GAME SET-UP

THE MATCH-UP

- After weather presented Tennessee (11-6, 4-1 SEC) with two challenging road trips, the Lady Vols are happily back home for a Sunday "We Back Pat" matinee vs. in-state rival Vanderbilt (17-2, 4-1 SEC).
- Participating in the SEC's week-long We Back Pat initiative, the Lady Vols and Commodores will tip inside Food City Center at 3:02 p.m. ET on SEC Network.
- UT and VU are tied with LSU for second place in the SEC standings at 4-1, so Sunday's match-up shapes up to be the most intriguing league game of the day.
- The Lady Vols picked up a key road victory on Thursday evening, erasing a 13-point second-quarter deficit to zoom past Mississippi State, 75-64.
- MSU entered the game at No. 32 in the NET rankings, so the UT triumph was important toward Kellie Harper's club improving its résumé for the postseason.
- Vanderbilt staved off Auburn in Nashville on Thursday, prevailing 53-50 to stay in second place in the SEC race.
- The Commodores' only losses came at NC State on Nov. 29, 70-62, and at home vs. Missouri, 65-63, on Jan. 14.

- Sam Gore (PxP) and LVFL Tamika Catchings (Analyst) will serve as the announce crew for the SEC Network broadcast.

- The contest can be heard on Lady Vol Network stations and by audio stream, with Brian Rice providing play-by-play. Jay Lifford is the studio host.

- Air time is typically 30 minutes before tip-off.

NOTING THE LADY VOLS

- The Lady Vols climbed from 65 to 56 in the NCAA's NET rankings after their win over No. 32 Mississippi State.
- Tennessee's schedule is rated No. 27 in the NCAA's Toughest Schedule Report.
- The Lady Vols rise to No. 6 in that report for cumulative opposition (which factors past and future games this season).
- UT ranks No. 8 nationally in attendance, averaging 8,027 fans per game.
- The 64 points UT gave up to Mississippi State stands as the lowest total it has yielded against a Power 5 opponent this season.
- Tamari Key has grown her blocks per game average to 2.80 this season, which ranks fourth in the SEC in 2023-24 and currently ranks as the fourth-best campaign in UT history.
- Key also owns the No. 1 (3.50, 2021-22), No. 3 (2.88, 2020-21) and No. 5 (2.77, 2019-20) averages as well.
- Since Rickea Jackson's return to the lineup, Kaiya Wynn has been UT's most effective player off the bench, producing 7.4 ppg., 3.6 rpg. and 3.8 apg. while shooting 48 percent from the field.

- Campus parking is limited for large Food City Center events, but there is a free shuttle service from the Ag Campus for all fans, dropping off and picking up immediately adjacent to Food City Center.
- ADA shuttles and entry operate the same as previous years.

PHILLIP FULMER WAY CLOSURE INFO.

- Due to construction and upgrades to Neyland Stadium, basketball fans and media members should be advised of immediate changes to normal traffic patterns on Phillip Fulmer Way and Peyton Manning Pass during the 2023-24 basketball season.
- Phillip Fulmer Way from G-10 garage to Neyland Stadium Gate 21 vicinity is now closed.
- The G-10 garage will not be accessible southbound on Phillip Fulmer Way.
- Phillip Fulmer Way will be closed to southbound traffic at Middle Drive, and it will not be accessible via Peyton Manning Pass.
- For events at Food City Center, G-10 and Staff 5 parking areas will be accessible via Lake Loudoun Boulevard, but it is strongly recommended that vehicles enter G-10 via Neyland Drive.
- Additionally, G5/30 will only be accessible from Lake Loudoun Blvd.

SEASON RESET

- After functioning without All-America and SEC Player of the Year candidate Ricca Jackson for eight games from Nov. 13 to Dec. 10 and posting a 4-4 record during her absence, Tennessee has been a much different team since she was cleared following a lower leg injury.
- The Lady Vols are 6-1 since Jackson returned to action and are in a season-best stretch where they have won seven of their past eight games.
- In addition to getting Jackson back, UT has been bolstered by the continued improvement of 6-foot-6 center Tamari Key. The school's all-time leading shot blocker was sidelined after eight games a year ago due to blood clots in her lungs and understandably needed time to reacclimate to the rigors of the game.
- Tennessee also has had to absorb the loss of reserve point guard Destinee Wells, who suffered a lower leg injury just prior to the Wofford game and is out for the season. Fifth-year standout Jasmine Powell has impressively picked up more of the load, and junior Kaiya Wynn has stepped up and provided a spark off the bench on both ends of the floor.
- With the players available for the past seven contests stepping into and accepting their roles, the Lady Vols have competed cohesively as a team, with different players each game emerging to provide valuable contributions in starting and support capacities.

HOOPS HISTORY BETWEEN HARPER, RALPH

- The 2021-22 season brought a brand-new look to the Tennessee-Vanderbilt rivalry, as former Lady Vol standout Kellie Harper, who was then in her third year leading her alma mater, met then first-year Vandy skipper Shea Ralph, a UConn alum, for the very first time as head coaches.
- It's now year five at UT for Harper and year three for Ralph at VU, with Harper getting victories in the coaches' four meetings as head coaches.
- The duo's careers at UT and UConn overlapped from 1996-97 to 1998-99, with Harper (then known as Kellie Jolly) helping lead UT to the second and third of three-straight NCAA titles in 1997 and 1998, while Ralph contributed to a UConn crown in 1999-2000 after Harper had graduated.

LADY VOL POINTS OF PRIDE

- **THE ONLY TEAM IN ALL 41:** Tennessee is the only women's basketball program to compete in all 41 NCAA Tournaments. Kellie Harper guided the Lady Vols to the 2021 through 2023 tourneys and had the team in position in 2020 before the COVID-19 pandemic forced the cancellation of the event.
- **WINNINGEST PROGRAM:** The Lady Vols have the most all-time wins by a women's basketball program in NCAA Division I history, standing at 1,462-378 through the Mississippi State game.
- **WNBA FIRST ROUND FACTORY:** Jordan Horston became the 45th Lady Vol to be drafted and the 20th first-rounder in the WNBA Draft, going ninth to Seattle in 2023. Kellie Harper has had first-rounders in the past three drafts, making her one of only four active coaches and one of 10 all-time to produce first-round picks in three consecutive WNBA Drafts.
- **HALL OF FAMERS:** Tennessee has 10 former players, three former coaches and two former administrators enshrined in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. Pat Summitt, Tamika Catchings and 1976 U.S. Olympians Summitt (player/UT Martin grad.) Cindy Brogdon and Trish Roberts are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball of Fame.

- Both women bravely battled breast cancer and will be remembered this season and always.
- On July 7, LVFL Nikki McCray-Penson, an assistant coach at Rutgers, passed away at 51.
- On Oct. 23, LVFL Tasha Butts died at 41.
- McCray-Penson starred at Tennessee from 1991-95 and went on to play in the WNBA and for the U.S. Olympic Team, winning gold medals in 1996 and 2000. She was a college head coach at Old Dominion and Mississippi State.
- Butts played at UT from 2000-04 and in the WNBA as well as overseas. Starting her career as a G.A. at UT in 2004-05, she was hired for her first head coaching job at Georgetown in April.

Tom Garrick is Ralph's husband, and he is in his third year as an associate head coach on her staff. SEC observers may also recall Garrick was an assistant at Vandy from 2009-15.
- The Harpers have two children, including son Jackson and daughter Kylie. Ralph and Garrick have a daughter, Maysen.

UT-VU CONNECTIONS

- Tennessee junior guard Kaiya Wynn and Vanderbilt graduate guard Jordyn Cambridge each played their high school ball at Ensworth School in Nashville.
- Wynn helped Ensworth to Division II AA state titles in 2019 and 2020 as a sophomore and junior before moving to Texas for her senior year.
- Cambridge, meanwhile, helped that program to a state crown in 2017.
- Vandy sophomore Justine Pissott signed out of high school and played one season on Rocky Top before entering the portal and moving over to Music City.
- Pissott appeared in 27 games in 2022-23, averaging 2.0 ppg. and 1.0 rpg. in 7.0 minutes per game.

RECAPPING THE LAST GAME

- The Lady Vols got back in the win column in a big way on Thursday evening, overcoming a 13-point second-quarter deficit to take a 75-64 victory over Mississippi State in Humphrey Coliseum.
- Tennessee (11-6, 4-1 SEC) was led by fifth-year senior Rickea Jackson, who turned in 19 points and seven rebounds. Junior Kaiya Wynn came off the bench to contribute a career-high 13 points, and fifth-year senior Jasmine Powell and junior Sara Puckett each tallied 11.
- Erynn Barnum was the top scorer for MSU (15-5, 2-3 SEC) with 15 points, and Carter and Debreasha Powe each had 12. Lauren Park-Lane also landed in double digits with 10 on the night.

POSTGAME NOTES VS. MISS. STATE

- **COMEBACK KIDS:** Tennessee recorded its fourth dou-

ble-digit come-from-behind SEC win and fifth such victory of the season, clawing its way back from a 13-point, second-quarter Mississippi State lead to win, 75-64. The Lady Vols previously won after trailing Auburn (11), Kentucky (17) and Florida (12) by more than 10. The Lady Vols also came from 10-down to Oklahoma in the third quarter to defeat the then No. 22/20 Sooners on Nov. 25. For the season, UT has bounced back from being behind to win nine of its 17 games.

- **GETTING DEFENSIVE:** Trailing by seven at the half, Tennessee buckled down on the defensive end in the third frame, holding the home team without a point the final 6:08 of the stanza. UT allowed MSU only five points for the entire quarter, marking the Lady Vols' best defensive effort of the campaign in that period or any period for that matter. UT held an SEC foe to its lowest point total against the Big Orange this season and limited the Bulldogs to their lowest offensive output in league play and their second lowest of the year.
- **RICKEA GETS THE "W" THIS TIME:** Rickea Jackson returned to the school where she played her first three college seasons for the second time in as many years. On this occasion, she walked away a victor, dropping a game-high 19 points and a team-best seven rebounds against the Bulldogs in 32 minutes. A year ago, she supplied Tennessee 28 points and 11 rebounds, but the Lady Vols came up just short, 91-90, in double OT.
- **CAREER DAY FOR KAIYA:** Junior guard Kaiya Wynn came off the bench and provided a spark for the Lady Vols. She went six of 10 from the field to finish with career highs of 13 points and three steals along with five rebounds and an assist in 23 minutes of action. Her +14 plus/minus rating was the game's highest along with teammate Tamari Key.
- **POWELL DISHING AND SWISHING:** Starting point guard Jasmine Powell filled up the stat sheet once again, firing in 11 points with three key three-pointers and contributing seven assists, four rebounds and two steals in 38 minutes. It marked the third time in the past seven games she has dishd seven dimes or more, also doing so vs. Wofford (10) and Kentucky (9). She now has a team-high 59 for the season, averaging 3.5 per game.
- **TAMARI A BIG PLUS:** Tamari Key played a season-most 29 minutes at Mississippi State, besting her previous

high of 24 at Auburn. The 6-foot-6 redshirt senior contributed eight points, four rebounds, three assists and three blocks while matching Kaiya Wynn for Tennessee's best plus/minus rating at +14.

