Alabama has won its last 23 matchups with Vanderbilt, including the most recent pairing on Sept. 4, 2022, in Tuscaloosa, a 55-3 Crimson Tide victory. Alabama head coach Kalen DeBoer has never faced the Commodores during his career, while Vanderbilt head coach Clark Lea is 0-1 in his only opportunity against the Crimson Tide.

**UNRANKED, NO PROBLEM FOR THE TIDE:** With its 42-10 win at Wisconsin on Sept. 14, Alabama has won 23 straight games against unranked opponents. The Crimson Tide's last loss to an unranked opponent came on Oct. 9, 2021, at Texas A&M.

**ON TOP, YET AGAIN:** Now ranked atop the Associated Press Poll, Alabama has held the No. 1 ranking in the poll at least once in 16 of the last 17 seasons. The only season the Tide did not reach No. 1 was 2023.

**ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL:** Alabama's No. 1 ranking in the Week 6 edition of the Associated Press Poll marked the 267th consecutive week that the Crimson Tide has appeared in the poll. That streak is the longest active streak in college football. The 267 weeks more than doubles second-place Georgia with the Bulldogs appearing in the poll for 120 consecutive weeks. Alabama's 267 straight weeks tops the Crimson Tide's previous program-long streak of 105 consecutive weeks under head coach Gene Stallings in the mid-1990s.

**ALABAMA IN THE AP SINCE 2008:** Alabama began the 2008 season at No. 24 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll. The Crimson Tide opened the year with a dominant 34-10 win over then-No. 9 Clemson in Atlanta, and since that win over the Tigers, UA has not been ranked lower than No. 17 in 266 polls that have followed. According to the College Poll Archive, the Tide is the only team to be represented on all 267 editions of the poll from the start of the 2008 season to the current week. The next closest team is Ohio State with 252 appearances followed by Oklahoma at 243. Alabama has spent 95.0 percent of the 17-plus years ranked in the top 10. A whopping 82.1 percent of that time Alabama has been ranked in the top five. The Crimson Tide has also been ranked No. 1 a total of 110 times since 2008. Only 14 other teams have earned the No. 1 ranking over that time, with the second-most appearances coming from Georgia at 40 and Clemson in third at 23.

**ALABAMA HAS THE MOST WINS SINCE 2008:** Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 203 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. That sum is 21 more than Ohio State, the next-closest win total over that stretch.

**ALWAYS IN THE HUNT:** Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 188 of 194 regular season games that have had national championship implications. The final three games of the 2010 campaign and the final three weeks of the 2022 schedule marked the only six regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 17 seasons.

**HONORING A LEGEND:** Prior to Alabama's Sept. 7 game against USF, The University of Alabama formally dedicated Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium with pregame and halftime ceremonies honoring former head coach Nick Saban. Under Saban's guidance, Alabama was nearly unbeatable at its home stadium that now bears his namesake. Across his 17 seasons in Tuscaloosa, Saban's teams went 108-9 (.923) when playing at home. Of those nine losses, only one was by more than seven points.

**2024 TEAM CAPTAINS:** The Crimson Tide's 2024 team captains were announced after practice on Aug. 20. As selected by their teammates, Tyler Booker, Deontae Lawson, Jalen Milroe and Malachi Moore were each named team captains for the season. It marked the second year in a row for Milroe and Moore, as the duo were voted permanent team captains by their teammates at the end of the 2023 regular season.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

**PILING UP THE POINTS:** Jalen Milroe has accounted for 18 total touchdowns in four games of action this season, including 10 passing and eight rushing. His 18 touchdowns and a two-point conversion have led to 110 points, the third-best total in the nation. Milroe's eight rushing scores are tied for the national lead among quarterbacks in Division I, while he is one of only 24 FBS quarterbacks with at least 10 passing touchdowns.

**THROWING THE BOMB:** Through four games this season, Jalen Milroe has completed 62-of-85 passes for 964 yards. Entering Alabama's matchup with Vanderbilt, Milroe is averaging 11.34 yards per pass attempt, good for third in the SEC and nationally. He has also accumulated 15.55 yards per completion which ranks fourth in the conference and 10th in Division I.

