WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Saturday will mark the 97th meeting between Ole Miss and Vanderbilt dating back to 1894.
- It is the third-most played series all-time between Ole Miss and its 2022 opponents (Mississippi State, LSU).
- The Rebels lead the series 52-40-2 overall ... The original record vs. the Commodores is 54-40-2, with wins in 2013 and 2014 by Ole Miss vacated due to NCAA ruling.
- 1962 was the last time Ole Miss started 5-0 and didn't have to vacate any of its wins.
- The Rebels are ranked No. 9 in both the AP Poll and the AFCA Coaches Poll.
- Ole Miss has forced a turnover in 25 of the 28 games during the **Lane Kiffin** era.
- The Rebels rank No. 10 in the FBS in team coverage with a Pro Football Focus grade of 91.5.
- 56 of the 125 players (45 percent) on the Rebel roster are newcomers and are in their first season at Ole Miss.
- The Rebels are second in the SEC and No. 13 in FBS with 3.2 sacks per game.
- Ole Miss has had a 100-yard rusher in five straight games for the first time since 1999.
- The Rebels are one of just three teams (Duke, Kansas & Ole Miss) to have three players with four or more rushing TDs.
- Ole Miss has blocked three kicks (2 punts, 1 PAT) this season through just five games, the most by a Rebel team since 2015.
- Through just five games, RB **Quinshon Judkins** has the most rushing touchdowns (6) in a season by any SEC freshman since 2019.
- Judkins ranks No. 12 nationally and leads all freshman with 107.0 rushing yards per game.
- WR **Jonathan Mingo** is No. 2 in the SEC and No. 19 in FBS in yards per reception (20.0).

Lane Kiffin is the fastest coach to reach 20 wins (28 games) at Ole Miss since Johnny Vaught began his Rebel career 20-7-1 over the course of 28 games (1947-49).

Quinshon Judkins has rushed for 535 yards this season, the most by any Ole Miss freshman in the first five games of the season since at least 1976.

The Ole Miss defense ranks No. 7 in the FBS allowing just 11.8 points per game. It's the fewest points allowed through the first five games by the Rebels since 2014.

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at 11:45 a.m. CT. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will be first, followed by head football coach Lane Kiffin at noon. The press conference is streamed live on SEC Network+ (ESPN App). Players will follow Coach Kiffin at the Monday press conference. Select players will be also available at approximately noon on Tuesday, while Coach Kiffin will be available Wednesday on the SEC teleconference (noon). There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change.

SEC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE: Coach Kiffin will be available on the weekly Southeastern Conference teleconference every Wednesday, beginning week one and concluding the final week of the regular season (noon). The number is available through the SEC office at 205-458-3000.

PRACTICES: Practice footage is available periodically on the Ole Miss FTP site. At open practices, video is permitted for stretch only, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Photographers must use tight shots and no formations.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 2) daily newspapers; 3) network affiliate television stations; 4) magazines, non-broadcast radio stations and weekly newspapers.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The SJB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested during credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/ videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos. Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO RIGHTS: The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by IMG College in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/ Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. Broadcast lines should be ordered through AT&T (1-877-438-0041). Visiting networks may also wish to contact Cabell Philpott with IMG College (336-831-0719 or cabell.philpott@imgworld.com), concerning the SEC's network agreement.

RADIO/TELEVISION SHOW: The RebTalk radio show gives fans the opportunity to ask Coach Kiffin questions concerning Ole Miss Football. The talk show, hosted by David Kellum, will air every Thursday during the season at 7 p.m. "The Season: Ole Miss Football" is an award-winning, weekly 30-minute show produced by Ole Miss Sports Productions. It debuts Wednesdays at 6 p.m. CT on TheSeasonOleMiss.com and airs on ESPN.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST VANDERBILT

November, 20, 2021 - Ole Miss 31, Vanderbilt 17: Matt Corral completed 27 of 36 passes for 326 yards and threw two TD passes as Ole Miss knocked off Vanderbilt, 31-17. The Rebels jumped ahead 10-0 early and never looked back, following Corral and a stifling defense to claim a 31-9 advantage in the fourth quarter before the Commodores scored their only TD. With the win, the Rebels finished the 2021 season a perfect 7-0 at home, the first undefeated mark on campus since 1992.

