STORYLINES

OPENING ON A ROLL

- Vanderbilt kicks off its 136th season of football on Saturday, hosting Charleston Southern at FirstBank Stadium.
- The Commodores have won three-straight season openers, matching the longest string of season-opening wins since capturing six in a row from 1970-75. Vandy's longest streak of opening victories is 35 from 1904-38.
- The Dores are 83-48-4 all-time in lid lifters.

HOME NEVER LOOKED SO GOOD

- Saturday marks another new milestone at FirstBank Stadium as the south end zone facility makes its debut.
- The state-of-the-art facility features living room boxes, loge boxes, club seating, field-level seating, founders' suites, club suites and open-air tailgate suites.
- The south end zone building also houses a new football game day locker room, and will also feature a student-athlete training table and dining facility for all varsity teams.

THE BECKONING

- Vanderbilt's offense has been transformed under second-year offensive coordinator Tim Beck's watch.
- Vandy's ESPN FPI offensive efficiency (67.5) ranked 28th in FBS in 2024. It was Vanderbilt's best finish in offensive efficiency since 2005 when the Dores ended up 25th in the metric's first year. Prior to Beck's arrival, Vanderbilt's best finish during Clark Lea's tenure was 76th in 2022.
- The Commodores were the best in the nation at protecting the football, finishing with an FBS-low seven turnovers on the season.
- Vanderbilt also led the SEC and finished third in FBS in red zone offense, getting points on 93.3% of its red zone trips (42-for-45).
- Beck was named a semifinalist for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach.

NEW SEASON, NEW HIGHT

- No need to blink, that is junior Martel Hight split out at wide receiver this season. The veteran corner will play both ways for the first time in his collegiate career.
- Hight finished the 2024 campaign tied for the team lead with two interceptions, tied for second with four pass breakups and added 33 tackles
- Hight's explosiveness with the ball in his hands was also on display as he averaged 14.7 yards on 18 punt returns and made a 57-yard house call against Alcorn State.

CAPTAINING THE SHIP

- Vanderbilt named eight veterans as team captains for the 2025 season. Commodore captains are voted on and selected by the team
- Richie Hoskins, Langston Patterson, Diego Pavia and Marlen Sewell were all selected as captains for a second-straight season. Randon Fontenette, Yilanan Ouattara, Eli Stowers and Khordae Sydnor join the leadership group for their first season as captains.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Eli Stowers has dotted preseason All-America lists this season, garnering first team picks by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, ESPN, Sports Illustrated, Associated Press, The Athletic, The Sporting News, Athlon and Phil Steele.
- Stowers is also one of two Commodores who picked up All-SEC recognition from league coaches in advance of the 2025 seaso, being tabbed preseason first-team All-SEC while Martel Hight landed a spot on the third team.
- Stowers' first team prognostication is the first for the Dores since the 2013 season when Jordan Matthews, Andre Hal and Casey Spear all earned preseason honors.

GAME NOTES

BIRMINGHAM BOWL CHAMPIONS

- For just the fifth time in school history, Vanderbilt football ended its season with a bowl victory as the Commodores defeated Georgia Tech in the Birmingham Bowl to conclude a historic 2024 campaign.
- Vandy beat the Yellow Jackets, 35-27, in Birmingham to clinch its first bowl victory and first winning season since 2013. The win improved the program's all-time postseason record to 5-4-1.
- Diego Pavia was named the game's MVP after he contributed to five touchdowns, a Vanderbilt bowl record. Pavia threw for three scores and rushed for a pair, amassing 245 total yards (160 passing, 85 rushing).
- The Dores were 5-for-5 in the red zone and forced a pair of turnovers in the victory. CJ Taylor intercepted a pass, Aeneas DiCosmo recovered a fumble and Nick Rinaldi made 10 tackles with two sacks. Rinaldi earned a spot on the Associated Press All-Bowl team for his efforts.
- The Birmingham Bowl was a renewal of a rivalry with Georgia Tech which dates back to the founding of the SEC. It was Vandy's first win over the Yellow Jackets since 1941 and returned the Golden Cowbell rivalry trophy to Nashville.

POSTSEASON SEC ACCOLADES

- Vanderbilt football's historic season resulted in the Commodores collecting SEC Coach of the Year (Clark Lea) and SEC Newcomer of the Year (Diego Pavia).
- It was the first time since Warren Norman was selected SEC Freshman of the Year in 2009 that Vanderbilt has collected an SEC individual postseason award from the league's coaches.
- Lea was the first SEC Coach of the Year on West End since Bobby Johnson, Lea's own coach as a player at Vandy, in 2008. Johnson led the Commodores to a 7-6 mark and Music City Bowl win, Vandy's first bowl victory at the time since 1955. He shared the award with Alabama's Nick Saban and Houston Nutt from Ole Miss, meaning the last time a Vanderbilt coach won the award outright was in 1982 when George MacIntyre led Vandy to an 8-4 mark and berth in the Hall of Fame Bowl.
- Vanderbilt won six of its first nine games for the first time since 1982, won at Auburn's Jordan-Hare Stadium for the first time ever, defeated Alabama and Auburn in the same season for the first time since 1955, was ranked in the Associated Press poll for the first time since the conclusion of the 2013 season, played a game as a ranked team for the first time since the 2012 Music City Bowl and played a regular season game while ranked for the first time since 2008.
- Pavia collected the SEC's first-ever Newcomer of the Year award. Separate from the Freshman of the Year, Newcomer of the Year recognizes the top transfer student-athlete who has not previously competed in the SEC and is not a freshman in eligibility status.
- Named a semifinalist for the Maxwell Award and Davey O'Brien Award, Pavia threw the fewest interceptions by a Vanderbilt quarterback since at least 1996 (minimum 200 attempts) and had the second-fewest interceptions among SEC quarterbacks last season with at least 250 attempts.
- In addition to the pair of individual awards, four Dores earned All-SEC honors. Eli Stowers was named the first-team tight end, Jesse Mirco (punter) and Martel Hight (return specialist) were chosen for the second team and Brock Taylor was named the third-team kicker.

DOMINANT DIEGO

- Diego Pavia's 20 passing touchdowns ranked sixth in the SEC. The 20 touchdowns were fifth-most by a Commodore in a season.
- On the ground, Pavia ran for a Vanderbilt QB record 801 yards. That total was the highest by a Power 4 quarterback last season and seventh-most among non-service academy quarterbacks in all of FBS.
 For his career, Pavia capped 2024 second among active FBS quarterbacks with 2,232 rushing yards,
- trailing only Army's Bryson Daily. In addition, his 6,716 career passing yards ranks 12th among active quarterbacks heading into 2025.

 He was named one of 16 semifinalists for the 88th Maxwell Award, as well as one of 16 semifinalists for
- the Davey O'Brien Award.

