INSIDE THE MATCHUP

- Cal and Vanderbilt will meet for the first time on the hardwood. Vanderbilt is one of just two current SEC teams that Cal hasn't faced (Auburn).
- The Bears have multiple ties to the Vanderbilt program.
 - Lee Dort (Junior forward; member of Vanderbilt team from 2022-24)
 - Adam Mazarei (Associate HC; 4 seasons on Vanderbilt staff, 2019-23)
 - Shasha Brown (Director of Ops; 3 seasons on Vanderbilt staff, 2019-22)
- A win by Cal on Wednesday in Nashville would mark its first nonconference road win since Dec. 19, 2017 at Seattle U (81-59). The Bears have lost 10 consecutive nonconference road games since.

1. IT TAKES EVERYONE

Cal has flexed its new-look depth with a 10-man rotation in each of its first two games this season. All 10 players who have so far seen the court are first-year Golden Bears - nine transfers and one freshman - and each has scored in both of the wins against CSU Bakersfield and Cal Poly. Six of the 10 Bears already have at least one double-figure scoring effort, highlighted by two apiece from Jovan Blacksher Jr. (17.5 PPG), Andrej Stojakovic (15.5 PPG) and BJ Omot (11.5 PPG).

Cal's retooled roster features 11 scholarship newcomers and 15 total players wearing Blue & Gold for the first time.

2. BUILDING BLOCKS

Though a modest feat, Cal is 2-0 for the first time in five seasons, since starting the 2019-20 season at 4-0. The two wins against CSU Bakersfield and Cal Poly last week were by a combined 31 points. Cal trailed just once for 17 seconds in the first half and led by as many as 18 against CSU Bakersfield on Nov. 4, and then showed resilience in overcoming an early 12-point deficit (17-5) in an eventual 18-point victory against Cal Poly on Nov. 7.

3. GOLDEN BEARS VS. THE SEC

Cal seeks its first road win against an SEC team when it faces Vanderbilt on Wednesday. The Golden Bears are 0-7 all-time on the road against SEC teams - including an 0-2 mark at newcomers Oklahoma and Texas - and 16-23 overall against the current members of the SEC.

Cal's last win against an SEC team was on March 24, 2014 vs. Arkansas (75-64) in the second round of the NIT. Since then, the Bears have lost three straight to SEC teams, most recently an 88-78 defeat to Ole Miss in the Hall of Fame Series in San Antonio last December.

4. MADSEN ERA, YEAR 2

It's year two in Berkeley for head coach Mark Madsen, who reinvigorated the Cal program and its fan base with a 10-win improvement in 2023-24. The Bears placed sixth in the Pac-12 last season, marking their best conference finish since 2016-17, and earned marquee wins at UCLA and against NCAA Tournament squads Washington State, Oregon and Colorado. Mad Dog - who was awarded a two-year contract extension in March 2024 that'll keep him at Cal until 2030 - now leads the Bears into a new era in the ACC.

5. EXPERIENCED GROUP

Cal's locker room may be filled with new faces, but its collective experience has shined through two games played. The Golden Bears ranked sixth among ACC teams in career Division I minutes played (14,876) entering the season.

The veteran bunch is headlined by graduate transfers Mady Sissoko and Jovan Blacksher Jr., who have played a combined 248 career games at Michigan State and Grand Canyon, respectively. Both players reached the NCAA Round of 32 last year with their former squads. Eight transfers - Sissoko and Blacksher, included - are at least a junior eligibility-wise: DJ Campbell (junior, Western Carolina), Lee Dort (junior, Vanderbilt), Joshua Ola-Joseph (junior, Minnesota), BJ Omot (junior, North Dakota) and Rytis Petraitis (junior, Air Force) and Christian Tucker (senior, UTSA).

Those eight Bears have accounted for 89.2% of Cal's scoring, 70.2% of its rebounds and 87.5% of its assists across its two wins over the opening week of the season.