- **CONSISTENT BUCKETS FROM PUCKETT:** Sara Puckett scored in double figures for the third straight game and the 11th time in 17 contests. The junior forward went five for eight from the field and finished with 11 points and grabbed six rebounds while generating a plus/minus tally of +12.

UP NEXT

- After enjoying a Thursday open date on Jan. 25, the Lady Vols head back on the road for two more games and continue a stretch that includes four out of five away from the friendly confines of Food City Center.
- UT ventures to Oxford next Sunday to take on the Rebels at 2 p.m. CT (3 ET) on ESPN.
- The Big Orange will then journey to Athens to face Georgia on Feb. 1 at 7 p.m. ET on SEC Network.

LET'S TALK ABOUT THE NET RANKINGS

- Tennessee is in the midst of a four-game run of games against foes that offer a chance for the Lady Vols to enhance their positioning in the NCAA NET Rankings.
- UT defeated No. 32 Mississippi State on Thursday to climb from 65 to 56 as of Jan. 19.
- The game before, the Big Orange fell at No. 27 NET Texas A&M.
- The next two games come vs. Vanderbilt and Ole Miss, who stand at No. 51 and 59 in the Jan. 19 NET report.
- Tennessee has current top 55 NET wins over No. 32 Mississippi State, No. 49 Florida and No. 55 Oklahoma.
- The Lady Vols have losses to six Top 60 NET teams, with four of those coming while Rickea Jackson was out for eight games due to injury.
- The losses are to No. 9 Notre Dame, No. 11 Indiana, No. 15 Ohio State, No. 27 Texas A&M, No. 39 Florida State and No. 60 Middle Tennessee. Jackson played only vs. Texas A&M and Florida State, with UT losing by one to the Seminoles in Tallahassee, 92-91.

Toughest Schedule Report.

- Lady Vol opponents have compiled a 175-99 overall record for a .639 winning percentage that is used for ranking purposes.
- Only Kentucky (No. 3) and Georgia (No. 18) rank higher among SEC schools.
- Based on cumulative opposition, which includes all the foes teams played already and those they are slated to play this season, Tennessee projects to have the sixth-toughest schedule with a combined .707 winning percentage for opponents. Kentucky ranks No. 1 (.721).

HOME SWEET HOME

- This is the 37th season that the Tennessee women's and men's basketball teams have called Thompson-Boling Arena at Food City Center home. The Lady Vols own a remarkable 515-58 record (.899) in the mammoth venue through the Florida game.
- The 500th win came on Jan. 1, 2023, via an 89-76 victory over Alabama.
- The Lady Vols have built a combined 668-82 (.891) home mark in contests played at Food City Center, Stokely Athletics Center and Alumni Gym.
- Kellie Harper is 64-13 overall, 35-8 vs. non-conference foes and 28-5 in SEC play in games played on The Summit through the Florida contest.

LADY VOLS VS. IN-STATE FOES

- The Tennessee women are 261-62-1 all-time vs. four-year college teams from the Volunteer State, and Kellie Harper is 17-1 in those matchups in her fifth season on Rocky Top through Dec. 6 after suffering at 73-62 setback to Middle Tennessee.
- The Lady Vols are 1-1 in 2023-24 (win vs. Memphis, loss vs. MTSU), were 3-0 in 2022-23 (wins vs. Chattanooga and Vanderbilt (away and home), were 6-0 in 2021-22 (wins vs. Tenn. Tech, ETSU, Chattanooga and Belmont at home and vs. Vanderbilt on the road and at home) and were 3-0 in 2020-21, with wins over ETSU, Lipscomb and Middle Tennessee, with two games on the schedule vs. Vandy (home and away) canceled.
- UT has won 17 of 19 over schools from within the state border and 33 of the last 35, with the lone setbacks during that run being a 76-69 loss to Vanderbilt in Knoxville on Feb. 28, 2019, and a 73-62 loss to Middle Tennessee in Huntsville, Ala., on Dec. 6, 2023.

TENNESSEE IN SEC PLAY

- UT is 442-98 (.819) in SEC regular-season games through the Mississippi State game, winning league bests of 18 regular-season championships and 17 SEC tourney titles through the years.
- Tennessee Head Coach Kellie Harper is 47-19 in SEC games through the MSU contest, including 4-1 in 2023-24. She is 5-4 all-time in SEC Tournament play.
- UT tied for third place in the league in 2019-20 (10-6) and finished third outright in 2020-21 (9-4), 2021-22 (11-5) and 2022-23 (13-3), marking its best back-to-back-to-back-to-back outcomes in SEC play since taking second in 2011-12, first in 2012-13, second in 2013-14 and first in 2014-15.

LADY VOLS VS. UNRANKED TEAMS IN 2023-24

- Tennessee is 10-2 vs. unranked teams in 2023-24, with its losses coming at a neutral site to Middle Tennessee and on the road at Texas A&M.
- During the Kellie Harper era, the Big Orange women sport an 87-13 mark vs. teams outside the top 25 polls.
- UT is averaging 80.6 points and 46.4 rebounds vs. unranked foes this season, while allowing 68.1 and 36.4 to opponents for margins of +12.5 and +10.0.
- Four Lady Vols are averaging double figures in points vs. unranked teams this year.
- Rickea Jackson leads the way at 17.9 ppg., followed by Jewel Spear (12.5), Karoline Striplin (11.8) and Sara Puckett (10.7). Jasmine Powell is close at 9.6 ppg.
- Jackson is tops in rebounds at 7.8 rpg.
- Jasmine Powell leads UT in assists with 51 (4.6 apg.) vs. 31 turnovers.
- Tamari Key and Karoline Striplin are shooting 56.3 and 51.5 percent from the field, respectively, to pace Tennessee in that area.
- Tamari Key has 21 blocked shots (1.8 bpg).

- Tennessee leads the all-time series, 78-10.
- The Lady Vols are 36-1 vs. the Commodores in Knoxville, 32-7 in Nashville and 10-2 at neutral sites (all postseason).
- UT has won 16 of the past 17 contests vs. Vandy.
- These squads have been to overtime on one occasion, with Tennessee seizing a 92-79 decision in Nashville on Jan. 19, 1997.
- Including that OT game in '97, Kellie (Jolly) Harper was 9-0 vs. Vanderbilt as a Lady Vol point guard, and she is 6-0 as UT's coach.
- Harper also was 0-1 vs. VU at Western Carolina and 1-1 vs. the Commodores while at NC State.
- The 84 points scored by the Lady Vols in Nashville last season were UT's most in Memorial Gymnasium since defeating Vandy, 94-88, on Feb. 15, 2004.

ABOUT THE OPPONENT

A LOOK AT THE COMMODORES

- Vanderbilt is led by a trio of players scoring in double figures, including Jordyn Cambridge (14.2), Sacha Washington (12.9) and Ilyana Moore (12.3).
- Washington and Cambridge pull down 7.7 and 6.9 rebounds per game, respectively.
- Cambridge also leads the team in three-pointers (30), assists (88) and steals (77).
- Vandy generates 11.4 steals per contest and turns opponents over 18.8 times per game.
- VU has hit 125 threes, with six different players knocking down 10 or more.
- Like UT, Vandy's SEC wins in 2023-24 are over Mississippi State, Florida, Kentucky and Auburn.

ABOUT THE HEAD COACH

- Shea Ralph is 45-40 in her third season at Vandy.
- She has guided the Commodores to their second-best start in school history at 17-2.
- A seven-time national champion as a student-athlete and coach, Ralph arrived at Vanderbilt after spending the previous 13 seasons as an assistant alongside Geno Auriemma at UConn.
- While serving as a coach at her alma mater, Ralph helped guide the Huskies to 12 Final Four appearances and six national championships, including a record four straight titles from 2013-16.

VANDY'S MOST RECENT GAME

- Freshman Khamil Pierre came up big for Vanderbilt down the stretch, helping the Commodores secure a 53-50 win over Auburn Thursday in Nashville.
- Pierre scored six points over the final three minutes of play and collected the game-sealing steal with four seconds left to help VU mount a comeback win.
- The freshman scored a career-high 17 points and grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds to record her second-consecutive double-double.
- Ilyana Moore chipped in 12 for the Commodores in a game that featured 17 lead changes and eight ties.

LAST UT-VU CONTEST

- A 28-point third quarter effort propelled the Lady Vols to an 86-59 victory over Vanderbilt in UT's home Play4Kay game on Feb. 12, 2023.
- Senior Rickea Jackson led Tennessee (18-9, 10-2 SEC) in scoring with 21 points on the day, while senior Jordan Horston narrowly missed a double-double with 18 points and nine rebounds. Junior Tess Darby also had a productive outing with 14 points, and graduate Jordan Walker dished out a game-high eight assists and logged an eye-popping +40 plus/minus effort.
- Vanderbilt (11-15, 2-10 SEC) was led by Marnelle Garraod who tallied 16 points. Sacha Washington and CJaja Harbison were also in double figures with 12 and 11, respectively.
- The win gave UT a 2022-23 season sweep after previously winning in Nashville on Jan. 8, 84-71.

(No. 18 in 2022 espnW 100) as a pair of guards who will boost UT's depth and athleticism in the backcourt next season after redshirting during the current campaign.

- **ACADEMIC PROWESS:** The Lady Vols turned in a 3.37 team grade point average for the fall semester, ranking as the second-highest term GPA on record (only bested by Fall 21's 3.39).
- There were three perfect 4.0 GPA efforts and eight of 13 team members were above a 3.5 for the term.
- **FIFTH IN LEARFIELD CUP STANDINGS:** Through the conclusion of fall sports, Tennessee ranks fifth in the LEARFIELD Director's Cup Standings with 292.5 points. That is the most points scored by UT for a fall season.
- Last year, Tennessee's sixth-place finish in the Directors' Cup was its best finish in school history. UT also was the second-best finisher among SEC schools a season ago.
- The Lady Vols contributed a second-straight NCAA Sweet 16 berth to last year's UT finish.

MAKE IT FOUR COMEBACK SEC WINS

- Tennessee has fallen behind by double digits in the

- second quarter of its first five SEC games this season.
- The Lady Vols impressively have come back to claim victory in four of those contests.
- UT bounced back from 13-down in its most recent game at Mississippi State, using a 21-5 third-quarter to overturn a seven-point halftime deficit, lead by 13 and win by 11, 76-64.
- UT also defeated Auburn, Kentucky and Florida after erasing double-digit second-quarter deficits.
- On Jan. 11, the Lady Vols found themselves down 12 to Florida in the second quarter before evening the score at the half at 43 and going on to win, 88-81.
- UT previously had bounced back from being 11 and 17 points down to Auburn and Kentucky, respectively.
- The Lady Vols also came from 10-down to Oklahoma in the third quarter to defeat the then No. 22/20 Sooners.
- For the season, UT has come from behind to win nine of 17 games. For more info., please see the "Deficits Overcome By Tennessee" note on page 12.

