### NOW IT'S TIME FOR THE BREAKDOWN

The No. 23/22 University of Missouri football team heads to Nashville to open Southeastern Conference play on Saturday, Sept. 30 at Vanderbilt. The Tigers and Commodores kick off from FirstBank Stadium at 3 p.m. CT. The game will air on SEC Network and Tiger Radio Network.

Mizzou (4-0) moved into the Top 25 – ranking No. 23 in the Associated Press poll and No. 22 in The US LBM Coaches Poll. The Tigers defeated Memphis in the 2023 Zou to the Lou Classic inside The Dome at America's Center in St. Louis. Three St. Louis natives, WR Luther Burden III, QB Brady Cook and RB Cody Schrader, led the way for the offense Saturday night. Burden had 10 receptions for a career high 177 yards, Cook threw for 341 and two TDs while Schrader averaged 8.8 yards per carry, totaling 123 yards and a score.

### THE SERIES

Saturday marks the 15th meeting between the two schools with Missouri leading the series 9-4-1, holding a three-game winning streak over the Commodores and leading 3-2 in games played in Nashville.

### THE COACHES

ELIAH DRINKWITZ is in his fourth season as Mizzou's head coach. He had led the Tigers to bowl appearances in each of his first three seasons, joining former head coach Warren Powers as the only two MU head coaches to achieve that feat. Additionally, only Powers won more games in his first two seasons at MU (1978-79, 15) than Drinkwitz (11). Prior to taking the Mizzou job, Drinkwitz was 12-1 as the head coach at Appalachian State in 2019. He had previous stops as the OC at NC State, Boise State and Arkansas State.

CLARK LEA is in his third season as head coach at Vanderbilt. The Commodores alum is 9-20 during that span.

### STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS ...

- Mizzou is playing its 133rd season of college football.
- Head Coach Eliah Drinkwitz has led Mizzou to a bowl in each of his first three seasons, only the second coach in school history to do so along with the late Warren Powers (1978-84).
- The 2023 roster features 32 players who have started at least four games in the collegiate career at the FBS level.
- Thirty-eight student-athletes on the team are from Missouri, including eight from the 573 area code, 19 from the St. Louis metropolitan region, nine from the Kansas City area and two from southwest Missouri.
- Mizzou has now finished nonconference play undefeated 10 times since 2000, and the first time since defeating Memphis, Purdue, UT Martin and Wyoming in 2018.
- MU totaled a season-high 542 yards of total offense vs. Memphis – 341 through the air and 201 on the ground.
- QB Brady Cook enters Saturday's game ranked 10th among all FBS quarterbacks in passing efficiency (185.2). He has thrown for 687 yards and four TDs over the last two games.
- WR Luther Burden III leads the NCAA FBS in YAC (216) and missed tackles forced (11) according to PFF College. He's the fifth MU player to register three-straight 100-yard games, the first since Emanuel Hall in 2017.
- RB Cody Schrader ranks fourth among active NCAA players in rushing yards with 4,217. Schrader leads the SEC in rushing, averaging 100.75 ypg. His 6.2 yards per carry average leads all SEC backs with 50 or more totes.
- Javon Foster's 87.8 grade leads all P5 offensive tackles in PFF College's rankings through four games.
- WR Marquis Johnson's 76-yard TD from QB Brady Cook stands as MU's longest play from scrimmage in 2023.
- K Harrison Mevis has made 68 career field goals and sits in sole possession of MU's all-time record.
- CB Kris Abrams-Draine had a team-leading seven tackles and an INT vs. Memphis and topped 100 career tackles.
- The Tigers next home game - vs. LSU on Oct. 7 - is sold out, Mizzou's second Memorial Stadium sellout in 2023.

#### PRESS BOX

The Memorial Stadium / Faurot Field press box is located on the sixth floor of the west side of the stadium. On game days, the facility opens to the working media three hours prior to kickoff. The space is accessible using the elevator at Gate 5W. Mizzou Athletics will provide a meal, drinks and snacks during the game.

#### POSTGAME

Postgame interviews with Mizzou head coach Eliah Drinkwitz and student-athletes will be held in SEZ defensive meeting room following a brief cooling-off period. Any in-game interviews and postgame interviews on the field are prohibited. Visiting team post-game media availability is at the direction of the visiting communications staff. The visiting team post-game interview room is in the SE corner tunnel (labeled 020), across from the visiting locker room.

#### MEDIA PARKING

Media parking is located at Tiger Ave. Parking Structure (TAPS), at the corner of Tiger Ave. and Hospital Dr. The main entrance is on the east side of the building, directly across from the children's ER entrance. Parking passes will be digitally distributed whenever possible.

## OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- Mizzou will have six permanent captains during the 2023 season, including four players who filled the same role last fall: LB Chad Bailey, QB Brady Cook, OL Javon Foster, and OL Darius Robinson. First-time captains RB Cody Schrader and LB Ty'Ron Hopper were also chosen for the honor.

## LAST TIME OUT - MISSOURI 34, MEMPHIS 27

- QB Brady Cook, WR Luther Burden III and RB Cody Schrader produced big plays in their hometown that keyed Mizzou's seven-point victory over previously-unbeaten Memphis at The Dome at America's Center.
- Cook got the Tigers started with a 76-yard scoring strike to WR Marquis Johnson and completed 18-of-25 passes for 341 yards.
- Burden produced career highs with 10 receptions and 177 yards - the most by any Tiger in Mizzou's seven games played at the Dome.
- Schrader registered his second 100-yard rushing performance of the season, totaling 123 on 14 carries, including a fourth-quarter 37-yard touchdown that netted Mizzou's final points.
- Missouri improved to 4-0 for the first time since 2013 and ran its St. Louis win streak to seven straight games, dating back to 2002.
- MU finished with a season-high 542 yards of total offense - 341 through the air and 201 on the ground.
- DB Kris Abrams-Draine led the defense with seven tackles, one for loss, an interception and a pass break-up; LB Ty'Ron Hopper also logged seven tackles and DE Johnny Walker Jr. had six, including a sack, a quarterback hurry and a forced fumble.