 His performance in the win over top-ranked Alabama on Oct. 5 landed him SEC Offensive Player of the
- Week. He was also named the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback of the Week and the Maxwell Award Player of the Week.
- He became the 13th quarterback since 2004 to defeat Alabama and Auburn in the same season and just the fourth do to so without playing in the SEC West (Stetson Bennett, Deshaun Watson, Matthew Stafford). He is the seventh quarterback in that same time frame to have at least three career wins over the Tigers and Tide, joining Jayden Daniels, Bennett, Joe Burrow, Jarrett Lee, Jordan Jefferson, Stafford and JaMarcus Russell.
- Pavia piloted a deadly efficient offense in 2023 while leading New Mexico State to 10 wins. He ranked among the top 35 in FBS in passing touchdowns, points, passing yards per attempt and passing efficiency that season. In addition, Pavia ranked fifth among FBS quarterbacks in Pro Football Focus' Elusive Rating.

FEWEST INTERCEPTIONS

- Diego Pavia's four interceptions thrown last season were the fewest by a Vanderbilt quarterback in a season with at least 200 attempts since 1996.
- He bettered the mark of five previously held by Jay Cutler (2004), Riley Neal (2019), Jordan Rodgers (2012) and Larry Smith (2010).
- $\bullet \ \, \text{With 298 attempts}, Pavia hit the mark with more passing attempts than three of the four who previously held the record (Rodgers had 319 attempts). \\$
- As a team, Vandy's four interceptions last season were the fewest on record (1946). The previous low total for interceptions thrown was five in 2004 and 2012. It was just the 13th time since 1946 that Vanderbilt has thrown fewer than 10 interceptions in a season.

SPECIAL PLAYS, SPECIAL PLAYERS

- The Commodores claimed three All-SEC awards on special teams in 2024. Jesse Mirco (punter) and Martel Hight (return specialist) were chosen to the second team and Brock Taylor was named the third-team kicker.
- Vanderbilt's special teams efficiency of 69.7 according to ESPN's FPI ranked fifth among FBS programs and led all SEC teams.
- Vandy was third in the SEC and 11th in FBS with 14.72 yards per punt return. Hight led SEC players and was third nationally in punt return average and returned a punt 57 yards for a score against Alcorn State.
- Mirco averaged 48.04 yards per punt on the season, best in the SEC and second in FBS. His average was 0.2 yards per punt better than Ray Guy Award winner Eddie Czaplicki (USC), who did not meet the NCAA statistical minimum for the season.
- Mirco was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week (Nov. 4) after averaging 52.9 yards on a careerhigh eight punts at Auburn.
- Taylor drilled a program-record 57-yard field goal at Missouri on Sept. 21. Taylor had five makes of 50 or more yards last season, giving him the career record for 50-plus-yard field goals.
- The Knoxville, Tennessee, native also finished the season with 93 points, second-most in school history. It trailed only kicker Carey Spear's 99-point season in 2013, which included a touchdown.
- Taylor was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week twice. His 18 field goals were second-most by a Commodore in a season. Taylor made his last 11 field goal attempts of the season.
- In the regular-season finale vs. Tennessee, Junior Sherrill took the opening kickoff back 100 yards for a touchdown, which marked Vandy's first kickoff return for a touchdown since Aug. 26, 2023 vs. Hawai'i.
- The 100-yard return was the longest by a Commodore since Sept. 20, 2014 vs. South Carolina. It was the first kickoff return for a score that Tennessee had given up since the 2021 season when Missouri accomplished the feat.
- Vanderbilt was one of six Power 4 programs with both a punt return and kickoff return for a touchdown in 2024 (BYU, Iowa, North Carolina, Oregon and Wake Forest).
- In addition, it was the first time since 1971 the Commodores scored on a punt return and kickoff return in the same season and just the fourth time on record Vandy scored in both varieties.

BEAR-LEA SCRATCHING THE SURFACE

- Head coach Clark Lea was named the SEC Coach of the Year after leading Vanderbilt to its first postseason appearance since 2018. He's the first Commodore coach to win the award since Bobby Johnson in 2008. Johnson was Lea's coach during his playing career at Vandy.
- Lea was also named AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the National Coach of the Year.
 He also found himself on the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year watch list after Vanderbilt's historical first half of the season.
- Many of the positive developments in the fall came after Lea retooled the coaching staff following
 the 2023 season. In addition to taking over defensive coordinator duties, Lea hired a new offensive
 coordinator (Tim Beck), director of sports performance (Robert Stiner) and chief consultant (Jerry Kill).
 With 11 new hires on the football coaching staff and over 50 new student-athletes on the roster, Lea's
- With 11 new hires on the football coaching staff and over 50 new student-athletes on the roster, Lea's Commodores made history last fall.
- With victories in six of its first nine games, Vanderbilt recorded its best start since 1982, went to its first bowl game since 2018 and had its first winning season and bowl victory since 2013.
- In addition, the Commodores produced their best scoring margin since 2013 and had a positive scoring margin for just the sixth time since 1975. The 27.3 points per game were the most since 2018 and the 23.4 points allowed per game were fewest since 2015.

BOWLING ON THE PLAINS

- Vanderbilt defeated Auburn 17-7 on Nov. 2 to collect its first win at Jordan-Hare Stadium in its 10th visit all-time.
- With their sixth win, the Commodores became bowl eligible for the first time since 2018.
- The Commodores defeated both Alabama and Auburn in the same season for the first time since 1955.
- The Dores held the Tigers to seven points, fewest versus a Power 4 opponent since Kansas State in 2017 and fewest against an SEC opponent since Missouri in 2015.
- Jesse Mirco finished the game with eight punts for 423 yards. His average of 52.9 yards per punt was second-best by a Vandy punter (minimum five attempts) in a single game. Mirco was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Diego Pavia became the 13th starting quarterback since 2004 to defeat both Alabama and Auburn in the same season.



GAME NOTES

BROCKET LAUNCHER

- Brock Taylor made his 17th field goal at LSU, a 47-yarder, to move into second on Vanderbilt's season field goal record list. He increased his season total to 18 field goals with a make vs. Tennessee in the regular-season finale and finished two shy of matching the program record of 20 set by Carey Spear in 2012.
- Taylor made his last 11 field goal attempts of the season over the final eight games (he did not attempt a field goal in the Birmingham Bowl).
- He connected on a program-record 57-yard field goal at Missouri on Sept. 21. Taylor had five makes of 50 or more yards last season, making him the first player in school history with at least five 50-yard-plus field goals.
- Taylor was chosen SEC Special Teams Player of the Week twice this season and was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award on Nov. 19.

