Series Notes: Alabama and Vanderbilt will meet for the 85th time on Saturday. The Crimson Tide leads the all-time series, 62-18-4, and has won the last 22 contests dating back to 1985. Alabama defeated the Commodores, 59-0, in Nashville in the most recent meeting in 2017 and defeated VU, 34-0, in the last pairing in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 8, 2011. Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 4-0 in his career against Vanderbilt, including a 3-0 mark with the Tide. Second-year Vanderbilt head coach Clark Lea is facing the Tide for the first time in his head coaching career.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM: Alabama has won 63 of the last 65 games at its home stadium following the Crimson Tide's 63-7 win over ULM last Saturday. Alabama boasts the best all-time home winning percentage in the FBS with an .838 (286-54-3) mark at Bryant-Denny Stadium since its opening in 1929. Boise State's Albertsons Stadium (278-60), which opened in 1970, is second at .823, while Oklahoma's Gaylord Family-Oklahoma Memorial Stadium (278-60), which debuted in 1923, ranks third at .818. Georgia Southern's Paulson Stadium (1984) is fourth at .818 (206-46) with Marshall's Joan C. Edwards Stadium (1991) ranking fifth at .813 (174-40). The Crimson Tide is 98-8 (.925) at Bryant-Denny Stadium during Nick Saban's tenure, including an 94-5 (.950) record since the 2008 season.

SABAN'S HOME RECORD: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 156-20 (.886) in home games during his collegiate head coaching career. He owns an advantage at every stop he has made as a college head coach, including a 98-8 (.925) mark while at UA. Following the Crimson Tide's 63-7 win over ULM last Saturday, Saban has won 67 of his last 70 contests at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

SABAN IN SEC HOME OPENERS: Nick Saban is 18-2 (.900) all-time in Southeastern Conference home openers spanning his time at Alabama and LSU. Across his tenure in the SEC, Saban's teams have outscored the opponent by a score of 732-335 (36.6-16.8 ppg). He is 14-1 (.933) at Alabama with the Crimson Tide outscoring foes by a margin of 546-231 (36.4-15.4) mark during his first 15 conference home openers in Tuscaloosa. The Tide's lone loss in an SEC home opener came against Ole Miss on Sept. 19, 2015 by a score of 43-37.

SABAN'S SEC HOME RECORD: Alabama head coach Nick Saban owns a 70-11 (.864) all-time record when playing in a Southeastern Conference game at home, going 16-4 (.800) during his time at LSU and owning a 54-7 (.885) record at Alabama. While with the Crimson Tide, Saban has posted eight perfect home SEC slates (most recently a 4-0 mark in 2021) and has not lost more than one home conference game in any season other than 2007 (two losses). All seven of his losses at home have been by seven points or less with three of those by three or fewer. Under Saban, Alabama has outscored its SEC home opponents 2,225-906 (36.5-14.9 points per game) and has limited the opposition to 14 points or less on 38 occasions, including eight shutout victories.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL: Alabama's No. 2 ranking in the Sept. 18 release of the Associated Press Poll marked the 233rd consecutive week that the Crimson Tide has appeared in the poll. That streak is the longest active streak in college football. The 233 weeks more than triples second-place Georgia with the Bulldogs appearing in the poll for 86 consecutive weeks. Alabama's 233 straight weeks tops the Crimson Tide's previous program-long streak of 71 consecutive weeks under head coach Gene Stallings in the mid-1990s.

ALABAMA IN THE AP SINCE 2008: Alabama began the 2008 season at No. 24 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll. The Crimson Tide opened the year with a dominant 34-10 win over then-No. 9 Clemson in Atlanta, and since that win over the Tigers, UA has not been ranked lower than No. 17 in 231 polls that have followed. According to College Poll Archive, the Tide has now spent 96.5 percent of the 14-plus years ranked in the top 10. A whopping 87.9 percent of that time Alabama has been ranked in the top five. The Crimson Tide has also been ranked No. 1 a total of 108 times since 2008. Only 13 other teams have earned the No. 1 ranking over that time, with the second-most appearances coming from Clemson at 23.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 166 of 169 regular season games that have had national championship implications. The final three games of the 2010 season marked the only three regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 14 seasons.

ALABAMA HAS THE MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 179 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. That total is 20 more than second-place Ohio State, who has totaled 159 wins over that stretch.

SCORING IN ALL KINDS OF WAYS: Alabama scored three non-offensive touchdowns as part of the Tide's 63-7 win over ULM on Sept. 17. The Crimson Tide recorded a pick-six by Will Anderson Jr., a blocked punt for a score from Malachi Moore, and a punt return touchdown by Brian Branch against the Warhawks. The three non-offensive touchdowns were the most by a Tide team since Sept. 17, 2016 at Ole Miss. That game in Oxford saw Eddie Jackson return a punt for six, Da'Ron Payne score on a fumble and Jonathan Allen follow suit with a 75-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown.

NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS IN THE SABAN ERA: Alabama recorded its 87th, 88th and 89th non-offensive touchdowns in the Nick Saban era last weekend against ULM. The Tide first had a pick-six from Will Anderson Jr. followed by a blocked punt return by Malachi Moore. Brian Branch added a third on the day when he returned a punt for a score. Since Saban's arrival in 2007, no team in college football has totaled more non-offensive scores than the Crimson Tide. During Saban's tenure, Alabama recorded a single-season record 15 in 2016, which led the Football Bowl Subdivision and was the most in a season by any FBS team in the last 20 years. The Crimson Tide also scored a non-offensive touchdown in 10 consecutive games dating from to the CFP Semifinal against Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015 to the Texas A&M game on Oct. 22, 2016 for 14 non-offensive touchdowns in that span – four interceptions, four punt returns, five fumble recoveries and a kickoff return.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

RETURNING HEISMAN: Crimson Tide signal-caller Bryce Young returned for his junior season after capturing the Heisman Trophy as a sophomore in 2021. Of Alabama's four Heisman winners, Young is the second to return to the Tide after winning the coveted award, joining Mark Ingram II, who won the 2009 Heisman. Young threw for 4,872 yards, 47 touchdowns and set school records for attempts (547) and completions (366).