## TIGERS IN THE POLLS

- On the heels of its victory over Memphis and its first 4-0 start in 10 years, Missouri moved into the Top 25 for the first time since the 2019 season.
- The Tigers ranked No. 23 in the Associated Press poll and No. 22 in The US LBM Coaches Poll this week.
- Mizzou was last ranked in the AP poll on Oct. 23, 2019 (No. 22) and it's the Tigers' first appearance in the Coaches Poll since Sept. 20, 2015 (No. 23).
- This week mark's the 256th week the Tigers have been ranked in the AP poll since 1939.

## HE IS HIM

- WR Luther Burden III set career highs for the fourth-straight game with 10 catches for 177 yards in the 34-27 win over Memphis in his hometown of St. Louis.
- It was his third-straight 100-yard game and fifth-straight contest with five or more receptions. Burden surpassed his 2022 receiving total of 375 yds, running his 2023 total to 502 yds through four contests.
- He leads the NCAA FBS in yards after catch (216) and missed tackles forced (11) according to PFF College. He's the fifth Mizzou player to register three-straight 100-yard games and the first since Emanuel Hall in 2017.
- Burden is the second Tiger with seven catches in each of the first four games of a season (TJ Moe, 2010).

## FANCY LIKE

- CB Kris Abrams-Draine had a team-leading seven tackles, including a TFL, interception and PBU in Mizzou's 34-27 win over Memphis in St. Louis.
- He grabbed his fifth career INT and became the first Tiger to haul in picks in back-to-back games since Daylan Carnell against New Mexico State and Arkansas.
- KAD racked up his 100th career tackle during the second quarter, tallying seven total stops on the day.
- He has 18 stops on the season and is averaging 4.5 tackles per game.

## CAN I KICK IT

- A week after his SEC record-breaking game-winner to beat K-State, Harrison Mevis' 25-yard field goal with five seconds left in the opening half against Memphis marked his 67th as a Tiger.
- The senior broke Andrew Baggett's Mizzou record for most field goals made in program history (66).
- Mevis extended his record with a 32-yard boot in the fourth, giving Mizzou a 10-point cushion in the win.

**MIZZOU IN SEC OPENERS**

- Saturday's contest marks the start of Southeastern Conference play for the Tigers, who have gone 3-8 in league openers since joining the conference in 2012.
- The Tigers claimed a 51-28 road victory over Vanderbilt in 2013 in the two programs' only previous meeting in an SEC opener.

**MUSIC CITY MUSINGS**

- Missouri will be making its sixth visit to Nashville since joining the SEC and the Tigers hold a 3-2 advantage over the Commodores in those meetings.
- Overall, the Tigers have won 10 of the previous 15 meetings with VU, going 10-4-1; Mizzou's 26-17 win in 2016 was vacated, giving MU an official 9-4-1 edge in the series that dates back to 1895.
- MU has averaged 44.3 points per game in their three victories at FirstBank Stadium (2013, 2017, 2021).
- Mizzou is 8-0 vs. Vanderbilt when scoring 24 or more.
- A pair of Tigers - DL Nyles Gaddy and OL Brandon Solis - call Nashville home, while just one Commodore - St. Louisian Trent Weaver hails from the Show-Me State.

**DETROIT ROCK CITY**

- DE Darius Robinson is battling through and up-and-down season. He had two tackles and his first sack of the season in limited action against Memphis as he fights a nagging calf strain.
- The senior captain is averaging 3.25 tackles per game.

**HERE COMES THE BOOM**

- P Luke Bauer assumed punting duties for the first time against Memphis, booting three kicks for an average of 47 yards, landing one inside the 20.
- He had a career-long kick of 59 yards in the game and has served as Mizzou's holder this season.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT**

- TE Jordon Harris was tabbed for his first career start in the Tigers' win over Memphis in St. Louis.
- The true freshman, who only played a year of prep football, provided extra protection on Mizzou's first drive, starting two tight ends with the ball on the 9-yard line.
- Harris has been a regular on special teams but saw extended time Saturday as fellow freshman Brett Norfleet missed the game with a rib injury.

**IN THE TRENCHES**

- Javon Foster sits atop PFF College's Power 5 offensive tackle rankings through four games.
- The senior holds an 87.8 grade in the outlet's metrics.
- Foster is on the watch lists for the Lombardi Trophy, Outland Trophy and Reese's Senior Bowl.
- He earned Preseason Second-Team All-SEC honors from the league's coaches and media.
- Foster has made 33 career starts for the Tigers.

**CODY B GOODE**

- Cody Schrader broke off a 37-yard TD in the waning moments of the fourth to give MU a 14-point lead. He finished with 123 yards on 14 carries.
- The MU offense racked up 542 total yards, its most since garnering 558 against Louisiana Tech in 2021.
- Schrader leads the SEC in rushing, averaging 100.75 ypg. His 6.2 yards per carry average leads all SEC backs with 50 or more totes.

