WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- This is the 98th meeting all-time between Ole Miss and Vanderbilt dating back to 1894.
- Ole Miss-Vanderbilt is the third-most played series between the Rebels and their 2023 opponents (Miss. St., LSU).
- Ole Miss leads the series 53-40-2 and 26-6 in Oxford ... The original record is 55-40-2 with Rebel wins in 2013 and 2014 vacated by the NCAA.
- Ole Miss has won eight of the last 10 vs. Vanderbilt, including the last four by an average of 24.0 points per game.
- Saturday marks the 96th Homecoming game at Ole Miss since 1924 ... The Rebels are 72-16-2 (.811) after vacated wins on Homecoming.
- Ole Miss has hosted Vanderbilt 20 prior times on Homecoming, owning an 18-2 record since first doing so in 1948.
- Ole Miss is one of 10 FBS teams nationally with two AP Top 25 wins.
- A win on Saturday would make **Lane Kiffin** the second-fastest in Ole Miss history to 30 wins.
- The Rebels are at least 6-1 to start for the third straight season, the best such streak at Ole Miss since 1957-63.
- Ole Miss is the only FBS team with both a 500yd passing (524, vs. Mercer) and a 300yd rushing game (317, vs. LSU).
- Ole Miss has held consecutive SEC opponents to less than 300 yards of offense for the first time since 2009.
- Of Ole Miss' 3,361 total yards, 2,360 (70.2%) have come from transfers.
- QB Jaxson Dart ranks third in the SEC, 10th in the FBS at 312.3 yards of total offense per game.
- At 2,134 career rushing yards, RB Quinshon Judkins ranks ninth in Ole Miss history.
- LB and SEC Defensive Player of the Week **Ashanti Cistrunk** has played in 55 consecutive games
- LB Suntarine Perkins leads all SEC freshmen with 3.5 sacks.

Ole Miss has held consecutive SEC opponents to fewer than 300 yards of total offense for the first time since 2009.

A win on Saturday would make head coach Lane Kiffin the second-fastest to 30 wins in Ole Miss history.

Saturday marks the 34th anniversary of Chucky Mullins' hit against Vanderbilt that left him paralyzed.

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at 11:45 a.m. CT, beginning with head football coach Lane Kiffin. The press conference is streamed live on SEC Network+ (ESPN App). Players will follow Coach Kiffin at the Monday press conference. Select players will be also available at approximately noon on Tuesday, while Coach Kiffin will be available Wednesday on the SEC teleconference (noon). There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change.

SEC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE: Coach Kiffin will be available on the weekly Southeastern Conference teleconference every Wednesday at noon, beginning week one and concluding the final week of the regular season. The number is available through the SEC office at 205-458-3000.

PRACTICES: Practice footage is available periodically on the Ole Miss FTP site. At open practices, video is permitted for stretch only, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Photographers must use tight shots and no formations.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystems.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 2) daily newspapers; 3) network affiliate television stations; 4) magazines, non-broadcast radio stations and weekly newspapers.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The SJB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested during credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SIB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos. Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO RIGHTS: The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by Learfield in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. Broadcast lines should be ordered through AT&T (1-877-438-0041). Visiting networks may also wish to contact Cabell Philpott with Learfield (336-831-0719 or cabell.philpott@imgworld.com), concerning the SEC's network agreement.

RADIO/TELEVISION SHOW: The RebTalk radio show gives fans the opportunity to ask Coach Kiffin questions concerning Ole Miss Football. The talk show, hosted by David Kellum, will air every Thursday during the season at 6 p.m. "The Season: Ole Miss Football" is an award-winning, weekly 30-minute show produced by Ole Miss Sports Productions. It debuts Wednesdays at 6 p.m. CT on TheSeasonOleMiss.com and airs on ESPNU.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST AUBURN

Oct. 8, 2022 • Nashville, Tenn. • #9 Ole Miss 52, Vanderbilt 28 The Rebels aired it out in historic fashion, with Jonathan Mingo breaking the Ole Miss single-game receiving yards record with 247 on nine catches with two touchdowns from 71 and 72 yards out. QB Jaxson Dart ended with a career-high 448 yards passing as the Rebel offense exploded for 591 yards total in the win.

Nov. 20, 2021 • Oxford, Miss. • #10 Ole Miss 31, Vanderbilt 17
Matt Corral went 27-of-36 for 326 yards and threw two TD passes as Ole
Miss knocked off Vanderbilt, 31-17. The Rebels jumped ahead 10-0 early and never looked back, following Corral and a stiffing defense to claim a 31-9 advantage in the fourth quarter before the Commodores scored their only TD. With the win, the Rebels finished the 2021 season a perfect 7-0 at home, the first undefeated mark on campus since 1992.

Oct. 31, 2020 • Nashville, Tenn. • Ole Miss 54, Vanderbilt 21 A record-setting day by Elijah Moore and Matt Corral propelled Ole Miss to a clean victory over Vanderbilt. Moore broke Al Brown's single-game receiving yard record with 238. Corral went 19-for-19 passing to start the game, breaking Eli Manning's 19-year-old record for consecutive completions as the Rebels cruised to victory in Nashville. Oct. 5, 2019 • Oxford, Miss. • Ole Miss 31, Vanderbilt 6

A dominant rushing and defensive performance propelled the Ole Miss football team to a 31-6 Homecoming victory over Vanderbilt. The Rebels racked up their most rushing yards (413) since 1979 in the rout. John Rhys Plumlee ran for 165 yards and a score. Jerrion Ealy (97), Snoop Conner (91) and Scottie Phillips (62) all contributed to the big day on the ground as Ole Miss never trailed in a decisive victory over the Commodores.

Nov. 17, 2018 • Nashville, Tenn. • Vanderbilt 36, Ole Miss 29 (OT) The touchdown that wasn't made for a heartbreaking finish for Ole Miss in Nashville. Kicker Luke Logan went 5-for-5 on the day, including a 32-yarder in the final minute to force overtime. Vandy opened OT with touchdown, and the Rebels appeared to answer—but AJ Brown's touchdown catch was overturned upon review, and Ole Miss fell just short

OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin is in his fourth season at Ole Miss, where he has led the Rebels to three consecutive bowl berths to start off his time in Oxford. In 11 years at the NCAA level, Kiffin has posted an all-time record of 90-48, including a 29-14 mark at Ole Miss. The Rebels ranked No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4) last season. Kiffin helped mentor and recruit talented true freshman running back Quinshon Judkins, who set the Ole Miss single-season records in both rushing yards (1,567) and rushing touchdowns (16). Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, its highest final ranking since 2016. Ole Miss ranked top-20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories in his first season in 2020. In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

VANDERBILT HEAD COACH CLARK LEA

Commodore head coach Clark Lea is in his third year serving as head coach for Vanderbilt, as well as his third year of head coaching in the NCAA. Lea is 9-23 with the Commodores, and is one of nine FBS head coaches to be leading their alma mater. Lea has the Commodores at 2-6 so far this season, and the 2022 season saw Vanderbilt win multiple SEC games for the first time since 2018. Last season, Vanderbilt was the least penalized team in the SEC, drawing just 63 flags, continuing a trend as one of the nation's least penalized teams under Lea's watch. Last year the Commodores also ranked 21st nationally in time of possession (32:03) and fourth in defensive touchdowns with four while also ranking 12th in interceptions thrown. Lea brought years of defensive coaching experience to Vanderbilt when he was hired prior to the 2021 season, having been a linebackers coach for multiple Power 5 programs, as well as serving as defensive coordinator for Notre Dame during their College Football Playoff run in 2018.

