### OPENING TIPS

• Columbia makes its home debut Sunday, hosting Vanderbilt from Schiller Court at Levien Gymnasium. Tip-off is scheduled for 2 p.m. ET with the game set to air live on ESPN+.

• Columbia is off to a 2-0 start after defeating Memphis (77-69) and Delaware (64-56) on the road. This is Columbia's third 2-0 start in its last four seasons and it's fourth of the Megan Griffith head coaching era. The Lions are now 14-1 in their last 15 true road games after posting a record of 12-1 a year ago. Dating back to the 2019-20 season, the Lions are 18-1 over their last 19 true road contests.

• Columbia will be looking for its first victory over a team out of the SEC. Entering the game, the Lions are 0-4 all-time against the conference. Sunday will mark the first time an SEC team will visit Levien Gymnasium. Three of the four prior matchups came on a neutral court. The other came on the road, which was when the Lions visited Vanderbilt in 2019. Since Megan Griffith became the head coach of the Lions in 2016, Columbia has already earned its first victories over teams out of the ACC and Big East.

• With wins over Clemson, Georgetown and Boston College last season, Columbia is 7-8 in its last 15 games against power-conference opponents (ACC, Big 10, Big 12, Big East, SEC, Pac 12). The 15-game span began in 2016 with an overtime win at home over Providence. The Lions then opened the 2017-18 season by defeating the Friars on the road, 73-64. The Lions earned their first ACC win in the 2017-18 season as well, when they defeated Boston College, 68-60, in front of a record 2,372 fans on Education Day. In 2019-20, they added to the tally with a 54-49 victory on Education Day over Georgetown (Dec. 6).

• Thursday's win over Delaware was Columbia's 1,000th game in program history. The official start of Columbia women's basketball came in 1984, which coincided with the formation of the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium. Prior to 1984, women's basketball was played at neighboring Barnard College.

**NEWARK, Del.** - Hannah Pratt notched her first double-double of the season and the Columbia women's basketball team dominated the glass on its way to defeating Delaware, 64-56, Thursday night at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Columbia (2-0) took an eight-point lead into the fourth quarter and quickly extended it to a dozen on back-to-back triples by Pratt. However, just when it seemed like the Lions were about to put their foot on the gas, they went cold, missing their next seven shots over a five-minute span as Delaware (1-1) clawed back. A 3-pointer by Jewel Smalls with 2:48 to play made it a 53-49 game.

The Lions needed something to turn the momentum and Kitty Henderson delivered. The sophomore Australian knocked down her third 3-ball of the night, which ignited a 7-0 run that put Columbia back up by 11 with less than a minute remaining.

That all but sealed it, as Pratt and Henderson combined for 31 points on 6-of-11 from the perimeter to take down the defending CAA champions.

"I thought both [Hannah and Kitty] played more solidly than everybody else tonight and were the most consistent players on the court," Columbia head coach Megan Griffith said. "I thought they had somewhat of a passive start and weren't as aggressive early, but they settled in and produced. For both of them to hit shots when we needed them was huge and their rebounding presence was huge. Kitty also had zero turnovers tonight and I was happy to see her finish strong."

Pratt turned in a game-high 16 points and 10 rebounds to produce her fifth career double-double. Kaitlyn Davis matched Pratt on the boards and Kitty Henderson turned in 15 points, eight rebounds and five assists. All told, the Lions outdid Delaware, 53-40, on the glass, including 20-8 on the offensive end. Those second chances were vital for the Lions, which got off 71 looks on a night where they shot just 31 percent.

"We're just kind of struggling to string together stops right now and we've got to stick to the game plan more, honestly," Griffith added. "When the ball tips, we tend to be a little too locked in maybe, too eager. We need to echo calls and communicate the right way. We didn't do that to the best of our ability and just need a little bit more of a consistent 40-minute effort."

Pratt scored each of Columbia's first seven points but Delaware had the advantage after 10 minutes thanks to a Smalls triple in the quarter's final seconds. Smalls (11) and Tara Cousins (12) were Delaware's leading scorers on the night.

The Lions settled in on defense to start the second quarter, not allowing UD to score until almost four minutes in. The Blue Hens then scored a quick five on buckets by their two leading scorers. However, Columbia's two leading scorers each sank a shot in the final minute to level the score at 30 at the break.

The third quarter was Columbia's most dominant of the game. Despite shooting 28 percent in the period, the Lions were 3-for-4 from downtown and held the Blue Hens to just nine points on three field goals. An 8-0 run with threes by Henderson and Jaida Patrick opened Columbia's lead up to eight heading to the fourth, where they found a way to walk out 2-0.