**BRING OUT THE POP-TARTS!**

- Harrison Mevis' 61-yard field goal to beat No. 15 Kansas State as time expired was selected as the Pop-Tarts Crazy Good Play of the Week on Sept. 22.
- The boot set an SEC record, was the second-longest field goal in Mizzou history and earned the senior SEC Special Teams Player of the Week Honors.

**NOW WE'RE COOKIN'**

- QB Brady Cook has turned in a two-game stretch like few others in Missouri football history, racking up a combined 697 passing yards in the Tigers' two victories against Kansas State and Memphis.
- With 341 passing yards Saturday against Memphis, Cook logged just the ninth back-to-back 300-yard passing performance in program history.
- Cook tied Drew Lock's single-game record of seven 20-yard pass completions Saturday, one week after connecting on six different passes of 20+ yards in the win over K-State, becoming one of just seven MU signal-callers to accomplish the feat (see below).
- Cook enters Saturday's game ranked 10th among all FBS quarterbacks in passing efficiency (185.2).
- Against the 15th-ranked Wildcats, Cook turned in a career day, throwing for a personal single-game high of 356 yards to become just the 10th Mizzou quarterback to surpass the 350-yard mark in a contest.
- Cook has thrown 306 attempts without an INT, surpassing Chase Daniel's MU record of 254 and 19 shy of Andre Woodson's SEC-record of 325 (2006-07).
- The St. Louis product earned one of the the Manning Award Stars of the Week citations from the All-State Sugar Bowl on Sept. 18 in recognition of his performance vs. K-State.
- Cook was also named to midseason watch list for the 2023 Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award.

HISTORIC STARTS

- Missouri is off to a 4-0 start for the first time since 2013, when the Tigers won their first seven games en route to a school-record 12-win campaign.
- Mizzou also concluded nonconference play with an unblemished record for the first time in five years.
- This season marks the 19th time in program history the Tigers have won their first four games in a season; they have gone on to post a winning season in each of the previous 18 years in which they started 4-0.

ANOTHER BRICK IN THE WALL

- The defense has impressed in the first four games, particularly against the run; MU ranks 15th in the FBS in rush defense, allowing just 83.3 ypg.
- The Tigers have not yielded a rushing TD in 2023.
- MU’s defense limited South Dakota to 194 yards of total offense in the opener, the lowest single-game total by an opponent since Oct. 24, 2020 vs. Kentucky.
- Led by SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week Nyles Gaddy, the Tigers logged 4.0 sacks and 12 tackles for losses against MTSU (Sept. 9), the most Mizzou TFLs since at least the 2000 season.
- MU followed that up by holding No. 15 K-State to its lowest single-game rushing total (138 yards) over its last 11 games, then limited Memphis to an average of 2.9 yards per carry (and just 83 total rushing yards) in Saturday’s victory in St. Louis.

LIGHTNING CRASHES

- Freshman WR Marquis Johnson had a 76-yard touchdown reception from QB Brady Cook to open the scoring in Mizzou’s 34-27 win over Memphis in STL.
- It was Johnson’s first career TD grab and the Tigers’ longest play from scrimmage this season.
- The 76-yard connection was MU’s longest scrimmage play in seven games at The Dome at America’s Center.
- The previous best was a 49-yard score from Blaine Gabbert to Wes Kemp in the 2009 contest vs. Illinois.
- Johnson was also named the Tigers’ team special teams’ player of the game.

PROOF OF BURDEN

- WR Luther Burden III continued his noteworthy start to the 2023 season with his third-consecutive 100-yard receiving performance in MU’s victory over Memphis.
- Burden’s total of 32 receptions is tied with LSU’s Malik Nabers for the top figure in the SEC, while his average of 8.0 receptions per outing is tied for fifth nationally.
- Burden’s 504 yards on the season are the most for any Tiger receiver through four games in the history of the program; the total currently ranks fourth among all FBS receivers on the season.
- Burden also recorded his fourth-straight game with seven receptions or more (and fifth overall).
- Burden became the fifth different Tiger in program history to register three 100-yard games in a row, reaching the mark before halftime against Memphis.
- The last Missouri receiver to post three straight 100-yard performances was Emanuel Hall in 2017 vs. Florida, Tennessee and Arkansas.
- Burden also became the fourth Mizzou player with seven receptions in five-straight games, following Jeremy Maclin (2008), Danario Alexander (2009) and TJ Moe (2010); he is just the second Tiger to log at least seven receptions in the first four games of a season (joining Moe in 2010).

- Senior K Harrison Mevis continued his assault on the Mizzou record book Saturday, converting both of his field goal attempts vs. Memphis to move past Andrew Baggett into sole possession of the top spot on MU's career field goals list with his 67th and 68th successful boots as a Tiger.
- Against Kansas State (Sept. 16), Mevis added to his MU record for successful makes beyond 50 yards, converting his 11th such kick as a Tiger with his game-winning, 61-yard field goal as time expired.
- That kick for the Warsaw, Ind., native broke the SEC record for the longest field goal in the conference's history, edging three 60-yard kicks by Fuad Reveiz (Tennessee, 1982), Kevin Butler (Georgia, 1984) and Chris Perkins (Florida, 1984), who previously shared the record.

## FEROCIOUS AT FAUROT

- Mizzou's win over Kansas State (Sept. 16) extended its nonconference home win streak to 16-straight games dating back to an Oct. 21, 2017 victory over Idaho.
- Missouri's current home win streak over non-SEC foes trails only an 18-game streak from Sept. 17, 2005 through Nov. 17, 2012 for the longest in program history.
- The Tigers have averaged 44.6 ppg on offense and held opponents to 302.1 yards of total offense over the course of their home nonconference streak.
- Eli Drinkwitz has led the Tigers to a 17-6 home record at Faurot (.739) including a perfect 9-0 record against nonconference competition.
- Over the last 21 seasons (2003-23), Mizzou has won 103 of its 151 home contests (.682) overall.