LADY VOLS FINISHING STRONG

- In five conference games, the Lady Vols have outscored foes 215-147 (43.0 to 29.4) in the second half.
- For the season, Tennessee has out-pointed foes 702 to

- 589 (41.3 to 34.6) after halftime.
- UT's best frame has been the third quarter, where it has tallied 372 points (21.9) in 2023-24 compared to 280 (16.5) for opponents.
- In SEC play, UT is plus 46 in the third quarter (104-58) and plus 22 in the fourth quarter (111-89), outscoring opponents 20.8 to 11.6 in the third and 22.2 to 17.8 in the fourth.
- UT outscored Mississippi State 21-5 in the third quarter on Jan. 14, holding the Bulldogs to the lowest point total in that frame, or any period for that matter, all season long.

THE DIFFERENCE JACKSON MAKES

- Tennessee is 7-2 with Rickea Jackson in action and 4-4 without her in 2023-24.
- She is averaging 19.3 ppg. and 8.8 rpg. in nine contests while shooting 44 percent from the field and 79 percent from the charity stripe.
- She has 30 offensive rebounds in those contests.
- With Jackson, Tennessee is outscoring opponents, 82.2 to 69.6, and outrebounding them, 45.3 to 35.2, for margins of +12.7 and +10.1, respectively.
- Without Jackson's services, UT was outscored by foes, 72.4 to 72.3, but it outrebounded opponents, 44.1 to 40.5, for differentials of -0.1 and +3.6.
- With Jackson, Tennessee is shooting 45.5 percent from the field and 32.5 beyond the three-point arc.
- Without the UT standout's presence, the Lady Vols hit only 39.9 percent from the field and 29.0 from three-point land.
- Jewel Spear's stats reflect a significant impact from Jackson's presence, as she improved from 8.6 ppg. and 30 percent shooting during Jackson's eight-game hiatus to 14.6 ppg. and 50.6 percent marksmanship with Jackson in the lineup.

ALL FIVE STARTERS IN DOUBLE FIGURES

- Tennessee features all five starters averaging double figures in scoring, including Rickea Jackson (19.3), Jewel Spear (11.8), Sara Puckett (11.0), Karoline Striplin (10.4) and Jasmine Powell (10.0).
- In 17 games, six different players have led UT in scoring. Karoline Striplin and Rickea Jackson have done so five times, followed by Sara Puckett (4), Jewel Spear (3), Jasmine Powell (2) and Destinee Wells (1).

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF CHARITY (STRIPE)

- Since Rickea Jackson's return to the lineup, the Lady Vols have shot 77.0 percent from the free-throw line over the past seven games.
- Tennessee is hitting free throws at a 73.8 percent clip for the season, a mark that ranks No. 2 in the SEC this season and one that currently stands as the sixth-highest mark in school history.
- In SEC play UT has been even better, connecting at a rate of 77.3 percent that ranks third among SEC schools.
- Jewel Spear ranks sixth in league play at 87.5 (21-24), while Jasmine Powell is 10th (84.0, 21-25).
- In all games, Sara Puckett hits 84.0 (4th in SEC), followed by Jewel Spear (80.0) and Rickea Jackson (78.6).

MILESTONE WATCH

- Kellie Harper is one win away from her 100th as head coach at UT and 16 shy of 400 for her career.
- With a blocked shot vs. MTSU on Dec. 6, Tamari Key reached 300 for her career and became the ninth player in SEC history to hit that mark.
- After blocking 16 shots over the past six games, Key now has 319 blocks through the A&M game and needs two to catch Sylvia Fowles (LSU, 321, 2004-08) in eighth on the SEC's all-time career list.
- She also is 60 points away from becoming the 49th player in Lady Vol history to score 1,000 points here.
- Rickea Jackson has tallied 1,930 for her career and is just 70 shy of hitting 2,000.
- Jackson has 845 points as a Lady Vol and needs 155 more to reach 1,000 in a Tennessee uniform.
- Against Liberty, Tess Darby hit six three-pointers and surpassed Taber Spani (143) and Shannon Bobbitt (147) to move into eighth place on UT's career three-pointers list. She now has 150 through the Mississippi State game.

- Rickea Jackson, Tennessee's leading scorer and rebounder, missed eight games (Memphis, Troy, Indiana, Oklahoma, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Middle Tennessee, EKU) with a lower right leg injury.
- Destinee Wells, UT's reserve point guard, was lost for the season due to a lower leg injury just prior to the Wofford game and has missed the past seven games.
- Jillian Hollingshead was out vs. Middle Tennessee due to being in concussion protocol but returned vs. EKU.
- Jasmine Powell missed the Troy game after suffering a wrist injury vs. Memphis, but returned vs. Indiana.
- Avery Strickland missed the Troy, Indiana, Oklahoma and Notre Dame games while being in concussion protocol. She returned vs. Ohio State and had four points and two rebounds in 12 minutes. After being injured again vs. MTSU she was back in protocol and missed the four more contests for a total of eight absences.
- Tamari Key, who missed nearly all of last season due to blood clots being discovered in her lungs, is gradually ramping up her playing time and shaking off the rust of inactivity for a prolonged period.
- The last few games have featured Key's best play of the season.

- Tennessee ranks No. 12 nationally and fourth in the SEC in rebounds per game at 44.76 through the Jan. 19 NCAA rankings.
- The Lady Vols are also No. 12 overall and No. 3 in the SEC in defensive rebounds per game (30.7) and No. 54 (No. 5 SEC) in offensive rebounds per game (14.1) through 17 contests.
- They now rank No. 43 nationally and No. 6 vs. league teams in rebound margin (7.1).
- Rickea Jackson paces the squad at 8.8 rpg., followed by Jillian Hollingshead (6.1) and Sara Puckett (5.6).
- During the Kellie Harper era, UT has three of the school's top six rebound averages, including 48.1 (1st, 2021-22), 46.0 (5th, 2019-20) and 45.6 (6th, 2020-21).
- Last year's 42.9 per game avg. was 28th all-time at UT and 12th nationally for 2022-23.

SHE'S A GO-TO PLAYER

- Rickea Jackson missed eight games due to a leg injury after getting off to a sensational start. UT is glad to see her back on the court and continuing that level of play.
- She led Tennessee at 22.0 ppg. and 12.0 rpg., while shooting 47 percent on field goals and 88 percent on free throws through two games before her injury.
- Jackson fired in 31 points and pulled down 17 rebounds in UT's 92-91 heartbreaking loss to No. 18/22 Florida State in Tallahassee on Nov. 9.
- Jackson returned to action on Dec. 19, contributing 11 points and six rebounds in 21 minutes off the bench in an 85-63 win over Wofford.

- The Tennessee senior, who is playing for the same college head coach in back-to-back seasons for the first time, is in the conversation for league player of the year and All-America distinction.
- Last season she was a top-five finalist for the Cheryl Miller Award, an honorable mention All-American by WBCA, USBWA and AP, and an All-SEC First Team selection by the coaches, AP and USA TODAY Sports Network.
- Jackson finished third in the SEC last season at 19.2 ppg. in all contests and second in league games at 21.4 ppg. LSU's Angel Reese (23.0/23.1) is the only returning SEC player who tallied higher scoring averages.
- Jackson's average ranked fifth all-time by a senior at UT and also qualified as the No. 5 career scoring average.
- She shot career bests of 54.8 percent from the field and 79.2 percent from the free-throw line in 2022-23.

RICKEA'S 30/15+ NIGHT VS. FSU

- Rickeya Jackson became the seventh Lady Vol in history to record a 30/15+ double-double with the 13th in Tennessee annals.
- Jackson follows Patricia Roberts (5 times), Cindy Brogdon, Mary Ostrowski, Shelia Collins (twice), Chamique Holdsclaw (twice) and Candace Parker.
- She joins Shelia Collins and Chamique Holdsclaw as the only UT players to accomplish this feat on an opponent's court.
- Jackson's rebounding total of 17 ranks as the seventh-most in a 30-15+ double-double by a Lady Vol.

JACKSON STACKING UP 20s

- Rickeya Jackson has tallied four efforts of 20 points or more in 2023-24 (FSU, Liberty, Auburn, Kentucky) and is tied for seventh place on UT's career list of 20+ performances with 20 in her second year on Rocky Top.
- The top nine are Chamique Holdsclaw (83), Bridgette Gordon (58), Candace Parker (48), Tamika Catchings (27), Rennie Davis (23), Diamond DeShields (21), Rickeya Jackson and Meighan Simmons (20) and Jordan Horston (16).
- Jackson accumulated 16 games of 20 points or more in 2022-23, ranking No. 9 at UT for most in a season.
- Only Chamique Holdsclaw (28, 24, 20), Candace Parker (21, 17), Bridgette Gordon (20, 18) and Tamika Catchings (18) had more in a season than Jackson's 16.
- Jackson logged eight straight contests of 20+ points from Feb. 6 to March 4, surpassing seven-game efforts by Candace Parker (2006-07) and Bridgette Gordon (1987-88).
- The only Lady Vol with more consecutive 20+ point performances in a row is four-time All-American Chamique Holdsclaw, who had nine in 1997-98.

"FEAR DA SPEAR"

- Wake Forest transfer Jewel Spear has scored in double figures 10 times this season and leads the Lady Vols with 29 three-pointers made.
- Her tally of career games in double figures stands at 82 through the Mississippi State contest.
- The two-time All-ACC performer is averaging 11.8 ppg. through her first 17 games as a Lady Vol, ranking second in scoring on the team.
- In SEC play, she is even better, averaging 13.6 ppg. and shooting 51.2 percent from the field and 88 percent from the free-throw line.
- Spear recently had her first back-to-back 20-point ef-

forts as a Lady Vol, firing in 21 vs. Kentucky and then following that with 20 vs. Florida. She also had 20 in the season opener vs. Florida A&M on Nov. 7.

- She scored at least 18 in the first three contests this season and added her fourth 18+ effort vs. Wofford.
- Spear joined Rae Burrell (5 games, 2020-21) and teammate Sara Puckett (2023-24) as the only Lady Vols over the past five seasons to record 10 or more points in the season's first three contests.
- Against Memphis on Nov. 13, Spear recorded her first double-double as a Lady Vol and the fourth of her career with 19 points and a career-best 12 rebounds, increasing her rebounding average to 6.7 at the time. She still stands at 4.5.
- Spear also is tied for second on the team with three charges taken.

PUCKETT PLAYING AT ANOTHER LEVEL

- After posting scoring efforts of 20 points vs. Florida, 12 vs. Texas A&M and 11 vs. Mississippi State, Sara Puckett is third on the squad at 11.0 ppg. and third in boards at 5.6 rpg.
- She now has 11 contests in double figures in 2023-24, surpassing her previous career-best season total of seven from her freshman campaign. She now has 22 for her career.
- With 13 points against Oklahoma, Sara Puckett notched her sixth consecutive contest in double figures to open the season and is the only Lady Vol to do that during the Kellie Harper era.
- Her consecutive streak, which ended vs. Notre Dame, was the longest since Mercedes Russell opened the 2017-18 campaign with 23 consecutive contests in double figures, spanning Nov. 12, 2017, to Feb. 4, 2018.
- Puckett's previous best run of consecutive double-figure contests was a four-game spree during games 8-11 of her rookie campaign in 2021-22, when she had 10+ vs. Virginia Tech (15), Georgia State (12), Stanford (10) and ETSU (19).
- Puckett dropped 11, 15, 24, 14, 13 and 13 in her opening six contests as a junior.
- Her 14 vs. Troy on Nov. 19 came on the heels of an illness that kept her out of the previous day's practice.
- Her 13 points vs. #21/19 Indiana came after scoring zero points in the first half due to foul trouble and after she rolled an ankle during the team's shoot-around earlier in the day.
- The only other player over the past five years to open with at least five straight double-figure efforts was Rae Burrell, who began the 2020-21 campaign with five consecutive efforts of 10 or more points.
- Puckett fired in her career high of 24 vs. Memphis, charting a third-straight double-figure performance for only the second time in her career and then matching her career high with her fourth in a row vs. Troy.
- Puckett was the No. 43 ranked player in the HoopGurlz ESPNW 100 class of 2021 and that season's Alabama Gatorade Player of the Year.