After starting with a pair of wins on the road, Columbia will debut for its home crowd on Sunday with an SEC matchup against Vanderbilt (2-0). Tip-off from Levien Gymnasium is scheduled for 2 p.m. ET.

## LAST TIME VS. VANDERBILT

### COLUMBIA'S WINNING STREAK SNAPPED BY VANDERBILT

Sunday, December 29, 2019

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Columbia women's basketball team saw its six-game winning streak come to an end Sunday afternoon, falling to Vanderbilt, 72-51, at historic Memorial Gymnasium.

Columbia (7-4) was led by Abbey Hsu's team-high 17 points. The reigning Ivy League Rookie of the Week was 6-of-15 from the field, adding four rebounds, two assists and tying her season-high of four steals. Senior Janiya Clemmons and sophomore Hannah Pratt added nine points apiece.

Vanderbilt (10-3) scored 24 points off 23 Columbia turnovers. The Commodores used their length to disrupt the Lions and finished with a 46-23 advantage on the glass. Sixteen of those rebounds were offensive.

"You want to learn from this game because I think there are a lot of great nuggets we can take from it," head coach Megan Griffith said. "We want to make sure we're improving in the areas we struggled in tonight."

"It was really nice to see a couple of players like Abbey Hsu and Hannah Pratt play and really be aggressive ... We saw two young players come into their own tonight and hopefully we can build on that."

The Commodores went up 12-4 just three minutes into the contest and shot 61 percent in the opening quarter to set the pace. Despite the home team's hot shooting, Columbia weathered the storm and hung around. A second-chance 3-pointer by Pratt and a layup by Sienna Durr made it a five-point game, 20-15, at the 3:17 mark.

Unfortunately, the Lions would go the next 9:55 before scoring again. Vanderbilt scored 11 straight over that span before Hsu's 3-pointer from the left corner ended the drought. Columbia was limited to seven points through the second quarter and trailed 39-22 at the break.

Despite the deficit, the Lions came bursting out of the locker room with four quick points in a span of 30 seconds to get within 13. However, that would be as close as it would get. Vanderbilt's cushion grew to as many as 24 late in the fourth quarter before all was said and done.

"Having the opportunity to quickly turn around and get after it again tomorrow is just like Ivy League play," Griffith added. "I think this is going to be a good opportunity for us to make sure we're ready for that."

Columbia remains in Nashville to take on Tennessee State Monday afternoon. Tip-off from the Gentry Center is scheduled for 2 p.m. local, 3 p.m. ET.

## COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

### QUICK HITS

- Abbey Hsu (16.5) and Hannah Pratt (15.5) rank Top 10 in the Ivy League in scoring.
- Columbia boasts five of the Ivy League's top 20 in scoring (Hsu, Pratt, Henderson, Patrick, Davis)
- Kaitlyn Davis (8.5) and Hannah Pratt (8.0) each rank Top 5 in the Ivies in rebounding
- Henderson's 5.5 assists per game rank No. 2 in the Ivy League. Her 3.7 assist/turnover ratio leads the Ivies.
- The Lions are now won 16 straight games when committing fewer fouls than their opponent.
- Columbia has won 21 straight games when tied or leading at halftime.

### DELAWARE POSTGAME NOTES

- The Lions went for 53 rebounds and outrebounded the Blue Hens by 13. Last season, they had 50+ rebounds seven times and outrebounded their opponent by 10 or more on nine occasions.
- Columbia was 10-of-26 from 3-point range. Last season, they hit 10+ threes nine times and went 7-2 in those games.

### IN ALL-AMERICAN COMPANY

- Junior guard Abbey Hsu ranks No. 3 among active Div. I players in 3-pointers made per game (2.93), trailing only highly decorated All-Americans Taylor Robertson of Oklahoma (3.76) and Caitlin Clark of Iowa (3.31). Hsu is coming off a year in which she set the Ivy League record for 3-pointers made in a season, knocking down 108 to surpass the previous mark of 99 set by Harvard's Katie Benzan during the 2017-18 campaign. Hsu ended the year ranking top-five in the NCAA in makes (108), attempts (288) and makes per game (3.38).

### SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

- The Lions won their opener for the fourth time in their last five seasons on Monday night, walking out of Memphis victorious, 77-69. Abbey Hsu scored a game-high 24 points to lead the charge, while seniors Hannah Pratt (15) and Jaida Patrick (14) also reached double figures. Columbia trailed by as many as nine in the first half and outscored the Tigers, 27-15, in the fourth quarter to earn the win.