## FEEL THE LOVE

- Several Tigers earned accolades for their performances in Mizzou's upset win over Kansas State on Sept. 16.
- K Harrison Mevis was named the SEC's Special Teams Player of the Week after going 3-of-4 on field goal attempts, including the game-winning 61-yarder.
- QB Brady Cook earned one of the Manning Award's Stars of the Week by the All-State Sugar Bowl, as well as a citation for the Davey O'Brien Award's Great 8 List; Cook finished the day 23-of-35 passing for 356 yards, two TDs and a QB Rating of 64.2.
- LB Ty'Ron Hopper picked up Reese's Senior Bowl Defensive Player of the Week laurels after leading the Tigers with eight tackles – six solos and two assists – along with a pair of pass breakups, two quarterback hurries and a tackle for a loss in the 30-27 victory.

## CUE MR. BRIGHTSIDE ...

- Missouri drew a sold-out crowd of 62,621 for its Sept. 16 upset of K-State, marking its first sellout since its 2019 Homecoming contest against Ole Miss (Oct. 12).
- Mizzou previously drew 57,645 for its Sept. 9 win over Middle Tennessee, and 50,434 for its season opener against South Dakota, giving the Tigers a total of 170,700 spectators so far in 2023, which represents its top mark through three dates since 2015, when the Tigers drew 201,500 for their first three home games against SEMO, UConn and South Carolina.
- The K-State sellout marked the eighth time in its last nine home games MU has topped the 50,000 mark.
- Mizzou's opening-night crowd vs. South Dakota (Aug. 31) represented its largest crowd for a home opener in four years.

## RUNNIN' DOWN A DREAM

- RB Cody Schrader became just the fourth active NCAA running back to reach the 4,000 career rushing yard milestone with his 84-yard performance vs. Middle Tennessee (Sept. 9).
- Schrader rushed for 3,069 yards at Division II Truman before joining the Tigers in 2022; he ranks fourth among active NCAA players with his 4,217 yards, trailing Greenville's Paul Garrett (5,183), Barton's Jordan Terrell (4,389) and SEMO's Geno Hess (4,364).

## SOMETHING TO PROVE

- Missouri comes off a six-win 2022 campaign and its third-consecutive bowl-qualifying season under Eli Drinkwitz, who joined Warren Powers as the only Mizzou head coaches to lead the Tigers to bowl berths in their first three campaigns at the helm.
- MU entered the new season with something to prove: having not secured four straight bowl berths since 2011, when it capped a string of seven consecutive bowl appearances (2005-11) with a win over North Carolina in the Independence Bowl.

## THE NEXT EPISODE ...

- Mizzou's defense flexed its collective muscle in the Tigers' season-opening victory over South Dakota, holding the Coyotes to 194 yards of total offense, marking their best single-game performance since 2020, when they held Kentucky to 145 yards.
- Additionally, the Tigers allowed just 1.1 yards per attempt on 35 South Dakota rushing attempts — its lowest single-game average allowed (minimum of 35 attempts) in 23 seasons, dating back to a Nov. 11, 2000 game in which they gave up an average of just 0.3 yards per carry against Baylor.
- The Tigers set the defensive tone for the game early, limiting the Coyotes to five yards of total offense in the opening quarter and just 62 yards in the first half.
- DE Johnny Walker Jr. led Mizzou in tackles with six, adding a TFL and half a sack in the victory over USD.
- Marvin Burks Jr. made an instant impact in his collegiate debut, tallying four tackles and a nine-yard sack on a key fourth-down attempt in the third quarter.
- Mizzou held USD to 2-of-13 third-down conversion attempts and just 14 first downs for the night.

## IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- Mizzou's announced attendance of 50,434 for its game vs. South Dakota represented Mizzou's top total for a home opener since 2019, when the Tigers drew 51,215 spectators vs. West Virginia (Sept. 7).
- The Tigers drew a total of 381,677 fans to seven home games last season, marking a 17.2% increase in its football attendance from 2021 to 2022.
- Mizzou's 2022 season total ranks as the 12th best in program history, averaging 54,525 fans.
- The Tigers drew crowds of 60,618 vs. Vanderbilt (Oct. 22) and 61,047 vs. Kentucky (Nov. 5), marking the first back-to-back 60,000+ home crowds since 2015 (South Carolina and Florida).

## FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME

- A number of Tigers logged career firsts in Mizzou's win over South Dakota (Aug. 31), including 18 players who saw their first game action in Black and Gold.
- WR Mekhi Miller led the parade, hauling in his first career TD reception, an 18-yard strike from Brady Cook seven minutes into the contest.
- DB Marvin Burks Jr. made his presence known in his collegiate debut, totaling four stops; none of those were bigger than his first career sack for a nine-yard loss on a 4th and 7 at the Mizzou 33 midway through the third period.
- Additionally, WR Theo Wease Jr. hauled in his first TD reception as a Tiger in MU's win over Middle Tennessee (Sept. 9).
- DE Nyles Gaddy recorded his first two sacks as a Tiger in the victory over Middle Tennessee.

## I WANT MORE

- Mizzou's offense features a new play caller in QB Coach Kirby Moore who joined the Tigers in the offseason.
- The Ambush Offense benefits from the return of junior signal-caller Brady Cook, who amassed over 3,000 yards of total offense a year ago; RB Cody Schrader who rushed for team bests of 658 yards and eight touchdowns and one of my most dynamic players in college football, Luther Burden III. Burden slides over to the slot WR and should see his touches increase.