RELIABLE

- Eli Stowers' 638 receiving yards last season were the second-most by a Vanderbilt tight end since 1996. He trailed only the 774 accumulated by Jared Pinkney in 2018. Pinkney, Stowers and Steven Scheu (2014) are the only Vanderbilt tight ends since 1996 to eclipse 500 receiving yards in a season.
- In addition, Stowers is the only Vanderbilt tight end since 1996 to complete a pass in a game after he hit fellow tight end Cole Spence for a 17-yard touchdown in the win over Alcorn State.
- No SEC tight end had more than Stowers' 49.1 receiving yards per game, as he finished the year tied in the category with Texas' Gunnar Helm.
- Stowers became the first Vandy tight end since at least 1996 to have multiple games with 100-plus receiving yards in a season. He had three such games last season after totaling 110 receiving yards vs. Georgia State and 130 vs. Ball State in addition to the Alabama game.
- Stowers became just the sixth tight end since 1996 to register 100-plus receiving yards in a game vs. Alabama:

• Stowers was a semifinalist for the John Mackey Award and selected All-SEC by the league's coaches. He was Vanderbilt's first offensive player to earn first-team All-SEC honors since 2013.

NEW HIGHTS

- Cornerback Martel Hight led the SEC and ranked third in FBS with a 14.72 punt return average. He also tied for the team lead with a pair of interceptions.
- In the win over Alcorn State, Hight became the first Dore with 100-plus punt return yards since Jonathan Krause on Nov. 24, 2012 at Wake Forest (110 yards). Hight's punt return for a touchdown in the game was the first since Krause's at Wake Forest in 2012.
- He became the first Commodore to have 100-plus punt return yards in a season since the 2019 campaign, reaching the mark in just two games.
- When Hight registered a 37-yard interception return for a touchdown against UNLV in 2023, he became the first Vanderbilt freshman in school history to return an interception for a touchdown and the first Dore of any age to do so since 2019.

JUNIOR AS A SOPHOMORE

- Hight's classmate Junior Sherrill continued to build on his contributions from his freshman campaign. Sherill finished his rookie year with 20 receptions for 293 yards and two touchdowns while playing in all 12 contests. He surpassed all three totals in 10 games last season.
- The Nashvillian has made at least one catch in 24 straight games and had multiple receptions in eight consecutive contests to end the 2024 regular season. He had one reception for 10 yards in the Birmingham Bowl.
- Sherrill received the opening kickoff vs. Tennessee and returned it 100 yards to the house for Vandy's longest kickoff return for a touchdown since 2014.
- \bullet He had a personal-best five catches for 62 yards and a receiving touchdown vs. No. 5/6 Texas on Oct. 26.
- Sherrill was rated the No. 8 freshman wide receiver in the nation by Pro Football Focus in 2023.

SEDRICK THE ENTERTAINER

- Running back Sedrick Alexander tallied a career-high 21 carries in the win over top-ranked Alabama on Oct. 5, matching his career-best with two rushing touchdowns, and was included on the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Honorable Mention List for the week.
- Alexander found the end zone in each of the first three games last season. He also scored in three games in 2023.
- He finished his sophomore campaign as the team's second-leading rusher, trailing only Diego Pavia, with 586 yards and six touchdowns. He is the 26th Vandy running back to eclipse 500 rushing yards in a season since 1996 and his total was second among all SEC sophomores.
- The Texan played in all 12 games as a freshman, logging 504 all-purpose yards, 371 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns.
- He led SEC freshmen in rushing yards and touchdowns and was named to the league's All-Freshman team.
- Alexander was named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List entering 2024.

SCORING ON THE BEST

- Vanderbilt was the second-highest scoring team against a pair of College Football Playoff squads during the regular season. Both defenses were led by coordinators named a finalist for the Broyles Award.
- Vanderbilt's 24 points against Texas were the second-most scored against the Longhorns. Georgia scored 30 in a win over Texas the week before the Longhorns played Vandy. Only Georgia and Vanderbilt eclipsed 20 points against Texas in the regular season.
- Likewise, Vandy's 23 points against Tennessee were the second-most scored on the Volunteers prior to postseason play. Again, only Georgia scored more points than Vandy against the Vols (31) as Vanderbilt and Georgia were the only teams to eclipse 20 points on Tennessee in the regular season.
- Texas defensive coordinator Pete Kwiatkowski and Tennessee defensive coordinator Tim Banks were both named finalists for the Broyles Award. Vanderbilt offensive coordinator Tim Beck was a semifinalist for the Broyles Award last season.

IMPROVEMENT VS. RANKED TEAMS

- In games against opponents in the AP Top 25 at the time of the game, Vanderbilt showed marked statistical improvement, in addition to securing its first-ever win against the No. 1 team in the nation.
- Last season, Vanderbilt averaged 28.5 points per game against ranked teams after scoring 18.0 in 2023 and 5.7 in Lea's debut 2021 campaign.
- In total scoring, Vanderbilt was outscored by just 14 points in four games against ranked teams. The 2022 Dores saw a deficit of 207 points over five games.
- Last year's Commodores allowed 32.0 points per game to ranked teams compared to 39.0 in 2023 and 52.6 in 2022
- Vanderbilt averaged over 300 yards of total offense against ranked teams last season for the first time under Lea, while holding ranked opponents under 450 yards per game for the first time in that span.
- The Commodores scored 12 touchdowns in their four games against ranked teams after scoring just one offensive touchdown in three such games during Lea's initial 2021 season.
- Individually, Diego Pavia led Vandy in both rushing and passing against the top 25, averaging 63 yards on the ground and 169.3 passing yards in four games, both high-water marks for a Commodore against ranked teams the last four seasons.

- Four Commodores earned weekly honors from the SEC after the team's 40-35 win over top-ranked Alabama on Oct. 5.
- Diego Pavia (Offensive), Brock Taylor (Special Teams), Gunnar Hansen (Offensive Line) and Miles Capers (Defensive Line) each earned recognition after the win.

- The last Commodore to win defensive lineman of the week was Dayo Odeyingbo on Nov. 17, 2018, while Bruno Reagan (11.25.17) was the last Vandy offensive lineman to take home the weekly award. Taylor became the first special teams player of the week for Vandy since long snapper Wesley Schelling on Nov. 28, 2022.

SCORING MARGIN THROUGH OCTOBER

- The Commodores outscored opponents 256-182 entering November last season, good for a margin of +74 points.
- It was the largest scoring margin by a Vanderbilt team entering November since 1955 when the Dores held a +86 edge at the end of October.
- The 256 points scored entering November were the second-most in that time frame, trailing only the 2013 team which had 257 through October.
- Under head coach Art Guepe, the 1955 Dores were 4-2 entering November, outscoring opponents 126-40, including shutouts of Middle Tennessee and Chattanooga.
- The '55 Dores finished 8-3 and reached the first bowl game in school history. Vandy defeated No. 8 Auburn, 25-13, in the Gator Bowl.

GAME 7 VS. BALL STATE

- The Commodores defeated Ball State 24-14 on Oct. 19 last season to improve to 5-2 on the season, 4-0 at home. It was the first time since the 1987-88 campaigns that the Commodores won four straight home games.
- The last time the Dores started a season 4-0 at home was in 1982 when Vandy won all six home contests.
- It was the fourth time on the season Vandy held its opponent under 100 rushing yards in a game. That number would grow to five following the Auburn contest when the Tigers had 88 yards on the ground.
- Vandy's offense totaled a season-high 420 yards against the Cardinals.
- Eli Stowers had eight catches for 130 yards, the third 100-yard receiving game this fall for the tight end and the most by a Commodore in a season since Jordan Matthews posted 100-plus receiving yards on eight occasions in 2013.
- Brock Taylor finished a perfect 3-of-3 on field goal attempts.

