 1998-99 team had its best showing in six years, as it earned three tournament victories and finished in the top three in seven of its 13 competitions. Well known for his rapport with collegiate players, Allen handled many of the day-to-day operations for the Longhorns and assisted head coach John Fields with scheduling, recruiting and coaching at practices and tournaments.

Prior to that he was director of tournament operations for the American Junior Golf Association (AJGA) in Roswell, Georgia, where he was responsible for planning and executing 47 national junior golf tournaments and other AJGA events. He oversaw all AJGA tournaments and was responsible for the supervision of eight tournament directors, as well as the hiring of 24 summer interns.

He is a native of Beechmont, Kentucky and graduated from Murray State in 1993 with a degree in journalism. As a student, he worked in the sports information office, where he was a liaison for numerous sports including golf. Prior to graduation, Allen worked two summers as a communications intern for the AJGA, where he was responsible for all on-site media relations at 10 national junior golf tournaments.

Allen and the former Sarah Moore were married in August 2019. They are the parents of six children: Maggie, Mollie, Mason, Kylie, Mabry and Blake.

The 2021-22 season is the fifth on West End for Emilie Meason. She was promoted to associate head coach after helping the Commodores advance to the 2019 NCAA Championships.

Meason, an All-America student-athlete at Georgia, joined the Commodores' as an assistant coach in July of 2017 after spending the spring of 2016 as a volunteer assistant coach at her alma mater, and has helped the Commodores return to postseason competition while advancing to the 2018, 2019 and 2022 NCAA Championships. During the 2021-22 season, she was instrumental in Vanderbilt capturing its fourth NCAA Regional title in program history on its home course (Vanderbilt Legends Club) from May 9-11.

Meason's importance to Vanderbilt's success during the 2018-19 campaign was acknowledged by her peers when she was named Assistant Coach of the Year by the Women's Golf Coaches Association.

During the 2018-19 season, Meason's assistance with the Commodores paid huge dividends. The team established a single-season program record with six tournament victories, including the NCAA Regional Championships in Auburn, Alabama, and Mason Rudolph Championship in Franklin, Tennessee.

Meason's contribution also helped Vanderbilt head coach Greg Allen earn SEC Coach-of-the-Year honors for the first time in his long tenure on West End.

Meason was instrumental in three Commodores earning All-SEC recognition in 2019, including Auston Kim, who became one of the nation's top freshmen, medalist at the NCAA Auburn Regional Championships, and a qualifier for the U.S. Women's Open.

In her first year on campus, Meason helped Allen mentor a young Commodore squad into 2018 NCAA postseason play after the team missed the tournament one year earlier.

Meason, a four-time All-SEC performer, was a mainstay in the Bulldogs' lineup from 2009-13, posting 14 top-10 and 28 top-20 finishes in 43 events played. She was a three-time medalist, securing wins at the 2010 Auburn Invitational, the Commodores' own Mason Rudolph Championship in 2012 and the 2013 Bryan National.

Meason's career-low round of 6-under-par 66 is second all-time at Georgia. She posted that score both in the first round of the 2012 Lady Puerto Rico Classic and in the third round of the 2010 Tiger/Wave Invitational. Meason also owns two of the top-15 season stroke averages in Georgia history. As a junior, she recorded the ninth-best average of 73.28, and as a senior, she posted a stroke average of 73.47, which is 14th on the Bulldogs' all-time list.

Following a brief career competing professionally, Meason regained her amateur status in 2015. She qualified for the U.S. Women's Amateur that summer and also helped Georgia win the USGA's Women's State Team Championship later in the year.

A native of Hoschton, Georgia, Meason was a standout junior who advanced to match play at both the 2008 U.S. Girls' Junior and the 2009 U.S. Women's Amateur and participated in the Canon (now Wyndham) Cup.

Emilie is married to William Meason, who played collegiate golf at Arkansas, and welcomed their son Hudson in 2021.

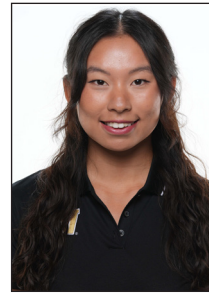