**SCHRADER SHREDDING**

- RB Cody Schrader logged an impressive start to the season vs. South Dakota (Aug. 31), topping the 100-yard mark for the first time as a Tiger with 138 rushing yards on 18 carries and a TD.
- Schrader added 123 yards on 14 carries in MU's win over Memphis, his 18th career 100-yard game.
- He helped ice the victory with a 37-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter for his 50th career rushing TD.
- Schrader turned in an impressive debut in 2022, leading all MU rushers with 658 yards and eight TDs.
- A transfer from Division II Truman State and native of St. Louis, he enters Saturday's game with 4,217 career rushing yards to his credit; by comparison, that total would rank second on Mizzou's all-time rushing list, trailing only Brad Smith [4,289].
- Coupled with 653 receiving yards and 34 return yards, Schrader has amassed 4,904 all-purpose yards in his career; in comparison, Schrader's total eclipses Brad Smith's career total [4,419] and trails only the top two on Mizzou's career all-purpose yardage list: Jeremy Maclin [5,609] and Marcus Murphy [5,112].
- Schrader led all of Division II in 2021 with 2,074 rushing yards on 300 carries and 24 TDs.

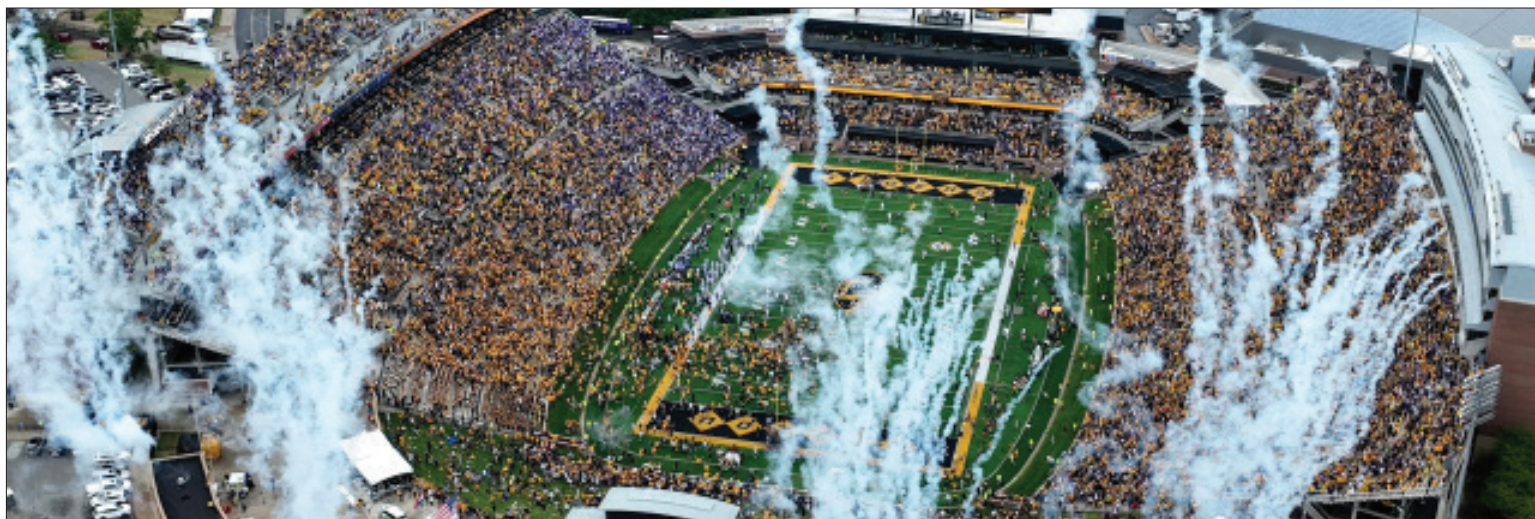
**AN ENSEMBLE CAST**

- The Tigers welcome back 18 starters - second most in the Southeastern Conference, including preseason All-SEC selections Kris Abrams-Draine, Ty'Ron Hopper and Darius Robinson leading Mizzou's defense, along with Javon Foster and All-America K Harrison Mevis on the offensive side of the ball.

**THE BOYS OF FALL**

- QB Sam Horn saw his first extended action under center in the opener against South Dakota.
- He had his first career passing TD in the fourth quarter, hooking up with Luther Burden III on a 15-yard pass-and-catch to account for the final points of the game.
- Horn was true on his first three tosses, finishing 3-of-5 for 54 yards, featuring a 31 yard toss to Mekhi Miller.
- A rare two-sport collegiate athlete, Horn pitched for Mizzou's baseball team last spring before suffering a forearm injury and touched 98 MPH on the in-house radar in Arlington, Texas against nationally-ranked TCU on Feb. 19.

## MISSOURI FOOTBALL HISTORY



### HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

Football at the University of Missouri dates to 1890 and the Tigers have an all-time record of 700-586-52 entering their 133rd season. Missouri was a charter member of the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association in 1907 which evolved into the Big Six Conference (1928), Big Seven (1948) and Big Eight (1958), before the creation of the Big 12 Conference in 1996, and MU's move to the Southeastern Conference in 2012. The Tigers won conference championships in 1909, 1913, 1919, 1924, 1925, 1927, 1939, 1941, 1942, 1945, 1960 and 1969. They won Big 12 North Division championships in 2007, 2008 and 2010 and SEC East Division championships in 2013 and 2014. Missouri has had two undefeated teams – the 1909 Tigers were 7-0-1 and in 1960 they went 11-0 (includes a forfeit victory over Kansas).