October 31, 2020 - Ole Miss 54, Vanderbilt 21: A record-setting day by Elijah Moore and Matt Corral propelled Ole Miss to a clean victory over Vanderbilt. Moore broke AJ Brown's single-game receiving yard record with 238. Corral went 19-for-19 passing to start the game, breaking Eli Manning's 19-year-old record for consecutive completions as the Rebels cruised to victory in Nashville.

October 5, 2019 - Ole Miss 31, Vanderbilt 6: A dominant rushing and defensive performance propelled the Ole Miss football team to a 31-6 Homecoming victory over Vanderbilt. The Rebels racked up their most

rushing yards (413) since 1979 in the rout. John Rhys Plumlee ran for 165 yards and a score. Jerriion Ealy (97), Snoop Conner (91) and Scottie Phillips (62) all contributed to the big day on the ground as Ole Miss never trailed in a decisive victory over the Commodores.

November 17, 2018 - Vanderbilt 36, Ole Miss 29 (OT): The touchdown that wasn't made for a heartbreaking finish for Ole Miss in Nashville. Kicker Luke Logan went 5-for-5 on the day, including a 32-yarder in the final minute to force overtime. Vandy opened OT with a touchdown, and the Rebels appeared to answer—but AJ Brown's touchdown catch was overturned upon review, and Ole Miss fell just short of the victory.

October 14, 2017 - Ole Miss 57, Vanderbilt 35: The Ole Miss offense exploded for 28 points in the second quarter and never looked back to send Vanderbilt home with a 57-35 defeat. QB Shea Patterson threw for 351 yards and four touchdowns and added a score on the ground, while RB Jordan Wilkins tallied 113 yards and a TD in the win.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin (Fresno State, 1998) is in his third season at Ole Miss and helped lead the Rebels to back-to-back bowl appearances in his first two years in Oxford. Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. That included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, part of an ongoing 13-game home win streak for Kiffin's teams. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll; its highest final ranking since 2016. Ole Miss ranked top-20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories in his first season, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. Kiffin is in his 11th year at the NCAA level and has posted an all-time record of 76-42. In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

VANDERBILT HEAD COACH CLARK LEA

Commodore head coach Clark Lea enters his second year serving as head coach for Vanderbilt, as well as his second year of head coaching in the NCAA. Holding a record of 5-12 as the Commodores' head coach, Lea has already found a jump in success between this season and last, surpassing the team's 2021 win total (2) in the first four weeks of the 2022 season with the team currently sitting 3-2 on the year. Lea brings years of defensive coaching experience to the Vanderbilt squad, having been a linebackers coach for multiple Power 5 programs as well as serving as defensive coordinator for the Notre Dame Fighting Irish during their College Football Playoff run in 2018. Under Lea the Commodore offense ranks 49th in the country in rushing offense, averaging 176.6 yards per game on the ground. Additionally, Lea has the Commodores converting a perfect 100 percent inside of the red zone so far in 2022, tied with five other teams for the best red zone efficiency in the nation.

COMMODORES SCOUTING REPORT

Vanderbilt welcomes the Rebels to Nashville behind the team's 3-2 record in 2022, with the Commodores returning to action following a bye week early-on in their season. The Commodore offense is led by true freshman quarterback AJ Swann, who has now started the last two games for Vanderbilt after coming in for Mike Wright, who started the team's first three games of the season at QB. Swann will look to his favorite target in the pass game, junior wide receiver Will Sheppard, as Sheppard has been a difference maker this year for the Commodores, logging team-highs in receptions (26), receiving yards (365) and touchdowns (7) on the year. Sheppard currently ranks second in the nation with his seven receiving touchdowns this season. The Commodore defense is headlined by senior linebacker Anfernee Orji, who not only leads his team with 52 total tackles on the year so far, but also ranks alongside some of the nation's leading tacklers with the preseason All-SEC selection averaging 10.4 tackles a game this season. Orji comes off of seasons in 2021 and in 2022 in which he finished as the Commodores' leading tackler, tallying 93 in 2021 and 66 in 2020.