HAIL TO THEE OUR ALMA MATER

- Head coach Clark Lea, a "Double Dore" with undergraduate and master's degrees from Vanderbilt, is one of eight Power 4 head coaches leading their alma mater.
- In addition, Vice Chancellor and Athletics Director Candice Storey Lee holds three degrees from Vanderbilt, where she was a member of the women's basketball team from 1996-2002.
- With the combination of Lea and Lee, Vanderbilt is one of just two Power 4 institutions where both the athletics director and football coach are graduates of their current employer. Oklahoma State athletics director Chad Weiberg and head coach Mike Gundy are both graduates of OSU.

McCrary finished 10-of-16 with one touchdown and one interception for the Commodores, who led 21-10 at the half.
- Charleston Southern scored a touchdown in the third quarter and then cut Vanderbilt's lead to 21-20 on a field goal with 3:17 to play in the game. But Vanderbilt was able to run out the clock on its ensuing possession to preserve the win.
- Ralph Webb rushed for 56 yards on 15 carries for Vanderbilt.

OVERTIME VICTORY TO OPEN 2024

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Quarterback Diego Pavia scored three touchdowns and posted 294 total yards of offense to lead the Vanderbilt Commodores to a 34-27 win over RV/RV Virginia Tech in overtime in its 2024 season opener at FirstBank Stadium.

The Commodores won their third-straight season opener, as Vanderbilt collected its first victory over a team receiving votes since Nov. 12, 2022, when the Dores knocked off RV/24 Kentucky at Kroger Field.

Pavia, the 2023 CUSA Player of the Year and transfer from New Mexico State, threw for 190 yards and added 104 yards on the ground. Pavia went 12-of-16 and threw for two scores, while rushing for a third. He is the first Commodore to have over 100 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in a game since Mike Wright against Missouri on Oct. 30, 2021.

Vandy scored on its first three offensive possessions to take a 17-0 lead, and held the Hokies scoreless for the first 29 minutes of the first half, only allowing a 40-yard field goal with 52 seconds remaining before halftime. It was the first time Vanderbilt did not allow a touchdown to an FBS opponent in the first half since Sept. 28, 2019, against Northern

Senior Quincy Skinner Jr. hauled in four catches for a team-best 72 receiving yards and a touchdown. Junior Langston Patterson paced the Vandy defense with 10 tackles, leading the Commodores in tackles for the fifth-straight game. Junior Linus Zunk collected two sacks, while freshman Glenn Seabrooks III added an interception.

Virginia Tech scored the first points of the second half with a 24-yard touchdown from senior Bhayshul Tuten that cut the Commodore lead to 17-10 at the 12:42 mark of the third quarter. Vanderbilt responded with a 53-yard field goal from sophomore Brock Taylor to push its lead back out to 20-10 with 7:07 remaining in the third. Taylor's 53-yarder tied him with Joseph Bulovas for the fifth-longest field goal in school history.

The Hokies pulled even with the Dores early in the fourth quarter, as Tuten hauled in an 11-yard score from redshirt junior Kyron Drones to tie the game up at 20-all with 10:12 left to play. Virginia Tech got the ball back at the 7:38 mark after a Vanderbilt punt. The Hokies went 97 yards on six plays to take a 27-20 lead with 4:21 remaining in regulation.

With the Commodores trailing 27-20 late in the fourth quarter, sophomore Sedrick Alexander hauled in a pass from Pavia for an 8-yard touchdown reception that made it 27-all with 1:51 remaining in regulation.

Vanderbilt received the ball first in overtime and marched 25 yards down the field in four plays to take a 34-27 lead, capped off by Pavia's 4-yard touchdown run

With Virginia Tech facing a 4th-and-11 from the Vanderbilt 12-yard line, the Dores forced a rushed pass up the middle that came up incomplete to secure the victory for Vandy.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - It was all black and gold on Saturday night at FirstBank Stadiumas Vanderbilt shut out Alcorn State 55-0, the first for the Commodores since beating East

The Commodore offense got started with a 35-yard field goal by Brock Taylor midway through the first quarter before quickly picking up on the following drives. A tight end-totight end reverse pass from Eli Stowers to a wide-open Cole Spence set him up for his first reception and touchdown in black and gold.

Quarterback Diego Pavia continued his hot start with the program, putting Vandy up 17-0 with a tip-toeing 5-yard touchdown run in the second quarter.

The Vanderbilt defense shut down any attempt by Alcorn State to get its offense going in the first half, limiting the Braves to just 28 total yards. CJ Taylor came down with the fourth interception of his career in the middle of the first quarter, setting up the eventual touchdown by Spence. That pick made it seven of the last eight games where Vanderbilt's defense has had at least one interception.

A rushing touchdown by Sedrick Alexander—his second of the season—came with five minutes remaining in the half. Alexander now has consecutive games with a rushing touchdown for the first time in his career. Taylor nailed a 46-yard field goal as time ran down in the half to make the Vanderbilt lead 27-0 heading into the locker room.

In the third quarter, AJ Newberry found himself in the end zone for the first time in his career following a 20-yard rush up the middle.

The fourth quarter saw a trio of scores by the Dores. Junior quarterback Nate Johnson took a keeper 58 yards for his first touchdown at Vanderbilt. The Commodores then struck twice within six seconds of game time—first off a 57-yard punt return by Martel Hight, followed by a pick-six by Alan "Taco" Wright on the first play of the ensuing Alcorn State drive. Hight's house call was the first punt return touchdown for Vanderbilt since Jonathan Krause took one back on Nov. 24, 2012, at Wake Forest.

Vanderbilt's 55 points are the most scored in a game since last season's win against Alabama A&M and the most in a shutout since a 58-0 victory against Presbyterian on Sept. 17, 2012. The Commodore defense kept the Braves at bay with only 71 total yards in the game. The last time Vandy held its opponent under 100 yards was when the defense limited Chattanooga to just 93 yards in 2003.

Vanderbilt heads to Atlanta to take on Georgia State at 6 pm C.T. next Saturday. The Commodores look to go 3-0 for the first time in the Clark Lea era.

ATLANTA - Vanderbilt's fourth-quarter comeback came undone on Saturday, as Georgia State scored a touchdown in the game's closing seconds to hand the Commodores a 36-32 loss at Center Parc Stadium.

It is Vandy's first loss of the 2024 season, as the Dores now stand at 2-1 overall. The win improves Georgia State to 2-1.