### A TOWER OF STRENGTH

MU's football program ranks as the second oldest west of the Mississippi River and one of the 10 oldest in major college football – behind only Rutgers (1869), Michigan (1879), Navy (1880), Minnesota (1883), Cincinnati (1885), Notre Dame (1888) and Iowa (1889) among NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision institutions.

### THE TIGER NICKNAME

The nickname "Tigers" was adopted soon after football was adopted in 1890 to honor a Civil War home guard that towns people organized to protect Columbia from guerilla attacks – most notably from the notorious "Bloody Bill" Anderson. Their spirit is now embodied in the MU mascot – "Truman the Tiger" – named for the Missouri-bred President of the United States, Harry S. Truman.

### SOCK IT TO THE '60s

During the decade of the 1960s, Coach Dan Devine's Tigers were the only team in the nation to never lose more than three games in a season – compiling a record of 77-22-6. The 1960 team was MU's first to be ranked #1 on Nov. 14, 1960. But MU lost to Kansas in the season finale – a game KU later forfeited for use of an ineligible player. In the Orange Bowl, Missouri beat Navy and Heisman Trophy winner Joe Bellino. The Tigers finished fourth and fifth in the final polls, which in those days were released prior to the bowl games. Minnesota won the national championship but lost in the Rose Bowl. Had the final polls come after the bowl games, MU could have been the national title winner. Missouri's other stint as the nation's #1 team came in 2007, before the Tigers fell to Oklahoma in the Big 12 title game.

### UPSET KINGS

During the 1970s, Missouri teams coached by Al Onofrio (1971-78) and Warren Powers (1978-84), recorded a string of astounding upsets. Onofrio directed 14 victories over ranked opponents, including #8 Notre Dame (30-26, 1972, at South Bend), #2 Nebraska (13-12, 1973), #2 Alabama (20-7, 1975 at Birmingham), #8 USC (46-25, 1976 at Los Angeles), #2 Ohio State (22-21, 1976, at Columbus) and #3 Nebraska (34-24, 1976, at Lincoln). The Powers era began with a bang in 1978, beating defending national champion Notre Dame 3-0 in South Bend, with the regular season concluding with a 35-31 win over #2 Nebraska in Lincoln.

### SPLITTING THE "T"

Legendary MU athlete, coach and athletic director Don Faurot, for whom the playing surface at Memorial Stadium is named (1972), revolutionized football in 1941. Having lost all-America quarterback Paul Christman in 1940, Faurot sought to re-make his offense. Taking his basketball experience with the "give and go," he transferred it to the Mizzou rushing attack – creating the "Split-T" formation which introduced the option play to college football. The result – Missouri led the nation in rushing that year averaging 307.7 yards per game led by halfbacks Bob Steuber, Harry Ice and Maurice "Red" Wade. Every option running offense that has followed has its basis in Faurot's innovation.

### THE CHART TOPPERS

Besides leading the nation in rushing in 1941, Missouri led the country in pass defense in 1982, allowing just 123.5 yards per game, while recording 17 pass interceptions and 41 quarterback sacks for 295 yards lost. Tigers who led the nation include: Bob Steuber in scoring (121 points in 1941), Hank Burnine in receiving (44 receptions in 1955), Roger Wehrli in punt returns (11.7-yard avg. in 1968), Jeremy Maclin in all-purpose yardage (202.4 ypg in 2008), Danario Alexander in receiving yards (137.0 ypg in 2009), Kentrell Brothers in total tackles (12.7 per game in 2015), Drew Lock in passing touchdowns (44 in 2017) and Drew Lock in passing yards per completion (16.4 yds./comp. in 2017).

### BOWLING WITH THE TIGERS

Missouri has been to 15 bowl games over the last 20 seasons (the 2020 Music City Bowl was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic) and 35 in the program's 132 seasons. Missouri has a 15-20 overall bowl mark – 15-13 since 1961. Coach Gary Pinkel took 10 Missouri teams to bowl games from 2003-2015, posting a 6-4 record. MU's first bowl game was the 1924 Christmas Festival against USC in Los Angeles. The Trojans had tied Stanford for the Pacific Coast Conference championship, but the Rose Bowl took Stanford to face Notre Dame and its "Four Horsemen." The game was put together hurriedly to reward USC, and Mizzou was invited by virtue of being the MVIAA champs and its season-opening victory over the Big 10 champs from the University of Chicago. USC won a 20-7 decision. Don Faurot was a fullback on that Missouri team.

### A ROSE BOWL IN COLUMBIA?

The 1941 Tigers went 8-1 in the regular season, the only loss being a 12-7 affair at powerful Ohio State. The Sugar Bowl and the Rose Bowl were both courting the Tigers, while the Rose was waiting to see who would win out between Stanford, Washington State and Oregon State. The Sugar invited Missouri. Don Faurot favored accepting its bid, but the university administration wanted to wait for the Rose Bowl. They set a time deadline to hear from the Rose, but when it came and passed, Missouri accepted the Sugar Bowl bid. Unfortunately, they'd forgotten about the two-hour time difference. Soon after, the Rose called to offer, but all Faurot could do was offer a polite "thank you." Then the attack on Pearl Harbor happened and large gatherings on the West Coast were prohibited. So, the Rose Bowl, pitting Oregon State against Duke, was moved to Durham, N.C. A few hours different, and that game could have been played in Columbia. Instead, MU went to the Sugar Bowl to face Fordham, and fell 3-0 in a driving rainstorm that neutralized Mizzou's option running game.