### 1,000 GAMES OF COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

- Columbia played its 1,000th game in program history Thursday night, defeating Delaware, 64-56. The program's first official year was the 1984-85 season, which coincided with the formation of the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium. Prior to 1984, women's basketball did not exist at Columbia University. The formation of the consortium allowed for students enrolled at neighboring Barnard College to participate in athletics as part of Columbia. Two years after the formation of the Consortium, the Lions went NCAA Div. I.

### REPPING THE USA

- Camille Zimmerman, Columbia's all-time leader in scoring (1,973) and rebounding (940) represented USA Basketball at the FIBA 3x3 AmeriCup in Miami last weekend. Zimmerman teamed up with three players who were coming off their WNBA rookie seasons in Veronica Burton (Dallas Wings/Northwestern), Lexie Hull (Indiana Fever/Stanford) and NaLyssa Smith (Indiana Fever/Baylor). Zimmerman and the USA went undefeated in pool play but were ousted by Canada in the semifinals, 17-15. This marked Zimmerman's second time donning the red, white and blue, also being named to the 2021 FIBA 3x3 Women's Series Montreal Stop roster.
- Zimmerman and the USA earned the bronze medal at the AmeriCup. Zimmerman was the star for the USA and went on to be named to the All-Tournament team alongside MVP Michelle Plouffe of Canada and Vitoria Marcelino of Brazil.

### BECKY HAMMON WATCH LIST

- Abbey Hsu was named to the preseason watch list for the 2023 Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Award, presented by Her Hoops Stats. Hsu is one of 25 players representing 25 different schools and 13 conferences that have been named to the list. To be eligible for this award, players must compete in one of the 26 conferences deemed to be "mid-major." Conferences ineligible to have players considered for the award include the ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12 and SEC.
- A two-time All-Ivy League selection through her first two seasons, Hsu is coming off a record-setting year that saw her shatter the Ivy League's single-season record for 3-pointers. She made 108 treys last year, ranking among the top five in the NCAA in makes, attempts (288) and makes per game (3.38). Along the way, she also broke Columbia's career record for made 3-pointers and enters her junior season with 173 total makes.
- Hsu is no stranger to national honors. As a rookie in 2019-20, she was named an Honorable Mention to Her Hoops Stats post-season "Fab 15". The United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) named Hsu its National Freshman of the Week earlier that same season.

### BUILDING A RESUME

- Six potential games against 2022 NCAA Tournament teams, three Postseason WNIT qualifiers, eight matchups against opponents that finished inside the top 100 of last year's final NET rankings and seven 20-win teams await the Columbia women's basketball team this upcoming season.
- All of the games against NCAA Tournament opponents on Columbia's vigorous non-conference slate will come on the road. The test includes 2022 CAA Tournament Champion Delaware (Nov. 10), NCAA Sweet 16 participant Iowa State (Nov. 20) and 2022 Atlantic 10 Tournament Champion Massachusetts (Dec. 10). A fourth potential game against an NCAA qualifier from last year will come at the Miami Thanksgiving Tournament (Nov. 25-27), where Columbia could meet the Hurricanes that Sunday in the four-team, bracket-style event. Miami advanced to the second round of last year's NCAA Tournament, falling to eventual national champion South Carolina.
- Three more non-conference games will see the Lions take on teams that qualified for last year's Postseason WNIT. Columbia, which advanced to the national quarterfinals of last year's tournament, will host Vanderbilt on Schiller Court at Leavenworth Gymnasium for the home opener on Sunday, November 10 at 2 p.m. A rematch against the team that eliminated the Lions from the WNIT, Seton Hall, takes place four days later, Nov. 17, in South Orange, New Jersey. The non-conference season comes to a close at home on Dec. 28 against first-round participant Ohio, which fell to the eventual WNIT champion, South Dakota State.



## COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

### NEW TO THE STAFF

Allie Bassetti joined the Columbia women's basketball staff as an assistant coach over the summer. She was most recently the assistant coach, recruiting coordinator and defensive coordinator at nearby Manhattan College. In six years at Manhattan College, Bassetti helped head coach Heather Vulin develop a team that won eight games during her first season into a 21-game winner in the 2021-22 campaign. Bassetti was named to the WBCA's Thirty Under 30 list in 2021, which recognizes 30 up-and-coming women's basketball coaches age 30 and under at all levels of the game.

### MID-MAJOR RANKINGS

Columbia begins the 2022-23 season ranked No. 9 in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll. The poll is voted on by coaches from the mid-major conferences. The Lions peaked at No. 7 in the poll last year. Two teams in the Ivy League are currently rank inside the top 10 with Princeton sitting at No. 2.