RETURNING STARTERS: Alabama returned five starters on the offensive side of the ball in 2022, led by quarterback Bryce Young. The Tide features three returners on the offensive line with center Darrian Dalcourt and guards Emil Ekiyor Jr. and Javion Cohen, while tight end Cameron Latu rounds out the group of starters.

OFFENSIVE PORTAL: The transfer portal has become a big part of college football and Alabama used it to find wide receiver Jameson Williams a year ago. With Williams becoming a first round pick of the Detroit Lions this past offseason, Alabama has welcomed in four transfers on the offensive side of the football for 2022. The group includes receivers Jermaine Burton (Georgia) and Tyler Harrell (Louisville) along with offensive tackle Tyler Steen (Vanderbilt) and running back Jahmyr Gibbs (Georgia Tech).

YOUNG CLIMBING THE CAREER LISTS: Despite being the starter for only 18 games, Bryce Young has made his mark on the Crimson Tide's career passing lists. Below is a look at where Young currently ranks.

ALABAMA IN THE AP RANKINGS

Alabama has been ranked in 844 of the 1,205 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 521-134-8 (.792) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 162-22 (.880) mark under head coach Nick Saban. Alabama is also ranked in the AP poll for the 233rd consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid-1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. The 233 consecutive weeks is the second-longest stretch by any program in the poll's history, trailing only Nebraska's all-time mark of 348 consecutive weeks. Alabama has started nine seasons at No. 1 (2022, 2021, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches' rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 31 seasons (1991-2021) with the AFCA coming on the title sponsor of the poll at the start of the 2021 season. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020 seasons. The Tide has compiled four UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and seven USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) coaches poll national titles.

BRYCE MOVING THE CHAINS AS A RUSHER: Bryce Young has been credited with 15 rushes on the season for 144 net yards. Included in those 15 'rushes' are the four times the junior quarterback has been sacked. On Young's 11 carries where he has tucked the ball and run, he has accounted for six first downs and two touchdowns. He has accumulated 175 combined rushing yards on those 11 carries for an impressive 15.9 yards per carry average.

SIX IN THE OPENER: Alabama quarterback Bryce Young accounted for six total touchdowns in the Crimson Tide's home opener against Utah State on Sept. 3. The junior threw for a career-high tying five touchdowns while also rushing for a score. Young's six touchdowns were the most by a UA signal-caller since Tua Tagovailoa's school-record seven scores against Ole Miss on Sept. 28, 2019. In that game, Tagovailoa finished with six passing touchdowns while also rushing for one against the Rebels.

YOUNG USING HIS LEGS, TOO: Bryce Young not only threw for five touchdowns against Utah State on Sept. 3, but he also rushed for one score. The touchdown on the ground was part of Young's five carries for a team-high 100 rushing yards. He became the first Alabama quarterback to eclipse the 100-yard rushing mark since Jalen Hurts against Ole Miss on Sept. 30, 2017. Hurts carried the ball 10 times for 101 yards and a touchdown in that matchup.

BRYCE AGAINST THE BEST: Quarterback Bryce Young elevated his game each time a ranked team appeared on the Crimson Tide's schedule a season ago. In six games against teams ranked in the final iteration of the College Football Playoff Top 25, Young posted an NCAA passer rating of 157.56 with an NFL rating of 107.36. He threw for 2,140 yards in those six games, which averaged out to 356.7 yards per game, with 17 touchdowns and just five interceptions. Young averaged 8.8 yards per attempt in those six games while completing 64.6 percent of his passes (157-243).

BRYCE AGAINST THE BEST DEFENSES: In 2021, Bryce Young's passing numbers came against some of the best pass defenses in the nation. In seven games against the nation's top 50 pass defenses (then-No. 1 Georgia, then-No. 2 Georgia, then-No. 4 Cincinnati, then-No. 9 Texas A&M, then-No. 39 Florida, then-No. 40 Ole Miss, then-No. 50 Tennessee), Young accounted for 2,192 yards (313.1 ypg), 17 touchdowns, just five interceptions and a completion percentage of 63.7.

DO IT ALL, JAHMYR GIBBS: Although Jahmyr Gibbs is listed as a running back, the junior transfer has proven valuable to the Alabama offense as a pass-catcher as well. He currently leads the Tide in receptions with 14 through his first three games while adding a team-high 22 rushes for 151 yards. Gibbs has led the Tide in rushing attempts in two of the first three games while pacing the wideouts in catches in two contests.

LEADING THE WRs IN AUSTIN: Jahmyr Gibbs recorded nine receptions for 74 yards at Texas on Sept. 10 to lead UA in both categories. His nine catches are the most by an Alabama tailback during the Saban era, topping the previous high of seven by Najee Harris against Ohio State in the 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship. They are also the most receptions by any pass-catcher in a game since John Metchie III had 13 at Auburn on Nov. 27 of last season, a game that went into four overtime periods. A week prior to that, Metchie III totaled 10 receptions against Arkansas in a four-quarter game with the Hogs.