### ALL-AMERICA TRADITION

Thirty-five Tigers have earned All-America recognition – 13 of them of the consensus variety. Mizzou's first all-American was tackle Ed Lindenmeyer in 1925, and the most recent was kicker Harrison Mevis in 2021. The only Tigers twice chosen as all-Americans were QB Paul Christman (1939-40) and all-purpose performer Jeremy Maclin (2007-08).

### BEST OF THE BEST

Two Tigers have been honored as the nation's best at their positions. In 1997, Brock Olivo was chosen as the first winner of the Mosi Tatupu Award as the nation's best special teams player. Olivo, who at the time was MU's all-time leading rusher, also played on all of Missouri's special teams throughout his career. Olivo is now a special teams analyst for the Missouri coaching staff. In 2008, Chase Coffman won the John Mackey Award as the nation's top tight end. Tiger players in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame (and year inducted) are: QB Paul Christman (1956), HB Bob Steuber (1971), T Ed "Brick" Travis (1974), C Darold Jenkins (1976), HB Johnny Roland (1998), TE Kellen Winslow (2002), DB Roger Wehrli (2003) and WR/KR Jeremy Maclin (2023). Two Tigers have finished high in the Heisman Trophy voting – Christman, third in 1939 and fifth in 1940, and QB Chase Daniel, 4th in 2007.

### OUR CRADLE OF COACHES

Coaching luminaries have patrolled the sidelines at Missouri, and six of them are in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame (year inducted) – Bill Roper (1951), Don Faurot (1961), James Phelan (1973), Frank Broyles (1983), Dan Devine (1985) and Gary Pinkel (2022). Pinkel is MU's winningest coach with a record of 118-73. His teams delivered five of MU's six double-digit win seasons.

A number of MU coaches have been head coaches in the NFL – Andy Reid (Kansas City Chiefs), Phil Bengtson (Green Bay Packers/NE Patriots), Devine (Green Bay Packers), Matt Eberflus (Chicago Bears), Dirk Koetter (Tampa Bay Buccaneers), Marty Mornhinweg (Detroit Lions), Vince Tobin (Arizona Cardinals) and Mike Zimmer (Minnesota Vikings). College head coaches who've spent time at Mizzou include: Moe Ankney (Bowling Green), Jerry Berndt (Penn/Rice/Temple), Jerry Claiborne (Virginia Tech/Maryland/Kentucky), Bill Cubit (Western Michigan/Illinois), Jim Donnan (Marshall/Georgia), Mike Price (Weber State/Washington State/Alabama/UTEP), Derek Dooley (Louisiana Tech/Tennessee), Rolie Dotsch (Northern Michigan), Skip Hall (Boise State), Josh Heupel (UCF/Tennessee), Koetter (Boise State/Arizona State), Barry Odom (UNLV), Dave Steckel (Missouri State), Ryan Walters (Purdue) and Doug Weaver (Kansas State/Southern Illinois). Mizzou letterman Lloyd Carr was the Michigan head coach from 1995-2007.

### IT ALL STARTED HERE

"Homecoming" is a commonplace event at every college and high school in America, but Tiger lore says the nationwide tradition began at Ol' Mizzou in 1911. From 1891 to 1910, the Missouri-Kansas game was played in either Kansas City or St. Joseph, but in 1911 it was to be played on a college campus – in Columbia – for the first time. Chester Brewer, MU's director of athletics and football coach, wanted to make sure the game was a success in its first year in Columbia, and he wanted to add some spice to the season-ending game. He issued a plea to Mizzou alumni – and especially former Tiger football players – to "Come Home" for the game. They did in droves, with a record crowd of 9,000 overflowing Rollins Field. With four minutes to play and MU trailing 3-0, Tiger captain Glen Shuck booted a tying field goal from a difficult angle. Then, little Billy Blees caught a rampaging KU fullback in the open field in the final seconds to preserve the tie and was carried off the field by his teammates.

### MIZZOU-MADE TO THE NFL

Missouri has had at least one player selected in the NFL draft in each of the last 18 years – the latest being DE Isaiah McGuire by Cleveland in 2023. In all, 226 Tigers have seen their name called in the draft since 1937 – including 20 in the first round. DB Roger Wehrli and TE Kellen Winslow are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

### SUPER TIGERS

Last year, Kansas City Chiefs linebacker Nick Bolton became the 21st Tiger to play in the Super Bowl, and the 12th to be a starter. Seventeen Tigers have earned Super Bowl rings as members of the winning team. Fourteen former Mizzou coaches have also coached in Super Bowl games.

### TO THE VICTOR GOES THE TROPHY

Missouri's four oldest trophy games were suspended when Mizzou moved to the SEC, but since 2014, the Tigers have battled the Arkansas Razorbacks in the Battle Line Rivalry. The Battle Line Trophy is made of silver and stands more than four feet tall and weighs more than 180 pounds. It depicts the outline of the two states. MU leads the trophy series, 7-2, and the overall series, 10-4.

Missouri and Kansas began playing for the Indian War Drum in 1935. The trophy was intended to stimulate new interest in the longtime series that had dwindled during the Great Depression of the 1930s. The Missouri-Nebraska Bell originated in 1927. The bell was engraved with an "M" on one side and an "N" on the other. At Mizzou, the bell was cared for by the QEBH Society while the caretaker in Nebraska was the Innocents Society of Nebraska. The ceremony of smoking the Tiger-Sooner Peace Pipe was inaugurated in 1929 by MU Athletic Director Chester Brewer, and by members of Mystical Seven, a University of Missouri honorary group. The ceremony took place each year at halftime of the Missouri-Oklahoma game. The Telephone Trophy was issued to the winner of the Missouri-Iowa State game. It originated with the 1959 game in Ames when the wires were crossed on the coaches press box headsets and each side could hear the other. The trophy, made of a telephone, was donated by Northwestern Bell of Ames.