Trailing by two scores late in the fourth quarter the Commodore offense went full steam. Vanderbilt posted back-to-back touchdowns in 1:15 to take its first lead at 32-29. Running back Sedrick Alexander rushed into the end zone from one-yard out with 1:14 left to play.

Georgia State answered by going 75 yards downfield in seven plays, finding the end zone in 59 seconds. The Panthers reclaimed the lead when quarterback Christian Veilleux found a streaking Ted Hurst for a 25-yard touchdown with 15 seconds left to play.

The Commodores could not find pay dirt on their final possession, as the clock expired with Vanderbilt at its 47-yard line after completing a 17-yard pass.

The Dores amassed 380 yards of total offense. Graduate student Diego Pavia had his first 300-yard game as a Commodore, as the quarterback collected 310 total yards of offense. Pavia tossed for a season-high 270 yards and added 40 yards on the ground. He threw for a pair of touchdowns against the Panthers, finding Junior Sherrill for an 8-yard score right before halftime, then connected with tight end Eli Stowers for an 18-yard touchdown early

Stowers hauled in nine receptions for 110 yards, both marks are single-game highs by a Commodore this season. A total of seven Dores caught a pass on Saturday. Alexander rushed for a team-best 42 yards and a score on 11 carries, as he has recorded a touchdown in all three games this season. At Newberry collected a touchdown for the second-straight game, while he hauled in a two-point conversion on Vanderbilt's final touchdown. The running back also added a 53-yard reception in the second quarter, which is the longest reception by a Vandy player this season, that set up the Commodores' first touchdown.

Randon Fontenette led the Vandy defense with eight tackles. Aeneas DiCosmo and Bryan Longwell teamed up for a sack, while the Dores had five tackles for loss. Longwell recorded his first collegiate interception and had four tackles against the Panthers.

DORES FALL IN DOUBLE OVERTIME

COLUMBIA, Mo. — Blake Craig kicked a 37-yard field goal on the first possession of double overtime on Saturday to help lead No. 7/8 Missouri to a 30-27 victory over Vanderbilt at

Craig's score came after Brady Cook found Luther Burden III for a 25-yard touchdown to send the game to a second extra period. The Commodores (2-2, 0-1 SEC) had an opportunity to tie the contest but saw a 31-yard field-goal attempt go wide left.

Cook finished 23-of-37 passing for 226 yards and two scores, with Burden posting six receptions for a game-high 76 yards while catch both of those touchdown passes. Nate Noel ran for 199 yards on 24 carries as well as the Tigers (4-0, 1-0) finished with 442 yards

Diego Pavia countered with 178 yards and a pair of touchdown throws for the Dores, hitting 14-of-23 attempts, and he led Vandy after finishing with 84 yards on 17 rushes as well. Eli Stowers was his top target after catching seven balls for 57 yards, while Sedrick Alexander chipped in with 52 yards on 11 carries.

Bryan Longwell and Langston Patterson paced the Vanderbilt defense with 12 and 11 tackles, respectively, with Longwell credited with 2½ stops behind the line of scrimmage. Randon Fontenette supplied eight tackles and Martel Hight finished with seven also.

Marvin Burks has 12 tackles to pace the Tigers and share game-high honors with Longwell as the Tigers limited the Commodores to 324 total yards

Missouri scored on its first two possessions of the second half, with Craig hitting a field goal from 54 yards out and Marcus Carroll adding a three-yard touchdown run less than three minutes later to give the Tigers their first lead, 20-13. The Commodores would even the score late in the third quarter when AJ Newberry reached the end zone from four yards out to cap an eight-play, 80-yard march by Vandy that took over five minutes off the clock.

Pavia gave the Dores an early 7-0 with a 65-yard touchdown pass to Joseph McVay less than six minutes into the contest, but when Mizzou answered on its ensuing possession with a 20-yard scoring pass from Cook to Burden the score was tied at the end of the opening period. Brock Taylor put Vandy back in front in the first 90 seconds of the second quarter after connecting on a 27-yard field goal, and following a 23-yard Craig field goal with just over a minute remaining in the half Taylor responded with a school-record 57-yard field goal as time expired to give the Commodores a 13-10 lead at the break.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — There are only a few times in one's life when they know they are witnessing history, and Vanderbilt's 40-35 win over No. 1/2-ranked Alabama on Saturday was just that for a sell-out crowd at FirstBank Stadium.

The victory over the No. 1/2 Crimson Tide marks the first time in program history that the Commodores defeated the top-ranked team in the nation. Additionally, it is the school's first win over a top-five team.

Quarterback Diego Pavia collected 308 total yards in the win over the Tide, passing for 252 yards and two touchdowns. Tight end Eli Stowers had a game-high 113 receiving yards on six receptions.

The Dores outgained Alabama in rushing yards, 166-84, led by Sedrick Alexander's 64 yards. The sophomore added a pair of scores on the ground.

Vanderbilt controlled the clock for most of the night against Alabama, as Vandy held the ball for 42:08 compared to the Crimson Tide's 17:52.

The Dores never trailed the Tide on Saturday, Vandy opened the game with a 75-yard drive. as Alexander punched it in from seven yards out. The Vanderbilt defense extended the lead to 13-0 after Randon Fortenette's pick-six off a tipped pass by De'Rickey Wright.

Alabama got on the board at the 4:22 mark of the first quarter to make it a 13-7 contest. Vanderbilt answered as Alexander darted into the endzone to give the Dores a 20-7 lead.

Vanderbilt took a 23-14 lead late in the second quarter thanks to a 51-yard field goal by sophomore Brock Taylor.

Alabama bookended halftime with a pair of touchdowns of its own to make it a two-point game at 23-21 with 12:01 left in the third quarter.

Pavia led the Commodores down the field on the next possession, facing a 4th-and-1 at the Alabama 36-yard line. The Commodore quarterback lofted a pass down the field that found the hands of Junior Sherill in the endzone to make it a 30-21 contest late in the third.

Alabama punched back with a 58-yard dart to Ryan Williams to pull back within two points at 30-28. The Dores extended their lead to 33-28 midway through the fourth quarter after Taylor drilled a 33-yard field goal.

Pavia gave Vanderbilt a 40-28 lead with 5:26 left to play in the game after he found Kamrean Johnson for a six-yard score to cap off a 7-play, 53-yard drive that milked 4:29 off the clock.

The Crimson Tide responded again with a quick score to pull back within five points at 40-35 with 2:21 left in the contest. Vanderbilt was ran out the clock on the next possession to secure the historic five-point victory over the No. 1-ranked team in the nation.

LEXINGTON, Ky. – There was no hangover for the Vanderbilt football team coming off the biggest win in school history, as the Commodores won a 20-13 slugfest at Kentucky on Saturday to post back-to-back SEC wins.