GIBBS STARTING HOT: Running back Jahmyr Gibbs made an instant impact for Alabama in his first career start on Sept. 3 against Utah State. The junior finished with nine rushes for 93 yards for an average of 10.3 yards per carry while adding one reception for five yards. Gibbs' 10.3 yards per carry average is the highest by a Tide back in his debut since Siran Stacy averaged 12.1 ypc in his UA debut on Sept. 16, 1989. Stacy carried 14 times for 169 yards and four touchdowns against Memphis as a junior.

THE TRANSITION TO TIGHT END: Cameron Latu transitioned from defensive end to tight end after his redshirt season at the Capstone and worked his way into the Crimson Tide's starting tight end spot in 2021. In 15 games, including 14 starts last season, Latu had 26 receptions for 410 yards, an average of 15.8 yards per catch, and tied for second on UA with eight receiving touchdowns. His patience in transition paid off in the final game of the season against then-No. 3/3 Georgia in the CFP National Championship Game on Jan. 10. The Salt Lake City, Utah, native, set the record for the most receiving touchdowns by a tight end in a single season in school history (8), after he hauled in a three-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Bryce Young in the fourth quarter. He trumped tight end Irv Smith Jr.'s seven touchdown receptions in 2018.

500+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama has recorded 500-plus yards of total offense 50 times in the last 103 games (dating to the start of the 2015 season), including seven instances in 2021 and against Utah State and ULM during the 2022 campaign. Alabama went over the 500-yard marker in eight of 13 games during the 2020 national championship run and nine of 13 total contests in 2019. The 2018 roster set the Alabama single-season record with 500-or-more yards in 12 of 15 games.

400+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama has gained 400-plus yards of total offense in 53 of its last 59 games, a stretch that began on Sept. 1, 2018 in the season opener against Louisville. The only six instances in which the Crimson Tide did not eclipse the 400-plus yards of total offense mark during that span was against Tennessee on Oct. 19, 2019 (373), at then-No. 11/9 Florida on Sept. 18, 2021 (331), against LSU on Nov. 6, 2021 (308), at Auburn on Nov. 27, 2021 (388), against then-No. 3/3/3 Georgia in the CFP National Championship Game on Jan. 10, 2022 (399) and at Texas on Sept. 10 of this season (374). Alabama is 5-1 in those six games.

30-OR-MORE IN 51 OF THE LAST 59: Alabama's offense has scored 30-or-more points in 51 of the last 59 games (dating back to the start of the 2018 season). Included in that stretch is a streak of 34 consecutive games with 30-plus points that set the FBS record. The Crimson Tide's streak started with a 42-3 win over Duke on Aug. 31, 2019 and ended with a 20-14 win over LSU on Nov. 6, 2021. UCF previously held the record of scoring 30-or-more points in 31 straight games from 2017-19.

40-OR-MORE SINCE 2018: Alabama has scored 40-or-more points in 42 of the last 59 games. Forty-two leads the nation for scoring 40-or-more points since the start of the 2018 season. Ohio State has the second-most instances of scoring 40-or-more points in that time frame (34-of-53), while Oklahoma follows in third (32-of-55).

OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS: The Crimson Tide has won 49 of its last 50 games when scoring a touchdown on the first offensive possession of the game. The most recent instance came against ULM on Sept. 17 when Bryce Young found Traeshon Holden for a 33-yard touchdown. The Tide's lone loss when scoring a touchdown on the opening drive during that stretch came at Texas A&M on Oct. 9.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: Alabama extended its school record for consecutive games with a score to 286 thanks to Traeshon Holden's 33-yard touchdown reception on the first possession of last Saturday's non-conference pairing with ULM. The Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama owns a 229-57 (.801) record over the course of the current streak.

BALL PROTECTION: In the last 197 games (dating back to the start of the 2008 season), Alabama has turned the ball over only 209 times (112 fumbles, 97 interceptions) for 1.06 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 191 times in 184 games (1.04/game). The 191 turnovers since 2009 includes 78 interceptions in 4,918 attempts (1 INT every 63.1 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 31 lost fumbles in 4,908 carries (one fumble lost every 158.3 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

SEVEN RETURNERS ON DEFENSE: Alabama returned seven starters on the defensive side of the football in 2022. Junior linebacker Will Anderson Jr. headlines the group after taking home the Bronko Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defender and registering 34.5 tackles for loss and 17.5 sacks as a sophomore. The Tide's defensive front also welcomed back linemen DJ Dale and Byron Young while the linebacker corps returned Mike linebacker Henry To'oTo'o (113 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks). The secondary sees safety Jordan Battle back for his senior year after leading the team with three interceptions while recording 86 tackles and three pass breakups. Fellow senior safety DeMarcco Hellams is also back and joins the versatile Brian Branch in the Tide's veteran defensive backfield.

DEFENSIVE PORTAL: The transfer portal has become a part of college football and Alabama found linebacker Henry To'oTo'o. The Tennessee transfer called the Tide defense and led them in tackles with 113. Alabama added one player from the portal to the defense in 2022, welcoming former LSU cornerback Eli Ricks, who was a freshman All-American in 2020.

HISTORIC PACE FOR ANDERSON JR.: Will Anderson Jr. not only led the country in tackles for loss and sacks in 2021 but put himself on a historic pace compared to past Alabama greats. Derrick Thomas' career sack numbers have always seemed unreachable in today's game of football, but Anderson Jr. is doing his best to keep pace. In 31 career games, Anderson Jr. has 26.5 sacks, which averages out to .86 sacks per game. Thomas finished his Alabama career with 52 sacks in 49 career games, a ratio of 1.06 sacks per game. For comparison, Jonathan Allen and Kindal Moorehead rank second and third in career sacks, respectively. Their sacks-per-game ratio were .50 for Allen and .52 for Moorehead. Anderson Jr. is actually averaging more tackles per loss per game (1.60 or 49.5 in 31 games) than Thomas did (1.39 or 68 in 49 games).