**HOME RUN HITTER:** Jalen Milroe's passing touchdowns have typically come in the form of a big play during his time as QB1 at Alabama. Across 17 starts the last two seasons, he is averaging 35.3 yards per passing touchdown, accumulating 1,166 total yards on 33 scores. This season alone, the Katy, Texas, native has thrown for 10 total touchdowns with every score coming from at least 16 yards or better. He has also recorded three touchdowns of 55-plus yards, highlighted by an 84-yarder in the season opener with Western Kentucky. As the starter in 2023, Milroe averaged 33.1 yards per score across his 23 passing touchdowns.

**DUAL-THREAT JALEN:** Jalen Milroe has proven to be a threat with his arms and legs during his time at the Capstone. He has rushed for 21 total touchdowns during his career, including eight this season. Milroe's eight rushing touchdowns are tied for the most by a quarterback in Division I and are also tied for the fifth-most at any position. In 2023, he totaled 12 rushing touchdowns which finished as the second-most by a quarterback in Alabama single-season history, trailing only Jalen Hurts' 13 from the 2016 campaign.

**UNPRECEDENTED IN THE AP ERA:** Following UA's 41-34 win over Georgia on Sept. 28, Jalen Milroe became the first player since the creation of the Associated Press Poll to manage 300-plus yards passing, 100-plus yards rushing and 2 rushing scores against a top-five opponent.

**LOCKED IN:** Jalen Milroe was given a 92.9 passing grade by Pro Football Focus following his performance against then No. 2/1 Georgia on Sept. 28. It marked the second-highest grade of any FBS quarterback in Week 5, and was the highest single-game passing grade for Milroe in his collegiate career.

**MILROE vs. THE BEST:** As Alabama's starter each of the last two seasons, Jalen Milroe has played some of his best football against the top competition. He has guided the Crimson Tide to five wins over Associated Press Top 25 teams, including last weekend's victory over then-No. 2 Georgia to go with four wins a season ago. In seven total contests against AP Top 25 foes across the last two seasons, Milroe has completed 67.8 percent (116-171) of his passes for 1,601 yards while accounting for 15 total touchdowns (nine passing, six rushing). He has accumulated 2,040 total yards in those matchups.

**WHERE #4 RANKS:** Through four games, Jalen Milroe has been one of country's most efficient quarterbacks. Below is a look at where Milroe currently stands nationally among signal-callers.

**FIVE-STAR REVIEW:** Ryan Williams has made his presence known, as the freshman leads Alabama in receptions (16), receiving yards (462) and receiving touchdowns (5) through his first four collegiate games. For the fourth consecutive week, Williams led the Tide receiving corps in receptions and yards, totaling six catches and a career-high 177 yards and a touchdown against then-No. 2/1 Georgia. Williams' 28.8 yards per catch average leads all FBS receivers, with Williams producing six catches of 43-plus yards already this season. Among freshmen, Williams shares the national lead in touchdowns while his 16 receptions are third-most. After hauling in two catches for 139 yards and two touchdowns in his collegiate debut against Western Kentucky on Aug. 31, Williams was named SEC Co-Freshman of the Week.

**JAM & JUSTICE:** Alabama's 1-2 punch of Jam Miller and Justice Haynes has proven effective through the first four weeks of the season. The duo have combined for 483 of the Tide's 887 rushing yards (54.5 percent) and five touchdowns on the ground. Miller has scored at least one rushing or receiving touchdown in all four games, with Haynes crossing the goal line in two matchups this season.

**QUICK STRIKE:** The Tide have created a reputation as a big-play offense to start the 2024 season. Of Alabama's 26 touchdowns, 15 have been scores of 20-plus yards (57.6 percent). The 15 touchdowns are split between eight passes and seven runs.

**400+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE:** Alabama has gained 400-plus yards of total offense in 69 of its last 87 games, dating back to the start of the 2018 season. The Crimson Tide has produced at least 400 yards of offense in three of four games this season, most recently recording 547 yards in UA's 41-34 win against then-No. 2/1 Georgia on Sept. 28. In the 18 instances where the offense did not go over 400 yards, Alabama is 15-3.