### A SEASON FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

Columbia is coming off its best season in program history in 2021-22, putting together a record of 25-7, 12-2 Ivy, to shatter the program records in both wins and Ivy League wins. Its 25 wins accounted for seven more than its previous best NCAA Div. I campaign (18-10 in 2009-10), and were four more than the 21-6 record the 1985-86 New York State AIAW champions had at the NCAA Div. III level. The 2021-22 Lions earned the program's first trip to the postseason in 36 years, advancing all the way to the National Quarterfinals of the WNIT.

### MET-BASKETBALL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR TRIO

Last season, Kitty Henderson became the third Lion in the team's last three competition seasons to be named All-Met Div. I Women's Rookie of the Year by the Met Basketball Writers Association. Henderson played in all 32 games, starting the last 23, averaging 8.3 points, 4.6 rebounds and 2.4 assists while shooting 41.4 percent from the field. Henderson ranked top 25 in the Ivies in scoring, top 20 in rebounding and 11th in assists. She was named Ivy League Rookie of the Week on two occasions (Nov. 15, Jan. 24), one which came after scoring a season-high 18 points in a home win over Cornell.

Each of Columbia's last three All-Met Rookie of the Year honorees are active members of this year's roster (Sienna Durr, 2018-19; Abbey Hsu, 2019-20). The Met Basketball Writers Association encompasses 21 New York City Metropolitan area schools across NCAA Div. I. Those schools include Army West Point, Columbia, Fairfield, Fairleigh Dickinson, Fordham, Hofstra, Iona, LIU, Manhattan, Marist, Monmouth, NJIT, Rider, Rutgers, Sacred Heart, St. Francis, St. John's, Saint Peter's, Seton Hall, Stony Brook and Wagner.

### 2021-22 QUICK HITS

- Abbey Hsu led the Ivy League and ranked Top 5 nationally in 3-point makes (108), makes per game (3.38) and 3-point field goal attempts (288). Her percentage (.375) from the outside ranked No. 62 in the NCAA.
- Hsu ranked No. 3 in the Ivy League and just outside the Top 100 nationally in scoring (16.4 ppg)
- Carly Rivera ranked Top 50 nationally and is No. 2 in the Ivy League in total assists (147). Her assist total was one shy of the single-season record (148), held by current head coach Megan Griffith from the 2005-06 season.
- Kaitlyn Davis ranked top 100 nationally in rebounds (267) and field goal percentage (.477).
- Davis ranked No. 10 in the Ivies in scoring (13.1), No. 3 in rebounding (8.4), No. 3 in field goal percentage (.477), No. 4 in blocks (1.3), No. 9 in steals (1.6) and No. 9 in assists (2.5).
- Columbia had four of the Ivy League's Top 25 in scoring (Hsu, Davis, Patrick, Henderson).
- Columbia boasted five of the league's Top 25 in rebounding (Davis, Patrick, Hsu, Henderson, Pratt).
- Kaitlyn Davis (1.3), Abbey Hsu (0.8) and Hannah Pratt (0.7) all ranked Top 10 in the Ivies in blocks.
- The Lions were No. 14 nationally in rebounds per game (42.28) and No. 25 in defensive rebounds (29.0).
- Columbia also ranked No. 21 nationally in assists per game (16.3) and Top 50 in total assists (521), field goal defense (.366), total rebounds (1,353), 3-point field goals per game (7.7), 3-pointers attempted (787), 3-pointers made (246) and overall winning percentage (.781).
- Columbia went 18-0 last season when leading at halftime.
- Columbia went 14-0 last season when committing fewer fouls than the opponent.

### THE COMEBACK KIDS

- Columbia had a flair for the dramatic last season, coming back from a double-digit deficit to win on four separate occasions. The Lions rallied from 14 down in the second half to defeat Clemson, 82-78 (Nov. 14), rallied from 12 down in the second half to defeat Yale, 65-55 (Jan. 2), and again came back from 12 down to win over Penn (Jan. 26).
- The most memorable and most improbable comeback of the 2021-22 season was that against Boston College in the WNIT. The Lions trailed by as many as 17 points on two separate occasions late in the first half. The deficit was 15 at halftime before the Lions outscored the Eagles, 36-18, in the second half to win. Columbia came all the way back without hitting a 3-pointer all night, ending the game 0-for-20 from downtown. Jaida Patrick gave the Lions their first lead of the night with 12.1 seconds left and they survived a 3-pointer at the buzzer as students and fans stormed the court at Levien Gymnasium.
- Including wins at Old Dominion and over Boston College in the WNIT, Columbia won when tied or trailing in the fourth quarter nine times last season.