SMOOTH JAZZ

- Jasmine Powell has settled in nicely for year two on Rocky Top, averaging 10.0 ppg. after tallying 4.7 ppg. last season and is Tennessee's leader in assists (59/3.7 ppg.) and fourth-leading rebounder in 2023-24 at 4.6 rpg. despite standing just 5-6.
- She's also producing 10.0 ppg. in SEC games, adding 4.8 apg. and 4.2 rpg.
- She has dished her top three assist totals of the season over the past seven contests, distributing 10 vs. Wofford, nine vs. Kentucky and seven vs. Miss. State.
- Powell scored in double figures in four consecutive games from Nov. 19 to Nov. 29, marking the first time she has done that while at Tennessee.
- She missed the Troy game due to a wrist injury but returned vs. #21/19 Indiana and contributed 12 points. She then put up a season-high 19 vs. #22/20 Oklahoma on 5-of-8 marksmanship before getting a start vs. #18/14 Notre Dame and leading UT with 14 points.
- The previous time Powell played in a game before the injury, she tallied 17 points in the win over Memphis on Nov. 13.

- Kaiya Wynn is enjoying a breakthrough season, putting up season-best averages of 5.7 ppg. and 2.9 rpg.

- while shooting 42 percent from the field, 33 percent on threes and 73 percent from the charity stripe.
- In SEC play, she has stepped it up to 7.0 ppg. and 3.4 rpg. while shooting 46.2 percent from the field and 77 percent at the line.
- Wynn already has posted season-mosts for minutes, points, field goals, three-pointers, free throws, assists and blocks during her third season on Rocky Top.
- She averaged 8.2 minutes per game as a freshman, 5.1 last season and now 15.0 per contest in 2023-24.
- In terms of double-figure scoring, Wynn has tallied 10+ points in five games this season, including three times in the past six contests.
- Prior to this season, she had reached 10 points only once in 61 games, tallying 12 vs. ETSU as a freshman.

STRIPLIN EMERGING AS JUNIOR

- Karoline Striplin has shown continued growth during her third season on Rocky Top, currently averaging 10.4 ppg. and 4.3 rpg. while shooting 52 percent from the field and 38 percent on three-pointers.
- She has been in double figures a career season-high eight times this season and on 14 occasions during her time as a Lady Vol.
- Striplin had a four-game streak of double-figure scoring from Dec. 6 to Dec. 31 that ranks as a career best.
- With Jillian Hollingshead out vs. MTSU on Dec. 6, Striplin got her first start of the season and 29th of her career. She responded with a career-best 29 points on 11-of-20 shooting, including 4-of-8 accuracy beyond the arc. She was three of three at the charity stripe as well.
- She followed with a team-high 17 vs. ECU on Dec. 10.
- Striplin tallied 19 points and 14 rebounds vs. Troy on Nov. 19, recording (then) career highs in both categories to notch the first double-double of her career and doing so in the first half alone with 15 and 10.
- Striplin opened the season with her previous scoring high of 18 points on 7-of-8 shooting vs. Florida A&M.
- She also tallied 13 vs. No. 21/19 Indiana and 10 vs. No. 18/14 Notre Dame.
- In the Indiana game, Striplin had a run of 11 straight points vs. the Hoosiers in the third frame.

STRIPLIN JOINS ELITE COMPANY

- With 29 points against Middle Tennessee on Dec. 6, Karoline Striplin became one of only three players during the Kellie Harper era to score that many points.
- Striplin joined Rickea Jackson (33 this season vs. Florida State/34 last year vs. Kentucky in the SEC Tournament) and Rennia Davis (three total efforts of 30+ during 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons).
- Prior to that outburst vs MTSU, Striplin's previous career best was 19 vs. Troy on Nov. 19, 2023.

JILLIAN EMERGING AS INSIDE PRESENCE

- Jillian Hollingshead is Tennessee's second-leading rebounder through 17 contests, pulling down 6.1 rpg. to go along with a 5.3 scoring average.
- She tallied seven points at Texas A&M on Jan. 14, marking her highest scoring total since posting seven vs. Wofford on Dec. 19.
- She had an 18-point, 10-rebound double-double vs. Troy and turned in a 14-point, nine-rebound effort vs. Memphis the game before.
- Ten of Hollingshead's points and seven of her boards came during the second half/overtime in the victory over Memphis on Nov. 13.
- The double-figure scoring efforts for Hollingshead give her two for the season, eight as a Lady Vol and nine for her career, with one coming as a freshman at Georgia in 2021-22.
- Hollingshead's inside production has been crucial with Tamari Key working her way back from last season's medical shutdown and Rickea Jackson missing games due to injury this season.
- Unfortunately for Hollingshead and the Lady Vols, her production was paused while missing the MTSU game due to being in concussion protocol, but she returned with a team-high nine rebounds to go with six points and three assists in 19 minutes vs. ECU.
- She pulled down 10 boards in the win over Wofford.

TESS MOVES INTO CAREER TREYS TOP 10

- Tess Darby joined Tennessee's career top 10 for

- three-pointers made this season and currently stands at No. 8 with 150.
- Darby is 11 shy of seventh-place Brittany Jackson (161, 2001-05).
- She moved into a tie for 10th at 133 after nailing the second of a pair of treys at the 7:04 mark in the second quarter vs. Oklahoma in the Elevance Health Women's Fort Myers Tip-Off on Nov. 25.
- With two treys vs. Notre Dame, Tess Darby upped her career total to 135 and claimed sole possession of 10th.
- Darby has hit three-pointers at a .378 clip during her career (150-397), ranking No. 9 all-time at Tennessee.
- A year ago, she connected on 40.9 percent (70-171) of her treys to card UT's second-best rate over the past 12 seasons.
- That percentage ranked No. 3 in the Southeastern Conference in 2022-23.
- Darby's 70 makes last season stand as the ninth-best total in UT women's hoops history.

UT SHOOTING, HITTING THREES IN BUNCHES

- Tennessee has attempted 387 three-pointers and hit 119 through 17 games. UT already has made as many treys as it did in 12 different seasons.
- The Lady Vols rank No. 70 nationally and No. 3 in the SEC for treys attempted per contest at 22.8.
- UT is 102nd in the country and No. 5 in the SEC for threes made per game at 7.0 as of the Jan. 19 rankings.
- The Lady Vols have hit 10 or more three-pointers on four occasions already, marking the first time in program history that UT has knocked down 10 or more treys in a game at least four times during the opening 12 contests of a season.
- They already have the second-highest total of games with 10+ three-pointers made, tying with the 2011-12 and 2005-06 squads.
- The UT record of games with 10+ three-balls is five, set in 2010-11, 2007-08 and 2002-03.
- The Big Orange made a season-best 12 at Liberty on Dec. 31 and fired in 10 at Florida State on Nov. 9, vs. Troy on Nov. 19 and vs. Wofford on Dec. 19.
- Jewel Spear (29), Tess Darby (24), Sara Puckett (20), Karoline Striplin (16) and Jasmine Powell (14) have reached double figures.

KEY ONCE AGAIN PATROLLING THE PAINT

- After missing all but nine games a year ago due to blood clots being discovered in her lungs, 6-foot-6 redshirt senior Tamari Key looks to provide interior presence on both ends of the floor.
- Key was a 2021-22 Lisa Leslie Award top-five finalist and All-SEC Second Team selection by the coaches and the USA TODAY Sports Network, and she is a two-time SEC All-Defensive Team choice (2020-21 & 2021-22).
- She is UT's all-time record holder for blocks in a career (319), career blocks per game (2.77) triple-doubles in a career (2), blocks in a season (119, 2021-22), season blocks per game (3.50) and triple-doubles in a season (1, 2020-21 & 2021-22).
- Key is one of only nine players in SEC women's basketball history to reach 300 career blocks.
- The other eight are 1.) Heidi Gillingham, Vanderbilt (413, 1991-94), 2.) Marita Payne, Auburn (377, 2003-06), 3.) Angela Gorsica, Vanderbilt (368, 1994-97), 4.) A'ja Wilson, South Carolina (363, 2014-18), 5.) Vanessa Hayden, Florida (357, 2001-04), 6.) Aliyah Boston, South Carolina (330, 2019-23), 7.) Martha Alwal, Miss. State (328, 2012-15) and 8.) Sylvia Fowles, LSU (321, 2004-08).

- She has UT's No. 2 (11) single-game blocks high as well as the No. 3, 4, 5, 6 and 9 sums as well.
- Offensively, Key has shot 59.4 pct. for her career to rank No. 4 all-time at Tennessee.
- Key averaged 8.4 ppg., 4.2 rpg. and 2.0 bpg. while shooting 66.7 percent from the field in 2022-23 before being sidelined. She put up 10.5/8.1/3.5/58.1 in 2021-22.
- She entered the 2023-24 season with 881 points, needing 119 to become the 49th Lady Vol to join the 1,000-point club.

WHERE THEY STAND ON SEC LISTS

- Rickea Jackson ranks No. 1 in scoring (1,930), No. 6 in rebounding (648) and No. 8 in double-doubles (12) on the SEC's active career lists.
- Tamari Key stands No. 1 in blocked shots (319), No. 1 in triple-doubles (2), No. 7 in rebounds (646) and No. 7 in double-doubles (15).
- On the SEC all-time lists, Key is tied for first with two triple-doubles. She entered 2023-24 ranked No. 9 in career blocks (295). Her season total of 119 in 2021-22 stands No. 4, and she owns the No. 3 (11) and No. 4 (10) single-game highs recorded by SEC players.

KEY CHOSEN FOR NCAA SUMMIT

- Tamari Key has been chosen to attend the NCAA Above The Rim Summit, a three-day immersive leadership program during NCAA Final Four Weekend in Cleveland on April 5-7.
- The aim of the Above the Rim Summit is to provide education and career development support to women's basketball student-athletes. The participants will be introduced to numerous subject matter experts who will share their expertise on career navigation. They will also be immersed in personal and professional development activities designed to provide an introspective picture of who they are and how they work best with others.
- The inaugural group in 2023 engaged in brand building, media training and financial literacy, and they also had an opportunity to gain more knowledge about the world of professional basketball from industry professionals and former players.