VANDERBILT SERIES HISTORY

- It is the third-most played series of all-time between Ole Miss and its 2022 opponents (Mississippi State, LSU).
- The Rebels lead the series 52-40-2 overall.
- The original record vs. the Commodores is 54-40-2, with wins in 2013 and 2014 by Ole Miss vacated due to NCAA ruling.
- Vanderbilt leads the series 29-22-2 in games played in Nashville ... The original record is 29-24-2 in favor of Vandy.
- Ole Miss has won seven of the last nine contests on the field vs. Vanderbilt.

The Ole Miss roster features 11 players who hail from Tennessee: WR **Kyndrich Breedlove** (Nashville), WR **Drew Burnett** (Memphis), S **Harrison Craig** (Collierville), OL **Jack Greer** (Germantown), S **Taylor Groves** (Cross Plains), LS **Jared Lawrence** (Lebanon), CB **Carter Patton** (Brentwood), WR **Joshua Pfeifer** (Nashville), WR **Sellers Shy** (Memphis), WR **Calvin Wilson** (Thompson's Station) and TE **Hudson Wolfe** (Savannah).

FRESHMAN SENSATION

True freshman **Quinshon Judkins** has made an immediate impact for an Ole Miss offense that leads the SEC and ranks No. 5 in rushing yards per game (261.8 ypg). Judkins ranks top 15 nationally in rushing yards (535), rushing yards per game (107.0) and rushing TDs (6). His 535 rushing yards are the most by any Ole Miss freshman in the first five games of the season since at least 1976. Judkins' 35 missed tackles forced ranks third in FBS, according to Pro Football Focus. Judkins' six rushing touchdowns are the most TDs (6) in a season by any SEC freshman since 2019. He has scored a TD in four of his first five collegiate games.

KIFFIN GETS 20TH WIN AT OLE MISS

With the win over Kentucky on Saturday, **Lane Kiffin** picked up his 20th win at Ole Miss in just 28 games on the Rebel sidelines. He is the fastest Ole Miss coach to reach 20 wins at Ole Miss since Johnny Vaught began his Rebel career 20-7-1 over the course of 28 games (1947-49). He's the second-fastest Rebel coach to reach the 20-win plateau behind Harry Mehre who won 20 games in just 24 contests (20-4) from 1938-1940.

REBS IN THE POLLS

- Ole Miss ranks No. 9 in both the the Associated Press Poll and the Coaches Poll after their win over No. 7 Kentucky.
- Dating back to last season, Ole Miss has been ranked in the top 25 for 22 straight weeks, which is its longest streak since being ranked for 41 straight weeks that stretched from 2014-16.
- The Rebels are back inside the top 10 for the first time since Ole Miss was ranked No. 8 headed into the 2022 Sugar Bowl.
- The SEC boasts seven teams in the top 25, including four teams ranked inside the top 10.

FIRST HALF EFFICIENCY

Ole Miss is averaging 470.2 yards per game, but the Rebels are doing a majority of their work in the first half. **Lane Kiffin** and the Rebel offense averages 282.4 yards in the first half, including surpassing the 300-yard mark in the first half in two of its last three contests. The Rebels are outscoring their opponents 127-32 in the first half this season. Ole Miss has averaged 170.4 yards rushing through the first 30 minutes of their games this season.

TACKLE MANIA

The Rebels have had a knack for disrupting plays in the opponent's backfield this season. Ole Miss is second in the SEC and ranks No. 15 in the FBS with 7.4 tackles for loss per game. During their Week 3 win over Georgia Tech, the Rebels had 12.0 tackles for loss. It was the most by a Rebel defense since recording 15.0 against Kent State on Sept. 22, 2018. Ole Miss has had nine or more tackles for loss in three of their five games this season.

THE PORTAL KING

Looking to replace 33 letterwinners, including 14 total starters, **Lane Kiffin** and the Rebels turned to the transfer portal to help strengthen its roster for 2022. The Rebels brought in a total of 28 transfers, including 24 portal transfers that ranked No. 2 according to 247Sports. USC transfer QB **Jaxson Dart** was rated the No. 3 overall transfer and started three games in 2021 for the Trojans. RB **Zach Evans** was also ranked in the top 10 in 247Sports' transfer rankings. Evans was ranked as the No. 2 running back and No. 8 overall player in the transfer portal. TE **Michael Trigg** was the third Rebel to be ranked as a top 20 transfer, rated as the No. 1 tight end and No. 19 overall player. 56 of the 125 players (45 percent) on the Rebel roster are newcomers and are in their first season at Ole Miss.