### IN THE CLUTCH

- Columbia went 6-1 in games decided by five points or less last season. The Lions earned a 54-51 victory on in the third round of the WNIT against Boston College and won its second-round game by less than five points, 62-59, at Old Dominion. Their other four such wins came at Clemson (82-78), against Rider (63-60), at home against Harvard (74-70) and at home against Penn (61-56). Columbia's only loss in a close game was the one that ended the 2021-22 season, falling to Seton Hall in the WNIT Quarterfinals, 78-75.

## COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

### TEAM STATISTICAL RECORDS

• Columbia has set team records this season in the following categories:

- 25 wins (previous 21 - 1985-86)
- 12 Ivy wins (previous 9 - 2009-10)
- 2,121 points scored (previous 1,915 - 2015-16)
- 234 3-point field goals made (previous 201 - 2019-20)
- 759 3-point field goals attempted (previous 647 - 2018-19)
- 1,315 rebounds (previous 1,254 - 1984-85)
- 500 assists (ties program record of 500 in 1985-86)

### SWIPING INTO THE RECORD BOOKS

• Jaida Patrick swiped her way into Columbia's record books in the Second Round WNIT victory at Old Dominion. The Duke transfer came away with eight steals, including four in the first quarter, helping the Lions force 24 turnovers and outscore the Monarchs, 24-7, in points off turnovers. Patrick's eight steals tied Columbia's single-game record held by Brittany Simmons, who had eight in a loss to Cornell on Jan. 19, 2013.

### ALL-IVY DUO

• Kaitlyn Davis and Abbey Hsu were named to the All-Ivy League teams. Davis earned her first All-Ivy nod and was selected to the First Team. Hsu earned her second straight selection (2019-20) to the Second Team.

• Davis became the first Lion named to All-Ivy First Team since Camille Zimmerman in 2017-18. Zimmerman was a three-time All-Ivy selection and two-time First Team honoree. Hsu became the eighth Lion in program history earn multiple selection to the First or Second Team, a list that also includes Sienna Durr.

### TOPPING THE IVIES

• The Lions ended the 2021-22 season ranked No. 1 in the Ivy League in assists (521), assists per game (16.3), blocked shots (129), blocks per game (4.0), defensive rebounds (29.0), free throw attempts (575), free throws made (362), rebounds (1,353), rebounds per game (42.28), 3-point field goals attempted (787) and 3-point field goals made (246).

### A HISTORICAL CAMPAIGN

• The 2021-22 season saw Columbia set many firsts and numerous school records, beginning at the very start of the season when they started 5-0. Other notable season accomplishments included:

- Defeating an ACC team on the road (Clemson, Nov. 13)
- Starting Ivy League play 7-0 (previous best was 2-0)
- Winning a program record eight consecutive games (Dec. 13 - Feb. 4)
- Winning the most Ivy League games in program history (12)
- Winning the most games in a season program history (24)
- Defeating Penn for the first time since 2011
- Sweeping Penn for the first time since 2010
- Sweeping Cornell for the first time since 2010
- Sweeping Yale for the first time since 2011
- Playing in their first postseason game and winning their first postseason game in 36 years
- Advancing to their first Ivy League Tournament Championship Game
- Playing in their first WNIT and winning their first WNIT game
- Coming back from 17 points down to defeat Boston College in WNIT Third Round
- Advancing to the National Quarterfinals of their first WNIT

### ALL-IVY DUO

• Kaitlyn Davis and Abbey Hsu were named to the All-Ivy League teams last year. Davis earned her first All-Ivy nod and was selected to the First Team. Hsu earned her second straight selection (2019-20) to the Second Team.

• Davis became the first Lion named to All-Ivy First Team since Camille Zimmerman in 2017-18. Zimmerman was a three-time All-Ivy selection and two-time First Team honoree. Hsu became the eighth Lion in program history earn multiple selection to the First or Second Team, a list that also includes Sienna Durr.

### BREAKING OUT THE BROOMS

• Columbia posted six regular season Ivy League sweeps last season, which are its most in program history. The Lions swept Yale, Penn, Harvard, Dartmouth, Brown and Cornell. Its sweep over Yale was Columbia's first since 2011, while its sweeps of Penn and Cornell were each its first since 2010. Last year marked Columbia's second-consecutive series sweeps of both Harvard and Dartmouth.

### PERFECT IN JANUARY

• By going 6-0 in the month of January, Columbia put together its first undefeated month in program history (minimum 3 games played). The Lions kicked off the 2022 calendar year with a double-digit second-half comeback win at home against Yale, 65-55. They followed it up with a road win at Harvard (Jan. 15), a home win over Cornell (Jan. 20) and a road win at Brown (Jan. 22). The Lions also took down Penn (Jan. 26) for the first time since 2011, coming back from 10+ points down in the second half for a second time during the month. They closed it out by defeating Dartmouth, 65-46, in Hanover (Jan. 29).