WELLS OUT FOR THE YEAR

- Head coach Kellie Harper shared after the Wofford game the unfortunate news that reserve point guard Destinee Wells was lost for the season due to a lower right leg injury. Wells was hurt in practice leading up to that contest.
- Wells who started four of the 10 games she played, averaged 6.8 ppg., 3.5 app. and 2.3 rpg. while shooting 81 percent from the free-throw line.
- She led the team with 35 assists (3.5 app.) at the time of her injury and scored in double figures on three occasions.
- Destinee Wells knocked down her first three pointer of the season late in the first quarter against Troy and went on to score 18 points while dishing out a game-high eight assists and grabbing four rebounds.
- The senior guard did so while getting her first start at point guard due to an injury to Jasmine Powell.
- She enjoyed her second game in double figures vs. No. 18/14 Notre Dame on Nov. 29, tossing in 13 points and dishing out five assists vs. the Irish, followed by a team-high 11 vs. No. 16/13 Ohio State.

HARPER IN YEAR FIVE AT ALMA MATER

- **Kellie Harper is in year five at Tennessee and season 20 overall within range of 100 wins on Rocky Top and 400 for her career. She is 99-45 at UT and has a 384-253 record overall.**
- Harper has led her teams to 15 postseason bids in 19 years (8 NCAA/7 WNIT) through 2022-23, including a perfect three-for-three on NCAA bids while in Knoxville.
- She led UT to back-to-back NCAA Sweet 16s in 2021-22 and 2022-23, making her one of only seven coaches

SUMMITT BLUE UNIFORMS

- Tennessee wore "Summitt Blue" uniforms for the first time in the modern era on Jan. 15, 2023, as the Lady Vols beat Georgia, 68-55, in Knoxville.
- UT fell to 1-1 in women's hoops while wearing those uniforms after donning them in a road loss at Mississippi State on Feb. 6, 2023.
- The Lady Vols, though, are now 2-1 after defeating Florida, 88-81, in the blue unis on The Summitt on Jan. 11, 2024.
- In conjunction with the 50th anniversary of Title IX, Tennessee Athletics' updated brand standards renamed the blue accent color historically associated with the Lady Vols "Summitt Blue."
- Four teams debuted the Summitt Blue uniforms during the 2022-23 academic year - a collection dubbed the "Summitt Legacy" series.
- During fall, the Tennessee soccer and volleyball teams were the first to compete in the new Summitt Blue jerseys.
- The Lady Vol basketball team followed suit with a full Summitt Blue uniform vs Georgia, and the softball squad's jersey rotation also featured a Summitt Blue option last spring.
- Summitt Blue stands alongside "Smokey Grey" and "Dark Mode" (formerly Anthracite) as the three accent colors on Tennessee Athletics' official color palette.
- "Tennessee's history as a worldwide leader in women's athletics, along with the Lady Vols' unique legacy of excellence are traditions we are proud to celebrate," Tennessee Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics Danny White said. "As some of our teams saw their new Summitt Blue uniforms for the first time, they reacted with a joy and enthusiasm that extended to our fans and proud alumni."
- The first version of the Lady Vols' blue accent color appeared in 1968 when Joan Cronan set out to obtain jerseys for the women's basketball team. At the time, no company offered an orange uniform, so Cronan opted for Columbia blue uniforms with orange lettering when the Lady Vols played at home.
- Later, when orange uniforms became available, Tennessee switched to the traditional orange jerseys but a touch of Summitt Blue has remained.
- Blue also has appeared on Tennessee men's uniforms in the past, as the men's basketball program used a shade of blue as an accent color on its jerseys during the head coaching tenure of Ray Mears in the 1960s.
- The Tennessee football team wore blue accessories during a 2022 home game vs. UT Martin and a 2023 contest vs. UConn. In addition to commemorating the anniversary of Title IX, the Summitt Blue color honored longtime Lady Vols head coach and innovator in the sport of basketball, Pat Summitt. UT Martin served as the alma mater for the iconic Tennessee head coach.



- nationwide to do that in each of the past two seasons.
- Harper (MSU 2019/UT 2022 & 2023) is one of only 10 NCAA DI coaches to make three or more appearances in the NCAA Sweet 16 since the 2018-19 Big Dance, one of only six females to do so and the youngest of those six.
- She has piloted her squads to 15 top-three league finishes and four league tourney titles along the way, including four straight third-place SEC finishes at UT.
- Her past two teams won 25 games, including a 25-9/11-5 SEC record in 2021-22 and a 25-12/13-3 SEC worksheet in 2022-23, despite losing All-SEC performers and game-changers Jordan Horston and Tamari Key in back-to-back campaigns for medical reasons.
- The Lady Vols' 13 SEC wins a year ago were the most since 2014-15, they recorded 25 victories in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2013-14 and 2014-15, and they advanced to the SEC Tournament title game for the first time since 2015.
- Harper is 47-19 in SEC games through the Mississippi State game, ranking third in winning percentage in league games behind only LSU's Kim Mulkey and South Carolina's Dawn Staley. Harper and Staley are the only coaches to guide their teams to top-three SEC finishes in each of the past four seasons.
- Tennessee's 18-1 start in 2021-22 was its best since 2007-08. UT also defeated five ranked teams for the most since 2017-18, topping its total of five from Harper's first two seasons in Knoxville combined.
- One of only two skippers to guide four different programs to the NCAA Tournament, the 1999 UT graduate and three-time national champion point guard joined Jim Foster in that select company in 2020-21. She has done so while reshaping programs at Western Carolina, NC State, Missouri State and now Tennessee.

HARPER ELITE IN DEVELOPING WNBA PICKS

- With Jordan Horston's selection at No. 9 in the 2023 WNBA Draft, Kellie Harper is only the fourth among active women's coaches to have first-round selections in three consecutive drafts and the 10th all-time. UConn's Geno Auriemma, Stanford's Tara VanDerveer and South Carolina's Dawn Staley are the only other active skip-pers to accomplish that feat.
- The former coaches include Ohio State's Jim Foster, North Carolina's Sylvia Hatchell, Georgia's Andy Landers, Notre Dame's Muffet McGraw, Rutgers' C. Vivian Stringer and Tennessee's Pat Summitt (2001, 2002, 2003).
- Only Auriemma (3 times) and Hatchell (twice) have gone back-to-back-back more than once.
- Only Auriemma and McGraw have had first-round picks in more than three consecutive seasons, with Auriemma doing so four times in a row twice from 2008 to 2011 and from 2013 to 2016, and McGraw enjoying a four-year run from 2012 to 2015. It would appear Harper would have a solid chance to join that small club in 2024, with returnee Rickea Jackson projected as a first-round pick.

- The largest deficit (23) as well as first-half (23), halftime (20) and second-half deficit (20/18:17/2H) ever overcome for a win by UT were vs. Rutgers (55-51) on Jan. 3, 2009. UT trailed, 31-8, with 2:15 left in the first half.
 - That second-half deficit overcome was tied by UT coming from 20 down in the third quarter to beat Stetson on Dec. 5, 2018.
 - In its biggest postseason rally in school history, UT rallied from 17-down for a 52-46 win over Virginia in the 1996 Elite Eight to reach the Final Four and win the Lady Vols' fourth NCAA title.
 - UT also had a 17-point postseason comeback vs. Gonzaga in Spokane, Wash., on March 28, 2015, with UT trailing by 17, 57-40, with 6:34 remaining in the NCAA Sweet 16 and going on to win, 73-69, in OT.
 - UT's best-ever game-opening run (22-0) came on Dec. 27, 2022, vs. Wofford.
 - An opponent's best game-opening run (19-0) came on Jan. 22, 2007, vs. Duke in Knoxville.
 - UT's biggest lost lead during the Harper era is 17 (3Q, Georgia, 1/14/21). It was the biggest since UT saw a 23-point lead evaporate in an 84-70 loss at Notre Dame on Jan. 17, 2018.
 - The Lady Vols came from 17-down in the second quarter, 14-down at the half and 16-down early in the third frame to card the largest comeback of the Kellie Harper era vs. #4/3 LSU, 69-67, on March 5, 2023, in the SEC Tournament semifinals in Greenville, S.C.

LADY VOLS, HARPER IN SEC OPENERS

- Tennessee is 37-5 in its first SEC home game of a season through 2023-24, winning seven of its last eight such contests.
- Kellie Harper is 5-0 in the first SEC home game of a campaign as Tennessee's head coach through the 2023-24 home SEC debut, defeating Missouri, Arkansas, Alabama, Alabama and Kentucky in her first five seasons.
- Tennessee is 36-6 all-time in its first SEC game of a season, including 19-3 at home and 17-3 on the road after defeating Auburn on Jan. 4, 2024, 75-67.
- The Lady Vols have won their past 10 SEC openers, last losing to LSU, 80-77, on Jan. 2, 2014.
- Kellie Harper is 5-0 at UT in SEC openers, winning vs. Missouri, Arkansas, Alabama, Florida and now Auburn in her first five seasons.
- The Lady Vols are now 33-9 in their initial SEC away game of a season after defeating Auburn on Jan. 4, 2024, 75-67, winning 14 of the past 15.
- Harper is 4-1 in UT's first SEC road game of the season, falling at Kentucky in 2019-20, defeating LSU in 2020-21, beating Arkansas in 2021-22, handling Florida in 2022-23 and handling Auburn in 2023-24.
- Tennessee is now 5-2 all-time in SEC openers vs. Auburn, including 3-1 on the road and 2-1 at home.

LADY VOLS IN OPENERS

- The Big Orange women are 40-10 in their first road game of the season through the 2023-24 road opener.
- The Lady Vols are 11-5 in those games when facing a ranked team.
- Tennessee possesses a 47-3 all-time record in its first home contest of the year through 2023-24.
- The Lady Vols have won 24 straight times in their first appearance at Thompson-Boling Arena and in 41 of their past 42 campaigns.
- The Lady Vols are 45-5 all-time in season openers over the past 50 years, including 29-3 at home, 8-2 on the road and 8-0 at neutral sites.

- UT had won its last nine season openers and 21 of its last 22 until the setback at Ohio State last year.

KELLIE HARPER IN OPENING GAMES

- Kellie Harper is now 8-1 coaching a Power 5 school (4-0 at NC State, 4-1 at Tennessee) in season openers.
- Her teams defeated East Tennessee State (away), Western Kentucky (home) and Southern Illinois (home) in her first three seasons at UT, respectively, and then fell to No. 14/15 Ohio State in 2022-23 before defeating Florida A&M in 2023-24.

NOTES HEADING INTO 2023-24

HEADING INTO 2023-24 WITH MOMENTUM

- UT returned eight veterans from a squad that navigated growing pains and a brutal schedule to finish 25-12 overall (13-3 SEC, 3rd/NCAA Sweet 16) in 2022-23.
- The Lady Vols are one of only seven programs making the NCAA Sweet 16 in each of the past two seasons.
- UT is the only school besides South Carolina to card top-three SEC finishes in each of the past four years.
- Kellie Harper guided the Big Orange past LSU and into the 2023 SEC Tournament title game, marking the program's first appearance since 2015.
- Top scorer Rickeya Jackson (2023 Cheryl Miller Award Finalist) and UT's all-time blocks queen Tamari Key (2022 Lisa Leslie Award Finalist), both All-SEC players, return.
- UT's transfer class is ranked No. 6 by 247Sports, via a No. 7 rating for Jewel Spear and a No. 19 spot for Destinee Wells.
- ESPN has Spear and Wells slotted at No. 4 & No. 15, respectively, in its portal rankings, while The Athletic has them at No. 8 and No. 13.