THE TERMINATOR: Will Anderson Jr. led the nation in 2021 with 17.5 sacks and 34.5 tackles for loss (an NCAA record since 2000). Those impressive numbers placed Anderson Jr. second on Alabama's single-season tackles for loss list behind only Derrick Thomas (1988 - 39.0) while he was third on UA's single-season sacks list, trailing Thomas once again (1988 - 27.0 and 1987 - 18.0). Those numbers, paired with his 10.5 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks from 2020, moved him into the top five of both career lists for the Crimson Tide. Below is a look at where reigning Nagurski Trophy winner ranks heading to this weekend.

ANDERSON JR. IN 2021: Linebacker Will Anderson Jr. recorded at least one tackle for loss in 13-of-15 games in 2021, while posting a career-high 4.0 (-35 yards) at Mississippi State on Oct. 16 and against LSU (-13 yards) on Nov. 6. He recorded sacks in 11 of the Tide's 15 games last season and had at least 1.5 sacks in four straight contests starting with the Mississippi State matchup on Oct. 16 and ending with the New Mexico State contest on Nov. 6. His four sacks at Mississippi State on Oct. 16 matched Derrick Thomas for the second-most in a game in school history (Thomas also had a five-sack game).

GETTING DEFENSIVE: The Alabama defense is quietly putting together an excellent start to the 2022 season. The Crimson Tide rank seventh nationally in total defense (225.3 ypg), eighth in passing yards allowed (146.7 ypg), ninth in scoring defense (8.7 ppg), 16th in rush defense (78.7 ypg) and 17th in pass efficiency defense (97.45). UA is also eighth in third-down conversion defense (21.7 percent) and 10th in defensive touchdowns (1).

KEEPING THE GROUND GAME IN-CHECK: The Crimson Tide defense limited ULM to only 78 yards rushing in last Saturday's contest. Prior to the matchup with the Warhawks, UA held both Texas and Utah State to 79 rushing yards apiece. Alabama's defensive unit has limited 13 of its last 18 opponents (dating back to the 2021 season) to less than 100 yards rushing. The impressive stretch comes after the 2020 campaign that saw seven opponents go over 100-plus and the 2019 season where 11 opponents eclipsed the 100-yard marker. Both the 2020 and 2019 schedules were 13 games long.

NO-FLY ZONE: Alabama opponents are averaging 146.7 passing yards per game and have not recorded a passing touchdown entering the Vanderbilt game. The Tide defense has limited two of its three opponents this season to less than 100 yards passing, including 91 by ULM last weekend and 57 for Utah State in the season opener on Sept. 3. The 57 yards by the Aggies were the fewest passing yards in a game by a Tide opponent since Nov. 16, 2019, when Mississippi State threw for only 82 yards. The 57 yards allowed to USU were the fewest in a game since Nov. 17, 2018, when the Citadel did not record a single passing yard. The Bulldogs attempted two passes in that matchup.

3-AND-OUT: The Alabama defense has forced a 3-and-out on 18-of-37 drives this season (does not include drives at the end of either half of less than three plays). That includes eight 3-and-outs against ULM and seven in the Utah State matchup. The Tide had just three 3-and-outs at Texas but added two more drives that lasted three-plus plays and finished with less than 10 yards.

THIRD DOWN DEFENSE: The Crimson Tide rank eighth nationally and second in the SEC in third-down conversion defense at 21.7 percent (10-of-46). Alabama allowed only three third down conversions in the season opener (17 tries) and then surrendered just three more conversions on 12 attempts at Texas. ULM converted four third down attempts last Saturday on 17 total tries.

TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS: Alabama has forced at least one turnover in 93 of the last 103 contests (dating back to the start of the 2015 season). During the current run, Alabama has forced 164 turnovers (107 interceptions, 57 fumbles) and returned 39 of those miscues for touchdowns.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: Alabama's defense limited ULM to 169 yards of total offense on Sept. 17. That impressive effort marked the 57th time in the last 197 games (since the start of the 2008 season) that the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposition to fewer than 200 yards of total offense.

SHUTOUTS SINCE 2007: Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, Alabama has recorded 25 shutouts, including 12 in Southeastern Conference play. With its 55-0 win over Utah State on Sept. 3, the Crimson Tide defense has 11 more shutouts than its nearest competitor over that span. Ranking second in shutouts during that time is Ohio State with 14.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no team has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 311 touchdowns over the last 184 games. That is 53 fewer than the second most in the nation (Wisconsin with 364).

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama's defense has been a force in the run game since head coach Nick Saban's arrival on campus. More recently, the Crimson Tide gave up just 67 rushing scores in the last 103 games (dating to the start of the 2015 season). The Tide defense led the nation in 2016 with five rushing touchdowns allowed, one year after giving up just seven rushing scores through 15 games in 2015, the second-lowest total in the country. Since Saban arrived in 2007, UA has allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns in the nation at 125, a total that is 43 fewer than second-place Iowa.

RUSHING DEFENSE: UA has surrendered only 29 individual 100-yard rushing performances dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that is the fewest in the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival in 2007, the Tide has allowed 24 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game.

10 POINTS OR LESS: Alabama's trademark has been its defense ever since head coach Nick Saban's arrival on campus. Since that first season in Tuscaloosa, Saban-coached defenses have held the Crimson Tide's opponents to 10 points or less on 99 occasions. Dating back to the start of the 2015 season, UA's defense has limited the opposition to 10 or fewer points 43 times across 102 total contests.