### HSU-IN FOR PLAYER OF THE WEEK

• Abbey Hsu scored 21 points on 8-of-11 shooting (5-7 3-PT) at Harvard (Jan. 15) and was named Ivy League Player of the Week for a second time this season. Along the way, Hsu posted season-highs in rebounds (9) and blocks (2), while also tallying three assists and a steal.





## COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

### A QUARTER TO REMEMBER

• Abbey Hsu scored 19 points in the third quarter against UMass (Dec. 11), setting a new Columbia women's basketball record for points in a quarter. Hsu was 5-of-7 from the perimeter and 6-of-9 from the field in the period. The previous mark belonged to Riley Casey, who scored 16 against Harvard on Feb. 8, 2019. Remarkably, Hsu is also tied for fourth all-time for points in a quarter, scoring 13 on two different occasions. The most recent also came this season, when she netted 13 in the third quarter against Stony Brook (Nov. 24).

### TRIO OF DOUBLE-DOUBLES

• Kaitlyn Davis (18-11), Kitty Henderson (12-10) and Jaida Patrick (11-10) all recorded double-doubles in Columbia's 78-49 victory at Marist (Dec. 5). At the time, it marked just the second occasion last season in NCAA Div. I women's basketball that three players from the same team all recorded a double-double. The other belonged to Texas State, who did so in a 93-23 win over Arlington Baptist (NCCAA) on Nov. 29. There was just one known instance the year prior, which was accomplished by South Carolina when they put together four double-doubles against College of Charleston on Nov. 15, 2020.

• Columbia became the first Ivy League team to accomplish the feat since Brown on Dec. 31, 2018 in a 109-102 double overtime defeat against Northern Illinois.

### RAINING THREES

• Columbia went 16-for-29 from 3-point land against Missouri (Nov. 27), setting a new program record for 3-pointers made in a game. In the process, the Lions also posted the seventh-highest 3-point shooting percentage for a single game in program history (.552) with a minimum of 10 makes.

### TAKING DOWN THE POWER CONFERENCES

• With wins over Clemson, Georgetown and Boston College last season, Columbia is 7-8 in its last 15 games against power-conference opponents (ACC, Big 10, Big 12, BIG EAST, SEC, Pac 12). The 15-game span began in 2016 with an overtime win at home over Providence. The Lions then opened the 2017-18 season by defeating the Friars on the road, 73-64. The Lions earned their first ACC win in the 2017-18 season as well, when they defeated Boston College, 68-60, in front of a record 2,372 fans on Education Day. In 2019-20, they added to the tally with a 54-49 victory on Education Day over Georgetown (Dec. 6).

### PRESEASON NUGGETS

• Columbia begins its 38th varsity season and 36th competing at the NCAA Div. I level as a member of the Ivy League. The program's first season competing as the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium was 1984-85, followed by its first season competing in both the Ivy League and NCAA Div. I in 1986-87. The 2020-21 season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

• Columbia returns 13 of its 15 players from the 2021-22 season, which accounts for over 96 percent of its scoring, rebounding and minutes.

• The Lions have two newcomers to the roster this year, welcoming in Perri Page (Pittsburgh, Pa. / Chartiers Valley) and Susie Rafiu (Ipswich, England / Copleston).

• The 2021-22 team went 25-7 overall with an 12-2 mark in Ivy League play. Both its wins and Ivy League wins totals were the most in program history. Columbia played in the postseason for the first time in 36 years, advanced to the Ivy League Tournament Championship, and advanced to the National Quarterfinals of the WNIT.

• Columbia returns All-Ivy League selections Kaitlyn Davis (First Team) and Abbey Hsu (Second Team). Both Davis and Hsu were also named to the Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association All-Met teams, with Hsu earning first-team honors and Davis landing on the second team.

• Columbia was picked second in the 2022-23 Ivy League Preseason poll with 108 total votes. The preseason ranking is the team's highest in program history.

## COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

### SUPPORT BLACK WOMEN CAMPAIGN

• Columbia women's basketball launched a campaign entitled "Support Black Women" which will focus on supporting local black-women-owned businesses in the Harlem area, as well as growing the game at the grassroots level by providing mentorship to aspiring young basketball players. This year's campaign is an extension of last year's campaign that focused on allyship.

• During each home game, the team will highlight a local Black-women-owned business on the video board, providing fans with the business's name, address and primary function. The Lions will also invite representatives from those businesses to attend their games. Each business was hand-picked by a member of the program.