SACK YOU VERY MUCH

Ole Miss ranks second in the SEC and No. 13 in the FBS with 3.2 sacks per game. LB **Khari Coleman** and DE **Jared Ivey** are tied for the team lead with 2.5 sacks on the season. 10 different Rebels have at least one or more sacks for Ole Miss this year, the third-most amongst FBS schools. Saturday was the fourth time in the season's first five games that Ole Miss tallied at least three or more sacks in a game.

100-YARD BACKS

The Ole Miss rushing attack continues to be the strong suit of a Rebel squad that has started the season 5-0. The Rebels have had at least one 100-yard rusher in five straight games. It's the first time Ole Miss has accomplished that feat since 1999. The Rebels had a 100-yard rusher over a stretch of five games during the 1999 campaign. **Quinshon Judkins** leads the Rebels with three 100-yard rushing performances, while **Zach Evans** has two.

GETTING STINGY WITH IT

Through the first five games of 2022, the Rebels are seventh nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 11.8 points per game. Ole Miss has held nine of its last 10 opponents to 21 or fewer points. Prior to giving up 27 points in Week 4 vs. Tulsa, the Rebels only allowed 13 total points in the first three games of the season. It was the fewest given up by a Rebel squad through the first three games of the year since 1963. Ole Miss also opened the '63 season allowing just 13 points in the season's first three contests. That 1963 team went on to finish the season 7-1-2 and were crowned SEC Champions.

ONE-TWO PUNCH

Freshman **Quinshon Judkins** and TCU transfer **Zach Evans** have combined for a lethal one-two punch for Ole Miss' rushing attack. Judkins has carried the ball 85 times for 535 yards and six TDs. Evans has registered 68 carries for 389 yards and four touchdowns. Judkins' 107.0 rushing yards per carry leads all freshman backs and ranks No. 12 in the FBS. The Rebels are one of just three teams (Duke, Kansas & Ole Miss) to have three players with four or more rushing TDs.

BIG LEG JON

K **Jonathan Cruz** is 6-of-8 in his collegiate career on field goals from 50 yards or more, including a 53-yard FG Saturday vs. No. 7 Kentucky. Cruz's kick tied for the sixth longest kick in school history and the longest since 2012 (Bryson Rose vs Arkansas). A transfer from Charlotte, Cruz holds the 49ers' school record with five field goals made 50-plus yards, including a program-best two 56-yard field goals. He also has had 19 of his 29 kickoffs in 2022 go for touchbacks.

COLEMAN GETTING IN THE BACKFIELD

Despite missing the two games due to injury this season, TCU transfer **Khari Coleman** has registered 6.5 tackles for loss this season. With his 5.0 TFL in the season opener vs. Troy, Coleman became just the third Rebel since 1999 to tally five or more tackles for loss in a single game. Mark Robinson registered 5.0 TFL last season and Kendrick Clancy had 6.0 in 1999. Coleman earned Freshman All-America accolades in 2020 after a stellar freshman campaign for the Horned Frogs. Coleman ranked second in the Big 12 and seventh nationally with 15.0 tackles for loss as a true freshman on his way to being named the Big 12 Co-Defensive Freshman of the Year. The 10.0 tackles for loss were the most by any SEC team in their season opener and are the most in an Ole Miss opening game since 2014.

MANY OPTIONS

One of the most exciting factors of the talent on the Ole Miss roster would be the depth at the receiver position. Even with so many new names added to the receiver roster, the relationships between the athletes have not let competition get in the middle of the purpose of the team: to win. Veteran **Jonathan Mingo** has started 31 games in his career and has tallied 260 receiving yards this season. Transfers **Jaylon Robinson**, **Malik Heath** and **Jordan Watkins** all bring valuable collegiate experience that will continue to help the Rebel offense.

KD HILL RECEIVES CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD, WILL WEAR NO. 38

Ole Miss DT **KD Hill** was recently named the winner of the 2022 Chucky Mullins Courage Award. The award, sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. A native of Eufaula, Alabama, Hill becomes the 32nd recipient in the 33-year history of the award. Hill will wear Mullins' No. 38 number throughout the 2022 season. Hill has appeared in 39 career games for the Rebels, including 21 career starts at nose tackle.