Quarterback Diego Pavia threw for two touchdowns and amassed 196 total yards in the victory. Pavia completed 15-of-18 for 143 yards, tossed for a pair of scores, and added 53 yards on the ground.

enior Richie Hoskins led the Dores with a career-high 44 receiving yards and one touchdown on three receptions. He found paydirt towards the end of the first half, as Pavia tossed an 18-yard dart down the sideline to Hoskins to give Vandy a 14-7 lead with 13

The Commodores' offense opened the game with a season-long 97-yard touchdown drive, as Vandy went down the field in eight plays to take a 7-0 lead over the Wildcats. Running back AJ Newberry hauled in a 20-yard touchdown pass to record his first receiving touchdown of the season.

Kentucky tied the game on the ensuing possession, then the two SEC rivals traded turnovers. The Dores threw their first interception of the season at the 10:33 mark of the second quarter. Vanderbilt's defense got the ball back minutes later, as cornerback Trudell Berry forced a fumble that linebacker Nick Rinaldi recovered at the Vanderbilt 34-yard line with 2:24 remaining before the half.

Pavia moved the Dores 60 yards downfield in six plays on their final possession of the first half, finishing the drive with an 18-yard touchdown to Hoskins that gave Vandy a 14-7 lead going into the locker room.

Vanderbilt extended its lead to 17-7 with a 49-yard field goal from Brock Taylor on the opening possession of the second half.

On the next possession, the Wildcats botched a field goal attempt from the Vandy 5-yard line, which resulted in safety De'Rickey Wright intercepting a pass from the UK holder

Coming off the Wright interception, Vanderbilt drove the ball to the Kentucky 32-yard line, where Taylor drilled a 50-yard field goal to push the Commodore advantage out to 20-7.

Kentucky cut into that lead with a 22-yard touchdown pass with 7:02 left in the game. The Commodores had to punt the ball back to UK on its next possession

The Vandy defense took the field with 2:26 remaining, clinging to a 20-13 lead. The Wildcats got into Vanderbilt territory, but the Dores stood tall, as safety CJ Taylor sealed the game with an interception at the 1:06 mark of the fourth quarter.

COMMODORES CAPTURE THIRD STRAIGHT WIN

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Vanderbilt football outlasted Ball State 24-14 on Saturday night in the first meeting between the two programs, giving the Commodores their best start since opening the 2008 season 5-0.

Vanderbilt (5-2, 2-1 SEC) entered the matchup having scored first in each of the last three games. Ball State (2-5, 1-2 MAC) ended that streak on its opening drive, producing a Pyard rushing touchdown from wide receiver Kiael Kelly to put the Cardinals up 7-0. The Commodores got on the board with 1:42 remaining in the first quarter behind sophomore Brock Taylor's 27-yard field goal. Moments later, a promising Vanderbilt drive fizzled out in the red zone, allowing Taylor to add another kick with 11:37 to go in the second. Taylor's two first-half field goals marked the fourth straight game, and sixth total this season, that the Commodore kicker has converted multiple attempts in a contest.

Vanderbilt generated a much-needed spark ahead of the halftime break. Graduate quarterback Diego Pavia dumped a screen pass off to junior Eli Stowers, with the tight end breaking free en route to a 41-yard score. The play is tied for the longest catch of Stowers' career; he had a 41-yard reception against Virginia Tech earlier this season. The Dores added to the lead with a successful two-point conversion, a pass from Pavia to junior Cole Spence. Vanderbilt held a 14-7 advantage at the half while producing its most first-half vardage this season. 285

The second half continued to be a low-scoring battle. Ball State evened the score 14-14 with 6.03 remaining in the third quarter, as quarterback Kadin Semonza threw a 7-yarder to tight end Tanner Koziol for the score. Vanderbilt reclaimed the lead 17-14 on its next drive behind yet another kick from Taylor, nailing a 38-yarder for his third make of the contest, a single-game career high. The kick also moved him into a tie for the sixth-most field goals in a single season in program history with 14.

The Commodores scored their first and only touchdown of the second half on a Pavia rush from five yards out. The Vanderbilt quarterback, who entered Saturday leading the SEC in quarterback rushing yards, now has three rushing touchdowns on the season. Pavia's run extended the lead to 24-14 with 7:48 left in the fourth quarter. Vanderbilt did not allow Ball State to score for the remainder of the game, holding the Cardinals to just 78 rushing yards throughout evenine.

Stowers, Vanderbilt's leading receiver this season, finished at the top of the receiving yardage once again with eight catches for 130 yards on Saturday. The tight end now has three games of 100 receiving yards or more this season, the most by a Commodore since Jordan Matthews in 2013.

The victory marks the Dores' first three-game win streak in a single season since 2017, which is also the best home start since going 6-0 in 1982. Vanderbilt, who received votes in the most recent polls, hosts No. 1/1 Texas at FirstBank Stadium next Saturday. The matchup comes nearly 100 years after the Longhorns last visited Nashville, a 14-6 Commodore victory in 1925. Kickoff is set for an aftermoon time of 2:30-3:30 p.m. CT.

COMEBACK THWARTER

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The No. 25-ranked Vanderbilt football team was denied its second top-five win of the season, as No. 5-ranked Texas knocked off the Commodores, 27-24, Saturday at FirstBank Stadium.

The Commodores attempted to erase a 10-point deficit late in the fourth quarter, as the Longhorns were clinging to a 27-17 lead after making a 23-yard field goal with 1:57 remaining in the game.

No. 25 Vanderbilt would not go down without a fight. The Dores went 75 yards down the field in eight plays, capped off by an 8-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Diego Pavia to tight end Eli Stowers, to make it a 27-24 contest with 46 ticks left on the clock. Vanderbilt lined up for the onside kick, but the No. 5 Longhorns corralled the ball and the three-point victory.

The loss brought Vanderbilt's three-game winning streak to an end. The Dores are now 5-3 overall and 2-2 in SEC play, while Texas improved to 7-1 on the year and 3-1 in SEC games. Pavia posted 210 total yards and collected three touchdowns against the Longhorns, throwing two scores and adding another on the ground. It is the fifth-straight game that Pavia has scored two or more touchdowns, while it is the second time he has totaled three scores in a game at Vanderbilt.

Stowers and wide receiver Junior Sherrill hauled in a touchdown in the loss, as each player now has a team-leading three touchdown receptions on the year. Sherrill added a seasoningh 62 yards on five catches to his stat line, while Stowers collected 33 yards through the air on three catches.

Kicker Brock Taylor converted a 54-yard field goal to end the first half and cut Vandy's deficit to 21-10 going into the locker room. It was his fifth field goal of 50 or more yards this season, which sets the school record for most 50-yard field goals in a season.


Linebacker Bryan Longwell paced the Dores with 11 tackles, just one short of his careerbest performance. The Commodore defense had a pair of interceptions for the second game this season, with razor Miles Capers and cornerback Martel Hight picking off one pass each. Star Randon Fontenette had three of Vanderbilt's six pass breakups, one of which led to Capers' third-quarter interception that set up a Commodore touchdown.