COMMODORES SCOUTING REPORT

Vanderbilt comes to Oxford at 2-6 overall and 0-4 in the SEC this season. The Commodores started off 2-0 after wins against Hawai'i (35-28) and Alabama A&M (47-13), but have lost six in a row, including two ranked losses to No. 22 Missouri (38-21) and No. 1 Georgia (37-20). Vanderbilt has been well disciplined this season, ranking second in the SEC and 27th nationally with an average of just 4.8 penalties for 42.6 yards. The Commodores also are skilled in special teams, currently holding the FBS lead in net punting with an average of 46.0 per punt from SEC leader Matt Hayball. Offensively, Vanderbilt has been under the leadership of two quarterbacks, with AJ Swann leading most of the passing duties with 1,290 yards and 11 touchdowns before an injury forced backup Ken Seals into the starting role. Vandy has two rushers with at least 200 yards in Patrick Smith (257) and Sedrick Alexander (225), and are led in the passing attack by wideout Will Sheppard and his 574 yards and eight touchdowns. Sheppard's eight scores ranks third in the SEC and seventh nationally. Defensively, CJ Taylor has been a one-man wrecking crew, leading with 52 total tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, two interceptions and two forced fumbles.

OLE MISS-VANDERBILT SERIES HISTORY

NEVER OUIT

Saturday marks the 34th anniversary of the hit Chucky Mullins made on Vanderbilt's Brad Gaines during Ole Miss' Homecoming game on Oct. 28, 1989, which left Mullins instantly paralyzed and eventually ended his life. Roy Lee "Chucky" Mullins was born on July 8, 1969, in Russellville, Alabama, where he graduated from Russellville High School in 1988 with all-conference, all-area and all-state honors. Mullins redshirted his first season at Ole Miss in 1988, but later saw action in 1989 as a defensive back and was rapidly emerging as a defensive force in the Southeastern Conference. Following the hit, Chucky's unbroken spirit changed the University of Mississippi and transcended the world of football. More than a million dollars was raised for the Chucky Mullins Trust Fund, and during his rehabilitation he was visited by such stars as Walter Payton, Janet Jackson, and President George H.W. Bush. When Chucky returned to Oxford in August 1990 to begin living in the specially-equipped house built by the Trust Fund donations, he announced a determination to return to Ole Miss and pursue a degree. Against all odds, in January of 1991, he did return to the classroom. However, on May 1, 1991, as he prepared for class, he suddenly stopped breathing. Rushed to the hospital, he never regained consciousness and died five days later from complications resulting from a blood clot. In the spring of 1990, the Phi Beta Sigma fraternity at Ole Miss initiated the Chucky Mullins Courage Award to be given each season to an outstanding defensive player, who is chosen by the Rebel coaching staff. Each award recipient receives a framed Mullins jersey and has the opportunity to wear Mullins' No. 38 on the field the following season. This season, senior defensive end and active Ole Miss career sacks leader Cedric Johnson wears a No. 38 patch as the 2023 recipient of the award. In 2006, Mullins' number was retired, and on Sept. 26, 2014, Coliseum Drive on the Ole Miss campus was renamed Chucky Mullins Drive, honoring his life and influence in the most visible and enduring way.

HISTORIC WIN AT JORDAN-HARE

Ole Miss came away victorious at Auburn following a gritty 28-21 victory at Jordan-Hare on Oct. 21, one of just four wins ever for the Rebels on The Plains. The win marked the first at Auburn since 2015, the first in Ole Miss history at night at Jordan-Hare, and combined with last year's 48-34 win over the Tigers in Oxford in 2022 it marked the first consecutive wins against Auburn for the Rebels since 1951-52.

KIFFIN ON CUSP OF 30TH WIN AT OLE MISS

With a win on Saturday, Ole Miss head coach Lane Kiffin would become just the seventh coach in Rebel history to eclipse 30 wins (in games played on the field). Additionally, if he does so this week against Vanderbilt he would be the second-fastest coach in Ole Miss history to 30 wins at 44 total games coached, trailing only Harry Mehre's 38 games.

HOT STARTS

Ole Miss is off to at least a 6-1 start through seven games for the third straight season under head coach **Lane Kiffin**, joining a 6-1 start from the 2021 squad that ended 10-3 and with a trip to the Sugar Bowl, as well 2022's team that started off 7-0. This is the best such streak at Ole Miss since the late 1950s and early '60s, when the three-time national champion Rebels ripped off seven such years in a row from 1957-63.

STINGY DEFENSE

The Landshark defense has been on a tear lately, helping lift Ole Miss to victories against Arkansas and Auburn, but doing so in different ways. The Rebel defense stifled the Razorbacks to just 36 yards on the ground back on Oct. 7, the fewest yielded to an SEC opponent by Ole Miss since shutting out Tennessee to zero rushing yards back on Oct. 18, 2014. Ole Miss followed that up with a lockdown passing defense performance at Auburn, holding the Tigers to just 122 yards through the air — the fewest by the Rebel defense against an SEC opponent since 2019, and the fewest in a win against an SEC opponent since holding Vanderbilt to just 60 passing yards in 2014. In terms of total offense, the last two games against Arkansas (288) and Auburn (275) constitue the first consecutive games holding SEC opponents to fewer than 300 yards since Nov. 14, 2009 vs. Tennessee (275) and Nov. 21, 2009 vs. LSU (290).

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

Ole Miss leads the SEC and ranks 15th in the FBS in turnover margin, currently sitting at a total season margin of +6 and a per-game margin of +0.9. The Rebel defense has done its part with seven interceptions and four fumble recoveries, but it's been the powerful -- yet careful -- Ole Miss offense that has helped pad that margin, currently leading the SEC and ranking fifth nationally at just five turnovers all season. In addition to being one of the most efficient QB's in the nation, junior **Jaxson Dart** has also not made many mistakes, putting the Rebels third in the SEC in interceptions this year (No. 22 FBS).