### IF WE ONLY HAD REPLAY

If instant replay had come to college football in the 1990s, Missouri would have two additional victories and the nation would have had two different national champions. In 1990, having beaten nationally ranked Arizona State the week before, the Tigers were set to entertain #12 Colorado. MU led 31-27 when Colorado embarked on a frantic drive in the game's final minute. With 31 seconds left, CU was camped 1st-and-goal at the MU 3-yard line. Charles Johnson spiked the ball on first down. Eric Bieniemy gained two yards on 2nd, and CU called its final timeout. It's here that the officials failed to notify the officials to change the down marker to 3rd down. Bieniemy was stuffed at the line on the next play with 8 seconds left, but the officials stopped the clock to clear the pile. When the clock re-started, Johnson spiked the ball again – ON FOURTH DOWN, only the marker said 3rd. With two seconds left, Johnson ran a sneak to the right and was awarded a TD – although he was down before extending the ball over the line, as video and photos showed. Colorado went on to win the Big Eight title, and with a win over Notre Dame in the Orange Bowl, claimed a share of the national championship with Georgia Tech.

Seven years later, #1 Nebraska came to town, The Cornhuskers were undefeated while the Tigers were 6-3 but winners of three straight. A 15-yard pass from Corby Jones to Eddie Brooks put Mizzou up 38-31 with a minute to play. Scott Frost got Nebraska to the MU 12 with seven seconds left, third and 10. He threw a bullet pass over the middle that ricocheted off the chest of intended receiver Shevin Wiggins as Julian Jones wrestled him to the ground. As the ball fluttered just inches from the grasp of safety Harold Piersey, Wiggins kicked the ball with his left leg backwards over his head and into the hands of a diving Matt Davison and TD was signaled with no time remaining. In OT, Nebraska prevailed, 45-38. Wiggins admitted after the game that he intentionally kicked the ball to keep it alive – against the rules – but not called. The Huskers thumped Tennessee in the Orange Bowl and were named national champs by the coaches' poll, while Michigan received the AP's #1 nod.

# HEAD COACH ELIAH DRINKWITZ

FOURTH YEAR • ARKANSAS TECH '04

A winner at every stage of his career, Eliah Drinkwitz – considered one of college football's top offensive minds – was introduced as the University of Missouri's 33rd football head coach in December 2019. The 2023 campaign will mark his fourth running the program and fifth season as a head coach.

In his seven seasons as an offensive coordinator and head coach, Drinkwitz has produced six 1,000-yard rushers, four 3,000-yard passers and four 1,000-yard receivers. In three years (2015, 2017, 2018), his offenses made at least one in each category. The combined record of his teams from 2010-22 is 115-53 overall (.684), including a 68-37 conference mark (.647).

Drinkwitz – 17-19 at MU (fourth season) and 29-20 overall as a head coach (fifth season) – advanced to bowl games in his first three seasons with the Tigers, joining former head coach Warren Powers (1978, 1979, 1980) as the only two MU head coaches to achieve the feat.

Under Drinkwitz's leadership, Mizzou produced its highest-ranked recruiting classes: 2021 No. 20, 2022 No. 19 (per Rivals), and the No. 1 wide receiver in the 2022 class.

The 2022 season showcased a much-improved defense, ranked fourth in the Southeastern Conference and 34th nationally by allowing just 340.8 yards per game, 93.8 less than in 2021. Freshman phenom Luther Burden III took no time making his mark at the college level. The St. Louis native became the first true freshman since 2008 to record two receiving touchdowns, two rushing touchdowns, and a punt-return touchdown in the same season. Burden III's eight scores from scrimmage were second amongst SEC true freshmen (Ole Miss' Quinshon Judkins) and led true freshmen receivers nationally.

The 2021 season saw Tyler Badie set the school's single-season record for rushing yards (1,804). His 14 touchdowns in 12 games are ninth on Mizzou's single-season and top-10 list. He was a CoSIDA Academic All-American, the SEC Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year (Mizzou's first-ever), first-team All-SEC and was named to multiple All-America teams.

In 2020, the Tigers overcame an 0-2 start to win five of their last eight games despite playing with less than 60 scholarship players for over half of those contents. Of the SEC's four new head coaches to begin work in the nation's toughest conference in 2020, Drinkwitz's 5-5 regular-season record was the league's best, ahead of Ole Miss' Lane Kiffin (4-5), Mississippi State's Mike Leach (3-7) and Arkansas' Sam Pittman (3-7).

Drinkwitz took over the Tigers program following an impressive 2019 season at Appalachian State that saw the 20th-ranked Mountaineers win the Sun Belt Conference title en route to a 12-1 record. Drinkwitz was named a finalist for the 2019 Eddie Robinson Award, a prestigious annual award to the nation's top coach. He was also named the North Carolina Coach of the Year by the North State Journal.

Before App State, Drinkwitz spent three years as OC and QB coach at NC State (2016-18), two years at Boise State – coaching the tight ends (2014) and serving as OC and QB coach (2015) – along with two years as the running backs coach at Arkansas State where the Red Wolves won back-to-back Sun Belt Championships. His first FBS coaching opportunity was as a quality control assistant at Auburn from 2010-11. The Tigers won the SEC and went on to the BCS Championship with a 14-0 record.
