NEWCOMERS – Joining the returners are eight newcomers: juniors guard Jamahri Harvey, a UNCW transfer, forward Jonah Pierce, a transfer from Francis Marion, forward Kaleb Scott, a Georgia State transfer, and guard Samage Teel, a transfer from Winston-Salem State, rounding out the roster are guards sophomore AJ Shaw and freshmen Kory Mincy, Carl Parrish and Henderson Williams.

2023-24 SCHEDULE – The schedule is highlighted by 15 regular season home games with non-conference home games against CIU, Citadel, Tennessee Tech, Florida A&M, Mid-Atlantic Christian, Kennesaw State, and Johnson & Wales. On the road in non-conference play, Presbyterian plays Vanderbilt, Elon, VMI, Furman, and Wake Forest.

REGULAR-SEASON TOURNAMENT - The Presbyterian Blue Hose play in the three-game First Coast Classic at the University of North Florida in Jacksonville, Fla., November 16-18. Presbyterian plays North Florida, Maine, and Northwestern State in the First Coast Classic. This marks the third consecutive season that the Blue Hose have played in a tournament in November. In the 2021-22 season, the Blue Hose claimed the University of New Orleans Classic title with wins over New Orleans, VMI, and Central Arkansas.

BIG SOUTH CONFERENCE SCHEDULE - With nine teams in the Big South Conference, the league will play a true round-robin league schedule with every team playing each other home and away. The Blue Hose begin the 16-team league schedule on the road at Charleston Southern on Wednesday, January 3. The Big South home opener is a Saturday, January 6 game against defending Big South Champs UNC Asheville.

ITALY TRIP – This summer, Presbyterian took a nine-day trip to Italy, August 1-9,. The Blue Hose visited Rome, Florence, and Milan while playing a couple of exhibition games. During the trip, the Blue Hose visited several historic sites: the Vatican and the Sistine Chapel, the Colosseum in Rome; and the David statue in the Accademia Gallery in Florence. While today was the first official practice for the 2023-24 season, in preparation for the trip to Italy, Presbyterian was allowed to have 10 full-team practices leading up to the team's departure.

Head Coach Quinton Ferrell Fifth Season

Quinton Ferrell is in his fifth season as head coach, and tenth overall as a member of the PC coaching staff, having served as an assistant coach from 2007-2012.

Ferrell, who helped Presbyterian College to an NCAA Division II Tournament appearance in 2005 and two 20-win seasons in his four years as a student-athlete, returned to his alma mater as the 19th head coach in men's basketball program history on April 11, 2019.

COACHING CAREER AT PRESBYTERIAN

In his first season (2019-20), the Blue Hose finished the 2019-20 season, 10-22 overall and 7-11 in the league. The 10 overall wins tied for seventh in the PC DI record book for total victories, the seven conference wins, tied for fourth. PC experienced a five-game winning streak during the season, which tied for the longest winning streak since the 2017 season.

In his second season (2020-21) which came during the COVID-19 pandemic, Rayshon Harrison was named Big South Conference Freshman of the Year, Second Team All-Big South Conference as well as being named a CollegeInsider.com Freshman All-American. Owen McCormack earned Big South Conference All-Academic team honors.

In his third season (2021-22), the Blue Hose defeated VMI, New Orleans and Central Arkansas to capture the University of New Orleans Classic title. Rayshon Harrison was named Second Team All-Big South Conference as well as earning Second Team NABC All-District 3 honors. Owen McCormack garnered the Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year award while being named to the Big South Conference All-Academic team.

Marquis Barnett was named to the Big South All-Freshman team. Owen McCormack and Jack McMahon were recognized for their hard work in the classroom by being selected for the NABC Honors Court. McCormack also earned College Sports Communicators Academic All-District honors.

In his fourth season (2022-23), Jalen Forrest was named to the Big South All-Freshman team. Owen Mc-Cormack claimed the Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year award for the second straight season while being named to the Big South Conference All-Academic team for the second time. McCormack also earned College Sports Communicators Academic All-District honors again.

PREVIOUS COACHING EXPERIENCE

Ferrell returned to PC after five seasons as an assistant coach at the College of Charleston, where he had a major responsibility in recruiting, scouting, and developing perimeter players.

Promoted to lead assistant in 2018-19, he worked with several standout players, including 2019 Colonial Athletic Association First Team All-Conference selections Jarrell Brantley and Grant Riller, as well as one of the best players in school history Joe Chealey, who garnered several awards during his time at CofC, including multiple CAA and NABC All-Conference honors, the Lou Henson All-American team, and became the third Cougar to play in the NBA.