NO-FLY ZONE

The Ole Miss secondary has put together an excellent stretch of games beginning with S **Daijahn Anthony**'s game-sealing pass breakup against No. 12 LSU on Sept. 30, yielding just 377 combined passing yards to Arkansas (250) and Auburn (122). In that same stretch, the Rebel defensive backs have combined for four interceptions and six pass breakups for 10 total passes defended. Ole Miss picked off two passes apiece against Arkansas (LB **Ashanti Cistrunk**, S **John Saunders Jr.**) and Auburn (Saunders Jr., CB **Zamari Walton**), marking the first time since 2021 that Ole Miss has had multiple INTs in consecutive games, and the first time in back-to-back SEC games since doing so in three straight in 2014 at Texas A&M (2, Oct. 11), vs. Tennessee (3, Oct. 18) and at LSU (2, Oct. 25).

CAUSING MAYHEM

Ole Miss ranks as one of the most ferocious defenses in the backfield this season, ranking fifth nationally in sacks (3.6/game) and eighth in tackles for loss (8.0/game). The Rebels have been relentless, recording at least 4.0 TFL in all seven games this season, with six of seven games hitting at least 6.0 TFL, four with at least 9.0 TFL, and two in double-digits against Mercer in the season-opener (11.0) and against Arkansas on Oct. 7 (10.0). Those TFL have come at a huge cost for opposing teams as well, as the Rebels lead the SEC and rank second only to USC in lost yardage at a whopping 270 yards. Ole Miss has been equally as punishing in disrupting the passing game, notching multiple sacks in all seven games and recording at least four sacks in four of seven games this year. A wide range of defenders have been getting in on the fun, too, with a total of 12 Rebels contributing to a QB sack and 21 having chipped-in on a TFL. And all that mayhem is paying off, with five forced fumbles (including a **Khari Coleman** sack fumble returned for a TD by **Jared Ivey** vs. Tulane), seven interceptions, 28 QB hurries, 26 pass breakups and a blocked field goal. In the Kiffin era, Ole Miss has recorded multiple sacks in 31 games, at least 5.0 tackles for loss in 29 games, and at least 4.0 sacks in 17 games. In games under Kiffin with at least 5.0 tackles for loss, Ole Miss is 20-9, and in games with at least 4.0 sacks, the Rebels are 9-3.



FAST STARTS, STRONG FINISHES

The Rebel offense can get out to an explosive start, as evidenced by its 97-38 first quarter margin (13.9 to 5.4 per game), but Ole Miss has also closed games in powerful fashion, holding an almost identical scoring margin in the final frame at 89-44 (12.7 to 6.3). That extends to the entire second half as well, as Ole Miss holds a season advantage of 151-82 in the back two quarters. The Rebels own six quarters with at least 20 points this year, five of which have come in either the first or fourth quarters.

MR. CONSISTENCY

Senior LB **Ashanti Cistrunk** has been a mainstay of the Ole Miss defense throughout his long career as a Rebel, as evidenced by his current streak of 55 consecutive games played -- which constitutes all 55 of his career games played. Cistrunk is among 117 active players nationally in the FBS to have played at least 55, and on Ole Miss' roster this year he is among three alongside transfers **Zamari Walton** and **Teja Young**, who both have also appeared in 55 career contests. Cistrunk is coming off perhaps the best game of his career against Arkansas, when he ended the night with a season-high nine tackles, 1.0 tackles for loss, one half-sack and a key interception returned 28 yards -- the second pick of his career. Cistrunk was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts against the Razorbacks, helping lead the Rebel defense to a 27-20 victory on Oct. 7. In his Ole Miss career, Cistrunk has 175 total tackles (75 solo), 9.5 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks, three forced fumbles and two interceptions. In addition to Cistrunk, Ole Miss' 2023 roster features five more with at least 150 career tackles: CB **DeShawn Gaddie Jr.** (155), LB **Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste** (180), LB **Monty Montgomery** (180), S **Isheem Young** (186) and S **Teja Young** (168).

DEFENSIVE NOTES

The Rebel defensive unit has been crucial to Ole Miss' success with timely big plays and big stops.

- CB Deantre Prince is Ole Miss' active career leader in interceptions with six.
- S John Saunders Jr. (84.3) and S Daijahn Anthony (82.7) are Ole Miss' top-two rated coverage defenders per PFF.
- Saunders and CB Zamari Walton lead Ole Miss with two interceptions apiece.
- Anthony had a crucial forced fumble and the game-winning pass breakup vs. No. 12 LSU on Sept. 30.
- Six Rebels have multiple pass breakups, led by five each from Anthony and Saunders Jr.
- Eight different Rebels have had their hand in Ole Miss' four forced fumbles either on the force or recovery ... 13 Rebels have batted down a pass, and 13 have recorded at least one QB hurry.
- Ole Miss has returned its seven interceptions this season for 101 yards, currently No. 6 in the SEC.
- LB Khari Coleman leads the SEC and ranks 12th in the FBS in active career tackles for loss (31.0)
- S **Teja Young** ranks second among FBS active career leaders with 222 career interception return yards, and he leads with four interception return touchdowns ... The FBS career record for INT return TDs is five (Jackie Walker, Tennessee, 1969-71).
- LB **Ashanti Cistrunk** has a season career-high of 2.5 sacks ... Cistrunk was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week following his nine-tackle performance against the Razorbacks that saw him intercept a pass and assist on a sack as well.
- S **Trey Washington** leads Ole Miss in tackles, averaging 6.6 per game (12th SEC) ... Washington was SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 18 after notching a career-high 10 tackles and a forced fumble vs. Georgia Tech.
- Ole Miss active career sacks leader DE Cedric Johnson recorded career sack No. 16.0 against Auburn (No. 8 OM history).
- Johnson (16.0, T-29th) and LB Monty Montgomery (15.0, T-34th) both rank within the FBS top-40 in active career sacks.
- LB **Suntarine Perkins** leads all SEC freshmen and ranks fifth nationally among freshmen with 3.5 sacks.
- DE **Jared Ivey** owns the lone defensive TD of the year for the Rebels, a key 26-yard fumble return at No. 22 Tulane.
- DE Isaac Ukwu has 3.5 sacks for a loss of 20 yards ... Combined with his career totals at FCS James Madison, he has 20.0.