NOTEWORTHY

THESE AREN'T YOUR DAD'S (OR 2023-24) BEARS

- After making a seemingly large roster revamp with signing four transfers in his first year at Cal's helm in 2023-24, Mark Madsen was tasked with a much greater shift this offseason as he added 10 scholarship transfers and 16 total new players to the roster.
- Last year's quartet of transfers – Fardaws Aimaq, Jalen Cone, Keonte Kennedy and Jaylon Tyson – accounted for 61.3% of Cal's minutes played, 73% of its scoring, 62.7% of its rebounding and 75.2% of its assists.
- With that group now gone (Aimaq, Cone & Kennedy to eligibility & Tyson to NBA Draft), Cal returned just three players who played last season – scholarship sophomores Devin Curtis and Vladimir Pavlovic, as well as preferred walk-on junior Gus Larson – and totaled 54 combined points.

BEEN THERE BEFORE

- Team captains Mady Sissoko and Jovan Blacksher Jr. both reached the NCAA Tournament Round of 32 last March with Michigan State and Grand Canyon, respectively.
- Sissoko played in 121 career games across four NCAA Tournament squads at Michigan State and averaged 5.5 rebounds per game while shooting nearly 60% from the floor in the past two seasons.
- Blacksher, a former All-WAC first-team selection and the 2022-23 WAC Preseason Player of the Year, was a member of three NCAA Tournament teams with the Antelopes and has fully recovered from a knee injury that sidelined him for 11 months starting in early January 2023. The Oakland native averaged 11.0 points, 3.5 assists, 3.2 rebounds and 1.4 steals in 123 career games for Grand Canyon.
- Blacksher is in his sixth collegiate season after receiving a medical hardship waiver from the NCAA this past offseason. He's one of the oldest players in NCAA Division I basketball this season.

SWITCHING SIDES

- Sophomore guard Andrej Stojakovic will play for the Golden Bears this season after starting his collegiate career in the South Bay with rival Stanford.
- Stojakovic is second on the team in both PPG (15.5) and RPG (6.0) through two games. Though shooting just 30.8% from the floor so far, he's effectively reached the free-throw line and has made 12-of-14 attempts.
- Stojakovic, a former McDonald's All-American and five-star recruit out of Jesuit High School in Carmichael, averaged 7.8 points and 3.4 rebounds per game across 32 contests for the Cardinal last year.
- The smooth-shooting, 6-foot-7 guard is the son of 13-year NBA veteran Peja Stojakovic.

SWISS ARMY KNIFE

- Junior forward Rytis Petraitis has flashed a gritty, do-it-all style of play that's immediately caught the attention of Cal's fan base through two games.
- Petraitis had a hand in just about everything in Cal's 91-73 win against Cal Poly on Nov. 7, scoring 13 points on 3-of-4 shooting, grabbing 6 rebounds, dishing an assist and tallying 3 steals, in addition to multiple defensive stands.

- Petraitis, an Air Force transfer, led the Falcons in five statistical categories as a sophomore last year and was one of just 11 players nationally last season to average at least 15.7 PPG, 6.3 RPG and 3.7 APG.

WELCOME TO THE HAAS OF PAIN

- Cal fans showed late last season why Haas Pavilion – nicknamed the “Haas of Pain” since Mark Madsen arrival in spring 2023 – can return to being a formidable place for opponents to play.
- Cal won 10 home games in 2023-24, including six of its final eight. The final eight-game span was spotlighted by Cal's first sold-out crowd since Jan. 29, 2017, when 11,801 were on hand for the Bears' 83-77 overtime win against USC on Feb. 7, 2024. That sellout was sandwiched by attendances of 8,710 against Stanford on Jan. 26 and 9,280 against UCLA on Feb. 10.
- After averaging an attendance of 2,155 during the 2022-23 season, Cal saw that number jump to 4,566 in Madsen's first year last season.
- The Bears will play at home in 5 of their remaining 9 nonconference games and also welcome Stanford to Haas Pavilion on Dec. 7 for the two teams' inaugural ACC contest, and the earliest meeting on the hardwood between the two rival programs.