The Cougars finished 2018-19 with a 24-9 overall record, its third straight 20+ win season, including non-conference victories over Rhode Island, VCU and Memphis. In 2017-18, the Cougars made a memorable run that included the program's second-straight 25-win campaign, an impressive 26-8 overall record and 14-4 mark in CAA play. The co-regular-season champions won the CAA Men's Basketball Championship and earned their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1999. Brantley was named to the All-CAA Second Team and Cameron Johnson to the CAA All-Defensive Team for the third year in a row.

Of the 13 scholarship players CofC had in 2019-20, Ferrell was responsible for signing 11 of them, and helped Head Coach Earl Grant resurrect a team that won nine games in 2014-15, to three straight 20+ winning seasons.

In 2016-17, the Cougars to posted a 25-10 overall record, marking the program's first 20-win campaign since 2013. Charleston advanced to the championship game of the CAA Tournament for the first time since CofC joined the Colonial in 2013. The Cougars were also selected and made their fifth all-time appearance in the Postseason NIT. It was their first postseason berth (NCAA or NIT) since 2011.

In 2015-16 Ferrell helped develop four all-conference players including CAA All-Freshman team selection Marquis Pointer, as well as Rookie of the Year and All-CAA Third Team selection Brantley, the first freshman to receive such honors since 2006. CofC went 9-4 in non-conference action, including an upset of LSU and projected No. 1 NBA Draft pick Ben Simmons.

Prior to CofC, Ferrell served as an assistant coach at Army for one season under head coach Zach Spiker. The Black Knights recorded a program-best 10 conference wins in the Patriot League in 2013-14 and also turned in back-to-back winning seasons in league play for the first time in school history. He mentored unanimous First Team All-Patriot League selection Kyle Wilson and Patriot League All-Rookie Team member Tanner Omlid.

During the 2012-13 season, Ferrell served as an assistant coach at The Citadel under head coach Chuck Driesell. He worked with the Bulldogs' perimeter players, while holding major responsibility in recruiting, opponent scouting and the monitoring of players' academic progress. Ferrell worked with developing Citadel point guard Marshall Harris III, who handed out the second-most single-season assists (155) in program history, and recruited Southern Conference All-Freshman Team member Brian

Prior to his tenure at The Citadel, Ferrell spent five years as an assistant coach at PC. In addition to working with both perimeter and post players, he was responsible for a wide variety of tasks including recruiting, scouting, team travel, equipment and academics.

In 2007-08, Ferrell helped the Blue Hose transition from NCAA Division II status into the NCAA Division I ranks, and was part of a staff which engineered victories over Auburn, Wake Forest and 20th-ranked Cincinnati during his time in Clinton, S.C.. He recruited the top two scorers in school history in Khalid Mutakabbir (1,576 points) and Al'Lonzo Coleman (1,501 points), who went on to earn All-Big South Conference honors twice.

COLLEGIATE PLAYING CAREER

Ferrell joined the Blue Hose coaching staff the first time around after a productive four years on the PC men's basketball team. A three-year starter at point guard for PC, Ferrell is regarded as one of the best defenders to ever play at PC under former head coach Gregg Nibert.

Ferrell was on the 2005-06 Blue Hose basketball team that advanced to the NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional Semifinals. He was also a senior captain on the 2006-07 Blue Hose squad that finished with 20 wins for the second consecutive season and led the Blue Hose in assists and steals in each of his final two seasons and was twice named the program's Most Valuable Defensive Player.

EDUCATION

Ferrell graduated from Presbyterian with a degree in accounting in 2007.

FAMILY

Ferrell is married to the former Kimberly Turner, of Augusta, Ga., and the couple has a son, Qaiden Mauricio (7), and a daughter, Keziah Renata (5).



AL'LONZO COLEMAN ASSISTANT COACH

Former Blue Hose standout forward Al'Lonzo Coleman is in his first season as an assistant coach. Coleman joined the Blue Hose coaching staff after spending 11 years playing professional basketball.

Coleman played pro basketball in Argentina, Ecuador, Mexico, Iceland, Finland, Israel, France, Dominican Republic, Hungary, and Turkey. He averaged double-figure points in each of his 11 seasons of professional basketball. He averaged 20.7 points and 12.1 rebounds playing for Stjarnan in Iceland's First Division in the 2015-16 season while earning All-League honors. On February 7, 2016, he scored a career-high 41 points against Thor Thorl playing for Stjarnan. Playing for Hapoel Ramat Gan in Israel, he averaged 19.0 points and 14.0 rebounds. Playing for Maccabi Rehovot in Israel, he grabbed a career-high 24 rebounds against Maccabi Haifa on January 9, 2018. During his career, he was a two-time Import Player of the Year in Israel in the 2017-18 and 2020-21 seasons. In 2016-17, he was a member of the All-Defensive team in Finland. He played on three teams that reached the Finals of their respective leagues including being part of a league championship team in Ecuador.