SIX RETURN WITH STARTING EXPERIENCE

- Tennessee welcomed back a veteran nucleus, with upperclassmen Tess Darby (35), Karoline Striplin (28), Rickeya Jackson (24), Sara Puckett (15), Jasmine Powell (11) and Tamari Key (9) combining for 122 starts last season and amassing a total of 466 during their careers.
- Key departed after nine games in 2022-23 due to blood clots in her lungs, but she returned to limited practice in June 2023 ahead of UT's European Tour. She practiced but did not play in two games vs. all-star teams.
- Averaging 8.4 ppg. and 4.2 rpg., Key was UT's third-leading scorer and fourth-leading rebounder despite her condition last season.
- Darby (7.4), Jillian Hollingshead (6.2 ppg.), 36 games but zero starts) and the trio of Powell, Striplin and Puckett were next, all at 4.7 ppg. Powell distributed 3.1 apg.

DISPLAYING PORTAL POWER

- Kellie Harper and her staff have recruited the transfer portal very successfully, and spring 2023 was no exception.
- The Lady Vols added seniors Jewel Spear (Wake Forest) and Destinee Wells (Belmont), who each have a COVID year option they could use for 2024-25.
- UT also welcomed sophomores Avery Strickland (Pitt) and Talaysia Cooper (South Carolina).
- Spear (32), Wells (35) and Strickland (11), who are eligible to play this season, combined for 78 starts last season and bring 189 total career starting nods to UT.
- Cooper, who made her transfer destination decision after the NCAA portal closed, is able to practice this season but must sit out due to that timing. Cooper played in 24 games last season for the Gamecocks.
- Last year's transfer portal class including Rickeya Jackson (Mississippi State), Jasmine Powell (Minnesota) and Jillian Hollingshead (Georgia). All three made immediate impacts a year ago, and Jackson was the SEC's third-leading scorer at 19.2 ppg.

FIVE ALL-CONFERENCE HONOREES

- Tennessee has five players on its roster who have earned all-conference honors here or at their previous schools.
- Forward Rickeya Jackson is a three-time WBCA All-America Honorable Mention choice, two-time All-SEC & SEC All-Tournament honoree and 2023 Cheryl Miller Award finalist.

- Center Tamari Key is a 2022 Lisa Leslie Award & Naismith Defensive Player of the Year finalist, All-SEC Second Team member & two-time SEC All-Defensive Team choice.
- Guard Jewel Spear was a two-time All-ACC and ACC All-Tournament honoree in three years at Wake Forest.
- Point guard Destinee Wells was a three-time first-team all-league pick (twice OVC, then MVC in 2022-23) at Belmont.
- Guard Jasmine Powell was Coaches All-Big Ten Second Team at Minnesota in 2020-21.

LADY VOLS GO 2-0 ON EUROPEAN TOUR

- The Tennessee women's basketball team took the first steps on its 2023-24 journey in June, beginning the chemistry-building process while embarking on a summer tour in Europe.
- The Lady Vols visited Italy and Greece and played two games during an excursion that lasted June 11-22.
- UT traveled by boat to defeat the Venice All-Stars, 89-76 at Palestra Leo Perziano on the Venetian lagoon island of Murano on June 13.
- The Big Orange then overwhelmed the Rome All-Stars, 100-48, on June 15 at EuroBasket Roma Arena.
- During the excursion, the Lady Vols had stops in Venice, Rome, Pompeii, Sorrento and Capri via plane, train, bus, boat, water taxi and gondola before heading to Greece, where they spent some time exploring the historic environs of Athens and made a day trip to Cape Sounion and Astir Beach along the Aegean Sea.

TWO LADY VOLS REP USA AT AMERICUP

- Tennessee standouts Rickeya Jackson and Jewel Spear represented the United States at the 2023 FIBA Women's AmeriCup in Leon, Mexico, from July 1-9.
- Spear and Jackson were part of the youngest team in the AmeriCup tournament with an average age of 20, and they helped that squad capture a silver medal.
- Jackson (14.6 ppg.) finished the competition averaging a team-leading 14.6 points and 4.9 rebounds per game.
- Her scoring average was fourth among the 109 players who saw action in the tournament, earning her a spot in the AmeriCup All-Star Five.
- Jackson's 102 points were the second most in USA AmeriCup history behind Lisa Leslie (129, 7 games, 1993).
- Spear produced 5.6 ppg. and 1.4 apg. while leading the USA in three-pointers with 10 in just seven contests. She did so after signing with Tennessee on May 5.
- The two were roommates at the USA Trials in Colorado Springs and at the AmeriCup in Mexico, helping them begin building a bond that will benefit the Lady Vols this season.

ADDITIONAL SUMMER TRAVEL

- In addition to the Lady Vols' European Tour and the AmeriCup experience in Mexico by Rickeya Jackson and Jewel Spear, three other Lady Vols traveled overseas for university experiences over the summer.
- Tess Darby was in Iceland and Karoline Striplin journeyed to England, with each completing study abroad experiences.
- Sara Puckett made her way to The Philippines with the VOLeaders Leadership Academy as part of the organization's goal to positively impact team, campus and community, both locally and globally.

LADY VOLS EMBRACE MISSION MONDAYS

- During the summer, the Lady Vol basketball team spent Mondays during the month of July taking part in community service events around Knoxville.
- The Lady Vol program has always been active at volunteering in the community, and this emphasis is part of Kellie Harper's focus of developing well-rounded successful women on the court and off, always helping those in the area her program calls home.
- During summer 2023, the Lady Vols participated in services events with iCan Bike, A Place at the Table, Big Orange Pantry and Flenniken's Landing.
- Big Orange Pantry is a food pantry on the UT campus offering low cost items for students and faculty

members in need.

- In addition to Mission Mondays, the Lady Vols annually join the men's basketball team in participating at the Down Syndrome Awareness Group of East Tennessee's Hoops for Hope basketball event.

ANOTHER CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- Tennessee played the most difficult itinerary in the country last season, per the final NCAA Toughest Schedule Report.
- It looks as if the Lady Vols are leaning that way again, with nine foes ranked in the Associated Press and/or USA TODAY Sports/WBCA Coaches Preseason Polls.
- The Lady Vols' slate includes No. 1/1 LSU, No. 6/4 South Carolina, No. 7/6 Ohio State, No. 9/9 Indiana, No. 10/10 Notre Dame, No. 12/16 Ole Miss, No. 18/22 Florida State, No. NR/23 Oklahoma and No. 25/RV Mississippi State.
- UT was one of 11 athletics departments with its women's and men's basketball programs ranked in at least one of the preseason polls, with the Lady Vols standing at No. 11/12 and the Vols at No. 9/10.
- Those schools were UConn, UCLA, Tennessee, Texas, North Carolina, Baylor, Duke, USC, Creighton, Illinois and Miami.

ROCKY TOP LOVES SOME HOOPS

- Through the end of the 2022-23 regular season, Tennessee easily ranked No. 1 nationally in total combined men's and women's basketball attendance at 451,142.
- The Lady Vols added 6,871 to that in their NCAA Tournament First Round game and 5,486 in the second round.
- The Vols welcomed 300,496 fans last season, while the Lady Vols had 163,003 attending for a total of 463,589.
- The Lady Vols averaged 8,150 fans per game at home to rank seventh in women's basketball in 2022-23.
- Crowds increased from 2021-22, when the UT women finished No. 8 nationally at 7,477.

TENNESSEE BY THE NUMBERS

- UT returned 1,798 of 2,852 points (63 percent) from 2022-23 and welcomed 1,417 in production from its three active newcomers for a combined sum of 3,215.
- The Big Orange women welcomed back 147 of 198 three-pointers and brought aboard three transfers expected to play this season in Jewel Spear, Avery Strickland and Destinee Wells. They combined for 197 treys last year for a 344 tally between their numbers and UT's returning sum.
- The Lady Vols welcomed back 466 career starts and brought aboard 189 career starts from their active newcomers for a total of 655.
- Tennessee returned 849 of 1,463 individual rebounds (58 percent) and welcomed an additional 279 from its active transfers, totaling 1,128.

UT OPENED WITH RECORD FOUR 1K SCORERS

- Tennessee finished the 2022-23 season with its most ever 1,000-point scorers (5). That group included Rickea Jackson (1,756), Jordan Walker (1,359), Jordan Horston (1,445), Jasmine Franklin (1,279) and Jasmine Powell (1,046).
- UT now has had three or more 1,000-point scorers at season's end on 13 occasions and four or more twice.
- It could match that UT record again in 2023-24, as returnees Jackson (1,930) and Powell (1,206) are joined by newcomers Destinee Wells (1,716) and Jewel Spear (1,585), while Tamari Key is not far off at 940 through the Mississippi State game.
- That foursome of Jackson (1,756), Wells (1,613), Spear (1,385) and Powell (1,046) marked the first time Tennessee had entered a season with four 1,000-point scorers on its roster, the 10th time with two or more and the second time with three or more.

EXPECTED IMPROVEMENT BEYOND THE ARC

- Tennessee returns 147 three-pointers from a year ago, led by senior Tess Darby's 70.
- That total is the No. 9 single-season total in UT history.
- Other top three-point shooters include Sara Puckett (26, 32.1 pct.), Jasmine Powell (19, 26.8 pct.), Rickea Jackson (16, 31.4 pct.) and Karoline Striplin (12, 38.7 pct.).
- Tennessee welcomes a transfer trio that tallied a combined 197 threes in 2022-23 and would have ranked

first, third and fourth on last year's Lady Vol squad. All three led their schools in threes made a year ago.

- Jewel Spear hit 93 (35.4 pct.) at Wake Forest last season, Destinee Wells made 65 (45.5 pct.) at Belmont, and Avery Strickland drained 39 (33.9 pct.) at Pitt.
- UT's notable graduation losses from beyond the arc include Jordan Horston (20, 27.8 pct.) and Jordan Walker (16, 25.4).

LADY VOL ROSTER NOTES

- After having 16 players on Tennessee's largest roster in modern history a year ago, Kellie Harper has assembled a squad of 13 in 2023-24.
- Twelve players will be active this season, while sophomore South Carolina transfer Talaysia Cooper will redshirt after opting to sign with Tennessee after the NCAA's transfer portal window had closed.
- Tess and Edie Darby (Greenfield, Tenn.) will play alongside one another for the second season. They are the second set of sisters to play basketball at Tennessee but the first to play on the same team.
- Amanda (1998-2002) and Abby Canon (2004-05) of Shelbyville, Tenn., were the first sister duo to represent the Big Orange, playing for Pat Summitt.
- Amanda Canon played on the 1998-99 Tennessee team, which included then-senior Kellie (Jolly) Harper.
- Tennessee technically has five players from the Volunteer State on the roster, including Tess and Edie Darby (Greenfield/GHS), Avery Strickland (Knoxville/Farragut H.S.) and Destinee Wells (Lakeland/Houston H.S.).
- Kaiya Wynn lived in Tennessee (Nashville) and attended Ensworth High School before her family moved to Texas for her senior year of high school. She lived in Richmond, Texas, and graduated from Foster High School before moving back to the Volunteer State.