KNOCK 'EM DOWN

- Cal has made 51 free throws through its first two games, its most in a two-game span since making 56 between Nov. 16-21, 2016.
- The Bears opened the season with a 31-of-40 performance against CSU Bakersfield; both the makes and attempts were Cal's most in a single game since going 31 of 43 against Portland State on Dec. 21, 2017. Four Bears were perfect individually at the stripe in that game, led by Andrej Stojakovic (9 of 9).

WANT TO FEEL OLD?

- Nostalgia! Cal's 2024-25 roster will make an early 2000s NBA fan feel their age, with multiple Golden Bears having direct family connections to some of the era's best.
- Cal guards Andrej Stojakovic and Stephon Marbury II, the sons of former NBA All-Stars Peja Stojakovic and Stephon Marbury, are in their first seasons as Golden Bears. Stojakovic, a sophomore transfer from Stanford, is expected play key rotational minutes for the Bears this season while Marbury II, a preferred walk-on, has played a vital role on the team's practice squad in the early stages of his first collegiate season.
- Peja Stojakovic had a 13-year NBA career that included three All-Star nods with the Sacramento Kings & an NBA title with the Dallas Mavericks in 2011.
- Stephon Marbury played 24 years of professional basketball in the NBA & Chinese Basketball Association and was a two-time NBA All-Star & three-time CBA champion.
- The elder Marbury and Stojakovic were both first-round picks in the 1996 NBA Draft and 2003 All-Star Game teammates.
- Fellow freshman walk-on Hugh Vandeweghe is the nephew of Kiki Vandeweghe, a two-time NBA All-Star (1983-84) who amassed 15,980 career points in 14 NBA seasons with Denver, Portland, New York & Los Angeles Clippers.

PRO BEARS IN ACTION

- Two former Golden Bears were on 2024 opening night NBA rosters last month – Jaylen Brown (Boston Celtics) and Jaylon Tyson (Cleveland Cavaliers).
- In addition to Brown and Tyson on the court, Cal was once

- again represented by basketball hall-of-famer Jason Kidd, in his fourth season as head coach of the Dallas Mavericks.
- Brown led the Boston Celtics to the 2024 NBA championship and was named the NBA Finals MVP after averaging 20.8 points, 5.4 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 1.6 steals in the finals while shooting 44% from the field.
- Tyson is an NBA rookie, having been selected by the Cleveland Cavaliers with the 20th overall pick in the first round of the 2024 NBA Draft in June.
- Tyson was the 11th Bear to be picked in the first round of an NBA Draft and the first Bear drafted since Ivan Rabb and Jabari Bird both went in the second round in 2017.
- Tyson was an All-Pac-12 First Team selection in his lone season as a Golden Bear under Mark Madsen last year. He was one of college basketball's most dynamic players, as he was just one of two major-conference players to average 19.6 points, 6.8 rebounds and 3.5 assists per game or better.

MARK MADSEN

CALIFORNIA MEN'S BASKETBALL HEAD COACH • 2ND SEASON AT CAL • STANFORD, 2000

Mark Madsen, a two-time NBA champion with East Bay roots and a proven track record as both a college and professional coach, was named the 19th head coach in California men's basketball history on March 29, 2023. After reinvigorating the Cal program and its fan base with a 10-win improvement in his first year at the helm in 2023-24, Madsen leads the Golden Bears into their inaugural season as members of the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2024-25.

Madsen was 70-51 (.578) overall and 39-25 (.609) in WAC play in four seasons at Utah Valley. Following an 11-win season in his first year in 2019-20, Madsen led the Wolverines to a share of the WAC regular-season title in 2020-21 and back-to-back 20-win seasons in 2021-22 and 2022-23. Madsen's 2022-23 squad won a program record 28 games and was an impressive 15-3 in WAC play.