DON'T BLINK

Ole Miss is once again running a lightning-quick offense in 2023, currently ranking ninth in the FBS at 23.1 seconds per play. This season, Ole Miss owns seven scoring drives clocking in beneath the one-minute mark, including back-to-back opening drives against Mercer (51 seconds) and Tulane (48 seconds). The 51-second drive against Mercer was the fastest to open a season for Ole Miss since 2018, and the 28 first quarter points ranks as the most in available records since at least 1967. The 48-second debut against the Green Wave, meanwhile, was the fastest on any opening drive for the Rebels since finding the endzone in just 34 seconds against Liberty on Nov. 6, 2021. In the Kiffin era, Ole Miss is 24-5 when scoring first.

BIG PLAY POTENTIAL

The Rebels continue to be one of the best teams in the country in explosive plays, currently ranking third among all FBS teams with 54 plays of 20 yards or more this season. In total, Ole Miss has tallied 124 plays of 10 or more yards this year, ranking tied for 12th among all FBS schools. The Rebels average 17.7 such plays per game.

THROWIN' DARTS

Junior QB Jaxson Dart has been one of the top signal callers nationally this season with both his arm and his legs, ranking third in the SEC and 10th nationally at his 312.3 yards of total offense per game. As Dart goes, so have the Rebels so far this season, with his SEC No. 2 and FBS No. 17 points responsible per game clip of 16.3 helping spur the Rebels to the No. 3 scoring offense in the conference at 39.7 points per game. Dart ranks third in the SEC and fifth nationally in both yards per completion at (15.7) and yards per attempt (10.0), and he ranks within the FBS top-30 in passing efficiency at 167.6 (No. 10) and passing yards at 1,840 (No. 29). Dart has been especially effective in the first quarters so far this season, standing at 38-of-49 for 662 yards and seven touchdowns in the opening frame. That includes a blistering 11-for-11 stretch to open the season against Mercer, making him just the seventh Ole Miss quarterback to ever throw 11 consecutive completions and the best such streak since Matt Corral set the school record at 19 in a row at Vanderbilt in 2020. Dart is starting to climb several Ole Miss career lists, as he now ranks seventh all-time in career 300-yard passing games (4), eighth in passing touchdowns (33), ninth in total offense (5,774), 10th in touchdowns responsible for (40) and 11th in passing yards (4,814). In his overall career combining totals from his freshman season at USC in 2021, Dart owns 6,167 yards passing, 7,170 yards of total offense, 1,003 yards rushing (960 at Ole Miss), and 42 passing touchdowns. Dart is one of just 19 quarterbacks in the FBS and four within the SEC with at least 4,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career rushing yards, as well as one of 16 with at leats 6,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards.

CALLING HIS OWN NUMBER

Junior QB **Jaxson Dart** had a career day running the ball against Georgia Tech on Sept. 16, and did so with one of the longest rushes ever by a Rebel signal caller. Dart ended with a career high 136 yards and two rushing touchdowns on 14, highlighted by a massive 68 yard scamper in the second quarter. That run nearly doubled up his previous career long of 36 against Troy last season, and all-time in Ole Miss history it ranks as the fourth-longest ever by a QB. On the ground, Dart ranks as one of the top rushing QBs nationally, ranking second in the SEC among signal-callers in both yards per carry at 4.5 (FBS No. 13) and yards per game at 49.4 (FBS No. 20). Dart is also tied for fourth nationally this year among QBs with six rushing touchdowns.

PORTAL PRODUCTION

Ole Miss has been no stranger to the transfer portal, and it has paid huge dividends this season, with 2,360 of its 3,361 yards (70.2%) of total offense coming from transfer players. That doesn't include all 2,038 passing yards from all three of Ole Miss' three transfer quarterbacks, but it does include 707 of 1,323 rushing yards (53.4%), and 1,653 of 2,038 receiving yards (81.1%), as well as 24 of all 35 Rebel touchdowns (68.6%) this season.

NOSE FOR THE ENDZONE

Ole Miss has two well-seasoned running backs in sophomore **Quinshon Judkins** and senior **Ulysses Bentley IV**, who stand as just one of four duos in the FBS with at least 20 career rushing touchdowns. Judkins and Bentley both crossed the goal line for the 22nd times in their careers against Arkansas on Oct. 7, putting them alongside other duos from LSU, San Jose State and USC. Combined, the Rebel duo of Judkins and Bentley owns 4,093 career yards and 45 total touchdowns on the ground.

GROUND & POUND

Sophomore RB **Quinshon Judkins** has exploded for 366 rushing yards and three touchdowns across his last three games since breaking out for 177 yards on 33 carries against the No. 12 LSU defense on Sept. 30. Judkins followed that up with another 100-yard effort at Auburn, tallying 124 yards and a score on 21 carries. Both of those efforts beyond the century mark have pushed Judkins to No. 3 in Ole Miss history in career 100-yard games. His 177 yards against LSU was his third career 150-yard outing -- with his other two last year being a 214-yard explosion at Arkansas, and a 205-yard effort at Texas A&M (making his 177 yards vs. LSU his most in front of a home crowd). Judkins is marching his way up several other all-time lists at Ole Miss, as he is currently fifth in career rushing touchdowns (23), tied for sixth in career all-purpose touchdowns (25), and ninth in career rushing yards (2,134). Judkins is coming off a historic freshman campaign in 2022 that saw him break several Ole Miss records, including the single-season rushing mark. Judkins was a consensus first team selection on all the Preseason All-America teams and All-SEC teams, and was selected to the Maxwell. Walter Camp and Doak Walker Award watch lists.

BACK IN ACTION

Senior transfer WR **Zakhari Franklin** has been limited due to injury to start the 2023 season, but he still ranks as one of the top active receivers in the FBS. This preseason, Franklin was one of two Rebels named to the Biletnikoff Award watch list alongside **Tre Harris**, and with good reason. Despite missing the first three games of 2023, Franklin still ranks among the top active receivers in the FBS, as his 38 career receiving touchdowns leads all active FBS receivers, and his 3,386 career yards ranks second only to Arizona's Jacob Cowing (4,045). Franklin has also hauled in a reception in 49 consecutive games played, ranking only behind Coastal Carolina's Sam Pinckney (52) and Cowing (51). In 46 career games for UTSA, Franklin rewrote their record books en route to two first team All-Conference USA selections and an Honorable Mention All-America nod by Phil Steele in 2022. Franklin has notched 13 career 100-yard receiving games, and in 2022 was tied for second nationally in receiving touchdowns with 15. Franklin was also part of the Biletnikoff watch list in 2022.