AGGIES HELD UNDER 10: Alabama's defensive unit allowed Utah State to record only seven first downs in the season opener on Sept. 3. The seven first downs allowed were the fewest by a Crimson Tide defense since Nov. 10, 2018, when Mississippi State had just six.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

REICHARD FOR THE WIN: Will Reichard went right down the middle from 33 yards out for the game-winning field goal at Texas on Sept. 10. That game-winner in the final 30 seconds of a game was the first during the Nick Saban era and first such win since the 2005 season. Jamie Christensen hit a 45-yard field goal as time expired to help Alabama take down Texas Tech, 13-10, in the Cotton Bowl on Jan. 2, 2006.

50-PLUS FOR REICHARD: The first points of the day at Texas on Sept. 10 came by way of a 52-yard field goal by Will Reichard. The 52-yarder tied Reichard's career long, matching his kick against Georgia on Oct. 17, 2020. For his career, Reichard has hit three times from 50-plus, also adding a 51-yarder against Miami in in the 2021 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic on Sept. 4 of last season.

PATs FOR REICHARD: Senior Will Reichard owns the Crimson Tide's all-time record for made PATs. The senior recorded nine PATs against ULM on Sept. 17 to move past the former record of 186 (188 attempts) by Adam Griffith from 2013-16. Entering this weekend's contest with Vanderbilt, Reichard has made 194-of-196 PATs for his career.

REICHARD MOVING UP THE CAREER LISTS: Placekicker Will Reichard has been a consistent presence in the kicking game for Alabama during his time at the Capstone. Reichard has made 44 field goals for his career and has totaled 326 kicking points. Both numbers have placed Reichard on the top-10 lists for Crimson Tide kickers. Below is a look at where Reichard currently ranks.

RACKING UP RETURN YARDS: Alabama's punt returners accumulated 262 yards against ULM on Sept. 17. The 262 yards broke a 75-year-old school record of 204 which was set on Nov. 22, 1947. It was 64 more punt return yards than the Tide totaled in 15 games during the 2021 season. Last year, JoJo Earle (88 yards) and Slade Bolden (87 yards) led the Tide in punt return yards. Against ULM, Kool-Aid McKinstry recorded 136 punt return yards while Brian Branch added 68 yards and a touchdown. The Tide also ranks eighth nationally in yards per punt return with 21.5.

KOOL-AID vs. ULM: Sophomore Kool-Aid McKinstry has taken on the Tide's punt returner role so far in 2022. He excelled in that role against ULM on Sept. 17, recording 136 yards on five punts for an average of 27.2 yards per return. The 136 yards are the third-most in a game in program history, trailing only Javier Arenas who set the school record with 153 against Tulane (Sept. 6, 2008) and owns the No. 2 spot with 147 in a matchup with Mississippi State (Nov. 15, 2008).

BRANCH FOR SIX: Brian Branch made it count when he recorded his first career punt return against ULM on Sept. 17, taking the ball 68 yards for a touchdown. It was the first punt return for a score by a Crimson Tide player since DeVonta Smith at Arkansas on Dec. 12, 2020.

SERIES NOTES

THE ALABAMA-VANDERBILT SERIES: Alabama and Vanderbilt will meet for the 85th time on Saturday. The Crimson Tide leads the all-time series, 62-18-4 (60-19-4 NCAA), and has won the last 22 contests dating back to 1985. Alabama defeated the Commodores, 34-0, in the most recent game between the two teams at Bryant-Denny Stadium on Oct. 8, 2011 and is 31-6-2 (30-6-2 NCAA) all-time against the 'Dores in Tuscaloosa. The Tide is currently riding a 10-game winning streak over the Commodores at home with the last loss coming in 1984.

Alabama posted a 24-10 victory over the 'Dores in on Sept. 8, 2007 in Nashville in Saban's initial season in Tuscaloosa before earning a 34-0 win on Oct. 8, 2011 in Tuscaloosa. The most recent pairing saw UA down VU, 59-0, in Nashville on Sept. 23, 2017.

STEEN TO FACE HIS OLD SCHOOL: Alabama's starting left tackle Tyler Steen is set to face off with his former school this weekend when Vanderbilt comes to town. Steen was at Vandy from 2018-21, playing in 38 total games with 33 consecutive starts to close out his career in Nashville. Of those 33 starts, 21 came at left tackle across his junior and senior seasons.

GENERAL NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past 15 seasons under Nick Saban has coincided with the Tide's success in the classroom. The 2022 squad is no exception as the Crimson Tide will enter the season with 14 student-athletes who already have their degrees in hand and will wear an SEC Graduate patch on their jersey. The list of graduates includes Bret Bolin, Darrian Dalcourt, DJ Dale, Justin Eboigbe, Emil Ekiyor Jr., Tyler Harrell, Amari Kight, Cameron Latu, Seth McLaughlin, Jaylen Moody, Kendall Randolph, Will Reichard, Jackson Roby and Tyler Steen. Since Saban's arrival in 2007, Alabama football has seen a total of 627 degrees earned, including 99 master's.

CHAMPIONS IN THE CLASSROOM: Alabama's achievements in the classroom have been most impressive during national title seasons. Those six squads (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) included 139 student-athletes who had earned their degrees prior to game time. Last season, a total of 18 graduates suited up for UA in the College Football Playoff Semifinal against Cincinnati while the 2020 squad featured an NCAA-leading 25 graduates on its roster entering bowl season.

NEW HIRES: Saban's 2022 coaching staff features four new faces including Joe Cox (tight ends), Coleman Hutzler (special teams/outside linebackers), Travaris Robinson (cornerbacks) and Eric Wolford (offensive line).