Trailing 24-17 midway through the fourth quarter, Vanderbilt forced Texas into a punt that gave the Commodores the ball at their 17-yard line with 8:09 remaining in the game. Vandy was stalled at its 35-yard line, as an interception on 4th-and-2 gave the ball tonghorns at the Vanderbilt 29 with 5:05 left on the clock. Texas drilled a 23-yard field goal on its ensuing possession to push its lead to 27-17 just after the two-minute timeout.

VANDERBILT VICTORIOUS AT AUBURI

AUBURN, Ala. - Vanderbilt's football team, which is receiving votes in both rankings, became bowl eligible for the first time since 2018 Saturday afternoon as it defeated Auburn 17-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. It was the Dores' first-ever win on The Plains.

The Commodores (6-3, 3-2 SEC) picked up their third conference win of the season, their most SEC wins since recording three in 2018. The Tigers are now 3-6 this season and 1-5 in conference play.

Quarterback Diego Pavia threw for 143 yards and two scores Saturday, his seventh game this season with multiple passing touchdowns. Sedrick Alexander recorded a team-high 49 all-purpose vards to aid Vandy's offensive efforts.

The Commodore offensive line did not allow a sack by the Tigers' defense. It is the second game this season in which Vanderbilt did not allow a sack, the first coming in the Commodores' win over Alabama.

CJ Taylor and Langston Patterson contributed seven tackles each to lead the Dores' defense. For the second consecutive game, Randon Fontenette finished with a career-high-tying 2.5 tackles for loss. Aeneas DiCiosmo, Miles Capers and Kordae Sydnor each recorded

Vanderbilt got on the board first when Pavia found AJ Newberry for a 28-yard passing touchdown, Newberry's second receiving touchdown of the season.

Auburn evened the score in the second quarter on a 30-yard touchdown catch by tight end Rivaldo Fairweather from quarterback Payton Thorne.

Kicker Brock Taylor nailed a 31-yard field goal to give the Commodores the lead with 1:05 left in the third quarter. With 16 this season, Taylor is tied for second on the Dores' all-time list for field goals made.

The Tigers had forced the Commodores to a field goal attempt at their own eight-yard line but committed a personal foul, giving Vandy the automatic first down. The Dores capitalized on the penalty and extended their lead to 10 points. Tight end Eli Stowers caught Pavia's four-yard pass to score and close out a drive that lasted 14 plays, 78 yards and 8:53. It is Vanderbilt's second-longest (TOP) scoring drive this season.

With less than two minutes to play, Thorne found Fairweather on a 16-yard pass for what would have been an Auburn first down were it not for CJ Taylor forcing his first fumble of the season, which was recovered by De'Rickey Wright to give the Dores back the ball.

Vanderbilt was able to run out the clock on the Tigers and earn its third SEC win this season and first chance for postseason play in six seasons.

DORES DOWNED BY GAMECOCKS

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The Vanderbilt football team dropped a rainy matchup to South Carolina on Saturday, falling 28-7 at FirstBank Stadium

Neither team generated momentum early as Vanderbilt's opening drive lasted just five plays, resulting in a punt. South Carolina steadily marched down the field on the ensuing drive, however, Gamecock kicker Alex Herrera could not convert a 42-yard field goal attempt through the steady drizzle. The miss was his first since Oct. 12 against Alabama.

Weather continued to have a factor on the game throughout the quarter. South Carolina quarterback LaNorris Sellers fumbled deep in Gamecock territory, stripped by Miles Capers on a scramble and recovered by Langston Patterson. The fumble recovery was Patterson's first of the season, and the eighth game this season Vanderbilt has forced a turnover. Seconds later, the Dores fell victim to a turnover of their own as quarterback Diego Pavia was hit from behind, fumbling the ball at the 19-yard line. The quarter went on to end 0-0, marking the first time all season Vanderbilt has been held scoreless and the fourth time the Commodores have shut out their opponents in the opening period.

South Carolina took advantage of the fumble soon after, breaking the stalemate with 13:11 left in the second quarter as Sellers found tight end Joshua Simon down the middle for a 17-yard touchdown. The score marked just the third time all season Vanderbilt's opponent scored first. Defense continued to influence the first half as the Gamecocks carried the 7-0 lead into halftime.

South Carolina opened the third quarter with a chunk play, as Sellers found receiver Jared Brown downfield for a 51-yard completion. Running back Raheim Sanders capped off the drive two plays later with a 33-yard touchdown run, pushing the score to 14-0. With the momentum shifting, Pavia responded to lead Vanderbilt down the field with its longest possession of the game, a 10-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. Facing a 3rd-and-8 in the redzone, Pavia got the Dores on the board with a 17-yard touchdown scramble. The score was Pavia's fifth rushing touchdown this season.

South Carolina seized control on the strength of its running game, rushing for 98 yards in the third quarter alone. Sanders added his second rushing touchdown on a 1-yard carry with 4:07 to play in the third, pushing the lead to 21-7. The next two Commodore drives went well into Gamecock territory, but ended in empty fourth down conversions. South Carolina iced the game on a 43-yard screen pass from Sellers to Sanders with 7:55 left, producing the final score of 28-7.

The Gamecocks garnered 214 yards on 43 total carries. South Carolina's rushing performance was its second consecutive game with 200 yards or more on the ground.

DORES DROP CONTEST IN DEATH VALLEY

BATON ROUGE, La. - The RV/RV Vanderbilt football team dropped a 24-17 contest to RV/RV LSU in Death Valley Saturday night.

Quarterback Diego Pavia collected multiple touchdowns for the ninth game this season as he posted a passing and a rushing score against the Tigers. The graduate student amassed $\,$ 229 total yards of offense as he threw for 186 yards and added a team-high 43 yards on

Wide receiver Quincy Skinner Jr. was one of three Dores to haul in three catches, leading the team with a season-high 72 receiving yards and a touchdown

Linebacker Langston Patterson and STAR Randon Fontenette each recorded double-digit tackles for the Commodores in Death Valley. Patterson registered a game-high 13 stops, while Fontenette added 10 tackles, each with a pass break up.

After forcing the Tigers to punt on an opening drive three-and-out, the Commodores struck first on a 63-yard touchdown pass from Pavia to Skinner on their first offensive play of

LSU responded on the following drive with a 20-vard rushing touchdown by Josh Williams to tie the game at 7-7 midway through the opening quarter. The Tigers were marching down the field looking to take the lead, but the Vandy defense got a stop on 4th-and-goal to keep the game tied at seven-all at the end of the first stanza.

Midway through the second quarter, the Tigers took a 7-point lead on a 21-yard rushing touchdown by Williams.

With 14 seconds left in the half, Jesse Mirco pinned LSU within its 10-yard line with a 57yard punt. It's his fifth straight contest with a 50-plus yard punt and the eighth game this season that Vandy has downed a punt inside the opponent's 10-yard line.