WIDE-OPEN WATKINS

Senior WR Jordan Watkins has been a big-play threat throughout his two-year tenure as a Rebel, and he's been off to a dynamite start as Ole Miss' top all-purpose option this season. Watkins has eclipsed the century mark receiving in three games this season, including a career-high 119 yards against Georgia Tech, and he has broken loose for several massive plays. Watkins has 17 plays of at least 10 yards, including eight of at least 20 yards, four of at least 30 and three of the top-four long plays for Ole Miss this season: his 70-yard punt return touchdown against Mercer, his 68-yard TD reception against Georgia Tech, and his 63-yard score through the air against LSU. Watkins also had four receptions of 30 yards last season, including a 61-yard catch at Vanderbilt. This season, his 70-yard punt return TD ranks third longest in the SEC (No. 11 FBS), and he is one of two nationally to have both a 70-yard punt return TD and a reception of at least 59 yards.

QUADRUPLE THREAT

Louisiana native **Tre Harris** has had a nose for the endzone in just two games as a Rebel, highlighted by the game of his life against Mercer on Sept. 2. Against the Bears, Harris wowed the Vaught-Hemingway faithful by finding the endzone on each of his first three catches as a Rebel, which tied the school record and helped the lightning-quick Ole Miss offense get up early in its eventual 73-7 blowout win. Harris tacked on a fourth touchdown reception in the fourth quarter, in the process breaking the school record and becoming just the 22nd player in SEC history to haul in at least four touchdown receptions in a single game. Harris ended the day as Ole Miss' top receiver, nabbing six catches for 133 yards and his record-breaking four trips to the endzone. Harris is no stranger to the multi-TD effort, having caught three touchdown passes against Rice last October while a member of the Louisiana Tech football team. Harris -- a preseason Biletnikoff Award watch list member -- owns a career line of 127 receptions, 1,986 yards and 20 touchdowns -- 16 of which have come within the last calendar year after a 10 TD season with the Bulldogs in 2022. In 2023, Harris is still the only receiver in the SEC and one of just two in the FBS with four touchdown receptions in a single game.

DEADLY DUO

Wideouts **Zakhari Franklin** and **Tre Harris**, both Biletnikoff Award watch list members this preseason, are the lone teammates in the FBS to rank within the active career receiving touchdowns top-15 list, with Franklin's 38 career scores leading all active FBS receivers, and Harris' 20 ranking tied for 13th. Combined, they own a dazzling career line of 393 receptions for 5,372 yards and 58 touchdowns.

DAYLIGHT FOR DAYTON

Senior WR **Dayton Wade** is off to a career-best start in 2023 as one of Ole Miss' top deep-play threats. At 402 yards on 28 receptions, Wade has already passed his prior high in yards (309) and catches (27) -- both recorded in 2022, his first season at Ole Miss after three at WKU from 2019-21. Wade has had at least 64 yards receiving in four games this year, and he leads all Rebels with four receptions of at least 40 yards. Nationally, he is among just six SEC receivers with at least four catches of 40 yards.

HIGH-FLYING OFFENSE

Ole Miss currently possesses the SEC's third-best scoring offense at 39.7 points per game, good for No. 9 in the FBS heading into Week Nine action, as well as the conference's No. 3 overall offense at 480.1 yards per game (No. 12 FBS). Impressively, the Rebels have done so against strong competition through seven games, holding a strength of schedule ranking of 11 against a top-12 average of 58.3 on the scoring offense list and 70.6 on the total offense rankings. Ole Miss has proven deadly both through the air and on the ground, though, as the Rebels are the lone FBS team with a 500-yard passing outing (524, vs. Mercer, No. 2 FBS) and a 300-yard rushing outing (317, vs. LSU, No. 25 FBS) this season. Furthermore, per PFF season grades, Ole Miss stands as one of just two schools nationally with a top-12 grade in both passing (4th, 91.0) and rushing (14th, 88.1) for 2023.

In the Kiffin era, the Rebel offense ranks among the most prolific in the nation, ranking second in the FBS in yards per game (506.3 ypg/43 games) and fourth in total yards (21,769 yards) since 2020. The Rebels have done it with a balanced attack over the last three years as well, as Ole Miss ranks alongside only Ohio State as the only two Power-5 teams with both a top-10 passing season (2020; No. 7) and a top-10 rushing season (2022; No. 3) since 2020.

RACKING UP THE YARDS

Kiffin's dynamic Ole Miss offenses have single-handedly dismantled the Rebel record books, recording three of the top-five offensive seasons in school history since 2020. Leading the way is the 2020 squad that ended the season ranked No. 3 in total offense nationally at an Ole Miss record 555.5 yards per game (5,555 yards). His 2021 team ranks fifth at 492.5 yards per game (6,402 yards), and last year the Rebels broke into the top-five again, this time notching the fourth-best season ever at 496.4 yards per game (6,453 yards). Impressively, Kiffin's Ole Miss teams have done so with a balanced offensive attack, ranking seventh in the FBS in passing in 2020 (344.9 ypg) before shifting toward the running game in 2021 with the No. 12 ground game (217.6 ypg) before 2022's single-season school record rushing attack of 3,336 yards (256.6) led the SEC and ranked No. 3 in the FBS behind only the service academies.

With those big single-season numbers come monster single-game numbers as well. Kiffin owns 22 games during his Ole Miss tenure with at least 600 yards of total offense, as opposed to just 16 times total from the beginning of the Ole Miss football program in 1893 until Kiffin's arrival in 2020. At the 700-yard plateau, Kiffin's Rebels own four of the six total 700-yard games in Ole Miss history, as well as five of the top-seven performances all-time.

NO FRESHMAN JITTERS

Freshman LB **Suntarine Perkins** was a highly-touted recruit nationally as the No. 1 overall player in Mississippi and the No. 2 linebacker in the country, and he has already become a staple of the Landshark defense through four collegiate games played. Perkins shined in his debut against Mercer on Sept. 2, leading all Rebels with nine tackles off the bench, including four solo and one solo sack, in Ole Miss' 73-7 rout of the Bears. Perkins was also a one-man wrecking crew for the Rebels in Tuscaloosa against No. 12 Alabama on Sept. 23, charting 2.5 tackles for loss and two solo sacks for a whopping loss of 21 yards. With 3.5 sacks, Perkins is tied for the team lead, fifth among all freshmen in the FBS, and leads all SEC freshmen. At Raleigh High School, Perkins was a one-man wrecking crew, leading RHS to its first state title in 2022 as both its star running back and linebacker. In the state title game, Perkins ran 32 times for 331 yards and four touchdowns while also contributing six tackles and an interception on the other side of the ball. In his high school career, Perkins totaled more than 5,000 all-purpose yards, including 2,078 rushing yards and 32 touchdowns on the ground as a senior. As a linebacker, he tallied 267 total tackles and 10 sacks in his high school career.