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama's matchup with Vanderbilt on SEC Network will be the Tide's 463rd televised game. Alabama has compiled a 320-138-4 (.697) all-time record in televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed-circuit telecasts).

182 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 196 GAMES: Alabama's contest in Tuscaloosa against Vanderbilt will be the Tide's 182nd nationally televised game since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of 2014.

164-9 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama is 164-9 (.948) when leading at the half. UA is also 148-4 (.974) when leading by seven or more points at the break during the Saban era. The Crimson Tide has held the lead at the half in 82 of its last 103 games (dating back to the start of the 2015 season).

SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST: Alabama head coach Nick Saban's 142 conference wins (including SEC championship games) are second on the SEC career conference wins list. Saban ranks first in league history in SEC regular season winning percentage at .830 (142-29). He is also second in SEC history in winning percentage in all games at .849 (230-41). Additionally, Saban is second on the league's career wins list at 230 victories.

SABAN vs. AP TOP 25: The Crimson Tide's 27-6 win over then-No. 4 Cincinnati on Dec. 31 of last season was Nick Saban's 96th career win, and 73rd at Alabama, against the Associated Press Top 25. Saban moved past Joe Paterno (86) for the most career wins against the AP Top 25 when he defeated then-No. 22 Auburn on Nov. 28, 2020. The late Florida State legend Bobby Bowden ranks third all-time (82), while Alabama's Paul "Bear" Bryant is fourth (66). Former Duke, Florida and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier is fifth (64). Saban's winning percentage against AP ranked teams (96-44, .886) tops Bryant (.592), Bowden (.557), Spurrier (.529) and Paterno (.512).

SABAN AT NO. 1: Alabama head coach Nick Saban has coached the most games as the Associated Press Poll's No. 1 team among active head coaches. Following the Sept. 10 victory in Austin over Texas, Saban has coached 97 games as the nation's top-ranked team, which is 76 more games than second-place Dabo Swinney, who has totaled 21 games at No. 1. The third coach on the list is Texas A&M's Jimbo Fisher who coached 10, all coming during the 2013-14 seasons at Florida State.

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 72-18 (.800) against the Associated Press Top 25 since the start of 2008. Alabama finished 6-1 against AP Top 25 teams last season, including wins against then-No. 14 Miami (44-13) on Sept. 4; at then-No. 11 Florida (31-29) on Sept. 18; over then-No. 12 Ole Miss (42-21) on Oct. 2; against then-No. 21 Arkansas (42-35) on Nov. 20; over then-No. 1 Georgia (41-24) at the 2021 SEC Championship Game; and a victory against then-No. 4/4/4 Cincinnati (27-6) at the CFP Semifinal at the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Crimson Tide's lone loss against an AP Top 25 team last season came against then-No. 3/3/3 Georgia, 33-18, in the CFP National Championship Game at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind., on Jan. 10.

MORE THAN A DECADE AT NO. 1: With Alabama's Aug. 15 preseason ranking at No. 1, the Crimson Tide has been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll at least once each season since 2008. The 15-year streak is the longest by any program and coach in the history of the AP rankings. The previous long streak by any one team was seven seasons by Miami (Fla.) from 1986-92. The previous streak by one coach is six straight seasons, which was accomplished by Frank Leahy at Notre Dame in 1943 and continued from 1946-50 following an absence while Leahy served in the Navy.

DOMINATING THE AP TOP 25: Alabama's win over then-No. 14 Miami in the 2021 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game last season was head coach Nick Saban's 22nd career win by 25-plus points against a ranked opponent. Saban is the all-time leader for the most wins by 25-plus points in the Associated Press Poll era (since 1936), passing Bobby Bowden's previous record of 20. Saban is also the NCAA record holder with 24 career wins of 20-plus points against AP top-15 opponents, including Alabama's 27-6 win against No. 4 Cincinnati in the College Football Playoff Semifinal at the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic on Dec. 31. An astounding 21 of Saban's 24 career 20-plus point wins against AP top-15 opponents have come at the Capstone.

AGAINST THE TOP 10: Alabama owns an 84-78-1 all-time record against teams ranked in the top-10 of the Associated Press poll. Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 35-12 (.745) overall record against top-10 teams, including a 20-6 (.769) mark versus the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff. In Saban's six national championship seasons at Alabama, his teams have gone 18-2 (.900) against top-10 opponents.

SABAN LEADS IN WINS vs. TOP-FIVE TEAMS: Alabama's 27-6 win over No. 4 Cincinnati in the 2021 College Football Playoff Semifinal at the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic on Dec. 31 was Nick Saban's 29th career victory against a team ranked in the top five of the Associated Press Top 25 Poll, the most in college football history. Saban's 29-15 career record in top-five contests gives him a .659 winning percentage, which is also college football's best. Following Saban on the all-time victory list are Bobby Bowden (18/378 winning percentage), Barry Switzer (15/516), Woody Hayes (15/516), Steve Spurrier (15/429) and Lou Holtz (15/419). Saban's record includes nine wins in the College Football Playoff: No. 3 Michigan State (38-0) and No. 1 Clemson (45-40) in 2015; No. 4 Washington (24-7) in 2016; No. 1 Clemson (24-6) and No. 3 Georgia (26-23) in 2017; No. 4 Oklahoma (45-34) in 2018; No. 4 Notre Dame (31-14) and No. 3 Ohio State (52-24) in 2020; and No. 4 Cincinnati (27-6) in 2021. Alabama also went 3-0 in BCS National Championship Games (vs. Texas, 37-21, 2009; vs. LSU, 21-0, 2011; vs. Notre Dame, 42-14, 2012).