**500+ YARDS OF OFFENSE:** With 557 yards of total offense in the Tide's 41-34 win over then-No. 2/1 Georgia on Sept. 28, Alabama has eclipsed 500 yards of offense in 59 games since the start of the 2015 season. The Crimson Tide went for 500-plus twice in 2023, first against LSU on Nov. 4 (507 yards) followed by a Nov. 18 win over Chattanooga (574 yards). UA's offense racked up 500-plus yards seven times apiece in both 2022 and 2021, eight times in 2020 and nine times in 2019, with the 2018 roster setting the Alabama single-season record with 500-or-more yards in 12 games.

**ALABAMA IN THE AP RANKINGS**

Alabama has been ranked in 879 of the 1,239 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 545-138-8 (.795) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll. Alabama is also ranked in the AP Poll for the 267th consecutive week, topping its previous streak of 105 consecutive polls from 1991-97 under head coach Gene Stallings. The 267 consecutive weeks is the second-longest stretch by any program in the poll's history, trailing only Nebraska's all-time mark of 348 consecutive weeks. Alabama has started nine seasons at No. 1 (2022, 2021, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches' rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 34 seasons (1991-present) with US LBM coming on the title sponsor of the poll at the start of the 2023 season. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020 seasons. The Tide has compiled four UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and seven USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) coaches poll national titles.

**600+ YARDS OF OFFENSE:** Alabama totaled 600 yards of offense in the 63-0 win over Western Kentucky to open the 2024 campaign. The 600-plus yard performance marked the 15th instance in program history that the Tide has been at or above 600 yards. The Crimson Tide's most recent instance of 600-plus came on Sept. 24, 2022, when UA posted 628 against Vanderbilt in the SEC opener. Alabama went over 600 yards twice in 2021 and four times during the 2020 campaign.

**40-OR-MORE SINCE 2018:** Alabama has scored 40-or-more points in 56 of the last 87 games. Fifty-six leads the nation for the most total games of 40-plus points since the start of the 2018 season. Ohio State has the second-most instances of scoring 40-or-more points over that stretch at 47, while Oklahoma is third with 40. UA has produced no fewer than 41 points in its first four games this season, the first time the Tide have opened a year with such a streak since 2019.

**OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS:** The Crimson Tide has won 55 of its last 56 games when scoring a touchdown on the first offensive possession of the game. The most recent instance came last season on Sept. 28 against then-No. 2/1 Georgia when Jalen Milroe rushed into the end zone from seven yards away to open the night's scoring. Alabama's lone loss when scoring a touchdown on the opening drive during the current stretch came at Texas A&M on Oct. 9, 2021.

**SCORING STREAK CONTINUES:** Alabama extended its school record for consecutive games with a score to 314 thanks to Jalen Milroe's seven-yard touchdown run on Sept. 28 to open UA's 41-34 win over then-No. 2/1 Georgia. The Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama owns a 254-60 (.808) record over the course of the current streak.

**BALL PROTECTION:** In the last 223 games (dating back to the start of the 2008 season), Alabama has turned the ball over only 238 times (129 fumbles, 109 interceptions) for an average of 1.06 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 220 times in 212 games (1.03/game). The 220 turnovers since 2009 includes 89 interceptions in 5,625 attempts (one interception every 63.2 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 33 lost fumbles in 5,511 carries (one fumble lost every 167.0 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

**KEENAN III NAMED SEC DL OF THE WEEK:** Alabama's Tim Keenan III was named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week on Sept. 9 following his standout performance against USF. Keenan III managed personal bests in sacks (1.5), tackles for loss (2.5) and total tackles (9), while also contributing one quarterback hurry.

**KEON, KEEPING ON:** Keon Sabb was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week and the Reese's Senior Bowl Defensive Player of the Week following Alabama's season opener against Western Kentucky on Aug. 31. Sabb earned the start at safety and played a key role in helping UA shut out the Hilltoppers, recording two tackles and a pair of interceptions with a combined 87 yards on his returns.

**THE BUCK STOPS HERE:** Through four games, the Crimson Tide defense has allowed just 11 third-down conversions in 64 attempts (17.1 percent), the second-best mark in the FBS.

**TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS:** Alabama has forced at least one turnover in 116 of the last 131 contests (dating back to the start of the 2015 season). During the current run, Alabama has forced 203 turnovers (130 interceptions, 73 fumbles) and returned 42 of those miscues for touchdowns.