Brock Taylor drilled a 47-yard field goal to pull the Dores to within a score at 14-10 with 8:26 remaining in the third. He has made each of his last 10 field goal attempts over the past seven games

LSU extended its lead to 24-10 with a touchdown reception by Kyren Lacy on a 12-yard pass from Garrett Nussmeier and a 28-yard field goal by Damian Ramos.

With Vanderbilt facing a 4th-and-9 from its 26-yard line, Mirco faked the punt and rushed for a first down. After moving the chains, the Dores were able to move the ball down the field and score on a 1-yard rush by Pavia. It marked his sixth rushing score this season, tied for second-most among SEC quarterbacks.

The Tigers ran out the clock on the Commodores after the Pavia touchdown to seal the

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt fell to in-state rival Tennessee, 36-23, Saturday afternoon at FirstBank Stadium to close out the 2024 regular season.

The Commodores finished the regular season at 6-6 and 3-5 in SEC play. The six wins are the most for Vandy since the 2018 campaign when the Dores collected six victories and played in the 2018 Texas Bowl against Baylor. Tennessee closes out the regular season at 10-2 overall and 6-2 in SEC games

Quarterback Diego Pavia registered 149 total yards of offense, throwing for 104 yards and adding 45 yards on the ground. Pavia ends the regular season with 716 rushing yards which sets the Vanderbilt record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a single season.

Running back Sedrick Alexander rushed for 60 yards on a season-high 17 carries

The Vanderbilt defense had a couple of players record double-digit tackles against Tennessee. Linebacker Langston Patterson matched his career-best with 13 tackles vs. the Vols, while linebacker Bryan Longwell tallied 10 stops.

Cornerback Martel Hight picked off his second pass of the season early in the second quarter. He is the first Commodore to record multiple interceptions this season, as he now has three career picks at Vandy.

Vanderbilt opened the game with a 100-yard kickoff return from wide receiver Junior Sherrill. It marked the first time since Aug. 26, 2023, vs. Hawai'i, that the Dores returned a kickoff for a touchdown. It is also Vandy's first kickoff return of 100 yards since Sept. 20, 2014, vs. South Carolina, which was also the last time the Commodores returned an opening kickoff for a touchdown.

Vandy's defense forced Tennessee to fumble on its third play of the game. Safety CJ Taylor knocked the ball loose, and linebacker Nick Rinaldi pounced on it to set up the Commodores at the Volunteer 27-yard line. Alexander punched it in from four yards out to cap off a 7-play, 26-yard drive that gave Vandy a 14-0 lead.

After a Tennessee touchdown made it a 14-7 contest at the 8:48 mark of the first quarter. Vanderbilt marched 61 yards downfield in nine plays to set up Brock Taylor for a 32-yard field goal that gave the Dores a 17-7 advantage with 4:01 left in the first quarter. The 17 first-quarter points for Vanderbilt against Tennessee were the most since Oct. 20, 2007, at

The Volunteers scored 36-straight points before Vanderbilt found paydirt again late in the fourth quarter. Pavia connected with wide receiver Richie Hoskins for a 31-yard touchdown that made it a 36-23 contest after a failed 2-point conversion.

Tennessee ran out the clock after the Hoskins' touchdown, as the Volunteers posted the 13-point win over Vanderbilt.

MAGIC CITY BOWL WIN

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — Vanderbilt quarterback Diego Pavia accounted for five total touchdowns to lead the Commodores to a 35-27 win in the 2024 Birmingham Bowl over Georgia Tech.

Vanderbilt's victory in the Birmingham Bowl marks the school's first postseason win since the BBVA Compass Bowl at the conclusion of the 2013 season. The Birmingham Bowl victory gives Vanderbilt a 7-6 record to conclude the 2024 campaign. It is the first winning season for the Commodores since 2013.

The Commodores are now 5-4-1 all-time in bowl games, as Vanderbilt played in its first postseason game since the 2018 Texas Bowl. The Dores posted their first win over Georgia Tech since Oct. 18, 1941. The victory over the Yellow Jackets also brings the Gold Cowbell back to Vanderbilt's campus for the first time in over 83 years.

Pavia's five scores set a school record for most touchdowns collected by a Commodore in a bowl game. The quarterback found the end zone three times through the air and twice on the ground against the Yellow Jackets. He collected 244 total yards in the win, throwing for 160 yards and rushing for 84 yards.

Vanderbilt collected 306 total yards of offense, with the Commodores gaining 146 yards on the ground. The Dores cashed in all on five of their visits to the red zone. The Vandy defense collected two turnovers, as safety C1 Taylor picked off his second pass of the season and defensive lineman Aeneas DiCosmo recovered his first fumble. Linebacker Nick Rinaldi posted a career-high 10 tackles and had two of Vanderbilt's three sacks. In total, the Commodores tallied seven tackles for loss against the Yellow Jackets, led by Rinaldi's 2.0 stops behind the line of scrimmage.

The Commodores opened the scoring late in the first quarter, as Pavia found tight end Cole Spence for a 7-yard touchdown to cap off an 8-play, 87-yard drive. Georgia Tech pulled even on the ensuing possession, as the Yellow Jackets went 75 yards downfield in 15 plays.

Vandy reclaimed a 14-7 advantage with 1:55 remaining before halftime after another extended drive that melted 8:06 off the clock. The Dores drove 81 yards in 14 plays, as Pavia hit paydirt with a 2-yard rush that put Vanderbilt up by a touchdown. Georgia Tech drilled a 43-yard field goal in the closing seconds of the first half to make it a 14-10 contest going into halftime.

A 33-yard field goal by the Yellow Jackets cut the Vandy lead to 14-13 midway through the third quarter. Vanderbilt extended its lead to 21-13 in the final minute of the third after Pavia found tight end Eli Stowers in the end zone for a 2-yard touchdown reception.

The Commodore defense got the ball back before the end of the third, as Taylor intercepted a pass at the Georgia Tech 33-yard line and returned it 22 yards to set the Vandy offense up 11 yards away from the end zone. It took three plays for Vanderbilt to thi paydirt after the Taylor pick, as Pavia connected with wide receiver Quincy Skinner Jr. for a 7-yard score that put the Dores up 28-13 just five seconds into the fourth quarter.

The Vandy defense collected its second-straight turnover moments later. Edge Mile Capers forced a fumble and DiCosmo recovered at the Commodore 27-yard line to give Vanderbilt the ball back with 13:40 left to play in the game. The Dores once quickly again took advantage of the turnover, scoring in six plays, as Pavia's 6-yard rushing touchdown gave Vanderbilt a 35-13 advantage with 9:59 remaining.

Inclement weather brought the 2024 Birmingham Bowl to a halt at the 7:17 mark of the fourth quarter, as the teams had to wait out a lightning delay. Georgia Tech scored back-to-back touchdowns out of the stoppage to trim Vanderbilt's lead to 35-27 with 1:30 left to play.

Needing an onside kick, Georgia Tech kicked the ball out of bounds to give the Commodores the ball for good. Vanderbilt kneeled out the final 90 seconds to secure its first bowl victory in nine seasons.