SHOUTOUT FOR SHUTOUTS

Ole Miss' 42-0 shutout vs. Georgia Tech during Week 3 was the first by an Ole Miss team since besting Presbyterian, 48-0, on Nov. 8, 2014. A 39-0 win in 2012 over Tulane, in New Orleans, was the last time the Rebels shutout an opponent on the road. The win over Georgia Tech was the first Power 5 shutout for Ole Miss since a 45-0 victory over Mississippi State in 2008, as well as the first against a non-current member of the SEC since beating Florida State, 33-0, on Oct. 7, 1961. The Rebels also had two shutouts against current SEC members before they entered the conference against Missouri on Sept. 14, 1974 (10-0) and South Carolina on Sept. 23, 1972 (21-0).

THE BIG MEN UP FRONT

Arguably one of the deepest positions for the Rebels in 2022 is the offensive line. Preseason All-America selection **Nick Broeker** anchors a line for an Ole Miss offense that finished sixth in the FBS last season in total offense. Broeker played in every single snap for the Rebels and has started 28 straight games. **Jeremy James** and **Caleb Warren** also both return after starting 14 and 12 games respectively last season. **Eli Acker**, redshirt freshman **Jayden Williams** and WKU transfer **Mason Brooks**, **Hamilton Hall**, **Cedric Melton** and **Reece McIntyre** will all see time on the experienced o-line for the Rebels.

HEAVY HITTER

Many Rebels are transitioning from high school or life at another university, but **Tyhone Malone** is making a different transition—from baseball back to football. Malone appeared in seven games for the Rebels on the baseball diamond, leading all non-starters with a .444 batting average and two home runs in just nine at-bats. While he wasn't on the Rebels' travel roster as they conquered Omaha and brought a national championship back home to Oxford, he certainly showed he has what it takes to compete on the diamond in the SEC, and now he's back looking to prove the same on the gridiron.

KIFFIN'S WEEKLY RADIO SHOW ON THURSDAYS

RebTalk, the official weekly radio show of Ole Miss Athletics, will broadcast each Thursday this fall at Bouré in downtown Oxford from 6-7 p.m. The show, which is hosted by the "Voice of the Rebels" **David Kellum** and includes special guests, will air live on the Ole Miss IMG Sports Network. Ole Miss Football head coach **Lane Kiffin** and select players will join the broadcast each Thursday throughout the season.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Ole Miss has four players on its roster from outside the U.S., including two Canadian players (**Jaden Dicks** and **Tavias Robinson**). Offensive lineman **Tobias Braun** (Germany) and punter **Fraser Masin** (Australia) round out the Rebels who add a little international flavor. Robinson has started every game for the Rebels this season and has tallied six total tackles, including a sack.

A NEW START

Sixteen Rebels have made their first career starts at some point for Ole Miss this season: QB **Luke Altmyer**, LB **Troy Brown**, QB **Jaxson Dart**, RB **Zach Evans**, DT **Jamond Gordon**, WR **Malik Heath**, CB **Davison Igbinosun**, DE **Jared Ivey**, OL **Micah Pettus**, WR **Jaylon Robinson**, S **Ladarius Tennison**, TE **Michael Trigg**, S **Trey Washington**, WR **Jordan Watkins**, WR **Jayden Williams**, S **Isheem Young**. Prior to Ole Miss, Brown had 30 starts at Central Michigan, Young 21 at Iowa State, Evans eight at TCU, Heath nine at Mississippi State, Robinson six at UCF, Dart three starts at USC.

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin heads into his third season at the helm of the Ole Miss football program after leading the Rebels to back-to-back bowl appearances in his first two years in Oxford.

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. That included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, part of an ongoing nine-game home win streak for Kiffin's teams.

The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll; its highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg). Ole Miss has eclipsed 600 yards of total offense seven times under Kiffin after hitting that mark just 16 times in the program's history before his arrival.

The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer points per game this season compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020, leading the program to an Outback Bowl win over No. 7 Indiana and a 5-5 record against an all-SEC schedule. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set during the Tigers' run to a national title in 2019.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first season at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

Kiffin has more than 11 years of head coaching experience, including 10 years at the NCAA level where he has posted an all-time record of 76-42.