**SHUTOUTS SINCE 2007:** Since 2007, Alabama has recorded 27 shutouts, including 12 in Southeastern Conference play. With its 63-0 win over Western Kentucky on Aug. 31, the Crimson Tide defense has 12 more shutouts than its nearest competitor over that span. Ranking second in shutouts during that time is Ohio State with 15.

**HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE:** Since the start of the 2009 season, no team has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 377 touchdowns over the last 212 games. That is 46 fewer than second-place Iowa (423).

**KEEPING THE GROUND GAME IN-CHECK:** The Crimson Tide defense limited then-No. 2/1 Georgia to only 80 yards rushing in its thrilling 41-34 win over the Bulldogs on Sept. 28. Alabama's defensive unit has held 24 of its last 46 opponents (dating back to the 2021 season) to less than 100 yards rushing. UA has also limited 13 of the last 31 opponents to 80 yards or less dating back to the start of the 2022 campaign, including twice in 2024.

**TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND:** Alabama's defense has been a force in the run game since 2007. More recently, the Tide has given up just 97 rushing scores in the last 131 games (dating to the start of the 2015 season). Since 2007, UA has allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns in the nation at 153, a total that is 26 fewer than second-place Iowa (179).

**BIG LEG BURNIP:** James Burnip has maintained his consistent form through four games. Called upon for 20 punts, Burnip has produced eight 50-plus yard punts, with seven boots pinning opponents inside the 20-yard line. Burnip's 45.8 yards per punt is 17th-best figure in the country and ranks third in the SEC.

**HE'S THAT GUY:** Burnip was named the Ray Guy Award's Punter of the Week on Sept. 17 for his punting prowess during UA's 42-10 win at Wisconsin on Sept. 14, as he averaged 49.2 yards per kick over his five boots. Burnip produced a season-long 64-yard kick in Madison, the sixth 60-plus yard punt of his career. The recognition was the second of the season thus far for Burnip, as he was named to the Ray Guy Award "Ray's 8" list following his performance against Western Kentucky on Aug. 31.

**NICHOL AND DIMING:** Winner of the Lou Groza Award in 2023, Graham Nicholson connected on his first field goal as a member of the Crimson Tide, a 28-yard attempt to help Alabama to a 41-34 win over then-No. 2/1 Georgia on Sept. 28.

## GENERAL NOTES

**ALABAMA DEGREES:** Alabama has seen significant success on the field over the last 17 seasons and that success has coincided with the Tide's efforts in the classroom. The 2024 squad is no exception as the Crimson Tide entered the 2024 campaign with 13 student-athletes who already had their degree in-hand, including: James Burnip, Kneeland Hibbett, Justin Jefferson, Keanu Koht, Jah-Marien Latham, Deontae Lawson, Jalen Milroe, Malachi Moore, Robbie Ouzts, Jaeden Roberts, Que Robinson, DeVonta Smith and Tim Smith.

**CHAMPIONS IN THE CLASSROOM:** Alabama's achievements in the classroom have been most impressive during national title seasons. Those six squads (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) included 139 student-athletes who had earned their degrees prior to game time.

**APR SUCCESS:** According to the most recent Academic Progress Rate (APR) numbers that were announced by the NCAA in June of 2024, figures that cover the four-year period extending from the 2019-20 through 2022-23 school years, the Crimson Tide continued to score well above the national cutoff standard. The football program's total average of 997 was tops among all Southeastern Conference schools and finished second among FBS Division I programs behind only Ohio State. In total, the football program was one of 10 University of Alabama teams to lead their respective sport in the SEC in APR numbers with 11 UA squads setting or tying all-time program-high marks for the four-year average. In total, Alabama finished with a program-best 995.5 across the University's 21 sports in 2022-23, surpassing the previous mark of 995.0 set a year earlier. The most recent report marked the sixth consecutive year of improvement for Alabama's overall average score.

**209 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 223 GAMES:** The Crimson Tide's matchup with Georgia on Sept. 28 was the Tide's 209th nationally televised game since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of 2014.