BIG BOOT

Senior transfer kicker **Caden Davis** played a crucial role in Ole Miss' comeback victory over No. 22 Tulane, going 3-of-3 on his field goal tries, but none bigger than his fourth quarter 56-yard behemoth that sailed through the uprights to give the Rebels a 10-point lead after being down 10 in the first half. That 56-yard shot by Davis soared past his previous of 40 yards in his only made field goal of his Texas A&M career in four total attempts. It ranks tied for second in the SEC and tied for seventh-longest in the FBS this season, as well as No. 4 in Ole Miss history -- the best since Bryan Owen nailed a 57-yarder against Tulane in 1988.

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin heads into his fourth season at the helm of the Ole Miss football program after leading the Rebels to three straight bowl appearances in his first few years in Oxford.

The Rebels once again ranked amongst the top of the nation in multiple offensive statistics in 2022. Ole Miss was No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4). Kiffin helped mentor and recruit talented true freshman running back Quinshon Judkins. Judkins set the Ole Miss single-season record in both rushing yards (1,567) and rushing touchdowns (16)

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. That included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, part of an ongoing nine-game home win streak for Kiffin's teams.

The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll; its highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg). Ole Miss has eclipsed 600 yards of total offense seven times under Kiffin after hitting that mark just 16 times in the program's history before his arrival.

The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer points per game this season compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020, leading the program to an Outback Bowl win over No. 7 Indiana and a 5-5 record against an all-SEC schedule. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set during the Tigers' run to a national title in 2019.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first season at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3. Statistically, the Owls finished in the top-25 in 16 team categories, including: No. 2 in passes intercepted, No. 5 in first down offense, No. 6 in rushing offense, No. 8 in kickoff return defense, red zone offense and turnovers lost, and No. 9 in total offense and turnover margin (by comparison, FAU was No. 72 the previous season in total offense and No. 99 in turnovers gained).

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranks as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying a starting quarterback and then developing Blake Sims in 2014. With three-year starter and All-American All McCarron off to the NFL, Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a secondplace finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Volunteers' offense jumped at least 34 places in every national statistical category over the 2008 figures.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

GAME ONE #22 OLE MISS 73, MERCER 7

Sept. 2, 2023 Attendance: 60,097 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss football opened its 2023 season with a 73-7 blowout win over Mercer at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

It only took 51 seconds for Lane Kiffin's offense to get all 60,097 fans inside Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on their feet. Dart marched the Rebels downfield, needing only three plays to find the endzone, connecting with Harris on a 38-yard strike.

After a quick answer from Mercer, Dart and Harris linked up for two more scores, giving the senior wideout three touchdowns in the first 3:15 of the game. Ole Miss' special teams unit forced their first fumble of the season just before Harris' third score, recovering the loose ball on a kickoff at the Mercer 20-yard line.

Ole Miss continued to assert its offensive dominance on their next drive, as Preseason All-American Quinshon Judkins waltzed in for six to put the Rebels up 28-7 and mark the most points scored in an opening quarter of a season dating back to 1967.

Mercer began the second quarter driving into Ole Miss territory. The Rebel defense took advantage of the situation and brought the house, forcing a fumble on the snap that was recovered by Reginald Hughes and cashing in on the turnover with a 31-yard field goal by Caden Davis.

After forcing Mercer into another punt, the Rebels drove back down the field with a heavy dose of Judkins. With just 32 seconds left in the half, Judkins would take a direct snap at the Mercer 3-yard line and run it in for his second score of the day. Ole Miss went into halftime with a 38-7 lead.

Ole Miss put up 28 points in the third quarter, beginning with a Jordan Watkins 70-yard punt return touchdown at the end of Mercer's first drive of the half.

Daijahn Anthony grabbed his first interception as a Rebel on the next drive, picking off Carter Peevy at midfield and returning the ball for 19 yards. Three plays later Dart would throw his fourth touchdown pass of the game to Harris, tying his career-high previously set during his freshman season at USC.

Spencer Sanders made his Ole Miss debut on the Rebels' next drive and threw for his first two touchdowns in a Rebel uniform on back-to-back drives. He connected on a six-yard pass to Ulysses Bentley IV for his first and 34-yard pass to freshman Cayden Lee for his second one, putting the Rebels up 66-7 heading into the final quarter. Transfer Walker Howard would find Matt Jones for the final TD to secure the win.

GAME TWO <u>#20 Ole Mi</u>ss 37, #22 Tulane 20

Sept. 9, 2023 Attendance: 30,000 • Yulman Stadium • New Orleans, La.

NEW ORLEANS — No. 20 Ole Miss football found itself in a 17-7 hole in the late stages of the first half, but the Rebels used a complete second half and closed the game on a 30-3 scoring run to best the 22nd-ranked Tulane Green Wave, 37-20, at Yulman Stadium on Saturday.

The Rebels (2-0) were stymied early by a stout Green Wave (1-1) run defense, while Tulane hit on some crucial early plays to take that 17-7 lead, but Ole Miss came out of the second half on a mission, using big plays in each facet of the game to come out of New Orleans with the victory.

Ole Miss struck first and struck fast, taking an early 7-0 lead in only 48 seconds, with Dart hitting wideout Tre Harris with 14:12 on the clock for their fourth score in five quarters of play on a 31-yard touchdown strike.

The Green Wave responded at 9:37 in the first quarter with a touchdown run by Makhi Hughes in the wildcat from two yards out, the beginning of a 17-point unanswered stretch by Tulane across the first half. That included a 44-yard field goal at 14:10 in the second quarter by Valentino Ambrosio and a 41-yard touchdown pass from Kai Horton to Jha'Quan Jackson at 5:49.

Ole Miss would break the drought with 1:36 to play in the half, tacking on a 37-yard field goal from Caden Davis to head into the break down 17-10.

That field goal would be the beginning of a 30-3 final scoring run for the Rebels, however, as sophomore running back Quinshon Judkins found the endzone with 6:11 in the third quarter to pull the game to a 17-17 tie.

That set up an early fourth quarter field goal, as Caden Davis hit his second of the day, this one from 27 yards out to give Ole Miss a 20-17 lead with 12:50 to play.

Tulane proceeded to chart the longest drive of the game, a plodding 14-play, 45-yard sequence that gobbled up 6:01 of clock time, but ended with a huge momentum-shifting turnover on downs when Horton came up a yard short on a 4th-and-2 that was originally called a first down before a booth review overturned it and gave the ball to the Rebels.

The Rebels found the endzone not long after, with Dart connecting with Michael Trigg on a 21-yard score to take a 27-17 lead with 4:28 to play.

Tulane responded with another long drive that took 10 plays and went 67 yards before a 26-yard field goal from Ambrosio, but it only took 1:32 off the clock.