SABAN vs. AP TOP 25 IN TRUE ROAD GAMES: With Alabama's win over then-No. 11 Florida on Sept. 18 of last season, head coach Nick Saban ranks third in all-time for road wins against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 with 25 victories. Bobby Bowden is the all-time leader (33), followed by Joe Paterno (27).

50-PLUS vs. RANKED OPPONENTS: Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama has posted 50-plus points against Associated Press Top 25 teams on seven occasions, while three of those seven occasions came in 2020. The most recent instance came on Jan. 11, 2021 at the College Football Playoff National Championship Game when the Crimson Tide defeated then-No. 3/3/3 Ohio State, 52-24. SABAN vs. NON-CONFERENCE FOES: Alabama head coach Nick Saban has only two losses to non-conference opponents during the regular season, both of which came in 2007 (21-14 vs. Florida State [in Jacksonville] and 21-14 vs. ULM). Under his direction, the Crimson Tide currently holds a 54-game winning streak against non-conference foes in the regular season, including a 40-game home winning streak at Bryant-Denny Stadium as part of a 42-1 mark at home. Saban owns a 100-20 (.833) career record against non-conference opponents in the regular season and postseason across his four stops as a collegiate head coach. His record against non-conference opponents in both the regular season and postseason at the Capstone is 69-7 (.908).

TOUGH TO GET SABAN'S TIDE TWICE: During his tenure at Alabama, head coach Nick Saban has suffered 25 total losses. Of those 25 losses, the Crimson Tide and Saban have had the opportunity to face the team that beat them at a later date on 21 occasions. In those 21 rematches, Alabama owns a 19-2 mark when avenging its previous loss. The only two times the Crimson Tide has fallen in back-to-back games against the same opponent is LSU (2010-11) and Ole Miss (2014-15). The Tide will square off with Texas A&M on Oct. 8 in Tuscaloosa, seeking a win after last season's last-second loss in Bryan-College Station. Alabama has not yet had the opportunity to bounce back from a loss against Clemson (2018), Utah (2009) and Georgia (2021).

SIX RINGS IN 12 SEASONS: The Crimson Tide's win in the 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship Game helped Alabama claim its sixth national title in 12 seasons, making UA the first team in the Associated Press Poll era (since 1936) to win six championships over a 12-season span. The only other team in college football history to win six titles in a quarter of a century or less was also Alabama, coming across a 19-season stretch from 1961-79.

THREE DECADES OF SABAN: Alabama head coach Nick Saban has claimed six national titles during his time with the Crimson Tide and seven across his collegiate head coaching career. With Alabama's win in the 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship Game, Saban became the first head coach to win an Associated Press/Coaches Poll National Championship in three different decades - the 2000s, the 2010s and the 2020s. Saban's first national championship came in 2003 at LSU, six seasons before he came to Tuscaloosa and captured the crown in 2009. The 2010s saw Saban win national titles in 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017, while his most recent one came on Jan. 11, 2021.

SIGN WITH THE TIDE, LEAVE WITH A RING: Since Nick Saban's arrival at Alabama in 2007, members of each one of his recruiting classes have won at least one national championship. The 2009 class tops the list with three to their name while the 2008, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015 and 2017 classes each achieved two national titles during their time in Tuscaloosa. The 2007, 2013, 2016, 2018, 2019 and 2020 classes can each claim one national title with the latter group still having time to add to that number.

BAMA IN THE NFL NOTES

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 14 drafts (113) than any other program in the nation. An impressive 41 of those picks have been first-round selections. The list of 113 features 12 Super Bowl champions, 27 Pro Bowl selections, 14 First Team All-Pro members and one Offensive Rookie of the Year. The 2022 Draft featured seven former Alabama standouts that heard their name called across the three-day event, including first-rounders Evan Neal (New York Giants) and Jameson Williams (Detroit Lions).

2022 NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw seven former players selected in the 2022 NFL Draft, including two first-round picks in tackle Evan Neal (No. 7, New York Giants) and wide receiver Jameson Williams (No. 12, Detroit Lions). Wideout John Metchie III (Houston Texans) and defensive lineman Phidarian Mathis (Washington Commanders) were each taken in the second round with third-rounders in linebacker Christian Harris (Houston) and running back Brian Robinson Jr. (Washington) closing out day two. Defensive back Jalyn Armour-Davis rounded out the group of seven, going in the fourth round (Baltimore Ravens). Alabama has now produced multiple first-round picks in 11 of the last 14 NFL Drafts with single first-round selections in 2009, 2015 and 2016.

SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS: Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban has produced the most first rounders of any NCAA Division I head coach with 46 players chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 41 while at Alabama. The Crimson Tide's two first-round selections in the 2022 NFL Draft extended Saban's all-time mark, producing 13 more first-rounders than second-place Joe Paterno (33). After the 2021 NFL Draft, Alabama became the first school in the modern draft era to have four wide receivers drafted in the first round in a two-year span (2020 – Henry Ruggs III, Jerry Jeudy; 2021 – DeVonta Smith, Jaylen Waddle) and one of just two schools (Oklahoma) to have quarterbacks selected in the first round in back-to-back years (2020 – Tua Tagovailoa; 2021 – Mac Jones). With the first-round selection of Tagovailoa in the 2020 NFL Draft, Saban has produced at least one first-rounder at every starting position on offense and defense during his illustrious collegiate head coaching career.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE NFL: Alabama entered Week 1 of the 2022-23 NFL season with a league-leading 58 players on active 53-man rosters. In total, the Crimson Tide currently has 72 players on an NFL roster (including reserve/practice squad). The Crimson Tide is represented on 29 of the NFL's 32 teams with only the Buffalo Bills, Kansas City Chiefs and San Francisco 49ers not currently rostering a former UA player. Below is a look at where former Crimson Tide standouts are currently playing.