**DEBOER AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS:** Kalen DeBoer is 13-2 across 15 career matchups with teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25, including an impressive 5-1 mark against top-10 teams. Added to those totals was the Crimson Tide's 41-34 win over then-No. 2 Georgia on Sept. 28. DeBoer's first career matchup against a top-25 foe at the FBS level came at Fresno State on Sept. 4, 2021, with the Bulldogs falling at No. 11 Oregon. Following the loss to the Ducks, DeBoer-led teams at Fresno and Washington proceeded to reel off 12 straight wins against ranked foes, including six victories in 2023. The winning streak was snapped following Washington's 34-13 loss to top-ranked Michigan in last season's CFP National Championship.

**AGAINST THE TOP 10:** Alabama owns an 86-80-1 (.516) all-time record against teams ranked in the top-10 of the Associated Press Poll. Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 37-14 (.725) overall record against top-10 teams, including a 22-8 (.733) mark versus the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff.

**BEATING THE BEST:** The Crimson Tide is 81-22 (.786) against the Associated Press Top 25 since the start of 2008. That record includes a 4-2 mark in 2023 with wins against then-No. 15 Ole Miss on Sept. 23, then-No. 17 Tennessee on Oct. 21, then-No. 13 LSU on Nov. 4 and finally against then-No. 1 Georgia in the SEC Championship Game on Dec. 2. Since 2007, Alabama has 25 wins over AP Top-Five teams, the most in the country. LSU has produced the next-closest win total with 12.

**ALABAMA vs. No. 1:** Alabama owns the NCAA record for the most wins all-time against the Associated Press Poll's No. 1 team since the poll was introduced in 1936. The Crimson Tide has compiled 11 wins against the AP's top-ranked team in program history, most recently against then-No. 1 Georgia in the 2023 Southeastern Conference Championship Game. Prior to that, the Tide downed the top-ranked Bulldogs in the 2021 SEC Championship Game.

**BAMA IN THE NFL**

**LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL:** As of the 2024 NFL Draft, Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 16 drafts (133) than any other program in the nation. The list of 133 features 12 Super Bowl champions, 35 Pro Bowl selections and 14 First Team All-Pro members along with one Offensive and one Defensive Rookie of the Year.

**2024 NFL DRAFT:** The Crimson Tide saw 10 former players selected in the 2024 NFL Draft, including three first-round picks in quarterback JC Latham (No. 7, Tennessee Titans), linebacker Dallas Turner (Minnesota Vikings) and defensive back Terrion Arnold (No. 24, Detroit Lions). The second round featured Kool-Aid McKinstry (New Orleans Saints) and Chris Braswell (Tampa Bay Buccaneers) while Jermaine Burton (Cincinnati Bengals) followed in the third round. Day three began with Justin Eoigbe (Los Angeles Chargers) being selected in the fourth round, followed by sixth-rounders Jase McClellan (Atlanta Falcons) and Will Reichard (Vikings) and seventh-round Jaylen Key (New York Jets).

**QUICK HITS ON ALABAMA'S NFL DRAFT SUCCESS:** Below is a look at some of Alabama's recent success in the NFL Draft.

- Over the last 16 NFL Drafts, Alabama has produced 133 total picks which is more than any other program in the nation. Of those 133, an impressive 47 (35.3 percent) have been first-rounders.
- Since 2000, the Crimson Tide has produced an NCAA-leading 49 first-rounders, a number that is nine better than the next closest school in Ohio State (38).
- Since 2010, Alabama has had an NCAA-best 46 players selected in the first round, a number that nearly doubles the next closest school in OSU (25).
- With the selection of JC Latham in the 2024 NFL Draft, Alabama has had at least one player selected in the first round of 16 straight drafts (2009-present) to set the new NCAA record. The Crimson Tide was previously tied with Miami (1995-2008), who owned the old mark of 14 consecutive first-rounders.
- Alabama has produced multiple first round picks in 13 of the last 16 NFL Drafts with single first-round selections in 2009, 2015 and 2016.

**CRIMSON TIDE IN THE NFL:** Alabama enters Week 4 of the 2024-25 NFL regular season with 76 players on active rosters (including reserve/practice squad) and is currently represented on 28 of the league's 32 teams. Alabama had 74 total players (including reserve/practice squad) overall and 62 on an active 53-man roster in Week 1, the most of any program in college football. The next closest school for active players was Ohio State with 49 followed by Georgia at 45, LSU with 39 and Michigan at 38 to round out the top five. Below is a look at where former Crimson Tide standouts are playing.