LOOKING BACK TO 2022-23

A RECORD SEVEN SENIORS HONORED IN 2023

- Tennessee seniors Jasmine Franklin (Fayetteville, Ark.), Jordan Horston (Columbus, Ohio), Rickea Jackson (Detroit, Mich.), Tamari Key (Cary, N.C.), Jasmine Powell (Detroit, Mich.), Jessie Rennie (Bendigo, Australia) and Jordan Walker (Muskegon, Mich.) were recognized before the Auburn game.
- Five (in 2011-12, 2007-08, 1983-84 and 1974-75) was the previous high for seniors honored.
- Due to an extra season of eligibility being made available to those losing postseason during the COVID-19 pandemic, several members of the class have the option to return for the 2023-24 season.

KEY LOSSES FROM A YEAR AGO

- Three key performers departed after the 2022-23 season, including four-year starter Jordan Horston and three-year starter Jordan Walker.
- Horston (15.6 ppg., 6.1 rpg., 3.3 apg.), a two-time All-SEC and All-America Honorable Mention choice, was the No. 9 pick in the WNBA Draft.
- Walker (5.7 ppg., 3.2 apg.) graduated with two master's degrees after starting 77 games over three seasons in Knoxville following two seasons at Western Michigan.
- Reserve Jasmine Franklin exhausted her eligibility after one season at UT, putting up 4.5 ppg. and 3.8 rpg. while shooting 49 pct. in 35 games.

UT PERSEVERES, WINS 25, MAKES SWEET 16

- Tennessee won 25 games in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2013-14 and 2014-15, wrapping up the 2022-23 campaign at 25-12 overall and 13-3 in SEC play to finish third for the fourth straight year.
- The Lady Vols' 13 SEC victories were their most since 2014-15, and they advanced to their first SEC Tournament title game since 2015. They defeated No. 2 seed and eventual NCAA champ LSU in the SEC semifinals, 69-67, to do so.
- The Big Orange went to back-to-back Sweet 16s for the first time since 2014-15 and 2015-16 and were one of just seven schools to do that during the 2021-22 and 2022-23 postseasons.
- UT's season came to an end in the Seattle 3 Regional semifinals to No. 1 seed Virginia Tech, 73-64.
- The Lady Vols were resilient despite losing 6-6 cen-

ter Tamari Key for the season after eight games when tests revealed blood clots in her lungs.

38TH SEASON WITH 25 WINS

- Tennessee reached a pair of milestone victory plateaus in 2022-23, improving numbers that date back to 1974.
- With the win over Toledo in the NCAA Second Round, the Lady Vols hit the 25-win target for the 38th time.
- Kellie Harper also tied her career best win tally for a season with that outcome, giving her back-to-back 25-win campaigns at Tennessee in 2021-22 and 2022-23 and four total for her career.
- Harper also won 25 at Missouri State in 2018-19 en route to a Sweet 16 and at Western Carolina in 2007-08.
- The regular-season finale triumph at Kentucky gave the Big Orange a 20-win campaign for the 46th time.
- It marked Tennessee's third 20-win season in Kellie Harper's four years as head coach (10th in her career), with the 2020-21 total of 17 wins impacted by several COVID-related game cancellations that no doubt would have pushed the Lady Vols to 20 victories.

SEC TOURNAMENT RUNNERS-UP

- Tennessee advanced to its first SEC Tournament Championship game since 2015.
- South Carolina defeated UT in Greenville, S.C., 74-58, but only after the Lady Vols had upset No. 2 seed and eventual national champ LSU, 69-67, in the semifinal round for the Big Orange's signature win of the season.
- It marked the first time UT has had two All-Tournament Team members since Cierra Burdick and Jordan Reynolds earned that recognition in 2015.
- Rickea Jackson averaged 25.7 ppg. and 7.7 rpg. while shooting 52.0 percent from the field and 95.7 percent (22-23) from the free-throw line during the 2023 event.
- Jackson's season-high 34 points against Kentucky in the quarterfinals were the most scored in any game by a Lady Vol since Diamond DeShields had 34 vs. Georgia on Feb. 5, 2017.
- A 14-of-14 (100-percent) effort at the charity stripe for Jackson vs. Kentucky in the quarterfinals was a school record for percentage with the most attempts.
- Jordan Horston (19.0 ppg.) also averaged in double figures for the weekend, with Horston leading the team in rebounding (8.7 rpg.), assists (3.0 apg.) and blocks (2.3 bpg.) en route to SEC All-Tournament honors.
- Tess Darby went six of 12 beyond the arc (50 percent) in three games.
- Jordan Horston's career-best seven blocks vs. Kentucky on March 3 tied centers Tamari Key (2020) and Kelley Cain (2009) for most swats ever in an SEC Tournament contest by a Lady Vol.

THE ONLY SCHOOL IN ALL 41

- The Lady Vols made their 41st consecutive NCAA Tournament, continuing as the only school to appear in every Division I tourney.
- Tennessee was an at-large qualifier for the 2023 NCAA Tournament, finishing third in the SEC regular season for the fourth-straight season and falling to No. 1/1 South Carolina in the SEC Tournament title game.
- UT earned a No. 4 seed for only the third occasion and has a 7-3 record all-time in that role after routing Saint Louis and Toledo in NCAA First and Second Rounds and falling to No. 1 seed Virginia Tech in the Sweet 16 in the Seattle 3 Regional at Climate Pledge Arena.
- Tennessee is now 130-33 in NCAA Tournament play, ranking first all-time in games played (163) and ranking second in victories (130) and in winning percentage (.798).
- Tennessee is 5-3 in NCAA play under Kellie Harper, going 2-1 in 2023, 2-1 in 2022 and 1-1 in 2021 after the 2020 tournament was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Lady Vols have advanced to the NCAA regional round on 36 occasions, owning a 28-8 mark in the Sweet 16.

RECORDS FOR GAMEDAY APPEARANCES

- In 2023, Tennessee became the only school ever to host ESPN College GameDay on campus four times in the same athletic year, hosting during football (Florida, Alabama) as well as during women's (UConn) and men's basketball (Texas).

- The Lady Vols also became the first women's program to appear on Women's College GameDay twice during the same season, doing so at home vs. UConn on Jan. 26 and again prior to the SEC Tournament Championship vs. South Carolina on March 5 in Greenville, S.C.
- UT has twice as many GameDay appearances (4) as any other school and is the only one to host twice.
- UT hosted in 2011 (vs. Vanderbilt), appeared in 2022 (at South Carolina), hosted in 2023 (vs. UConn) and appeared in 2023 (vs. South Carolina in SEC Tourney).
- ESPN's Women's College GameDay also appeared in Storrs, Conn., in 2010 (Notre Dame at UConn) and at Iowa City, Iowa, 2023 (Indiana at Iowa).

2023 SEC POSTSEASON HONORS

- Rickea Jackson and Jordan Horston were members of the Coaches All-SEC First Team.
- Jackson made the USA TODAY Sports Network All-SEC First Team, while Horston was second team.
- Jackson and Horston were both recognized as members of the SEC All-Tournament Team.
- Tess Darby was named to the SEC Women's Basketball Community Service Team.

NATIONAL ACCOLADES

- Rickea Jackson was an All-America honorable mention choice by the AP, USBWA and WBCA.
- Jackson was a finalist for the Cheryl Miller Award.
- Jordan Horston was an All-America honorable mention selection by the AP and WBCA.

UT STRONG IN THE CLASSROOM AGAIN

- Nine Lady Vols were named to the 2022-23 SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- Eighteen of 29 Lady Vols playing for Kellie Harper have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition a total of 38 times through 2022-23.
- Making the list in 2022-23 were returnees Tess Darby, Brooklynn Miles, Sara Puckett, Jessie Rennie, Karoline Striplin, Marta Suárez, Jordan Walker and Kaiya Wynn, as well as newcomer Edie Darby.
- The Lady Vols once again earned "Special Mention" status for their collective 3.048 grade point average as part of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's Academic Team Honor Roll.
- Tennessee was one of 29 NCAA Power Five schools, including only five from the SEC, to earn academic recognition from the WBCA.

THE WNBA LOVES LADY VOLS

- Jordan Horston became the third Lady Vol in each of the past three seasons to be selected in the first round of the WNBA Draft.
- Horston was the No. 9 overall pick of the Seattle Storm and made the AP and WNBA All-Rookie Teams.
- Rae Burrell was the No. 9 overall selection in the 2022 WNBA Draft by the Los Angeles Sparks, while Renna Davis went to the Minnesota Lynx in 2021.
- The Lady Vol basketball program has produced 65 professional players over the years, including 52 alumnae who went on to play in the WNBA. Of those 52 who continued their careers at the professional level in the WNBA, 45 were selected on Draft day and 20 were picked in the first round.

Classy. Personable. Trustworthy. Intentional. Proficient. Determined. Those are just a few of the adjectives that aptly describe fifth-year Tennessee head coach Kellie Harper. Her array of impressive traits has been on full display in leading one of only seven programs to make NCAA Sweet 16 appearances in each of the past two seasons.

Also one of only two skippers to guide four different programs to the NCAA Tournament, the 1999 UT graduate and three-time national champion point guard joined Jim Foster in that select company in 2020-21. She did so while reshaping programs at Western Carolina, NC State, Missouri State and Tennessee. Foster accomplished that feat during stops at St. Joseph's, Vanderbilt, Ohio State and Chattanooga during a career lasting from 1978 to 2018.

The respect for Harper's leadership capabilities, basketball acumen and development of the UT program has been underscored by her selection to the USA Basketball Women's Junior National Team Committee, upon which she is serving from 2021-24. It was further underscored in 2022-23, when USA TODAY Sports Network voted her as its Preseason SEC Coach of the Year.

In 19 complete years as a Division I head coach, Harper has led her teams to a 373-247 record and 15 postseason appearances (8 NCAA/7 WNIT) through the 2022-23 campaign. She has piloted her squads to 15 top-three league finishes and four conference tourney titles along the way, and in 2022-23 she led a team to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the third time in the past four seasons the event was held, including her final unit at Missouri State and her past two editions at Tennessee.

During her first four years on Rocky Top, Harp-

er has led the program on a steady return toward lofty heights. Her past two teams won 25 games, including a 25-9/11-5 SEC record in 2021-22 and a 25-12/13-3 SEC worksheet in 2022-23, despite losing All-SEC performers and game-changers Jordan Horston and Tamari Key in back-to-back campaigns. The Lady Vols' 13 SEC wins a year ago were the most since 2014-15, and they recorded 25 victories in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2013-14 and 2014-15.

In 2022-23, Tennessee remained the only school perfect in NCAA Tournament berths, notching its 41st appearance. It also made its first trip to the SEC Tournament championship game since 2015, defeating #4/3 LSU in the semifinals and falling to #1/1 South Carolina during the title game in Greenville, S.C.