• Saban has compiled a 277-67-1 (.804) record as a college head coach. He has claimed seven national championships — six at Alabama — 11 conference championships and 22 of his teams will have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff Semifinals in seven of the last eight seasons including six of the last seven CFP National Championship Games.

• Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships, the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships and the only coach to win three CFP National Championships. He has won seven titles in his last 17 years coaching college football, most recently capturing the CFP National Championship following the 2020 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years (2009, 2011-12). His title in 2020 moved him past Paul "Bear" Bryant for the most national championships in the poll era with seven.

• In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. Saban made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He took down Clemson, 45-40, to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game and took home his sixth national championship - and fifth at Alabama - in 2017 with a 26-23 overtime win over Georgia in the 2018 CFP National Championship Game. Saban's most recent title came in dominating fashion as the Crimson Tide defeated Ohio State, 52-24, in the 2021 CFP National Championship Game in Miami Gardens, Fla.

• In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

• A five-season run at LSU (2000-04) produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships and three SEC West Division championships. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America.

• Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach, including four postseason appearances. In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season.

• Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points) and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

• A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and one grandson, James.

• At Michigan State, the Sabans started the Nick's Kids Foundation, which is dedicated to raising awareness for deserving organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the southeast. Thanks to the generosity of the donors and the efforts of Nick and Terry Saban, the Nick's Kids Foundation has donated over \$10 million dollars to many deserving organizations and causes since arriving in Tuscaloosa.

• Personally, Nick and Terry have given over \$1 million dollars to their First Generation Scholarship at The University of Alabama and have pledged \$1 million dollars to The Crimson Standard Initiative. They have also made major contributions to their church, St. Francis Catholic Church, to build the Saban Catholic Student Center that was completed in August of 2016. Their most recent project is the Saban Center.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Alabama junior quarterback Bryce Young combined for 295 yards of total offense and six touchdowns to lead the top-ranked Crimson Tide past Utah State, 55-0, in front of 98,321 fans at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Tide opened the season with a win for the 16th straight year under head coach Nick Saban.

Young finished the night with a team-leading and career-high 100 yards rushing (five rushes) while throwing for an additional 195 yards on 18-of-28 passing with five touchdowns. Running back Jahmyr Gibbs also played well in his Crimson Tide debut, finishing with 93 yards on nine carries. Juniors Traeshon Holden (five catches, 70 yards, two touchdowns) and Jermaine Burton (five catches, 35 yards, two touchdowns) combined for 10 receptions, 125 yards and four touchdowns to lead the aerial attack.

Redshirt senior Jaylen Moody paced all Tide defenders with five tackles, including one for loss and one quarterback hurry. In all, Alabama's defense accounted for five tackles for loss, four quarterback hurries and a forced fumble on the way to the team's first shutout in a season opener in 34 years.

The shutout victory marked the first time in 34 years that Alabama has opened the season without allowing a point to its opponent (defeated Temple, 37-0 on Sept. 10, 1988). Additionally, the 55-point margin is the largest margin of victory in a season opener in the Saban-era.

AUSTIN, Texas — Alabama pulled out a 20-19 win over Texas at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium in Austin, Texas, on the strength of a 33-yard field goal by kicker Will Reichard with 10 seconds left on the game clock.

Reichard's effort as time wound down marked the first game-winning field goal in the last 30-seconds of a game for Alabama during the Nick Saban era - and first such win since the finale of the 2005 campaign. Reichard opened the scoring in the first quarter with a 52-yard field goal, which matched his career long.

After trading scores in the first half, resulting in a 10-10 tie going into the break, Texas hit three field goals in the second half, while the Tide responded with a touchdown and Reichard's game winner, both in the fourth quarter.

Running back Jase McClellan led all rushers with 97 yards on six carries, including an electrifying 81-yard touchdown in the first quarter. Running back Jahmyr Gibbs led the Tide with 74 receiving yards on nine catches, including a seven-yard touchdown catch from quarterback Bryce Young in the middle of the fourth quarter. Young went 27-of-39 for 213 yards and a touchdown while adding 38 rushing yards on seven carries.

Defensive back DeMarcco Hellams led the Tide defense with 10 tackles, including eight solo stops, while linebacker Jaylen Moody, defensive back Kool-Aid McKinstry and linebacker Will Anderson Jr. all recorded sacks on the day.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. – Alabama scored three non-offensive touchdowns and broke a 75-year-old school record for punt return yards with 262 in the Crimson Tide's 63-7 victory over ULM inside Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Quarterback Bryce Young threw for 236 yards and three touchdowns on 13-of-18 passing to help the Crimson Tide compile 509 yards of total offense on the day.

The Alabama ground game combined for 273 yards on 39 carries with four running backs rushing for 40-plus yards. Running back Roydeil Williams led the way with eight carries for 58 yards and a touchdown. Fellow running back Jahmyr Gibbs led the Tide in receiving yardage, totaling 65 yards and a touchdown on four grabs.

Defensive back DeMarcco Hellams led the Tide defense with nine tackles. Linebacker Henry To'oTo'o finished with eight tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack, while linebacker Will Anderson Jr. added five tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, one sack and his first career interception return for a touchdown.

The Crimson Tide broke a 75-year-old school record by accounting for 262 total punt return yards – a record that was originally set on Nov. 22, 1947 when the Tide combined for 204 yards in a win over LSU. Kool-Aid McKinstry led the way after fielding five punts for 136 yards, the third-highest in a game in program history, trailing Javier Arenas who set the school record with 153 yards vs. Tulane (9/6/08) and has the second most with 147 against Mississippi State (11/15/08).