From there, Ole Miss went into cruise control, with Caden Davis knocking down his third field goal of the day — the fourth-longest field goal in school history at 56 yards — and Jared Ivey taking a Khari Coleman sack fumble back 26 yards for a touchdown to put Ole Miss on top 37-20.

GAME THREE #17 OLE MISS 48, GEORGIA TECH 23

Sept. 16, 2023 Attendance: 64,150 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

OXFORD, Miss. — No. 17 Ole Miss and Georgia Tech slugged it out in the first half, but an explosive Rebel offensive attack took command of the game in the second half, leaving the Yellow Jackets behind en route to a 48-23 victory at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday.

The Rebels ended with 550 yards of total offense, including 299 on the ground thanks to a career rushing day from starting quarterback Jaxson Dart.

Defensively, the Rebels caused some havoc in the Yellow Jacket backfield, notching a season-high 7.0 tackles for loss from seven different defenders.

The first quarter was all Rebels, as Ole Miss jumped out to a 10-0 lead following a 47-yard field goal at the 12:38 mark from Caden Davis and the first of two touchdown runs by Dart at 3:02 in the first

The Yellow Jackets tacked on a 22-yard field goal from Aidan Birr with 1:09 to play in the half after a second quarter tug-of-war, but that was but a preamble to the second half fireworks to come from the Rebel offense.

The Rebels forced a punt on Georgia Tech's first drive of the second half and made the Yellow Jackets pay with a five-play, 71-yard drive that was capped by a 21-yard touchdown scamper by Ulysses Bentley IV at the 9:45 mark.

Dart immediately made Tech pay yet again, capping a five-play, 28-yard drive with a six-yard score to make it a 24-3 game with 6:00 in the third quarter. Georgia Tech would make it interesting across the end of the third and start of the fourth, tallying 14 unanswered following a one-yard rush by quarterback Haynes King with 2:07 left in the third, and a 15-yard pass from King to Eric Singleton Jr. to make it a 24-17 game with 10:31 to go.

From there, however, the Ole Miss aerial attack took back the game for good. A 40-yard bomb from Dart to wideout Dayton Wade opened the floodgates, leading to a 45-yard field goal from Caden Davis with 7:45 left to make it 27-17. Dart found Jordan Watkins on a long 68-yard touchdown strike to put Ole Miss up 34-17 with 5:59 to play.

The Rebels weren't done there either, as another fourth down stop by the Ole Miss defense led to a second deep pass to Wade, this time a 43-yard connection to the 1-yard line that led to a Quinshon Judkins touchdown.

Tech added a 14-yard touchdown pass from King to Avery Boyd with 1:34 to play, making it a 41-23 game, but Ole Miss put the game out of reach, 48-23, following a 36-yard scoring burst from Matt Jones with 49 seconds to go — his third career score in just nine carries as a Rebel.

GAME FOUR #12 Alabama 24, #15 OLE MISS 10

Sept. 23, 2023 Attendance: 100,077 • Bryant-Denny Stadium • Tuscaloosa, Ala.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - No. 15 Ole Miss held a halftime lead against No. 12 Alabama, but the Crimson Tide pulled away in the second half to win a hard-fought 24-10 slugfest at Bryant-Denny Stadium on Saturday.

The Rebels (3-1, 0-1 SEC) were evenly matched with the Tide (3-1, 1-0 SEC), but Alabama was able to grind Ole Miss down in the late stages of the tug-of-war, winning the second half 18-3 to hand Ole Miss its first loss of the season.

After an opening drive that stalled out in just five plays for the Rebels, Alabama picked up the first points of the day on their opening drive, as Will Reichard knocked down a 48-yard field goal.

It didn't take long for Ole Miss to answer back, as the offense drove 75 yards down the field in under four minutes and scored the first touchdown of the day on the ensuing drive. Dart opened the drive with a 40-yard pass to Dayton Wade and would end up scoring by himself on a 10-yard touchdown run up the middle. It was his third rushing touchdown of the season, a new single-season career high for the junior.

Three drives later, Alabama marched 66 yards down the field looking to score until Zamari Walton grabbed his first interception in a Rebel uniform, picking off Jalen Milroe in the endzone.

A blocked punt at the end of Ole Miss' next drive would give the Crimson Tide the ball back at the Rebel one yardline, but the Ole Miss defense was able to rise to the occasion once again. A fumbled snap and back-to-back sacks from Jamond Gordon and Ladarius Tennison held Alabama to just a field goal.

Caden Davis missed a 34-yard field goal with 13 seconds left in the half, but 0le Miss would go into the halftime break with a 7-6 lead.

The Ole Miss defense racked up four sacks, held the Crimson Tide to just 115 yards, and did not allow a touchdown in the opening half for the second time in as many games.

Alabama opened the second half with another Reichard field goal, this time from 23 yards out to give the Tide the lead. A Dart interception at the far end of the field on the next drive would lead to a Jalen Hale 33-yard touchdown from Milroe. Alabama would get the two-point conversion and take a 17-7 lead with 6:29 to play in the third quarter.

Ole Miss scored its only points of the second half on a Caden Davis 35-yard field goal that made it 17-10 as the teams headed to the final quarter of play.

Alabama opened the fourth quarter with its second touchdown of the game, going 75 yards in six plays and taking a 24-10 lead on an eight-yard Jase McClellan scoring run. The Crimson Tide put up 241 yards of offense and 18 total points in the second half.

The Rebels went 55 yards on 15 plays during their final drive of the game, but would end up turning the ball over on downs with just 2:06 left to play.

GAME FIVE #20 OLE MISS 55, #12 LSU 49

Sept. 30, 2023 Attendance: 66,703 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

OXFORD, Miss. — The stars were aligned for Ole Miss on Saturday night. A full moon. An electric, record crowd of 66,703. A powerful offensive attack. And a little bit of luck, as LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels' potential game-winning pass into the endzone fell incomplete, sealing a 55-49 Rebel victory over the 12th-ranked Tigers.

Ole Miss (4-1, 1-1 SEC) and LSU (3-2, 2-1 SEC) combined for a mind-boggling 104 points and 1,343 yards, but it all came down to that final play with five seconds on the clock and the Tigers in position to win on a walk-off touchdown in the endzone. Ole Miss safety Daijahn Anthony had different ideas, though, as he broke up the potential 26-yard game-winner, putting all 66,703 in attendance into a frenzy as the celebration was underway.

The tale of the tape on this one was lengthy. The 55 Rebel points stand as the most scored against an AP ranked opponent in Ole Miss history, the combined point total of 104 stands as the third-most in conference history between two SEC opponents, and the 1,343 yards of total offense stands as the fifth-most in the history of the SEC — the most since 2020.