Madsen's first year in Bear Territory was marked by Cal's best finish in the Pac-12 Conference standings since 2016-17 with a tie for sixth place (13-19, 9-11). The Bears' nine conference wins – each against a different opponent, including marquee victories against UCLA and NCAA Tournament teams Washington State, Oregon and Colorado – were the fourth-most by a first-year head coach in program history. Madsen was awarded a two-year contract extension in March 2024, keeping him in Berkeley until 2030.

Madsen spent six seasons as an assistant coach for the Los Angeles Lakers (2013-19) prior to leading Utah Valley. During his time on the Los Angeles bench, he coached NBA superstars LeBron James, Kobe Bryant and Steve Nash, among others. He also played alongside some of the NBA's greatest players, including Bryant, Shaquille O'Neal and Kevin Garnett. Following three seasons played with the Lakers (2000-03), Madsen played six further seasons with the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Madsen's first coaching position came as an assistant coach for the Utah Flash of the NBA Development League during the 2009-10 season. He later returned to his alma mater to earn an MBA from the Stanford Graduate School of Business in 2012 and spent the 2012-13 season as an assistant coach for the Cardinal, working in recruiting, opponent game planning and player development. A 2019 Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, Madsen earned All-America honors twice while helping lead the Cardinal to four NCAA Tournament appearances – including the 1998 Final Four – in as many seasons played from 1996-2000. He averaged 10.9 points and 7.0 rebounds per game in his Stanford career and ranks fourth in field goal percentage (.587) and sixth in rebounds (857) in program history. Madsen earned an undergraduate degree in economics from Stanford in 2000.

Madsen served a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Spain. Madsen and his wife, Hannah, have two sons (William and Leroy) and two daughters (Alexandria and Anastasia).

'Mad Dog' – the nickname Madsen received from his fifth grade P.E. teacher at Montair Elementary School in Danville – didn't waste a second in implementing his vision for Cal men's basketball. He and his staff aggressively pursued some of the top recruits in the country in the transfer portal and on the high school level, and On3 ranked the Bears' 2023 transfer class as the eighth-best in the nation. That transfer class was highlighted by Jaylon Tyson – who went on to be selected No. 20 overall in the first round of the 2024 NBA Draft by the Cleveland Cavaliers in June 2024 – and Fardaws Aimaq, who led the Pac-12 in rebounding (11.0 RPG) and was one of only six major-conference players to average a double-double in the 2023-24 season.

Madsen and company restocked the Cal roster again through the transfer portal heading into the 2024-25 campaign; 10 of Cal's 11 scholarship newcomers this season are transfers, making up the 12th-ranked transfer class in the country (On3).

Following a decorated playing career which included a trip to the NCAA Final Four at Stanford and two NBA championships while playing for the Los Angeles Lakers, Madsen is considered a rising star in the coaching ranks. Prior to Cal, he most recently led Utah Valley to the semifinals of the 2023 NIT. Madsen was named the 2023 Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year and led the Wolverines to a pair of conference titles during his four seasons at the helm. He was well-recognized for his efforts during the 2022-23 campaign as he was named District Coach of the Year by both the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) and a finalist for the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year award, which is presented annually to the top Division I mid-major coach in college basketball.

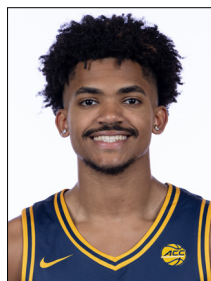

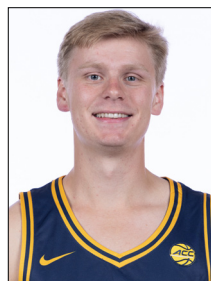

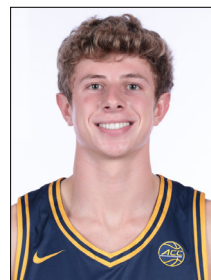