• Kalen DeBoer has produced unprecedented results at every stop of his coaching career. His hard work and dedication to his craft has shaped one of the most impressive resumes in college football after just nine years as a head coach.

• DeBoer's coaching philosophy stresses the importance of class, integrity and academic success. He has a passion for bringing people together while building the total program. DeBoer believes in creating an environment that allows his players to thrive. He holds a deep commitment to developing the young men in his program and investing in them both on and off the field as they prepare for their next steps in life.

• DeBoer and his staff believe in developing players athletically, academically, socially and spiritually so that they leave the program as better men. Beyond winning football games, it is about building a culture within the program that is contagious and producing a team that loves each other and are willing to play for each other.

• There are three non-negotiables in DeBoer's program that have stood the test of time and resulted in stunning success: family, accountability and toughness.

• During his 26 years in coaching, he has consistently prospered at multiple levels and in different roles, helping to build and revitalize programs while establishing a diverse network of contacts across the country, in both coaching and recruiting. In his first nine seasons as a head coach, DeBoer has accumulated a record of 104-12, which includes a 25-3 record in his previous stop with the Washington Huskies and three NAIA National Championships at Sioux Falls.

• DeBoer enters 2024 with a 12-2 record against top-25 teams in his four seasons at Fresno State and Washington. He also boasts a staggering 24-6 record in one-score contests across his first nine years as a head coach, including a 12-2 mark at Washington in one-score games.

• In 2023, he led Washington to the College Football Playoff National Championship Game with a victory over Texas in the Sugar Bowl. DeBoer's '23 group won the Pac-12 Championship and recorded the most wins in a season in program history (14). Additionally, he won the 2023 Associated Press, AFCA, Eddie Robinson, George Munger, Walter Camp, Sporting News and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards.

• DeBoer became the first Washington coach to win 11-or-more games in consecutive seasons after going 11-2 in 2022 and 14-1 in 2023 and the first to win a bowl game in his first season with the Huskies. That success resulted in back-to-back Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors. His Washington squads also went 10-1 against ranked teams, and he is 18-3 in playoff games as a head coach, including his stint at Sioux Falls.

• Along with winning the Pac-12 and the Sugar Bowl during the 2023 season, UW recorded two top-10 wins over Oregon along with victories against No. 12 Oregon State, No. 13 Utah and No. 24 USC.

• In his first year at UW, he led the Huskies to an 11-2 overall record after Washington finished 4-8 the previous year. They posted a 3-0 mark against ranked teams and a win over Texas in the Valero Alamo Bowl. His Huskies swept its three Northwest rivals and finished in a tie for second in the Pac-12, while he was named Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year.

• Prior to his time at UW, DeBoer spent two seasons as Fresno State, which included the pandemic-shortened 2020 season. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs made great strides on both sides of the ball, posting a combined 12-6 record. Fresno was 4-8 in 2019 prior to DeBoer's arrival.

• In 2021, Fresno State went 9-3 under DeBoer. The 2020 season saw the Bulldogs finish at 3-3 overall.

• Immediately prior to leading Fresno State's program, DeBoer was on staff at Indiana University as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He helped guide the Hoosiers to an 8-5 record and a berth in the Gator Bowl. IU's eight victories in 2019 matched their highest wins total in 26 seasons, and IU ranked No. 3 in the Big Ten in total offense. Indiana averaged 432.8 yards of total offense per game, throwing for 302.4 yards per contest while rushing for 130.4.

• DeBoer joined then-head coach Jeff Tedford as the Fresno State offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2017. In two seasons in that role, DeBoer helped the Bulldogs to overall records of 10-4 (2017) and 12-2 (2018), along with two division titles, two bowl game victories and the Mountain West Conference Championship in 2018.

• A school-record setting wide receiver at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), DeBoer later led his alma mater to three NAIA National Championships in five seasons as head coach, winning titles in 2006, 2008 and 2009, while also finishing as runner-up in 2007 and making the semifinals in his first season as head coach in 2005. During his five seasons at Sioux Falls, DeBoer compiled a 67-3 overall record, including a 49-1 mark in Great Plains Athletic Conference play. He was NAIA National Coach of the Year in each of his three championship seasons at USF.