This game stands out in the Rebel record books as well, with Ole Miss' 706 yards of total offense ranking sixth all-time — giving head coach Lane Kiffin four of the six 700-yard games in program history.

LSU tallied 637 total yards with Daniels ending the day with 513 yards of total offense and five touchdowns, but the Rebels used a complete team effort to emerge victorious.

Ole Miss received a brilliant outing from starting quarterback Jaxson Dart, who ended the day 26-of-39 for a season-high 389 yards and four touchdowns. He was effective on the ground as well with 50 yards and a touchdown, but it was a breakout day by sophomore running back Quinshon Judkins that helped the Rebel offense keep LSU guessing, ending the day with 177 yards and one touchdown on 33 carries while adding a touchdown catch as well.

The Ole Miss offensive line did not allow a single sack, four different Rebels caught a touchdown, three different runners ran one in, and wideouts Tre Harris (eight catches, 153 yards, one TD) and Jordan Watkins (five catches, 103 yards, one TD) combined for 266 yards and two scores to compliment Dart and Judkins for Ole Miss' all-around effort.

GAME SIX #15 OLE MISS 27, ARKANSAS 20

Oct. 7, 2023

Attendance: 65,748 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

OXFORD, Miss. — A week after the Ole Miss offense put on a show under the lights at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, the Rebel defense stepped up with an excellent effort of their own en route to a 27-20 victory over Arkansas.

The Rebels (5-1, 2-1 SEC) held Arkansas (2-4, 0-3 SEC) to 288 total yards of offense, the fewest for Ole Miss against an SEC opponent since 2019. That includes just 36 yards on the ground, the fewest yielded by the Rebels against an SEC opponent since holding Tennessee to zero on Oct. 18, 2014. Ole Miss' defense shined all around, finishing with a season-high five sacks and two interceptions, first by senior Ashanti Cistrunk in the first quarter and then by senior John Saunders Jr. to seal the game in the fourth.

Offensively, the ground game of Quinshon Judkins and Ulysses Bentley IV led the way for Ole Miss, combining for 159 yards and a pair of scores. Quarterback Jaxson Dart completed 16 passes for 153 yards, including a six-yard touchdown pass to Dayton Wade.

Arkansas struck first after an Ole Miss three-and-out. The Rebels responded on the ensuing drive, marching 66 yards to put points on the board. Caden Davis converted a 27-yard field goal with 2:47 to play in the first quarter to make it 7-3.

After allowing the Razorbacks to score on their first possession, the Ole Miss defense started to settle in. Cistrunk picked off KJ Jefferson at the 31-yard line and returned it inside the 10, putting his offense on the doorstep. Four plays later, Judkins cashed in the takeaway, running in the score from one yard out to make it 10-7.

The Rebel defense continued to cause fits in the second quarter. They forced four straight Arkansas punts, including a trio of three-and-outs, to flip the field. J.J. Pegues and Suntarine Perkins both found their way into the backfield, recording key sacks. Set up with excellent field position, two big burst runs from Bentley quickly moved Ole Miss inside the red zone. Dart capped off the drive with a 6-yard pop pass to Wade, who trotted into the end zone to extend the Rebels' lead to 10 at 17-7 going into halftime.

On the opening drive of the third quarter, Arkansas drilled a 56-yard field goal to make it a one-score game. The Razorbacks turned up the pressure on Ole Miss, sacking Dart on fourth down to get the ball back. The Razorbacks opened the scoring in the fourth quarter with a 72-yard touchdown drive to take a 20-17 lead over Ole Miss.

The Rebels answered with a 7-yard rushing score by Bentley to retake the lead at 24-20 and would add a Davis field goal to make it 27-20 with 2:43 left in the game.

The Ole Miss' defense stepped up one final time to put the game away with Saunders Jr.'s interception to seal the victory.

GAME SEVEN #12 OLE MISS 28, AUBURN 21

Oct. 21, 2023 Attendance: 88,043 • Jordan-Hare Stadium • Auburn, Ala.

AUBURN, Ala. — The defense showed up when it counted and the offense found timely scores to give Ole Miss its first back-to-back wins against Auburn in more than a half century, as the Rebels edged out the Tigers, 28-21, at Jordan-Hare Stadium on Saturday night.

Ole Miss (6-1, 3-1 SEC) stifled Auburn (3-4, 0-4 SEC) to just 275 yards of total offense, and combined with holding Arkansas to 286 on Oct. 7, this marks the first time the Rebels have held consecutive SEC opponents to fewer than 300 yards since 2009. That defensive effort was helped greatly by a no-fly zone from the Rebel secondary, which shut down the Auburn passing attack to just 122 yards — the fewest against an SEC opponent for Ole Miss since 2019.

The Rebel win marks just their fourth ever at Auburn in games played on the field (first since 2015), and combined with last year's win in Oxford, Ole Miss has now won consecutive games against the Tigers for the first time since 1951-52. Ole Miss is now at least 6-1 to start for the third year in a row, the best such streak since 1960-62.

It was a complete team effort on defense, with eight different Rebels contributing toward nine tackles for loss, in addition to two sacks and two interceptions. Senior linebacker Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste had a career night, tying his career best with 2.0 tackles for loss on top of an Ole Miss leading seven total tackles. Senior defensive backs John Saunders Jr. and Zamari Walton each chipped in an interception, giving Ole Miss its first set of consecutive games with multiple interceptions since 2014.

On offense, sophomore running back Quinshon Judkins led the Ole Miss charge with 124 yards and one touchdown rushing. Quarterback Jaxson Dart ended the night with 246 yards of total offense, going 10-of-17 for 202 yards and one touchdown through the air, while adding 44 yards and a career-high two rushing touchdowns on the ground.

The Rebel defense set the tone early, forcing Auburn into a turnover on downs on its first possession of the game before scoring first on an 11-yard touchdown catch by wideout Zakhari Franklin at the 4:55 mark, his first score as a Rebel. Auburn responded in kind, though, knotting the game 7-7. Ole Miss got right back on the board on its next drive, with Dart finding the endzone from 29 yards out to push the Rebel lead back up to 14-7. The second quarter turned out to be a defensive tug-of-war, with five combined punts and an interception apiece by the Rebels and Tigers, with the lone score being a one-yard TD by Auburn's Hunter to tie the game 14-14.

Defense ruled the beginning of the second half as well, but Ole Miss broke through on its fourth drive on a 1-yard score from Dart as time expired in the third to put the Rebels up 21-14. Judkins added to that edge in the fourth, finding the endzone from four yards out to push the Rebel lead to 28-14. Auburn made it interesting late, though, scoring with just 56 seconds to play, but the ensuing onside kick failed, giving the Rebels the ball and the win.