During his career at Presbyterian, Coleman became the first player in the program's history to garner First Team All-Big South honors when he collected the accolade in 2012. He was a Second Team All-Big South selection in 2009. As a freshman, while helping the Blue Hose usher in the Division I era he was named NCAA Division I Independent Newcomer of the Year in 2008 after leading the Blue Hose in scoring (11.2 ppg) and rebounding (5.0 rpg). He also garnered a spot on the All-Independent Second Team and on the Division I Independent All-Newcomer team.

In his stellar career at Presbyterian from 2007-12, Coleman scored 1,499 points, which is the third most points scored by a Blue Hose player in the Division I era, while grabbing a program Division I record 786 rebounds. Coleman was the first player in school history to score 1,000 points in Division I basketball. He holds Presbyterian Division I era career records for free throws made (417), free throws attempted (632), defensive rebounds (532), and offensive rebounds (254). He also collected six of the eight highest single-game rebounds totals in the program's Division I era including grabbing a programbest 18 boards at Winthrop on February 14, 2012.

A Charlotte, North Carolina native, Coleman graduated from Presbyterian with a degree in Business Management with a double minor in Physical Education and Coaching in 2012. Coleman has a daughter, Zoë (7).



JUSTIN GRIFFITH ASSISTANT COACH

Justin Griffith is in his second season as an assistant coach at Presbyterian College.

Griffith during his 11 year college coaching career, which has included stops at Presbyterian, North Carolina Wesleyan, Lander, Mount Olive, and Winston-Salem State, has coached and recruited four All-Americans, five All-Region players, 25 All-Conference Players, three Conference Defensive Players of the Year, two Conference Players of the Year and one Conference Freshman of the Year.

Prior to coming to PC, Griffith spent two years as an assistant coach at his alma mater North Carolina Wesleyan College.

In Griffith's two seasons as an assistant coach at North Carolina Wesleyan, he help guide the Battling Bishops to a 20-11 record which included a 19-2 home record. In the 2020-21 season, the Bishops won the USA South Athletic Conference East Division title and reached a national ranking of 15th.

Prior to his time at North Carolina Wesleyan, Griffith spent the 2019-20 season as an assistant coach at Lander University. In that season, he helped lead the Bearcats to a 23-8 overall record, a Peach Belt Conference Tournament Championship, and a berth in the NCAA tournament.

Griffith began his coaching career at the University of Mount Olive in 2012. During his six seasons at Mount Olive, the Trojans won the 2014 Conference Carolinas Championship while finishing in the top four in the conference five of his six seasons. At Mount Olive, he coached and recruited three league defensive players of the year, one conference player of the year, and numerous all-conference players.

In the 2013-14 season, Griffith left Mount Olive for one season to be on the coaching staff at Winston-Salem State. He would return to Mount Olive for the 2014-15 season. In his one season at Winston-Salem State, he helped guide the Rams to a 19-7 record which included the CIAA South Division regular-season title and a trip to the CIAA championship game.

The Winston-Salem, North Carolina native graduated in 2012 with a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration from North Carolina Wesleyan. During his playing career at North Carolina Wesleyan, he was a two-year team captain who helped the Bishops capture three USA South Conference Championships. In 2020, Griffith graduated with a Master's degree in Athletic Administration from Coker University.

Griffith and his wife Juannette have one daughter: Zoe.



TREY JOHNSON ASSISTANT COACH

Assistant Coach Trey Johnson is in his first season back at Presbyterian College. After being an assistant coach at Lenoir-Rhyne University from 2021-23, he returned to the Blue Hose program after spending two seasons from 2019-21 as the program's Director of Basketball Operations.

Johnson returns to Presbyterian College after spending the last two years as an assistant coach at Lenoir-Rhyne University. He played an integral role in helping the Bears rank among the nation's leaders in the fewest turnovers in the 2021-22 season while also being a part of the coaching staff when Lenoir-Rhyne upset Louisville last November.

Prior to Lenoir-Rhyne, Johnson spent two seasons from 2019-21 as the Blue Hose's Director of Basketball Operations.

Before his time at PC, Johnson was an assistant coach for one season at Francis Marion, where he coached players who were named the Peach Belt Conference Co-Player and Freshman of the Year while helping the Patriots' earn a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Johnson went to Francis Marion following his time as a manager at his alma mater, Charleston Southern, beginning prior to the 2014-15 season. In his final two years of college, he served as the head manager.

A Myrtle Beach, South Carolina native, Johnson graduated from Charleston Southern in 2018 with a degree in Business Management. He has a son, Jeremiah.