• After the 2009 season, he took a job at Southern Illinois as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2010 through 2013. He moved to Eastern Michigan as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2014 through 2016, helping the Eagles to their third-ever bowl-game berth in 2016. plays (99).

• A 1998 graduate of Sioux Falls with a degree in secondary education, DeBoer was a record-setting football and baseball student-athlete. During his football career, he compiled 3,400 yards and 33 touchdowns on 234 career receptions – all school records at the time – and played on the 1996 NAIA Division II National Championship team.

• He also played baseball for the Cougars, batting .520 (still a school record) as a senior in 1998. His career average of .492 is tops in USF history, as are his 37 career homers and .944 slugging percentage.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** – The No. 5/5 Alabama football team began the 2024 season in style, as head coach Kalen DeBoer earned his first victory in his Crimson Tide debut following a 63-0 win over Western Kentucky Saturday night in front of a sold-out crowd at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Alabama produced 600 yards of total offense in its first showing of the season while limiting Western Kentucky to just 145 total yards. Quarterback Jalen Milroe needed just seven completions on nine attempts to notch 200 yards through the air, including three touchdowns. He added two rushing scores to his ledger as well, accounting for five total touchdowns in the win. Wide receiver Ryan Williams' first two catches as a member of the Crimson Tide both found the end zone with the freshman totaling 139 yards in his first collegiate game. Kendrick Law's lone reception resulted in a 22-yard touchdown.

Justice Haynes led Alabama with 102 rushing yards on four carries, highlighted by an 85-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. After the starters were pulled midway through the third quarter, running back Daniel Hill and quarterback Ty Simpson each provided rushing touchdowns late in the ballgame.

Defensively, Keon Sabb shined in his initial Alabama appearance, nabbing two first half interceptions. Deontae Lawson and Jihaad Campbell led Alabama with nine total tackles apiece, while Que Robinson notched the Crimson Tide's only sack.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** – The 4/4 Alabama football team scored 28 points in the final quarter, as the Crimson Tide used a late push to take down USF, 42-16. Prior to the game, a sold-out crowd witnessed the official dedication of Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium with pregame and halftime ceremonies honoring former head coach Nick Saban.

Jalen Milroe finished the night 17-of-27 with 199 passing yards and a pair of touchdowns. The junior quarterback added two additional touchdowns on the ground. Jam Miller led the Tide with 140 rushing yards, including a 56-yard touchdown run, on 15 attempts, while Justice Haynes provided a rushing score of his own to go with 41 yards on the ground.

Ryan Williams was Alabama's leading receiver for the second consecutive game, notching 68 yards and a score, boosted by a 43-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter. Kobe Prentice managed two catches, one of which resulted in a 16-yard touchdown.

The Crimson Tide defense was stout throughout the night, allowing just one USF touchdown. Up front, Tim Keenan III was the leading defender in sacks (1.5) and tackles for loss (2.5). Jihaad Campbell picked up a team-high 11 tackles, with Malachi Moore totaling seven tackles and a team-best two pass breakups.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** – Alabama came out on top in a thrilling matchup between two top-five teams, as Jalen Milroe's late 75-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Williams helped to seal the 41-34 win over No. 2/1 Georgia. The Bulldogs final drive was halted by Zabien Brown's first-career interception, allowing the Tide to run out the remainder of the clock.

Milroe finished 27-of-33 through the air, compiling a career-high 374 passing yards and two touchdowns. The dual-threat quarterback also added 117 yards and two touchdowns on 16 carries on the ground. Jam Miller's lone catch resulted in a 16-yard receiving score.

Williams led all Tide receivers once again, compiling 177 yards on six catches, with the final one being the long go-ahead score with 2:18 remaining in the ballgame. Germie Bernard hauled in five catches for 25 yards, and also had a 7-yard rushing score.

The Alabama defense produced four total turnovers (three interceptions, one fumble) to aid the winning effort. Deontae Lawson led all Tide defenders with 10 tackles (two for loss), contributing a sack and a pass breakup. Domani Jackson managed seven tackles and an interception, while Jihaad Campbell totaled four tackles and an interception as well. As a group, Alabama forced four turnovers, broke up nine passes to go with three sacks, six tackles for loss and a safety.