• As they did last year, the Lions have vowed to continue ordering their home pregame meals from local Black-women-owned restaurants, as well as collecting and donating resources to local women's shelters.

• Last season, the players mentored young girls of color in the Harlem community by connecting with local organizations and implementing their SEED (Success, Envision, Empowerment, Determination) mentorship model. They worked specifically with The Harlem Children's Zone and Girls, Inc. The team also volunteered at community basketball clinics, such as Grow Our Game, which is a program that empowers the next generation of young girls to become fierce, amazing leaders through confidence, passion and community impact, all while learning the game of basketball.

### #EDGE

• Since Megan Griffith became the head coach of the Lions in 2016, the program's motto has been "EDGE" which stands for "Energy, Discipline, Grit and Excellence."

### ABOUT COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY

• Columbia University was founded in 1754 as King's College by royal charter of King George II of England. It is the oldest institution of higher learning in the state of New York and the fifth oldest in the United States. One of eight members of the Ivy League, Columbia University is one of the world's most important centers of research and at the same time a distinctive and distinguished learning environment for undergraduates and graduate students in many scholarly and professional fields.

### COLUMBIA-BARNARD ATHLETIC CONSORTIUM

• Women's basketball at Columbia began in 1984-85, one year after the creation of the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium. Two years later, Columbia became an NCAA Div. I program (1986-87). Prior to the formation of the consortium, the women's basketball program competed at neighboring Barnard College as the Barnard Bears.

• The creation of the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium in 1983 was an unprecedented endeavor. Made in tandem with Columbia's decision to become coed, a request to the NCAA allowed the two schools to form an athletic consortium, making Barnard the only women's college in the country whose students could compete on Division I athletics teams.

• Currently, Columbia has three players that attend Barnard College (Noa Comesaña, Mary Lobon and Nicole Stephens).

### MORNINGSIDE HOOPS PODCAST

• The Morningside Hoops Podcast is back for another season. Columbia Athletics debuted the new podcast in 2018, which features weekly interviews with coaches and members of the men's and women's basketball programs. New episodes are available weekly on Spotify and various other podcast platforms.

The majority of those will be exclusively available on ESPN+, the new direct-to-consumer sports streaming service from The Walt Disney Company's Direct-to-Consumer and International division in partnership with ESPN. The Ivy League will also have at least 24 events air on ESPN's linear networks each year, including the men's and women's basketball conference tournaments.







# MEGAN GRIFFITH

**COLUMBIA ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2016**

Megan Griffith '07CC enters her seventh season as head coach of the Columbia women's basketball program. She was named head coach in March of 2016.

Griffith has ushered in a new era of Columbia women's basketball. Her six-year tenure as head coach have combined to be the winningest six-year stretch in the NCAA Division I history of the program. Over that time, the Lions have earned seven power-conference wins, including their first victories over opponents from the ACC and Big East. Columbia has also qualified for the Ivy League Tournament in each of its last two seasons, playing in the championship game in 2021-22 before accepting the program's first bid to the Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT).

The 2021-22 season was a landmark year for Griffith and the Lions. Griffith coached Columbia to its winningest season in program history, going 25-7 overall with a 12-2 Ivy League record. The Lions shattered several team records and accomplished many program firsts throughout the season, which included starting the season 5-0, defeating an ACC opponent on the road (Clemson), winning a program-record eight consecutive games, starting Ivy League play 7-0, competing in and winning its first postseason game in 36 years, competing in its first Ivy League Tournament, advancing to the tournament championship game, and advancing to the quarterfinals of its first WNIT. Columbia's run to the WNIT quarterfinals is the deepest by any team and Ivy League history, and included victories over Patriot League champion Holy Cross, Old Dominion and Boston College. The Lions came back from as many as 17 points down to defeat the Eagles on March 24 at Levien Gymnasium, marking the largest comeback to win a game in program history.

In winning 25 games, Columbia broke the program's previous mark of 21-6, accomplished by the 1985-86 Hall of Fame team that won that year's New York State AIAW Championship and advanced to the NCAA Div. III Regional. The program's winningest Div. I and Ivy League seasons prior to 2021-22 came in 2009-10, when the Lions went 18-10 and 9-5 in the Ivy League.

The 2021-22 season also saw junior Kaitlyn Davis voted First Team All-Ivy by the league's coaches, while sophomore Abbey Hsu was named Second Team All-Ivy. It marked just the fourth time since the Lions officially joined the league in 1986-87 that Columbia placed two players on one of the two All-Ivy teams – two of those occasions have come under Griffith's watch. Hsu went on to be named First Team All-Met by the Met Basketball Writers Association (MBWA), with Davis landing Second Team All-Met honors. Additionally, first-year guard Kitty Henderson was named the All-Met Women's Div. I Rookie of the Year, marking three consecutive competition seasons in which a Lion has taken home the award (Abbey Hsu, 2019-20; Sienna Durr, 2018-19).