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3. Statistically, the Owls finished in the top-25 in 16 team categories, including: No. 2 in passes intercepted, No. 5 in first down offense, No. 6 in rushing offense, No. 8 in kickoff return defense, red zone offense and turnovers lost, and No. 9 in total offense and turnover margin (by comparison, FAU was No. 72 the previous season in total offense and No. 99 in turnovers gained).

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranks as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying a starting quarterback and then developing Blake Sims in 2014. With three-year starter and All-American AJ McCarron off to the NFL, Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Volunteers' offense jumped at least 34 places in every national statistical category over the 2008 figures.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

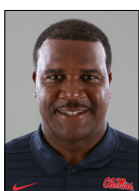

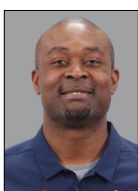

OXFORD, Miss. — New names and faces were an important part of the outcome as the Rebels defeated the Troy Trojans, 28-10, on Saturday afternoon.

A total of 27 new Rebels made their debut on Saturday, helping push Ole Miss to its 10th straight home victory dating back to Nov. 14, 2020 — the longest home winning streak in program history since winning 33 in a row from Nov. 1, 1952 to Nov. 7, 1964.

Defensively, junior TCU transfer Khari Coleman was a one-man wrecking crew in his Rebel debut, terrorizing the Troy backfield with 5.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks on eight total tackles — marking just the third time since 1999 that a Rebel has notched at least 5.0 tackles for loss, joining Mark Robertson's 5.0 in 2021 and Kendrick Clancy's 6.0 in 1999. After Ole Miss won the opening coin toss and deferred, Troy took the kickoff and had an eight-play drive to midfield. But the Trojans stalled there as the Rebel defense stepped up. Dart was 1-for-3 on his first drive as a Rebel that also stalled for Ole Miss near midfield.

After another early Troy drive produced nothing, the Rebels went to work for the game's first points. Nine plays and 82 yards later, Ulysses Bentley IV took it in from two yards out for a touchdown, and the PAT by Jonathan Cruz made it 7-0 Rebels with 2:25 to go in the first. On that drive Dart connected on a 16-yard pass to Jonathan Mingo, and a big Evans rush of 46 yards setup the Bentley score.

Ole Miss added two touchdowns in the second quarter, a two-yard scamper by Mingo and then another two-yard rush, this time by the freshman Judkins to the right pylon to give Ole Miss an early 21-0 lead with 6:38 to go in the first half.

Troy got its first points of the game to end the first half on a 31-yard field goal by Brooks Buce as time expired, making it a 21-3 game at the break.

The Rebels took the second half opening kickoff and impressively drove 75 yards in 13 plays, capped by a 12-yard touchdown pass from Dart to senior wide receiver Malik Heath. The extra point by Cruz made it 28-3 Rebels, and even though there was a lot of time remaining, this one was all but over less than five minutes into the third quarter.

Later in the quarter, Ole Miss seemed poised for more points at the Troy 22 after Miles Battle intercepted a Gunnar Watson pass with 6:26 to go in the third. But on the very next play, Dart was intercepted in the end zone by the Trojans' Markeis Colvin.

In the fourth quarter, Troy scored its lone touchdown on fourth and goal at the Rebel 3-yard line on a pass from Watson to Rajae Johnson, the end of a 39-yard drive that took 11 plays. The point after by Buce was good, and it was 28-10.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss grabbed the lead from the jump and never looked back in a dominant 59-3 victory over Central Arkansas at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday night. The Rebels played well in all three facets of the game with seven touchdowns on offense, as well as one on special teams, while forcing four turnovers.

After winning the coin toss and taking the kickoff, Altmeyer immediately took a shot down the sideline to Mingo for a 36-yard gain. Ole Miss ran the ball four straight times before Altmeyer punched the first score of the game with a 7-yard touchdown pass to Trigg.

The Rebel defense stopped Central Arkansas' offense on its first drive and forced a punt. The Bears' fumbled the snap, which was picked off the ground by Tennison and taken to the end zone. Central Arkansas was unable to get anything going on offense on the ensuing drive, and Ole Miss blocked a punt to regain the ball on the UCA's 4-yard line. It took two plays for Altmeyer and Trigg to connect on their second touchdown of the night.