Harper is 88-39 overall and 43-18 vs. SEC competition during a quick makeover on Rocky Top, ranking third in winning percentage in league games behind only LSU's Kim Mulkey and South Carolina's Dawn Staley. Harper and Staley are the only SEC coaches to guide their teams to top-three SEC finishes in each of the past four seasons.

"Including her tenure at Missouri State, Kellie has guided her teams to three of the past four NCAA Sweet 16s," University of Tennessee Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics Danny White said after extending Harper's contract in 2023 through the 2027-28 campaign. "She's among an elite group of coaches in achieving that, and it didn't happen by accident. The Lady Vols have a strong program culture, visible player development, a commitment to excellence and intentional leadership in place, and I look forward to watching our

program continue to rise under her leadership.”

A native of Sparta, Tenn., Harper was a floor general for the legendary Pat Summitt at UT from 1995-99, playing 132 games and piloting the Lady Vols to NCAA National Championships in 1996, 1997 and 1998. She was part of a senior class that helped the Big Orange forge a 131-17 overall record as well as win two SEC regular season titles (1998, 1999) and three SEC Tournament crowns (1996, 1998, 1999).

High school recruits and players in the transfer portal have been drawn to Harper’s valuable experiences as a player who reached the pinnacle at the all-time winningest program in women’s college basketball history. The LVFL also attracts players who cherish a welcoming family environment and an atmosphere of competitive excellence that is embraced by arguably the country’s most supportive fan base.

She was able to keep the previously signed No. 9 class (Jordan Horston, Tamari Key) intact when she was hired in 2019, managed to ink future starters Tess Darby, Keyen Green, Marta Suárez and Jordan Walker during the pandemic in 2020, and followed with a No. 15-ranked group in 2021 (including starters Sara Puckett and Karoline Stripplin). She also added seven players through the portal the past two seasons, including key contributors Rickea Jackson, Jillian Hollingshead, Jasmine Powell and Jasmine Franklin in 2022 and the nation’s No. 6 ranked portal class in 2023 by 247Sports in Jewel Spear, Destinee Wells and Avery Strickland.

UT signees also have embraced a coaching style from a mentor who builds foundational relationships and challenges young women daily to become the best players, teammates, students, leaders and people they can be. That formula has proven successful for everything from program chemistry to team success to individual accomplishments.

During Harper’s brief time at Tennessee, she has coached three WNBA first-round picks in Renna Davis (2021), Rae Burrell (2022) and Jordan Horston (2023). It marked only the second time in school history that UT had players selected in the first round in three consecutive seasons. Pat Summitt produced first-round picks in 2001 (Tamika Catchings), 2002 (Michelle Snow) and 2003 (Gwen Jackson, Kara Lawson). Tennessee is the only women’s program to have two different coaches accomplish that feat.

In 2022, Alexis Dye also earned a shot at the WNBA, going to camp with the Connecticut Sun. Previously, Lou Brown and Kasiyahna Kushkituah earned opportunities to play professionally overseas following their Lady Vol careers.

Davis (2020 AP/USBWA/WBCA, 2021 AP/USBWA/WBCA), Horston (2022 AP/WBCA, 2021 AP/WBCA) and Jackson (2023 AP/USBWA/WBCA) were All-America Honorable Mention selections under Harper’s tutelage, and Davis claimed the Senior Class Award in 2021 as well.

At the league level, Harper has tutored All-SEC First-Teamers Davis (2020, 2021), Horston (2022, 2023) and Jackson (2023); All-SEC Second-Teamers Burrell (2021) and Tamari Key (2022); SEC All-Defensive Team member Key (2021, 2022); SEC All-Freshman Team honorees Horston (2020), Suárez (2021) and Puckett (2022); and SEC All-Tournament Team members Dye (2022), Horston (2023) and Jackson (2023).

In the classroom, 18 of 29 Lady Vols playing for Harper have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition a total of 38 times through 2022-23. A program-best 12 of 14 Lady Vols made the honor roll in 2021-22, while nine (of 13) made it in 2020-21, nine (of 15) made it in 2022-23 and eight (of 12) did so in 2019-20. That ’19-20 group carded a Lady Vol best-ever GPA of 3.48.

HARPER YEAR-BY-YEAR AT TENNESSEE

2019-20: Harper personally enjoyed the (then) finest start of any season in her career at 7-0 and recorded the most victories in her first season at a school (21-10), as UT climbed to a high ranking of No. 17. She picked up her 300th overall career win vs. Alabama and surpassed her 500th contest as a head coach along the way as UT tied for third in the SEC before the season ended without an NCAA Tournament due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

2020-21: In year two for Harper, the Lady Vols climbed as high as No. 13 in the AP Poll. They earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the second round and a 17-8 record despite having four games canceled due to COVID and losing three post players to season-ending injuries. UT carded an outright third-place finish in the SEC and defeated four ranked teams, including No. 2/3 South Carolina in Knoxville and No. 15/15 Indiana in Bloomington.

2021-22: Tennessee returned to national prom-

inence in Harper’s third year, but season-ending injuries to three players limited the team’s ceiling after it began the year 18-1 (best start since 2007-08) and climbed to No. 4 in the AP Poll. Still, UT finished 25-9, placed third in the SEC at 11-5, beat five ranked foes and advanced to Harper’s second career Sweet 16, the first for UT since 2015-16. Harper matched personal bests for wins in a season (25) and deepest NCAA tourney run (Sweet 16), and she had her most wins ever over ranked teams (5). The Tennessee Sports Writers Association named her the organization’s state women’s college basketball coach of the year.

2022-23: The Lady Vols recorded 25 wins (25-12) in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2013-14 and 2014-15, their 13 SEC victories (13-3, 3rd) were their most since 2014-15 and their trip to the SEC Tournament title game was their first since 2015. A fourth consecutive top-three SEC regular season finish tied South Carolina as the only programs to do so during that span, and UT’s advancement to back-to-back Sweet 16s made it one of just seven schools to advance to that round in both 2021-22 and 2022-23. Harper guided teams to back-to-back 25-win seasons and NCAA Sweet 16s for the first time in her career and matched Pat Summitt’s UT record by producing a first-round WNBA Draft pick for a third consecutive season.

Only the third Lady Vol head coach in the NCAA era of women’s basketball, Harper took the reins at Tennessee after six years of leading the Missouri State Lady Bears, capped by the 2018-19 season’s impressive march to the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament title and magical run to the NCAA Sweet 16.

Harper guided Missouri State to NCAA appearances in 2015-16 and 2018-19 with WNIT berths on three other occasions. At previous schools, she also led North Carolina State to the NCAA Tournament in 2009-10 (plus two WNIT appearances) and guided Western Carolina to NCAA berths in 2004-05 and 2008-09 (plus two trips to the WNIT).

In 28 full seasons as a Division I head coach, assistant coach or player, Harper has made 23 post-season appearances with a combined 621-300 record, 16 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven WNIT bids.

She recorded a 118-79 won-lost record at Missouri State, claiming Missouri Valley Conference Tournament crowns in 2016 and 2019 and notching regular-season runner-up finishes in 2015-16, 2017-18 and 2018-19. After her first team at MSU finished 14-17/6-12 MVC (t6th), she never placed lower than third in the league standings or missed the post-season. Three of her last four editions there surpassed the 20-win plateau, including the 2015-16 squad that forged MSU’s first NCAA appearance in a decade.

The 2018-19 MSU squad improved measurably as the season progressed, resiliently overcoming a 1-7 start to post the program’s best overall record (25-10) since 2004-05 and its top league mark (16-2) since 2003-04 with a 24-3 run over the final 27 contests. The Lady Bears finished No. 24 in the final 2019 USA Today Sports Coaches Poll, which was their first national ranking in 15 years. Harper was named the Missouri Valley Coach of the Year and also was chosen as the 2019 Kay Yow Coach of the Year, which goes to the Division I women’s head coach who embodies a winning spirit while displaying great character, on and off the court.

Her final Lady Bears team developed into her best one with a late season spree that included victories over No. 21 Drake, No. 24 DePaul and No. 13 Iowa State and a nine-point loss to sixth-ranked Stanford in the Sweet 16. Harper’s 2018-19 squad featured only one senior and included 11 freshmen or sophomores on the 14-player roster.

Prior to her arrival at Missouri State, Harper became just the third women’s basketball coach in North Carolina State history in 2009 and directed the Wolfpack to three postseason appearances and a 70-64 record during her four-year stint at the helm, including the 2010 NCAA Tournament.

NC State joined Tobacco Road rivals Duke and North Carolina as the only Atlantic Coast Conference teams to score wins over the league's other 11 teams during that span and earned six top-25 victories in four seasons.

Before her tenure in Raleigh, Harper piloted Western Carolina to a 97-65 record and four post-season berths in five seasons, including a 70-31 mark her final three years in Cullowhee. The Catamounts captured the first two Southern Conference (SoCon) Tournament titles in school history while seven student-athletes captured all-conference honors during her tenure.

She earned 2007 SoCon Coach of the Year accolades and placed her squads in the WBCA Academic Top 25 on three occasions, including a fifth-place finish in 2007-08.

Prior to her first head coaching job, Harper spent three seasons as an assistant at Chattanooga, helping the Mocs to three consecutive Southern Conference championships, three NCAA appearances and a combined 78-15 record under head coach Wes Moore. She tutored four all-conference guards while at Chattanooga, including the 2004 league player of the year.

In advance of her time in Chattanooga, Harper spent two seasons at Auburn, the first as an administrative assistant before being promoted to assistant coach under Joe Ciampi for the 2000-01 campaign.

As a college player, Harper was part of a women's basketball dynasty at Tennessee. As a junior, she guided the Lady Vols to a 39-0 record and their third-straight national championship, averaging 7.6 points and 3.8 assists for the season and scoring a career-high 20 points in the national title game against Louisiana Tech. She went 4-of-5 from beyond the arc in that contest and was

named to the 1998 All-Final Four Team.

Harper set an NCAA championship game record with 11 assists and dished out 20 helpers in two games for All-Final Four honors in 1997 after returning from a knee injury midway through her sophomore season. That year, the National Strength and Conditioning Association named her its Strength and Conditioning Female Student-Athlete of the Year.

For her Tennessee career, Harper scored 894 points and had 452 assists, leaving UT on the school's career top 10 lists for assists, assist average, 3-point attempts and 3-point percentage. She still ranks eighth in career assists and is 11th in 3-point percentage (.364, 99-272).

Harper was drafted by the Cleveland Rockers in the fourth round of the 1999 WNBA draft and earned her degree in mathematics that same year. She was a three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll member and earned both All-SEC Coaches Second Team and honorable mention All-America honors as a senior. She also was named to the SEC Community Service Team as a senior.

She played for her father (the late Kenneth Jolly), an assistant coach at White County High School in Sparta, Tenn., and was a five-time All-American during her AAU playing career. She was inducted into the UT Athletics Hall of Fame in 2009 and White County High Hall of Fame in 2012. On Dec. 24, 2019, the basketball hardwood at the new Findlay Elementary School in Sparta was dedicated as "Kellie's Court."

Harper is married to Jon Harper, an assistant coach on her staffs at Western Carolina, NC State, Missouri State and Tennessee. The Harpers welcomed their first child, son Jackson, in November 2013, and had a daughter, Kiley, in June 2018.