At the Women's Final Four in Minneapolis, Griffith was named the 2021-22 CBB Analytics Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by the Asian Coaches Association. Griffith was honored with the award at the Association's Women's Basketball Coaches Conference.

After building up the program over her first three seasons, Griffith led the Lions to what was a historical 2019-20 campaign, which included a record of 17-10, an 8-6 Ivy League mark and the team's first ever qualification into the Ivy League Basketball Tournament. Columbia started off the year with a 9-4 non-conference record, which included a

six-game winning streak and victories over reigning conference champions Fordham, Robert Morris and Mercer. The Lions then headed into league play, where they started 2-4 before rolling off a then-program record six-game Ivy League winning streak. The streak began the weekend of Feb. 14-15 with the team's first ever weekend sweep over Dartmouth and Harvard, including a 25-point blowout over the Crimson. The following weekend, Griffith's Lions went on the road and swept Brown and Yale for their first back-to-back Ivy League weekend sweep in program history. The winning streak grew to six the weekend of Feb. 28-29, when Columbia went on the road and swept yet another weekend over Harvard and Dartmouth. The Lions overcame a 10-point deficit in Cambridge to earn their first season sweep of Harvard in program history. Less than 24 hours later, they swept Dartmouth to lock up their first berth into the Ivy League Basketball Tournament.

First-year Abbey Hsu went on to be named the Met Basketball Writers Association (MBWA) Women's Div. I Rookie of the Year after ranking top 10 in the Ivy League in scoring (14.3) and leading the Ancient Eight in 3-point shooting (.411). She and sophomore Sienna Durr were each named Second Team All-Ivy League, becoming the first pair of Lions in 12 years to earn All-Ivy League first- or second-team honors. Hsu was named Ivy League Rookie of the Week five times through the season, as well as Ivy League Player of the Week and USBWA National Rookie of the Week on Feb. 18 after averaging 25.0 points and shooting 50 percent (10-of-20) from 3-point range in a weekend sweep over Dartmouth and Harvard.

Prior to her return to Columbia, Griffith spent six seasons at Princeton, including her last four as an assistant coach and the team's recruiting coordinator. She also served as the Tigers' director of basketball operations from 2010-12. The last two years, Griffith has helped Princeton make back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament. During that span, the Tigers posted a 54-7 overall record, including an undefeated 30-0 regular season in 2014-15, and a 26-2 mark in Ivy League play.

In Griffith's time with Princeton, the Tigers eclipsed 20 victories and reached the postseason each year, while securing five Ivy League titles. She has mentored 13 All-Ivy League players, including Blake Dietrick, who was the 2015 Ivy League Player of the Year and a WBCA Honorable Mention All-American, and 2013 Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year, Lauren Polansky.

Griffith captained the Lions for three seasons and was a two-time All-Ivy League selection (2006 and 2007). Griffith is one of nine Lions to score more than 1,000 points during her career, averaging 10.1 points per game. During her junior year, Griffith ranked 22nd in the nation in assists, averaging 5.5 per game, while chipping in 15.2 points per game. She was twice named Academic All-Ivy League and was a member of the Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar Team two straight years.

Following graduation, Griffith played three years of professional basketball in Europe. She joined FoA Nice Basketball in Forssa, Finland, during the 2007-08 season and was named the team's MVP at the end of the season. In 2008-09, Griffith led the Espoo Basket Team to the National Finnish Championship and the Finnish Cup Championship titles. During the year she was also a youth basketball coach for Honka Basketball Club.

Griffith was also a member of the Celeritas-Donar Basketball team in Groningen, Netherlands. In addition, she was named a U20 Dames 1 assistant coach and U18 Northern Selection Team assistant coach, while working as a youth coach and clinic director for Celeritas-Donar.

Griffith founded Back to Basics Basketball in 2008, an organization developed to teach basketball skills, while providing training and mentoring in her hometown of King of Prussia, Pennsylvania.

Griffith graduated from Columbia with a degree in economics in 2007.

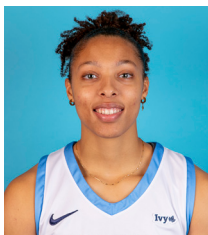

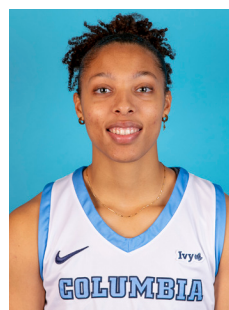