Following a Bears' three-and-out, Ole Miss would score once more before the end of the first quarter. He put the offense in position to score with a 26-yard pass to Malik Heath down the middle of the field on a 1st-and-24.

The scoring settled down in the second quarter as Cruz's field goal were the only points of the frame. Ole Miss went into the half leading 31-0.

Ole Miss ramped it back up to start the second half. The defense forced a three-and-out, giving the ball to the Rebel offense. On the second play of the drive, Dart launched a 51-yard bomb to Mingo with an incredible catch over the Bears' cornerback. Two plays later, Zach Evans bulldozed his way into the endzone. On the very next drive, Dart found Dayton Wade behind the defense for a 39-yard reception. The next play, he located Trigg open to the left for six, extending the Rebel lead to 45 after the Cruz extra point. Trigg became just the 11th Rebel to score three touchdowns in a single game.

The Rebels' offense continued to command the game as they crossed the goal line one more time before the third quarter finished.

In the fourth, Central Arkansas marched down the field, cutting a big chunk of the field by throwing it deep for 36 yards. However, the Bears settled for a field to get on the board, down 52-3. As the game was nearing its end, UCA fumbled on a punt return and Ole Miss recovered it inside the 10. Ulysses Bentley IV put the cherry on top with an 11-yard rushing touchdown.

ATLANTA — Ole Miss was dominant in its first road contest of the year on Saturday, as the Rebels ran right through Bobby Dodd Stadium to take a convincing 42-0 victory from Georgia Tech.

From the opening drive it looked like Ole Miss (3-0) was on a mission in Atlanta, as the three-headed Rebel backfield of Zach Evans, Quinshon Judkins and Ulysses Bentley IV put together their best performance of the season against Georgia Tech (1-2) to help lead the Rebels to a season-high 316 rushing yards on the day, as well as six total rushing touchdowns.

Evans (18 carries, 134 yards), Judkins (19 carries, 98 yards) and Bentley IV (eight carries, 27 yards) each finished with two rushing touchdowns apiece, marking the first time three Rebels recorded at least two rushing touchdowns since the team's 1979 matchup with Vanderbilt.

The Rebel defense also played a major role in the team's win over the Yellow Jackets, pitching their first full-game shutout since 2014 when Ole Miss took down Presbyterian, 48-0. The Ole Miss defense stonewalled Georgia Tech, allowing just 214 total yards along with seven total sacks on the day. The stout Rebel defensive unit has allowed only 13 points through its first three games of 2022, and have held opponents scoreless in nine of 12 quarters this season — including seven of the last eight.

The Rebels got to work right away after receiving the opening kickoff, as the Jaxson Dart led offense marched down the field on a 74-yard scoring drive that only took 1:21 off the clock in five plays before it was capped off with an Evans 3-yard touchdown run. Despite only completing one pass on the opening drive, Dart would still record a season-high 207 yards through the air for the Rebels on a 10-of-16 clip before his day would come to an end.

Momentum remained in the Rebels' corner on the defensive side of the ball, when a three-and-out drive for the Yellow Jackets led to a punt being blocked and recovered by Cedric Johnson at the Georgia Tech 20-yard line. The Rebels would capitalize on the field position, with Judkins running for a 7-yard touchdown to put Ole Miss up 14-0 early in Atlanta.

Johnson's punt block marks the second of the season for the Rebel special teams unit, as well as the first time that an Ole Miss team has had two punt blocks in a single season since 2007. It also stands as the first time the Rebels have blocked a punt in consecutive games since 1998.

The second quarter saw Evans continue his dominance running the ball, as he ripped off a 26-yard touchdown scamper to bump the Ole Miss lead up to 21-0, while hitting 100 first-half rushing yards for the second time this season. The Rebel defense held strong for the remainder of the frame, holding the Yellow Jackets scoreless into the halftime break.

It marked the second consecutive game in which Ole Miss has held their opponent to under 250 total yards on offense.

OXFORD, Miss. - Ole Miss anticipated an aerial shootout against Tulsa's top-ranked passing offense, but a tough Rebel running game and a defensive effort that never fully broke helped the 13th-ranked Rebels hold on, 35-27, over the Golden Hurricane on Saturday.

The Rebels (4-0) battled back from an early 14-7 first quarter deficit to take a 35-17 halftime lead over Tulsa (2-2), but the second half became a defensive slugfest highly dependent on the running game and field position.

On the ground, Ole Miss tallied 308 of its 462 total yards, led by another impressive showing from freshman running back Quinshon Judkins, who ended the day on a career-high 140 yards and two scores on 27 carries. Today's matchup marks the first time since 1999 that Ole Miss has had at least one 100-yard rusher in four consecutive games, as well as the first time since at least 1976 in available game-by-game data that Ole Miss has opened the year with four straight games with a 100-yard rusher.

Judkins had three runs of 20 yards or more, and his two touchdowns in the second quarter pushes him to five in four games.

Judkins, starting quarterback Jaxson Dart (13 carries, 116 yards) and Zach Evans (10 carries, 48 yards, 1 TD) all secured high numbers in the rushing game for the Rebels, while Malik Heath (4 catches, 75 yards, 1 TD) and Jonathan Mingo (3 catches, 54 yards, 1 TD) hauled in 129 of Ole Miss' 154 passing yards.

It was an offensive back-and-forth battle as both teams secured at least 450 yards on offense, but the Rebels were able to put up the points needed in the first half, while the defense closed out the game in the back half.

The Rebel defense stymied Tulsa's FBS-leading passing attack to 218 yards fewer than its No. 1 ranked average of 413 yards per game entering, throwing for just 195 on Saturday.

Holding off a late surge by Tulsa, the Rebels held on for their 35-27 win over the Golden Hurricane, moving to 4-0 as the team heads into its first SEC game of the year against Kentucky.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss recovered two Kentucky fumbles to preserve a dramatic 22-19 victory and move to 5-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC play. The Wildcats fell to 4-1 and 1-1.

With the Rebels clinging to a three-point lead, a 26-yard field goal by Jonathan Cruz their only points of the second half, it was the Ole Miss defense which saved the day.

Ole Miss jumped out to an early 14-0 lead, but this one would be far from over. Dart was the key to the Rebels' first scoring drive. In six plays from his own 35-yard line, the Rebel signal-caller had Ole Miss in the end zone. Zach Evans took it in from the 4 for his lone touchdown of the day. Cruz made the extra point and Ole Miss led 7-0 with 7:09 to go in the first quarter.

After Kentucky placekicker Matt Ruffolo missed a 39-yard field goal, Ole Miss moved downfield for another touchdown. Quinshon Judkins burst through the middle of the line and raced 48 yards for a touchdown, a beautiful run that had those in red and blue among the capacity crowd roaring their approval. The point after by Cruz made it 14-0 with 59 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

The Rebels' own defense was also able to slow down a potent Wildcat offensive attack. However, UK did answer the two early touchdowns with one of its own.

Kentucky's Barion Brown returned the kickoff from his own goal line to the Ole Miss 15 to set things up for the visitors. Christopher Rodriguez's touchdown rush of 10 yards cut the UM lead to 14-6. The first quarter ended with Ole Miss up eight points.

After the Rebels' subsequent drive stalled, Fraser Masin punted to Kentucky and the ball was downed at the 1-yard line. Tavius Robinson of Ole Miss was then credited with a sack as Levis delivered the football in the right flat - to nobody. The ruling was intentional grounding, and a safety was awarded to the Rebels for a 16-6 UM lead.

On fourth and 20, Cruz connected on a 53-yard field goal, and Ole Miss led 19-6 with 7:03 to go before halftime. The kick was tied for sixth longest field goal in school history and the longest since Bryson Rose kicked a game-winner against Arkansas in Little Rock in 2012.

A nine-play drive capped by a Levis to Robinson touchdown pass of five yards made the score 19-12. The extra point kick was not attempted with a bobbled snap and a tackle by Ole Miss. There was 1:23 left before halftime.

To open the third quarter starting at the UM 49, the Wildcats soon scored on a 17-yard pass from Levis to Jordan Dingle. This time, Ruffolo was good on the extra point. It was 19-19 with 6:22 to go, and it was clearly anybody's ballgame.

Ole Miss started a drive at its own 35 for what would be the game's final points. With 2:19 to go in the third, a Cruz field goal of 26 yards put the Rebels back in front 22-19. The drive covered 57 yards in 13 plays.
